The M.C.C. team were crossing Australia from Perth to Adelaide in between tour matches

This was the Test match that brought the 'Body-line incident to boiling point'. Woodfull was hit twice and Oldfield, who didn't bat in the 2nd innings, played a ball from Larwood into his face. England won by 338 runs. Larwood and Allen took fifteen wickets in the match

- 11a Greg Chappell. South Australia, Somerset, Queensland & Australia 1966-1983. Greg Chappell's original one page typed statement read out to the press following the underarm incident in the 3rd One Day International between Australia and New Zealand held at Melbourne in February 1981 involving his Brother Trevor Chappell. The statement reads 'I have always played cricket within the rules of the game. I took a decision yesterday which whilst within the Laws of Cricket, in the cool light of day I recognise as not being within the spirit of the game. The decision was made whilst I was under pressure and in the heat of the moment. I regret the decision. It is something I would not do again'. The statement signed by Chappell. Some staining, not affecting the text, otherwise in good condition. A unique item from an infamous incident in Australian cricket history. Previously sold by Chappell in Christies sale held in Melbourne in July 2001 £500/700

With the series tied at 1-1, Australia looked to have gained the upper hand by batting first and setting New Zealand a chase of 235 runs.

- Undisciplined bowling and fielding by the Australians, and a great innings from Kiwi opener Bruce Edgar narrowed the target to 15 with one over to play. Chappell's younger brother, Trevor, a batting all-rounder who specialised in bowling at the end of an innings, delivered the final over. From the first five balls, Trevor Chappell took two for 8, leaving the new batsman, Brian McKechnie, to score a six to tie the game. At this point, Greg Chappell intervened, told his brother to deliver the ball along the ground, ie. underarm, and he then informed the umpire to let the batsman know of the change of bowling style. Despite the protestations of wicketkeeper Rod Marsh, the ball was delivered and the batsman simply put his bat in front of the ball to stop. He then hurled his bat away. A large crowd of 50,000, mostly Australian, loudly booed the Australian team from the field. Although under-arm bowling was not allowed in One Day cricket in England at the time, it had not been entered in the rules for this One Day series. This was soon changed*

I have played on mats in South Africa with the Australian Test players in 1921 and later when the turf wickets were used, that was in 1935'. The letter dated January 1962 and nicely signed by Oldfield. G £100/150
- 14* Pelham Francis Warner. Middlesex & England 1894-1920. Four page handwritten letter from Warner, headed Carling House, Maidstone to Mrs Clark, regarding turning down an invitation to play tennis because he will be playing cricket. 'To be quite truthful I forgot all about it which is no excuse really, though the fact that I have been travelling all over the place playing cricket will I hop influence you to mitigate the sentence. I am playing cricket on the days you asked us'. The letter dated 5th July 1909 and nicely signed by Warner. G £140/160
- 15* Pelham Francis Warner. Middlesex & England 1894-1920. Lord Hawke's tour of New Zealand 1902/03. Excellent four page handwritten letter from Warner, headed Christchurch, N.Z. to 'Hutchinson', regarding arranging an appointment in London with Ward Lock & Co (publishing house). He goes onto talk about the M.C.C. tour and the country. We have had a very good time and a triumphant match so far. I made 211 the other day.... This is a beautiful country but the climate is overrated'. The letter dated 28th February 1903 and nicely signed by Warner. G £150/200
