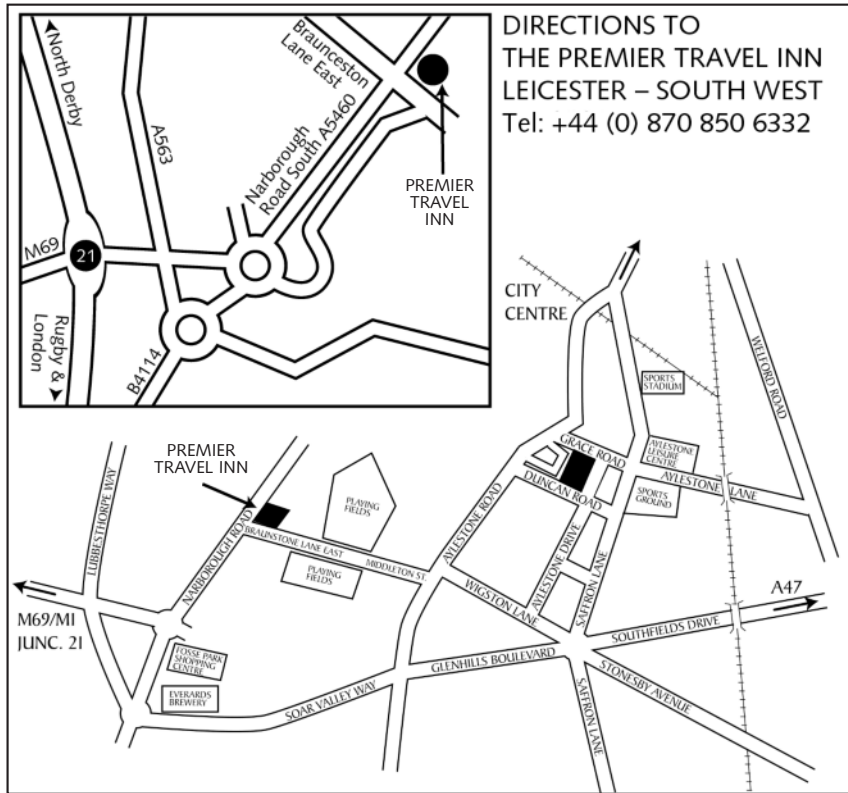

- 1 'Dinner to the Australian Imperial Forces Cricket Team. Cafe Monico, Monday 15th September 1919'. Original table plan for the Dinner. Guest included Lord Harris, Warner, F.S. Jackson, Tennyson, Douglas, Ashley Cooper, S.Pardon, Woolley, Hobbs etc. Folds otherwise in good condition. Rare £30/40
- 2 England v South Africa 1929. Original complimentary press ticket to the 2nd Test Match at Lord's 29th June-2nd July 1929. Issued to 'The Doncaster Gazette'. Adhesive marks to verso otherwise in good condition £30/40
- 3 M.C.C. tour of the West Indies 1953/54. Small selection of ephemera formerly the property of Harold Dalton, team physio/masseur to M.C.C. Original passenger list for the Fyffes Liner S.S. Ariguani, for the departure from Jamaica to Bristol of the M.C.C. team on the 6th April 1954 with names of the team to inner pages. Sold with a telegram from M.C.C. to Captain Len Hutton 'Wishing you all possible good luck for success in Test match starting tomorrow. Marylebone' dated 29th March 1954 and a mono photograph featuring both teams wearing suits. Adhesive marks to backs. G £60/90
- 4 Mr S.M.J. Woods. 'Cricket' Wright & Co folding penny sheet dated 1890 with picture and biography of Woods. Adhesive marks and slight damage to rear wrapper, some rusting otherwise in good condition. Scarce. G £60/80
- 5 'Ye Tall Hat Wicket Match. Darnall (Sheffield). 23rd September 1893'. Four page printed leaflet with details of matches, engagement (for a shilling) of professional bowlers for net practise etc. The University played the Australians at Leyton, Sussex at Brighton, Surrey at the Oval etc. Folds otherwise in good condition. Rare £50/70
- 7 'The Daily Graphic. Cricket Number 1912. Original complete edition of the Cricket Number for 1912. Twenty pages with excellent pictures of the Test teams and players who competed in the Triangular Tournament, England, Australia and South Africa. Plus pictures of all the County teams and other players. Some nicks tears to edges otherwise in good condition. Sold with an original full page image of the Maharajah of Patiala being padded up to bat. Published by 'The Sketch' and dated 14th June 1911. G £30/40

**AUTOGRAPHED CRICKET EPHEMERA**

- 8 Arthur Fielder. Kent & England 1900-1914. Short one page handwritten letter from Fielder regarding a request for an autograph. 'I have very great pleasure in sending it to you. Trusting you are a good Cricketer'. The letter headed 'The Old Pavilion, Rugby School', dated 17th May 1934 and nicely signed in ink by Fielder. The letter laid down to page, some rust marks to paper. G £40/60
- 9 Edward Wentworth Dillon. Kent 1900-1923. Excellent four page handwritten letter to a Mr Milne regarding his promise to give him a bat. '...I came across an old bat of mine the other day when I was putting a few things together ready for this season.... and thought of my promise to you....there is no sentimental value attached to it as it is a post-war one and I believe I played with it in the only county match I have played in since 1913, namely Kent v Notts in about 1922 or 1923 and took a pair with it- I did however connect as I was caught slip each knock. I went to Lord's yesterday and saw the South

Africans- they pleased me- it was cold. I sat in the pavilion all the time- those who did sit out looked perished. Saw lots of old pals up there. That old pavilion and the pals one meets is a great tonic....'. The letter dated the 19th May 1935 and nicely signed by Dillon in ink. G/VG £80/120

- 10 Stanley Christopherson. Kent & England 1883-1890. Two page 'Forces' typewritten letter from Christopherson to Private J.D. Coldham (cricket author). 'I first had bronchitis and influenza and then fell and gashed my head, so I have been away from Lord's just at the busy time.... We shall have a busy time because Oxford v Cambridge, Eton v Harrow and the Indian team will all be at Lord's. My own presidency finishes on 1st May and I have been fortunate in securing a very worthy successor. It is not yet public property but it is Sir Ronald Adam, late Adjutant General, a keen cricketer and just full of brains'. The letter dated the 8th March 1946 and nicely signed by Christopherson in ink. G/VG £70/100

*Stanley Christopherson was the president of M.C.C. from 1939-1946, the longest period anyone has held the office*

- 11 Alec Hearne. Kent & England 1884-1906. Two page handwritten letter from Hearne to J.D. Coldham (cricket author). 'I had 23 years experience with Kent County, and enjoyed every moment of it, finishing up in 1906 with more runs and wickets than any other Kent player. As you say, I am now one of, if not the oldest professional living, I was born on 22nd July 1863'. The letter dated the 13th March 1946 and nicely signed by Hearne in ink. G/VG £60/80

*Alec Hearne scored over 16000 runs, took 404 catches and took over 1150 wickets for Kent. He died in Beckenham in 1952*

- 12 William Henry Patterson. Kent 1880-1900. Three page 'Forces' handwritten letter from Patterson to Private J.D. Coldham (cricket

I am afraid County cricket will be passing through very testing times and it remains to be seen how the public will respond to higher charges and members to increased subscriptions. I am not too hopeful. The County side cannot show the same standard of play- and new players will take some time to establish themselves with the public'. The letter dated the 14th March 1946 and nicely signed by Patterson in ink. G/VG £60/80
- 13 Francis Alexander MacKinnon of MacKinnon. Kent & England 1875-1885. Two page handwritten letter from MacKinnon to J.D. Coldham (cricket author). 'I spent nearly seven weeks last year... visiting Tunbridge Wells Cricket Week where I joined my school 87 years ago... also Folkestone and of course the great Canterbury Week where I first played for Kent in 1870, the year I played for Cambridge v Oxford beating them by two runs'. The letter dated the 22th November 1946 and nicely signed by MacKinnon in ink. G/VG £60/80
- 14 Manley Colchester Kemp. Kent 1880-1895. Two page handwritten letter from Kemp to J.D. Coldham (cricket author). 'When I was playing there were fewer County matches and so bowlers and especially fast bowlers were not liable to be over-bowled as they are now. The wickets too were not batsmens' paradises as they are now. They were not protected by anything from rain, so the bowlers occasionally to think of bowling on a sticky wicket, if a hot sun came out after a heavy shower. As a wicket-keeper it was a real joy on such a wicket to watch a bowler reaping his due reward for spin, length or swerve...'. The letter dated the 12th February 1949 and nicely signed by Kemp in ink. Excellent cricket content. G/VG £70/100
- 15 Harold Thomas William Hardinge. Kent & England 1902-1933. One page handwritten letter from Hardinge to J.D. Coldham (cricket author) regarding a request for an autograph. 'I am rather intrigued that you find room in your collection for old 'has-beens' like myself'. The letter dated the 21st October 1954 and nicely signed by Hardinge in ink. Sold with a earlier handwritten letter, from A.J. Lancaster, Secretary of Kent C.C.C. regarding a reference to Rev Lashleigh who played for Kent 1885-1901, headed '19th Sept'. Qty 2. G/VG £40/60
- 16 Geoffrey Norman Foster. Worcestershire & Kent 1903-1922. One page typewritten letter from Foster to J.D. Coldham (cricket author) regarding a request for an autograph. 'I am always glad to encourage lovers of the game to which my family owed so much and am happy to send you this letter to add to your collection, though it seems rather like a message from the dark long ago. I only hope you will continue to derive great future happiness from your interest in cricket and will be enabled to play the game on and off the field'. The letter dated the 27th October 1954 and nicely signed in ink by Foster. G/VG £50/70
- 17 Cyril Frederick Walters, Worcestershire & England 1928-1935. Two page handwritten letter on 'County Ground (handwritten), The Union Club, Worcester' headed paper from Walters buying a complete set of 'The Cricketer' magazine, he also talks of the county team progress 'I think that now more of our batsmen have got going we will make a lot of runs on good wickets which will give our bowlers a chance of showing what they are worth'. Letter dated 16th June 1933 and nicely signed by Walters. G £50/70
- 18 Learie Constantine, Trinidad & West Indies 1921-1939. One page handwritten letter on 'Sir Learie Constantine, London' headed paper from Constantine to Raymond Glendenning, BBC Sports commentator regarding invitations speak at 'The Leadership Lunches' at the Cafe Royal in the 1960's, his peirage and ill health. Letter dated 28th March 1969 and nicely signed in full by Constantine. File holes. G/VG £30/50  
*Constantine died two years later in 1971*
- 19 Jack Hobbs. Surrey & England. Interesting three page handwritten letter from Hobbs to a Mr Speight thanking him for sending some stamps to his son, talks of a golfing holiday in Penzance, coming back from India, the voyage home etc, odd mentions of cricket etc. The letter dated 26th March 1934 and nicely signed by Hobbs. G £40/60  
*Hobbs was probably returning home from India following the M.C.C. tour of India in 1933/34 where he reported on the series*
- 20 Walter Reginald Hammond. Gloucestershire & England 1920-1951. Two page handwritten war-time letter and envelope from Hammond to his Wife. He talks of the long journey to India, where he was stationed, advising that both Chas Bray (Essex) and Freddie Brown (Middlesex) are out in Egypt etc. Signed 'Wal' and dated 5th February 1941. The envelope is postmarked 2nd March 1941 and has 'RAF Censor' stamp. G £150/200
- 21 Jack B. Hobbs, Surrey & England 1905-1934. Collection of signed ephemera relating to Hobbs correspondence with Stanley Cherry, a 2nd World War prisoner of the Japanese. On his return home after four years imprisonment he contacted Hobbs a few times to get his help in becoming a member of Surrey C.C.C. Hobbs had played cricket with his Grandfather William. The collection consists of three handwritten letters to Cherry, one dated 1946 on Jack Hobbs (Sports Outfitters) headed paper regarding a signed photograph and the other two, dated 1958 refer to Cherry's application for membership. All three letters signed in ink by Hobbs. There are also copies of Cherry's letters to Hobbs attached, plus correspondence from the Oval and M.C.C. In addition there are two nicely signed postcards of Hobbs, both dedicated to Cherry, in card mount, an official scorecard for the England v Australia Oval Test match 1930 (Bradman 232) and an original four page 'Test Match Supplement to The Australasian' newspaper, dated 10th December 1932 with full page image of Stan McCabe to front cover and reports and many photographs of the first two days play in the first Test at Sydney (Bodyline tour), folds. - 22 William Gilbert Grace. Handwritten one page letter in black ink to Donald John Knight (Surrey & England 1911-1937) 'My Dear Knight, I shall be pleased to see

- Weigall (G.J.V. Weigall. Kent & Europeans 1891-1920) down to practice anytime he can come. We practice Tuesday and Fridays in the morning and Wednesdays and Saturdays in the afternoon. We shall begin regular practice in April. I am yours truly'. Nicely signed by Grace. The letter written on 'London County Cricket Club, Crystal Palace' letter head and dated 16th March 1902. G/VG £200/300
- 23 Donald John Knight. Surrey & England 1911-1937. Interesting collection of mixed ephemera regarding Knight and his family with some cricket interest. Includes some end of term college reports from Malvern College, selection of nine telegrams sent to him after success on the cricket field, includes innings of 90 for Surrey v Notts 1913, innings of 105 for Surrey v Kent 1914, top score of 64 in the Varsity match of 1914 at Lord's etc, banns of marriage and marriage certificate of his parents, Sutton C.C. entertainment programme featuring his mother, two tickets for Eton v Harrow 1919 at Lord's, postcards sent to his mother from Egypt, speech day programme (Malvern)-Donald Knight delivers the prologue, six portrait photographs of Knight, one signed in black ink and one of Knight with his mother etc. G £40/60  
*Knight was one of 'Wisden's Five Cricketers of the Year' in 1915*
- 24 Edward Tate. Hampshire 1898-1902 and Cricket Professional at Malvern School for fifty years. Portrait sepia photograph of Tate wearing suit and tie, signed 'Yours Faithfully Edward Tate'. Photograph by Norman May of Malvern. Sold with a presentation photograph, probably given by a student to Tate, with cricket rhyme and photograph. Various sizes. G £30/40
- 25 Paul Methuen. M.C.C. 1816. Signed free-front envelope to J.H. Burke, Engineer Cadet of Chatham, dated and sent from 'London, February Seven 1835'. Signed 'Paul Methuen' in black ink. Rare early signature of Methuen who played one first class match for M.C.C. G/VG £80/120  
*Paul Methuen was born in Marylebone in 1779 and was a Member of Parliament for Wiltshire, he became Lord Methuen in 1838.*
- He died in Westminster 1849*
- 26 W.W. Keeton. Nottinghamshire & England 1926-1952. Green folder containing an assortment of ephemera including folding leaflet for his Benefit match v Yorkshire at Trent Bridge in July 1947, accompanied by a telegram dated 12th July 1947 from Harold Larwood to Keeton 'Keeton, Notts Cricket Club, trent Bridge, Nottm. Good Luck, Hope it is a Bumper. Regards to the boys. Lol'. Also Members Enclosure ticket for England v South Africa Test match in Keeton's Wives name, advertising leaflet, press cuttings etc. G £50/70
- 27 W.W. Keeton. Nottinghamshire & England 1926-1952. Original typewritten letter of selection from P.F. Warner, Chairman of the Selection Committee, to Keeton advising him of his selection to play for the North v South at Old Trafford on the 18th-21st June 1932. Details include remuneration for the match (£15 plus 3rd class return railway fare), details of the match, press relations etc. The letter, on Lord's Cricket Ground headed paper, dated 12th June 1932 and nicely signed in ink by Warner. Rare. G £100/150
- 28 W.W. Keeton. Nottinghamshire & England 1926-1952. Original typewritten letter of selection from F.S. Jackson, Chairman of the Selection Committee, to Keeton advising him of his selection to play for England v Australia at Old Trafford on the 6th-10th July 1934. Details include remuneration for the match (£40 plus 3rd class return railway fare), details of the match, press relations, accommodation etc. The letter, on Lord's Cricket Ground headed paper, dated 2nd July 1934 and nicely signed in ink by Jackson. Rare. G £180/250
