27 Sir Frank Mortimer Maglinne Worrell. Barbados, Jamaica & the West Indies 1941-1964. Handwritten four page air mail letter from Worrell to Reg Lockett of Norton C.C. who Worrell played for during the 1950/60's. Good cricket content 'If the Norton Boys can get the runs , Jim Laker can get the opposing sides out......I really miss

the general atmosphere of League Cricket very much although I realise that there comes a time in everymans life when he has got to bow out from sport in order to carve a niche for his future...'. The letter dated 10th June 1960 and nicely signed in ink 'Frank'. Odd staining to letter otherwise in good condition

- 28 James Charles Laker. Surrey, Essex & England 1946-1964. Handwritten two page letter from Laker to Reg Lockett of Norton C.C. who Laker played for during the early 1960's. Some cricket content 'I spoke to Tom last night about next year and I think he would like me to come back to Norton but I fear it is going to be difficult as I have many business commitments in London....'. Excellent one page typewritten letter from Sutcliffe to the Editor of the Cambridge Independent press regarding clothing shortages following the war 'forcing many enthusiastic young cricketers to turn out in unconventional rig'. He talks of village green cricket needing help and hopes to appeal through the press column for 'lovers of the cricket match to give every possible support to their local clubs.... So we shall weather the storm of austerity until happier days are with us again'. The letter dated 9th July 1946 and very nicely signed in ink by Sutcliffe. VG £50/70

I have hired the Gilling Shoot this year.... So your kindness would enable me to spend a few most enjoyable days at one of my favourite pastimes when I come Gilling or am in neighbourhood'. The letter written on 'The Rectory, East Gilling, York' headed paper and nicely signed in ink by Ranjitsinhji. G £100/150
- John W. Hearne, Middlesex & England 1909-1936. One page handwritten letter from Hearne to 'Mr Milne' regarding him and his Wife purchasing a bungalow in peaceful surroundings in West Drayton, Middlesex. 'Its certainly more peaceful than opposite the drone which nearly drove us 'Crackers'. The letter dated 10th February 1949 and nicely signed in

He talks of meeting up with Arthur Mailey 'it will make the evening doubly glorious and memorable'. Also talks of watching the Australians at Hove 'I honestly think England (unless our batting breaks down) should retain the Ashes' and broadcasting with Alan McGilvary and Freddie Brown for the Australian Commercial Station for all five Tests. The letter dated 5th June 1956 and nicely signed by Gilligan in ink. G £40/50
- 48 John 'Jack' Berry Hobbs, Surrey & England 1905-1934. One page handwritten letter, on Surrey C.C.C. headed paper declining a request for a written article for the Sports Services Bureau. 'I am afraid I am fixed up for this season'. The letter dated 7th May 1924 and nicely signed in ink by Hobbs. G £50/80
- John 'Jack' Berry Hobbs, Surrey & England 1905-1934. One page handwritten letter from Hobbs to Harry B. Rowan regarding a 'Cricket Week' to be held in Glasgow. 'I am glad to hear you are again holding the Cricket Week and I shall be pleased to come along in April. I am very sorry though that A.C. MacLaren will probably be there too, I would rather work with somebody else. I should have thought Maurice Tate would have been a good proposition. I could get him for you if you like...' be proved, and naturally now it seems that I shall have to live on the suggested 1 per week retaining fee for the greater part of the year.... I appreciate that I like everyone else will have to start right at the bottom, but I am afraid that £1 over the winter session would be a hardship, bearing in mind the permanent and good position I now have....'. In 1800 he staged a cricket match on horseback with specially made bats. Mann was a founder member of the Marylebone Cricket Club. Mann was M.P. for Maidstone 1774-1784 and M.P. for Sandwich from 1790-1807. He died in 1814

In 1825 he bought from Thomas Lord, the lease of Lord's cricket ground for five thousand pounds, when Lord was considering selling the ground for building. In 1836 J.H. Dark purchased the remainder of the lease from Ward. Ward was M.P. for the City of London between 1826-1831. He died in 1849

The 5th and final Test match of the Ashes summer of 1926 was won by England by 289 runs. England made 280 in their first innings. Australia replying with 302. Hobbs and Sutcliffe then commenced England's 2nd innings with an opening stand of 172, with Hobbs eventually make 100 and Sutcliffe 161 this led to a total of 436. This left Australia to score 414 runs for victory. However, Larwood and Rhodes, in the main, bowled them out for 125 and England won the 1926 Ashes series.
