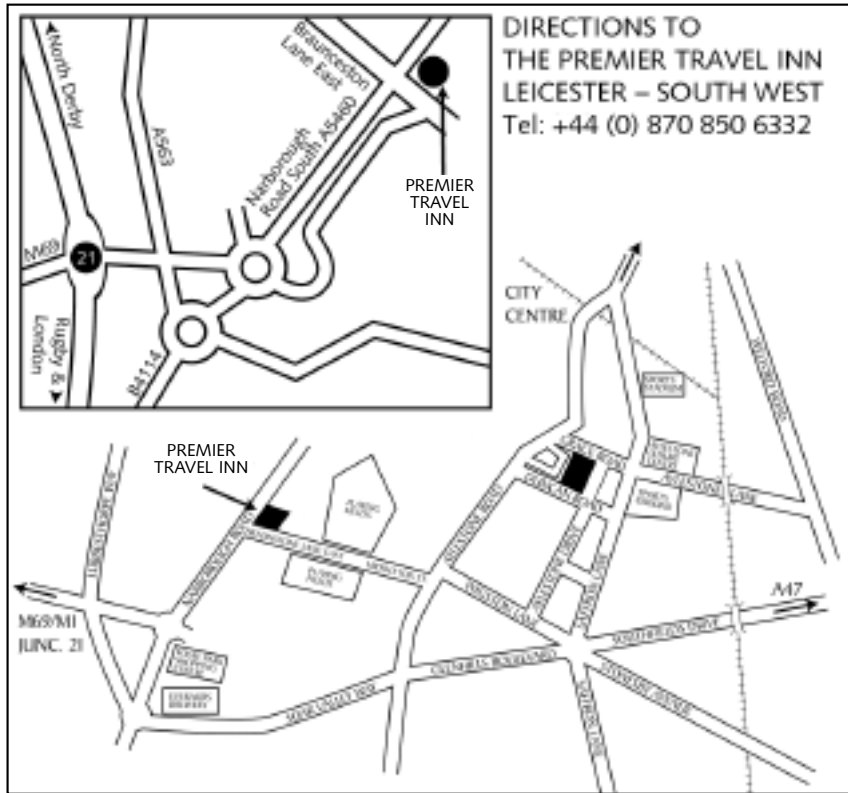

5. The seller warrants to the Auctioneer and to the buyer that he is the true owner or is properly authorised to sell the property by the true owner and is able to transfer good and marketable title to the property free from any third party claim.
6. The highest bidder to be the buyer. If during the auction the Auctioneer considers that a dispute has arisen he has absolute authority to settle it or re-offer the lot. - 1 'The M.C.C. Dinner'. Small and beautifully ornate menu for the Dinner held for the M.C.C. touring party to Australia held on the 27th February 1912 at the Hotel Wentworth, Sydney. The menu, on cream card with pink blush colour, has raised stylish art nouveau floral decoration with title to centre. The inside has a poem from Shakespeare and Menu 'on a good wicket' to left and right hand sides. All the courses are named after English players, 'Hearne Bay Oyster Cocktails', Rhodes Schnapper a la Century', Saddle Woolley Lamb and Vine Sauce, Hobb-led Asparagus and Pawley Dressing, Peche Warner etc. Very good condition. Rare and early menu £200/300
- 2 John 'Jack' Ryder. Victoria & Australia 1912-1932. Official menu given by 'Canon E.S. Hughes, Vice President of the Victorian Cricket Association for Jack Ryder's Testimonial' held at the Members Pavilion, Melbourne Cricket Ground on the 20th December 1930. Colour caricature to front cover, by Samuel Wells, showing Canon Wells holding a bag of 'Golden Grain' (Testimonial proceeds?), with some in his hand, with Ryder depicted as a padded up bird swooping down from a tree. The menu with toast list and coloured ribbon tie. Splitting to spine of menu otherwise in good/very good condition. Rare £100/150
Ryder was about to finish his first class career, having played for Victoria for twenty years, he captained Australia in five of his twenty Tests
- 3 'Leicestershire County Cricket Club 1879-1928. Jubilee Celebration Dinner 1928'. Rare official menu for the Dinner held at the De Montfort Hall, Leicester on the 30th April 1928 to celebrate the first fifty years of the county club. The four page gilt edges folding menu with raised club emblem of the 'running fox' printed in red to top and title and details below. 'Menu' and 'Toasts' to inside pages with decorated with images of cricketers and 'Musical programme to back page. All printed in club colours of red and green. Adhesive marks to rear cover just affecting printed text, odd faults otherwise in good condition £50/70
- 4 'The Cricket Writers' Club Dinner in honour of the Australian Team'. Three official folding menu cards for the Dinners held at Skinners' Hall in 1953, 1956 and 1972. Odd minor faults otherwise in good condition £40/60
- 5 Incogniti tour of the United States & Canada 1920. Rare 'Canadian Pacific' Dinner menu dated 9th November 1920. The menu from the return voyage of the team to England. Ex E.G. Wynyard collection. VG £60/90
- 6 Cricket menus/cards. Official menu for the B.S.C. Luncheon given to the Australia touring team of 1985, official menu for the Eve of Bicentenary match at Lords 1987 and an M.C.C. greeting card for 1963 and an M.C.C. christmas card for 1948. G £25/35
- 7 The Australians 1930. Linen handkerchief, 16"x16", with printed images of the Australian players with title to top 'The Australians 1930'. Each player named beneath their image. Players include Woodfull, Bradman, McCabe, Fairfax, Oldfield, Jackson, Grimmett, Ponsford etc. Copyright photo by A. Wilkes & Son. West Bromwich. Rare. Good/very good condition. Rare £100/150
- 8 'At Play, Cricket'. Rare and attractive American cricket handkerchief, c1870/80's, with delightful scenes of boys playing cricket. Cotton handkerchief with large printed image to centre of two boys playing the game holding bats with wickets to rear. Further images of the game to right and left quarters of the handkerchief with captions, 'Well Caught', 'Fielding', 'The New Bat' and 'After Play'. The handkerchief predominately coloured in red and black with colourful border surround. To top border of surround is the makers name 'S.H. Greene & Sons. Washington' (faded). Approx 12"x12.25". Some damage to top corners of handkerchief (repaired at right hand top corner), some foxing/staining to some area's of the handkerchief otherwise in good condition with bright original colours. Attractive period image £80/120
- The firm of S.H. Greene & Sons of Washington, U.S.A. was founded in Warwick, Rhodes Island in 1865 and finally went into receivership in 1925*
- 9 'England's Champion Batsman. J.B. Hobbs. Surrey & England XI'. Cotton handkerchief with five images of Hobbs to centre and surround with titles 'A Hook Shot', 'An On Drive', 'An Off Drive' and 'A Late Cut' with titles and achievements to centre with listing of hundreds to border. Produced in 1922. Minor staining to borders otherwise in good condition. 17"x17". Loosely laid down to card. G £70/100
- 10 Lancashire 1931. Linen handkerchief, 17"x17", with printed image of the Lancashire team with title to top 'Lancashire County Cricket Club Season 1931' and 'Champion County 1926, 1927, 1928 & 1930'. To the lower border the printed names of the team including Eckersley, E. & R. Tyldesely, Paynter, McDonald, Iddon, Duckworth etc. Minor foxing to borders otherwise in good/very good condition. - 11 'The Laws of the Game of Cricket c1744'. Large silk handkerchief with printed image of Hayman's 'Cricket in Marylebone Fields' to centre. 'Jos. Ware, Cranford Kent to lower border. Printed by Joseph Ware of Cranford, Kent, the handkerchief measures approx 27.75" x 27.25". Around the perimeter of this famous illustration are the oldest existing printed Laws of Cricket and date

- from 1744. The laws are written in cursive script and they describe a game quite different to modern cricket, overs consisted of four balls, there was no 'leg before wicket' rule and there was no restrictions on the size of the bat. Some minor marks, wear otherwise in good/very good condition. Reproduced in the 1960's by Liberty £70/100
- 12 Don Bradman. Rare and original 78 rpm vinyl 'Columbia gramophone Co' record with recording by Bradman entitled 'How It's Done- A Friendly Chat by Don Bradman of the Australian Cricket XI. 1930' and two piano solos 'Old Fashioned Locket' and 'Old Bungalow of Dreams' both by Don Bradman. In original paper sleeve. G £70/100
- 13 M.C.C. tour of Australia 1936/37. Official Orient Line 'S.S. Orion' brochure for the 'M.C.C. tour of Australia 1936/37'. Pictorial colour front cover. With team detail, itinerary, player profile and pen pictures etc to inside pages. G £30/50
- 14 'Constitution & Rules of the Wilde Bay and Burnett Cricket Association (Queensland) 1887'. Printed by Robinson & Co, Printers, Maryborough (for the Association). Small 10pp booklet with printed decorative wrappers. Some minor staining to wrappers with front wrapper detached. An early and rare Queensland club publication £250/350
- Not in Padwick. Maryborough club was founded in 1860*
- 15 'Constitution & Rules of The Queensland Cricket Association. As amended and adopted at a General Meeting, held on August 21st 1894. Also Fixtures and list of clubs, season 1894'. Printed by A.J. Ross & Co, Printers Brisbane (for the Association). Small 44pp booklet with printed decorative wrappers. Wrappers with some wear and staining otherwise in good condition. An early and rare Queensland publication £200/300
- Padwick 3511 records issues for 1896/97 and 1899/1900 to 1904/05 only*
- 16 'Le Monde Illustre'. Journal Hebdomadaire No 434. 9E Annee- 15 Juillet 1865. Paris 1865. This copy of the magazine has a full page illustration of the Oxford v Cambridge cricket at Lord's. Page 39 has a short article on the match and english cricket. Rare £40/60
- 17 M.C.C. tour of South Africa 1956/57. A good collection of ephemera from the tour including some items from the Harold Dalton collection, masseur to the team. Three tour brochures, edited by G.A. Chettle, Test match Natal and North-Eastern Transvaal editions, Union Castle List of Passengers (inc M.C.C. team), Itinerary (United Paints), Engagements folding card for Bulawayo, three official menus to Dinners and Luncheons and eight invitations to functions, Dinners and luncheons attended by the team and officials. - fold otherwise in good condition. Undated but 1926, the ticket has F.E. Lacey as Secretary of M.C.C. and he retired from the position in 1926. Sold with a similar admission ticket to Lords in the Australian Enclosure for Saturday 25th June 1934, with printed signature of the Australian Manager H. Bushby to ticket. Good condition. - 22 Cricket invitations, tickets, 1960/1980's. Includes official invitation card from the Australian Prime Minister to Ian Chappell regarding a Reception 1984, Invitation card for Presentation to Colin Milburn of the Lawrence Trophy for scoring the fastest century in Test cricket in 1969, ticket to see Trevor Bailey 'Talking Cricket' 1963, two invitation cards for the Ceylon Tea Centre County Cricket Awards 1967 & 1968, invitation card to the Cricket Writer Club Reception to the New Zealand tourists 1973, invitation card to a cocktail Party given to the West Indies cricketers 1973, T.C.C.B. invitation card to a press conference regarding the Benson & Hedges Cup competition in 1972 etc. Qty 10 £30/50

Very large ledger style scrapbook containing some period team photographs (not Hampshire) featuring Armstrong plus a number of book plate photographs taken from 'Famous Cricketers and Cricket Grounds' and laid down to pages. Also includes some loose ephemera including telegrams sent in 1885 and 1889 regarding Hampshire matches 'Armstrong bowled six wickets for eighteen runs. Many thanks for letting him come'. Also Southampton Cricket Club 1889 printed notice to raise subscriptions to recognise the services of Mr Armstrong to the club', Southampton Cricket Club fixture card for 1889, South Hants fixture list for 1895, Deanery Cricket Club fixture list for 1888 and South Hants C.C. 'Report of the Committee for the year 1883. The large ledger boards with title 'Cricket Snaps' has four silver shields attached, each relating to batting and bowling performances by Armstrong for the Deanery and South Hants C.C.'s in 1882 and 1883. Sold with two cricket caps, one a hooped cap in maroon, blue and gold and the other a cap with Lancashire emblem attached, both with wear and moth holes. G £100/150
- H.H Armstrong (Christian names unknown) was an English cricketer who was a right-handed batsman and a right-arm medium pace bowler. Known for his bowling Armstrong took 68 wickets at an average of 20.23. Armstrong's date of birth and death are lost to history. Armstrong finished with figures of 23 overs, 16 maidens, seven wickets for 33 runs in the match against Derby (see telegram note)*
- 28 Leicestershire Cricket Ground Company 1878. Early and rare season ticket for the 1878 season. This ticket hand numbered number 16 and signed by the Ground Manager W.H. Bearman and dated 18th April 1878. G/VG £80/120
- The present Leicestershire County Cricket Club was formed in March 1879*
- 29 Donald John Knight. Surrey & England 1911-1937. Small collection of ephemera relating to Knight including his Grenadier Guards commissions in 1916 and 1921, correspondence with the Guardian by his Wife regarding how he died. The Guardian originally published suicide but later apologised. His Father death certificate, letter to his wife regarding Knight including odd cricket references etc. G £30/40
- 30 'Alfred Mynn'. Two sided M.C.C. Christmas greetings card featuring Alfred Mynn to face, with biography by E.N.L. (Lucas) to verso. Sold with a similar M.C.C. printed card for the 150th M.C.C. Anniversary 1787-1937, again with poem by E.V.L. and notes to verso. Printed by Charles Skipper, London. Both cards with M.C.C. emblem and trimming to borders in M.C.C. colours. Sold with a selection of nine Christmas cards including Kent 1955, Surrey 1960's, Taverners 1960's etc and a further one sided printed card 'M.C.C. Gentlemen v Players, Lord's 1951 with images of cricket through the ages. G £30/40
- 31 'Some Notable Cricket Bats' Home Gordon. The Windsor Magazine 1906. Printed article on the bats sold with a collection of photographs, each laid down to card, of various signed cricket bats from the past. Various sizes. G £20/30
- 32 Ken Barrington. Order of service brochure for the Service of Thanksgiving for the life of Ken Barrington 1930-1981. Sold with various items of ephemera including Benefit match scorecard 1964. THE TOWNSEND FAMILY CRICKET COLLECTION

The Townsend cricketing dynasty is unique in cricket history as four consecutive generations of Townsends have graced the first class cricket stage. Frank Townsend, Gloucestershire 1870-1891, Charles Lucas Townsend, Gloucestershire, London County & England 1893-1922, David Charles Humphrey Townsend, Oxford University, Durham & England 1933-1935 and Jonathan Richard Arthur Townsend, Oxford University, Durham, Wiltshire & Suffolk 1964-1973. In addition, Charles Townsend's brothers, Arthur Fenton Miles Townsend, Gloucestershire & Essex 1903-1910 and Frank Norton Townsend, Gloucestershire & Transvaal 1896-1900 and his son, Peter Norton Townsend, Oxford University 1929 also played first class cricket. Seven members of the Townsend family played first class cricket from 1870-1965, almost a century of cricket!.

Frank Townsend, a free scoring middle order batsman and slow under-arm bowler played 169 matches for Gloucestershire between 1870-1891 and regularly played with W.G. Grace in the Gloucester team. He made two centuries with a highest score of 136 and took 101 wickets with an average of 25.24 and a best of 6-31

Charles Townsend, the most famous of them all, a sound middle order batsman and slow bowler, played 162 matches for Gloucestershire and made two appearances for England at Test match level. He created a sensation when, on leaving Clifton College in 1895 at the age of eighteen, he joined Gloucestershire and in that summer took 131

wickets making him the bowler of the season, prior to this in 1893, aged sixteen he took a hat-trick of stumpings, with the assistance of wicket-keeper William Brain, against Somerset at Cheltenham, a unique achievement which stands to this day. His best year with the ball was in 1898 when he took 145 wickets at 20.64. Perhaps he was over bowled at a young age, but from 1897 he became better known as an all-rounder for his batting and bowling ability, He played two Tests for England, against the Australians in 1899 and would have played more had his financial situation and work demands not prevented him. Barring the Graces, Gloucestershire has produced no such remarkable cricketer as Townsend. Charles Townsend took 725 wickets at an average of 23.11 with a best of 9-48 and scored over 9,500 first class runs at an average of 30.29 with a best of 224no

David Townsend, an attractive opening batsman played University cricket at Oxford and was selected for the M.C.C. tour of the West Indies in 1934/35. He opened in three of the five Tests on the tour making a top score of 36. He scored over 1,800 runs in first class cricket at an average of 29.04

Johnny Townsend, another opening batsman, played for Oxford University in 1964/65, and scored 64 against the 1964 Australian's, batting at number 3. He went on to play his county cricket for Durham, Wiltshire and Suffolk.

W.G. Grace played cricket with Frank and Charles Townsend, and was a good friend of the family, being Charles Townsend's godfather and Charles's Mother, Louisa was an accomplished artist specialising in miniature art, having several paintings exhibited in the National Portrait Gallery.

Quote from the Memorial Biography of Grace 1919, Frank Townsend, when asked if he was fond of Grace replied 'Yes, I loved every inch of the Old Man'.

The majority of the collection relates to Charles Townsend's cricketing career but there are also a

- Louisa Townsend** was the wife of Frank Townsend and an inaugural member of The Society of Miniature Painters, now the Royal Miniature Society, exhibiting five works in the Society's opening exhibition in 1896. She exhibited further works with the Society and six works at the Royal Academy between 1896 and 1920 including a portrait of W. G. Grace, in the year of his death 1915, which later acted as the frontispiece plate to 'The Memorial Biography of W. G. Grace', edited by Lord Hawke, Lord Harris and Home Gordon and published in 1919.
Although Grace was definitely the best known face of cricket in his day, he is still probably the most recognisable of cricketers to this day and was portrayed many times in photographs, the major media of the day, and cartoons and caricatures. Genuinely well painted portraits are, however, extremely rare and so these two watercolours, which can stand side by side with the Henry Scott Tukes studies of the great man, present fine opportunities of acquiring truly historic depictions of The Doctor.

- Edward Paynter played for Lancashire from 1926-1945, a short attacking batsman and an excellent fielder, who made his debut in 1926 but did not establish himself in the first team until 1930. He made his Test debut for England in 1931 against New Zealand. He went onto make 293 appearances for Lancashire, scoring over 20,000 runs in first class cricket at an average of 42.26 with 45 centuries. His top score being 322 for Lancashire v Sussex at Hove in 1937. For England, he played twenty Tests and averaged 59.23, the fifth highest of all time and second only to Herbert Sutcliffe amongst Englishmen and against Australia alone Paynter averaged an extraordinary 84.42. He toured with England to Australia in 1932/33, South Africa in 1938/39 and with the Commonwealth to India 1950/51. Perhaps he is best remembered for his Test appearance in the 4th at Brisbane, Paynter who was playing in the Test was taken to hospital suffering from Tonsillitis and a temperature of 102, with England well placed he was not needed to bat on the Saturday, by the Monday with his temperature still well above the average, he heard on his bedside radio of England wickets tumbling. He left the hospital in pyjamas assisted by Bill Voce and arrived at the ground just after tea. He batted almost immediately and batted for an hour and a quarter, making 24 not out. After another night in hospital, he took his score onto 83 and helped England to a small first innings lead, and although he only fielded for a couple of hours. Australia were soon all out and with a victory target of 160 runs to win, Paynter had the honour off hitting the winning runs, a six off Stan McCabe, to win the match and the Ashes. He averaged a fine 61.33 in the five Tests. The ball presented to Paynter following his heroics in the Brisbane Test sold for £5,000, hammer at Christies June 1990 auction

A nice lot of sports you are- like that mongrel Jardine: after Australia's gentleman Captain W. Woodfull got the blow over the heart. That bastard Jardine ordered all the men on to the leg side and Larwood to bowl at the man: when Woodfull got hit Jardine went up and congratulated Larwood. A more dirty thing has never been done on a cricket field. Thank god Australia has not got mongrels like Jardine the bastard amongst us. We play the game and if Oldfield had not got hurt you would not have won at Adelaide or Brisbane. And then you got a friend to write to the 'Herald' and ask them to take up a subscription for you after you had done all the pointing. You might get a few mugs to subscribe'. The letter headed Mebourne 18th February 1933 with printer name of sender

THE J.W. HEARNE CRICKET COLLECTION

John William Hearne. Middlesex & England 1909-1936. John Hearne, known as 'Young Jack' to distinguish him from his distant cousin J.T. Hearne', was a Middlesex leg spinning all rounder who represented England in twenty four Test matches from 1911 to 1926. One of the leading all rounders of his day, he achieved the 'double' five times and on three occasions exceeded 2,000 runs. He took over 100 wickets in a season five times. A slightly built right handed batsman who played scored eleven double centuries, all for Middlesex, the highest being 285no v Essex in 1929. As a bowler he was an immediate success with his sharp spin. As a teenager he took 7 wickets for two runs against Essex in twenty five balls in 1910. He toured with M.C.C. on five occasions to West Indies in 1910/11, Australia in 1911/12, 1920/21 & 1924/25 and to South Africa in 1913/14 but unfortunately never lived up to his performance for his County on the Test match stage. In all first class matches he scored over 37,000 runs at an average of 40.98, in Test matches, he scored 806 runs at an average of 26.00, with a top score of 114. His bowling followed a similar trend, in first class cricket, he took

- 1,839 wickets at an average of 24.42 with a best of 9-61 and took five wickets on 107 occasions, in Test matches he took 30 wickets at an average of 48.73 with a best of 5-49. He took 346 catches in first class cricket.

HERBERT SUTCLIFFE CRICKET COLLECTION

PART TWO

The following three lots were formerly the property of Herbert Sutcliffe, Yorkshire & England 1919-1945. The items were given to the vendors Husband and parents, the Husband being Sutcliffe's gardener as a youth and his parents looked after Herbert when they were neighbours in Ilkley, Yorkshire. The vendor has provided the following information:- We lived on the same road in Ilkley as Herbert Sutcliffe from about 1966 for ten years or so. My Mum and Dad helped care for him and Mrs Sutcliffe before he had to move into a retirement home. As a teenager I first used to wash his car (a Bentley) and then helped keep his garden tidy. My Dad was a real fan of his, and tried hard to find out why he was never knighted, as Dad was convinced he should have been. I suspect the letters give a clue to some of the reasons behind this. When Herbert was sorting out

some of his papers he asked my Dad if would like any of them, that's where the collection I now have came from . I remember that Herbert also asked me to burn a lot of old photos, etc., which I did in a bonfire at the bottom of his garden. Luckily those he gave my Dad escaped that fate! I inherited the box of papers after my Dad died."

The collection includes items from the M.C.C. tour of Australia 1924/25, where Sutcliffe became the first batsmen to score a century in each innings of a Test against Australia and became the first to score three successive hundreds in Test cricket. He went onto score a further century in the 4th Test played at Melbourne

In 1861, 'Spiers and Pond' brought over to Australia the first All-England cricket team, who sailed on I.K Brunel's steamship, SS Great Britain, from Liverpool. This was the

first commercial sponsorship of cricket.

The idea for the tour came from the English proprietors of a Melbourne company called Spiers and Pond, which ran the Café de Paris in the city. Spiers was Felix William Spiers and Pond was Christopher Pond. Their representative in England, a Mr Mallam, had tried to interest Charles Dickens in a lecture tour of Australia and New Zealand but without success. Instead, having noted the success of the 1859 venture and the growing popularity of cricket in Australia, Spiers and Pond decided to attract a team of leading English cricketers. Mr Mallam therefore journeyed to Birmingham in September 1861 to watch the North v. South game at Aston Park. During the game, Mallam met the cricketers at the nearby Hen and Chicken Hotel to make a business proposal. As a result, twelve players agreed to tour Australia next winter on terms of £150 per man plus expenses.

REG SIMPSON CRICKET COLLECTION

This annual started life in 1863 and ended in 1896 with nine issues being produced intermittently in 23 years.
