AUTOGRAPHED CRICKET EPHEMERA

- 1 Andrew Ernest Stoddart, Middlesex and England 1885-1900. Handwritten letter regarding the completion of a nomination paper with the comment, 'It seems hardly cricket weather yet but you may commence tomorrow if you wish'. Nicely signed in ink 'A E Stoddart'. The letter with one horizontal fold and some foxing is laid to card otherwise in good/very good condition £100/150
Stoddart captained England on two tours to Australia, leading England in eight tests and played rugby by England ten times
- 2 Sir Spencer C.B. Ponsonby. Handwritten letter on Lord Chamberlain's Office, St James's Palace headed paper regarding the security of St Paul's. Nicely signed in ink by Ponsonby 'Spencer Ponsonby' (later Ponsonby Fane). Light horizontal and vertical folds, otherwise in very good condition £40/60
Spencer Cecil Brabazon Ponsonby was on the M.C.C. Committee 1866-68, 1870-1873, 1875-1878, Treasurer from 1879 to his death in 1915. He was a founder member of the Surrey Committee and President of Somerset C.C.C. from 1890. He helped in founding I Zingari
- 3 Sir Archibald Woollaston White, Yorkshire 1908-1920. Small handwritten letter announcing his availability to play in the F.F. v. The R.A. match on 14th-15th July (no year). 'I am up for the F.Fs and should be very glad to play if you could give me a place'. Nicely signed in ink 'Archibald W. White'. Light horizontal fold, otherwise in very good condition £60/80
White captained Yorkshire 1912-1914
- 4 Frank Stanley Jackson. Yorkshire & England 1890-1907. One page letter handwritten on 'The Leeds Club' headed paper to a Mr Grace 'Very many thanks for the Kodak Photos I needed this morning, they are wonderfully good and are the source of great admiration'. The letter dated 26th June 1895 and nicely signed by Jackson in ink. VG £100/150
- 5 John Arlott. Small card with two sided handwritten letter from Arlott to Donald J. Knight (Surrey & England 1911-1937) 'The last time we met you were kind enough to say that you would sign my copies of your books for my collection..... Many thanks-and I hope we may meet soon in what must, surely be, a great summer for English cricket'. The card dated 12th February 1953 and nicely signed by Arlott. VG £40/60
- 6 Pelham Francis Warner. Middlesex & England 1894-1920. Handwritten letter on 'The Cricketer' magazine headed paper dated 10th November 1936 from Warner to Mr Goldman with good content regarding Goldman's book collection. 'What a wonderful collection of cricket books you have!. I congratulate you'. Nicely signed by Warner. Fold marks otherwise in good condition £60/80
- 7 William Gilbert Grace. Gloucestershire & England 1865-1908. Handwritten three page letter, on London County Cricket Club headed paper, in black ink to 'Braddon' (?) and dated 20th February 1901. The letter concerns the Boer War and a ball that was presented to Grace. Also refers to Frank Townsend (Gloucestershire C.C.C. 1870-1891)... Frank Townsend... a very good wicket keeper and bat... if you can do anything for him, I shall be very glad to hear of it, and so will his father and mother. He has had no chance of doing any shooting, but will make a good shot with a weeks practice'. Nicely signed in ink by Grace. Adhesive marks to fourth page not affecting text, odd faults otherwise in good condition £250/350
Hugh Townsend died in 1901 fighting in the Boer war
- 8 Dr Edward Mills Grace, Gloucestershire and England 1870-1895. Handwritten letter on Park House, Thornbury headed paper, dated 20th October 1907. 'Is the enclosed quite correct. Kindly let me know.' The letter nicely signed in ink by Grace 'Edward Mills Grace'. Light horizontal fold otherwise in very good condition £180/250
- 9 Hugh Richard Bromley-Davenport, Middlesex and England 1892-1899. Handwritten letter dated 5th November 1948 replying to a request for autographs. 'I particularly want to get you Gubby Allen's, but he doesn't come in regularly to the S. Exchange'. He also refers to the the 'splendid start our captain - Mann - has made' and questions the bowling of Wright. Nicely signed in ink 'H. R. Bromley Davenport'. Light horizontal fold, otherwise in very good condition £60/80
Bromley-Davenport, right hand bat, left arm fast bowler, played four tests for England and was one of the few players of his era to play cricket wearing glasses
- 10 Sir Leonard Hutton, Yorkshire and England 1934-1955. Handwritten letter dated 3rd November 1987 on 'The Forty Club' headed paper, acknowledging receipt of a book. Nicely signed in ink 'Len Hutton'. Light horizontal and vertical folds, otherwise in good condition £20/30
- 11 William Storer, Derbyshire and England 1887-1900. Handwritten letter responding to a request for souvenir bat 'I gave them away at the end of the season'. Nicely signed in ink 'W. Storer'. Very good condition £80/120
Storer played six tests for England as wicket-keeper and also played football for Derby County
- 12 Lord Harris, George Robert Canning, Kent & England 1870-1911. Three page handwritten letter from Harris to Aunt Flo (!). General family business. The letter written on 12, Motagu Street headed paper and

- dated 15th June (no year), nicely signed 'Harris'. G £70/100
- 13 Bernard J.T. Bosanquet. Middlesex & England 1898-1919. Handwritten two page letter from Bosanquet to a Geoffrey Moore. The letter dated 5th February 1935 and on personal embossed stationery 'Salut, Pyrford, Surrey'. Mainly cricket and golf content 'Glad to hear Mr Leveson-Gower has become a vice President. I shall always be much interested in the club and hope I may be able to take a more practical interest than before'. Nicely signed by Bosanquet. G £60/90
- 14 Arthur E.R. Gilligan. Surrey, Sussex & England 1920-1932. Three page handwritten letter from Gilligan to 'Fred' with excellent cricket content written from 'The Adelaide Club' on the M.C.C. tour of Australia 1950/51, presumably Gilligan was there in a journalistic role. He talks of 'having a very nice time in Tasmania and some really good cricket-Denis Compton being in great form (Compton made 142 and 77), meeting Vic Richardson in Melbourne, the high temperatures, talks of the tour match v South Australia currently being played 'M.C.C. batting here on Saturday, looking very good.... we're dining at Government House Banquet...so that should be most pleasant'. The letter dated the 29th January 1951 and nicely signed by Gilligan in ink. G £50/80
- 15 Hon Alfred Lyttelton, Cambridge University, Middlesex and England 1876-1887. Handwritten letter dated 11th April 1906 to the Dean of Christchurch. Nicely signed in ink 'Alfred Lyttelton', the signature slightly smudged. Light folds otherwise in good condition £100/150
Lyttelton was President of M.C.C. in 1898. Also played for Worcestershire C.C.C. (not first class) and represented England at football in 1877 and played for Old Etonians in the 1876 F.A. Cup Final. Lawyer & Statesman and Colonial Secretary 1903-1905. He became an M.P. in later life
- 16 Major Edward George Wynyard, Hampshire and England 1894-1912. Small handwritten letter dated 24th May 1934 responding to a request for his autograph. Nicely signed in ink 'E.G. Wynyard'. Laid down to album page. Very good condition £80/120
- 17 Charles Burgess Fry, Sussex and England 1892-1921. Handwritten letter dated 2nd March 1934 apologising for not being able to make an appointment. Nicely signed in ink by Fry 'CBF'. Light horizontal fold and minor ink smudging otherwise in very good condition £60/80
- 18 Paul Antony Gibb, Yorkshire, Essex & England 1934-1956. Handwritten letter dated 27th July 1958 replying to a request for a photograph. Nicely signed in ink 'Paul A Gibb' with the original envelope. Light horizontal folds otherwise in good/very good condition £40/60
- 19 Gerald de Lisle Hough, Kent 1919-1920. Handwritten letter on Kent County Cricket Club headed paper, dated 8th April 1948 replying to an enquiry about a past player. Nicely signed in ink by Hough 'G. de L. Hough'. The letter is laid down to paper with light folds and minor staining otherwise in good condition £40/60
Hough was appointed manager of Kent in 1934 and secretary in 1936
- 20 Christopher Heseltine, Hampshire & England 1892-1914. Handwritten letter dated 27th November 1942 replying to a request for his autograph. Nicely signed in ink by Heseltine 'Christopher Heseltine'. Light horizontal fold otherwise in good condition £50/70
- 21 Northern Cricket Society. Menu for the dinner 'in honour of the Indian Cricketers' held at Guildford Hotel, Leeds 6th June 1952. Signed by Yorkshire C.C.C. President, William Worsley, Len Hutton, who gave the vote of thanks and members of the Indian touring party and other dignitaries. G/VG £40/60
- 22 'The Lancashire County and Manchester Cricket Club. Dinner to celebrate the sharing of the County Championship with the Surrey County Cricket Club 1950'. Official menu for the Dinner held at the Midland Hotel on the 21st November 1950. With excellent decorative cover, red ribbon tie, menu, toasts, season's record etc. Signed to inside front cover by eleven of the Lancashire playing staff including Place, Statham, Grieves, Washbrook, Edrich, Berry, Howard, Greenwood etc. VG £60/90
- 23 Surrey County Cricket Club Championship Dinner 1959. Official menu for the Dinner held at The Grosvenor House, Park Lane on the 15th April 1959, with team photograph to inside pages. Sold with a signed Surrey 'County Champions' autograph sheet for 1958. Thirteen signatures including Stewart, Barrington, Loader, Lock, Edrich, Jefferson, Storey, Tindall etc and a further Surrey 'County Champions' autograph page for 1956, signed by thirteen members of the squad including May, Bedser, Lock, Barrington, McIntyre, Laker, Loader etc. G £40/60
- 24 'C.B. Harris Benefit Souvenir card' 1949 signed by Nottinghamshire players including Jepson, Butler, Simpson, Voce, Woodhead, Hardstaff, Butler, Keeton, Harris, Stocks etc. Printed by Meads of Nottingham. Sold with a Nottinghamshire C.C.C. 'Who's Who in Nottinghamshire County Cricket Club' leaflet c1940 featuring twenty caricatures and biographies drawn and compiled by Underwood. Printed and Published by Barnes & Humby, Nottingham. G/VG £50/80
- 25 Australia 1956. Official P&O souvenir tour programme for the England v Australia Tests of 1956. The programme with fixtures, travel details and pen pictures and biography of all members of the Australian team to pages. Signed to pen pictures by all sixteen members of the team plus the Manager W.J. Dowling. The centre page image of the ship 'R.M.S. Himalaya' signed by Bill O'Reilly. Very minor fading to the signatures of Davidson and Wilson, minor gae toning to covers, ownership name and notes to first page otherwise in good condition £180/250
- 26 Australia 1948. Official 'P&O R.M.S. Strathaird' souvenir brochure for the Australian tour of England 1948. Printed in Sydney. Pictorial covers. Fully signed in ink to pen pictures by

- all eighteen members of the Australian touring team. Signatures nicely signed include Bradman, Hassett, Miller, Harvey, Johnson, Lindwall, Barnes, Loxton, Morris, Ring, Toshack, Tallon etc. Some minor age toning and wear to covers, some light fading to signatures otherwise in good condition. Rare £250/350
- 27 M.C.C. tour of Australia 1920/21. Large official Orient Line S.S. Osterley card with centre colour image of the ship at sea. With titles to top border 'Visit of M.C.C. team to Australia 1920/21' and dates of voyages from London and Australia in 1920/21. Signed in ink around the colour image of the ship by the full M.C.C. touring party. Seventeen signatures including Douglas, Woolley, Hearne, Wilson, Fender, Hobbs, Dolphin, Rhodes, Waddington, Makepeace, Howell, Parkin etc. Also signed to lower border by five senior members of the ships crew. The card measures approx 8.5"x7.5". Rare. Some marks, odd faults otherwise in generally good condition £300/400
- 28 Lancashire C.C.C. One Hundred Years at Old Trafford 1884-1984. A blue presentation album containing commemorative covers, post card, photographs, scorecard for the test match vs West Indies, each item laid down to a page with signatures to the borders. Signatures include umpires Dickie Bird and Don Oslear, past players including Statham, Wharton, Place, players from the West Indian test team including Lloyd, Holding, Haynes, Marshall, Walsh, England players including Gower, Ellison, Lamb, Fowler, squad members of the 1984 Lancashire county side, and players from the 'Laker' Test Match including Laker, Statham, Cowdrey, Sheppard etc. Ninety nice signatures in total. - 29 Lord Hawke. Ink signature of Hawke on piece with full page sepia book plate photograph of Hawke in batting pose wearing Yorkshire cap. G/VG £70/100
- 30 Keith Miller, Australia. Press cuttings laid down to four pages, six cuttings signed in ink by Miller. G £30/50
- 31 Arthur William Carr. Nottinghamshire & England 1910-1934. Excellent ink signature of Carr on blue paper piece, laid down to larger card. VG £25/35
- 32 James Joseph Kelly. New South Wales & Australia 1894-1905. Excellent ink signature of Kelly on paper piece, laid down to card. G £80/100
- 33 Frank Woolley. Kent & England 1906-1938. Excellent ink signature of Woolley on paper piece, laid down to larger card. VG £25/35
- 34 Henry 'Harry' Rigden Butt. Sussex & England 1890-1912. Pencil signature of Butt on paper piece, laid down to larger card. G £30/50
- 35 Albert Edward Relf. Sussex & England 1900-1921. Pencil signature of Relf on paper piece, laid down to larger card. G £30/40
- 36 Victor Thomas Trumper. New South Wales & Australia 1894-1914. Pencil signature of Trumper on paper piece, laid down to larger card. Signature slightly rubbed otherwise in good condition. Rare £200/300
Victor Trumper was regarded by his contemporaries as the greatest of all Australian batsman, with the exception of his form in England. He died in June 1915 from Bright's disease
- 37 Albert Edwin Trott. Victoria, Middlesex, London County, Australia & England 1892-1910. Ink signature of Trott on paper piece, laid down to larger card. Rare. VG £100/150
Australian born, Albert Trott played for Victoria and Middlesex between 1892 and 1910. He also is one of few players to have played for both Australia, 3 Tests and England, 2 Tests. Trott remains the only batsman who has struck a ball over the top of the Lord's pavilion. He committed suicide by shooting himself, having been ill for some time with little hope of recovery, in 1914
- 38 George 'Harry' Henry Stevens Trott. Victoria & Australia 1885-1908. Ink signature of Trott on paper piece, laid down to larger card. Rare. VG £140/180
- George Trott, brother of Albert, played in twenty four Tests for Australia between 1888 and 1898. He captained Australia on the 1896 tour of England and in Australia in 1897/98
- 39 Jack Morrison Gregory. New South Wales & Australia 1920-1929. Ink signature of Gregory signed to top brown border of part of the front cover of 'The Jubilee book of Cricket'. G £25/35
- 40 Douglas Robert Jardine. Surrey & England 1921-1933. Ink signature of Jardine on paper piece, laid down to album page. Rare. VG £100/150
- 41 Bodyline Test players. Selection of seven signed cards and paper pieces, all signed by a Test player from the 1932/33, Australia v England, series. Signatures are Harold Larwood, Bill Bowes, Bob Wyatt, Freddie Brown, Maurice Leyland, Gubby Allen and Bill Voce. G £70/100
- 42 Australian tour of England 1948. Selection of four signed cards, signed by Keith Miller, Doug Ring, Arthur Morris and Ernie Toshack, two signatures are signed to pieces and laid down to card. G £40/50
- 43 Herbert Sutcliffe, Yorkshire & England. News Chronicle cricket competition certificate presented to R. Gray, Moorlands School, Far Headingley, Leeds 'for the best batting performance during the week ended June 24th 1933'. Nicely signed in ink by Sutcliffe and the editor of the newspaper. 13"x18". Certificate laid to card, bumping to lower left corner, minor ageing, wear and stain otherwise in good condition £30/50
- 44 Don Bradman. Australian tour of England 1934. Original 'The Savings Bank of South Australia' advertising ink blotter, unused. To face are printed cameo pictures of the team with Test match fixtures to centre and 'Our Sporting Ambassadors. Test Fixtures 1934. Success to the Team!. The Savings Bank of South Australia will help you to achieve success' to reverse is the pink ink blotter. 8.75"x3.75". Signed in later years by Don Bradman to centre. VG £30/50
- 45 Sir John Edward Kynaston Studd. Middlesex 1878-1884. Excellent ink

- signature of Studd on piece, signed when he was Lord Mayor of London in 1928. Laid down to larger pieces with image of Studd. G £50/70
- 46 William Gilbert Grace. Gloucestershire & England 1870-1899. Excellent ink signature of Grace on large paper piece. VG £200/300
- 47 Francis G.J. Ford. Middlesex & England 1886-1899. Excellent ink signature of Ford on note on 'Bounders, Burwash, Sussex' headed paper. Adhesive marks to verso. G £60/90
- 48 Charles Lucas Townsend, Gloucestershire, London County & England 1893-1922. Short handwritten letter from Townsend regarding the place of his birth in Clifton College. The letter dated February 1944 and nicely signed in ink by Townsend. G £70/100
- 49 Middlesex 1923. Album page nicely signed by eleven members of the team. Signatures include Mann, Dales, N.J.D. Moffatt, Childs-Clarke, Durston, Beton, Hendren, Hearne etc. To verso are ten signatures of the Warwickshire team of 1923 including Calthorpe, Stephens, B.W.Quaife, W.Quaife, Wyatt, Santall, Bates, Howell, Smart etc. Some rarer signatures. The West Indies played at Eastbourne on their opening tour match against L.C. Stevens XI in April 1950. The match was drawn
- 63 West Indies tour of England 1939. Official folding card itinerary for the tour beautifully signed to front colour cover by Learie Constantine. The itinerary with title to centre and West Indian emblem above and decoration to lower corner. Fixtures to inside pages with tour party listed to rear cover. Good condition. Rare £60/90

Gerald French (1883-1970) played two First Class matches for the M.C.C. and twenty matches for Devon in the Minor Counties Championship.

John Richard Lowndes French, 2nd Earl of Ypres (1881-1958), older brother to Gerald French, was the son of the British field marshal and the first commander of the British Expeditionary Force in World War I, Sir John French. He followed his father by joining the army and he served with the Royal Field Artillery but his military career was cut short following a riding accident. French was also a talented artist, something which did not endear him to his father.
