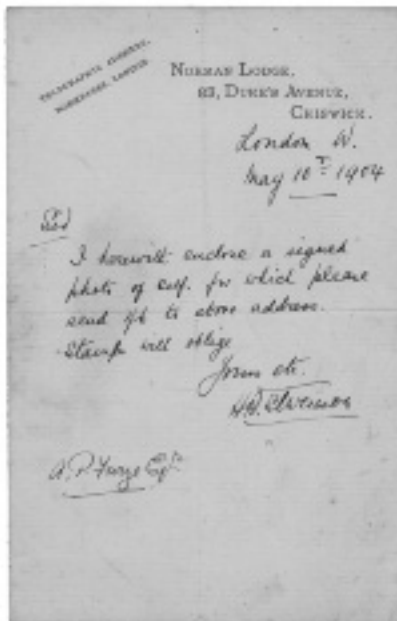

- 736 Olympic Games 1948. Collection of twelve original gilt (11) and one silver metal blazer buttons produced to be used on Olympic blazers for the Great Britain team of 1948. The buttons consist of three different sizes 20cm (3), 18cm (5) and 14cm (4). The buttons, with the five Olympic ringed emblem and 'Great Britain' beneath to face and to verso 'British Olympic Association', are unused and in excellent condition. Loosely mounted on card. Rare

- The vendors Grandfather worked for Arthur Howard & Son of Ealing, London who supplied blazers for the Great Britain team in 1948 and other Olympic Games. He measured Prince Phillip for his Olympic blazer and his son, the vendors father modelled the blazer*

- Aidan Merivale Crawley, MBE (1908-1993) was a British journalist, television executive and editor, and politician. He was a member of both of Britain's major political parties, the Labour Party and Conservative Party, and was elected to the House of Commons as a Labour MP from 1945 to 1951, and as a Conservative MP from 1962 to 1967.*
- 749 Lilleshall National Sports Centre, Shropshire. Official red leather bound visitors book from the centre signed by many sportsman, sportswoman and journalists from a variety of sports, both from Great Britain and around the world, from 1951 to 1983 (with some breaks). The book is signed to the first lined page by H.M. Queen Elizabeth II, who was then Princess Elizabeth, the entry dated the 8th June 1951, and by Prince Phillip, dated the 23rd November 1954, the day he opened the sports pavilion. The book is signed by various teams, associations and individuals, teams include the England International Football team 1956, Tottenham Hotspur Football team 1959, The British Olympic Hockey team 1952, Great Britain Hockey Team 1956, South African Hockey Team 1957, Nigerian Empire Games Team 1958, 25th Anniversary-Press Reception 1976, England Football Association Youth Squad 1980, Great Britain Hockey team 1980, Tottenham Hotspur Football team 1981, F.A. Staff Coaches Presentation Evening 1982, Southampton Football Club 1983, England, Scotland, Spain Youth football teams 1983, various cricketers 1950/70's etc. The England football team of 1956 (12 signatures), signed in October of that year, included three Manchester United players who died in the Munich Air Disaster, Duncan Edwards, Tommy Taylor and Roger Byrne, other signatures include Walter Winterbottom, Billy Wright, Stanley Matthews, Don Revie, Colin Grainger etc. The Tottenham Hotspur Football team 1959 (18) includes Bill Nicholson, Cliff Jones, Maurice Norman, Ron Henry, Bobby Smith etc. Other signatures include Harry Altham, Bill Voce, Hallows, Fishlock, Alan Fairfax, Mary Duggan, Walter Robbins, Bill Edrich, E.R.D. Eagar, Charles Palmer, W. Ashdown, Brian Sellers, Freddie Brown, Gubby Allen, G. Geary, Clyde Walcott, J. Ikin, G. Duckworth (all cricket), Emyln Hughes, Mark Hately, Gary Mabbutt, Tommy Caton, Steve Perryman, Don Howe, Bobby Robson, Peter Shilton (all football), Suzanne Dando, Jonah Barrington, Lynn Davies, Lord Litchfield, Stanley Rous etc. All the signatures signed in ink or biro. The National Sporting Club was a club founded in London in 1891, which did more to establish the sport of boxing in Great Britain than any other organisation. The club was founded in 1891 as a private club. Its premises were in Covent Garden, London. The founders were John Fleming and A.F. "Peggy" Bettinson, and Hugh Lowther, 5th Earl of Lonsdale was its first president. The club was run under very strict rules regarding both the boxers and the members. Bouts would take place after dinner, before about 1,300 members and guests. In 1909, the club's president introduced the Lonsdale Belt as a prize to be awarded to the British champion at each weight. The belts were made from porcelain and twenty-two carat gold.

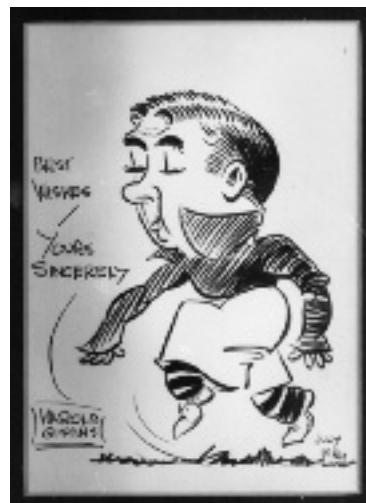

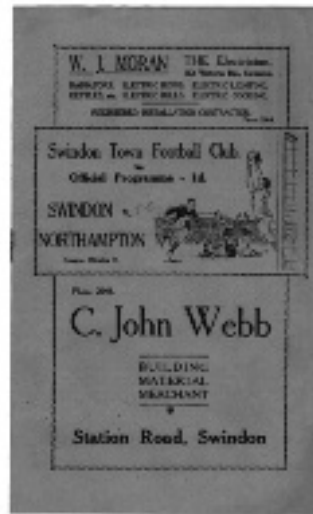
