CRICKET EPHEMERA

- 1 'The Norwich Gazette'. Early and original 'tabloid' size weekly four page newspaper for August 30th to 6th September 1729, printed by Henry Crofs-grove of St. Gile's Parish, Norwich. With four line paragraph reporting 'On Thursday last, a Great cricket match was played at Penshurst Park...between Kent, headed by John Stead esq and Sussex and Hampshire, headed by Sir William Gage, for 100 guineas, 11 a side'. The newspaper has some minor wear to edges and 3" split to spine otherwise in good condition for its age. A rare item - cricket

- 2 'The General Evening Post (London)'. Early and original 'tabloid' size four page newspaper for 29th to 31st August 1738, published by J. Roberts of Warwick Lane. With five line paragraph reporting 'On Monday last, a great Match of Cricket was played on Epping Road, between the Gamesters of Woodford and those of Stratford, for a considerable sum of money, which was won by the former, by a majority of 40 notches'. The newspaper has some wear to edges with small loss, folds, light staining, wear to spine otherwise in good condition for its age. A rare item - cricket

- 3 'The London Chronicle'. Early and original 'tabloid' size eight page newspaper for 25th to 28th July 1789, published by T. Wilkie of St Paul's Churchyard. With one and a half columns recording 'Laws of the Game' of cricket together with rules on betting on the game, an early record of the laws. The newspaper has some minor wear to edges, minor wear to spine and light staining otherwise in good condition for its age. The newspaper contained in a blue slipcase with the bookplate of A.E. Winder. A rare item - cricket

- 4 'The Ipswich Journal'. Early and original broadsheet four page newspaper for 20th August 1831, printed by Postle Jackson of the Old Butter Market. With three paragraphs plus scorecard recording 'Grand Cricket Matches', two matches between the Marylebone and Norwich Clubs (played at The New Ground and at Dereham, Norwich) and a further match between the Marylebone club and Bury (St. Edmunds) (played at Field Lane). Players included in the teams included many great players of the day including Pilch, Beagley, Lilywhite, Wenman, Caldecourt, Dark, Cobbett etc. 'The former day was remarkably fine, and the field was numerously and fashionably attended, many ladies adding the charms of their company to the gaiety of the scene'. The article also contains major coverage of the throwing dispute 'Mr Blake followed and having shown a disposition to run in at the first ball of Lilywhite, he threw the next ball so violently as to break a bone of Mr Blake's hand, which of course, prevented him from proceeding in the game.... We understand that many Gentlemen have expressed their determination not to play again, unless the throwing system is put to a stop to, since it is both attended with danger, and precludes any reasonable chance of even good players making runs... Both Umpires Bentley and Matthews admitted the bowling to be altogether contrary to the law, but as the throwing system was tolerated at Lord's, they did not venture to call 'no ball' in the country. The newspaper has some small loss to the spine edge and a slit to a fold on the front page otherwise in good condition for its age. A rare and very interesting article - cricket

- Ashdown made his first-class debut aged 15 in 1914 and his last was in 1947. He is the only cricketer to have played in first class matches before the First World War and after the Second*
- 20 Gloucestershire C.C.C. Fixture booklet for 1946 including 'Laws of Cricket and a Few Records'. Decorative covers with a photograph of W.G. Grace to the front. General wear and ageing - cricket £20/30
- 21 'England's Test Team. Season 1946/47'. M.C.C. tour of Australia 1946/47. Original single page colour calendar featuring title to centre with calendar months and to outer borders cameo pictures of all seventeen members of the touring party. - 22 Samuel Parr Senior. Small memorial card with embossed tomb design. Hand written inscription in ink 'In memory of the late Mr Samuel Parr Senior who died February 20 1857 in his 78th year'. The card measures 4.5"x3". G - cricket £40/60
- Samuel Parr Senior scored 58 for Radcliffe-on-Trent v Nottingham Old Club in 1800. He is mentioned in the book 'Kings of Cricket' by Richard Daft. His sons George, Henry and Samuel Junior were successful cricketers*
- 23* West Indies Australia tour 1984/85. Official West Indies Christmas card from the tour with printed message to inside. Players names printed to back. G/VG. Rare - cricket £20/30
- 24 M.C.C. tour to India, Sri Lanka & Australia 1976/77. Official M.C.C. Christmas card from the tour. With M.C.C. colours and title to front, real mono photograph of the team loose mounted. Photograph by Bristol Photographic Stores, Bombay. Sender unknown. VG - cricket £20/30
- 25 Albert Craig. 'To Honest George Burton. The Popular Middlesex Bowler'. Original broadsheet poem in tribute to Burton sold at the Middlesex v Surrey match played in 1889. Surrey won by six wickets. Burton had bowled well for Middlesex in the season to date and Craig celebrates in typical fashion a worth professional bowler. Advertisement for F.H. Ayers to verso. Minor foxing and slight wear to page edges otherwise in good condition. Rare - cricket £80/120
- 26 'The Australian Cricket Team 1909'. Folding fixture card for the Australian tour of England 1909. Decorative covers, with title, with cameo pen pictures of the players and facsimile signatures of the tourists to inside pages and tour fixtures to back cover. R.F. Steel. 'The Block'. Melbourne. Some identification annotation to inside marks, some minor wear and age toning to outer covers otherwise in good+ condition. Rare £180/250
- The fixture card was probably only presented/issued to players and officials*

- 27 Pelham Francis Warner. Middlesex & England 1894-1920. Type written copy of Warner's Executor's Accounts detailing the values of his estate and chattels, sales of investments etc. Includes a summary of family bequests linked to his final will detailing the disposal of chattels. Dated March 1965. G - cricket £60/80
- 28 George Gibbons Hearne. Kent & England, 1875-1895. Original death certificate dated 13th February 1932 following Hearne's death at Kings College Hospital, London from pneumonia. G/VG - cricket £30/50
George Hearne hit 1000 runs in the 1886 season and took 100 wickets in a season twice. He played one match for England on the 1891/92 tour to South Africa
- 29 E.W. Swanton. An original thirteen page typed manuscript of an article titled 'Alec Victor Bedser OBE: The Genuine Article' with Swanton's own annotations. Written for 'Now Magazine' c1970s, the article is 'a portrait of Alec Bedser, the great cricketer, not a eulogy' and covers his playing career and that of an England selector. Rare. - 30 Victorian cricket scraps. Brown folder containing an excellent collection of cricket related scraps and real photograph postcards of village cricket teams etc. Odd one signed. G - cricket £30/50
- 31 John 'Jack' Berry Hobbs, Surrey & England 1905-1934. Collection of over thirty press cuttings laid down to eight large album pages. The cuttings report on Hobbs' batting achievements between 1923 and 1925, including scoring his 100th hundred in 1923 and passing W.G. Grace's record of 126 First Class centuries in 1925. - 34 Australia v England 1946-1947. 'Cricket Country' Edmund Blunden 1945. The front end papers nicely signed in ink by the two teams who played in the first Test played at Brisbane on the 29th November to the 4th December with heading 'Australia 1st Test England 1946. Thirty two signatures, twenty members of the M.C.C. touring party, including Howard, Manager, Ferguson, scorer and the masseur, and twelve members of the Australian team who played in the Test. Signatures include Don Bradman (Cpt), Barnes, Hassett, Johnson, Miller, Tallon, Toshack, McCool, Lindwall, Tribe, Morris, Hammond (Cpt), Hutton, Compton, Edrich, Bedser, Gibb, Wright, Yardley, Washbrook, Ikin, Voce, Evans etc. Also signed by the two umpires, George Borwick and John Scott opposite the title page. Odd faults to the book including some light foxing otherwise in good condition. Rare signatures from this first Test £150/250
This was the first Test match played between England and Australia after the end of the Second World War. Australia won the Test by an innings and 332 runs. For Australia, Bradman made 187, Hassett 128, McCool 95, Miller 79 and Miller took 7-60 and 2-17, Toshack took 3-17 and 6-82. For England, Hammond and Ikin made 32, Yardley 29 and Wright took 5-167
- 35 'Twenty Years at the Top'. Garry Sobers. London 1988. Very nicely signed by Sobers to front end paper. Dustwrapper. Sold with an Endurance Ltd-The Art of Sport cricketing figure of 'Sir Garry Sobers. West Indies 1953-1973'. The figure stands approx 12" high with certificate of authenticity signed by Sobers. - 36 South Africa 1947. Official souvenir brochure for the South African tour of England in 1947. Compiled by A.W. Simpson. Decorative covers. Signed to pen pictures by all eighteen members of the touring party, including the manager, Frames. Signatures nicely signed in ink include Melville, Mann, Fullerton, Plimsoll, Lindsay, Nourse, Viljeon, Rowan, Mitchell etc. Also signed to pen picture by Dewes of England. Minor wear and ageing, otherwise G - cricket £100/150
- 37 Australia 1934. Official 'Australian Board of Control for International Cricket. 18th Australian XI. English Tour 1934'. Official folding card itinerary for the tour of England with printed details in gold and green with map of Australia to bottom left hand corner. To inside pages names of the Australian team and full itinerary of matches to be played in England. Signed to the inside by Cyril Walters of England. Rare. Minor wear, otherwise G £80/120
Cyril Walters unexpectedly Captained England in his first Ashes Test match, deputising for Wyatt who had broken his thumb
- 38 George Oswald Browning 'Gubby' Allen. Cambridge University, Middlesex & England 1921-1950. 'The Badminton' diary for 1958 containing his sporting and private appointments for the year (in his hand). Name written in ink to inside front cover and signed by Allen in pencil to front end paper. G/VG - cricket £50/70
- 39 Leo O'Brien. Victoria & Australia, 1929-1938. Original 'Commonwealth of Australia International Driving Permit' issued to O'Brien, 21st April 1959. Signed by O'Brien below the passport size photograph to the inside rear cover. Some wear, otherwise G - cricket £50/70
- 40 Harold T.W. Hardinge. Kent & England 1902-1933. Excellent ink signature of Hardinge on card piece, laid down to slight larger paper piece. G - cricket £20/30
- 41 Herbert Strudwick. Surrey & England 1902-1927. Excellent ink signature of Strudwick on card piece, laid down to slight larger paper piece. G - cricket £20/30
- 42 John William Hitch. Surrey & England 1907-1925. Excellent ink

- signature of Hitch on card piece, laid down to slight larger paper piece. G - cricket £20/30
- 43 Ernest G. Hayes. Surrey & England 1896-1919. Excellent ink signature of Hayes on card piece, laid down to slight larger paper piece. G - cricket £20/30
- 44 Thomas de Grey. 6th Baron Walsingham 1843-1919. Ink signature of Walsingham on paper piece/snippet. G - cricket £25/35
Walsingham was a Conservative Member of Parliament for West Norfolk from 1865 until 1870, he became a Government Whip of Benjamin Disraeli from 1874-1875. He was a keen lepidopterist (butterflies and Moths). His collection was donated to the British Museum along with his library of 2,600 books. Walsingham was a first class cricketer and played in fifteen matches with a highest score of 62. He was mainly associated with M.C.C. and Cambridge University, also players in the Gentlemen v Players match of 1863
- 45 Right Honourable Sir Fleetwood Isham Edwards 1842-1910. Ink signature of Edwards on paper piece/snippet. G - cricket £25/35
Edwards served in various government positions including aide de camp to the Governor of Bermuda 1867-1869, groom in waiting to Queen Victoria from 1880 and from 1895 became Keeper of the privy purse etc. He played in one first class cricket match for I Zingari in 1866 v Gentlemen of the South which included W.G. Grace and his two brothers. He became a member of M.C.C. in 1870
- 46 Brownlow Cecil, 2nd Marquess of Exeter 1795-1867. Ink signature of Exeter on paper piece/snippet. G - cricket £25/35
Cecil was a British Peer, courtier and Tory politician. A keen cricketer who was associated with M.C.C. prior to his political career. He appeared in one first class match for W. Ward's XI v E.H. Budd's XI at Lord's in 1817
- 47 Alan Plantagenet Stewart. 10th Earl of Galway 1835-1901. Ink signature of Galway on paper piece/snippet. G - cricket £25/35
- Stewart was a British peer and politician, educated at Harrow. He played first class cricket for the M.C.C. between 1858 and 1864*
- 48 Hugh Richard Dawnay. 8th Viscount Downe. Ink signature of Downe on free front envelope. G - cricket £30/50
Dawnay was a British Army General and President of M.C.C. He fought in the Anglo-Zulu war in 1879 and also in the Boer War between 1899 and 1901. A cricketer he played for I Zingari and the M.C.C. playing in the M.C.C. v Aborigines Test at Lord's in 1868 in the first tour of England by an Australian team. He became President of M.C.C. in 1872
- 49 William Gilbert Grace. Gloucestershire & England, 1870-1899. Excellent ink signature of Grace on paper piece headed 'Gloucester' with signature beneath. Window mounted with a small photographic image of Grace above. Attractively mounted, framed and glazed. Overall approx 8"x12". VG - cricket £120/160
- 50 Donald George Bradman. New South Wales, South Australia & Australia 1927-1949. Excellent ink signature of Bradman on paper piece. Window mounted with a photographic image of Bradman wearing 1930 cap and blazer above. Attractively mounted, framed and glazed. Overall approx 11.5"x16". VG - cricket £50/70
- 51 Cricket signatures c1930's. Selection of five album pages, one individually signed in pencil by Jack Hobbs, another by Herbert Strudwick and a paper piece very nicely signed in ink by Denis Compton. The other three pages have smaller album pages laid down to pages, one signed in pencil by five members of the Essex team, J. Freeman, Russell, O'Connor, Nichols and Cutmore, another signed in pencil by five members of the Derbyshire team, Bowden, Townsend, Lee, Cresswell and Hutchinson and the last signed in pencil by various players including Bowes, Hulme, Verity, E. - 52 J.B. Hobbs, Surrey & England 1905-1934. Good ink signature of Hobbs on paper piece, laid down to card.

- 53 Douglas Robert Jardine. Surrey & England 1921-1933. Ink signature of Jardine on larger irregular cut paper piece. VG - cricket £50/70
- 54 Percy G.H. Fender. Sussex, Surrey & England 1910-1935 and Andrew Sandham. Surrey & England 1911-1937. Two excellent ink signatures of the two players on paper pieces. G/VG - cricket £25/35
- 55 Herbert Sutcliffe. Yorkshire & England, 1919-45. Album page nicely signed in black ink and in fun 'Herbert Sutcliffe D.S.O. PhD'. VG - cricket £35/50
- 56 Sussex C.C.C. Two signatures of A.E. Relf on piece laid down to card, and R.R. Relf on piece. Both signed in pencil. G - cricket £25/35
- 57 Cricket autographs. Selection of twenty one, mainly autograph pages, signed by over fifty five cricketers including Ames, Bedser, Evans, Graveney, Jenkins, Boycott, May, Warr, L. Compton, Bailey, Eagar, Cook, W. Edrich, L. Harrison, Gray, J. Young, Yardley, Roebuck, Rose etc. Sold with a pirate programme for the 1961 Australian tour and a Supplement of the England team who won the Ashes in 1926 (All Sports). G £20/30
- 58 Len Hutton. Yorkshire and England. One page handwritten letter from Hutton, dated May 1951, regarding an engagement he was asked to attend. Nicely signed by Hutton. Corner loss otherwise in good condition £25/35
- 59 Sir Edward William Wallington. Oxford University 1875-1877 and M.C.C. Two page handwritten letter on Buckingham Palace letterhead regarding supplying fire grates and asking to be sent a catalogue of grates, sizes and prices. The letter dated 19th January 1912. Signed E.W. Wallington. Mounted. Some age toning otherwise in good condition - cricket £40/60
Wallington gained his blue at Oxford in 1877. His last match was played for M.C.C. in 1885. He was groom in waiting to the then king, then the Prince of Wales and Private Secretary to the Queen. Prior to that he was the Private Secretary to the

- Governor of Fiji 1883-1885, spent many years in Australia and in 1889 was appointed Secretary to the Melbourne club and in the same year became Private Secretary to the then Governor of Victoria. He played a little cricket for Wiltshire and Dorset. In 1881 his team E.W. Wallington's XI played Hobart Town and Wallington made 91*
- 60 William Gilbert Grace. Gloucestershire & England, 1870-1899. Two page hand written letter, on London County Cricket Club letterhead, from Grace to 'Heald' regarding some confusion over the payment of a subscription. 'I have asked Murch about your subscription and he remembers you paying him. I am sorry any mistake has arisen. When you did not receive any receipt, I think you should have enquired of me whether I had received the money.....'. Nicely signed by Grace and dated 20th October 1906. Folds and minor nicks to edges otherwise in good condition. VG - cricket £200/300
- W. Murch played for London County 1901-1904*
- 61 Charles Burgess Fry, Sussex & England 1892-1921. One page hand written letter, on Naval School. T.S. Mercury, Hamble, Hants, from Fry to a Mrs M.H. Olztel (?) asking for support to fund the training ship from a previous subscriber 'As you have been kind enough to help 'The Mercury, in the past, I am writing to express a hope that the ship may continue to receive your help. The internal work here shows better results then ever before in the number and quality of boys sent into the Royal Navy. But every week we have to refuse entries of deserving boys because we have not the money to take them..... Please help the 'Mercury' if you possibly can'. The letter dated 29th October 1912 and nicely signed in ink by Fry. Folds, good condition. Rare to see a letter from Fry on 'T.S. Mercury' headed paper - cricket £80/120
- The T.S. Mercury was one of a number of similar, mostly static training ships located round the coasts of Britain and founded during the Victorian period to provide boy recruits for the Royal Navy. It was founded in 1885 as a charitable venture by Charles Arthur Richard Hoare, a partner in the banking firm of C. Hoare & Co, with the objective of rescuing poor boys of good character and training them for naval service. Over the years the establishment was increasingly managed by Charles Hoare's mistress Beatrice Holme-Sumner. The entire establishment was moved from Binstead to Hamble near Southampton in 1892. In June 1898 Beatrice Holme-Sumner married C. B. Fry, the great England cricketer and all-round sportsman, and in 1908, after the death of Hoare, Fry became the Mercury's Captain-Superintendent. In 1950 C.B. Fry retired and handed over command of TS Mercury to Commander Matthew Bradby RN Rtd.*
- 62 Len Hutton. Yorkshire and England. One page handwritten letter from Hutton, dated 11 December 1947, to a Miss Nelson regarding an autograph request and also giving her the addresses of Cyril Washbrook and Norman Yardley. Nicely signed by Hutton G - cricket £25/35
- 63 John Berry Hobbs, Surrey & England 1905-1934. One page handwritten letter from Hobbs, dated 6th February 1948, to Joan Nelson regarding an autograph request and also giving her the address of Herbert Sutcliffe at the County Ground. Nicely signed by Hobbs. G - cricket £30/40
- 64 Glamorgan C.C.C. archive players letters. Collection of nine autograph letters and postcards signed and one telegram, May 1889, relating to a match in Swansea at the end of month where players have stated that they are unavailable to play, Players include H. - Charles Townsend, a sound middle order batsman and slow bowler,*
- played 162 matches for Gloucestershire and made two appearances for England at Test match level. He created a sensation when, on leaving Clifton College in 1895 at the age of eighteen, he joined Gloucestershire and in that summer took 131 wickets making him the bowler of the season, prior to this in 1893, aged sixteen he took a hat-trick of stumpings, with the assistance of wicket-keeper William Brain, against Somerset at Cheltenham, a unique achievement which stands to this day. His best year with the ball was in 1898 when he took 145 wickets at 20.64. Perhaps he was over bowled at a young age, but from 1897 he became better known as an all-rounder for his batting and bowling ability, He played two Tests for England, against the Australians in 1899 and would have played more had his financial situation and work demands not prevented him. Barring the Graces, Gloucestershire has produced no such remarkable cricketer as Townsend. Charles Townsend took 725 wickets at an average of 23.11 with a best of 9-48 and scored over 9,500 first class runs at an average of 30.29 with a best of 224no*
