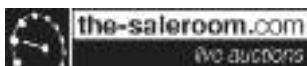

4. Postage and packing will be charged at current rates for all postal deliveries.
- 4a. Postage and packing is subject to V.A.T. at 20%.
5. The seller warrants to the Auctioneer and to the buyer that he is the true owner or is properly authorised to sell the property by the true owner and is able to transfer good and marketable title to the property free from any third party claim.
6. The highest bidder to be the buyer. If during the auction the Auctioneer considers that a dispute has arisen he has absolute authority to settle it or re-offer the lot. The Auctioneer may at his sole discretion determine the advance of bidding or refuse a bid, divide any lot, combine any two or more lots or withdraw any lot without prior notice.
7. CRICKET EPHEMERA

- 452 Band of Brothers dinner menu, 1884. Small decorative menu for the 'Dinner given by the "Band of Brothers" to the "Philadelphians" at the Star Hotel, Maidstone on Friday 25th July 1884'. The two sided menu with attractive original water colour face with title, England and American flags and two ribbon bows inscribed 'Brotherly love maketh a Band of Brothers'. Menu printed to verso. Adhesive damage to verso affecting menu, otherwise G - cricket £60/80
- The dinner took place on the evening of the final (second) day of the match against Kent which Kent won by 6 wickets. This was the first tour by the Philadelphians*
- 453 'Argentina v Santiago' 1928. Menu for a dinner held at the Prince of Wales Country Club, Santiago, dated 23rd December 1928. The menu in the shape of a cricket bat with pale blue and white ribbon to handle. 'Mr Wilson' annotated in ink to the menu. Printed title to lower border of mount. Mounted, framed and glazed, overall 16"x3.5". G - cricket £30/40
- Records exist of Argentina touring Chile in 1928/29 playing Chile twice, and a G. Wilson scoring 147 for Argentina in their first innings in the match played 25th-27th December 1928. It is possible that this might be Geoffrey Wilson who captained Yorkshire from 1922 to 1924. The menu was framed in Leeds*
- 454 Australian tour to England 1948. Rare official menu for the dinner held at Richmond Town Hall, Melbourne, 18th February 1948, on the eve of Australia's departure to England to W.A. Johnston and D.J. Ring. The printed menu on marbled card with Richmond Cricket Club emblem and titles to front. Sold with a M.C.C. and Sheffield Shield folding fixture card and a 'Mazda Lamps' book mark, both for 1958/59, and an 'England v Australia Souvenir Scorecard and Fixture List' for 1956. Qty 4. G - cricket £50/70
- 455 'Leicester and Leicestershire Cricket Association. List of Matches 1875'. Early printed fixture list for first class, county and club and matches played in the 1875 season. Minor foxing, otherwise in very good condition for the year. Rare - cricket £150/250
- 456 Lisbon Cricket Club, 1861. Official receipt no. 24 issued to Robert Johnson Esq. for his subscription to the Club for the season. Signed in ink by Walter Boughton, Treasurer. Folds, tape repair and minor ageing, otherwise G - cricket £50/80
- Annual matches between Lisbon and Oporto were first played in 1861, the year for which this receipt is dated. Cricket was first established in Portugal during the Peninsular War when Wellington's troops were encamped in Lisbon*
- 457 'Rules of the Cheltenham and County of Gloucester Cricket Club' 1863. Early and rare four page printed leaflet listing the officers of the Club and Club rules. Committee members include Mr C. Jessop, Mr F. Jessop and Mr J. Lillywhite. Folds, tape repairs and minor loss, otherwise in generally good condition - cricket £300/400
- The Club was founded in 1863 as a rival to the Mangotsfield Cricket Club (latterly West Gloucestershire Cricket Club) which had been founded by Dr Henry Grace, father of the three famous Grace brothers. The two Clubs were amalgamated in 1870 to form Gloucestershire County Cricket Club*
- 458 Hampshire C.C.C. Early member/fixture 'Lady's Ticket' card for the 1920 season. The folding card in black leather with decorative titles to front and rear, with bound in printed fixture lists for the 1920 season. Stamped to the inside no. K34. G/VG - cricket £15/25
- 459 Frank Henry Crawford, cricket bat maker. Interesting original copy of Crawford's contract with Henry Luff trading as John Wisden for a five year apprenticeship as a cricket bat maker. Dated 29th April 1908 with wax seal in good/very good condition. Sold with a later four page advertising leaflet for F.H. Crawford's own bat and hockey stick making company. Vertical fold, small tears to page edges, otherwise G - cricket £60/80
- 460 'Cricket Books. Great Collectors of the Past'. Blue folder with printed title 'Prospectus' containing details of the forthcoming publication of the book by Irving Rosenwater in 1975. Printed on handmade paper including original order form. Rare. VG - cricket £30/40
- 461 David Hookes, Australia. Official printed order of service for Hookes' memorial service held at the Adelaide Oval, 27th January 2004. Sold with another order of service for Bob Berry, Lancashire, Worcestershire, Derbyshire & England, 11th December 2006. VG - cricket £25/35
- 462 'The Australian Eleven 1884'. Gunn & Moore calendar/ advertising show card c1920s. Excellent original colour advertising card/board featuring a colour lithograph laid to the card with vignettes of the captain W.L. Murdoch, surrounded by slightly smaller vignettes of the Australian team superimposed on Gunn and Moore bats with cricket scenes and local attractions in the background. Players' names are listed to lower border. Printed advertising slogan 'For Over 50 Years, leading players, the world over, have used Gunn & Moore's "Autograph" Bats' and company details to borders. Original hanging cord to top border, small pin holes to lower border where the original calendar would have been attached. Mounted, framed and glazed, overall 17"x13.5". Excellent original condition - cricket £100/150
- 463 'The English Eleven 1885'. Gunn & Moore calendar/ advertising show card c1920s. Excellent original colour advertising card/board featuring a colour lithograph laid to the card with vignettes of the captain W.G. Grace, surrounded by slightly smaller vignettes of the English team superimposed on Gunn and Moore bats with cricket scenes and local attractions in the background. Players' names are listed to lower border. Printed

- 465 Gunn & Moore calendar. Card calendar with mounted colour reproduction of the painting 'A Cricket Match at Brading', with folding calendar for 1963 laid to lower border and printed titles to either side and brown hanging cord to top. Published by Robinsons of Bristol. Overall 15"x11.5". G/VG - cricket £25/35
- 466 Birmingham Cricket Club, 1823. Poster advertising a production of Sheridan's play 'Rivals' on 30th May 1823, 'By Desire and under the Patronage of the Birmingham Cricket Club'. The poster, loose mounted, measures approx. 8"x12". Light creasing and ageing, otherwise G/VG. Rare - cricket £250/350
- 467 'Elusive Victory'. 16mm sound film from the M.C.C. tour to Australia 1950/51. Written by E.W. Swanton, filmed by John Woodcock. E.W. Swanton's own copy. The film features a young Brian Johnston interviewing the touring party before departing, including the Captain Freddie Brown and Alec Bedser, ending with Woodcock waving off the party as they board the flight home. 13.5" reel in round grey tin. Label to film annotated in ink 'Copy E.W. Swanton, J.R. Woodcock'. G - cricket £80/120
- Australia won the Ashes series 4-1, with England winning the final Test. John Woodcock is a cricket writer and journalist. He was cricket correspondent of The Times from 1954 to 1988 and editor of Wisden Cricketer's Almanack for six years
- from 1981 until 1986
- 468 Cricket scrapbooks 1890s to 1950s. Interesting collection of six large scrapbooks containing original laid down press cuttings, cigarette cards, printed caricatures of W.G. Grace, original cameo photographs, articles, match tickets, cartoons by RIP, trimmed book dustwrappers etc covering the period. Four of the scrapbooks compiled by C.I.S. Wallace, well known collector of cricket books and ephemera. Fair/good condition, two lacking covers - cricket £80/120
- 469 Warwickshire C.C.C. County Champions 1951. Scrapbook compiled by the book dealer E.K. Brown containing press cuttings, letters addressed to E.K. Brown relating to the Players Championship Testimonial Fund, scorecards etc. Some laid down, others loose. Also includes a programme for the Members' Championship Celebration held at the County Ground on 23rd April 1952 between H.E. Dollyer's XI and W.E. Hollies XI. Covers detached with some loss, otherwise in fair/ good condition - cricket £50/70
- 470 E.W. Swanton. Interesting archive of correspondence relating to Swanton's article published in the Sunday Telegraph in 1962 to commemorate the Centenary of the founding of Clifton College. The article referred to the highest recorded score of 627no by A.E.J. Collins when a pupil at Clifton College in 1899, and the letters, typed and handwritten, are from the Headmaster at Clifton, the Secretary of the Centenary Celebrations, Collins' widow, the scorer during the match and numerous former pupils and contemporaries of Collins, all congratulating Swanton on his article and their own reminiscences of the occasion. The scorer notes that 'when the innings was drawing to a close I was so badgered by masters and reporters who kept on snatching the book out of my hand that I really do not know what the score was. However the score is substantially correct, 627 +/- 20, shall we say". From Swanton's own archive - cricket £100/150
- Arthur Edward Jeune "James" Collins is known as having the highest ever recorded individual score in a cricket match, made when aged 13. His innings was made over four days. Surprisingly, Collins never played first class cricket
- 471 England, Australia and South Africa. Triangular Series 1912. Original copy of the Manchester Evening News 'Cricket Edition' for 3rd August 1912. Includes articles regarding the triangular series including scores and reports for Lancashire v South Africans and Derbyshire v Australians. Odd faults and minor loss, otherwise G - cricket £20/30
- 472 No lot
- 473 Yorkshire C.C.C. 1970/80s. Collection of Test and County match tickets, guest passes, dinners etc. VG - cricket £25/35
- 474 Cricket match tickets/pass outs 1963-2001. Collection of over fifty tickets and passouts. Includes Australia v England 1963 (Sydney), Queensland v South Australia 1977 (tied match), Australia v India 1979 (Calcutta), Pakistan v Zimbabwe 1992 (World Cup), Victoria v England 1990 (Ballarat), Queensland v West Indies 1991, Australia v West Indies 1992, Australia v England 1994, Australia v West Indies 1996 (Gabba), Australia v Pakistan 1996, Mainly Australian matches. - cards, signed trade cards, a piece of 'Parr's Tree' at Trent Bridge blown down in a storm in 1976, ceramic model of Lord's Cricket Ground etc. A comprehensive collection. G £50/70
- 477 Cricket ephemera. A box of ephemera including 'Sobers. The Changing Face of Cricket' signed by Sobers. 'Centenary of Australia & England Test Cricket 1877-1977. Limited Edition Print Folio'. Sydney 1977 large square brochure including nine pages of colour plates in original portfolio with six loosely inserted limited edition colour reproductions of early cricket prints. Ashes tour brochures and books 1930 to 1964. Four 1960s Playfair annuals, signed by Hampshire, Kent, Middlesex and Yorkshire players, in poor condition. Album page signed in pencil by Len Hutton. - 479 'W.G. Grace. Champion Cricketer of the World'. Large cotton handkerchief commemorating a Century of Centuries by Grace. The handkerchief has a central portrait of Grace three quarter length in cricket attire holding a cricket bat, with biography and record of each individual score and opponents to outer border. Decorated with cricket bats and balls in a floral outer border. Produced in 1895 the handkerchief is printed in black. 24"x21.5". Minor rust spots and stains otherwise in excellent condition. Sold with a small press cutting laid down to paper from The Daily Mail, 27th January 1960 about the handkerchief - cricket £70/100
- 480 'England's Champion Batsman. J.B. Hobbs. Surrey & England XI' 1922. Large linen handkerchief with printed headings and five images of Hobbs in various batting poses plus total runs and average in first class cricket up to 1922. Listed to outer border are details of centuries scored by Hobbs. 17"x17". Odd rust spots, otherwise in very good condition - cricket £60/90
- 481 'Ladies Day Canterbury Cricket Week'. Large silk handkerchief with colour scene of an early eighteenth century match in progress, spectators to foreground, Canterbury Cathedral in the background. Made by Rhodia of Italy c1970s. 26"x26". VG - cricket £25/35
- 482 'Cricket. Here is a nice three-quarter ball, guard your wicket or down they fall'. Rare and attractive Victorian cricket handkerchief, c1870/80's, with scenes of boys playing cricket. Cotton handkerchief with large printed image to centre of boys playing the game. The handkerchief predominately coloured in red and black with colourful border surround. 14.5"x13". Ink initials to one corner of the handkerchief, odd minor faults, otherwise in very good condition with bright original colour. Attractive period image - cricket £140/180
- 483 'At Play, Cricket'. Rare and attractive American cricket handkerchief, c1870/80's, with delightful scenes of boys playing cricket. Cotton handkerchief with large printed image to centre of two boys playing the game holding bats with wickets to rear. Further images of the game to right and left quarters of the handkerchief with captions, 'Well Caught', 'Fielding', 'The New Bat' and 'After Play'. The handkerchief predominately coloured in red and black with decorative border surround. To top border of surround is the makers name 'S.H. Greene & Sons. Washington. 12.5"x12.5". Minor staining and slight fraying to edges, wear to the 'Fielding' caption, otherwise in good/very good condition with bright original colour. Attractive period image £100/150
- 484 Cricket tea towels. Three modern cotton and linen tea towels. 'W.G. Grace 1848-1915' with village cricket scene, 'Cricket as explained to a foreign visitor', and 'All-England Twelve - second expedition to Australia 1863-1864' by Ulster. Each approx. 30"x20". Adhesive marks to the borders of the Ulster, otherwise G/VG - cricket £20/30
- 485 McGrath Foundation 'Pink Test'. Large pink silk handkerchief produced for the Test match played at Sydney, 3-7 January 2015. The handkerchief with bright pink background, with 'Commonwealth Bank Test Series' emblem to centre, surrounded McGrath Foundation and sponsor's logos, match dates to borders. 19"x20". VG - cricket £15/25
- The Foundation was set up by Glen McGrath and his late wife, Jane, to raise awareness of breast cancer*
- 486 'The Laws of the Game of Cricket c1744'. Large silk handkerchief with printed image of Hayman's 'Cricket in Marylebone Fields' to centre. 'Jos. Ware, Cranford Kent' to lower border. Printed by Joseph Ware of Cranford, Kent, the handkerchief measures 27.75" x 26.5". Around the perimeter of this famous illustration are the oldest existing printed Laws of Cricket and date from 1744. The laws are written in cursive script and they describe a game quite different to modern cricket, overs consisted of four balls, there was no 'leg before wicket' rule and there was no restrictions on the size of the bat. Reproduced in the 1960's by Liberty. VG £60/80
- There are examples of this handkerchief in both the Lord's and Melbourne museums and they are referred to in 'Treasures of Lord's'. Tim Rice. London 1989 (page 62) and Glorious Innings: Treasures from the Melbourne Cricket Club Collection'. Richard Bouwman. Hawthorn, Victoria 1987 (page 10)*

Linen handkerchief, 17"x17", with printed image of the Lancashire team with title to top 'Lancashire County Cricket Club Season 1931' and 'Champion County 1926, 1927, 1928 & 1930'. To the lower border the printed names of the team including Eckersley, E. & R. Tyldesely, Paynter, McDonald, Iddon, Duckworth etc. Minor stains, otherwise G/VG - cricket £40/50
- 489 England v Australia, Headingley 1981. Large 'silk style' handkerchief produced to commemorate the 'famous' third Test match, England v Australia, Headingley 1981. Ian Botham and Bob Willis's match. With details of the match and caricatures of Botham and Willis by Roy Ulyett. 21"x19". VG - cricket £15/25
- 490 'The Eleven of England 1847'. Original early silk commemorative handkerchief depicting the England eleven of 1847, after the watercolour by Felix. The handkerchief portrays Sewell, Lillywhite, Pilch, Dorrington, O.C. Pell, N. Felix, Clarke, Dean, W. Dennison, A. Mynn, Parr & Guy. Mounted overall 35"x39". Some age toning, wear and loss to folds on centre of image, other odd faults to extremities. A rare and early handkerchief in generally good condition for its age - cricket £300/400

- 725 'West Indies v Australia and Old Trafford 1955'. Five page typewritten manuscript/article by Len Hutton for the News of the World Newspaper, dated 26th May 1955, on the importance of top class bowling 'at both ends' and describes the bowling combinations of Gregory and McDonald, Larwood and Voce, Lindwall and Miller, and Tyson and Statham, pointing out the fact that the West Indies had no such attack in defeat to the Australians, their first home series defeat. Hutton then describes in length why he feels Australian batsman do so well on good wickets,

- mentioning the batting of Morris and the other leading Australian batsman and then goes on to state that the three 'W's (Worrell, Weekes and Walcott) are 'not the same attacking weapon of a few years ago'. He also notes the significance of the waning of the form of West Indies spinners Ramadhin and Valentine, speculating that 'Perhaps Ramadhin has gone stale after so much cricket'. Hutton remembers 'going out to bat against "Sonny" for the first time in 1950. As I was taking guard, massive Clyde Walcott, the wicket-keeper, remarked to me:- "You're going to have some trouble with this lad, Len... I've kept wicket to him many times and I still can't tell which way he's going to turn the ball and I'm two yards further away from him than the batsman. So I don't fancy your chances!'. Hutton continues by describing "Roses" battles at Old Trafford, in particular the long and steep stairs to the third floor dressing room. 'When Warwickshire played Lancashire there recently, Freddie Gardener... injured his back while batting. Freddie, then 46 not out had to be carried from the field by his team-mates. Then began the tortuous climb up those stairs. By the time they had hauled him into the dressing room the boys were exhausted'. Ink annotations to the manuscript in Hutton's own hand. - 726 'Test series v South Africa 1955'. Five page typewritten manuscript/article by Len Hutton for the News of the World Newspaper, dated 2nd June 1955, on the impending first Test against South Africa at Nottingham. In his capacity as a selector he provides a fascinating insight into the characteristics required to be a successful Test cricketer and the factors the selectors have to take into consideration to balance batting, bowling and fielding needs. 'First of all, playing ability is essential. A close second is what is known as "big match temperament".' Examples he gives include Denis Compton's innings of 150 out of 199 for Middlesex and Trevor Bailey, '... a good all-round cricketer... Put Bailey into a Test match, however, and he produces his flair for playing "above himself"... perhaps the Test match scene finds him really at home'. He also refers to Herbert Sutcliffe, Maurice Leyland and Eddie Paynter whose Test records were better than their county achievements. Hutton also recalls the temperament of Keith Miller who in 'lesser games... "just couldn't get interested"', whereas in the Sydney Test of 1950/51 Miller was called on to bowl with England comfortably on 128-1. 'He had been fielding on the boundary, actually talking to a spectator, but he started bowling as fast as I have known him... England were 137 for four and in trouble. Soon after turning the match upside down, Keith returned to his post on the boundary!' Excellent cricket content. G - cricket £250/350
- 727 'Test series v South Africa 1955'. Four page typewritten manuscript/article by Len Hutton for the News of the World Newspaper, dated 16th June 1955. The article discusses the subjects of managing bowlers and analysing opposition batsmen. In particular he refers to the fact that 'bowlers especially are temperamental souls and a captain has to make an intensive study of them'. Examples Hutton quotes include Doug Wright who '...could tell, even after one over, if things were going well for him. He would tell the skipper so and the wise captain treated him accordingly', and Brian Statham to say "Sorry, skipper, but I don't seem to be clicking at the moment". He continues to explain why on occasions he would make a bowling change even after the previous bowler had taken one or two quick wickets, based on the captain's analysis of a batsman's weaknesses and which bowlers 'are the best men to exploit a frailty'. He quotes the example of Neil Harvey whom, Hutton claims, was less successful against England than other countries. 'Neil's first movement at the crease is to put his left foot across the wicket, bringing his right shoulder so that he is square on to the bowler... so that he becomes vulnerable to balls moving in to him in the region of leg stump'. Hutton also describes the psychology of the fielding team playing on a batsman's weakness. Ink annotations to the manuscript in Hutton's own hand. Excellent cricket content. G - cricket £200/300
- 728 'Test series v South Africa 1955'. Six page typewritten manuscript/article by Len Hutton for the News of the World Newspaper, dated 30th June 1955. Hutton wrote this article shortly after scoring his first century of the season, 194, for Yorkshire at Nottingham. Whilst clearly delighted with his performance, he describes his regret at not watching the 'thrilling' Test match at Lord's, won by England by 74 runs, and compares it to the first Test played at Nottingham two weeks prior which England had won easily by an innings and five runs, '... people have asked me to explain such a marked difference in the cricket played by practically the same twenty two players within so brief a space of time' and explains this is due to the 'State of the wicket decides the cricket'. He discusses the difficulties in assessing how a pitch will play and how 'Pitch preparation, I assure you, is one of the most difficult and hazardous affairs in the game and I wonder whether some folk ever will be satisfied'. He then writes in length on the improvement in the bowling of Brian Statham. Hutton continues by discussing the importance of partnerships, both batting and bowling, describing how the success of batting partnerships, such as Hobbs and Sutcliffe, Ponsford and Bradman, and his own with Washbrook, were based on mutual respect, friendship and support. Bowlers such as Gregory and McDonald, Geary and Astill, Newman and Kennedy, Larwood and Voce, etc '... have all hunted in pairs and one without the other has seldom been so effective'. Ink annotations to the manuscript in Hutton's own hand. Excellent cricket content. G - cricket £250/350
- 729 'Don Bradman'. Original and six page typewritten manuscript/article on the subject of Don Bradman, written by Len Hutton. 'In the spring of 1930, I found myself as a 14 year old schoolboy watching Yorkshire v the Australians at Bradford. The

journey of some 5 miles from my native town of Pudsey was made with the purpose of seeing Don Bradman. I did see him, but very briefly, he was LBW to Emmott Robinson for one'. Over thirty years later I mentioned this innings to Don, and like a flash he replied, 'Yes, I remember I nicked it'. What a memory, what a batsman, what a remarkable man. The next time I saw Don Bradman he made 309 runs in one day against the might of England at Headingley, I was just passed my 14th Birthday and went along to the match with a man who had been unemployed for several years, the great depression was on in Yorkshire at that time'. Hutton talks of Bradman going 'on to make 334, a score which I was to exceed 8 years later at the Oval'. He then didn't see Bradman for 8 years until his debut at Trent Bridge in 1938. Hutton talks of speaking to Wilfred Rhodes who stated that 'Don was the best he ever bowled against', George Macauley being hit for sixteen off four balls, Bradman batting on bad or rain affected wickets, his batting on the 1930 tour, his ability at any game 'for no matter what game he played he could have been a Champion at any of these games'. He talks of Bradman being born in the country, good climate, his confidence, his ability to hit the vacant places in the field, his footwork, his stance, his batting against Farnes in the Lord's Test of 1938 etc. There is a deleted paragraph (deleted in pencil in the form of a cross in pencil) regarding 'Jealousy (due to his talent) amongst the cricketers of Sydney, jealousy that was to follow him all along the road until the day came to lay down his bat. I have had some experience of these feelings, but I have always felt how much easier it is in England to start in your stocking feet than it is in Australia..... Don wanted to be a Champion, hence perhaps the reason why Don was considered a little on the hard side, but I never noticed, making full allowance for the hard days which he must have known as a youth, Don was a product of his environment'. He then talks of his record breaking innings at the Oval, '(Bradman) stationed himself eight yards from me at silly

mid off... until I reached 335, so before each ball I had a good look at Don.... when I passed his record score of 334, Don was the first to congratulate me, and he did so most generously, as indeed did the rest of his team'. Hutton then talks of Bradman's private and home life, his ability at Billiards, his moderate drinking, Bradman's love of playing in Yorkshire and the appreciative crowds there, his great captaincy qualities etc. Hutton finishes 'Australia can be proud of Don Bradman, any country would be proud to have produced him. Those of us who played against him and knew him will never forget him, his boyish enthusiasm stayed with him all the way, and his chirpy 'good day' was just the same when I last saw him'. Wonderful cricket content. Date and purpose unknown. Some handwritten alterations in Hutton's hand to typewritten manuscript. G - cricket £400/600
