- 139 All India tour of England 1936. 'Complimentary Dinner in honour of All India Cricket Team and Mr A.P. Freeman's XI 1936'. Official menu for the Dinner given by The Mayor of Gravesend (G.R. Croft J.P.) held at The Town Hall Gravesend on the 29th April 1936. The official decorative menu, with four printed pages to inside, with Mayor's emblem and titles to front cover with blue ribbon bow tie. Menu, toast list, teams names and music to inside pages. VG. Scarce - cricket £80/120
- This was the first match of the Indian tour played at the Bat & Ball Ground, Gravesend and the match was drawn, Ramaswami 41, Amarnath 40 Ashdown 65, Woolley 54 and Edrich 4-42*
- 140 'Kent County Cricket Champions 1906'. Rare official menu for the 'Banquet to The Champion Team' celebrating Kent winning their first ever County Championship in 1906. The Banquet held at the Corn Exchange, Maidstone on October 10th 1906 with the Mayor in attendance. Original raised and embossed decorative covers with Maidstone emblem to centre with purple ribbon tie, gilt to edges. Four printed pages to inside, the first being a title page with cameo portraits of members of the Kent team, menu, toasts and programme of music to other pages. Printed by the Post Office Printing Works, Maidstone. Minor foxing and soiling to covers otherwise in very good condition. A scarce item of Kent cricketing history £120/160
- 141 Surrey C.C.C. 'County Champions' 1952. Official menu for the 'Championship Dinner' held at the Cafe Royal, on 3rd December 1952. Menu with raised Surrey emblem in silver to front cover, brown ribbon tie to exterior and mono photograph of the team attached to inside. Sold with six 'Annual Dinner' menus from 1949, 1950, 1954, 1955, 1956, 1957. All with raised Surrey emblem in silver to front cover. Qty 7. G/VG £30/50
- 142 M.C.C. tour of Australia 1928/1929. Official S.S. Ormonde Dinner menu for the Complimentary Dinner given on board by Mr James Ferguson to commemorate the return of 'The Ashes'. The Dinner was held on the 17th April 1929 and has a view of the ship to front cover, title page with borders in M.C.C. colours, listing of the team, menu and two page cricket song to inside pages. Sold with a Union-Castle R.M.S. "Arundel Castle" passenger list brochure, dated March 2nd 1928. Qty 2 - cricket £70/100
- 143 Scarborough Cricket Club v The Parsees (Bombay, India) 1888. Early and original handbill for the match played at the Cricket Ground, North Marine Road, Scarborough on the 27th August 1888. Title 'Grand Cricket Match at Scarborough' to top border and below 'The Parsees (from Bombay) versus the Scarborough Club. This Grand Match will be played on the Cricket Ground, North Marine Road This Day. Wickets pitched at 12 o'clock. The match bill printed in black and red print and to lower border 'Refreshments provided on the Ground by Mr Bishop, Star Hotel. Admission sixpence'. The handbill, with folds, has some wear and nicks to edges and minor worm holes, the majority to top and lower border and odd one to main body otherwise in good condition Printed by J. Maude of North Street, Scarborough. A rare item from the tour £700/900
- The match bill comes from direct descent from Jal Merwanjee Morenas who toured both in 1886 and 1888 with the Parsees, one of only two players to make the trip twice. Although the match bill is not dated, it is believed that it relates to the 1888 match*
- The match was drawn, the Parsees batted first and made 119 all out, Bapasola top scored with 34, Scarborough then batted and made 140 all out with Leadbeater top scoring with 42, Pavri taking four wickets. In the Parsees second innings they were bowled out for 91 with Bapasola again top scoring*
- with 27, Leadbeater taking four wickets, at close of play Scarborough managed to hold on for the draw on 70-7, Pavri again taking four wickets. The game was drawn with the scores level when the tourists restricted the hosts to 70/7 in the 2nd innings, an exciting game. Morenas opened the batting and made 3 before being out lbw to Baker in the first innings and 2 in the second, again being out lbw to Bland
- 144 Arthur Mailey, New South Wales & Australia 1912-1930. 'Owzat?'. Original and charming handkerchief, probably produced in the 1930's, depicting artwork by Arthur Mailey. The royal blue handkerchief with red edging depicting a colourful cricket match scene, a batsman, out of his crease, being stumped by the wicket keeper with stumps broken and bails flying and who is appealing wildly with five fielders, three slips, a gully and third man to other areas of the handkerchief. Printed signature of Mailey to bottom right hand corner. The handkerchief measures approx 16.5"x17" and is in excellent unused condition. A rare item, not previously seen by the auctioneer - cricket £100/150
- 145 England v Australia, Headingley 1981. Large 'silk style' handkerchief produced to commemorate the 'famous' third Test match, England v Australia, Headingley 1981. Ian Botham and Bob Willis's match. With details of the match and caricatures of Botham and Willis by Roy Ulyyett. 21"x19". VG - cricket £15/25
- 146 'Surrey County Cricket Champions 1971'. Souvenir silk handkerchief printed in Surrey colours with titles to corners with decoration of 'Prince of Wales' feathers. Excellent condition - cricket £25/35
- 147 'Sussex County Cricket Club Hove Ground Centenary 1872-1972'. Souvenir silk style handkerchief printed with aerial view of the ground with titles to corners. Excellent condition - cricket £25/35

- 148 'Jackson's Oxford Journal'. Early, original and very interesting 'broadsheet' four page newspaper for 19th August 1786. With twenty three line paragraph on page one. 'Wednesday Se'nnight an unfortunate Affray happened at Haverhill: Several Farmers Servants having been playing at Cricket, a Quarrel arose between one Stephen Boreham and another Person, when they agreed to fight, Abraham Goodlad to be Second to Boreham, and Robert Webb to be Second to the other, who was his Fellow-Servant. In the Course of the Battle the Seconds quarrelled, and after a few Blows had passed between them, Webb drew a Knife, and threatened his Antagonist that he would stab him if he struck another Blow; which Goodlad not regarding, advanced to renew the Battle, when Webb stabbed him with such Violence into the Bottom of his Belly, that the Knife penetrated to the Back-Bone; and a Brother of Goodlad's running to his assistance, the Blood-thirsty Wrench attempted to stab him also, and would have affected his Purpose, had not a Byestander providentially caught Hold of his Arm. - The wounded young Fellow languished till Four o'Clock on Thursday Morning, when he expired. The Coroner's Jury sat on the Body, and brought in their Verdict 'Wilful Murder', by Robert Webb, who was thereupon committed to Chelmsford Gaol'. Very good condition for its age. A rare item - cricket £100/150
- 149 'Kentish Gazette'. Early and original 'broadsheet' four page newspaper for 9th July 1793. With two announcements on page one of the first meeting of the Sevenoaks Vine C.C. on 19th July 1793, and 'A Great Match at Cricket, Surrey against All England, for One Thousand Guineas' at Dartford Brent on Monday 22nd July 1793. Many great players of the era are listed in the two teams, including the Earl of Winchelsea, Tom Walker, Beldham, Harris, Boxhall, Aylward, Fennex, Small Snr, Small Jnr etc. Minor creases and loss, otherwise very good condition for its age. A rare item - cricket £80/120
Surrey won the match by 53 runs
- with Beldam carrying his bat for 106no in Surrey's first innings of 171
- 150 'Le Monde Illustre'. Early and original 'tabloid' sixteen page French newspaper for 13th July 1865. With a four paragraph article written in French on the annual Varsity cricket match between Oxford and Cambridge Universities. Roughly translated, the article describes the traditional rivalry between the teams, the tradition of the match and its popularity with the gentry and celebrities. It describes that for the All England Eleven cricket is a profession, explaining that cricket requires great eye precision (to hit the ball), accuracy in bowling etc, and how, for the English students cricket is part of their studies. The following page features a fine full size lithograph print of the match in progress at 'Saint-John's Wood dans le champ de Lord'. Very good condition for its age. A rare item - cricket £70/100
- 151 'The Daily Gazetteer'. Early and original 'tabloid' cutting of the first two pages of the newspaper for 25th September 1746. With thirteen line paragraph on page two reporting on 'The great Match at CRICKET, of Five on a Side, that was played in the ARTILLERY-GROUND on Friday the 12th Instant, and won by the London Players, occasion'd a Challenge for Five of London to play against any Five in any one Parish in ENGLAND; which Challenge is accepted of by the Parish of Bromley in Kent: And this Day Long Robin, John Bryan, James Bryan and Two others of Bromley, play against Stephen Dingate, Little Bennett, Tall Bennett, and Two others of London, for Fifty Pounds in the same Place. The Wickets to be pitch'd between Twelve and One o'Clock, and the Match to be played out'. The page has been unevenly trimmed, otherwise in good/very good condition for its age. A rare item - cricket £80/120
Not mentioned in Maun, this cricket reference is a previously unknown/unrecorded match. The named protagonists were all well known cricketers of the period including the brothers John and James Bryant of Bromley and Kent. Stephen Dingate,
- 'Little' and 'Tall' Bennett (real names unknown) are first recorded in 1744. The Bennetts were noted cricketers of the period for London Cricket Club and Surrey. Robert 'Long Robin' Colchin, a renowned single wicket player of the time, had strong associations with the Artillery Ground and is known to have promoted many matches there. In a 1746 article in 'The Connoisseur' Colchin was described as being 'as good a bat as either of the Bennetts'. Away from cricket Colchin moved in dubious circles, one of his favourite pastimes was attending public executions at Tyburn
- 152 'The London Chronicle'. Early and original 'tabloid' eight page newspaper for 2nd to 4th July 1778. With seven line paragraph on page three. 'On Monday at the great Cricket-match on Sevenoaks-vine, for 1000 guineas, the Duke of Dorset against Hampshire: the Duke got the first innings 88, second innings 122; total 210. Hampshire got the first innings 71, second innings 140; total 211, having four men to come in'. The majority of the first two pages are devoted to an obituary of the late King George II by the Earl of Chesterfield. Very good condition for its age. A rare item - cricket £70/100
- 153 'The London Evening Post'. Early and original 'tabloid' size four page newspaper for 17th to 19th July 1746, published by J. Meeres, Old Baily, near Ludgate. With nine line paragraph reporting on 'The four Millers of Bray-Mill, in Berkshire, play a Match at Cricket on Monday next in the Artillery-Ground, against the four best of Addington in Surrey, for Fifty Pounds; to begin between Two and Three o'Clock, and the Match to be play'd out. N.B. The Matches made between the County of Kent and all the World are to be play'd, the first on Bromley Common, on Friday the 11th of August; the second, in the Artillery-Ground, on the Monday following'. The newspaper has some wear to the spine, with minor loss to lower edge, otherwise in good/very good condition for its age. A rare item - cricket £70/100
Bray was a great centre of cricket.

- Derek Birley recounts in his 'Start of Play' that of the occasion of one visit by the M.C.C. in the 1790s, the local church bells were rung to celebrate a local victory. This so enraged the visiting team that they refused to stay for the post-match dinner
- 154 Brian Johnston 1912-1994. Original 'Order of Service' for the Service of Celebration held at Westminster Abbey in May 1994, plus an invitation to an informal buffet, held at the Banqueting House, Whitehall Palace following the service. Formerly the property of Tony Lewis, Glamorgan & England cricketer. VG - cricket £20/30
- 155 Cricketers' Funerals. Original 'Order of Service' for Frank Woolley 1978, Colin Cowdrey 2001 and Bob Woolmer 2007. Also a CD recording of the Service of Thanksgiving for 'The Lord Cowdrey of Tonbridge' at Westminster Abbey. G/VG - cricket £25/35
- 156 Cricketers' Funerals. Original 'Order of Service' for Harold Gimblett 1978, Gubby Allen 1989, Len Hutton 1990 and Denis Compton 1997. The Compton Order of Service includes two colour photographs of attendees and two colour postcards of Westminster Abbey. VG - cricket £25/35
- 157 Cricketers' Funerals. Original 'Order of Service' for Harold Gimblett 1978, Jim Laker 1986, R.E.S. Wyatt 1995 and Colin Cowdrey 2001. VG - cricket £25/35
- 158 Cricketers' Funerals. Original 'Order of Service' for Wilfred Rhodes 1973 and Len Hutton 1990. Vertical fold to the Rhodes, otherwise G/VG - cricket £25/35
- 159 Cricket ephemera. Selection including original photograph of the Gentlemen v Players match played at the Oval in 1911, the photograph shows Spooner (who made a score of 190), batting with Fry, almost being run out. Some wear to edges with small loss. Sold with an original real photograph plainback postcard of the Australian team of 1908, two mono postcards of the Australian and South African cricketers at Lord's 1912 (L.Sales & Son), three official Oval scorecards, fully completed of the England v Australia match 1909 (Bardsley 136 & 130, Sharp 105, Cotter 6-95), Surrey v Middlesex 1910 (Middlesex all out 41, 2nd innings, Smith ten wickets in the match) and England v Australia 1926 (Hobbs 100, Sutcliffe 161, Mailey nine wickets in the match) plus three printed 'Supplements from the Captain' magazine for 1912 featuring the Australian, South African and England teams (some wear and nicks to edges). The items in generally good condition however all have suffered from being located in a pub environment of the early 1900's and are somewhat browned with nicotine and age £40/60
- 160 Cricket ephemera. Box containing four scrapbooks, newspapers, magazines etc. One scrap book titled 'The Demon Bowler (F.R. Spofforth) and W.G.' comprising good cuttings, bookplates and typed articles on the two players. Others include good content relating to Lord's in the 1960s including post cards, match tickets, programmes (one signed by John Gleeson), brochures and an original bookplate photograph from a Sport and General Supplement of Bradman standing full length in batting attire, the first supplement picture of Bradman issued just before his first Test appearance, and original mono photographs of Keith Miller and Norman Yardley. Also includes an original copy of the Daily Telegraph, dated 18th August 1925, featuring a report on Hobbs achieving his hundredth hundred at Taunton, and other newspapers, magazines, supplements all with good cricket content. G £40/60
- AUTOGRAPHED CRICKET EPHEMERA**
- 161 Beatrice Fry, wife of C.B. Fry. Handwritten two page letter on 'C.B. Fry Magazine' headed paper, dated 12th August 1908, to the author E.V. Lucas inviting him and his wife to stay for the Hambledon match, 10th-12th September. 'This match is going to be a great success, there is quite a lot of enthusiasm floating about'. She also suggests that Lucas' book 'The Hambledon Men' surely should sell itself well during this match and in Hambledon'. Nicely signed 'Beatrice Fry'. Minor ageing and creasing, otherwise G/VG - cricket £50/80
- 'The Hambledon Men' was first published in 1907. The match referred to in this letter was Hambledon v England XI (actually twelve a side) played at Broad Halfpenny Down. The England XI was captained by Gilbert Jessop and included J.T. Hearne, A.E. Trott, W.E. Astill, A.E. Knight etc. For Hambledon, C.B. Fry, E.G. Wynyard, C.P. Mead, W.H. etc. The Captain was Edward Whalley-Tooker playing his last first class match. Hambledon won the match by five wickets
- 162 Desmond Eagar. Gloucestershire & Hampshire 1935-1957. Typed one page airmail letter, written as Secretary of Hampshire C.C.C., to a L.J. Youngren, Illinois, dated 15th September 1962 in response to receipt of 'an exciting parcel' of cricket memorabilia. Items mentioned include letters from Dr T.R. Hunter, a picture of E.W. Swanton as a young man with a moustache 'looking like Hitler!', a copy of 'Willow Leaves', and his desire for Hampshire to tour the United States 'as did Julian Cahn in the old days... unfortunately we must find a millionaire before we can even think of doing such a thing !!'. He ends with a reference to Hampshire's poor season. Nicely signed in ink by Eagar. G £50/80
- Eagar was captain of Hampshire from 1946-1957 and Secretary from 1946 to his death in 1977. His son, Patrick is the well known sports photographer
- 163 F.S. Ashley-Cooper. Handwritten two page letter on 'Betchworth' headed paper, dated 'Today, 1912', to E.B.V. Christian thanking him for some help on research. 'This morning I went to London early, and was "first man in" the B.M. [British Museum] Reading Room when it opened at 9 o'clock.. I'll remember to let you know next time I expect to be at the Oval, for it would be delightful to have a chat especially with a match in progress'. - Foster captained Warwickshire from 1911 to 1914. He badly injured his foot in a motor cycle accident in the First World War, which ended his cricket career*
- 165 Frederick Gale. Handwritten four page letter written in Manitoba, Canada, dated 30th March (1893), to his friend Mr Holmes. This letter includes much on Jubilee Day, Burbidge and Surrey, H. Moses in Australia, Harvey Fellows, South Africa etc. Nicely signed 'Fred Gale'. G/VG - cricket £80/120
- Fred Gale played in the Winchester Eleven in 1841 against Eton and Harrow at Lord's, but did not go on to play first class cricket. He made his name as a prolific writer of books, newspaper and magazine articles writing under the name 'The Old Buffer'. He had emigrated to Canada to be with his family after the death of one of his sons, but was homesick and missed his cricket, so returned home the following year*
- 166 Gerald de Lisle Hough. Kent 1919-1920. Two page handwritten letter on official Kent County Cricket Club headed paper, dated 30th August 1942. The letter to H.W. Warner, Kent enthusiast and collector, concerns the date of the foundation of the Club's Cricket Week and plans for Centenary celebrations. 'Before the War I discussed the question of the date with the Chairman and some members of the Committee. My instructions were to prepare to go by the Jubilee. I have verified that this was 1891. If the Committee decide to ignore the gap of the last War (and they probably will of this one too) when setting the Canterbury date, presumably they can do so. As a matter of fact, arguments about dates are of minor importance. The big thing is to get the Week going again after the War as soon and as well as possible. For this purpose we can make great use of the Centenary. This was my main reason for objecting to the application of the word Centenary to this year in some sections of the press. Obviously we don't want people to have any reason to accuse us of holding it twice'. He continues with a comparison of the date of the formation of the M.C.C. 'When the M.C.C. was formed, there must have been a meeting to decide it. The date of the "birth" of the Club is the same as the date of the meeting. Similarly the date of the "birth" of the Canterbury Week was a meeting in 1841'. The discussion was prompted by an article written by Warner that appeared in 'The Cricketer'. Included is a letter from A.W.T. Langford on The Cricketer headed paper, dated 12th August 1942, to H.W. Warner apologising for 'the omission of your name under the article title. It was very bad luck for you'. He also asks Warner to respond to a letter from Hough, 'I cannot think why he did not raise the point before when we had the preliminary notes in'. Also includes Warner's pencil notes and copy letters. Pin holes and minor rust marks, otherwise G/VG £80/120
- Hough played fourteen matches for Kent. He was appointed Manager and later Secretary of Kent, resigning through ill health in 1949*
- 167 Henry Russell Wray. Single page handwritten letter on official 'The American Cricketer' headed paper, to the collector, Charles Pratt Green. The letter, dated 17th February 1893 from Philadelphia, notifies Green that the former editor, George Morgan, had relinquished the role. 'The magazine has lost one of its most faithful editors - I am a poor substitute'. He also thanks Green for information provided which 'we can make use of in our next number'. It was a grand game and a good day and I too have pleasant reminiscences of it'. He also recalls P.F. The off ball is severely let pass by, unless of short length and not too high. Grace was never guilty in that respect, cutting and driving as the length of the ball sent along needed attention'. 545 South Africa tour of England 1955. Original seven page typed manuscript by Hutton for the News of the World, dated 15th July 1955. Hutton is writing shortly after South Africa's victory against England in the Third Test at Old Trafford. In the article he discusses the pros and cons of winning the toss in five day Test matches, ball condition and swing bowling, and the significance of the right (top) hand in batting. 'I have been struck by the similarity of events in the second and third Tests, at Lord's and Manchester. In each case, England batting first, ran into trouble on a "green" wicket... this throws into prominence the dubious "advantage" of winning the toss... if Peter May had been as bad a tosser as I was during my reign as England's captain, England's tasks at Lord's and Manchester might have been made much easier!'. Hutton explains that 'Five-day pitches in fine weather... have to be prepared with lasting qualities... The moisture left in the grassy - or "green" pitch - however helps the shiny new ball to deviate a great deal... In all the home Test matches played in good weather in recent years in which I have batted first I have felt that trouble would be lurking about at least until lunch time, very often until mid-afternoon'. Hutton then discussed the dilemma of winning the toss and deciding whether or not to bat first. He also describes the coin he used for the toss, 'a half-crown which I had kept for over 20 years. This was a treasured memento from an aged cricket lover in my home town of Pudsey... when I made my first fifty. His parting words were "Never spend this, young Hutton, until you're down to your last half-crown." Believe me, I never shall'. Hutton compares the difficulties of countering of swing bowling on the first day of a Test in England compared to abroad. 'After two or three overs in South Africa, Australia and West Indies, few bowlers rub the ball on their flannels to keep the shine. Sydney is now an exception' and he describes how the curator of the Sydney Oval 'worked

his passage' on a boat to England to study cricket grounds. He then discussed the importance of a good start for the batting side. 'I fully appreciate how much South Africa owe to... little Jackie McGlew... While Roy McLean and Paul Winslow played more spectacular innings, McGlew provided the firm rock on which both South Africa's innings were constructed... [and] McGlew's display of courage in the face of several painful knocks from Frank Tyson... Ask Godfrey Evans, who broke a finger, and Tom Graveney, who sprained a thumb, in keeping wicket to Frank's expresses at Old Trafford. He then claims that Evans' injury might have 'saved the match for England' as, 'forced to use his right hand as little as possible Godfrey brought his left hand into greater play... Too much "right hand" has been one of Godfrey's weaknesses'. Hutton's own similar experience was against West Indies in 1950 when he was struck on the right hand and forced to retire. 'When I resumed batting, I was compelled to play almost single-handed but, using the left hand and arm for all my strokes, I think I played my part in England's victory. In fact, still one-handed in England's second innings, I was second top-scorer!' VG - cricket £250/3500

546 County Cricket 1955. Original seven page typed manuscript by Hutton for an article in the News of the World, dated 21st July 1955. The article covers the subjects of increasing the number of county matches, the impending retirement of Yorkshire Captain, Norman Yardley, and Hutton's move to a new house. Hutton reports that the Advisory Cricket Committee 'will agree in November to extend the Championship from 28 to 32 matches for each county. My hope that any proposal for more Championship engagements is defeated. My suggestion would be for fewer matches, not more'. The argument for more matches is to enable each county to play one another twice each season and 'that it would help those counties struggling against financial difficulties. In other words, more games, more cash'. Hutton's counter

argument is that 'counties already try to cram as many games as possible in to the middle of the summer, to take advantage of the best weather' which would lead to additional games having to be arranged for the 'early weeks - when cold and wet weather usually restricts attendances - and in September, when football is in full swing' the result being increased match expenses and the potential need to recruit more players. His greatest concern is with regard to the players such that 'by the end of the season their appetite for the game has become jaded. The late Charlie Harris, of Nottinghamshire, summed up the feeling of most cricketers in the closing weeks when, on arriving at the crease first thing in the morning, he began the day's proceedings with a general "Good morning, fellow workers"'. Hutton is particularly pleased that the changes won't come into effect until the 1957 season 'for the sake of England's prospects of retaining the Ashes [in 1956]'. He continues by discussing the need to look after fast bowlers to prevent injury. 'Old-time players have often told me how Arthur Carr, when captain of Nottinghamshire, took infinite pains to see that Harold Larwood bowled only a few overs at a time and never exceeded Carr's own allotment for him for the day... Further, Harold was never tired out when he played for England'. Hutton describes how Bradman in 1948 and Hassett in 1953 'nursed Ray Lindwall so carefully that he was never allowed to bowl flat out until the First Test and I have attempted to do the same with Brian Statham. Frank Tyson's case in Australia was different as he needed experience more than anything in the opening matches'. He compares how fresh the Australian team of 1953 were 'contrasting their zest with those of one or two of the England players. Some of my team, arriving from all over the country, felt as tired as they looked'. Regarding Norman Yardley, Hutton pays tribute 'to the fine spirit in which he has always played the game... An ankle injury during the war, about which few people know anything, caused him to bowl less than he should have done... I shall

not forget Norman's feat of dismissing Don Bradman in three successive innings in Australia 1946-47. Nor will Norman forget the remark of Norman Sellers, the then-Yorkshire captain, who met him at the Pavilion steps as he was proudly leaving the field. Norman did not expect the usual congratulations. He knew Brian too well for that. Brian was true to form. "Nah, then, Lavender (Norman's nickname)," said Brian in the broadest Yorkshire accent, "tha' may be good enough to bowl for England but for Yorkshire tha' hasn't got a price!". Hutton concludes 'In the last week I have been surprised to learn that I have bought a "mansion". Someone has exaggerated the story... It is only a four-bedroomed property'. The new house has a paddock in which Hutton plans to lay a cricket pitch 'and to run my own side of local youngsters... As a father of two boys myself, I have a big affection for youngsters and anything I can do to assist them to become cricketers will give me infinite pleasure'. Some annotations and corrections apparently in Hutton's own hand. G/VG - cricket £250/350

547 'Playing Back'. Thirteen page hand written manuscript written by Hutton, probably for an instructional book or article. Undated. Hutton gives a fascinating description of the technique required for playing off the back foot, comparing the approaches taken by the leading players of the period. 'The most difficult of all batsmen to dismiss are those who watch the ball most carefully and for the longest possible time; those who watch it through the air and off the pitch... In all forward strokes there is more chance of error than in back shots, because by going forward to meet the ball you give yourself less time in which to watch it... Nearly all the famous overseas batsmen are back-foot players. Think of the Australians, Bradman, Ponsford and Woodfull; of the West Indian, Headley; of the South Africans H.W. Taylor and Bruce Mitchell... Sidney Barnes, among present-day cricketers, is one of the finest back-players ever seen. The movement of his right foot is the same to almost every delivery

bowled to him - a backward movement of several inches at the moment the ball is leaving the bowler's hand. By this preparation he is always in a position for the hook or the square cut which are his favourite run getting shots... To play a forward shot, of course, he would have to change his balance and what is more he would have to do so with reduced time for the operation... But naturally he prefers to play nearly all his shots off the back foot. Many Australians have adopted the Bradman stance at the wicket. In this the feet are placed approximately nine inches apart with the bat grounded half-way between them... very different from what might be called the classical stance... The Bradman stance enables the batsman to deal with the short pitched ball more easily than the half-volley, or any ball requiring a forward stroke, though that is not to say that Bradman did not know how to deal with half-volleys!' Hutton continues with more detailed description of the techniques and potential faults regarding foot movement and timing of the shot. 'I count myself indeed fortunate to have spent many hours at the crease with Walter Hammond, who to my mind played the back shots to perfection. When I began my first-class career in 1934 Grimmett and O'Reilly, the Australian spin-bowlers, were at the height of their game... The heroes of the moment always set the fashions. A few years earlier the cricket world was enthralled by the speed of Larwood, Voce and Bowes and little Larwoods bowled themselves breathless in the parks and recreation grounds. In 1934 spin bowling was the problem and I became intrigued by the mastery of Grimmett and O'Reilly, thinking to myself that any batsman who could show off well against leg-breaks and googlies stood an excellent chance of playing for England... in the majority of l.b.w. decisions given to Grimmett and O'Reilly the batsman had been playing back... many batsmen must have been taking the back foot across the line between wicket and wicket... The top-spinner or anything that came unexpectedly quickly from the pitch gave Grimmett and O'Reilly their

548 'Playing Shots'. Eight page hand written manuscript by Hutton describing the off drive, on drive, square cut and pull shot. Written on M.C.C. headed note paper. Undated. Presumably written for an illustrated book or training manual. 'Off Drive'. This shot is perhaps the most attractive one to watch in batsmanship. I may be biased for this has been my pet shot since being thirteen years of age. The shot is played to a ball pitching on the off stump, up to a distance of eighteen inches outside the off stump. The left foot is placed near the pitch of the ball allowing space for the bat to meet the ball. Point the left shoulder at the top of the back swing, in the direction you wish the ball to travel. Hold on tight as possible throughout the shot with your left hand. This shot is usually played to a ball pitching one yard to two yards from the batting crease. On Drive. Played to a ball pitching on or just outside the left stump, the safest place to hit the ball between mid on and the bowler. As for the cover drive the left shoulder should point in the direction you wish the ball to travel. The left toe should point a little straighter down the pitch than shown in the picture. The body has leaned into the shot, gaining maximum weight into the stroke at impact. Square Cut. The picture shows a square cut being played off the left foot to a very short ball, pitched two to three feet outside the off stump. Bat has just made contact with the ball, but the head has remained still, and has not been lifted as so often happens with this stroke. Be prepared to lose a little power, in order to hit the ball in the meat of the bat. It is a mistake to think the harder you hit the faster the ball will travel. Correct timing will make the ball speed to the boundary. Watching the ball is the secret of this certain four shot, against a fast bowler who is not certain of length & direction. The Pull Shot. A great run producing stroke on slow wickets, but can be very dangerous on the very fast wickets of Australia. Don Bradman

was the finest exponent of this shot I have seen, he always concentrated on hitting the ball between mid-on and square leg. The right foot is moved across and back in the direction of the off stump. Note how the body is poised slightly backwards ready to swing into the shot. The bat is head high ready to swing in a downward movement to the ball. The left hand is in control of the bat, the right hand comes in at the moment of impact'. VG - cricket
