- 1 William Brockwell. Surrey, London County & England 1886-1903. Rare original advertising handbill for Brockwell's Surrey Benefit match, Surrey v Yorkshire, Kennington Oval, 26th-28th July 1900. Photograph of Brockwell to front, biography and performances to verso. 5.5"x9". Small loss to left hand corners, tape repairs to verso, otherwise in good condition. £100/150
- 2 William Henry 'Bill' Lockwood. Nottinghamshire, Surrey & England 1886-1904. Rare original advertising handbill for Lockwood's Surrey Benefit match, Surrey v Yorkshire, Kennington Oval, 25th-27th July 1901. Photograph of Lockwood to front, biography and performances to verso. 5.5"x9". Small loss to top right corner, tape repairs to verso, otherwise in good condition. £100/150
- 3 Surrey C.C.C. 1894. Original folding member's ticket and fixture card for 1894. Brown leather with gilt titles. G. £30/40
- 4 Leicestershire County Cricket Club Jubilee 1879-1928. Official four page menu for the Jubilee Celebration Dinner held at De Montfort Hall, Leicester on 30th April 1928. Printed in red and green ink with embossed county fox emblem to front, gilt edges, menu and toasts to centre, musical programme to back page. Minor ageing, otherwise in very good condition. Sold with an original mono press photograph of five players to have captained Leicestershire, seated in cricket attire and blazers. Players are Dawson, Hazlerigg, Wood, Fowke and Rudd. 8.5"x6.5". G. £50/80
- 5 Leicestershire C.C.C. 1923. Rare official folding card itinerary for the 'North of Scotland Tour', 20th-27th July 1923. Printed in green and red, with fox emblem and titles to cover, personnel, travel and match arrangements. Minor ageing, otherwise in good/ very good condition. £50/70
The Scottish leg of the tour comprised four matches, v Inverness and District 21st July (Leicestershire won by 42 runs), v Nairn and District 23rd July (match drawn, Leicestershire won on first innings), v Elgin and District 24th July (Leicestershire won by 78 runs), and v Scottish Counties at Aberdeen, 25th-26th July (match drawn).
- 6 Leicestershire C.C.C. 1925. Rare official folding card itinerary for the 'Northern and Scottish Tour', 21st-31st July 1925. Printed in green and red, with fox emblem and titles to cover, personnel, travel and match arrangements. The card appears to have been signed by members of Elgin C.C. Some spotting and ageing, otherwise in good condition. £50/70
Matches played on the tour included v Durham at Sunderland 22nd-23rd July (drawn), v Grange 24th-25th July, v Elgin 27th July, v Huntley 28th July, v Inverness 29th July, and v Stenhousemuir 30th July (results not known).
- 7 M.C.C. Centenary Dinner, 1887. Official invitation and menu for the dinner held at Lord's on 15th June 1887. The invitation issued to Sir Spencer Ponsonby-Fane, then Treasurer of the M.C.C. Handwritten annotation, 'accepted' in ink to top left corner of the invitation, presumably in Ponsonby-Fane's own hand. Minor ink smudge to annotation, otherwise in very good condition. £100/150
The dinner was said to have been attended by the greatest gathering of amateur cricketers ever assembled.
- 8 'Kent County Cricket Champions 1906'. Rare official menu for the 'Banquet to The Champion Team' celebrating Kent winning their first ever County Championship in 1906. The Banquet held at the Corn Exchange, Maidstone on 10th October 1906 with the Mayor in attendance. Original raised and embossed decorative covers with Borough of Maidstone emblem to centre with purple ribbon tie, gilt to edges. Four printed pages to inside, the first being a title page with cameo portraits of members of the Kent team, menu, toasts and programme of music to other pages. Printed by the Dickinson of Maidstone. Minor foxing and soiling to covers otherwise in very good condition. A scarce item of Kent cricketing history. £250/350
- 9 'Kent County Cricket Champions 1906'. Rare official menu for the 'Dinner to the Kent XI' celebrating Kent winning their first ever County Championship in 1906. The Banquet held at Hotel Cecil on 11th October 1906. Original covers with embossed Kent emblem to centre with cream ribbon tie. Twelve printed pages to inside, the first being a photograph of the Kent team, 'A Canterbury Week Ode' by Major Philip Trevor, menu, toasts, programme of music, results and averages for the 1906 season etc to other pages. Minor foxing and soiling to covers otherwise in very good condition. A scarce item of Kent cricketing history. £250/350
- 10 'County Cricket. Kent v Yorkshire'. 1893. Rare and early original handbill for the match played at Rectory Field, Blackheath, 31st July- 2nd August 1893. The names of the Kent XI are printed, including Marchant, Mason, G. Hearne, A. Hearne, W. Hearne etc. Printed footnote reads, 'Yorkshire lead in the County Championship, but Kent are well to the fore'. Printed by C. North. 4.5"x7.5". Excellent condition. £180/250
In a match that generated much interest as both sides had ambitions to win the County Championship, Yorkshire won by an innings and eleven runs.
- 11 Kent C.C.C. 1921. Original club membership and fixture card in green cloth. VG. £20/30
- 12 Kent C.C.C. 1922. 'Record of Matches played season 1922'. Printed chart showing the results, individual scores and bowling figures for matches played May to July, 1922. Presumably published by the club. Copies of the chart were available to order 'in skeleton form for the use of Clubs' from the designer, J.H. Haine, Catford. 8.25"x10.5". Horizontal and vertical folds, minor foxing, otherwise in good condition. £30/50
- 13 Doug Wright. Kent & England 1932-1957. 'England v Australia 'Centenary Test' Melbourne 1977.

- Official information pack issued by the Australian Cricket Board with letters to Wright inviting and welcoming him to the Centenary Test. Also includes a Doug Wright name badge, original airline tickets, and a Melbourne Cricket club newsletter 1977. Sold with a 'Centenary 1880-1980 Cricket Stamp Album' comprising a good selection of international cricket related stamps and pirate issues. G. £40/60
- 14 'Kent Club. 1842. Grand Cricket Match. England against Kent on the Beverley Ground, Adjoining the Cavalry Barracks, Canterbury on Monday August 1st 1842 and following days. Players. Kent. W. de C. Baker Esq, F. Fagge Esq, N. Felix Esq, A. Mynn Esq, C.G. Whittaker Esq, Adams, Dorrington, Hillier, Martingale, Pilch, Wenman. England. Hon F. Ponsonby Esq, C. Langdon Esq, C.G. Taylor Esq, Barker, Box, Fenner, Good, Guy, Hawkins, Lillywhite, Redgate, Sewell. Umpires Mills and Bayley. The Military Band will be in attendance'.
Large, original and early handbill/poster for the match played at the Beverley Ground, Canterbury on Monday August 1st to 4th 1842, printed at the Kentish Observer Office, St Georges Street, Canterbury. The handbill measures 9.5" x 14.5". Minor tear to right hand edge repaired with tape to verso, minor spotting and slight creasing otherwise in very good condition for its age. A rare handbill for this major match with the teams reading like a 'who's who' of early cricketers. £800/1200
England won the match by nine wickets. The star of the show was Fred Lillywhite who took eleven wickets in the match, ably assisted by James Dean who took seven wickets. For Kent, Pilch made 98 and Felix 74 in Kent's first innings total of 278. In reply England made 266 with Guy making 80 and Hillyer taking six wickets. Kent were then bowled out for 44 leaving England to win the match finishing on 58-1 for the loss of Good. Joseph Guy scored 7 runs from one ball with no overthrows in the England first innings
- 15 'CRICKET. A Grand Match will be played in Lord's Ground, Marylebone on Monday July 16th 1849 and following days. The North of England against the South. Players. North. Lord Burghley, Lord Guernsey, E. Elmhurst Esq, H. Pickford Esq, Bickley, Chatterton, Clark, Guy, Parr, Samson, Wisden. South. Hon R. Grimston, R. Kynaston Esq, N. Felix Esq, A. Mynn Esq, W. Nicholson Esq, Box, Chester, Dean, Hillyer, Lillywhite, Pilch.... Cricket bats and stumps to be had of M. Dark at the Manufactory on the Ground. Admittance 6d. Stabling at the Ground. Ordinary at 3 o'clock'.
Original and early handbill for the match played at the Lord's Cricket Ground on the 16th & 17th July 1849, printed by Morgan, 38 Church Street, adjoining the Marylebone Theatre. The handbill measures 5.5" x 8". Some minor wear to corners, 'July 16' handwritten in black ink to verso otherwise in very good condition for its age. A rare handbill for this major match with a galaxy of early cricket stars named. £600/900
The North won by 243 runs. The North batted first and made 131 with Parr making 47 and Lillywhite taking five and Hillyer four wickets. In reply the South were bowled out for just 48 runs, Wisden and Clark taking seven wickets between them. The North in their second innings made 227 with Armitage and Guy making 48 and 43 respectively. Clark then proceeded to bowl the South out and win the game as they made 67 all out and he took six wickets. Felix was bowled first ball in each innings. Armitage made a hit for 8 (including 4 overthrows).
- 16 'Cricket. A Grand Match will be played on Spark's Ground, Grove Street on Tuesday 4th July between Eleven of the North of England and Grange Clubs; and on Thursday 9th July, between the county of Berwick and Grange Clubs, on the same ground. Edinburgh 29th June 1848
Original and early handbill for the matches played at the Sparks Ground, Edinburgh on the 4th & 6th July 1848, printed by James Turner & Co of Lothian Road. The handbill measures 9" x 7.5". Some wrinkling and nicks to page edges, very minor tear/hole through title and some age toning otherwise in very good condition for its age. A rare handbill for these two matches in Scotland.
- 17 Vallance William Crisp Jupp. Sussex, Northamptonshire & England 1909-1938. Collection of twenty four original Post Office telegrams sent to Jupp congratulating him on taking all ten wickets for Northamptonshire in Kent's first innings at Tunbridge Wells in 1932, followed by top scoring for Northamptonshire in both innings with scores of 34 and 32. Correspondents include cricketers, friends and members of Jupp's family, including Goldman, Sutcliffe, Kemp-Welch, Clay, Jupps' mother and father etc. The Goldman telegram reads, 'Hearty congrat. Fancy making Grace turn in his grave'. G/VG. £100/150
Jupp remains the only player to have taken ten wickets in an innings and top scored with the bat in both innings. Despite Jupp's performance in the match Kent won by an innings and 188 runs, Freeman taking sixteen wickets in the match for Kent.
- 18 Vallance William Crisp Jupp. Sussex, Northamptonshire & England 1909-1938. Collection of photographs and ephemera relating to Jupp's cricketing career and personal life. The collection includes thirteen original press photographs, real photograph postcards and candid photographs of Jupp and his family during his cricket career, war service and later years. Other items include his marriage certificate dated 20th January 1925, two certificates of 'Post War Credit' issued to Jupp in

- 1943 and 1947, and an official invitation to a luncheon given by Prince and Princess Arthur of Connaught. Varied condition, generally good. £80/120
- 19 Vallance William Crisp Jupp. Sussex, Northamptonshire & England 1909-1938. Selection of ephemera including Jupp's birth certificate, a handwritten commendation on Jupp's 'courage and foresight' while serving in 1916, a share certificate issued to Jupp, his leather wallet, an original contract with Northamptonshire C.C.C. dated 15th December 1921, and a small selection of photographs of Jupp and one of Johnny Douglas of Essex etc. G. £80/120
- 20 Vallance William Crisp Jupp. Sussex, Northamptonshire & England 1909-1938. Four original albums containing cuttings, photographs, postcards etc relating to Jupp's career 1922-1932. The first album, covering 1922-1925, includes two original mono photographs, one of a match in progress of West of Scotland v J.W.H.T. Douglas XI, Glasgow, 8th-10th July 1922, 10"x6.5", a real photograph postcard of the 1922 Northamptonshire team, a 'Chronicle & Echo' newspaper poster with the headline 'Mr Jupp's Future' etc. The second album, 1926-1928, comprises a handwritten letter to Jupp from Scarborough C.C., real photograph postcard of the 1927 Nottinghamshire team by Charles Morris of Dover, a telegram to Jupp etc. The third album, 1929-1932, has Jupp's name and address handwritten in ink to the front endpaper, and comprises three candid photographs of Jupp, a telegram from Lord Lilford (1 match 1911, President 1904-1921) congratulating Jupp on a victory at Peterborough, six original mono photographs including the M.C.C. team in 1928 by Walker of Scarborough, 10.5"x5.5", a mono photograph of Jupp walking off the field, 5"x8", Douglas and Jupp walking on to the field to bat at Scarborough, Walkers, 6.25"x8.25" etc. Varied condition, pages loose in the first album. An excellent personal record of Jupp's cricket career. £200/300
- 21 John Thomas 'Jack' Brown, Yorkshire & England, 1889-1904. 'The Battle of the Roses. Yorkshire v Lancashire. J.T. Brown's Benefit Match 1901'. Rare advertising card for John Brown's benefit held at the Headingley Grounds on the 5th to 7th August 1901. The card with titles and full length image of Brown in batting pose wearing Yorkshire cap to front and to verso 'Some interesting facts....about J.T. Brown'. Printed biographical details of his career from being engaged with the Perthshire County Club in 1888 to scoring 163 for the players in 1900. Printed by Nutt & Co of Leeds. Some soiling and wear to card otherwise in good condition. A rarely seen card. £200/300
- One of the greatest Yorkshire batsman, Brown was the only one to hit two double centuries for the county, in 1897 he made 311 v Sussex and in 1898 he made 300 v Derbyshire at Chesterfield. During the latter innings, he and Tunnicliffe created a new first class record first wicket partnership of 554. He played eight Tests for England and made his only Test century (140) in Australia in 1894/95. His career was marred by illness and dropped out of first class cricket in 1904 due to a heart trouble. He died in November 1904, aged only 35 years.*
- 22 Australian tour of England 1934. 'British Sportsman's Club. Luncheon Given to The Australian Cricket Team 1934'. Scarce original menu for the Luncheon given to the Australian team at the Savoy Hotel, London on the 30th April 1934. The menu with titles and date to front cover. To inside pages the menu, toasts etc. A rare menu from the tour. G/VG. £100/150
- The Australians arrived in England on the 28th April 1934 having left Freemantle on the 26th March. They practised pre tour at Alan Fairfax's indoor cricket school at Millbank, London. The first match of the tour started at Worcester on the 2nd May 1934.*
- 23 M.C.C. Tour of Australia 1928/29. Official 'Orient Line, R.M.S. Ormonde' souvenir brochure for the M.C.C. Australian Tour 1928/29'. Decorative covers with M.C.C. colours. To inside pages, real mono photograph of the M.C.C. team laid down to the itinerary page, pen pictures and biographies of the M.C.C. team etc. The brochure contains the full set of tour results and was probably published in limited numbers just prior to departure, the final page states, 'Freemantle, March 25th - M.C.C. having retained "The Ashes" embarked in R.M.S. "Ormonde" for England'. Some foxing and wear to covers, otherwise in good condition. A rare brochure for the return trip and unusual to see, the outgoing 'Otranto' brochure much more widely seen £80/120
- The touring party travelled out from Toulon on the S.S. Otranto and returned from Freemantle on the Ormonde on 20th April 1929 having won the Ashes series 4-1.*
- 24 M.C.C. tour of South Africa 1964-65. Rare official players' itinerary for the M.C.C. tour with list of players, itinerary & engagements pages, postal & telegraph information etc. Owner unknown. Rusting to staples, otherwise in good condition. £30/50
- 25 M.C.C. tour of Australia & New Zealand 1965-66. Rare official players' itinerary for the M.C.C. tour with list of players, itinerary & engagements pages, postal & telegraph information etc. Owner unknown. Small tear to rear cover, otherwise in good condition. £30/50
- 26 M.C.C. and England tours 1974/5-1989. Four official players' itineraries for the M.C.C. tour to Australia & New Zealand 1974-75, England tours to West Indies 1986, Australia 1986/87, and Nehru Cup Tournament 1989. Owner unknown. G/VG. £30/50
- 27 South Africa 1931-1933. Four nice mono candid photographs of South African players taken during matches. Each photograph signed in ink by the featured player. Signatures are X. Balaskas (date stamped to verso 16th December 1932), F. Martin (28th March 1932), S. Steyn, and A. Palm. As a player, Peel was very popular and admirers often entertained him socially; he became well known for liking alcohol. His county career came to a premature end when Lord Hawke dismissed him because of his inebriate habits. Peel continued to play and coach cricket for most of his life and in later years became associated with Yorkshire once again. Among his other jobs, he became the landlord of a public house and worked in a mill. He died in Morley in 1941 at the age of 84.*

- 70 Edward Ivo Medhurst Barrett. Hampshire, 1896-1925. Two page handwritten letter in ink from Barrett to 'Mr Coldham', dated 9th December 1946. Barrett reminisces about his cricket career that spanned thirty years. He remembers cricketers he played with including W.G. He also refers to his most successful season, 'In 1912, when home on leave from China, I played in every first class match for

- 72 Arthur James Ledger Hill. Cambridge University, Hampshire & England, 1890-1921. Two page handwritten letter in ink from Hill to 'Private Coldham', dated 8th April 1946. Hill reminisces about his enjoyment of his thirty year cricketing career with Hampshire, the enthusiasm for cricket in the county, and the quality of young players, 'but would much like a Larwood or Rhodes to help us!'. Hill hopes that Coldham is 'able to get a knock. Sometimes the difficulty over here is to get something to knock with or at, as bats and balls are very difficult to get'. - Hill is also noted for captaining Hampshire at rugby and hockey, and was also known as a good racquets player and boxer.*
- 73 Hesketh Vernon Hesketh-Prichard. Hampshire, London County & M.C.C., 1900-1913. Two page handwritten letter in ink from Hesketh-Prichard to 'My dear Alderman', undated, c1910. Hesketh-Prichard is replying to a request to play in a cricket match, in which he is unable to play. It appears that Hesketh-Prichard is already committed to playing in a single wicket challenge match, the details for which he has described to the verso. The match 'At Dilton Place on June 14 or 15... [between] David Horne (Surrey) (The Cuckfield Crasher) v H. Prichard (Hants) for 100 sovereigns [sic] (provided by D. Horne. Prichard if he loses will proffer I.O.U... Entrance money to be used for medical attendance on 1st umpire if his decisions displeased either principal)'. - Hesketh-Prichard was a renowned adventurer, traveller and writer.*
- 74 Charles Robson. Middlesex, Hampshire & London County 1895-1906. Single page part letter handwritten in ink from Robson. Date and recipient unknown. This remaining page appears to be regarding a dispute between the 'St. Marys Executive [who] did not approach any of the Stoke players till May 1st and Farrell who I believe is the cause of their complaint was never approached till May 2nd'. - The grounds referred to in this letter appear to relate to the Antelope Ground, then home of Southampton St. Marys F.C., and Itchin Stoke Down, both of which hosted Hampshire county cricket matches in the late nineteenth century. Charles Robson captained Hampshire from 1900 to 1902.*
- 75 Edward Mark Sprot. Hampshire 1898-1914. Single page letter handwritten in ink from Sprot. - Sprot captained Hampshire from 1903 to 1914.*

- Bencraft was Captain, Treasurer, Secretary, Chairman and President of Hampshire C.C.C. throughout his life.

The letter, dated 16th March 1960, was written the year before Russell's death when he had been 'struck blind at the end of /59 & have been unable to read any letter printed or otherwise'. He describes playing with '[F.E.] Lacey in 1887 and was run out for 28 & left Lacey behind to carry his bat for a glorious innings of 323 which still stands as the record scored in 2nd class cricket'. He describes playing for the Deanery C.C. in 1871, with whom he was a member from 1883 'and have been a member ever since'.

Aird is reporting on the Melbourne Test, 'I still cannot believe that what we saw on the last morning really happened'. Australia who had ended the previous day on 79 for 2, needing a further 165, were blown away by Tyson and Statham for a further 33 runs. Aird writes that the wicket was really fast and Tyson looked very difficult. 'Godfrey Evans was magnificent diving full length on either side of the wicket and catching them one handed'. He praises Cowdrey and May, who 'should be Captain and Vice Captain. Cowdrey has the better outlook on the game in my opinion. May does not enjoy Test Matches'. Much on the hospitality received and the huge crowds – 300,000 watched the Melbourne Test, £24,000 receipts. 'We shall I think have paid our expenses for this tour after this match and everything else will be profit'. Signed 'Ronny'. G/VG £120/160
Aird was secretary to M.C.C. 1953-1962, and President in 1968-1969.
- 80 Harry Surtees Altham. Oxford University, Surrey & Hampshire 1909-1923. Two page handwritten letter dated 16th February 1959 to Mr Warner (H W Warner, Kent follower and collector) replying to Warner's letter which he had read with great interest and enjoyment. Altham does not believe it possible to play more enjoyable cricket than that on August tours with the Harlequins, 'Yorkshiremen may laugh at the 'fancy caps' but some pretty good cricketers wore them and are in company good companions'. Altham goes on to confirm that the 1958/59 Ashes tour in Australia has been disappointing, 'so many things have gone wrong, but I never did trust our batting and the Australians are back to something like their old standard'. The Ashes series was won by Australia 4-0 with one match drawn. At the time Altham, best known for his writing, coaching and administrative skills was Treasurer and President elect of M.C.C.

Eagar has obtained 'one or two extra items - expensive - but also one or two that I got for less than he bought them in for!'. With the new cricket season impending, Eagar expects the English County players to want more money as Sobers is being paid. £5000 (by Nottinghamshire) and he will 'bat at no. 4, open the bowling, act as first change and will be on his knees by July!'. The letter is written in reply to 'Mr Coldham' (Jim Coldham, cricket collector and historian), who was stationed at the time on military service in Rangoon, 'far from the county cricket battle grounds of England', in which Geary covers the subjects of bowling, press reporting, coaching, his own good health, playing cricket in the heat in Rangoon, and the end of the war. Regarding bowling Geary states (presumably in response to a comment made by Coldham) 'maybe I played with the wrong county. Yes I did work like a Trojan... bowl [sic] 60 overs and more some matches. In a Test match in Australia I bowled 82 overs for 105 and 5 wickets in one innings, even then some people said

- I was lucky, anyway they cannot take away what I did'. Geary is highly complementary about Coldham's writing style, 'You should take up reporting cricket being so interested in it, and I am sure you could do it, by your letter to me'. Regarding the end of the war he concludes, 'Things are not all sunshine here and will not be for a year or so. County cricket is starting up this coming season. What will happen I could not say'. - 88 Alexander Skelding. Leicestershire 1912-1929. Single page handwritten letter in ink dated 3rd May 1950 (?). - 89 George Harry Grey, 7th Baron Grey of Groby. Single page hand written letter to William Parsons of Leicester, dated 28th October 1830, sent from Dunham Massey, then Grey's home. The letter folds into a postal format with a date stamp and seal. Grey is replying to an invitation to join a committee 'to carry into effect an Archery & Cricket Club in the County of Leicester. The time of year for such amusements is one when my engagements will not permit me to visit Leicestershire, and however happy I should be to promote such objects as a Resident in the County, I must for the reasons I have stated decline the honor'. - Grey's grandson, George Harry Booth Grey, played cricket for Cambridge University and M.C.C. and was elected President of Marylebone Cricket Club in 1851.*
- 90 Charles Inglis Thornton. Kent, Cambridge University & Middlesex 1867-1885. Rare and early signature in ink of Thornton, 'With compliments and thanks. Yours truly, C.I. Thornton'. Horizontal and vertical folds, otherwise in very good condition. £250/350
- Thornton was noted for being the greatest hitter of his day, using the then unorthodox and controversial approach of moving out to hit the ball. For many years he was a leading figure in the Scarborough Festival.*
- 91 William Martingell. Kent 1841-1852. Very early handwritten memorandum from Martingell, on folded page, acknowledging receipt of payment from the county club. The memorandum reads 'memorandum. I acknowledge to have received of the treasurer of the Kent Cricket Club twenty pounds for a years salary due to me from the club. Dated 6th October 1849', beautifully signed by Martingell. Also signed in smaller lettering 'Martingell' to verso. Very good condition. A rare and very early letter from a leading Kent cricketer who was an original member of William Clarke's All-England Eleven. £700/1000
- Martingell played forty nine matches for Kent, also played one match in Surrey 1839 to 1859, and was described as one of great bowlers of his day and his finest hour was probably the 7 for 19 he took in the Gentlemen v Players match of 1853 He died in 1897 in Eton Wick, Buckinghamshire at the age of 78.*
- 'In his day he was one of the best bowlers in England. Forming his style under the old law, he delivered the ball a little below the shoulder and depended on his bias from the leg side'.*
- 92 Lord Harris. Oxford University, Kent & England 1871-1911. Original typed letter dated 29th November 1910 from Harris to the Secretary, Warwickshire C.C.C. Harris is writing to explain why 'Kent and Warwickshire had not played for so long... As far as I can recollect our professionals took exception to something that happened at the Kent v Warwickshire match some years ago, it was either at Blackheath or Catford, I fancy that was the reason why we dropped the match, and other counties having come on to our list we have not altered it'. - Kent played Warwickshire at Catford in 1899 in a match in which Kent won by ten wickets. The two counties didn't meet again until 1912. It is not known what the controversy was to which Harris refers.*

Kingsmill Key was a middle order batsman and slow off break bowler who played for Surrey from 1882-1904, he captained the side from 1894 to 1899 with considerable success, winning the County Championship in that six year period on three occasions (1894, 1895 & 1899, finishing 2nd once and 4th in the other two seasons. He is quoted as a 'A man of most original views, an always philosophic cricketer and an imperturbable captain'. His highest score was 281 for Oxford University v Middlesex in 1887. He went on Sanders tour of North America in 1886, Hawke's tour of North America in 1891 and Oxford University Authentics tour of India 1902/03. A noted rugby player, he gained his blue at Oxford. He died in August 1932, at the age of 67, from poisoning after an insect bite.

- Brown captained Northamptonshire from 1932 to 1935 and later served as secretary.*
- 118 William Lucius Kelly (1875-1968). Manager of the Australian touring team to England 1930. A collection of correspondence, letters, two envelopes, photographs and cards covering the period 1930 to 1939 between Kelly and Miss Sheila Chase, Manageress of the Midland Grand Hotel, London with whom he formed a friendship and relationship following the Australians staying at the hotel whilst playing tour and Test matches in London. Sold with this correspondence is a rare black opal and diamond gold ring given to Sheila Chase by Kelly. There are ten letters and one Christmas card covering the period plus a signed studio portrait photograph (by Bolland) of Kelly dated September 1930 and a mounted postcard of the 1930 Australian team signed to the mount by all the players including Woodfull, Bradman, Jackson, Fairfax, Grimmett, Ponsford, Oldfield, McCabe, Kelly, Richardson etc. The

letters begin in September 1930 on his return from Ireland and just prior to leaving to travel back to Australia 'I am terribly disappointed in not being able to have an evening with you prior to my departure from England.... but two Dinner and Theatre parties... at which I am 'Guest of Honour' has completely put the lid on any dearest hopes..... So it is good bye Sheila... I will not be able to call at the hotel on Monday but will be there without fail on Tuesday morning to say good bye in person'. He asks her to write a letter addressed care of the 'S.S. Oransay' Orient Company, Naples, Italy 'would I think reach there before the boat.... I shall always retain glowing thoughts of the golden hours spent in your company and hope the very near future holds for you sweet romance, love and happiness'. He writes again, 'c/o Victorian Cricket Association, Flinders Street, Melbourne', on the 1st November 1931. 'Just a hurried note to say I am sending this morning through the Orient Com[pany]... the little keepsake I mentioned in my previous letter. The stone is black opal- rather rare even in Australia which is the only country where it is found. We also have a very pretty light green opal but it is not nearly so rare as the black. The gold is from Kalgoorlie, so the ring is 100% Australian. I hope you will not dislike it Sheila and that you will wear it sometimes- just as a reminder of someone at the other end of the earth who was very happy in your society'. The third letter dated 5th April 1934 talks of the Bodyline dispute and the role he played in it 'Sad to say I am not going to England. All my friends kept on telling me that owing to the somewhat prominent part I took in the awful 'Bodyline' dispute my reception in English cricket circles would be very cool and 'my room[?]' would be preferable to my company. Under the circumstances I have reluctantly decided to remain in Melbourne.... Alan Kippax is going to call on you and Mary Pickford Dibbs [nickname for one of the players]. Alan still smiles his way through life. I have arranged for two or three tickets to be sent to you for the two Test matches in London. If there should be any delay, post the

Manager Harold Bushby the enclosed card as a reminder'.... 'I hope you have a jolly time in England this coming summer and before it is over write me congratulating the tiny population in this country on regaining 'The Ashes of English Cricket', the Davis Cup' and comparing home with our small representation in the Olympic Games. What!!'. 'We are celebrating the centenary of Melbourne in October next, when we expect an influx of about 100,000 visitors from overseas, What about coming out with Prince George?..... ps What about sending Alan a sprig of heather, if he is in the team for the vital Test match?'. The fourth letter is written at about the time of the 5th and final Test of 1934 and dated 10th August 1934. 'By the time this reaches you the 5th and last Test will be almost finished. I hope we win- but good luck to you.... It is nice to hear that England would welcome me with open arms. If I were sure that your arms were wide open I would swim the 12,000 miles and risk the denizens of the deep- including the Lockness Monster and any stray Mermaids. I receive letters by each mail from some of the team. They all seem to be having a very pleasant time.... We have great parties each night of the Test matches and listen in to a ball-for ball description of the game until 3am. A further letter from later in 1934 reads 'I met all the players on their return and they all told me they had nothing like the time we had in 1930, and were nice enough to say they missed me sadly. They had a meeting in London regarding the missing agreement[?] and neglect of the team by the Manager... I understand there were other serious facets'. The next letter dated 1938 talks of the onset of possible war 'Isn't it wonderful to think what a lucky escape from the horrors of war!. I suppose your brother returned from Germany?'. 'I wish to sympathise with England in not winning the 'Ashes'. It was quite evident that you were the better team. I hear that young Hutton has 'cashed in' on his big score and is autographing everything from prayer books to ladies scanties!'. The last four letters all dated 1939 concern Sheila's brother attempts to obtain

for a Jewish friend in Germany application to enter Australia with, hopefully help from Bill Kelly, one is sent to her brother and the other three to Sheila 'I had written to your sister informing her that the axe has fallen at this end on your friends application to enter Australia. I regret the decision for your sake but I must tell you quite candidly that Jews (especially tradesman) are about as welcome in Australia as refrigerators are to eskimo's ... 'I know that other nations think we a hell of a cheek but that's our 'White Australian Policy and a few million Australians are prepared to fight Japs or anyone else to maintain it'. Kelly send useful advice to Sheila regarding the application 'show him the letter received by me from Canberra. You could also tell him that Pergamenteres [?] [Jewish friend] friends in Australia who signed his application form are W.L. Kelly, Harry Breeton, Sec V.C.A and Vernon Ransford (Aust XI). 'I wish you success with his Jewish friends but I don't like your chances'. 'Mr Hitler missed his golden opportunity in September and there is no possibility of it occurring again [Chamberlain meeting Hitler]'. [letter dated June 1939]. There is also a photocopy of a letter from the Jewish friend to Mr Chase written in German with a typed translation '... We both have the visa for France but unfortunately not others yet. You and Australia are our only hope. Please get in touch immediate...'. The ring itself has been professionally examined and valued and is described in the valuation as a Opal doublet and diamond three stone ring, a black opal stone of even patches of fire of mixed colours of fine quality. William Kelly was the manager of

- the Australian touring team to England in 1930 for which he was paid £650, this was Don Bradman's first tour. Kelly played for Victoria in 1908. He was an auctioneer from Melbourne and Chairman of the Victoria Cricket Association. He was a member of the Australian Board of Control at the time of the M.C.C. Bodyline tour of Australia in 1932/33 and was one of the men responsible for drafting and sending the cables to lodge its protest to the M.C.C. following the incidents on the field of play.*
- The manager's name for the 1934 Australian tour was announced on 22 September 1933. He was Harold Bushby, a Tasmanian lawyer. He beat five other candidates: R.C.M. Boyce, W.L. Kelly, L.P.D. O'Connor, S.H.D. Rowe and E.L. Waddy.*
- 119 Don Bradman. Official menu for a 'Luncheon and Presentation to Don Bradman'. Savoy Hotel, London. September 20th 1948. At the autumn 1957 dinner of the Cricket Society, Earl Attlee presented the prize for the most promising young cricketer to C.D. Attlee was a cricket fanatic who kept an agency ticker machine outside the Cabinet Room to keep up to date

- with the cricket scores.
- 147 James A.H. Catton, sports journalist. Two page handwritten letter dated 28th August 1935 to [N.S.] Curnow, South African cricket statistician and author. Catton apologises for being out of touch through illness due to 'a very tired heart' (he died the following year), 'I have only been to three matches during this season', being three of the Test matches against South Africa at Lords, Old Trafford and The Oval. Catton was clearly impressed with the South Africans, in particular 'Rowan's batsmanship and Langton's bowling... Wade a good and quiet captain and a very fine bat. Viljoen is a very fine bat'. Catton encloses a copy of Pycroft's 'The Cricket Field' and sends it with his best wishes and thanks for information provided by Curnow. He also requests 'the first class wicket records of your last home season... for inclusion in the Wisden of 1936' and asks for reports from the Australian's forthcoming tour to South Africa. - Catton was best known as a football writer and edited the Athletic News for many years under the name of Tityrus. After the death of F.S. Ashley-Cooper he took over the role of chief statistician for Wisden.*

Daft continues, 'I am also sending you George Parr's old bat. It is like a piece of old iron... I am pleased to say, & will soon be added to your collection'. Nicely signed 'Rich Daft'. - Richard Daft was one of the finest batsmen of his day, playing 254 matches for Nottinghamshire scoring 9788 runs at an average of 25.42. He wrote 'Kings of Cricket- Anecdotes and Reminiscences from 1858 to 1892' the year after he retired, which was published in 1893. Ultimately, Arrowsmiths published the standard edition and Tillotson the subscribers' edition. By 1900 his health had deteriorated and he died bankrupt.*
- 150 William Findlay. Oxford University, Lancashire & M.C.C. 1901-1912. Single page typed letter on M.C.C. headed paper, dated 20th April 1936 to the collector, A. W. Shelton. Findlay thanks Shelton for his letter and confirms that the '[A.L.] Ford Library has been in the bookcase in the Members' Reading Room at Lord's for a few years. Limited to 148 copies on machine-made paper, signed by the author, and the stencil destroyed ... Exceedingly rare in this unfolded state... Not in Arlott according to Hoyle and A. Dicky-Bird'. An unusual and witty invitation to attend a cricket match! G. £30/50

- 153 William Frederick Grundy, cricket author. Four page handwritten letter, dated 16th August 1917, from Grundy to the collector, Charles Pratt Green. 'I send you a copy of a little booklet I have had printed not long since, containing a few of the letters I received acknowledging my memento of Shrewsbury & Shaw and hope it will find you very well. I really made the selection in 1910 but having a long unwellness come on and then the War, it got put aside and long delayed'. Grundy appears to be referring to a recently printed booklet comprising letters relating to an earlier book, 'Letters of Acknowledgement of The Memento of Arthur Shrewsbury and Alfred Shaw', (Padwick 8035), published in 1910, but this cannot be confirmed. He also sends Pratt Green a picture of the 1859 team that toured America, 'There is only one of the team alive now - W. Caffyn - the Surrey player and if he lives until the 2nd of next February he will be 90'. Grundy records visiting 'George Wootton one of our great bowlers - 1861 to 1871 - who is 83'. He asks Green if he can spare a copy of his booklet on famous bats, as he had sent his own copy to Lord Alverstone who mislaid it. 'I wish this awful war were over and we could have our Cricket Matches again, which we miss so very much'. G/VG. £70/100
- 154 Arthur Haygarth, M.C.C. Sussex and Middlesex, 1844-1861. Four page hand written letter from Haygarth, undated but probably 1876 to F.W. Wright, (Oxford University & Lancashire, 1863-1875). The biography of Wright subsequently appeared in the 1862 section of Scores and Biographies Vol VII, published in 1877. Haygarth refers to the circular that Wright had returned via the late F. Lillywhite in which Wright had given his height of 9 feet 9 inches and which Haygarth has corrected to 5 feet 9 inches. He goes on to thank Wright for being so co-operative unlike many of the cricketers professional and amateur, 'I am sorry to say that in some cases even simple questions to form a short biography remain unanswered'. Haygarth also mentions that he has stated in the biography that Wright is the son of F.B. Wright who played in the Winchester Eleven of 1825 with other personal details, such as his rectorship, 'if in error please correct me'. In a postscript Haygarth points out that he is 'not a clergyman though his brother is Rector of Wimbledon' as Wright had addressed his letter to the Rev A. Haygarth. Pawson describes how at the last minute he turned down a chance to play for his native county Yorkshire as he felt that 'it would be unfair to keep wicket with Hirst, Haigh, Rhodes etc bowling... with a bruised hand'. The article, which subsequently appeared in the Spring 1973 issue of the Cricket Society Journal, explains how his one match for Worcestershire came about as the county arrived to play Oxford University without a keeper and he played well enough to stake his permanent place for the university side. Explaining his passion Michael once said that the majority of his items '... either help revive wonderful memories or make me feel somehow in touch with the greats I have never seen'. The Australians of 1899 lost only three matches on the tour (Essex, Kent and Surrey), drawing four Tests and winning the 2nd Test at Lords by 10 wickets to win the Ashes. Darling, Gregory, Kelly, Iredale and Trumper all had good tours with Darling topping the average with almost 2000 runs at 41.29, Trumper scored three centuries on the tour including 300 not out against Sussex at Hove, Trumble, Howell and Jones took over 390 wickets between them, Howell taking all ten against Surrey.

1899 was the first time in England that five Test matches were played and the English team were chosen by a selection committee for the first time in this year.

In a match against Shooters Hill he once took as many as seventeen wickets. He was a man respected by all who knew him. For many years he had been an intimate friend of the veteran Surrey cricketer, William Caffyn' Wisden 1917.*
- 305 M.C.C. Australian Team 1903-1904. Lord's May 1904 v Rest of England'. - England won the Test by one wicket. Australia batting first made 324, with Trumble making 64no, Noble 52, Trumper 42 and Hirst taking 5-77 for England, in reply, England made 183, with Hirst making 43, Tyldesley 33 and Trumble taking 8-65 for Australia. Australia made 121 in their second innings with Clem Hill top scoring with 34, Gregory 21 and Lockwood taking 5-45 for England. This left England requiring 263 to win the match, Jessop batting at number seven made a whirlwind 104, his first Test century, from 76 balls in only 75 minutes and Jackson 49. Fifteen runs were still needed when Rhodes, the last man in, joined Hirst. The two Yorkshiremen stood firm and scoring mainly in singles took the scores level with Australia, a single by Rhodes bringing victory, Hirst finishing on 58no. Trumble bowled unchanged, from the pavilion end, right through the entire match.*
- Gilbert Jessop was eventually dismissed after 77 minutes for 104, which included 17 fours and an all-run five. Many of the fours had well cleared the boundary, but the laws of cricket in 1902 meant that to obtain six runs the ball had to be hit out of the ground. One of these "fours" was caught on the players' balcony.*
- 310 Jack Hobbs 'Record'. Somerset v Surrey 1925. Original and scarce silk scorecard from the match played on the 15th-18th August 1925, where Hobbs made his 126th and 127th centuries equalling and breaking W.G. Grace's record of number of centuries scored. Hobbs made 101 in the first and 101no in the second. Surrey won the match by ten wickets. - Arthur Percy Frank Chapman. Kent & England 1924-1938. During the 1920's and early 1930's, Percy Chapman was regarded as the epitome of the English amateur cricketer. A brilliant school cricketer, a century on debut for Oxford University and a century in the Varsity match. His carefree batting won him an England cap in spite of the fact that his only county cricket had been with Berkshire at that point. He was selected to captain England in 1926 against the Australians at the Oval and having won the Test, won back the Ashes. He captained England on the tour of Australia in 1928/29, and returned home victorious. His leadership of England was ended temporarily for the final Test of 1930 on the grounds that his batting was too unpredictable and Wyatt was selected. However Chapman led England to South Africa in the winter of 1930. He captained Kent from 1931 to 1936. In Test cricket, playing twenty six Tests, he averaged 28.90 with the bat and in all first class cricket 31.97. He and his wife Beety divorced in 1942; he spent his final years, mainly alone, suffering from depression, arthritis and a continued dependence on alcohol. Following a fall at his home and a subsequent operation, Chapman died in 1961, aged 61.*

- Oxford University won the toss and elected to bat. In their first innings they made 240 all out, with Oxford Captain Cambell top scoring with 51, Roberts of Sussex taking 6-80. In reply Sussex made 368 all out with R.R. Relf making 177, Peat (6) and Melle (4) sharing all ten wickets for the University. Oxford were then bowled out for 77 runs and Sussex won the match by an innings and thirty three runs. Percy Fender taking 5 wickets for 21 runs from 10.3 overs.*
- 318 'Great Cricket Sensation at Folkestone- Captain P.F. Warner Nonplussed Leaves At Once For Buckingham Palace, A.P.F. Chapman In The Dock, Hotel Metropole Under Martial Law'. Large original newspaper advertising billboard poster printed by the Kent Evening Echo. Folds, minor wear and slight very minor loss otherwise in good condition for its age. The poster measures 20" x 30". £80/120
- It is not certain which cricket match or year the poster is referring but it may well have been 1939. 'England Past & Present' were do to play P.F. Warner's XI on the 2nd September 1939 at Folkestone. Ten matches were cancelled at the end of the 1939 English cricket season due to the German invasion of Poland on 1 September and the British government's declaration of war against Germany on Sunday 3 September and no first-class matches were played in England after Friday, 1st September 1939 until Saturday, 19 May 1945. Warner is titled 'Captain P.F. Warner', the Hotel Metropole was requisitioned by the War Department and Chapman by 1939 increasingly suffered from the effects of alcoholism.*
- 319 Tom Webster. Sporting cartoonist. Official Claridge's Hotel Dinner menu dated 30th April 1934. The menu with title and date to front cover and menu and wines to inner pages. To the back cover of the card there is an original caricature of Percy Chapman with the inscription 'Percy, With all thy faults, we love you still'. Signed Tom Webster 1934. Slight soiling and adhesive marks not affecting the caricature. G. Previously sold by Phillips Auctioneers in September 1980 as part of lot 59. £80/120
- The Australians arrived in England on the 28th April 1934 having left Freemantle on the 26th March. There was a luncheon given by the British Sportsman's Club to the Australian cricket team held at the Savoy Hotel, London on the 30th April 1934. The first match of the tour started at Worcester on the 2nd May 1934. Chapman may well have attended the Luncheon and stayed the night along with Webster and others at Claridge's.*
- Tom Webster was a British cartoonist and caricaturist who specialised in sporting cartoons. He started out at the Sports Argus in Birmingham, then later the Evening News, before joining the Daily Mail in 1919. He specialised in cartoons of horseracing, cricket and golf, and stayed at the Mail for over twenty years. He left the Daily Mail in 1940, but continued to draw for other newspapers, and his own range of annuals, until 1960. He died in 1962, aged 76.*
- 320 Tom Webster. Sporting cartoonist. Large original pen and ink artwork by artist Tom Webster regarding Percy Chapman being dropped from the team for the fifth Test against Australia in 1930 due to perceived tactical deficiencies and possibly growing concerns over his heavy drinking. Chapman was replaced as captain by Bob Wyatt. The press were united in attacking the decision, praising Chapman's batting and captaincy while denigrating Wyatt's lack of experience. The artwork begins 'The un-picking of the English team has now been done. We must not throw stones at the selection Committee, we must throw Boulders at them for dropping Percy Chapman. The Australians select a

- Captain and stick to him - maybe they are peculiar that way'. Webster then states 'The Team was disintegrated to the world over the wireless at 9.50pm Tuesday night' and he then proceeds to name some of the players in turn beginning with Hobbs and finishes with why they have selected two wicket keepers to play in the Test, Ames and Duckworth and finishes with '... means that the selection Committee do not know from Tuesday until Saturday who their best wicket keeper. Without being partial to either England or Australia I think the better selection Committee will win'. Unsigned by Webster. The artwork appeared in the Daily Mail on 14th August 1930, as stated to verso. 11"x12.5". Horizontal crease, minor staining otherwise in good condition. Signed by Mailey to corner and with inscription 'Now you know why I used the menu sideways'. - 322 'Oratory'. Six page handwritten speech on 'St Michael's Ascot, Berkshire headed paper in Chapman's hand. It is not known to whom the speech was made or what date but it begins 'Mr President and Gentlemen' and concludes with '...and may you, as a football club be only less successful than the Old Carthusians'. The greater part of the speech is devoted to Lord Tennyson 'whose genial bulk we miss at the festivities tonight'. Good content. - 323 'Cricket Tours Abroad' by A.P.F. Chapman circa 1933. Original eleven page handwritten manuscript/article on the subject. Chapman talks of travelling abroad on tours and looks at the history of various sporting tours from around 1860 onwards, modes of transport etc. He describes the pre first world war tours including both international tours to club tours at home 'One could hardly enter any large station especially during the holiday month of August without seeing on the platform a barrow or two piled up with cricket bags', Chapman then mentions post war touring problems, shortage of money, the advent of the motor car and unfashionable travel by train etc. He talks of possible over-keenness on tours which can lead to uncharitableness 'Our matches in Australia, (where the atmosphere seems charged with electricity, and where the cries of the excited crowds of spectators are liable to upset the equilibrium of the players) have suffered a good deal from this over-keenness lately. He then compares the simplicity of a club tour to a professional representative team 'Under the public eye from start to finish and for six months leads a strenuous life'. Chapman then describes in great detail, forms of deck games, in particular deck cricket against the ship's company 'Perhaps they are more accustomed to the surroundings, the motion of the ship, the dazzling light and the presence of a chattering crowd of spectators six feet behind the bowlers arm, or perhaps they take the game a trifle more seriously. A cricket ground 90 feet long, 12 feet wide and 8 feet high forms rather a contrast to Trent Bridge or The Oval'. He recalls matches in Colombo en-route to Australia 'If you want a taste of unadulterated heat try a cricket match in Colombo in October, for the atmosphere is usually like a Turkish bath and you will need your towel'. Chapman then describes in wonderful detail the pressures of the tour 'the strain is not so great in countries other than Australia, for the sense of rivalry is not so intense, but the experiences remain the same in varying degrees. Crowds on arrival, crowds on departure, crowds at wayside stations.... photographers, autograph hunters and press men everywhere and be careful what you say.. or some innocent but unguarded remark may be used as evidence against you. Invitations to Dinners, dances, theatres, concerts, mines, farms and factories, some of them difficult to refuse without giving offence. Boating, golf, tennis and fishing on off days. Dust and insects, a broiling sun overhead, cricket grounds of iron and sometimes mud and matting, packing and unpacking, hundreds of miles of travelling by road and rail sometimes through lovely scenery and sometimes over dreary wastes but nearly always with something novel to see'. He also describes touring in South Africa and the West Indies. He finishes by describing the great kindness and hospitality given to the team on every tour 'It is a strenuous time indeed but the pleasures outweigh the discomforts a hundredfold and colouring it all, there is the proud and glorious feeling that you are honoured guests as the chosen representatives of English sportsmanship'..... 'Do these Test tours do good?. Undoubtedly they have in the past both to visitor and visited... It would be a thousand pities if this over-anxiety to win, which mars the enjoyment of players in Test matches and has lately caused such trouble in Australia- should ever become so accentuated as to destroy friendly relationships'. The article is undated but Chapman gives us the year in his writing 'So cricket had to make a fresh start in 1919 under considerably changed conditions, which we find, after fourteen years of peace, have materially affected tours at home more than those abroad'.

- Arthur Fielder, a fast bowler and very photogenic with his stance and moustache, took almost 13,000 first class wickets for Kent at an average of 21.02, he played in six Tests for England. After a poor 1905 season, Fielder was the leading wicket taker for the Kent side which won the 1906 County Championship, appearing in all 22 Championship matches and taking 158 wickets for the County in the process. He was named one of Wisden's Cricketers of the Year in 1907. During this season he became the first man to take all 10 wickets in an innings in the Gentlemen v Players match at Lord's, taking 10/90 in the first innings and 14 wickets overall in the match. He is one of only four men to take more than 150 wickets in a season for Kent. He achieved the unusual distinction of scoring a century (112no) when coming in at number eleven, for Kent v Worcestershire at Stourbridge in July 1909, adding 235 for the last wicket with Frank Wolley, a record in English county cricket.*

- 338 Robert Andrew Woolmer. Kent & England 1968-1983. M.C.C. navy blue cloth touring cap with raised embroidered white emblem of St. George & dragon to front. The cap from the Sankey family collection and previously sold by Knights as lot 576 in October 1995. 'R.A. Woolmer' hand printed to inner label. The cap in good/very good condition. £120/160
- Bob Woolmer played 271 matches for Kent during his career scoring over 15,000 runs at an average of 33.43. He represented England in Tests on nineteen occasions and averaged 33.09 with the bat with a top Test score of 149. He died in 2007 in Jamaica in controversial circumstances.*
- 339 Graham Dille. Kent, Worcestershire & England 1977-1992. M.C.C. navy blue touring cap worn by Dille during his Test career. The cap with M.C.C. touring emblem of St. George & Dragon to front in silver and red thread. With official printed label 'G.R. Dille' to inside. Previously sold by Knights in 1997. Playing for England he scored 2434 runs at an average of 40.56 and made 98 dismissals. On the 1936/37 tour, Ames scored 811 runs at an average of 35.68 and made 29 dismissals.
- 341 Douglas Vivian Parson Wright. Kent & England 1932-1958. England navy blue home cloth Test cap with raised wired emblem of the three lions and crown to front. The cap made by E.C. - 342 Colin Cowdrey. Kent & England 1950-1976. M.C.C. navy blue cloth Test touring cap, by William Morling of Maidstone & Canterbury, with embroidered touring emblem of St. George & Dragon. Name signed to inside label. Previously sold by Knights Auctioneers in April 1997, lot 1163. Good/very good condition.

- Colin Cowdrey played for Kent for twenty six years and played 114 Tests for England 1954-1975. In his career he scored over 42,000 runs at an average of 42.89 with 129 centuries. His highest score was 307 for M.C.C. v South Australia in 1962/63. He died in 2000 at the age of 67.*
- 343 Pelham 'Plum' Francis Warner, Middlesex & England 1894-1929. England navy blue cloth Test cap with raised embroidered and wire emblem of the three lions and crown to front. The cap, with smaller peak, typical of a pre first world war cap, by H. Ludlam & Co of Albermarle Street, London, with name P.F. Warner' handwritten to label. Heavy wear to front of inner lining otherwise in good condition. An early and rare cap worn by the "Grand Old Man" of English cricket, as he was affectionately known. £600/900
- Warner played first-class cricket for Oxford University, Middlesex and England. He played 15 Test matches, captaining in 10 of them, with a record of won 4, lost 6. He succeeded in regaining The Ashes in 1903-04 however he was less successful when he captained England on the tour of South Africa in 1905-06, suffering a resounding 1-4 defeat, the first time England had lost to South Africa in a Test match. He was also to have captained England on the 1911-12 tour of Australia, but fell ill. He was unable to play in any of the Tests, with Johnny Douglas taking over the captaincy. He was named Wisden Cricketer of the Year in 1904 and also in 1921, making him one of only two to have received the honour twice, the other is Jack Hobbs). The second award marked his retirement as a county player after the 1920 season, in which he captained Middlesex to the County Championship title. In the mid 1920s he was Chairman of Selectors, tour manager on the infamous Bodyline tour of Australia in 1932-33. He was the chairman of the England Test selectors for several years in the 1930s. He later became President of the Marylebone Cricket Club. He was knighted for his services to cricket in 1937. He wrote extensively on cricket. He detailed his Ashes Tests and a history of Lord's Cricket Ground. He founded The Cricketer magazine. He was cricket correspondent of the Morning Post from 1921 to 1933, and subsequently of the Daily Telegraph. He died in 1963 at the age of 89 years.*
- 344 Leonard Hutton, Yorkshire & England 1934-1955. England dark blue cloth Test cap worn by Hutton in home Test matches for England during his playing career. The cap, by Simpson of Piccadilly, with excellent raised embroidered emblem of three lions and crown of England to front. 'Hutton' handwritten in black ink to inside label. - Sir Leonard Hutton, Yorkshire & England 1934-1955. Len Hutton was probably the greatest English opening batsman of his era, who played for Yorkshire and England before and after the Second World War as an opening batsman. He set a record in 1938 for the highest individual innings in a Test match in only his sixth Test appearance, scoring 364 runs against Australia, a milestone that stood for nearly 20 years. In 1952, he became the first professional cricketer of the 20th century to captain England in Tests, under his captaincy England won the Ashes the following year for the first time in 19 years. Hutton captained the England Test team between 1952 and 1955, in 23 Tests as captain, he won eight Tests and lost four with the others drawn. Hutton retired from regular first-class cricket during the 1955 season. He was knighted for his contributions to cricket in 1956. He went on to be a Test selector, a journalist and broadcaster and remained involved in cricket, and became Yorkshire President in 1990. He died a few months later, aged 74.*
- The vendor of this cap describes this find 'As the best ever Christmas present! A work college of his eldest daughter informed her that her father had won one of Len Hutton's caps at a Charity event. The vendor negotiated a deal and the vendor was the proud owner of the cap. Hutton had apparently donated the cap to the charity.*

- 345 Denis Compton. Middlesex & England 1936-1964. Middlesex navy blue cloth cricket cap with embroidered emblem of the three seaxes, emblem of Middlesex to front. The cap previously sold by the Cricket Memorabilia Society as lot 41, date unknown. 'Middlesex' hand

- Denis Compton scored almost 40,000 first class runs, with a highest score of 300 and an average of 51.85. He played 78 matches for England and scored almost 6,000 runs at an average of 50.06 and a best of 278. His best season was 1947 where he scored 3816 runs at an average of an incredible 90.85 with 18 centuries. Compton was the original Brylcreem boy. He was a breathtakingly talented batsman who had all the cavalier abandon and audacity of youth. He played football for Arsenal and won the F.A. Cup with them in 1950.*
- 346 Alec Victor Bedser. Surrey & England 1939-1960. M.C.C. navy blue cloth Test touring cap, by Simpson of Piccadilly, with excellent embroidered touring emblem of St. George & Dragon. Name hand printed to inside label. Previously sold by Vennett-Smith's Auction in November 2000, lot 2487. Some signs of wear otherwise in good+ condition. £300/500
- Twin brother of Eric Arthur Bedser, was the principal seam bowler in England from 1946 onwards until the mid 1950's. In his first two Tests for England he achieved match figures of 11 wickets for 145 and 11 wickets for 93. His total of 236 Test wickets created a new world record. He took 100 wickets in a season on eleven occasions with 162 his best in 1953. He was Chairman of selectors from 1969-1981 and managed several overseas M.C.C. tours.*
- 347 Harold James Butler. Nottinghamshire & England 1933-1954. Nottinghamshire navy blue cloth cricket cap with raised embroidered emblem of the Nottinghamshire crest to front. The cap made by R. Buttress & Co of Cambridge and previously sold by Vennett-Smith auctioneers. Name 'H.J. Butler' hand printed to inner label. Minor wear and fading to emblem otherwise in good condition. A cap from the best bowler for Nottinghamshire during the period on either side of World War II. £120/160
- Butler was a fast medium bowler and hard hitting lower order batsman who played 306 matches for Nottinghamshire during a twenty one year first class career. He took 952 first class wickets at an average of 24.44.*
- 348 Malcolm Jameson Hilton. Lancashire & England 1946-1961. M.C.C. navy blue cloth cricket cap with excellent raised embroidered white emblem of St. George & dragon to front. The cap worn by Hilton on his only M.C.C. tour of India, Pakistan & Ceylon in 1951/52. Paper label to inside of cap with handwritten details of the player and the tour. The cap has fading to the outside of the peak and minor wear and soiling, some browning to the M.C.C. emblem otherwise in good condition. Sold at Old Trafford in an auction held on behalf of Hilton's widow. £200/300
- Malcolm Hilton played in 241 matches for Lancashire taking just over 1000 first class wickets at an average of 19.42. He played four Test matches for England between 1950 and 1951/52 taking fourteen wickets.*
- 349 Neil James Napier Hawke. Western Australia, South Australia, Tasmania & Australia 1959-1969. Australian green cloth Test cap allegedly worn by Hawke during the Australian Test series against India in 1967-68. The cap, by Farmer's of Sydney, with embroidered Australian emblem to front with '1967-68' beneath. Minor small moth holes to peak otherwise in good condition. The late vendor states in his notes that this cap was Neil Hawke's but there is no clear provenance with the cap to support this. The cap has been checked and can be confirmed as a cap from that series, the embroidered emblem and numerals are consistent with the compared cap of Doug Walters who played in the same series. £2000/3000
- Neil Hawke played 27 Tests for Australia, taking 91 wickets at an average of 29.41 his best being 7-105 against England in the 1962/63 series. In all first class cricket he took 458 wickets at 26.39. He had a most successful tour of England in 1964 taking 83 wickets at an average of 19.80 including eighteen wickets in the series. Hawke spent eleven years playing in the Lancashire league following his retirement from the first class game. He was also a first-rate Australian Rules footballer.*
- Hawke was not called up to play in the series until the fourth Test match, the last of the series, at Sydney where he went away wicketless. Australia won the series by four Tests to nil.*
- 350 Frank Carroll Cobden. Cambridge University & M.C.C. 1870-1872. Very early cricket ball stamped in gilt with the inscription:- 'F.C. Cobden Esq. S.E. Butler c Bourne b Cobden o. T.H. Belcher b Cobden o. W.A. Stewart b Cobden o. 3 wickets in 3 balls, Lord's June 28th 1870. Cobden was playing for Cambridge in the Varsity match of 1870 and Oxford University required four runs to win with three wickets in hand and Cobden was bowling the last over. A single was taken off the first delivery, then Cobden performed the hat-trick to win the game for Cambridge by 2 runs. This feat led to the 1870 match becoming known as 'Cobden's Match'. - 'And so, accompanied by excitement unparalleled did the 8th, 9th and 10th wickets fall with the score 176, Cambridge after all winning this 'Match of Matches by 2 runs'. [Wisden 1871, pp35-36]*
- Cobden was a right arm fast bowler who gained a blue in all three years of his time at Cambridge. In 22 matches he took 65 wickets at an average of 17.20, with best innings figures of 6/35. He took five or more wickets in an innings four times and ten or more wickets in a match once. For many years he ran Radnor C.C. He played for Shropshire and Herefordshire.*
- 351 Walter Brearley. Lancashire, London County & England 1902-1912. 'Gentlemen v Players, 10th-12th July 1905'. Cricket ball, presented to Brearley, with circular silver metal plaque to ball with inscription '1905. Gents v Players at Lord's. 7 Wks.104. W. Brearley'. Previously sold by

- Christie's Auctioneers on the 2nd June 1989 (with two other balls), as lot 283. Good condition. £150/250
- In 1905, his best season, Lancashire fast bowler, Walter Brearley took 181 wickets at an average of 19.25.*
- In the 1905 Gentlemen v Players match, Walter Brearley bowled 28.2 overs, 3 maidens, 7 wickets for 104 runs in the Players first innings in which they made 356, the Gentlemen were then bowled out for 185, the Players in their second innings made 293-4 declared with Brearley taking a further two wickets. The Gentlemen were bowled out for 315 and the Players won the match by 149 runs.*
- 352 Sydney Santall. Warwickshire 1894-1914. 'Warwickshire v Worcestershire 1909'. Cricket ball presented to Sydney Santall with shield shaped silver plaque to ball with inscription 'Warwickshire v Worcestershire August 3rd 1909. W.L. Foster. lbw. b. Santall. Thousandth Wicket in First Class Cricket'. The silver plaque hallmarked Vaughton & Sons, Birmingham. Previously sold as part of The Pilkington Collection, Phillips Auctioneers, September 1989 as lot 542. Good condition. £150/250
- In the match, which Worcestershire won by an innings and 233 runs, Santall took three wickets for 149 runs in Worcestershire's only innings, his second wicket of Foster for 41 was his 1000th first class wicket.*
- Sydney Santall, a right arm medium pace bowler took 1,220 first class wickets at an average of 23.97 and a best of 8-23.*
- 353 Northamptonshire v Surrey, 8th-10th July 1912. Cricket ball presented to F.C. Parker following Northamptonshire's defeat of Surrey in 1912. The ball with circular silver metal plaque to ball with inscription 'First Defeat of Surrey by Northants, July 10th 1912. Presented to F.C. Parker Esq'. Minor wear to inscription on plaque otherwise in good condition. £120/160
- Northamptonshire beat Surrey for the first time in 1912, winning by nine wickets, the result putting the county on top of the County Championship table for the first time. Surrey in their first innings made only 95, Thompson and Smith taking nine wickets between them. Northamptonshire responded with a total of 247 with Vials making 82, Surrey made 242 in their second innings before completing the victory with only one wicket down.*
- F.C. Parker Esq was a Northamptonshire Councillor, possibly a benefactor of the club?*
- 354 Kennington Oval 1920. Cricket ball, presented to W.E. Hazelton by the North of Thames L.V.C.C. [Licensed Victuallers?] 1920. The ball with large shield shaped silver metal plaque to ball with inscription 'A Record. Presented to W.E. Hazelton by the North of Thames L.V.C.C. Match played at Kennington Oval, Sep 9 1920 versus Wholesale Trade. Wholesale Trade 214-9, North of Thames 136. Hazelton 11 wickets for 72 runs (12 a side)'. Minor wear to ball otherwise in good condition. Previously sold at the M.C.C. Bicentenary auction of April 1987, lot 702. £60/90
- The ball was donated to M.C.C. by Hazelton's wife, Mrs W. E. Hazelton.*
- 355 Herbert Sutcliffe. Yorkshire & England, 1919-1945. 'Scarborough Cricket Festival 1926'. Mounted cricket ball presented to Herbert Sutcliffe for his performance in the M.C.C. & Ground v Yorkshire match played at Scarborough in September 1926. The ball with silver crest and name 'Scarborough Cricket Club' mounted to ball. The ball sitting on a flat wooden black mount with silver plaque attached, the plaque has an engraved inscription to face which reads:- 'Scarborough Cricket Festival. M.C.C. & Ground v Yorkshire. - Amazingly, Woolley played first class cricket until 1938, whilst 51 years old. During the match he passed 56,000 runs in first-class matches.*
- 360 James Morton Sims. Middlesex 1929-1952. 'Middlesex v South Africa 1947. Jim Sims- Hat-trick!'. - 362 Alfred Lewis Valentine. Jamaica & West Indies 1949-1965. 'England v West Indies 1950, first Test series win in England'. Valentine (6 for 39) took the last English wicket and West Indies won a Test series in England for the first time'. - In the fourth Test at the Oval, West Indies batted first making 503 with Rae (109) and Worrell (138) both making centuries, in reply England made 344 with Hutton making an undefeated double hundred (202no), following on England collapsed and were bowled out for 103 with Valentine taking 6-39. He took four wickets in the first innings too. The stars of the tour were the unknown spinners, Valentine and Ramadhin who took 33 and 26 wickets respectively in the Test matches, no one else took more than six. 'The English batsman were baffled by them, even before they arrived at the crease'. Valentine created a sensation on his first tour to England, completely unknown before this visit, he took 123 wickets at an average of 17.94 in first class matches and 33 wickets at 20.42 in Tests. West Indies won the series by three Tests to one and this signalled the coming of age of the West Indies as a force in world cricket.*

- 364 Robert Abel, Surrey & England 1881-1904. A John Piggott cricket bat, autographed on the face 'Robert Abel, 1 October 1896' with fragment of handwritten letter from his son A.E. Abel attached to the face of the bat, originally reading 'Father used and was very proud of this bat. He scored a great number of runs with [it] in 1896- one of his more successful seasons, including 231 against Essex with the great 'Kortwright' in the team. With kind regards, Yours sincerely'. - 365 David Denton. Yorkshire & England 1894-1920. A Gunn & Moore 'Autograph' cricket bat used by Denton in the 1909 cricket season. The bat is inscribed in ink to back by Denton 'Scored 184 with this bat against Notts at Nottingham Season 1909. Highest score to date. Also 106 versus Australians at Bradford 1909'. - David Denton, middle order batsman for Yorkshire (1894-1920) and England 1905-1910), scored 1897 runs at an average of 36.48 in 1909. He scored five centuries and eight fifties. He made his highest score of the season against Nottinghamshire of 184, out of a total of 331 all out, in the first innings of the match played at Nottingham on the 15th-17th July 1909 batting at number three. His innings of 106, out of a total of 299 all out, was scored against the Australians in the match played at Bradford on the 21st-23rd June 1909, again batting at three. Denton's innings against the Australians is described by Wisden 'As one of the finest innings played against the Australians. Denton defended with exceptional skill and hit splendidly. Giving on chance he was seventh man out.... after batting three hours and a quarter.*
- 366 Frank Edward Woolley. Kent & England 1906-1938. A Gunn & Moore 'Autograph' cricket bat used by Woolley apparently used by Woolley during the 1929/30 tour of Ceylon, Australia & New Zealand. Signatures include Chapman, Levett, Freeman, Ashdown, Woolley, Todd, Valentine, Wade, Camerson, Crisp, Bell, Rowan, Mitchell, Siedle, Dalton, Langton, Cranmer, Bates, Croom, Dollery, Hollies, Paine, Kilner, Santall, Lytton, Perks, Jackson, Howarth, Gibbons, Warne etc. Wear to grip otherwise in good condition.

- 368 Tim Robinson. Nottinghamshire & England 1978-1999. Gunn & Moore 'Diamond' cricket bat used by Robinson in scoring 166 for England v Pakistan in 1987 and 83 [?] runs in the Nottinghamshire v Essex, Benson & Hedges Cup Final in 1989. - Robinson scored his 187 against Pakistan in the first innings of the first Test played at Old Trafford in 1987. The match was weather affected and was drawn. Robinson was run out for 86 in the 1989 Benson & Hedges Cup Final v Essex. Nottinghamshire won the match by 3 wickets.*
- 369 Bruce N. French. Nottinghamshire & England 1976-1995. Original microphone stump from the England v Australia. World Series, Second Final match played at the Sydney Cricket Ground in ??? 1987. The stump has small hollow (now filled) to take the microphone (retrieved by the broadcasting company). England won the Second Final by 8 runs. - In the Second Final of the World Series Cup at Sydney England batted first and made a total of 187-9, in reply Australia just fell short making 179-8, Botham taking 3-26 from his ten overs.*
- 370 Reginald Erskine Foster. Worcestershire & England 1899-1912. A magnificent large silver salver presented to Foster following his world record Test match score of 287 against Australia in 1903. Inscribed to centre of salver 'England v Australia. To R.E. Foster from his friend Hedley Cuthbertson in commemoration of his remarkable score of 287 on the Sydney Cricket Ground. The Record Score in a Test Match. The Ashes Team. December 14th 1903'. The silver salver, with pie-crust edge and three scrolled feet, was made by Thomas Bradbury & Sons of London, is hallmarked London 1904, weighs 1.7kg and measures 16" diameter. Odd marks otherwise in good condition. Previously sold in Phillips Auctioneers sale of 1998, lot 76. An historic item of Ashes history. £1500/2500
- Reggie 'Tip' Foster was an English cricketer and football player. He is the only man to have captained England at both sports. One of seven Foster brothers who were all educated at Malvern College and who all played cricket for Malvern and for Worcestershire C.C.C., Foster was a right-handed middle-order batsman. He had played for Worcestershire while they were still a minor county but in 1899, their inaugural season as a first-class county, he and his brother Wilfrid Foster both scored two hundreds in a match (against Hampshire), a feat which remains unique in county cricket. In 1900, as captain of Oxford, he scored 171 to set the record for the highest individual score in the Varsity Match, and he scored 102 not out and 136 for the Gentlemen against the Players at Lord's, the first man to score two centuries in a match in the Gentleman v Players series. In total, Foster scored 930 runs at an average of 77.5 for Oxford in the 1900 season, a record in University cricket. For these performances, Foster was named a Wisden Cricketer of the Year in 1901 and the following year a superb run of form for Worcestershire resulted in him scoring 1,957 runs, at an average of 54.36. However, business prevented him representing the MCC in Australia the following year and England undoubtedly missed his brilliant batting. Moreover, apart from one match against Warwickshire, he could devote no time to first-class cricket in May and June 1902, ruling him out of contention for an England place against Australia.*
- In 1903, his appearances were restricted to three matches in June and August, but England were desperate for a captain for that winter's Ashes tour. Foster was (oddly) able to arrange to be away from England. Although one might have feared that he would be out of*

practice, in the first Test at Sydney in 1903, Foster scored 287..... This was the highest score in Test cricket until 1930 (surpassed by Andy Sandham), and remains the highest score by a debutant and the third highest by a batsman of any nationality against Australia, home or away (surpassed only by Len Hutton's 364 in 1938 & Ross Taylor's 290 in 2015). For more than a century, Foster also held the record for the highest score in a test match at the SCG, his score not being beaten until Australian Michael Clarke scored 329 not out against India in January 2012.

In the following three seasons Foster could spare no time for cricket and in the following three seasons he played little cricket, but in 1907 he was able to find time to play regularly from the beginning of June. His batting was as good as ever in a summer of appalling wickets and helped Worcestershire to rise to equal second with Yorkshire. He captained England in the three-match series against South Africa in 1907, winning one match and drawing two. Offered the captaincy of the M.C.C. for the 1907/1908 Ashes tour, Foster declined because business commitments were monopolising his attention. Following the 1907 season, he played little first class cricket. He played football for Corinthians and England. Foster died in 1914, it was clear in the previous years that Foster was suffering severely from diabetes. A trip to South Africa failed to help him recover and he died in May 1914 at the age of only 36.

Edward Hedley Cuthbertson attended Malvern College and played a few times for Cambridge University, but did not get his Blue but made 151 v M. C. C. and Ground, at Lord's in 1910. Got his blue for Association Football. He was killed in the Great War at Amara, Mesopotamia in 1917.

371 'World's Record Last wicket stand 235 by A. Fielder & F.E. Woolley'. Lovely large silver octagon (eight sided) two handed cup presented to Arthur Fielder ['Pip'] by ['Col'] [Colin Blythe??]. The engraved inscription to the trophy reads:- 'Kent v Worcestershire at

Stourbridge. July 5,6,7, 1909. Kent won by an innings and 33 runs. Last Wicket Record 235. F. Woolley [incorrectly spelt] c Foster b Arnold 185, A. Fielder not out 112'. Also engraved to the rear of the cup on the foot is the wording 'Pip from Col'. The silver cup was made by William Hutton & Sons Ltd of Sheffield, is hallmarked Sheffield 1908, weighs 420 grams and measures approx 9" by 6" and stands 4.5" tall. To base of the cup is inscribed 'Charles Packer & Co. 76-78 Regent's Street'. Very good condition. Previously sold by Phillips Auctioneers in June 1986 as lot 409. An historic memento from the Championship winning team of 1909. £500/800

In the match which Kent eventually won by an innings and 33 runs, Worcestershire batted first and made 360 all out, with Pearson making 161, Kent in reply made 555 all out but were 320-8 when Colin Blythe walked out and was promptly out first ball for O. Woolley and Fielder then proceeded to add 119 off the last hours play and they continued the next morning with a further 116 runs in 80 minutes enjoying a partnership of 235, before Woolley was out, which remains the tenth wicket record in county cricket to this day. Worcestershire were then bowled out by Blythe (7-44) for 162. Fielder took six and Blythe eight wickets in the game. This was Fielder's only first class century. Arthur Fielder played 253 first-class matches, taking 1,277 wickets at an average of 21.02 and featured in four County Championship winning sides for his County.

372 'Kent C.C.C. Champion County 1909'. Unusual large commemorative silver ink stand presented to Kent Captain, Edward Wentworth Dillon at the 'Champion County Banquet' held on the 23rd October 1909. The silver ink stand on four circular feet, ingeniously designed, is lozenge shaped with two wickets at the front facing each other, and a cricket bat leant against each set, with the Kent emblem 'Invicta' to centre and to back is a silver cricket ball on a stand, whose top opens as a lid to reveal the inkwell inside. The engraved inscription to the ink stand reads:- 'Presented to E.W. Dillon. Champion

Eleven 1909 by the Kent County Cricket Club'. Each of the 1909 players received a similar trophy at the banquet. The silver ink stand was made by Henry Wilkinson of Sheffield, is hallmarked Sheffield 1909, weighs approximately 280 grams and measures approx 10" by 4" and stands 2.5" tall at its highest point. Very good condition. An historic memento given to each player from the Championship winning team of 1909. £500/800

Kent won their second Championship by some margin, winning sixteen of their matches to runners up Lancashire fourteen but only losing two matches compared to Lancashire losing four matches. Dillon captained Kent from 1909-1913, winning the Championship again in 1910 and 1913. He played 223 matches for Kent scoring over 11,000 runs at an average of 28.29. He was a noted rugby player who played three-quarter for Blackheath and England.

373 Frank Rowbotham Foster. Warwickshire & England 1908-1914. In the match Foster scored 105 out of Warwickshire's first innings total of 317, his first century in first class matches. He then bowled out Yorkshire for 347 collecting nine wickets for 118 runs from 29.3 overs. He took another three wickets in Yorkshire's second innings. Foster

- captained Warwickshire from 1911 to 1914. Foster played 127 matches for Warwickshire between 1908-1914. He badly injured his foot in a motor cycle accident in the First World War, which ended his cricket career.*
- 374 Elias Henry 'Patsy' Hendren. Middlesex & England, 1907-1937. 'Middlesex Champion County 1920'. Excellent silver miniature cricket bat presented to Hendren for his batting performance during the 1920 season. The silver cricket bat has an engraved inscription to face which reads:- 'E. THE CRICKET COLLECTION OF MICHAEL BEER OF KENT. Part Two

Michael Beer (1930 – 2007) was born in Dover, Kent. From an early age he had a love of the game of cricke, though never playing the game other than at school. He was a member of Kent C.C.C. and M.C.C. His collection of over 2,000 books and memorabilia grew from London bookshops, book stalls, auctioneers and dealers. He met and corresponded with H.W. 'plum' Warner who was very special to him. Following Michael's death, the cricket collection was too much a fabric of the family home to be removed. The Hon R H Lyttleton should have undertaken this work'. Comments relating to specific matches and notable Eton cricketers who went on to play first class cricket include 1867, 'About this time the Eton & Harrow match became the great fashionable event of the London season - it reached its zenith in the early 70's - 2000 each day was about the numbers present'. 1876, 'Forbes [Walter Francis Forbes Eton, I Zingari & Gentlemen, 1877-1884] one of the most famous of Eton cricketers threw the cricket ball 132 yds at the Eton College Sports this year'. 1878 and 1879, 'Paravacini [Percy John "Para" De Paravacini Eton, Cambridge University & Middlesex 1881-1892] an outstanding Boy cricketer - who never fulfilled his early promise - in fact he lost his bowling altogether'. Paravacini played cricket for four seasons for Eton. He also played in two F.A. Cup finals for Old Etonians, winning v Blackburn Rovers in 1882. "Para" was one of the most popular of Eton cricketers. In the 1878 Eton v Harrow match his brother, Harry Farquhar De Paravicini played for Harrow. 1883, 'Greatorex [Theobald Greatorex (Harrow), Middlesex & Cambridge University 1883-1892] failed dismally at the Varsity - but as a boy was one of the most brilliant bats ever seen at Harrow'. 1885, 'My first Eton v Harrow. I think we saw the finish Papa & I but it must have been rather late for me as the game ended at 7pm. I remember picking up a dark blue tassel in the "run in" after the game.' One of the best-contested matches played between the two sides, Harrow winning by three wickets with two minutes to spare. 1886, Eton won by six wickets. '[Hugh Richard] Bromley-Davenport [Eton, Cambridge University, Middlesex & England 1892-1899] (fast left) was considered a marvellous boy bowler... I saw this match on the Saturday afternoon with Papa... I distinctly remember as [William Dillwyn] Llewelyn [Eton, Oxford University & M.C.C. 1890-1893] walked away - a man saying "that little fellow going out has made 44" - I remember when it was only 40 & 12 to get - & also the run in afterwards'. 1892, Harrow won by 64 runs. 'In my day this Eton XI was always called Forbes's Scratch [Dudley Henry Forbes (Eton), Oxford University 1894-1895]... Eton flung a fine chance of winning this match away by 3 very bad run outs in the 2nd innings - for which 2 of which Forbes was to blame'. 1910, Eton won by 9 runs. 'Fowler's Match' [Robert St Leger Fowler (Eton), Hampshire 1924, appointed captain of postponed M.C.C. tour to West Indies 1924/25, died June 1925]... This wonderful game.
