- 1 Kent C.C.C. County Champions 1906. Rare official menu for the dinner to 'The Amateurs Kent XI (The Cricket Champions)', held at The Grand Hotel, Trafalgar Square, 10th December 1906. The menu with 'We Are a Band of Brothers' emblem and titles to front cover, black and white silk tie and gilt edges. Printed menu to inside. Minor soiling to covers otherwise in very good condition £200/300
- 2 Kent C.C.C. County Champions 1906. Rare official menu for the dinner for the Ninth Annual Dinner of the 'Association of Men of Kent & Kentish Men' with 'Guests: Kent County Cricket Team (Champions 1906)', held at The Holborn Restaurant, London, 6th November 1906. Printed titles to front cover, menu and toast list to centre pages, programme of Association events for 1906-7 to rear cover. Foxing, otherwise in good condition £200/300
- 3 Lord Harris, George Robert Canning, Kent & England 1870-1911. 'Complimentary Dinner to Lord Harris. By a few of his cricketing friends, on his leaving England for India as Governor of Bombay 1890'. Scarce exquisite one page card menu held in honour of Lord Harris held at The Limmer's Hotel, Conduit Street on the 4th February 1890. The menu card with gold and red floral decoration to borders with detail printed to centre. Light horizontal crease and adhesive marks to verso otherwise in good/very good condition. A rare item. Sold with a trimmed sepia real photograph postcard of Harris. G £180/250
- 4 'Receive this fond token'. Exquisite Victorian folding greetings card with front cover depicting a boy cricketer wearing colourful cap about to bowl the ball next to the stumps. Title to lower border, floral decoration to borders. Blank to inside pages. Marked to back in pencil '1880'. The card a little delicate with some wear to the paper of the boy cricketer and stumps, odd folds otherwise in good condition for its age. 3"x4.75" £30/50
- 5 'Maidenhead Cricket Club 1872'. Original printed sheet dated April 1873 being the Club's annual report with a list of members, matches played and their results in 1872 and accounts. The first recorded Club match was in August 1780, the Austin-Leigh family had eight members on the list, one of whom, E.C. Austin-Leigh, had played ten matches for Sussex. Another first-class player who was a member was A.S. Tabor (Middlesex, six matches) who played for the club in their annual match against Eton in 1872. Horizontal and vertical folds, otherwise in good condition £19.5"x12.75" £30/40
- 6 Surrey 1902. Original handbill for a 'Cricket Match... between XV of Honor Oak C.C. and Mr. E.G. Hayes' Surrey XI', played at Honor Oak Cricket Ground, 16th September 1902 in aid of the Peckham & Kent Road Pension Society. The handbill lists 'well-known Players' including Hayes, Richardson, Lockwood, Lees, Brockwell, Stedman, Davis etc, also Pearson of Worcestershire and Huish of Kent. Loss to top left corner, some foxing, horizontal fold with tape repair to verso, otherwise in good condition £70/100
- 7 'Cricket. Follow the Game with the King-Pins of Cricket, West Indians v Spartans, Sunday May 27th & Decoration Day May 30th [19]23'. Unusual and intriguing handbill for cricket match[es] played at Commercial Field, Brooklyn, New York. The handbill features lists of two teams, with short biographies of each player. Players for the 'West Indians' include Dr. W.O.B. Gibbs (captain), F. Hinds, O. Layne, E. Holder, R. Allder, A. Dash etc. Players listed for 'The Dreadnoughts' include A. Walcott (captain), A. Simpson, V. Sween, John Robinson, R. Cook etc. Printed by 'The Energetic Press', Brooklyn. Despite research, the auctioneer has been unable to find any record of the match, or the players named. 7.5"x12". G/VG £60/90
- 8 'List of Cricketers, 1946'. Unusual printed broadsheet listing the players for all seventeen first class counties and the Indian touring party to England, 1946. Published by 'Press Association and Exchange Telegraph Company's Joint Service'. Additional players names have been annotated in ink. Horizontal and vertical folds, otherwise in good condition. 19.5"x12.75" £30/40
- 9 'Improvements in Cricket Bats' 1893. Three page disbound original patent with drawings for a design which 'consists in making the blade and sometimes the handle partly of thin elastic metal- by preference steel'. James Whitestone. Patent no. 7767, dated 17th April 1893. VG - cricket £30/50
- 10 M.C.C. tour to Australia 1928/29. Original 'Daily Express Test Match Supplement' dated 6th February 1929 published during the fourth Test played at the Adelaide Oval, 1st-8th February 1929. The supplement was issued at the tea interval on the fifth day's play to announce the record third wicket partnership of 262 between Hammond and Jardine, Hammond scoring 177, and Jardine 98. Horizontal and vertical folds, tape repair to top edge, small holes to top corners, otherwise in good condition £25/35
- 11 M.C.C. won the 'timeless' fourth Test by twelve runs. Hammond scored two centuries in the match, 119 in the first innings and 177 in the second. Archie Jackson top scored for Australia with 164 runs in their first innings. Jack White took thirteen wickets in the match for M.C.C.
- 12 'Making a Good Score'. Excellent late Victorian colour chromolitho cut out picture (scrap) of a batsman, stumps and wicket keeper c1910. 8.5" tall with title to lower border. Laid to large album page surrounded by eleven other smaller scraps of cricketers in batting, bowling and fielding action, the majority approx 2.5" tall. Odd faults, otherwise in generally good condition £50/70
- W.G. Grace. Hampstead v London County 1902. Original batting orders handwritten in pencil to both sides of one page. Each side lists the batting orders for the two teams, the London County team written in Grace's hand. Players in the London County team

- include W.G. Grace (Captain), and his son, C.B. Grace, also C.J.B. Wood of Leicestershire. For Hampstead, F.R. Spofforth. Pin hole to top edge where the notice would have been pinned up in the pavilion. Foxing to page, otherwise in good condition. Sold with two pages of typed extracts of press reports relating to the match from Neville Weston. G £200/300
- Listed at number three in the batting order is 'H.F. Hylton', an original press cutting of the scorecard for the match shows Arthur Stoddart in this position in the order. However, the accompanying press reports describes Hampstead's poor start, 'but Marsh and Hylton retrieved matters somewhat by putting on 40 for the next wicket'. This would suggest that Stoddart did not play. We can find no record of this match elsewhere.*
- One notable feature of the match was the appearance for Hampstead of F.R. Spofforth (New South Wales, Victoria & Australia 1874-1888). Spofforth and W.G. Grace had first played against each other twenty nine years previously in 1892. The scorecard shows Spofforth, st. Marsh, b. W.G. Grace 0, and Grace, b. Spofforth, 21*
- 13 Reginald Herbert Spooner. Lancashire & England 1899-1921. Official circular complimentary ticket with string tie to the Lord's Members' Enclosure, for the first day of the Oxford v Cambridge Varsity match, 6th-8th July 1925. Issued to and signed in ink by Spooner. G/VG £25/35
- 14 Derek Gilbert Ufton. Kent 1949-1962. Original large poster and accompanying handbill advertising a match played at the Catford Cricket Carnival for Derek Ufton's Testimonial, between Christopher Chataway's XI v Catford, 29th June 1963. Chataway's team was represented by notable sportsmen and stars of the stage, including Billie Wright (England & Arsenal Manager), Ian Craig (Australia), Laurie Fishlock (Surrey & England), Jack Martin (Kent & England), Jon Fellowes-Smith (South Africa), Roy Castle and Tony Fane (Stage) etc and Ufton. The poster measures 20"x30". Folds, otherwise in good condition £40/60
- 15 'Centenary of South African Test and International Cricket' 1989. Original green file containing press and media material relating to the Centenary celebrations. Contents include a large 'South African Cricket Union' handkerchief, smaller silk handkerchief produced for the Centenary Banquet, 8th March 1989 incorporating sponsors' logos, various press releases, itinerary etc. Also correspondence relating to the event sent to Chris Harte of the Australian Cricket Journal, from Dr. Ali Bacher, Albie During etc. VG £40/60
- 16 Cricket related orders of service. Hubert Melville Martindale, 1976. Anthony Weigall, 1977. Gordon Christopher Melluish, 1977 (Essex 1926, four matches). Thomas John Mulcahy, 1981. Geoffrey Maurice Gower, 1989. Qty 5. Odd faults, otherwise in good condition £20/30
- 17 Sir John Berry 'Jack' Hobbs 1924-1967. Order of Thanksgiving for Hobbs' Memorial Service held at Southwark Cathedral on 20th February 1964. Minor ageing, light vertical fold, otherwise in good condition. Rare £25/35
- 18 John Arlott. Original typed two page manuscript for an article for The Guardian newspaper, 3rd June 1975. Arlott is reporting on the drawn County Championship, Middlesex v Surrey match played at Lord's 31st May- 3rd June 1975. Arlott comments on the Middlesex wicket-keeper, Murray, missing stumpings Edrich, 'twice failing to take off the bails... he will blame himself more sternly than anyone else'. He also notes Brearley batting out the innings with Featherstone. Handwritten alterations and deletions in Arlott's hand. G £40/60
- 19 John Arlott. Original typed four page manuscript for an article for The Guardian newspaper. Arlott is reporting on Surrey beating Yorkshire in the Benson & Hedges quarter final at The Oval, 12th June 1974, 'even more convincingly than the margin of 24 runs suggests'. Arlott comments on Yorkshire's decision to play five seamers and no spinner, 'Howarth, borther of the New Zealand slow left arm bowler went on to score 80 and won the match award for its major innings... Surrey's eventual 225 from
- 55 overs was a higher total than Yorkshire have ever scored in this competition'. Arlott makes an interesting comment about Boycott, Yorkshire Captain, 'He looms too large in his fellow countrymen's minds at the moment for his own, or his colleagues' good'. Handwritten alterations and deletions in ink in Arlott's hand. G/VG £50/70
- 20 John Arlott. Original typed three page manuscript for an article for The Guardian newspaper. Arlott is reporting on West Indies beating England 'with depressing ease' in the second One Day International at The Oval, 7th September 1973. Arlott comments, 'English cricketers and their followers could only view this match with alarm so far as it bears on the coming Test series between the two countries in the Caribbean. The win was achieved with an air almost of condescension'. He also reports that 'No West Indian bowler sent down a bouncer... while Boyce, the most effective bowler of the [earlier Test] series was given only six overs and delivered half of them from a half-length run'. Handwritten alterations and deletions in ink Arlott's hand. G/VG £50/70
- England, having narrowly won the first one day international at Headingley by one wicket in the last over, lost the second match at The Oval heavily by eight wickets with more than ten overs to spare, West Indies winning the two match series with a higher run rate*
- 21 John Arlott. Original typed three page manuscript for an article for The Guardian newspaper with particular interest relating to the 1974/75 tour to Australia. The article, written in August 1974 following the Test series against Pakistan, relates to the M.C.C. selection for the one day series against Pakistan and the impending winter tour to Australia. Arlott comments on 'The Prudential Trophy matches are being played for substantial sums of money and these are by the selectors' standards, pragmatic selections. The players themselves would resent experiment. As for the touring side, those of the past usually carried at least a couple of young players as an investment against the future. This one does

not'. Arlott continues that 'the party has been chosen - defensibly - specifically for the purpose of winning the series in Australia... it offers a depressing prospect for the future'. Arlott describes Boycott as 'the most complete current English batsman... Underwood on a damaged wicket would win a match... Lever is bowling with improbable fire' and a 'dearth of test-quality all rounders'. Regarding the Australian team, Arlott comments, 'There is no evidence that Lillee can reproduce his former speed... Meanwhile the vaunted Thomson... has played one Test and then with little effect... Under-rated English sides of good heart have succeeded in Australia before now; this one may do as much'. Handwritten alterations and deletions in ink Arlott's hand. G/VG £60/90

Australia regained the Ashes winning the six match series 4-1 with one match drawn, the bowling duo of Lillee and Thomson being a significant factor

22 John Arlott. Original typed four page manuscript for an article for The Guardian newspaper written at the close of the first day's play in the third Test against West Indies, Lord's, 23rd August 1973. Arlott describes the Lord's pitch, 'After a few spurts of morning life the pitch relapsed into general torpor with a tendency to lower bounce at the nursery end'. Kanhai having won the toss for the third time in the series 'gave West Indies first innings'. He comments on bringing in 'Willis for the injured Old while West Indies left out Headley, [used] Murray in his place as opening batsman and brought in Foster'. Regarding England's bowling Arlott comments on Greig's bowling having lost accuracy and being cautioned for running on the wicket, Underwood being 'encouraged by a few balls which turned', Lloyd and Kanhai making 'batting look pleasurable simple with Kanhai making his century'. Sobers' arrival at the crease presented the bowlers with 'a more daunting prospect'. Handwritten alterations and deletions in ink Arlott's hand. G/VG £50/70

West Indies won by an innings and 226 runs

23 John Arlott. Original typed four page manuscript for an article for The Guardian newspaper written at the close of the second day's play in the third Test against West Indies, Lord's, 24th August 1973. In a day in which 'Another large, and in some sections, highly demonstrative crowd, had fine entertainment; they saw 405 runs scored', West Indies had declared their first innings at 652-8, Kanhai scoring 157, Sobers 150 and Julien 121, leaving 'a weary [England] team almost an hour and a half to bat'. England ended the day 'with seven first innings wickets left... 564 behind'. The article describes the quality of Sobers' innings and his partnership with Bernard Julian, and the rearguard batting of Amiss and Fletcher during the last hour's play. Handwritten alterations and deletions in ink Arlott's hand. G/VG £50/70

24 Australian tour of England 1926. Cotton table cloth, with floral design border, signed by sixteen members of the touring party and then hand embroidered in various coloured threads. Signatures include Collins, Taylor, Ryder, Richardson, Bardsley, Collins, Grimmett, Ponsford, Woodfull, Mailey etc. 34"x34". Minor foxing/rusting marks otherwise in good condition. Unusual £100/150

25 'The Eleven of England 1847'. Original early silk commemorative handkerchief depicting the England eleven of 1847, after the watercolour by Felix. The handkerchief portrays Sewell, Lillywhite, Pilch, Dorrington, O.C. Pell, N. Felix, Clarke, Dean, W. Dennison, A. Mynn, Parr & Guy. Mounted overall 35"x39". Some age toning, wear and loss to folds on centre of image, other odd faults to extremities. A rare and early handkerchief in generally good condition for its age. £250/350

29 Yorkshire C.C.C. 1935. Original large menu for the 'Dinner to The Yorkshire County Cricket Team. County Champions 1935', held at the Savoy Hotel, London, 14th September 1935. The dinner given by Sir Charles Sykes and Clifford P. Hare. Four page menu bound in decorative card cover with cream tie, the internal pages detached. Titles and vignette photographic portraits of Sykes and Hare with the Yorkshire team listed below to first page. To centre pages a full page cartoon by Tony Webster facing the menu. Cricket caps from the 1948 series are rarely seen at auction and only the caps of Don Bradman, Arthur Morris and Sidney Barnes are known by the auctioneers to been sold in the last twenty years. Bill Johnston was a key member of Bradman's Invincibles, the 1948 Australian team that toured England without losing a single match. He took 102 wickets on the Australian tour of 1948 at an average of 16.42 with a best 6-18 v Yorkshire and nine wickets in the first Test at Nottingham against England.

'Johnston was different to Miller and Lindwall. A tall left-arm bowler, he had a bouncy, bucking approach and a lithe, rubbery action which dispatched a mean late-swerving ball that often cut away sharply. Irrespective of what then happened to it, the bowler more often than not placed his hands on his hips and grinned. Picking up wickets regularly during that series, Jolly Bill Johnston offered no respite to Test or county batsmen who might have thought they were safe whenever Lindwall and Miller took their sweaters. Johnston's overall bag that summer was 102 wickets. No Australian has managed a century of wickets on a tour of England in all the years since'. [David Frith. The Guardian 2007]

He scored almost 35,000 runs at 33.26 and took over 1100 wickets at 26.42. He is famously remembered facing the West Indian fast bowlers in 1976 having been recalled to the England team at the age of 45. The interval between Close's first and last Test matches was 27 years, the second-longest after Wilfred Rhodes. Close died in September 2015 at the age of 84 years

- In this tour match, the North batted first and were bowled out for 91 by the Australians, Spofforth and Boyle taking 5 wickets each, Flowers top scored for the North with 26, Barlow making 10 not out. The Australians then batted and were bowled out for 100, Bonnor top scored with 38, Barlow taking 4 wickets for 6 runs. In the North's second innings they totalled 255 with Barlow scoring a century 101 and Flowers making 90. This was Barlow's first century in first class cricket. The Australian were bowled out for only 76 in their second innings with Attewell taking 4-30 and Barlow 6-42 from 27 overs. The North of England won by 170 runs. Richard Barlow considered this match to be his best all round performance that he played. He states in his autobiography 'The best, in my opinion, was at Nottingham in 1884, in the match North of England v Australians. In the first innings I was 10 not out and in the second innings I made 101 on a very bad wicket, and against some first-class bowling. I have often remarked since, that I did not know how I managed to remain in so long on such a difficult wicket, and with such bowlers as Messrs. Spofforth, Palmer, Boyle, Giffen and Midwinter arrayed against me. I also took ten wickets*
- for 48 runs. The London Papers gave the following complimentary report of play:- For North of England against the Australian team, at Nottingham [1884], on a sticky wicket, Barlow was batting four hours and a half for his score of 101, and never gave the semblance of a chance; in the first innings he was 10 not out, and his bowling average was ten wickets for 48 runs. Such a performance in a match of this importance, has never been recorded, and a subscription was made and presented to him, along with a few other presents including a silver claret jug and a diamond breast pin whilst he was enthusiastically cheered'. The Australian player, Tom Horan writing in *The Australasian* said 'Throughout the tour we have not seen a finer performance than that of Barlow's, on such a difficult wicket, against splendid bowling, and without giving the slightest chance. His bowling also, was first class, and required a good deal of watching'.*
- Richard Barlow played in 351 first class matches scoring over 11,000 runs at an average of 20.61 with a highest score of 117 v M.C.C. in July 1885. He took 950 wickets at 14.52 with a best of 9-39 v Sussex in June 1886. His batting epitomised the term 'stonewalling'. He also played football as a goalkeeper for Lancashire*
- Barlow is immortalised in one of the best-known pieces of cricket poetry, a poem called 'At Lord's' by Francis Thompson. In it Thompson remembers back watching Barlow and A N Hornby play for Lancashire through rose-tinted glasses. The first verse of the poem, which is repeated as the final verse is the best known:*
- It is little I repair to the matches of the Southron folk,
Though my own red roses there may blow;*
- It is little I repair to the matches of the Southron folk,
Though the red roses crest the caps, I know.
For the field is full of shades as I near a shadowy coast,
And a ghostly batsman plays to the bowling of a ghost,
And I look through my tears on a*

*soundless-clapping host
As the run-stealers flicker to and fro,
To and fro:
Oh my Hornby and my Barlow long
ago!*

William Lloyd Murdoch. New South Wales, Sussex, London County, Australia & England, 1875-1904. *Billy Murdoch is listed as player/cap number thirteen in the list of Australian Test players and he played his first Test match for Australia, in the second Test ever played, against England at Melbourne in March/April 1877. He captained Australia in sixteen Tests from 1880 to 1890, this included four tours to England one of which, in 1882, gave rise to The Ashes. Murdoch scored both the first double century in Test cricket (211 against England in 1884) and the first triple century in Australian domestic cricket (321 against Victoria in 1882). In later years, he settled in England, playing county cricket for Sussex (1893 to 1899, as captain) and London County (1900 to 1904). In 1892, he toured South Africa with England and played in one Test match, making him one of the few cricketers to represent more than one international team. Murdoch's final first-class match came at the age of 49, in August 1904. He died in Melbourne in 1911, aged only 56*

Bob Appleyard's brief first-class career which did not start until he was 27. An off spinner who bowled at close to medium pace, with a deceptive dipping flight, and great accuracy, he was devastating on a wet wicket, and economical on batsman's pitches. His Yorkshire debut came in 1950 when he played in three matches and took 11 wickets but there was little indication of what was to happen the following season when he took 200 wickets. He took 154 wickets in 1954 and received an England call-up. He took 5 for 51 on debut, and 31 wickets at 17.87 in his nine Tests. A change in the lbw law and a chronic shoulder injury drastically reduced his effectiveness, and he quit in 1958, after only five full seasons. For Yorkshire he took 708 wickets at an average of 15.48 and a best of 8-76

Sir Julian Cahn was a British businessman, philanthropist and cricket enthusiast. From 1929 to 1939, Cahn was the captain of his own team, the Sir Julian Cahn XI, that toured the world. It was one of the most successful private teams, losing only 19 out of 621 cricket matches. Cahn recruited top players from outside England, including Australians Vic Jackson and Jack Walsh

William Arnold Sime CMG MBE was a South African-born English barrister and judge who also played first-class cricket. Educated at Bedford School and at Balliol College, Oxford, he

was a right-hand batsman and slow left-arm orthodox bowler. He played first class matches for the Minor Counties between 1929 and 1934, and Oxford University in 1931. He then joined Nottinghamshire in 1935 and stayed with them until 1950, captaining the club in his final three years. He was Recorder of Grantham and was appointed a Circuit Judge in 1972. He was very good friends with Arthur Carr and the cricketing items being sold in this auction were left to Sime on Carr's death

Good condition. An interesting insight into the early cricketing and sporting life of an inspiring but often controversial cricketer £300/500

Arthur William Carr was born at Mickleham in Surrey in 1893. He was educated at Hazelwood, Eton and Sherborne Schools. The Sherborne school magazine wrote the following of his cricketing abilities in 1904 'Very good all round for his size, but too small to be much use yet' and in 1905 'For his inches would be quite in the 1st class; with a little more head, but at present is addicted to strokes that mean certain death. Is too small yet to do justice to his undoubtedly bowling talent. A fine field anywhere' and in 1906 'As Captain, keen and energetic in the field, but should learn to discriminate between slackness and un-skilfulness in others. As a batsman, has had no superior here, possessing every stroke a boy of his age ought to have, his driving being perhaps his strongest point. His bowling hardly increased

as much in accuracy as in pace. A beautiful field anywhere, from wicket keeper outwards'. On leaving the school the magazine wrote of him: - '...has also been suddenly called to Eton. In him Hazelwood loses a sportsman second to none, and his future will be looked upon with eager interest' He went on to Eton College where he was in Mr. J.H.M. Hare's House from September 1906 to July 1907 when he was asked to leave so went instead to Sherborne School from September 1907 to July 1911. He was a member of the Cricket XI from 1909 to 1911, scoring over 1,000 runs in the 1909 season alone. He also played for Nottinghamshire County Cricket Club 2nd XI in 1909. The Sherborne School magazine wrote the following of his 1910 cricket season 'Very good bat, with any number of good shots, his best being his drive, which is very powerful. His fault is his great recklessness, getting himself out by treating full tosses and long hops too carelessly. A good field anywhere, at his best in the slips. A useful fast bowler, but cannot last long'. In 1910 he represented the Public Schools XI in the match against the MCC at Lords. On leaving school he made his first class debut for Nottinghamshire against Derbyshire at the age of 17, in the same season, scoring 1,800 runs but did not score his first century for the club until 1913 and he played football for Leicester City [Rugby] Football Club in 1912. His war-time service saw him involved at Mons as a 2nd Lieutenant and his regiment were involved in the long retreat from Mons where they acted as a rearguard to the retreating British Expeditionary Force. He was wounded and invalided home for four months during 1915, returning to the front at the end of the year and was mentioned in despatches. He was still serving with his regiment at the armistice in November 1918.

In the summer of 1919 he resumed his career with Nottinghamshire Cricket Club as club captain, a position he held until 1934 when he gave up the job following a heart attack. He toured South Africa with the MCC in the winter of 1922-23 and was named Wisden Cricketer of the Year in 1923.

Nottinghamshire finished second in each of the County Championship seasons of 1922 and 1923

Carr was named captain of England for the Ashes series against Australia in 1926. In the third Test at Leeds, he controversially put Australia into bat after winning the toss, and dropped Charlie Macartney at slip in the first over of the match. Macartney went on to score a hundred before lunch and England was lucky to avoid defeat. He came down with tonsillitis during the fourth Test of the series, and although he recovered in time for the fifth Test, he was replaced as captain by Percy Chapman. He was bitterly disappointed with this decision, and although he captained England twice more in his final two Tests against South Africa in 1929, henceforth he put most of his effort into captaining Nottinghamshire into a dominant position within the English County cricket competition. He became a test selector during the 1927 season. In 1930 and in the following years, Carr was instrumental in developing the "bodyline" bowling tactic together with future England captain Douglas Jardine and the two Nottinghamshire fast bowlers Harold Larwood and Bill Voce. Carr used the tactic of instructing his bowlers to aim at the bodies of batsmen and placing a close set field on the leg side to take catches fended away from the body with the bat and perfected it as he led Nottinghamshire to success in the county competition. Jardine then used Larwood and Voce in similar fashion on the infamous 1932-33 English tour of Australia, resulting in several injuries to Australian batsmen and the incurring the wrath of the Australian public. After this tour, and the subsequent fallout, Carr was subjected to bodyline bowling by other English county teams, and was severely shaken by several balls that nearly hit him on the head. He later denounced the tactic he had helped develop as unfair. Dissension within the Nottinghamshire club over his role in the bodyline scandal led him being sacked as captain in 1934, and he never played first-class cricket again.

In all, he played 11 times for England with a batting average of 19.75. He also wrote a book, 'Cricket with the Lid Off' with a preface by Douglas Jardine which was published in

1935. In his first class career he scored 21,100 runs including 45 centuries at an average of 31.58 and took 318 catches.


were produced, this plate being presented to Gilbert Court Branch who sat next to Grace at the Dinner. The plate has recently been professionally restored due to a hairline break to the plate in May 2017 when being removed from the frame it was originally displayed in, probably caused by slight pressure on the plate whilst in the frame. There are photographs of the plate originally mounted in the frame, after the breakage and the restored plate available to view. A very rare plate, rarely seen £12000/18000

W.G. Grace completed his one hundredth century by making his highest first class score of 288 v Somerset in the game in the match, Somersetshire v Gloucestershire, played at the Ashley Down Ground, Gloucester on Friday May 17th 1895

A short resume of Gilbert Court Branch and the plate's history is provided by the vendors of the plate who reside in Canada- 'Although we know the journey of the plate over the last century we do not know a great deal of history about the original owner, our great grandfather Gilbert Court Branch and his connection to W.G. Grace. Gilbert Court Branch lived in Norton Hauteville, Pensford in Somerset and was a cattle dealer and farmer. We believe he knew W.G. Grace through their joint love of beagling. Both Branch and Grace were members of the Clifton Foot Beagles. We also believe that he was a member of the Bristol Century Club.

The plates journey began when it was specially commissioned by S. J. Kepple and Son for a private dinner party at the St. Stephen's Restaurant on January 22nd, 1896 in honour of W.G.'s 100th century. The back of the plate depicts the seating arrangement with Gilbert Court sitting beside W.G. along with the other guests. The dinner was arranged by W. Methven Brownlee for all 18 guests.

Gilbert Court Branch died on December 19, 1912 at which time the plate was willed to our grandfather Harold Samuel Branch. He lived in the South Gloucestershire area for most of his life where the plate was proudly displayed in a



frame in his residence until his death in 1967. After his death the plate along with other articles were shipped to Canada by our father Gilbert Peter Branch. He immigrated to Canada in the early 1950's where he married our mother and lived in southern Ontario. As children we all remember the plate being displayed in the living rooms of our homes but had little knowledge of the significance other than it was a cricket plate that belonged to our great grandfather. In 2016 we started to appraise a number of household items that belonged to our parents at which time we discovered the importance of the plate. Being Canadian we have no understanding of the game of cricket and felt it was important to return it to the birthplace of the sport where it can be appreciated for its rarity and significance.

'Irving Rosenwater, in 1975, wrote that ten [plates] were still in existence, and the appearance of one on the open market, it was believed for the first time, caused a flutter of excitement at Christie's Auctioneers in June 1989'. It sold for £4200 as lot 222. The Wisden Book of Cricket Memorabilia. Marcus Williams & Gordon Phillips 1990

John Hearne, known as 'Young Jack' to distinguish him from his distant cousin J.T. Hearne', was a Middlesex leg spinning all rounder who represented England in twenty four Test matches from 1911 to 1926. One of the leading all rounders of his day, he achieved the 'double' five times and on three occasions exceeded 2,000 runs. He took over 100 wickets in a season five times.

The M.C.C. tour of South Africa in 1913/14 was won by four Tests to nil, one drawn, mainly thanks to the bowling of Syd Barnes, who finished the tour having taken 103 wickets at 10.74 with a best of 9-103. Hearne played in three of the five Tests and took 5-49 in the 3rd Test, but never lived up to his English reputation.

Bill Bowes playing career with Yorkshire spanned from 1929-1947. He played in 372 first-class matches as a right arm fast bowler and a right-handed tail end batsman. He took 1,639 wickets with a best

performance of nine for 121 and completed ten wickets in a match 27 times. He scored 1,531 runs with a highest score of 43* and is one of very few major players whose career total of wickets taken exceeded his career total of runs scored. Bowes was a late selection for the tour, just three days before the ship sailed, for England's tour of Australia and New Zealand in 1932/33. He played in only the second Test on the Australian leg of the tour, at the Melbourne Cricket Ground, in which he bowled Don Bradman first ball and that was his only wicket in the match, which Australia won by 111 runs. Bowes played in the second Test against New Zealand at Eden Park in Auckland and took six for 34 on the first day to bowl New Zealand out for only 158. Bowes played in twelve first-class matches on the tour and took 37 wickets with his best performance the six for 34 in the Auckland Test.

The tour of Australia & New Zealand in 1932/33 was Bill Bowes only overseas tour with the M.C.C.
