- 1 Gerald Brodribb. 1915-1999. Cricket historian and statistician. A good selection of handwritten and typed correspondence and reports sent to Gerald Brodribb, the majority between Brodribb and A.H. Wagg in the period 1945-1952. The correspondence relates to cricket played in England, West Indies, New Zealand, India, Australia etc. and comprises details of player's averages and records, and matches played. Other correspondents include Philip Thomson in Trinidad, A.W. Davidson in New Zealand, E.F. Hitchman in Ottawa, Edward Knight etc. Brodribb and Wagg are considered by many as pioneers in the field of cricket statistics and this selection provides an excellent insight into their detailed research. - 2 Gerald Brodribb. 1915-1999. Cricket historian and statistician. Box comprising eleven scrapbooks and albums compiled by Brodribb from 1926 when Brodribb was aged eleven, to 1945. The books with handwritten notes, statistics, newspaper and magazine cuttings of match reports and many of players and teams etc. Subjects covered include the 1937/1938 winter season including Tennyson's tour to India and Brinckman's tour to South America, Len Hutton for the period 1939-1945, the 1937 County cricket season etc. An intriguing record of Brodribb's fascination with the game from an early age. - 3 'The Australian Cricket Team 1909'. Folding fixture card for the Australian tour of England 1909. Decorative covers, with title, with cameo pen pictures of the players and facsimile signatures of the tourists to inside pages and tour fixtures to back cover. R.F. Steel. 'The Block'. Melbourne. Some identification annotation to inside marks, some minor wear and age toning to outer covers otherwise in good+ condition. Rare £150/250
The fixture card was probably only presented/issued to players and officials
- 4 'Bodyline. Season 1932/33'. Original Sydney Cricket Ground ladies membership ticket, with cord attachment, for the 1932/33 season. 'One lady only, once each day from Oct 1st 1932 to Sept 30 1933'. Odd faults, good. Rare £30/40
- 5 Sir Julien Cahn's XI 1939. Octagonal six page fixture list for the 1939 season bound in leather in Cahn's black, grey and pink colours, gilt title to front. Minor soiling to covers, otherwise in good/ very good condition £40/60
- 6 Cardiff Cricket Club. An official fixture card for the 1880 season, and two Member's Tickets with fixtures printed to centre pages for 1883 and 1884. Qty 3. Odd faults otherwise in good condition £30/50
- 7 Cassell & Co. 'Matches at the Oval, 1883. Matches at Lord's 1883'. A four page folded fixture card advertising Cassell's sporting books, with matches listed at both grounds for June, July and August 1883. Some wear, foxing and splitting to fold, otherwise in generally good condition £30/40
- 8 'The Fight for the Cricket Championship 1900'. Six page folding fixture card produced by Duke & Sons, Penshurst, Kent. The card, with humorous cartoon of 'Prehistoric Cricket' to front, lists all County Championship matches for the 1900 season, also the West Indian tour fixtures, Kent Club and Ground etc. Some wear, otherwise in generally good condition £30/40
- 9 Yorkshire club cricket 1868-1903. Five fixture/ member cards for Yorkshire clubs. Cards are Eccleshill C.C. 1868, Ilkley C.C. 1870, Londesbro' Park C.C. 1893, Springfield C.C. 1899, and Hull C.C. 1903. The Hull card cloth bound in fragile condition. The others with odd faults, generally good condition £50/70
- 10 'First Class Cricket Fixtures 1908'. Eight page booklet published by Smith & Sons, gentlemen's tailors, London, listing first class fixtures for 1908, also those of the touring Philadelphians. Front and rear covers feature photographic images of cricketers in batting, bowling and fielding poses. Lacking staple which has left rust staining, otherwise in good condition £30/40
- 11 'The Crescent Cricket Club Season 1888'. Original single page flyer for a 'Grand Smoking Concert' at the Cock Assembly Rooms, Cock Tavern Highbury, 3rd March 1888. The flyer printed in gold ink on pink paper with ornate border, printed titles and the programme for the event. Heavy folds, some tears and fading. Fair/ good condition £40/60
- 12 'Principle Cricket Fixtures, 1907'. One of a series of small booklets published by the Cricket Press, originally priced at one penny. This issue features Capt. E.G. Wynyard (Hampshire & England 1878-1908) to the front cover. Not listed in Padwick. Rusting to staple otherwise in good/ very good condition. Scarce £50/80
- 13 Stoics Cricket Club. Early 'List of Matches' folding fixture cards for 1879, 1881, 1886, 1888-1890 and 1894. Also two 'Rules and List of Members' booklets for 1885 and 1888, and a fixture card for two tours, date unknown. Odd faults, otherwise in good condition. Qty 10 £40/60
It is believed that the Stoics Cricket Club was founded in 1877, originally for the old boys of Westminster School. Notable players who appeared include A.E. Stoddart, C.J. Kortwright and R.W.V. Robins, but it was while playing for Hampstead against Stoics in a one day match in 1886 that Stoddart scored 485 in a total of 813 for 9, the Stoics not getting a bat
- 14 England v Australia, Lord's 1930 and 1938. Official 'Large Mound Stand' match tickets for Saturday 28th June, 2nd Test at Lord's 1930 and Saturday 24th June, 2nd Test at Lord's 1938. Minor folds otherwise in good condition £30/40
- 15 Cricket posters. Original posters for the charity match, Brondesbury C.C. v Middlesex C.C.C. 1957 and for 'The Forty Club XI (Capt. Sir Leonard Hutton v Coventry & District (Diocese) XI (Capt. J. Hews) played at Courthaulds Sports Ground in 1962.. Both 15"x20"'. Horizontal and

- vertical folds, otherwise in good condition £25/35
- 16 'Arthur Shrewsbury & Richard Daft's Team to the North America 1879'. Early printed passenger list for the 'Inman Line. List of saloon passengers per Royal Mail Steamer 'City of Richmond' from New York to Liverpool, sailing October 25th 1879'. 4pp folding listing printed on mauve paper with titles and vignette of the ship to front wrapper ruled in gilt, list of passengers including all the tour players to inside pages and maritime map of the North Atlantic Ocean to rear wrapper. Players listed included Shrewsbury, Daft, Pinder, Barnes, Lockwood, Ford, Ulyett, Shaw, Emmett, Bates etc. Some horizontal folds and some soiling to page edges and creasing otherwise in remarkably good condition for its age. Ex Arthur Shrewsbury by direct descent and previously sold as part of lot 110 of Christies sale of June 1995. £250/350
- The tour was arranged by J.P. Ford, A member of the Nottinghamshire Town Council, who had interests in North America, asked Richard Daft to select and lead a side of professionals on a tour of North America in the autumn of 1879. Daft picked six other Nottinghamshire players plus five from Yorkshire to accompany him. The main fixture was against Philadelphia, where around 25,000 attended the three day game and due to this fixture the tour was a success. A baseball match was arranged in New York later in the tour*
- 17 Don Bradman. Royal Australian Mint 1996 \$5 'Sir Donald Bradman' coin, and another 2001 coin, both in presentation cases. Also an 'Australian Legends' Medallic first day cover dated January 1997 with commemorative \$5 Bradman coin. Sold with two full sheet of similar Bradman stamps in souvenir packs etc. VG £25/35
- 18 England tour of Australia 1954-1955. The Savings Bank of South Australia advertising ink blotter, unused. To one side is a pink ink blotter, to face printed pictures of the 'English Cricketers 1954-1955- Don't be caught at "Silly Point"- for a good "score" save regularly at The Savings Bank of South Australia'. 8.75"x3.75". VG £40/60
- 19 John Arlott. Middlesex v Gloucestershire, 2nd-4th May 1973. Original three page typed manuscript written by Arlott for an article for The Guardian newspaper. Writing at the close of play on the opening match of the 1973 County Championship season, Arlott describes how 'The perennial uncertainty of Maytime form produced an interestingly uneven pattern of play at Lord's yesterday. Gloucestershire, in a couple of bursts of enterprise, hauled themselves from the brink of collapse to an upright position'. Sold with a official match scorecard for the match annotated in hand by Arlott. VG £50/70
- The rain affected match ended in a draw with no play possible on the second day*
- 20 Lancashire v Surrey 1870. Original copy of the Manchester Evening News for 27th May 1870. The four page issue includes a thirty line report on the first day's play at Old Trafford (Surrey 103, Lancashire 96 for 6). This was the first match of the season and the benefit game for F.R. Reynolds 'who had been the professional bowler of the Manchester club for a period of ten years'. Odd faults and minor loss, otherwise in good condition £30/50
- Frederick Reginald Evans (Lancashire 1865-1874) was manager of Old Trafford cricket ground from 1860 to 1908*
- 21 'Early Cricket'. The scrapbook of Ernest Short. The scrapbook is a copy of E.V. Lucas's 'The Hambledon Men' of 1907 extensively extended with the inclusion of pictures, newspaper cuttings, typed notes etc, much referring to cricket later than the original book, so that the finished scrapbook is 3" thick, and bound in green calf with the spine title of 'Early Cricket. Ex libris E.H. Short' in gilt. The majority of the additions to the original book are magazine and newspaper cuttings accumulated during Short's time in London. Notable contents include a candid sepia photograph of Patsy Hendren, Sydney Southerton journalist and editor of Wisden 1934/35, White, Chapman, Tate and Hammond on the 1928/29 England tour in Australia at a railway station. Signatures of nine of the contributors to a BBC Radio Empire Programme 'Back to the Pavilion: Recollections of Lord's', mainly professional actors such as Norman Shelley, but also Plum Warner and Arthur Mailey. A two page typed letter from E.V. Lucas dated 4th December 1905, inviting contributions for the Misses Nyren fund. A typed article on Bonner with handwritten amendments written from his home address of 2, Whitehall Court, SW1. A signed postcard dated 10th June 1946 from C.B. Fry at Hamble inviting Short and any others he wishes to his box at Lord's for three forthcoming matches etc. Wear and bowing to covers, generally good condition £150/250
- Ernest Short (1875-1959), an Australian, was for a time the London correspondent of a Melbourne paper. He wrote some books from the mid-1920s to the mid-1950s on art, sculpture, etc*
- 22 Don Bradman 1908-2001. Five original Australian and three English newspapers featuring extensive coverage of Bradman's funeral and tributes. Publications are The Advertiser, The Sunday Mail, The Herald Sun, The Sunday Morning Herald, The Observer, Daily Telegraph and Sunday Telegraph. Sold with a printed 'Operational Brief' for the funeral procession containing the protocol to be observed by attendees, the route of the cortege and motor cycle escorts, emergency services, communications, personnel etc. Also four colour candid photographs of Bradman's house and the funeral cortege in progress. - 23 New Zealand tour to England 1949. An official four page programme for a 'Concert & Prize Distribution' held on board the Q.S.M.V. 'Dominion Monarch' on 16th March 1949 on which the New Zealand touring party were travelling to England. The decorative programme lists Walter Hadlee as 'Stage Manager' for the production, Bert Sutcliffe as 'Official Censor', and Frank Gilligan as 'Compere'. Also an official menu for the dinner on board dated 31st March 1949, signed to the inside

- front cover by four passengers (non-cricketers). Sold with a menu for the 'British Sportsman's Club Luncheon to the West Indian Cricketers' held at the Savoy Hotel, 16th April 1957, and a further menu for a 'Dinner to the Pakistan Team' held at the Surrey Tavern, 17th July 1967. Creasing to the 1967 menu, the others in good/very good condition. Qty 4 £40/60
- The team sailed from Wellington on the 'Dominion Monarch' on 26th February 1949, arriving at Southampton on 2nd April 1949*
- 24 Colin Blythe. Kent & England 1899-1914. Official order of service for 'The Rededication of the Colin Blythe Memorial' held at Kent County Cricket Club on 8th November 2017, and a matching menu for the luncheon held for the event. Sold with a mono real photograph plain back postcard of Blythe in bowling pose. Also an order of service for 'The Rededication of the Memorial of the Honourable Ivo Bligh and Florence Morphy' held at St Mary Magdalene Church, Cobham on the 18th May 2011, and an order of service 'Commemorating the 150th Anniversary of the Birth of W.G. Grace, St George's Church Beckenham, 17th July 1998, with accompanying booklet compiled by the Rector of Beckenham, Canon G.E. Carpenter. G/VG £30/40
- 25 George Hubert Graham Doggart. Cambridge University, Sussex & England 1948-1961. - 44 Don Bradman. Signature in ink of Bradman on small page. Signed in later years. VG £30/40
- 45 William Ward. Surrey, Hampshire & M.C.C. 1810-1845. Signed free-front envelope to a Right. Hon. Earl Winterton of Godalming, dated and sent from 'London, Sept. twenty two 1826'. Signed 'W. Ward' in black ink. A very rare early signature of Ward, a right handed batsman and occasional lob-bowler who played 130 first class matches and was considered for many years one of the leading batsman in England. - William Ward was born in 1787 and educated at Winchester where he first played cricket. His first recorded match was in 1810 when he played for England against Surrey at Lord's. His greatest achievement was when playing for M.C.C. v Norfolk at Lord's in 1820 he scored 279, a record that remained unbroken until W.G. Grace made 344 in 1876. He made eighteen appearances for the Gentlemen v Players between 1819-1838. In 1825 he bought from Thomas Lord, the lease of Lord's cricket ground for five thousand pounds, when Lord was considering selling the ground for building. In 1836 J.H. Dark purchased the remainder of the lease from Ward. Ward was M.P. for the City of London between 1826-1831. He died in 1849*
- 46 Don Bradman. White card with a photograph cutting of Bradman standing with his wife, Jessie. Nicely signed by both Don and Jessie Bradman. Unusual to see both signatures together. G/VG £50/70
- 47 W.G. Grace. Large bold ink signature of Grace on small page. G/VG £80/120
- 48 Sri Lanka 1980s-2010s. Fifteen signatures of Sri Lanka Test cricketers in ink individually signed or on pieces laid to cards. Signatures include Dilshan, Vaas, Ranatunga, Jayasuriya, Muralitharan, Dias, Herath, Kaluwitharana etc. G/VG £15/25

- 56 Kingsley Amis. Novelist, poet and critic, 1922-1995. Single page typed letter dated 19th July 1963 from Amis in Cambridge to his close friend John Arlott. Subjects covered include Amis belatedly returning 'the perishing Sampler' which Arlott had previously passed to him. He also discusses his impending move to Majorca '(we go finally on 20th September)', congratulates the Arlotts on the forthcoming birth of their child stating 'we, I think, have something similar on the way, though it's early to tell yet', and describes his disillusionment on his academic life in Cambridge, 'Remind me some time to do my imitation of the archetypal Cambridge undergraduate lecturing his parents about Gielgud'. Signed in ink 'Kingsley'. VG £50/80
- 57 F.S. Ashley-Cooper. Two small pages of notes relating to Nottinghamshire cricket written in ink in Ashley-Cooper's own hand. One is a list headed 'Hits out of T.B. [Trent Bridge]' and lists nineteen occasions from 1863 to 1923 when a batsman hit the ball out of the ground, with dates, batsman, team and bowler

- listed. Several Australians are recorded including G.J. Bonnor in 1880, G. Giffen and P.S. McDonnell in 1882 etc. The other page lists Nottinghamshire captains from Clarke to Carr with pencil amendments. G £50/70
- 58 William Norman Birkett 1883-1962. Two page typed letter from Birkett to the publisher 'Mr [Les] Gutteridge' written on Royal Courts of Justice letterhead and dated 31st October 1955. Birkett is replying to an enquiry about a poem that Birkett's wife, a keen cricketer, was given by a friend. Birkett feels it may have been written by T.P. Cameron Wilson who wrote an unpublished poem on 'Sportsmen in Paradise' (Padwick 6545, a facsimile typed copy of the poem is included). Birkett concludes with advise on contacts for Gutteridge to make further enquiries. Nicely signed in ink 'Norman Birkett'. Folds, otherwise in good condition £40/60
- Lord Birkett was a judge at the Nuremberg Trials, a Member of Parliament, a Vice-President of Lancashire C.C.C., and author of 'The Game of Cricket'. Wilson was an English poet and novelist of the First World War, best known for his poem 'Magpies in Picardy' published posthumously in 1919 by The Poetry Bookshop*
- 59 Edmund Charles Blunden. One page handwritten letter in ink from Blunden to John Arlott from the University of Hong Kong, dated 24th August 1954. Blunden is eagerly anticipating Arlott's visit to the Far East en route to Australia for the forthcoming Ashes series. Blunden comments that Arlott is unlikely to see much cricket in Japan, although 'The Victory of Pakistan should encourage them to send a team at once if only XI men who had previously performed only at baseball or cormorant fishing'. - Blunden was a First World-War poet, author of 'Cricket Country', and was a close friend of Siegfried Sassoon*

- 61 William Eric 'Bill' Bowes. Yorkshire & England 1927-1947. Single page typed letter from Bowes to J.D. Coldham, written from his home in Yorkshire and dated 2nd November 1982. Bowes is replying to a request for information on F.S. Jackson on whom Coldham was writing a book. Bowes reports on Jackson's occasional visits to the Yorkshire dressing room. 'Whether it was necessary or not the chairman or captain would speak the name of the player. With Herbert Sutcliffe or Maurice Leyland there would be a minute of two of friendly or light conversation and with the rest a shake of the hands, a word or two of congratulation to the player who had done well... or to me, "Hello Bowes. I haven't seen you bowl to-day but I was at Lord's and I liked the way you bowled to Patsy. He's a good player, isn't he." And so on. He gave the impression of knowing and being in touch with the game and he automatically commanded respect'. Signed in ink 'Bill Bowes'. Horizontal fold, good condition £50/70
- 62 Neville Cardus. Handwritten two page letter from Cardus on National Liberal Club letterhead, dated 17th April 1948, written to Siegfried Sassoon. 'I came back again from Australia yesterday & your letter was waiting for me here. I can't expect to tell you in a brief letter how much pleasure you have given me - and pride. To have warmed your heart and nourished your mind!' He hopes they can meet soon and he reports how difficult it was to write 'on a noisy distracting ship' in the Suez Canal. 'I tried to write another chapter to a book I'm working on and it was about George Meredith & the absurd belittlement of him a few years ago'. He closes with the hope that they can discuss this when they meet. Nicely signed 'Neville Cardus'. Horizontal fold, good condition £60/90
- 63 George Duckworth. Lancashire & England 1923-1938. Handwritten plain postcard to Fred Berry, Blackpool C.C., undated but postmarked 26th July 1946. Duckworth is writing to confirm the team for a forthcoming match. 'Everybody OK except Connie [Learie Constantine] who has a broken finger'. The team is Duckworth, Hallows, Oldfield, Rae, Parkin (Lancashire), Smith (Middlesex), Cutmore (Essex), Pepper (Australia), Achong, Martindale (West Indies). 'Have asked Nutter [or Hutton?] to replace Connie'. Signed 'Best wishes, Duckie'. It is assumed that Duckworth was putting together a team for a charity match, but no record of this team playing can be found. G £30/50
- 64 Edward Desmond Russell Eagar. Gloucestershire, Oxford University & Hampshire 1935-1957. Four page handwritten letter from Eagar to John Arlott. Written on Grand Hotel Leicester letterhead, dated 12th August 1956. The main subject of the letter relates to the impending publication of 'the History [Hampshire County Cricket: The Official History]. I intend visiting Phoenix [publisher] in September to agree finally on what should & should not be included. I hope we can arrange a mutually convenient date as I would like you there'. Eagar continues to report on 'A great performance at Rushen (what a hole)' where Hampshire had beaten Northamptonshire by ten wickets '& they did well at Canterbury from which I have been much encouraged personally'. Regarding the captaincy, 'Leo [Harrison] has captained admirably & will do so in County matches in future before Colin [Ingleby-Mackenzie] (who has had some poor matches - as captain). This - entre nous (French!) please'. Other subjects covered include their cricket collections, captaincy and players' benefit matches. Signed 'Yours, Desmond'. An interesting letter relating to Hampshire cricket, and their shared interests in literature and collecting. Light folds, otherwise in good condition £60/90
- 65 Beatrice Fry, wife of C.B. Fry. Handwritten two page letter on 'Fry's Magazine' headed paper, crossed out with replies requested to the Fry's family home at Glenbourne Manor, Hampshire. The letter, dated 21st

August 1908, to the author E.V. Lucas. She encloses an 'odd little book' hoping it would be of help. She continues to give the names of those who 'will give you all information' including J.A. Best, Hon. Sec. Hambledon C.C. 'We will put you both up with much pleasure'. The invitation relates to the Hambledon v All England match played on 10th, 11th and 12th September 1908. 'The chances are the weather will have broke, but we will hope on'. Nicely signed 'Beatrice Fry'. Some ageing, wear and creasing, otherwise in good condition £70/100

The weather held for the match referred to in this letter, Hambledon v England XI (actually twelve a side) played at Broad Halfpenny Down. The England XI was captained by Gilbert Jessop and included J.T. Hearne, A.E. Trott, W.E. Astill, A.E. Knight etc. For Hambledon, C.B. Fry, E.G. Wynyard, C.P. Mead, W.H. etc. The Captain was Edward Whalley-Tooker playing his last first class match. Hambledon won the match by five wickets with Fry scoring 68no in their second innings

66 J.W. Goldman, cricket collector. Three page handwritten letter written from his home in Kerry where he lives May to October, dated 18th May 1969. In the letter to Mr [J.D.] Coldham, Goldman writes 'What a pity you did not contact me earlier as the remainder of my Cricket Library about 2000 is still in Egham. It might be better if you waited until October when you can come over as all my [E.V.] Lucas stuff has not been touched'. He continues by saying how well he knew Lucas' and he certainly was not a bore. He was eccentric yes as many geniuses are. I had him and Plum Warner to my house on more than one occasion to dinner and they came at 7 & stayed till 3am & I was not bored, at any rate not with E.V.L.'. He describes Lucas signing a book for him, and that 'one year he sent me a Xmas Card with the words added "As long as we have Wally Hammond, the Duke of Windsor can have Wallie Simpson"'. Goldman describes Lucas' interests outside cricket, namely county history, topography and fine champagne, and states that he is happy for Coldham to use this

information with acknowledgement. He closes saying he doesn't get to see much cricket, relying on 'Wisden, Wireless & the papers etc' and that 'the Cricket Society Journal was very good. Young Rosenwater seems to have come on a lot'. Nicely signed by Goldman. Light folds otherwise in good/ very good condition £50/70

Coldham's article on Lucas to which Goldman refers appeared in the Cricket Society Journal of Autumn 1971 and recounts some of the information provided by Goldman in this letter

67 Edgar Mervyn Grace, son of Edward Mills Grace and nephew of William Gilbert Grace. Three page handwritten letter written on Thornbury letterhead and dated 4th August 1915 to F.S. Ashley-Cooper. Grace writes to confirm he has 'at last received my box of books from my brother who enlisted & I have found the old minute book of the Thornbury C.C. with the accounts of the club from its earliest days'. Grace asks for the return of photographs he had provided and asks 'is there any chance of the book being published this year or will you wait till the War is over', referring to Ashley-Cooper's biography of E.M. Grace which was published in 1916. Regarding Grace's family, he reports 'W.G. looked extremely fit & well & as jolly as ever at poor Uncle John Dann's funeral'. Nicely signed 'E.M. Grace'. Despite appearing fit and healthy in August 1915, W.G. Grace died two months later in October. Edgar Grace first played for Thornbury aged nine and continued for 62 years including 37 as captain

68 Charles Pratt Green. Cricket collector and wine merchant. Two page handwritten letters dated 10th February 1947 and 18th March 1948 from his Malvern home to J.D. Coldham. Aged 94, Green states that 'I am now totally blind and dependent on others' and these letters have been dictated and transcribed by either his wife or daughter. The first letter refers to a purchase of material by 'a Capt F.B. Milne a few years before the War... He was paying me by instalments but

for years past I have not received a penny & he still owes me £14. If therefore you can oblige me with an address that will find him I should be grateful'. He describes how he has 'nothing left of interest' having cleared much of his collection before moving house, a collection which included 'an array of 151 Bats with a story going back to 1827. 149 of these are now in Sir Julian Cahn's pavilion at West Bridgford. 'The[ir] biographical and descriptive catalogue is practically a history of the game'. The second letter acknowledges Coldham's help in recovering the debt owed by Capt. Milne. He notes that Coldham has books by E.V. Lucas and F.S. Ashley-Cooper, 'Both authors were my friends. E.V. Lucas wrote a lengthy account of the Bats in the Sunday Times about 1930. I was deeply attached to Ashley-Cooper whom I helped with Cricketa in his school days... In his last illness he disposed of his vast collection to Sir Julien Cahn for £800'. Light folds, otherwise in good condition £60/90

69 William Frederick Grundy, cricket author. Four page handwritten letter, dated 10th May 1917, from Grundy to the cricket writer and collector, A.D. Taylor. 'I send you a little print of some of the letters I received acknowledging the memento of Arthur Shrewsbury and Alfred Shaw which I published some years since. I put it together in 1910 but a long unwellness coming on and the war caused it to be delayed until recently'. The 'memento' to which Grundy is referring is 'A Memento of two great Notts. cricketers, Arthur Shrewsbury and Alfred Shaw' published in 1907 (Padwick 8034). The later booklet which accompanied this letter to Taylor, 'Letters of acknowledgement of the Memento...' is listed in Padwick 8035, and having been published in 1910, whereas this letter suggests that the booklet was actually published in 1917. Grundy continues by bemoaning the continuing War, 'I am sorry the game has had to go under for the time being and will take a long time to get into anything like its old form after the War has ended. I saw... that our Notts. John Gunn who is verging on 41 has been called up. He has two

- sons already gone and his brother George has been in the transport service at the front for a year or two'. Regarding collecting, Grundy refers to F.S. Ashley-Cooper whose collection 'numbered over 3 thousand publications', and closes with a recount of meeting George Wootton, 'the old Notts. bowler. He was very well and came on his bicycle to meet me at the station altho' was attaining his 82nd year in October. I got his autograph opposite the photo in which he is in my memento'. Signed 'W.F. Grundy'. An interesting letter with good Nottinghamshire content. G/VG £60/90
- 70 Leslie Gutteridge, cricket book dealer and collector. Single page typed letter to John Arlott on Epworth Second Hand Books letterhead, dated 8th November 1963. Gutteridge is writing regarding details of a book of Old Ballads of 1780 in four volumes. He also thanks Arlott for his comments on 'the Warner - Ross situation. My information agrees that Warner will never sell unless he makes a severe loss - by which time it [the Cricketer] will not be worth selling! The Cricket Quarterly now has a circulation of 610!!'. Signed in ink 'Leslie'. Light folds otherwise in good condition £30/40
- 71 Len Darling. Victoria & Australia 1926-1937. Single page handwritten letter from Darling written in New South Wales and dated 14th February 1989. Darling is replying to a request for autographs. He reminisces about the 1934 tour to England, his first tour with Australia, and to South Africa in 1935/36, and looks forward to watching on television the impending tour to England. Sold with an album page signed by four members of the 1968 International Cavaliers team including Don Kenyon, Bryan Davis, Godfrey Evans etc. Light folds, otherwise in good condition £40/60
- 72 Levi George Wright. Derbyshire 1883-1909. Single page handwritten letter in ink written on Midland Railway Chief Mechanical Engineer's Office letterhead and dated 20th July 1914. Wright is writing to an unknown correspondent thanking him for the receipt of the 'American Cricketer'. He continues, 'I am sorry to tell you I have given up the game and taken to the ancient [game] of bowls. I was far from well last year and took to bowls as a lighter recreation. I am glad to say I am well again now though but cannot very well intrude on the younger generation although the longing for a game occasionally comes over me'. Signed 'L.G. Wright'. Horizontal and vertical folds, otherwise in good condition £50/70
- 73 John Crawford William 'Jack' MacBryan. Cambridge University, Somerset & England 1911-1931. A black folder comprising approximately sixty handwritten letters from MacBryan, the majority to 'Edward Francis', along with a good number of copies of typed replies from Francis to MacBryan. Also typed manuscripts with annotations for articles, and MacBryan's England tie. The letters cover the period 1977 to 1982. Subjects covered include stories about his old friend Sammy Woods; MacBryan playing in the match in which Hobbs equalled W.G. Grace's record of centuries; not being selected for the 1924/25 tour to Australia with the selector P.R. Johnson describing him as 'too bad tempered'; the reason for his poor throwing in the field being due to dislocating his shoulder playing rugby for Bath in 1912; his lack of respect for his J.C. 'Farmer Jack' White who was not called up to serve in the first World War; a description of an injury to his lower arm sustained by Duleepsinhji having been mauled by a tiger; his wartime memories of being wounded and captured during the retreat from Mons, being held as a prisoner of war in Holland, and his brother being killed in action; his batting style impressing Yorkshire players including Wilfred Rhodes who described him as looking 'more like a Yorkshire pro than a Somerset amateur' etc. An excellent personal recollection. - MacBryan played only one Test match for England, against South Africa in 1924. In the rain affected match he did not bat, did not bowl and took no catches, an unfortunate distinction he holds to this day. At the time of his death in 1991 aged 90, MacBryan was the oldest surviving England Test player. Described as a neat, correct and*
- gritty batsman, he was often uncomplimentary about Somerset county cricket in the 1920s and his attitude to authority in general. A good hockey player, he won a gold medal as a member of the 1920 Olympic British hockey team*
- 74 Cricket letters. Selection of eight letters: A.A. Thomson to Coldham 1955 regarding a forthcoming book, Cyril Washbrook 1978 regarding an autograph request, Ron Yeomans to H.W. Warner c1960 regarding the sale of cricketana, Bob Barber 1959 and Jack Bond to Sokell (2 letters) regarding attendance at an event and a meeting, 'Bob' Arrowsmith to Coldham 1982 regarding cricket research, R.G. Barnes 'Oxford & M.C.C. 1906-1920' to Altham 1959 regarding a cricket poem he had written and a single page letter from Barrauds, photographers, Liverpool 1889 regarding a request for a photograph of cricketer, Allan G. Steel. Good condition £70/100
- 75 John Betjeman. Poet, writer and broadcaster. Single page typed letter on 43, Cloth Fair, London letterhead dated 15th December 1960. Writing to P.A.L. Barling, Betjeman states, 'I can't make definite arrangements more than three months ahead now; if I do I find I am always having to cancel things. If you will write again in, say, July, I can let you have a definite answer'. Signed in ink 'John Betjeman'. At the time Barling was responsible for organising functions for the Cricket Society. - Betjeman, a keen cricket follower, was Poet Laureate from 1972 until his death in 1984, and was a founding member of the Victorian Society*
- 76 Frederick Gale. Handwritten twelve page letter written in Manitoba, Canada, dated 1st December 18932, to his friend 'Mr [R.S.] Holmes'. 'Can you help one in a fix? My portmanteau was stolen on my way here and was picked up on the trail 8 months afterwards & nothing left in but wearing apparel which was marked with my name'. Most important to Gale was the loss of his only copy of Public School Matches of 1853 and also a later edition and he asks if Holmes can lend him his copy 'as I want to copy the pictures'.

- Gale, living with his son and feeling in much better health is enjoying shooting geese and getting exercise. Much on life in the prairies and the extreme cold, interlaced with talk of cricket back in England: O'Brien, Grace, Fuller Pilch, Steele, the over-use of pads and leg protection, etc. 'Do you know any Editor who needs a correspondent - 2000 words and no padding?' G/VG £70/100
- Fred Gale played in the Winchester Eleven in 1841 against Eton and Harrow at Lord's, but did not go on to play first class cricket. He made his name as a prolific writer of books, newspaper and magazine articles writing under the name 'The Old Buffer'. He had emigrated to Canada to be with his family after the death of one of his sons, but was homesick and missed his cricket, so returned home the following year*
- 77 John Berry 'Jack' Hobbs. Surrey & England 1905-1934. Two page handwritten letter in ink dated 20th July 1931 to 'Mr Pilleau'. Hobbs is writing regarding 'the pictures you ordered at Horsham'. Hobbs continues, 'It is now settled that I shall play for Surrey again next year but I shall be allowed to stand down when I wish... Glad to hear the news about the bat, it should belong to you after all the trouble & expense you were put to'. Signed 'J.B. Hobbs'. Some foxing and staining affecting the signature, otherwise in good condition £40/60
- 78 William 'Bill' Voce. Nottinghamshire & England 1927-1952. Single page handwritten letter from Voce replying to an enquiry regarding a photograph. The letter is undated but written in later years. Signed 'Bill Voce'. G £40/60

- 81 Alfred Shaw. Nottinghamshire, Sussex & England 1864-1897. Rare and excellent three page handwritten letter from Shaw to an unknown correspondent, dated 6th March 1896. The subject appears to relate to something of a sensitive nature, possibly about Lord Sheffield, having been passed to the press. 'Yours dully [sic] to hand I am very sorrow [sic] for as I well know you would do your best. I can assure you I was afrade [sic] thay [sic] would be a mistake as I know one word would do it but do not be afrade [sic] I often get into these scrapes and get right again. I shall be having something els [sic] before long and then I will see you and then we can manage it all right. His Lordship does not know who I sent it too [sic] and I have not told him and shall not do so but I shall tell him when he as [sic] anything Peticler [sic] to let me run up to London and see you and I know he will agree with me. If you see any one of the Editors of those papers you sent it to will you kindly ask them to always put any article in theas [sic] papers wich [sic] comes from his Lordship not to alter any thing you send them. His Lordship is a very good fellow but he takes a lot of understanding'. Nicely signed 'Alfred Shaw'. VG £300/400
- Alfred Shaw was employed by Lord Sheffield to coach young Sussex cricketers and in 1894 he turned out for Sussex at the age of 51 and ended the season at the top of the county averages*
- 82 Player benefits and testimonials 1990s. Large collection of thirty eight letters relating to player's benefits. - 83 Scrapbook of William Archibald Standish (1856-1942). Early printed invoice for Richard Daft's sporting business for the sale of one cricket ball, signed by Richard Daft and also by William Gunn who was seventeen at the time and hand dated '1st July 1876'. - Employed in Richard Daft's shop in Nottingham, Gunn had not much spare time, but, determined to make himself a cricketer, he used to get some practice at unearthly hours in the morning. The well known cricket and sporting business Gunn & Moore, of which Gunn was a co-founder, opened for business in 1885*
- 87 Eddie Lawrence. Cricket writer and historian. He played in three first-class matches in the period 1850-1851: one for an Under 36 XI, one for Marylebone Cricket Club and Metropolitan Clubs and one for the All England Eleven. His umpiring partner in many of the more prominent matches was R.P. Carpenter*

Born in 1932, Gerry Wright studied in Maidstone and London and at the Beaux Arts Paris. Gerry was fascinated by the Golden Age of cricket and his work culminated in the publication of 'Cricket's Golden Summer' in 1985. A fast bowler himself, he was fascinated by bowler's grips and some of those paintings are also offered at this auction. He has painted many of the great cricketers including Bradman, Imran Khan, Viv Richards and Shane Warne. Young states 'Dear Reg, This is one of the two stumps I whipped at Trent Bridge in [19]48, as you can see by the photo. I gave the other one to Frank Chester [umpire]. This particular stump I gave to Jim Fairbrother [groundsman] who returned it to me when he heard of the auction.... The photo illustrates the greed of the Australian citizen Barnes who the ball before had struck the winning single, snatched all 3 stumps the other end and had reached the pavilion. But the scoreboard was one short (typical of Trent Bridge) and he returned amid cheering and jeering. F. Chester borrowed his bat to bang the stumps on!. There was nothing left for him when he arrived at our end when Hassett hit the winning run. His language was appalling, clear and fluent!'. Nicely signed 'Jack Young'. THE PERCY FENDER . SUSSEX, SURREY & ENGLAND 1910-1935. CRICKET ARCHIVE

Percy George Herbert Fender 1892 – 1985) played 13 Tests and was captain of Surrey between 1921 and 1931. An all-rounder, he was a middle-order batsman who bowled mainly leg spin, and completed the cricketer's double seven times. Noted as a belligerent batsman, in 1920 he hit the fastest recorded first-class century, reaching three figures in 35 minutes which remains the record today. As early as 1914 Fender was named one of Wisden's Cricketers of the Year. After war service in the Royal Flying Corps he re-established himself in the Surrey team and became captain in 1921. His captaincy inspired the team to challenge strongly for the County Championship over the course of several seasons, despite a shortage of effective bowlers. Alongside his forceful though sometimes controversial leadership, Fender was an effective performer with bat and ball, although he lacked support as a bowler. From 1921, he played occasionally in Tests for England but was never particularly successful. Despite press promptings, he was never appointed Test captain, and following a clash with the highly influential Lord Harris in 1924, his England career was effectively ended. Further disagreements between Fender and the Surrey committee over his approach and tactics led the county to replace him as captain in 1932 and to end his career in 1935. A very recognisable figure, Fender was popular with his team and with supporters. Cartoonists enjoyed caricaturing his distinctive appearance. In addition to his cricket career, Fender worked in the wine trade, had a successful career in journalism, and wrote several well-received books on cricket tours. He worked well into

the 1970s, even after going blind. He died in 1985.

The exhibition match in Tasmania is recorded as is the batting exhibition put on by the M.C.C. after winning their two day game with New South Wales Country XI at Canberra early. They played twenty five matches in Australia and a further three in New Zealand. Having started off the Test series well, winning the first two Tests, M.C.C., lost the remaining three Tests and so failed to regain the Ashes. England's failure can be attributed to a combination of poor batting and the brilliance of Don Bradman. The tour was a financial success due to the fluctuating nature of the Tests and broke all records with receipts amounting to £90,909 with over 900,000 people attending. Bradman made 82 in the 2nd Test, 270 in the 3rd Test, 212 in the 4th Test and 169 in the fifth Test

673 'Clapton Cricket Club. Matches 1845 - [1853]'. Very early and original red leather bound scorebook for the club with titles in gilt to front cover and brass metal clip fastener to edge, marbled page block and was produced by Harris & Galabin, Stationers of Fenchurch Street, London. The scorebook appears to record thirty matches played in the period 1845 to 1853 by Clapton, the majority from 1845 to 1847, with matches played against Haileybury, Dulwich (Union), Oxford & Cambridge Universities (combined XI), Haileybury College, Oxford University, Cambridge University, Cambridge Quidnuncs, Blackheath Dartmouth, Blackheath Paragon, Montpelier Club, Surry [Surrey] Club, Kings Walden and Godalming. Some notable players took part in these matches including four of the Walker (of Southgate) brothers who played regularly for Clapton C.C. prior to the formation of the Southgate Club (circa 1858) for which they became known, John Walker, Alfred Walker, Frederic Walker, Arthur Henry Walker, William Nicholson, Thomas Sherman, Edmund Reeves, William Denison, George Brockwell (Uncle of William), Frederick Caesar (Brother of Julius), Charles Gordon, Thomas Craven and appearing in two of the matches and playing for Blackheath Dartmouth, Nicholas Felix (Wanostrocht) scoring 43 runs against Clapton in July 1845 and scoring 96 not out for Blackheath against Clapton in July 1846. The

match played between Montpelier (the original tenants of the Kennington Oval) and Clapton on 17th July 1845 was played for a 100 guineas a side, the announcement of the match in the press on the 13th July 1845 read 'The Montpelier and Upper Clapton Clubs will play their annual match on the Surrey Ground, Kennington Oval on Thursday next, the 17th instant, and from the celebrity of these strong clubs, a great treat is expected. The ground is in fine condition'. A report on the match on the 20th July 1845 reads 'A match, which excited considerable interest, took place between the above clubs on Thursday last, at the New Ground, Kennington Oval. Some fine play was exhibited on both sides...'. Both Arthur Haygarth and W.W. Read (in various books) state that this match was the first to be played at the Kennington Oval although H.H. Montgomery in his book 'The History of Kennington' does not, he suggests that the first actual game at the Oval was played on the 13th May 1845. To the back of the scorebook neatly handwritten to two facing pages are the 'Averages of Runs obtained in Matches for 1845' and 'Averages of Runs obtained in Matches for 1846' and also of wickets taken. There are also annotated notes regarding the past season. For 1845 the notes read 'The Club played 8 matches of which 4 were won, 2 were lost and 2 undecided.... The season was very wet and unfavourable and several of the first rate matches were impeded thereby'. For 1846 'The club played 9 matches, 5 won, 3 lost and 1 undecided. The finest weather we ever had'. Plus there is a handwritten team sheet with names and order of batting numbers to sides. Craven and Gordon scored the most runs in 1845 and John Walker and Gordon were highest in 1846 with Craven and Alfred Waker taking the most wickets. The scorebook has been very neatly compiled and interestingly laid out and in two distinctive hands, the pages preprinted with titles with an innings to a page. The early matches from 1845 to 1847 have handwritten headings detailing the two teams playing, the ground and the date of the match. There follows a series of matches where no headings with

dates appear however the first match with no heading has been identified as being between Clapton and Cambridge Quidnuncs in 1853 and the penultimate match written in the book has titles to the top border v Blackheath 17th August 1853 so it is reasonable to assume all games lacking their heading took place in that year although there seems to be major changes to the Clapton team for the last match entered, so this may have been at a later date. The 'celebrated' Clapton Club was formed in 1832 and re-formed in 1854. The scorebook has some minor wear to boards, A very early and beautifully compiled scorebook, thought to have been lost or destroyed, with some famous names from the birth of cricket

The scorebook has been in the vendors family possession for over 30 years. The book 'The Walkers of Southgate. A Famous Brotherhood of Cricket'. W.A. Bettesworth 1990 devotes several pages to the club and the Walkers involvement therein. A passage from the book reads 'In his [John Walker] early days he was one of the supporters of the old Clapton Club being assisted in his efforts to promote the club's success by Mr W. Nicholson, who himself was a famous wicket-keeper and batsman [pages 27/28]. There is a six page chapter on pages 161-166 entitled 'Early Matches' which refers in great detail on matches played for Clapton by the Walker brothers. 'As is perhaps only natural, the records of the early days of the Walkers in the cricket field are not only incomplete but almost non-existent. Occasionally by good fortune one may come across a score of an old Clapton or Southgate Albert match, but as far as can be ascertained the score books were destroyed some years ago. This is the more to be regretted because many of the famous players of the day assisted the Clapton Club. Mr John Walker and Mr William Nicholson were the founders (??) of the old Clapton C.C. and constantly played for it, together with Mr Fred Walker and Mr Alfred Walker. Whenever one happens upon a report of an old Clapton match one is pretty sure to find that the fast underhand bowling of A.

- Walker esq was the chief cause of the defeat of the other side, and that either Mr John or Mr Fred made some very hard hits and scored pretty largely'. Another match which appears in the scorebook and is mentioned by Bettesworth is the Clapton v Cambridge Quidnuncs game of 1853. 'Another interesting match this year was between the Quidnuncs and Clapton. The former making 106 and 201 for nine wickets, and Clapton 117 and 29 for six wickets.... Not withstanding the inducement which the London season holds out to the majority of young men assiduously engaged in sowing their wild oats, a fair quota of Quidnuncs appeared at Clapton on Thursday last. There were two vacancies, to be sure, to be filled up..... A greater treat than the Clapton cricket offered to the Quidnuncs can hardly be imagined: amongst their ranks every style had its professor'. Mr F. Walker, played for the Quidnuncs, scoring 31 not out and 43, both the highest scores on his side. For Clapton Mr John, Mr Alfred and Mr Arthur Walker all made runs, while Mr Alfred was irresistible with the ball, taking fourteen wickets...'

Michael Henry Denness OBE was a Scottish born cricketer who played for Kent, Essex, England and Scotland. He made his debut for Kent in 1962 and played 330 matches for the county between 1962 and 1976 before moving to Essex. In total he scored over 25,000 first class runs with a highest score of 195. He captained Kent between 1972 and 1976 and had major success winning the John Player League three times (1972, 1973, 1976), the Benson & Hedges Cup twice (1973, 1976), and the Gillette Cup in 1974, and captained England in nineteen Tests between 1973/74 and 1975 including the Test tours of 1973/74 to the West Indies and to Australia in 1974/75. He was a Wisden Cricketer of the Year in 1975 and remains the only England captain to be born in Scotland. Denness later became an ICC match referee. He was president of Kent County Cricket Club in 2012/13. The blazers are being sold by the family

For the first time in several years, the captaincy remained unchanged for successive major tours. The tour selection was criticised, too many fast bowlers and not enough batsman, the selection of Denness as captain and the non selection of Jon Snow. In addition Boycott withdrew stating he was not fit enough mentally to return to Test cricket. Not good omens for the tour and it proved to be the case. England were destroyed by Lillee and Thomson and lost the series 4-0 with one Test drawn. Denness stood down from the captaincy and from playing due to lack of form just prior to the start of the fourth Test and John Edrich took over for this match. Denness returned to the captaincy in the fifth Test which was lost but against all the odds in the sixth Test, England beat Australia by an innings and four runs with Denness scoring 188
