- 7 'Farewell Dinner to Dr W.G. Grace 1898'. Original menu card for the Dinner, given by the Clifton Foot Beagles, held at the Clifton Down Hotel on December 6th 1898. Decorative and colourful front cover, with green ribbon tie, with images of hunting horn, whistle, riding cap and whip and titles, menu and toast list to inside pages with further decorative hunting images to rear cover. Printed by 'W. Bennet, 43 Broad Street'. The toast list includes, His Grace the Duke of Beaufort, W.G. Grace etc. Originally from the collection of C.L. Decorative front cover with 'G. MacArthur' of Pretoria hand written, and printed menu to verso, the other card with the printed players' names for both teams. - 9 Frederick Gale. Kent 1845. Original printed single page flyer advertising two talks to be given by Gale at the Town Hall, Westminster. The talks are titled 'The Parliamentary Pupper Show... Forty Years in the Parliamentary World', 19th June 1891, and 'The Game of Cricket and Cricketers' 3rd July 1891. 9.5"x7.25". Some loss and folds. Fragile condition £70/100
- 10 'Groves Cricket & General Sporting News Agency, Sheffield'. Two four page 'Final Revised List of Cricket Fixtures for 1887', one printed on white paper, the other blue. The front pages detail the terms and prices of the services provided to customers of the agency, with slightly differing versions. Sold with two similar lists published by Ashley & Smith's Sporting News Agency, London, for 'The Cricket Season' 1887 and 1892.

Sold with an original single page flyer for a 'Grand Smoking Concert' given by The Crescent Cricket Club at the Cock Assembly Rooms, Cock Tavern Highbury, 3rd March 1888. - 12 Club fixture cards 1879-1895. Official cloth covered fixture card/ membership booklets for Willow Dale C.C. (Bolton) 1887, Weybridge Albion C.C. (Surrey) 1895, and West Hartlepool C.C. 1897. Sold with ten early Stoics Cricket Club 'List of Matches' folding fixture cards for 1879, 1881, 1886, 1888-1890 and 1894. - 13 F.H. Ayres sports equipment 1886-1909. A collection of five original catalogues and leaflets issued by Ayres. Items include an eight page instruction manual for an early bowling machine, 'The "Cambridge" Bowler', 1909. Four page advertising flyer for Ayres' bats, pads and balls with player testimonials, 1886. Four page list of testimonials for Ayres' equipment including one from W.G. Grace, 1887. - 14 'The Cricketer's Register. Bell's Life In London and Sporting Chronicle' 1884 and 1885. Two slim albums comprising cuttings/ extracts relating to matches played. 1884 match reports include 'Marylebone Club and Ground with Pilch against the County of Sussex', 'Gentlemen and Players of England' including Lillywhite, Pilch, Box, Hillyer, Felix, Mynn etc, Petworth v Marylebone, Marylebone v Northern Counties etc. At the end is a printed 'Cricketers' Register. Average Runs &c in 1885' with Felix heading the batting. The 1885 volume includes reports for include Sussex v Kent, 'Nine Gentlemen with Lillywhite and Martingell against Eleven Players of England', I Zingari v The Auberies, Cambridge with Box and Hillyer v England etc, with handwritten averages to rear. - 16 Don Bradman. Three original 'Test Match Bulletins' issued with the Daily Mail. Issues for 1st, 4th and 5th December 1928 covering the first Test at Brisbane 1928. This was Bradman's first Test match. Folds otherwise in good condition £20/30
- 17 A.J. Gaston. Cricket follower, writer & collector. Envelope addressed to 'A.J. Gaston Esq, 104 Hollingbury Park Avenue, Brighton, Sussex'. Postmarked 20th July 1922. Annotation in ink to the front of the envelope, 'The Famous Leather Hunter of "Sussex Daily News". Bowler of 13 wides & many other cricketing achievements'. G £30/40
- 18 'Uppingham Rovers Cricket Club. Matches for 1883'. Original single page printed fixture list with flag emblem to the top in the Club colours of blue, black and red. The fixtures for July and August 1883 include matches against the county sides of Northamptonshire, Leicestershire, Derbyshire and Hampshire, also Yorkshire Gentlemen etc. Horizontal folds otherwise in good condition £20/30
- Founded in 1863, Uppingham Rovers is the Uppingham School Old Boys cricket team. Notable cricketers who played in the 1883 season include*
- A.P. Lucas (Surrey, Cambridge University, Middlesex, Essex & England 1874-1907) who played in five Test matches for England 1878-1884, and S.S. Schultz (Cambridge University, Lancashire & England 1876-1882). Others include F.E. Street (Kent 4 matches), C.E. Green (Middlesex 33 matches) etc
- 19 Eton v Harrow 1936. Very large original card with printed details of the arrangements for spectators and guests attending the annual match played at Lord's in 1936. The card lists the luncheon tables in the arbours and the tents on the practice ground and the east side of the ground and to the West, details are published of the Grand Stand Boxes, Members Reserve, Tables behind Block A, New Boxes, private rooms at hotel etc. Guests who had booked the Grand Stand Boxes included His Grace The Duke of Devonshire, Viscount Cobham, F.T.Mann, The Earl of Derby, Sir Humphrey de Trafford etc, in the New Boxes were P.F. Warner, R.H. Twining, The Hon Sir F.S. Jackson etc, in the private rooms at hotel were E.G. Wynyard, Viscount Boyne etc, in the side garden 'Sir Julian Cahn, G.L. Hoare etc, and in the arbours and Tents to the East were the Guards Club, Harrow Association, Old Etonians, Carlton Club, Green Jackets, Bath Club, Lord Melchett, Charles E. Russell etc. The card would have probably been displayed prominently at Lord's for spectators and guests attention. The card measures 17"x24" and has some nicks and tears to edges with small corner loss to right hand lower corner otherwise in good condition £50/80
- 20 Yorkshire. Bramall Lane, Sheffield 1973. Original newspaper poster for the Morning Telegraph announcing 'Yorkshire's Goodbye to Bramall Lane- Special Supplement' for the match Yorkshire v Lancashire, 4th-7th August 1973. 19.5"x28". Horizontal and vertical folds, otherwise in good/ very good condition £50/70
- The match was drawn with no play possible on the second day*
- 21 'Yorkshire C.C.C. Fixtures 1908'. Original 'OXO' advertising card with a mono printed photograph of the Yorkshire team to centre with fixtures

- listed below and cricket figures on a red background. 13.5"x16". The card has been heavily trimmed to the top edge with almost complete loss of the advertiser's brand name. Otherwise in very good condition with bright colours £50/70
- 22 George Neville Weston. Cricket historian. A large scrapbook from Weston's own collection. The front cover inscribed in ink in Weston's hand, '1951. Cricket matches played in costume (arranged by Mr C.I.S. Wallace). 1 At Orpington June 17, 2 Chatham & Rochester June. 3 June 28 Birmingham. 4 July 21 Tardebigge (Hewell Grange near Redditch)'. The scrapbook comprises a series of correspondence between Weston and Wallace including lengthy handwritten letters from Wallace and typed replies from Weston. The letters dated June and July 1951. Subjects covered include the health of both men, Wallace complimenting Weston on his work on W.G. Grace, the request from the Royal National Lifeboat Institution for advice on organising an 'Old Time Cricket Match at Orpington [Kent]' for which Wallace provided detailed information. In reply Weston refers to a similar match recreated at Hambledon. The remainder of the album comprises original photographs and press cuttings relating to the recreation matches listed on the front cover, and an original poster produced to publicise the Orpington match. Sold with an exercise book titled 'Lord's May 14th 1969. A visit to the ground and Memorial Gallery' with notes on 'WG' items, and two other large scrapbooks of Weston's relating to the Centenary Test at Lord's in 1980 etc. Good condition £60/90
- Weston is renowned as being probably the greatest historian on the history of W.G. Grace, in particular his attention to the detail of minor matches in which Grace played throughout his career. In the forward to Weston's book 'W.G. Grace The Great Cricketer' published in 1973, Irving Rosenwater quotes A.A. Thompson saying Weston 'knows more about W.G. than any man alive', to which Rosenwater adds, 'or dead'*

- 28 William Roy Genders. Derbyshire, Worcestershire & Somerset 1946-1949. A collection of scorecards, photographs, press cuttings etc relating to Roy Genders and his brother, Clive. A number of items relate to their schooldays at King's School, Ely, including school team photographs, a letter from the Bishop of Sheffield, orders of service etc from the 1930s. - Roy Genders played ten first class matches, four each for Derbyshire and Worcestershire, and two for Somerset. Genders wrote two books on cricket including a history of Worcestershire C.C.C.*
- 29 Cricket related orders of service. David Stuart Sheppard 2005. Anthony William 'Tony' Grieg 2012. Thomas William Graveney 2016. Douglas John Insole 2017 and Hubert Doggart 2018. - 30 'Warwickshire C.C.C. 'County Champions 1911'. Rare official menu for the 'Complimentary Dinner' held for the County Champions at the Grand Hotel, Birmingham on 21st September 1911. Title to centre 'Warwickshire County Cricket Club. County Champions. Season 1911. To inside pages 'Menu' and 'List of Toasts'. Toasts were made by The Earl of Warwick, Viscount Cobham, Gilbert Jessop, Frank Foster, Leveson-Gower, Sydney Pardon etc. The County Championship table for 1911 to the back cover. Central horizontal creasing to menu otherwise in good condition £60/90
- 31 Cricket memorabilia. Good selection in large box including various autographs, signed mini bats, books, ceramics etc. G £30/50

- 39 Henry Horton. Worcestershire & Hampshire 1946-1957. Two page handwritten letter from Horton to 'John [Arlott]', dated 5th April 1965. Horton thanks Arlott for payment to him of expenses by the B.B.C. 'for my lengthy spell on T.V.' and reports he has received 'a very nice cheque from Derrick Allen B.A.O.R. [British Army of the Rhine]' Signed 'Henry'. G/VG £25/35
- 40 E.V.L. Lucas. Cricket author and essayist. Four page handwritten article written by Lucas in his distinctive hand on his Waldron, Sussex, letterhead. The subject of the article is John Small who played for

- Hampshire 1773-1798 and was an original member of Hambledon Cricket Club. About Small he writes, 'The first recorded match in which he played was for Hambledon against Caterham when he made 80; the last, for Hambledon, was in 1793, against the MCC when he made only 2 & 0'. He describes Small's other skills 'besides cricket: he was a fine skater[?] & a true shot' and, quoting Nyren, his 'skill as a musician both with the voice & the violin'. His early careers were as a shoemaker and gamekeeper 'and latterly took to making bats and balls' which were bought by Budd and M.C.C. who 'offered him a guinea a piece for them'. On his death a poet wrote the epitaph, 'Here lies, bowled out of really[?] unerring ball, A cricketer renowned, of name John Small'. Rust marks to top left corners, otherwise in good condition. - John Small was one of the leading batsmen of the 18th century and is noted for his influences on the Laws of cricket including setting the maximum width of the bat, and the addition of the middle stump to the wicket*
- 41 John Masfield. Poet Laureate 1930-1967. Two page handwritten letter from Masfield on his Abingdon letterhead to Leslie Gutteridge. The letter is undated, the accompanying envelope is postmarked 10th November 1964. Masfield is writing to thank Gutteridge for his letter about 'the Australians in England, 1882' and of 'Major Bowen to offer to lend me his copy'. Masfield had written the lengthy poem 'Eight Five to Win' about England's attempts to score the runs needed to win the Test match at Kennington Oval, falling short by seven runs. The poem was first published in The Times on 29th August 1956, and a copy of the newspaper page is enclosed. Masfield also asks Gutteridge for information on when 'At some time, between about 1855-1885', an Eleven of Masfields played an Eleven of Lyttletons at (I think) Newport, Shropshire... Assumed to be writing to Spencer Ponsonby, Pycroft thanks him for information and 'I hope by the beginning of next season to dedicate a 6th edition of my "Cricket Field" to the Zingari as Charles Leigh tells me I may do'. - James Pycroft is chiefly known for writing 'The Cricket Field', one of the earliest books about cricket, first published in 1851. The sixth edition was published in 1873 without the dedication*
- 43 John Auger Dixon. Nottinghamshire 1882-1905. Single page note handwritten in ink from Dixon, dated 3rd September 1889. Nicely signed 'J.A. Dixon'. Light horizontal fold, small adhesive marks to verso, otherwise in good condition. Sold with a sepia photograph of Dixon, seated half length wearing cap and blazer. - Dixon captained Nottinghamshire 1888-1889. A successful footballer, he represented Notts County and England*
- 44 Edwin Boaler 'Ted' Alletson. Nottinghamshire 1906-1914. Single page letter handwritten in ink from Alletson, dated 11th October 1954. Alletson writes, 'Have not had the best of health these last few years... [I] have to go with two sticks otherwise I am very fit. I scale 19 1/2 stones so am not running off much'. Signed E.B. - Ted Alletson was famous for scoring 189 in 90 minutes, the last 142 coming in 40 minutes, including 34 in one over while batting for Nottinghamshire against Sussex at Hove in 1911*
- 45 Harry Butler Daft. Nottinghamshire 1885-1899. Single page letter handwritten in ink on the ornate letterhead of Richard Daft, sports outfitter, dated 11th September 1889. Daft writes apologising for the delay in replying to a request for his autograph. Signed 'H.B. Daft'. Horizontal and vertical folds, otherwise in very good condition £70/100
- Harry was one of four members of the Daft family who played cricket for Nottinghamshire along with his father Richard, his brother Richard P. Daft, and his uncle, Charles. Harry was also a noted footballer, playing for Notts County with whom he won the F.A. Cup in 1894, Nottingham Forest, and made five appearances for England*
- 46 Wilfred Richard Daniel Payton. Nottinghamshire 1905-1931. Single page letter handwritten in ink on Wilfred Payton Sports Outfitter letterhead, and dated 15th February 1935. Payton is writing to a J.B. Milne replying to a request, 'and I hereby enclose one of my old bats'. Nicely signed 'W. Payton'. Light folds, otherwise in good condition £40/60
- 47 John Richmond Gunn. Nottinghamshire, London County & England 1896-1904. Two page handwritten letter from Gunn to John Arlott with very good cricket content. Dated 17th August 1956, Gunn is writing regarding a radio broadcast given by Jim Swanton 'about our [Nottinghamshire] left arm bowler A.K. [Alan] Walker, where he did the hat trick in the first three balls in the second innings. He said it was a world record never having been done before. I did it some years ago at Chesterfield against Derby claiming the wickets of J.G. Wright, C. Ollivierre & W. Storer in the first three balls of the second innings same as Walker. Thought you might have a word or two with Mr Swanton & put him right, it is funny two Notts men doing it in the second innings. Have got the ball in that case at the Notts ground'. Gunn closes by saying that Neville Cardus 'did not think it had been done before'. Signed 'John Gunn'. Adhesive marks to lower corners of the first page, otherwise in very good condition £70/100
- The match to which Gunn is referring was played at Chesterfield 27th-29th June 1904. It appears Swanton was correct in according to Alan Walker the 'record' of a hat trick in the first three balls of the second innings. The scorecard for the 1904 match suggests that Gunn bowled the second over, Wass having opened. In*

- the second innings in the 1953 match at Leicester, Walker not only opened the bowling in the second innings and took a hat trick off the first three balls, he had also taken the final Leicestershire wicket in the first innings*
- 48 George Gunn. Nottinghamshire & England 1902-1932. Four page handwritten letter dated 12th November 1957 from Gunn to John Arlott. The letter is in two parts: first Gunn writes to thank Arlott for his letter of sympathy following the recent death of Gunn's son, George Vernon Gunn (Nottinghamshire 1928-1950), in a motorcycling accident. 'He always was a bit of a harem scare em and he had 3 bad smashes really & they say third time pays for all. I told him several times to get rid of it, the bike'. Gunn continues 'you can't tell them nowt even if they are fifty two, and the same when they get married, "you can't tell them nowt". They make your arms ache when they're young & they make your heart ache when they're old'. Gunn closes with a postscript saying he had also recently lost his wife, 'that was a hell of a smack when she went. She was a Grand Old Lady'. As an afterthought, Gunn then picks up on the theme of cricket and refers to England's series win against West Indies that summer, and 'That old Yorkshire trick of ploughing the wicket up' referring to bowlers running on the wicket. 'A.W. Carr [Nottinghamshire captain] was a rum lad but he wouldn't stand for that or any other dirty trick' and describes how, playing against Yorkshire, 'Fred Barrett said to A.W. you wait till we get out there. I'll show the so and so's how to plough the wicket up, & he did for one over, but A.W. took him off & didn't let him bowl again that match'. A poignant personal letter with good cricket content. - George Gunn died the following year on the 29th June 1958*
- 49 Guy Rolf Jackson. Derbyshire 1919-1936. Single page typed wartime letter from Jackson, dated 22nd May 1944. Jackson is replying to a request for his autograph from a young Derbyshire supporter and looks forward to the return of cricket. Nicely signed in ink 'Guy Jackson'. - Jackson captained Derbyshire from 1922 to 1930. He was selected to captain the M.C.C. tour to South Africa in 1927/28 but had to withdraw due to ill health*
- 50 Leslie Fletcher Townsend. Derbyshire, Auckland & England 1922-1939. Single page handwritten letter from Townsend, dated 8th July 1976. Writing from his home in New Zealand Townsend is replying to a request for his autograph. Sold with an original sepia press photograph of Townsend, head and shoulders wearing his M.C.C. touring blazer, taken while on tour in India, November 1933. 5.5"x3.75". G £30/50
- 51 Sydney Francis Barnes. Warwickshire, Lancashire & England 1894-1930. Single page handwritten letter dated 17th November from Barnes to 'Mr Milne' with good cricket content and reference to W.G. Grace. Barnes writes to return autographed cards and explains why he rarely visits London, 'the only reason I should would be to watch the Tests and the reason I don't is that this would be rather expensive... I go to Nottingham and Manchester matches because I can get home each day'. Regarding Grace he writes, 'I played against him once- his last Gents v Players match at the Oval & my first. I got him caught at the wicket but Hadfield the umpire said "not out". W.G. said later, I played it Barnes. I replied I know you did & so does everyone except this chap, but then as WG once told a bowler, "they have come to see me [bat] & not to see you bowl". A very fine man & a great cricketer is my opinion of him'. Signed 'S.F. Barnes'. Small adhesive marks to lower corners, otherwise in good/ very good condition £80/120
- Barnes first played for the Players against the Gentlemen (captained by Grace) in the drawn match at The Oval, 10th-12th July 1902. Grace's final appearance in a Gentlemen v Players match was actually in 1906*
- 52 George Duckworth. Lancashire & England 1923-1947. Single page letter handwritten in ink from Duckworth to 'Mr [Jack] Sokell' (Wombwell Cricket Lovers' Society), dated 3rd January 1956. Duckworth is replying to an invitation to attend a lecture. Nicely signed by Duckworth. Sold with a small selection of original photographs and cigarette cards of Duckworth. G/VG £30/40
- 53 Albert Ward. Yorkshire, Lancashire & England 1886-1904. Two page letter handwritten in ink from Ward, dated 11th November 1889. Ward is replying to a request for his autograph. 'I have had but one year in first class cricket but as you intend to do me the honour of putting my autograph with those of famous cricketers I trust that my future performances in the cricket field will entitle it to its place'. Nicely signed 'Albert Ward'. Small stain to one corner, horizontal and vertical folds, otherwise in good condition £120/150
- Ward played four first-class matches for Yorkshire in 1886. He made his debut for Lancashire in 1889*
- 54 John Thomas 'Johnny' Tyldesley. Lancashire & England 1895-1923. Single page letter handwritten in ink dated 24th June 1903. Tyldesley is writing to accept an invitation to play for Players v Gentlemen at Lord's. Signed 'J.T. Tyldesley'. Sold with a Valentine's Series colour postcard of Tyldesley in batting pose etc. G/VG £50/80
- Tyldesley played in the drawn Gentlemen v Players match at Lord's, 6th-8th July 1903. In the first innings the Players made 478 (A.E. Knight 139) and the Gentlemen 185. Following on, the Gentlemen declared at 500 for 2 (C.B. Fry 232no and A.C. MacLaren 168no). The Players ended 55 for 1. Tyldesley scored 6 and 13no in the match*
- 55 Edward Humphrey Dalrymple Sewell. India, London County & Essex 1892-1904. An interesting and entertaining two page letter handwritten in ink from Sewell to G. Neville Weston, cricket writer and collector. In the letter marked 'Private' and dated 23rd June 1942, Sewell writes

- regarding recent derogatory articles in The Cricketer magazine about W.G. Grace. Sewell reports that Sydney Santall 'has squashed Haig about W.G.' and that Sewell himself has 'bowled an over or two against Gilligan's childish attack in a previous number... I've told W. to his face exactly what I think about it all' and asks that Neville Weston writes another letter endorsing Santall and 'if there's anything you approve of in my letters... especially as regards the ungentlemenliness of attacking Grace without rhyme or reason for making the attack 27 years after his death, I am sure every admirer of the G.O.M. ['Great Old Man'] will approve of anything you write'. Sewell's uses colourful terms such as 'disgraceful' and 'objectionable' and 'such a lack of breeding' and closes, 'The next No. appears July 18, W.G.'s 94th birthday- a good opportunity for a fast yorker on the leg stump!' and signs himself, 'E.H.D. Sewell'. A good read! Adhesive mark to top edge of second page, otherwise in good/ very good condition £50/70
- Sewell was an author of several books on cricket and also wrote for a number of newspapers on cricket and rugby*
- 56 Richard Moore 'Dickie' Bell. London County 1902-1904. Three page letter handwritten in ink from Bell to G. Neville Weston, cricket writer and collector. Dated 8th December 1941 and writing from his wartime address in Weybridge, Surrey, Bell is replying to express his interest in Weston's idea of the compilation of a 'scrapbook of my old friend Dr. W.G. Grace... I have all sorts of things such as team photos, snapshots of Grace, letters, an autographed bat which he gave me, a golf bag etc' including original photographic plates, but explains that most of his things are packed and stored away. Bell remembers meeting 'the Doctor practically all the year round after he came up to London, cricket in the summer & we used to run with the beagles and play golf together in the winter'. Being a great admirer of Grace, Bell kept 'a whole bundle' of correspondence between them 'feeling sure they would be of great interest long after his passing away'. Bell was an original member of the
- London County C.C. and 'remained so until it was disbanded. I think C.J.A. Wilkinson & I are the only ones still playing cricket. He closes by explaining that his London flat 'is shut up for the duration of the war', and that he is currently living close to a General Weston who used to play cricket and wonders if he is related to Neville Weston. Nicely signed 'R.M. Bell'. A good wartime letter with interesting references to Grace. Some adhesive marks, not affecting the letter content, otherwise in good condition £50/80
- W.G. Grace was invited to form the London County Cricket Club in 1898 and served as the club's secretary, manager and captain. They played their first first-class match in April 1900. Bell played his first match for the club in 1902 and represented the Gentlemen of London County against M.C.C. at Lord's in August 1908, which appears to be the last match played by London County before being disbanded, in which Bell took eleven wickets in a four wicket victory for London County. He played for Sutton (Surrey) C.C. for over forty years*
- 57 Patrick Graham Toler Kingsley. Oxford University 1928-1930. Single page handwritten letter dated 30th October 1978. Kingsley is replying to a request from 'Mr Crampton' for his autograph. Nicely signed 'Patrick Kingsley'. VG £25/35
- 58 David Charles Humphrey Townsend. Oxford University & England 1933-1948. Single page typed letter on Archer, Parkin & Townsend Solicitors letterhead dated 7th January 1976. Townsend is replying to a request from D.G. Crampton for his autograph. Nicely signed 'David Townsend'. VG £25/35
- Townsend is the last cricketer to have played Test cricket for England without having played for a first-class county. He played in three Tests on the M.C.C. tour to West Indies 1934/35*
- 59 Evelyn Maitland 'Lyn' Wellings. Oxford University & Surrey 1928-1946. Single page handwritten letter dated 16th October 1988. Wellings is replying to 'Mr Crampton' for a request for his autograph and writes
- 'you are correct about my short career in first class cricket, all over by 1933 except for one MCC match post war'. Signed 'E.M. Wellings'. VG £25/35
- Wellings worked as a journalist for the London Evening News and wrote a number of books on cricket*
- 60 Michael Richard Barton. Oxford University & Surrey 1935-1954. Single page handwritten letter dated 13th January 1990. Barton is replying to 'Mr Crampton' for a request for his autograph. Signed 'Michael R. Barton'. VG £40/60
- Barton captained Surrey from 1949 to 1951*
- 61 Oxford University. Three generations of Oxford groundsman spanning one hundred years. Original three page handwritten letter from William Charles Hodgkins to an unknown correspondent dated 5th January 1923. Hodgkins describes 'My Grandfather, David Hodgkins, who was the first Varsity groundsman was born in 1800 and died in 1896, he probably began about 1820, and besides the Varsity ground, did most of the Colleges as well, Magdalen, Trinity, University, Worcester, Lincoln, Jesus, Magdalen Hall, but in the early days everyone played on the Varsity ground until they could manage to get a ground at Cowley Marsh... The connection has gone on with Trinity since then. I think my father did it until he got too old quite 45 years, and I have done it 30 years... when 1930 comes I shall have no doubt in my own mind, that between us, we have passed 100 years'. Signed 'William Charles Hodgkins'. The letter partly laid down to page with some creasing, otherwise in good condition. Sold with three original portrait photographs of David Hodgkins, William Hodgkins, and William Charles with William Hodgkins. Some creasing, generally good condition £50/70
- 62 James Gilman. Middlesex, Cambridge University and London County 1900-1904. Three original handwritten letters/ postcards, one from Gilman to the cricket historian, G. Neville Weston dated 11th May 1964 relating to research about W.G. Grace. The two others dated 3rd April

- 1966 and 16th March 1976 are from Irving Rosenwater to Weston, both relating to conversations with Gilman, one regarding Gilman hitting a six into the Tavern to win the 1902 Varsity match at Lord's, the other on the eve of Gilman's 97th birthday. Sold with a facsimile letter to Gilman from W.G. Grace in which Grace berates him for letting him down the day before a London County match in 1901 etc. Odd faults and uneven trimming to the original letters, otherwise in good condition £40/60
- The majority of Gilman's first-class career was playing for London County.*
- 63 John Thomas Brown. Yorkshire & England 1889-1904. Single page handwritten letter dated 27th December 1900. Writing to an unknown correspondent Brown states, 'I have had brought to me a copy of old cricket rules as revised by the M.C.C. in 1798 printed on the old style of paper and framed. I think the thing is genuine and could be bought at a reasonable figure. Would it be of any use to you. It so let me know and I will tell the man to send it on for you to see'. Signed 'J.T. Brown Yorks XI'. The letter is laid down to a modern mount below an early mono postcard of Brown in batting pose at the crease. Framed and glazed, overall 6.25"x12.5". Good condition £120/160
- J.T. Brown dropped out of first class cricket in May 1904 due to heart trouble, which initially was not thought serious, but he in fact never recovered and died in November of the same year, aged only 35 years. He and Percy Holmes are the only batsmen to have scored two triple centuries for Yorkshire*
- 64 Trevor Edward Bailey. Essex & England 1946-1967. Single page handwritten letter dated 23rd August 2006 from Bailey. Writing from his home in Westcliffe-on-Sea, Bailey compares regaining the Ashes in 1953 being 'rather like last summer [2005], extremely satisfying' and describes having played in six series against Australia, 'three at home and three away'. Signed 'Yours, Trevor'. Good condition £25/35
- 65 Ronald 'Ronny' Aird. Hampshire & Cambridge University 1920-1938. Four page handwritten letter from Aird writing from his home in Sussex to J.D. Coldham, dated 16th January 1983. Aird is replying to a request for information on F.S. Jackson. He remembers Jackson as 'a very friendly and charming man. The expressions "Live Wire" applied very much to him'. He describes his appearance as 'slight and athletic and he had great confidence in himself... I cannot believe there has ever been a better genuine all rounder... a natural athlete'. Aird closes by recommending a visit to Lord Alletton, whom he believes was a nephew of Jackson. Signed 'Ronny Aird'. Good condition £30/50
- Aird was secretary to M.C.C. 1953-1962, and President in 1968-1969*
- 66 John Arlott. Single page typed letter from Arlott to the book dealer, E.K. 'Ted' Brown, dated 10th March 1969. Halley explains that it is 'Mr [William] Sievwright' who has written books on Perth cricket'. - 79 Arthur Haygarth, M.C.C. Sussex and Middlesex, 1844-1861. Writing to the cricket author and historian, A.J. Gaston, Hitchen is replying to an enquiry about magazine articles on cricket. Hitchen is in poor health and has advertised some duplicate copies of Wisden in 'The Field' as 'a time of illness is always a trying one to the exchequer'. He asks Gaston for advice on 'having my set of "Wisden" rebound. I should not have done this if all the covers had been quite intact and perfect... I have chosen the cloth sides to imitate as near as possible the original & familiar "buff" cover of our old yearly favourite'. Regarding cricket, Hitchen writes 'Poor "Old Notts", how the mighty have fallen. We seem in a dreadful way & cannot hope for a "look in" at Yorkshire on Monday next. Well done Warwicks'. In a postscript he asks if Gaston could publicise the fact that he has 'one or two copies left of the ed de luxe of "Life of A. Shrewsbury"'. - England won the series by four Tests to one. The tour was highly controversial because of the bodyline bowling tactics used by the England team under the captaincy of Douglas Jardine.*
- Bodyline, also known as fast leg theory bowling, was a cricketing tactic devised by the English cricket team for their 1932-33 Ashes tour of Australia, specifically to combat the extraordinary batting skill of Australia's Don Bradman. A bodyline delivery was one where the cricket ball was bowled at the body of the batsman, in the hope that when he defended himself with his bat, a resulting deflection could be caught by one of several fielders standing close by.*
- The tactic was considered by critics to be intimidatory and physically threatening, to the point of being unfair in a game that was supposed to uphold gentlemanly traditions. England's use of a tactic perceived by some as overly aggressive or even unfair ultimately threatened diplomatic relations between the two countries before the situation was calmed. Although no serious injuries arose from any short-pitched deliveries while a leg theory field was actually set, the tactic still led to considerable ill feeling between the two teams, particularly when Australian batsmen suffered actual injuries in separate incidents, which inflamed the watching crowds. The controversy eventually spilled into the diplomatic arena.*

The remark about Frank being what we call an "If-er" was not intended to be unkind, and I think I qualified the remark by saying Frank was a glorious player. - The date of the letter corresponds with the publication of Hobbs' book 'Playing for England: My Test-Cricket Story' in 1931*
- 510 Pelham Francis Warner. Oxford University, Middlesex & England 1894-1920. Single page handwritten letter in ink dated 5th May 1949 from Warner to 'Dear Mr Bowes'. Writing from an address in Kensington, Warner writes saying how pleased he is that the correspondent liked 'my book on Lord's' and invites him to send the book for signing. He closes by saying, 'I hope your boy will one day play for Somerset at Lord's of course'. Signed 'P.F. Warner'. Adhesive damage to top edge of verso, otherwise in good condition £30/40
- 511 Pelham Francis Warner. Oxford University, Middlesex & England 1894-1920. Two page typed letter on official M.C.C. letterhead dated 14th May 1940 with the odd handwritten annotation in Warner's hand. Addressed to 'Dear Stanhope', the letter covers subjects including reminiscences of Oxford, the anxiety and worry of the War and his cricket work at Lord's. Regarding cricket, Warner remembers the umpire, 'old Thoms... He was a rare character and a very good judge of cricket'. Also 'About that hit for 10 at Winchester... You are quite right in saying that it was a fine glance to leg. So many people accuse me of having bowled a rotten long hop or full pitch!'. Warner also remembers 'Poor Harry Hunt [John Henry Sneyd Hunt, Middlesex 1904-1912] was killed in the last war. He was a great fellow in every way and a fine cricketer especially in the field' and refers to a catch taken by Hunt 'at Lord's in the Middlesex and Lancashire match about 1905. I can see it now. He ran at full speed from his left to straight behind the bowler in front of the Pavilion rails and held a hard drive with his left hand out stretched somewhere about the height of his head... I mentioned it in that book of mine "My Cricketing Life", which was published in 1921. I am afraid you may find it difficult to get today as it is said to be out of print. Publishers never print enough copies of books by cricketers!'. He closes by bemoaning the lack of cricket, 'A big match for the Red Cross which we had arranged for yesterday and today had to be cancelled. I feel like joining the Corps which takes in men up to 60. With a hat on I might pass for less than hat though I am 66'. Signed in ink 'Plum'. 512 Plum Warner's M.C.C. tour to South America 1926/27. Two interesting handwritten letters written to Warner relating to the first M.C.C. tour to South America, captained by Warner. The first, a single page handwritten letter dated 24th January 1927, is from Clem Gibson (Sussex & Cambridge University 1919-1926) who captained the Argentina team in four 'Test' matches played. The letter is full of gratitude and praise for Warner and the popularity of his team. With the three match series drawn an extra deciding match was arranged. 'There is no doubt as you yourself really know which was the better side, and it was only a question of time as to when you would find your true form'. Gibson closes by saying, 'Personally I shall always be able to tell the world that I once skipped the Argentine side in a series of matches against Plum Warner and although walloped, enjoyed it thoroughly. Yours ever, Clem'. The other letter, four pages handwritten in ink, is written from 'Gibbs & Co, Valparaiso', and dated 29th January 1927. Written in a similarly effusive vein the letter relates to the Chile leg of the tour. The correspondent's name cannot be identified, but he had hosted Warner while in Chile. He writes, 'It was good of you to let me get together for a small dinner the few O.Rs [Rugby School] there are in this part of the world'. A reference to the singing of "Floreat". The South America tour, originally planned for Argentina, was expanded to take in additional matches in Uruguay, Chile and Peru. Despite taking a strong team including Gubby Allen, Rony Stanyforth, Jack White and Lord Dunglass (later Alec Douglas-Hume, Prime Minister 1963-1964), the 'Test' series in Argentina, was closely fought, M.C.C. eventually winning 2-1, with victory in the deciding match by an innings and twelve runs

513 Mrs Mabel Murray Hickson. Novelist and wife of Sidney Austyn Paul Kitcat (Gloucestershire 1892-1904). Three four-page handwritten letters written by Hickson to the publisher, Bowden, of a cricket-related short story. In the first letter, dated 24th April 1898, she writes 'I think if I re-write "Fairie's

dove-letter[?]" that it will be greatly suitable for your series of cricket tales. It has only appeared in an obscure local magazine in the north, which died after the first few numbers. I shall re-model the story', and concludes with her terms of payment. The second letter, dated the following day, 25th April 1898, is in response to the acceptance for publication of her story, and confirming the arrangements for the typing of the script, 'I could do it in 2 or 3 days & send it to Mrs Dickens to type. She would let you have it at the end of the week. Will that do?' and asks to see proofs for checking '[as] I can't endure any slip-slop expressions'. In a postscript she writes, 'My husband to play for Glo'shire & knows "The Doctor" well. I am sure he would tell you any thing he could about him with pleasure. He [Grace] is 50'. The third letter, dated 28th May 1898, relates to the printer's proofs of the story, 'Here are the proofs. I would have sent them before, but my husband has crushed his hand & can't write so I am his secretary for a while. It's most unfortunate & spoils all his cricket. We should have been at Brighton next week', and closes with additional alterations. Each letter very nicely signed 'Mabel Kitcat'. Good/ very good condition £70/100

Mabel Kitcat was a prolific writer of short stories of periodicals in the 1890s. She married the Gloucestershire cricketer, Sidney Kitcat, in 1896, but continued writing under the name Mrs Murray Hickson from her first marriage, to Robert Murray Hickson who died aged only 29 in 1885. Her novel 'Concerning Teddy' (Padwick 6002) was published by Bowden in 1898

514 Sydney Cricket Ground 1898-1913. Three interesting items of correspondence relating to the Secretary of Sydney Cricket Ground, S.H. Fairland. The first is a typed letter to Fairland from the Manager of the Reuter's Telegram Company dated 5th March 1898, which refers to the return of official press passes during the matches against England. The two other documents are official duplicate Ground Reports prepared by Fairland. One comprising two pages is dated 'to 20th September 1910'. The other, dated 29th April

The report was produced by Fairland in response to a resolution passed by the Trustees that 'the Secretary should take a more active part in the management of and be a stronger personality in connection with the Cricket Ground'. The last four pages feature 'Letters of Thanks & Appreciation' received by Fairland in carrying out his duties, presumably to reinforce his continued suitability for the role.
