- 1 The Triangular Series. England v Australia 1912. Rare original official match ticket for admission to the Members' Enclosure for the first day of the Lord's Test match, 24th June 1912. Sold with a 'Special souvenir' print presented with 'The Captain' magazine. July 1912. The souvenir with images of the Australian players. Each player named. Trimmed to borders, approx. 5.75"x8". The rain affected match was drawn
- 2 Australia tours to England 1938. Two official tickets, one to the members' enclosure for the fourth day of the second Test, England v Australia, Lord's, 28th June 1938. The other ticket is for the third day (Monday) of the third Test, Old Trafford, 8th- 12th July 1938. The match was abandoned without a ball being bowled. Sold with a sepia real photograph postcard of 'Carpet bedding, Australia v England, The Leas, Folkestone', for the tour match against an England XI, 3rd- 6th September 1938. Publisher unknown. Also two mono souvenir prints of official team photographs of the 1934 and 1938 Australian touring parties published by the Daily Mail and News Chronicle respectively. G/VG £40/60
- 3 Lancashire County and Manchester Cricket Club. Early member's ticket for the 1896 season. The hexagonal ticket in black leather with gilt titles to front and Lancashire emblem to rear, with bound in printed fixture lists for Lancashire and Manchester Cricket Clubs. The highlights of the season would be the three matches played against the Australians at Old Trafford. Odd faults otherwise in good condition £30/50
- 4 Lord Sheffield's English Teams tour of Australia 1891/92. Printed musical programme from the R.M.S.'Arcadia' en route to Australia for the tour. Title to top border 'R.M.S.'Arcadia. 'Friday Nov. 6th 1891. the Darkest African Minstrels, Interlocutor [a person who takes part in a dialogue or conversation]Mr W.G.Grace' with musical numbers featuring some of the cricketers G.Bean, A.E.Stoddart, A.Shaw, J.M.Read, R.Peel and J.Briggs. Affixed to a large album page, with on reverse large albumen photograph of camels at Moses Well (Egypt). A rare, and possibly unique memento of this tour, organised by Lord Sheffield. Previously sold as lot 33 in Charles Leski's auction of August 2011 £120/160
- 5 Nondescripts Cricket Club. 'The Fiftieth Anniversary Dinner of the Nondescripts Cricket Club held at The Cafe Monico 27th January 1926'. Attractive four page menu plus covers for the Dinner in 1926. Excellent decorative covers with cameo images of members of the club with decoration in club colours, ribbon tie in similar colours to edge. To inside 'Songs of the Nondescripts', images of the President etc, Toast List, Entertainment, team photographs then and now and a crossword to back cover. - 6 Marylebone Cricket Club 1925. Official invitation to the 'Complimentary Dinner to Mr. A.E.R. Gilligan and the M.C.C. Team' held at the Savoy Hotel, 15th July 1925. This was the invitation to 'Mr J.L. Bryan', probably Jack Bryan who was a member of the 1924/25 M.C.C. tour to Australia led by Gilligan. Very good condition. Sold with an official invitation to the 'Farewell Cocktail Party in honour of the M.C.C. Cricket Team' given by the Jamaica Cricket Association at Myrtle Bank Hotel, Kingston, 3rd April 1954, the final day of the fifth and final Test match of the 1953/54 tour to West Indies, this being E.G. E.G. Wolfe was Sir Julian Cahn's brother-in-law and served as Manager on Cahn's tour to Ceylon and Malaya in 1937
- 7 Albert Edwin Trott. M.C.C., Middlesex, Victoria, Australia & England, 1892-1911. Rare original menu on two cards for the Complimentary Luncheon given by E.F. Bourke 'On the Occasion of the Representative Cricket Match between Pretoria and Johannesburg for A.E. Trott's Benefit. Held at the Berea Park, Pretoria, 28th February 1898. Decorative front cover with 'G. MacArthur' of Pretoria hand written, and printed menu to verso, the other card with the printed players' names for both teams. Minor staining to card edges, otherwise in good condition. A scarce item £300/500
Australian born, Albert Trott played for Victoria and Middlesex between 1892 and 1910. He also is one of few players to have played for both Australia, 3 Tests and England, 2 Tests. He is known as the only batsman to hit a ball that cleared the Lord's Pavilion. He committed suicide in 1914 by shooting himself having been ill for some time with little hope of recovery.
The one day match was won by A Bailey's Transvaal XI (Johannesburg) by 162 runs. Trott, playing for Pretoria, took 5 wickets and top scored with 22 runs

Georges & Co Ltd' Original folding fixture card for 1938 listing the fixtures of the Bristol Brewery C.C. to centre pages, Gloucestershire and Australia tour fixtures to inside covers. - 13 Royal Household Cricket at Balmoral 1938. Two typed team sheets on Balmoral Castle letterhead for 'Harry Mercer's XI' dated 12th August 1938, and 'Mr. Tubbs' XI'. Both sheets with handwritten alterations and batting orders in pencil. Odd rust spots, otherwise in good condition £30/50
- 14 George Bainbridge Barrington. Derbyshire 1880-1887. Original stock dividend Warrant for Interest no. 796 issued to Barrington, 13th January 1900, by the Grand Trunk Railway Company of Canada. Addressed to Barrington at his home in Kirk Langley near Derby. G £30/40

- 25 Cricket in advertising and publicity 1930s onwards. White file comprising an eclectic collection of cricket related advertising, book launch publicity leaflets, publishers' catalogues, cricket events, product labels etc. Book launches include for Herbert Sutcliffe's 'For England and Yorkshire', 'How to Bowl', Ian Peebles, 'The Fight for the Ashes 1932-3', Jack Hobbs etc. Other items include knitting patterns for cricket sweaters by Greenock, Patons, Bellmarsh and Sirdar. - 26 Cuttings scrapbook 1899-1902. A large scrapbook comprising a comprehensive collection of press cuttings, a good proportion of which relate to cricket, the remainder for politics, the church, Boer War, obituaries etc. The cuttings include good coverage of the 1899 Ashes Test series and the Australians' tour matches in England, County, club and representative matches for the 1899 season, also includes articles relating to the first West Indies tour of England in 1900. Cuttings are taken from the Daily Telegraph, Morning Post, The Sportsman, The Field, Daily Graphic etc. Owner's name and inscription 'E. Slocock, begun at Edmonton N.W.T. Canada 1989' handwritten to first page. A few of the articles have been written by Slocock as correspondent in South Africa covering the Boer War, and when based in Edmonton, Canada. Front cover detached, lacking spine, internally in good condition £40/60
- 27 Alfred Percy 'Tich' Freeman. Kent & England 1914-1936. A collection of typed manuscripts with odd annotations in Freeman's own hand, comprising six articles written by Freeman in 1937, the year after ending his first-class career, in which he recalls his playing days. The first article relates to his early

memories including playing in his first match as a boy aged eleven in 1897 at Leyton High School. He recalls his father practising with G.F. Hearne (Middlesex), Fred Huish, and Alec Hearne (Kent). Regarding bowlers he refers to Charles Kortright (Essex) as 'the fastest bowler in the world', and R.O. Schwartz of South Africa who introduced the googly to Freeman. After moving to Tonbridge his first-class debut was for Kent against Oxford University in 1914. He describes Kent players including Charlie Blythe, Frank Woolley, Punter Humphreys, Jim Seymour, Jack Mason etc, and relates memories of playing against W.G. Grace, and his first tour to Australia in 1925/25. In the second article Freeman comments on the 'glue-pot' wicket at the Rectory Field, Blackheath, 'the graveyard of [Surrey's] hopes', how Kent's bowlers were better suited to the conditions than their Surrey opponents and describes numerous encounters between the sides at that ground. He compares the styles of Jack Hobbs with Percy Chapman, comments on the visit of Armstrong's 1921 Australians and Collins' side of 1924, touring South Africa in 1927 etc. He opens the third article by describing how the 'four years of the war robbed me of what would, in all probability, been my best years', beating Tom Richardson's record of 290 wickets in a season in 1928 and going on to achieve the record of 304, which still stands to today. Freeman refers to his disappointment of not playing in a Test against Australia in England and recounts matches in which he played against Bradman. Other batsmen he admires include the Yorkshire pair of Sutcliffe and Holmes, and Jack Hobbs. Freeman devotes the fourth article to the 1922/23 tour to New Zealand led by A.C. Maclaren, including experiencing an earthquake during a match at Christchurch on Christmas Day, Gilligan's team to Australia in 1924/25, and Chapman's in 1928/29. In the fifth article Freeman lists his top seven batsmen, namely Jack Hobbs, Wally Hammond, Frank Woolley, Don Bradman, Charlie Macartney, Herbie Taylor and Patsy Hendren, and provides a good summary of the merits of each player, and also lists his 'World Eleven' and

discussions on captaincy and wicket-keeping. In his final article Freeman writes about the press and selectors (referring again to being passed over for selection against Australia in England), the 'Bodyline' controversy etc. He closes by describing his disquiet at the manner of his dismissal by Kent as a player in 1936 having taken over 100 wickets, but which was curtailed by injury. He reproduces the letter informing him of the Club's decision, which he received after the news had already been released to the media. He closes, however, with happy memories of lighter moments on tour in South Africa and Australia. An excellent and entertaining first-hand account of a remarkable cricket career. - 30 'The Spider and the Fly in Cricket

Language' by Gowen Hopen. An entertaining typed poem comprising thirty two lines of rhyming couplets. Written as a pastiche of the poem by Mary Howitt originally published in 1828, in this version the Australian spinner, Charlie Grimmett, is styled as the spider, with Jack Hearne as the fly. The first two lines read, "'Won't you walk out to my bowling,'" said Grimmett to Jack Hearne;/ "'Tis the nicest, slowest bowling, the sort you always spurn.'" Hearne rejects the temptation stating 'But I have promised Gilligan that I would try and stay', but Hearne ultimately falls to Grimmett's 'corkscrew cunning'. Originally from Grimmett's personal collection. Horizontal folds, otherwise in good condition £50/80

Rippon 1914-1937 (letter dated May 1934), F.S. Lee 1929-1947 (letter dated August 1956), R.J.O. Meyer 1936-1949 (letter dated 1978) and A.T.M. Jones 1938-1948 (letter dated May 1992). VG £30/50
- 81 Lord Martin Bladen Hawke, Yorkshire & England 1881-1911. Short one page handwritten letter/note to Mr Johnson, written on 'Wighill Park, Tadcaster' letterhead and dated the 29th April 1908. 'Many thanks for your letter and good wishes for the coming season'. Nicely signed 'Hawke'. Minor foxing otherwise in good condition £60/90
Wighill Park, home of Lord Hawke, had its own private cricket ground in the grounds
- 82 R.L. Hodgson. Journalist and author. Single page handwritten letter dated 22nd June 1929 from Hodgson writing using his pseudonym 'A County Vicar'. In the letter to H.W. Warner headed 'As at "The Cricketer' Office', Hodgson thanks Warner for his letter which had been forwarded to him by 'Your namesake, the Editor [P.F. Warner]... in which you say such pleasant things about "Angela". I am so glad you like her!' He closes with the hope that he might get to Canterbury for the Kent v Nottinghamshire match in August. Nicely signed 'A Country Vicar'. Originally from H.W. Warner's collection. Foxing, and adhesive marks to verso £30/40
- 83 Ronald 'Ronny' Aird. Hampshire & Cambridge University 1920-1938. Four page handwritten letter from Aird writing from his home in Sussex to J.D. Coldham, dated 16th January 1983. Aird is replying to a request for information on F.S. Jackson. He remembers Jackson as 'a very friendly and charming man. The expressions "Live Wire" applied very much to him'. He describes his appearance as 'slight and athletic and he had great confidence in himself... I cannot believe there has ever been a better genuine all rounder... a natural athlete'. Aird closes by recommending a visit to Lord Alletson, whom he believes was a nephew of Jackson. Signed 'Ronny Aird'. Good condition £30/40
Aird was secretary to M.C.C. 1953-1962, and President in 1968-1969
- 84 Leslie Gutteridge, publisher, Epworth Press. Single page typed letter from Gutteridge to Gerald Brodribb, dated 30th April 1956. Gutteridge is writing attempting to identify a poem, a transcript of which he originally enclosed with this letter. He writes, 'An article that I have written about Cophthall Chambers and his "The Cricket Match a Poem in Two Cantos" needs the confirmation that this poem of his is unknown'. He continues, 'The real name of "Cophthall Chambers Esq." is Thomas Smith. The poem was sung(!) at the Opening Dinner of the Surrey Cricket Club'. Signed in green ink 'Leslie'. Pinholes and foxing, light folds, otherwise in good condition £30/50
The poem to which Gutteridge is referring may be 'The Origin of Cricket: Sung at the Opening Dinner of the Surrey Cricket Club' originally published in 'A Collection of Poems by Thomas Smith' in 1867. Smith was a stockbroker who used his address at Cophthall Chambers as a pseudonym
- 85 Arthur Haygarth, M.C.C. Sussex and Middlesex, 1844-1861. Original four page handwritten letter to an unknown correspondent, dated 28th April 1982, to whom Haygarth had already posted a letter 'this morning'. The subject of the letter is Haygarth's 'Scores and Biographies'. He encloses two lists received this morning from M.C.C. and has just written to the assistant secretary, Mr J. Murdoch, to forward him their list of printed matches. Haygarth continues, 'I expect to catch several cricketers I could not find in the winter. It has often been an arduous task to find the addresses of many cricketers after a few years have passed since they began play. I am sure I can rely on you to save the MS... I pride myself that every line in the 13 vols already published is a fact connected with cricket and all "future vols" (& I hope there will be several) are all drawn up in exactly the same lines'. In a postscript Haygarth writes, 'All depends now on Bean & the Syndicate does it not?' and finishes, 'I shall most probably never go to Lord's again for I think their treatment of me was most unkind'. An interesting letter relating to Haygarth's ongoing difficulties with the publication of 'Scores and Biographies'. Nicely signed 'Arthur Haygarth'. Arthur Haygarth is best remembered for compiling the fifteen volumes of 'Scores and Biographies', the first four published by F. Lillywhite, the remainder by M.C.C. At the time of writing Haygarth was disillusioned by the apparent failure of M.C.C. to continue to publish his manuscripts, Volume XIII covering 1874-1876 having been published some five years previously in 1880. The letter was formerly owned by John Arlott, with faint pencil annotations of Haygarth's name and details
- 86 John Henniker-Major, 5th Baron Henniker. Two page handwritten letter on Thornham Hall, Eye (Suffolk) note paper to Dr Short, dated 14th September 1877. Henniker-Major is writing to thank Short 'for the most enjoyable day's cricket the three young people had on Wednesday... I will send you over as good an eleven as I can on Friday next. I cannot come myself as I shall be away from home. Nicely signed 'J Henniker'. Horizontal folds. Good condition £30/40
John Henniker-Major served as Member of Parliament for East Suffolk and was appointed Governor of the Isle of Man in 1895 where he died in 1902. He established a cricket ground at Thornham Hall in 1876
- 87 Pelham Francis 'Plum' Warner. Oxford University, Middlesex & England 1894-1920. Four page handwritten letter in ink dated 5th July 1909. Warner is writing to apologise for not replying to an invitation to play tennis, and his untidy appearance as 'my flannels were at Lord's'. Signed 'P.F. Warner'. Light horizontal fold, otherwise in good condition £50/70
- 88 England Test cricketers 1930s. Four brief handwritten letters from England Test players, each replying to

- a request for an autograph or in thanks for congratulations received. Signatures are Cyril Walters (Worcestershire), Gubby Allen (Middlesex), Maurice Leyland (Yorkshire) and Eddie Paynter (Lancashire). Odd adhesive marks to two letters, otherwise in good condition £50/80
- 89 Geoffrey Boycott. Yorkshire & England 1962-1986. - 90 William 'Gentleman' Smith. Original early two page handwritten letter from Smith dated 19th June 1816. Smith is writing to an unknown correspondent, probably a publisher, regarding a series of matches played between Eton and All England at Newmarket 'in 1750'. Smith lists the players who participated, including for All England, Lord Trentham, Lowson, Lade, Whickliffe, Humphries, Cooper etc and for Eton, Duke of Kingsnton, Lord Sandwich, Lord Howe, Townshend etc. Light staining and small adhesive marks to the letter, otherwise in good/ very good condition £100/150
- An accompanying copy of a cutting from the 'Sporting Kalendar' of July 1751 reports on a three match series played at Newmarket in 1751, in which England won the first by 37 runs, Eton the second by 70 runs, and England the third by 95 runs. William Smith was educated at Eton College and Cambridge University, but was sent down for unruly behaviour and became a notable actor*
- 91 Don Bradman. Australia. Original handwritten one page letter from Don Bradman to Jack Pollard regarding payment for an article for 'Six and Out' a book edited by Pollard. Bradman requests some form of payment and asks for a cheque to be sent made out to 'Adelaide Crippled Childrens Association' as he does not wish to profit from the article. Nicely signed in ink by Bradman. The letter is dated 17th June 1966 and is written on Bradman headed paper. VG £70/100
- 92 Walter Reginald Hammond. Gloucestershire & England 1920-1951. Interesting four page handwritten letter, with original envelope, from Hammond to his Wife from the Grand Hotel, Bulawayo on the M.C.C. tour of South Africa 1938/39. Postmarked 8th February 1939. Excellent content including flying down to Durban after the last (timeless) Test to spend time with her, not playing in the last match, visiting the grave of Cecil Rhodes, Civic luncheon 'where the Mayor as always spoke a lot of hot air', eating steak and kidney pudding 'made a change form all the local stuff', bad weather 'The Cape climate my dear is a dream compared with some of the stuff we have been getting...'. - 93 John Berry 'Jack' Hobbs, Surrey & England 1905-1934. Two page handwritten letter to Charles Pratt Green regarding cricket bats. 'I am under agreement to return all bats with which I make important scores to the makers of the "Force" bat, Summers, Brown & Sons, 40 Whitecross Street and perhaps they would oblige if you wrote them. I thank you for all the nice things you say about me in your letter, also for your kind wishes for success in South Africa'. Nicely signed 'J.B.Hobbs' and dated 16th October 1913. Back of letter laid down to lined page. Odd mark/foxing spot otherwise in good condition £60/90
- The letter was written just prior to Hobbs leaving for the M.C.C. tour of South Africa in 1913/14. On the tour he topped the batting averages with 1489 runs at an average of 74.75 with five centuries*
- 94 Charles Burgess Fry, Sussex & England 1892-1921. Five page handwritten letter from Fry to Jim Swanton, he talks of Swanton's success in his articles on the Tests, 'I was sitting by that pleasant character P.B.H. May, at the Arsenal match today, he thinks television is having a big influence on the public attitude to cricket eg 10s of 1000's instead of 1000's know what A. Bedser 'looks like'- so that the words of such accounts as yours take on much more meaning. I see his idea- he is a thoughtful kid'. He then talks in length about Arsenal and football, 'The famous club is suffering from over-sophistication of method and the ageing of some of its players-Only goals count in soccer and no amount of midfield acrobatics makes up for penetrative individual dash and pluck near goal'. The letter dated 19th September 1953 and nicely signed in ink 'C.B.F.'. G £70/100
- 95 George Gordon, 9th Marquis of Huntly & Earl of Aboyne. Original one page handwritten letter from Aboyne to 'Thergill (?)' regarding the embodiment of the Gordon Highlanders regiment. As I find it is generally supposed that the regiment will be embodied immediately after the ballot, it will be necessary that Sgt Vaughton should make the best of his way to Aberdeen so as to be there as soon after the 16th June as he can.... I hope he will be able to bring some of the assistance along with him I mentioned in my last letter. Excuse all this trouble and believe me my dear Thergill'. The letter dated, Aboyne Castle, 3rd May 1798. Nicely signed 'Aboyne' in black ink with original official red wax seal. An early signature of Aboyne, styled Lord Strathavon until 1795 and known as The Earl of Aboyne from 1795-1836, was a Scottish peer. Small nick to one edge, light adhesive marks to verso, otherwise in good/ very good condition £80/120
- In 1794, the newly embodied regiment of the Gordon Highlanders was paraded for the first time at Aberdeen when they wore the then almost new, and now famous, tartan which had been devised by Forsythe of Huntly. Forsythe had taken the standard plaid and woven in a yellow stripe, which, as he wrote to Lord Huntly, he trusted would appear "very lively."*
- Recruited mainly in the large Gordon estates in Badenoch, Lochaber and Strathspey but also from the counties of Aberdeen, Banff and Elgin, the*

- Regiment was, at first, numbered the 100th Regiment of Foot. But the title of the Gordon Highlanders was used along with the number. In 1798 they became the 92nd, under which number they won their first battle honours and by which they were known until their amalgamation in 1881 with the 75th Regiment.*
- Gordon was born in 1761 and was a keen cricketer who made four known first class appearances from 1785-1792. He was a member of the White Conduit Club and an early member of M.C.C. but was mainly associated with Surrey. He died in 1853*
- 96 Len Braund. Surrey, Somerset & England 1896-1920. One page handwritten letter to J.D. Coldham reporting on his health, awaiting a second artificial leg. Welcomes current success of the Surrey team 'keeping up the old tradition of sportsmanship'. The letter dated 20th November 1946 and nicely signed in ink by Braund. Folds, good £60/90
- Braund was beset by ill-health in his later life and had both legs amputated during the Second World War*
- 97 Wombwell Cricket Lovers' Society 1950s/1960s. Selection of approximately thirty typed and handwritten letters, the majority written to Jack Sokell from former players, publishers, editors etc replying to invitations to attend dinners and events. Signatures include Fred Rumsey (Somerset & England), Graham Ross, Irving Rosenwater, Brian Reynolds (Northamptonshire), Cedric Rhodes (Lancashire Chairman), Diana Rait Kerr (Curator, Lord's Museum), R.W.V. Robins (Cambridge University, Middlesex & England) etc. G £30/40
- 98 Don Bradman. Single page handwritten letter from Bradman in ink on The Victoria Station Hotel, Nottingham letterhead dated 2nd June 194[8]. Writing to 'Dear Geoffrey', Bradman states 'I'm very sorry but I am afraid it is impossible to do what you ask. We are getting hundreds of similar requests & I'm sure you will quite understand that we can neither accept all of them nor pick out certain ones'. Signed 'Don Bradman'. Horizontal folds and light foxing, otherwise in good condition £70/100
- 99 William Ewart 'Bill' Astill. Leicestershire & England 1906-1939. Four page handwritten letter in ink from Astill to 'My Dear Eileen' dated 'Friday', the accompanying envelope postmarked 24th August 1929. Astill has just arrived in Westcliff-on-Sea for the Essex v Leicestershire match played at Southend 24th-27th August 1929 and is replying to correspondence received from the lady. The envelope laid down to page. Fold to the letter, otherwise in good condition £30/50
- 100 Anthony Robert 'Tony' Lewis, Glamorgan & England 1955-1974. A small selection of correspondence to Lewis relating to him retiring from first class cricket in 1974, becoming a member of I Zingari in 1975, presidency of M.C.C. etc. The letter relating to his retirement is from Colin Cowdrey and dated 30th July 1974 'Like C.B. Fry you have chosen to finish at the might of your powers, called to bigger things', there are two letters handwritten by Lord Cobham, the first dated 24th January 1975 asking him to join I Zingari and the other, dated 1st February 1975 following Lewis's positive reply 'I know that your own attitude towards cricket is that it is a game to be enjoyed and not a battle to be endured', he talks of the lack of chivalry in cricket in the 1970's, 'I think that you and dear old Johnny Clay are the only two Glamorgan IZ's.... Maurice Turnbull certainly would have joined us but for his untimely death', a further letter from Sir William Becher, Secretary of IZ dated 1993, he talks of Colin Cowdrey, George Mann etc plus a card from Colin Cowdrey praising Lewis on his performance as M.C.C. - 101 Elias Henry 'Patsy' Hendren. Middlesex & England 1907-1937. Single page handwritten letter in ink dated 23rd May 1934. Hendren is writing to thank S. Canynge Caple for his recently published book 'The Cricketer's Who's Who'. Nicely signed 'E. Patsy Hendren'. Light folds, adhesive marks to verso, otherwise in good condition £30/50
- 102 Tom Graveney and Raman Subba Row. - 103 Harold Larwood. Nottinghamshire & England 1924-1938. Single page undated handwritten letter from Larwood in which he is replying to a request to present prizes at an event. 'I am sorry that I have to decline your invitation... I have been inundated with requests of all sorts but have declined them all'. Nicely signed 'Harold Larwood'. The letter partly laid down to black page. Horizontal and vertical folds, otherwise in good condition £40/60
- 104 H.V. Dorey. Editor of 'Cricket Who's Who'. Single page handwritten letter in ink from Dorey to the Editor of 'Cricket' magazine. The letter, written on the elaborate colour letterhead of Cricket & Sports Publishers Ltd of London is dated 22nd May [19]10. Dorey is enclosing a copy of the newly published 'England v Australia in the Tests [from 1876-1909] of which a review would be greatly appreciated. Nicely signed 'H.V. Dorey'. Partly laid to page. Horizontal and vertical folds, with some ageing, otherwise in good condition £50/70
- Cricket Sports & Publishers were the publishers of a number of notable cricket books including 'Robert Abel's Life and Reminiscences in the Cricket Field' 1910, 'Santall's History of Warwickshire Cricket' 1911, Craig the Cricket Rhymster's Poems' 1910 etc*
- 105 Frederick Gale ('The Old Buffer'). Handwritten ten page letter in ink dated 28th January 1893, to Mr

- [R.S.] Holmes, author and collector. Writing from his home in Manitoba, Canada. Gale is writing to thank Holmes 'for kindly sending me such a valuable present' of the book 'Public School Matches of 1853'. He continues at length on subjects such as Burbidge of Surrey, Fuller Pilch of Kent, politics parliament and government including 'Dizzy' Disraeli, Palmerston and Gladstone, the cold weather in Manitoba where the temperature reached 'lower than 45 below zero', New York, and missing life in England. Signed 'Fred Gale'. G £100/150
- Fred Gale played in the Winchester Eleven in 1841 against Eton and Harrow at Lord's, and played two first class matches in 1845. He made his name as a prolific writer of books, newspaper and magazine articles writing under the name 'The Old Buffer'. Some of his library including author's copies had been sold by Sotheby's in 1891 when Gale left England for Canada, a move which turned out not to be permanent*
- 106 A.J. Gaston. Four page handwritten letter in ink from Gaston dated 26th April [18]94 from his home in Brighton. Gaston is writing to E.B.V. Christian to thank him for 'the signed copy of your excellent "At the Sign of the Wicket" and to inform him that he 'had previously written a notice which will duly appear in the Cricket Field of July', and asks if Christian can send copies to the editor of 'Baily' and to E.V. Lucas of the Globe and others. Signed 'A.J. Gaston'. Small nick to one edge, otherwise good £80/120
- 107 Edgar Grace, grandson of W.G. Grace. Single page handwritten letter in ink from Edgar Grace dated 16th April 1953. Writing to G.N. Weston from the Admiralty Observatory in Slough, Grace is replying to Weston's enquiry about records of W.G. Grace's scores, 'To the best of my knowledge my father kept no record of W.G.'s scores and I never saw any when staying with my grandparents' and suggests 'wading through old newspapers and local ones at that or corresponding with likely cricket grounds'. - 108 W.G. Grace. An interesting two page handwritten letter in ink from Grace to an unknown correspondent, on Royal Albion Hotel, Brighton, letterhead. 'Mr Arrowsmith the publisher has not behaved very well in the matter as he has used a lot of blocks [images] that are in my book 'Cricket' and has never asked my leave etc. I do not think very much of it, and should not like to offend an old cricketer like Daft'. The letter dated 'Tuesday' which corresponds with 23rd May 1893 when Grace was playing for Gloucestershire against Sussex. Nicely signed 'W.G. Grace'. G/VG £140/180
- 109 George Rostrevor Hamilton, poet and critic. Two page handwritten letter in ink dated 13th February 1944 from Hamilton to John Arlott, co-authors of 'Landmarks: a book of topographical verse for England and Wales', published by Cambridge University Press in 1943. Regarding sales, Hamilton reports that '3637 copies had gone (including review and presentation copies), the January sales being 816. Quite satisfactory, I think'. He comments on having seen a poem of Arlott's in The Observer, 'though I have been rude to you about it, and I don't think it up to your best', questions when Sackville-West will broadcast Arlott, and closes with his struggle writing two odes. - 110 Thomas Atkinson Higson. Oxford University, Derbyshire & Lancashire 1892-1923. Single page typed letter on Swire & Higson, Solicitors, Manchester letterhead, dated 6th September 1937. Writing to a George Brooking at his address at 'Cricketana' in Wallasey, Higson gives his thoughts on some players recommended to him by Brooking, Higson at the time being Chairman of Lancashire C.C.C. He also reports that his son, Peter (Lancashire 3 matches, 1928-1931), has retired from cricket 'as he is too busy at the moment'. Signed in ink 'T.A. Higson'. G/VG £50/70
- 111 John Berry 'Jack' Hobbs. Surrey & England 1905-1934. Single page handwritten letter in ink from Hobbs dated 9th November 1928. Writing to a Mr Holmes from Warrnambool in Victoria, Australia while on tour with M.C.C., Hobbs states, 'I was greatly interested in the statistics, for "Wisdens" [sic] says I needed 2 runs to complete the 50,000 when I came out here while my friends say I needed 78 when I went to the wicket in the last match at the Oval, when I scored 150' and asks Holmes to provide a complete list when he returns. Signed 'J.B. Hobbs'. The letter in poor condition having become split at the folds, with old tape repairs to verso with show through. Text otherwise complete £40/60
- According to cricketarchive.com, Hobbs reached the landmark of 50,000 first-class runs in the second innings of the tour match against South Australia at Adelaide, 26th-30th October 1928*
- 112 W.T. Hodder, book collector. Two handwritten letters from Hodder to E.B.V. Christian relating to the sale of books from Hodder's collection. In the first letter (undated), which spans four pages, Hodder thanks Christian for a cheque for £3 for books. 'Formerly they belonged to G.F. Parr Esq who in the early history of the game played for "England", the "Gentlemen" & M.C.C.; he made-for those days- some splendid scores, notably for the last named club. At mid-wicket, too, he was also the finest "field" of his day'. He describes the scarcity of good 'cricket literature and collecting is still on the increase', but that he is prepared to sell his duplicates including early Wisdens, red and green Lillywhites etc, and will provide Christian a list. The second, single page, letter is dated 11th February 1893, and accompanied three books. He describes the 'trouble & anxiety' that he has endured having had requests from all parts of the country. 'In acquiring "Bolland" and "Thomsonby" you are getting two of the now choicest gems of a cricketer's library'. He closes by congratulating Christian on his 'facetious "Rules for Captains of 2 XI's"', an article which appeared in 'Cricket'. Both letters signed 'W.T.

- Hodder'. G/VG £40/60
- 113 Alexander Frederick Douglas-Home (Lord Home of the Hirsell). Middlesex & Oxford University 1924-1926. Single page typed letter on House of Lords letterhead, dated 13th November 1981. Lord Home is replying to a request from J.D. Coldham for information about Lord Harris on whom Coldham is writing a book. Home recalls Harris standing 'very straight with his bat off the ground, and I remember that he played the ball very late. But that was probably because by then he had lost the power to drive, and had to be content to deflect'. He notes the hospitality of Lord and Lady Harris and how '[Harris] was a stickler for the rules of the game'. Signed in ink 'Home'. G/VG £40/60
Lord Home served as Prime Minister in 1963 and 1964
- 114 John Thomas Ikin. Lancashire & England 1939-1957. Single page typed letter from Ikin writing from Stoke-on-Trent, dated 27th January 1953, replying to an invitation from a Mr. Higson to play in a 'match for Sidney Barnes. There is one "snag" at the moment. The Lancashire Committee do not permit the players to take part in Sunday matches, I will approach the Secretary for permission'. Signed in ink 'John Ikin'. File holes to one edge. Sold with a single page handwritten note from C.D. Hassell, secretary of Lancashire C.C.C. replying to a request for players' photographs. Qty 2. G £40/60
Ikin was successful in his request to play in Barnes' testimonial match played at Stafford on the 26th April 1953
- 115 Andrew Lang. Scottish poet and writer. A twelve line poem written in ink in Lang's own hand on one page. The subject is the month of May and the promise of a summer of cricket. Handwritten annotation in pencil by John Arlott to the top right corner, 'Andrew Lang (1844-1912) Writer'. A rare item, this poem does not appear to have been in any of his published collections. Nicely signed 'Andrew Lang'. Light vertical folds, otherwise in very good condition £80/120
- 116 E.V. Lucas. Cricket essayist and writer. Two essays on the subject of Lord Charles J.F. Russell and his book, 'Recollections of Cricket', one comprising five pages handwritten in ink in Lucas's distinctive style, the other six typed pages with annotations in ink by Lucas. In the typescript, titled 'A Bargain', Lucas recollects his 'staggering shock' in finding a copy of Russell's book, of which only twelve copies were published, 'in a forgotten packing case' for which he had originally paid 'a few shillings' but which now, is worth five pounds'. An undated reply (probably early November 1964), from and nicely signed in ink by Sutcliffe, relates to Sutcliffe's own clarifications and corrections to the typescript which he describes as 'really magnificent... no words of mine could adequately thank you for your wonderful tributes' and his belief that 'I do not think you will have any difficulty in finding a publisher', also Sutcliffe's request for a royalty. On 13th November 1964, Savage writes again explaining this is his 'first venture in preparing a book and I am an untried writer'. There then follows a series of letters sent in 1965 submitting the book to numerous prospective publishers and subsequent letters of rejection. In a letter to Sutcliffe dated 5th July 1965

- Savage lists the publishers to whom he has submitted manuscripts, and expresses his concern that the book will not get published. It would appear that the book never was published, there being no record of it or any other by Savage in Padwick. G/VG £70/100

- 178 Percy Holmes. Yorkshire & England 1913-1933. S.B. Joel's Tour to South Africa 1924/25. A unique personal collection of twenty one mono (one colour) postcards, a good number real photographs, sent by Holmes to his wife, Edith, daughter, Mollie, and son, Sidney, while on tour in South Africa. Holmes' correspondence relates primarily to places at which he stayed, sites visited and travelling, with the occasional mention of cricket! The majority of postcards are dated, and so the course of the tour can be traced. The first examples date from 19th November 1924 and were sent from Pietermaritzburg where they played Natal. He then sent a card from Kimberley on 1st December, wishing his family a merry Christmas. On to Bulawayo where they played against Rhodesia, 5th-8th December. Holmes describes seeing wild animals, 'If you go out in the car at night, shut off the lights and wait, you see the eyes of the jaquaul [sic] like balls of fire'. From Bulawayo they move to Johannesburg for matches against Transvaal and the first 'Test', played over Christmas. Holmes did not play in the match, which South Africa won by nine wickets, due to illness, and mentions in a postcard dated 27th December, the day after the match was completed, that 'I am fed up now'. On arriving in Durban on 31st December for the second Test, Percy is 'Quite well now' and has enjoyed the scenery on a very hot eighteen hour train journey. Holmes made his highest score of the tour in the second innings, helping the team to a 48 run victory. The following three postcards are dated 12th January

1925, just after the match against Northern Districts played at Bethlehem, 'not where Christ was born... a sweet little place. Just fancy coming as far to play cricket in a village. Lovely climate'. The following two days, 13th and 14th January, he writes from Muizenberg, Cape Town. Holmes mentions practice for the third Test which Joel's XI went on to win by ten wickets. By 21st January he has reached Worcester, 'One more match finished, only 5 more and then home. Leave here tonight for Mossel Bay... I am standing down for this match [against County Districts]'. On 22nd January, in Mossel Bay, Holmes describes members of the party going sea fishing, 'but not me. I have just been killing the live stock on my bed'. Sunday 1st February finds Holmes in Port Elizabeth, and by the 18th, with one match to go, Holmes is planning his return, suggesting Edith meets him in London. In the final postcard, to Mollie, dated 28th February, Holmes writes, 'I hope you have not forgot Dad will be home soon' and signs himself 'Dear Wada'. Odd faults, overall in good/ very good condition £400/600

The strong England 'second team' left England on the 'Edinburgh Castle' on 24th October 1924. Holmes played in thirteen matches on the tour, scoring 536 runs at an average of 28.21. The 'Test' series was drawn 2-2 with one match drawn

Although Blythe suffered from epilepsy he freely volunteered for the Kings Own Yorkshire Light Infantry in 1914 and served with distinction on the Western Front. Blythe was killed in action by 'random shellfire' during the battle of Passchendaele, Belgium in November 1917*

Charles Philip Mead (*Hampshire and England 1905-1936*) died on 31st March 1958. He played seventeen times for England and in 1921 scored 182 not out against Australia at The Oval, which was then the highest Test score by an Englishman in a Test against Australia in England

452 'The Mystery of Cricket'. John Arlott 1949. Original twenty three page typescript written by Arlott and Edward Livesey with contributions by S.F. Barnes, W.E. Bowes, Len Hutton, Victor Jackson, C.J. Kortright and J.E. Walsh, and presented by Arlott. The introduction on the first page reads, 'A programme which asks the question- but will certainly not find the answer- "What is the peculiar fascination if this game to so many different types of people?"'. The programme was originally broadcast on the B.B.C. Midland Home Service on 23rd May 1949 and comprises quotations by cricketers and writers including E.V. Lucas and C.B. Fry, poetry by Thomas Moulton, transcripts of recorded interviews with S.F. Barnes, Jack Walsh, Len Hutton, Charles Kortright, Bill Bowes etc. Includes a good description of Alletson's famous innings batting for Nottinghamshire against Sussex at Hove in which he scored 139 runs in half an hour, humorous excuses for batsmen getting out, dropping catches etc. Bill Bowes gives an interesting insight into his early career with Yorkshire and getting his County Cap, 'I remember Emmett [sic] Robinson coming to me... He told me that I had to get a book, and in this book I'd got to write down the name of every batsman that I ever met... how he got out and where; who was the bowler, what were his best shots, what were his weak shots... the state of the wicket... Cricket in Yorkshire means serious cricket'. A fascinating and entertaining discussion on the significance of the game of cricket at all levels. Ex John Arlott collection. G/VG £100/150

453 'The Don. Sir Donald Bradman talks to John Arlott'. A fourteen page typescript of a radio interview recorded on 15th June and 3rd July 1961 in which Bradman 'talks about the game as he remembers playing it, and as he sees it today'. Subjects covered include the way the game

had changed in the years since Bradman's retirement, the differences between English and Australian cricket, 'conditions in England... breed bowlers who are very accurate... In fielding, I believe Australians generally speaking, are more alive and active and are better throwers. In batting, I'm always struck by the fact that Englishmen are more technically correct... probably because they receive a greater degree of coaching. Our players, in the main, develop naturally... [with] somewhat unorthodox styles'. Bradman recollects his experience of the 'Bodyline' bowling in the infamous 1932/33 Ashes series. 'The difference between the bumpers today and the body line of 1932/33 is simply this. Today you may get two an over. In 1932 you might get five or six. Today you may have two men behind square leg, in 1932 you might have five... It is a legitimate weapon of attack by a fast bowler. But like medicine it may be good in small doses. Take too much and it can kill you'. Other subjects covered include the popularity of the game with the paying public, the cost of running the game, encouraging playing conditions to encourage good, entertaining batting, the greater use of fast bowlers over spinners, who was the greatest batsman and bowler, covered wickets, coaching etc. An excellent insight into the thoughts and opinions of one of the great cricket icons. 454 'Sir Jack Hobbs talks to John Arlott on the occasion of his eightieth birthday'. Twenty four page original typescript for a radio interview recorded on 16th December 1962, with contributions from Clarrie Grimmett, Wilfred Rhodes, Herbert Sutcliffe, Andrew Sandham, Sydney Barnes, Arthur Mailey, George Duckworth etc. Arlott opens by listing Hobbs' major achievements, 61,221 total runs, 197 centuries, the two highest opening stands for England against Australia with Wilfred Rhodes and Herbert Sutcliffe etc. Hobbs describes his younger days, meeting Tom Hayward at Cambridge, and his early days at Surrey living in lodgings near the Oval. Hobbs recalls his debut in first-

class cricket in 1905, playing for Surrey against the Gentlemen of England, captained by W.G. Grace in which Hobbs scored 18 and 88, the top score in the match. Regarding his batting technique Hobbs explains that he was never coached, 'I was just a natural'. Grimmett recalls the first time he bowled against Hobbs, playing for Victoria on the 1920/21 M.C.C. tour to Australia, in which Grimmett split his finger attempting to take a catch off a Hobbs drive, 'I shall always remember his masterly display of wet wicket technique'. Regarding passing Grace's record of 126 centuries, Hobbs remembers his struggle in attaining the feat, 'it got rather worrying... I got a little bit edgy'. Hobbs describes his great opening partners, Hayward, Rhodes, Sandham and Sutcliffe who described Hobbs' skill as a 'technical masterpiece' and remembers him scoring a century at the Oval in 1926 against Australia on 'a real gluepot... his best [century] ever'. Hobbs describes the Australian, Sydney Barnes, as one of his greatest opponents, who 'hated batsmen', also Tibby Cotter, who was 'very fast indeed... [the ball] went by you just like a flash of lightning', also Johnny Douglas, Maurice Tate, and Arthur Mailey who 'spun the ball very much indeed'. In his last first-class season in 1934, aged 51, Hobbs was asked by George Duckworth to play in Duckworth's benefit match at Old Trafford. Hobbs scored 116 and 51 not out, the only century scored against Lancashire at Old Trafford in the year Lancashire won the County Championship. Hobbs closes by saying that 'it's been a lovely life, this professional cricket business, I've enjoyed it to the full'. An excellent account of the great batsman's personal memories. **ITEMS FROM THE DESCENDENTS OF
GEORGE MURRAY ROYLE
(NOTTINGHAMSHIRE 1871-1881)**

George Royle was a highly respected and admired cricketer, named by Richard Daft in his book 'Kings of Cricket' as one of the best amateurs at the time to play for Nottinghamshire. However his first-class career was restricted by his work commitments as a director of Thomas Adams & Co., one of the two largest companies in the textile trade. Nottingham was renowned for its lace industry, Thomas Adams being a renowned philanthropist who was pioneering in ensuring the welfare of his workforce through the provision of schools, libraries, hospitals and churches.

- 587 George Murray Royle. Nottinghamshire 1871-1881 (three matches). Two very early original scrapbook albums compiled by Royle, one titled 'C.C.C. From 1864', the other 'C.C.C. Scores from 1874'. 'C.C.C.' refers to the Nottinghamshire Commercial Cricket Club who played their home matches at Trent Bridge. The albums comprise press cuttings with Royle's own scores and references to Royle in match reports underlined by him in red ink, also handwritten scorecards and summaries of Royle's own batting performances and averages each year recorded in his own neat hand. The albums also provide a comprehensive record of first-class and club cricket for the period. Prominent Nottinghamshire players who appeared with Royle include Richard Daft, Alfred Shaw, notable for being the player who bowled the first ball in Test cricket, and George Summers, known for having died aged only 25 after being hit on the head while playing for Nottinghamshire against M.C.C. at Lord's. Opposition teams featured include prominent clubs of the area such as Newark, Leicester Town, Loughborough, Derby Town,

Grantham etc and further afield, and features regular fixtures between teams from the textile industry, Lace XI v Hosiery XI, English v Foreign Lace Houses etc. The earliest report is for two matches played in the Bois de Boulogne, Paris, in 1864, Sir Robert Clifton's Eleven Amateurs v Paris (the Paris team made up entirely of Englishmen!), both resulting in victories by an innings for Clifton's team, Royle scoring nought in the first match and 43 in the second. The most significant match of the 1868 season was the visit of the Australian Aborigines who played the Nottingham Commercial Club at Trent Bridge, 3rd-5th August 1868. Royle opened the innings for Nottingham, scoring 10 out of a total of 91, in reply the Australians made 76. In the second innings, batting at number seven, Royle made 100 not out 'in a really grand manner' out of a total of 372, the match ending in a draw. Included are reports of Royle's first two of the three first-class matches he played for Nottinghamshire. His debut was v Gloucestershire in 1871 in which Royle scored 45 in the first innings in a ten wicket victory against the bowling of the three Grace brothers, W.G., E.M. and G.F., in which Royle's potential is described as 'of great service in the cricket field'. His second match v Surrey in 1871 was less successful (2 and 0). To the rear of the earlier album is a comprehensive collection of cuttings relating to County and representative cricket for the period, also a report of the arrival of the Australian Aborigines in 1868, and the Australians' tour match against Nottinghamshire in 1882. A fascinating personal record of early Nottinghamshire club and county cricket and social history in general. Foxing and age toning, otherwise in good condition £400/600

Matches against the Australian Aboriginal team, playing under pseudonyms such as Dick-a-dick, Jimmy Mosquito, Cuzens, Red Cap, Twopenny etc, were notable not only for their cricketing skills, but also for their exhibitions of spear and boomerang throwing and other sports which drew much interest and entertainment

588 George Murray Royle. Nottinghamshire 1871-1881 (three matches). Cricket ball with gilt inscription, 'This is the ball that was first used in international matches in Paris 1864'. The ball blackened with age, gilt inscription fading but legible, otherwise in good condition £250/350

A team of amateurs from Nottingham, promoted by Sir Robert Clifton, a member of parliament for Nottingham, played two matches in the Bois de Boulogne, Paris, in 1864. Designed to improve the 'entente cordiale' between England and France, the Paris team was actually made up of players with English names, some titled. Clifton's team won both matches convincingly, Royle scoring nought in the first match and 43 in the second

589 George Murray Royle. Nottinghamshire 1871-1881 (three matches). Cricket ball with gilt inscription, 'Presented to G.M. Royle for getting [the] highest score 144 runs not out, Lace v Hosiery, July 6th 1878'. VG £100/150

The match ended in a draw with the Lace eleven scoring 316. Hosiery made 15 for 1 when time was called. Nottingham was renowned for its lace industry and frequent matches were played between the Lace XI and the Hosiery XI, Royle being a regular member of the Lace XI. Royle played only three first-class matches, his appearances restricted by his work commitments as a director of Thomas Adams & Co., one of the two largest companies in the Nottingham textile industry

He played in the Australian Services XI in the Victory Tests alongside Keith Miller, Hassett, Sismey, Stanford, Whittington etc but was never picked for the full Australian Test side, many say, following an argument with Don Bradman, Garry Sobers, who played against him in league cricket, said of Pepper that 'the reason why he never played county cricket was probably because of his overripe language'. He therefore came over to England playing league cricket for Rochdale for three seasons and for Burnley for five seasons*
