- 'Grand Football Match!. County Cricketers and League Footballers versus George Robey's League Team on Manchester City Ground'. Official programme for the match played at the Hyde Road Football Stadium, (Manchester City moved to Maine Road in 1923), on the 24th February 1902. The match was organised 'in aid of a memorial to the late John Briggs and Benefit of Mrs Briggs & Children'. The referee was Albert Neilson Hornby (Lancashire C.C.C. & **England** 1867-1899). **Players** appearing in the match for Robey's team included Billy Meredith, Orr, Hynds of Manchester City, Foulkes of Sheffield United, G. Robey of Royal Ramblers, Jack of Preston, Gates of Blackburn, Athersmith of Aston Villa etc and for the County Cricketers team, J.Sharp, B. Sharp, Booth of Everton, Pennington of Notts County, Higson of Casuals, Warren of Ferby County, Ross of Manchester City, Hollins of Corinthians etc. Image of Chairman J.E. Chapman, Manchester City to the centre of the front cover, pictures of Johnny Briggs and George Robey to inside pages. The linesman were also cricketers Albert Ward of Lancashire & England and Sam Hargreave of Warwickshire. Adverts for 'Pilling & Briggs, Athletic Outfitters', 'George Robey in Jack and the Beanstalk' and advance notice of the publication of 'The Life of John Briggs' by Herbert Turner to rear cover. - 2 'Royal Brighton Cricket Ground, A Grand Match of Cricket will be played on the above ground for 100 sovereigns, on Monday, August the 27th 1827 between the Midhurst Club, and western part of the county against Brighton Club and eastern part of the county'. Original and early handbill for the match played at the Royal Brighton Cricket Ground, by Creasy and Baker, Printers, Brighton. The handbill measures 8"x 13.5". Some wear and staining to the handbill extremities otherwise in good condition for its age. A rare

The match is classed as West Sussex v East Sussex. Est Sussex won by 33 runs. Some prominent players played in the match including Fred Lillywhite, W. Slater, H. Tamplin, G. Brown, C. Lanaway, J. Broadbridge, W. Hooker etc. All of which played for Sussex

Albums cover the periods 1905-1912 including school cricket and his debut for Surrey in 1911. 1913/14 at Oxford University, his first century for Surrey, one of Wisden's 'Five Cricketers of the Year'. 1919-1924, two Test matches in 1921. 1924-1939 including loosely inserted items including a twelve page handwritten manuscript on Batsmanship for 'The Cricketer', signed by Knight, a 25pp typescript for an instructional cricket film signed Knight with additional handwritten addenda. 1919-1921 with cuttings relating to Knight, collected by M.M.R. Knight. 1920-1930 photograph album with handwritten title to first page, 'Westminster School Cricket and Football Elevens 1920-1930' signed by Knight, comprising twenty original

Knight's cricket career was interrupted by the First World War and then by his career as a teacher, leaving first-class cricket in 1927, returning for the 1937 season. He played in two Test matches in the Ashes series against Australia in 1921

How I Did It', The Sun and 'Hail King Lillee', The Sun (different), and 'Lillee Bowls into History', Geelong Advertiser, all three dated 28th December 1981. Also 'Dennis Lillee Triumphs'. Australia went on to win the match by 58 runs, Lillee taking ten wickets in the match 16

15 John Arlott. England v India 1971. Three original typed manuscripts written by Arlott for articles for The Guardian newspaper. The reports cover the first Test, England v India, Lord's, 22nd-27th July 1971, with articles for each of the first, fourth

and fifth day's play. In the first day's article Arlott opens by comparing 'India's highly organised and skilfully applied spin bowling' with 'England's dogged determination and professional improvisation'. Having lost the first five wickets for 71, England managed to raise the score to 252 for 8 by the close of play, including a not out fifty by John Snow. He describes the pitch as 'honest, hard, but of no great pace'. At the end of day four, England were 145 for 5 in their second innings, only 136 runs ahead, with India finding themselves 'never before... so strongly positioned in a Test match on an England ground. Only the loss of nearly five hours play to rain over the previous two days seems likely to prevent a definite result' and doesn't expect a repeat of England's rearguard effort as in the first innings. Further showers prevented England began their innings until mid-afternoon. The match ended in a draw after further rain after tea on the last day with India 38 runs short of their first Test victory in England. Arlott closes his last report highlighting 'the shift of power in world cricket' and the English selectors' decisions about selection for the following summer's Ashes series, 'this is the time for experiment', and looks forward to the next Test at Old Trafford where India 'could yet deservedly win the rubber'. Handwritten alterations and deletions in Arlott's hand. G

Off the back of their first series win (against West Indies) India managed their first Test and series victory in England when they won by four wickets in the third and final Test at The Oval, the first two rain affected matches being drawn

John Arlott. England v Pakistan, Lord's 1971. Three original typed manuscripts written by Arlott for articles for The Guardian newspaper, covering the second Test, England v Pakistan, Lord's, 8th-13th August 1971, with articles for each of the first, fourth and fifth days' play. Only 41 overs play was possible on the first day. 'Boycott and Luckhurst gave England a secure start of 118 for no wicket... Heavy overnight rain and morning showers made the square treacherously muddy'. Play did not

begin until mid-afternoon. By day four the match was progressing 'steadily towards a draw... after the equivalent of three days' play [was] lost to rain' including a washed out day three. England declared at 241 for two (Boycott 121no), Pakistan ended the day '202 [actually 192]' runs behind in their first innings. Arlott closes with the prediction that only those who believe in chauvinistic miracles can dream of either side winning'. The final day 'plagued by and more than halved by rain, went down to the inevitable draw... with dignity and mild technical interest despite the complete hopelessness of a clear decision'. Richard Hutton made his Test debut in this match, on the same ground where his father, Len, 'began his illustrious Test career with innings of nought and one... 34 years ago'. Richard Hutton scored 58no in England's second innings. Handwritten alterations and deletions in Arlott's hand. G £140/180

England won the series 1-0 with two matches drawn

John Arlott. Australia tour to England 1972. Three original typed manuscripts written by Arlott for articles for The Guardian newspaper. The first report, written prior to the start of the Ashes series, relates to the appointment of Illingworth, aged forty, as captain for the first two Tests. Arlott comments on the fact that, with Illingworth in the side, 'there is no place for any other offspinner, such as Pocock' and the selectors wanting to be 'convinced of [Illingworth's] willingness to bowlwhich has not always been certain... and will want renewed confirmation of his batting ability', and considers Tony Greig as a suitable alternative for the all-rounder position. The other two articles report on the second and third day's play in the match M.C.C. v Australians, Lord's 20th-23rd May 1972. Arlott comments on an 'absorbing if slow-going day' with Alan Ward making 'a convincingly powerful effort to retain his Test place' taking three wickets including that of Ian Chappell first ball. Other highlights of the day included five wickets for Ashley Mallett. The final report covers the final day which resulted in an unlikely win for Australia 'by four [sic] wickets with three balls to spare. Chappell had declared early in the morning 'thirteen runs behind on the first innings, [and] proposed a finish Illingworth reciprocated only cautiously but the Australians-especially their captain- responded with such elan that the previously slow, grinding match was transformed'. John Arlott. England v Australia, Lord's 1972. 'Massies match'. Three original typed manuscripts written by Arlott for articles for The Guardian newspaper. The reports cover the first Test, England v India, Lord's, 22nd-27th July 1971, with articles for each of the first, second and fourth (final) day's play. The first day's play ended with England 249 for seven. 'The fast bowling of Lillee and the medium paced swing of Massie gave Australia the initiative in the second Test Match. Massie in his frist Test match took five for 75... Greig, with top score, handsomely made, again increased his standing as a Test player'. Rain had delayed the start by an hour and 'The pallid looking pitch was true with little pace or life, but the new ball swung sharply under the morning cloud'. Having bowled long spells, and with England at 200 for seven, 'the English innings looked ripe for destruction but Massie and Lillee simply had not enough energy to carry it out'. By the end of the second day, Australia had reached 201 for five including a 'composed and faultless century by Greg Chappell' to put them in a strong position only 71 runs behind England who had been bowled out earlier for 272, with Massie ending with 'outstanding' figures of eight for 84, 'bowling with good control, and tactically astute variation'. The match ended on the fourth day 'when Australia beat England by eight wickets' to level the series, 'already more exhilirating [sic] than any for more than a decade' at 1-1. 'Australia did not merely deserve to win; they won positively'. Arlott describes Greg Chappell's 'authority', and Ian Chappell and Rod Marsh's 'gusto' and 'no English bowler had such an unsettling effect as Lillee or beat the

stroke more often than Massie' who took another eight wickets in the second innings. 'Only two bowlers-Laker, 19, and S.F. Barnes, 17- have ever taken as many wickets in a Test as Massie's 16'. Handwritten alterations and deletions in Arlott's hand. G

Bob Massie finished with match figures of 16-137 in his famous debut Test match. The 1972 series was drawn 2-2, England retaining the Ashes

John Arlott. New Zealand tour to England 1973. Two original typed manuscripts written by Arlott for articles for The Guardian newspaper reporting on the 'rain harried match', M.C.C. v New Zealand, Lord's, 19th-22nd May 1973. The articles relate to the second and third days' play. 'There was only- but tidily- two hours play... at Lord's yesterday. In that time Turner continued his innings to 153 not out, his aggregate for the season to 796- only 204 short of the thousand before the end of Mav which many had said would never by done again'. Starting the day 232 runs behind, 'M.C.C. batted with little to aim for but, if this match is of little importance in terms of result, is can have other significances'. In particular, Arlott refers to Amiss batting 'with something of the authority he had shown only in county cricket in this country... he needed only to convince himself of his ability to convince others'. Rain at lunch curtailed play for the day. The match reached its 'inevitable draw' on the third and final day. Arlott describes the fixture as 'traditionally important' but 'declining [in] importance' and having 'an unhappy record of bad weather'. Sold with a short typed article by Arlott prior to the first Test v West Indies at The Oval in 1973, two official scorecards for Hampshire v India, 17th-20th July 1971, one with scores and notes in Arlott's hand, and a page of handwritten scores at different stages of play in the match Yorkshire v Lancashire, Headingley 1972 etc. Handwritten alterations and deletions in Arlott's hand. John Arlott. England v New Zealand, Trent Bridge 1973. Three original typed manuscripts written by Arlott

for articles for The Guardian newspaper, covering the first Test, England v New Zealand, Trent Bridge, 7th-12th June 1973, with articles for each of the first, third and fourth day's play. Arlott reports on England starting their first innings 'with the due dignity and solidity required... and ended rustling for runs in a fashion which would have done no credit to the county Championship'. England reached 92 before the fall of the first wicket, 'only to slither down to 191 for nine, and yet... to cling on to 216 for nine at the close of play'. He describes the 'ten thousand spectators, a high unblinking sun and [the] best scorecard in Britain replaced- for labour-economy reasons - by the second best'. On the third day, England bowled out New Zealand for 97 and a 'partnership of 210 between Amiss [138] and Greig [139] enabled Illingworth to pick his time to declare at 325 for 8'. By the close, New Zealand had lost two wickets and required a further 423 runs to win. Arlott admires Greig as 'a valuable all rounder' and as 'a cricketer of several appreciable gifts, [with] ideal Test match temperament and calculatedly competitive urge'. Day four saw New Zealand rising 'to the greatest height they have ever achieved against England... At 130 for four the probability [of defeat] verged on certainty; only for Congdon and Pollard, in a New Zealand record fifth wicket stand of 177, to lift them within sight of a historic win'. Congdon scored 176, with New Zealand losing only three wickets in the day which ended with them on 317 for five, requiring 162 to win on the final day. England won the Test match on the last day by 38 runs with Vic Pollard scoring 117 for New Zealand. Tony Lewis, Graham Roope (England), Richard Hadlee and John Parker (New Zealand) made their first appearances in Test matches in England in this match. England won the series 2-0 with one match drawn

Denis Charles Scott Compton. Middlesex & England 1936-1958. Three pages of a handwritten article written by Compton in his role as a journalist with a further page of

notes, four pages in total. Compton is reporting on the third day's play in the second Test v New Zealand at Lord's, 23rd June 1973, of which he writes 'New Zealand boobed badly here at Lord's vesterday for allowing the England bowlers to contain them so much in conditions perfect for batsmen'. Having bowled out England for 253, New Zealand resumed their first innings at the start of day three on 200/3, 'the password should have been Attack, Attack & more attack' but could only muster seventy runs in the morning session. New Zealand were looking for their first Test victory against England in the 44th Test between the two countries, this being 'their greatest chance. They should have scored enough runs to have declared around 5.45 last night'. Ultimately the match was drawn. G/VG

John Arlott. England v India 1974. Four original typed manuscripts written by Arlott for articles for The Guardian newspaper. The reports cover the second Test. England v India, Lord's, 20th-24th June 1974, with articles for each of the four days' play. In the first day's article Arlott describes England having reached 334/1 and the dry conditions following an 'abnormally dry winter and spring', David Lloyd making his Test debut, 'Edrich with renewed hunger for runs', the Indian bowlers appearing to 'lose heart', Amiss 'hitting... with controlled force'. By the end of day two, 'England [had] created themselves an impregnable position' with India 578 runs behind, England having ended their innings on 629 (Amiss 188, Denness 118, Greig 106), Bedi taking six wickets for 226 runs. 'the heaviest ever suffered by a bowler in a Lord's Test'. He describes 'a massacre of bowlers... it was less than a fair contest'. By the close of the third day, India, having been bowled out for 302 were following on, 'still 325 behind', and on the fourth day, 'In a little more than an hour... Arnold and Old destroyed the Indian batting' bowling out India for 42 to win by an innings and 285 runs, Old ending with figures of 5/21 and Arnold 4/19. Handwritten alterations and deletions in Arlott's hand. G £150/200

- 27 Rushey Green C.C., Kent. Five folding fixture cards for seasons 1890-1894, and Catford Cricket Club 1895, and 1896, also undated folding rule cards for both clubs. Sold with a flyer for a Rushey Green C.C. 'Programme of Entertainment' 13th December 1894, and part of a Club

publication describing the formation of the Club 'four years ago' with averages for the 1893 season, featuring the Hearne brothers Alec (top of the batting averages) and George Gibbons (third). Both laid down to card. G £50/80

Alec and George Hearne both made one appearance for England in the Test match against South Africa, Cape Town, 19th-22nd March 1892. Their brother Jack also played for England in that match, and another, Frank, played for South Africa having emigrated for health reasons in 1889

Original decorative card covers. This was Allen's copy, his name, 'G.O. Allen' written in ink to first page, and copius notes in pencil of social engagements, meetings, matches etc. throughout. The first entry is for 24th May 1937, prior to that Allen had been captaining M.C.C. in the 1936/37 tour to Australia. Cricket related entries include M.C.C. committee meetings, and a number of matches including the only four first-class matches in which he played in 1937, 26th May M.C.C. Australian Team v The Rest at Lord's, 23rd & 24th August Middlesex v Kent at Lord's 28th, 30th

John 'Jack' Ryder. Victoria & Australia 1912-1932. Official menu given by 'Canon E.S. Hughes, Vice President of the Victorian Cricket Association for Jack Ryder's Testimonial' held at the Members Pavilion, Melbourne Cricket Ground on the 20th December 1930. Colour caricature to front cover, by Samuel Wells, showing Canon Hughes holding a bag of 'Golden Grain' (Testimonial proceeds?), with some in his hand, with Ryder depicted as a padded up bird swooping down from a tree. The menu with toast list and coloured ribbon tie. Splitting to spine of menu otherwise in good/very good condition. Rare £50/70

Ryder was about to finish his first class career, having played for Victoria for twenty years, he captained Australia in five of his twenty Tests

31 England v Australia 1905. Official match ticket for the Monday (first day) of the fourth Test, Old Trafford, 24th-26th July 1905. The small plain ticket admits the holder to the 'Pavilion Side'. Sold with five postcards including two similar aerial view postcards, one in colour, the other mono, of England playing Australia at the Adelaide Oval on the 1907/08 tour. 105 Don Bradman. A fascinating collection of correspondence between Bradman and Christopher Martin-Jenkins, then editor of 'The Cricketer' magazine relating to shortpitch bowling. The first letter is a response to an editorial in the October 1984 issue of 'The Cricketer', written by Christopher Martin-Jenkins, in which the subject of intimidatory short pitched bowling was raised, including the possible

introduction of measures such as increasing the length of the pitch, painting a line on the pitch, restricting the bowler's run up to ten yards, or a change in the law such that a batsman is not out caught if the ball had struck the glove or bat handle. Bradman responds to these ideas in a single page typed letter dated 3rd October 1984 to Martin-Jenkins, having read the article 'with interest... astonishment'. Bradman acknowledges the need to remove 'intimidation as a tactic' but lays the blame with umpires 'unwilling to exercise a moral judgement'. His view on the abolition of batsmen being out off the glove 'is an illogical and stupid way of trying to solve [the issue]', and that the idea of lengthening the pitch 'would be equally absurd, penalising batsmen of all types'. Bradman concludes by questioning whether the LBW law is adequate for spinners. 'Don't support remedies which don't make sense... I believe you are on the wrong track'. Signed 'Don'. In Martin-Jenkins' typed copy reply, dated 11th October 1984, he quotes statistical evidence supporting the concept of lengthening the pitch in proportion to the growing height of bowlers over time and increased speed through 'modern nutrition and physical training methods'. Bradman replies on the 30th October with a lengthy three page typed letter reiterating his views in strong terms on 'the foolishness of the "not out caught" idea' and that lengthening the pitch would be unfair to slow and medium paced bowlers. He uses colourful language such as 'utter fallacy', 'arrant rubbish', and is 'totally unmoved by your argument', refuting the view that modern bowlers are 'fitter, stronger and faster' and provides lengthy anecdotal evidence. He closes with a request that his views are not to be published but is happy for this letter to be shown to Jim Swanton 'and would be interested to know his reaction'. Signed 'Don'. In Martin-Jenkins' reply of 8th November he acknowledges that the change to catches off the glove 'would not be a good thing', but does not accept all of Bradman's arguments about fast bowlers, and further supports the introduction of a line across the pitch. On 28th November Bradman

suggests the introduction into Test matches of a wide off a short ball, as was already the case in limited over cricket, but suggests that the 'stumbling block would be the West Indies... because they would regard "anything" as a move to blunt their fire power. Signed 'Don'. Later correspondence in 1992 relates to Bradman's agreement to the 'return to the back foot for judging a noball', and readdresses the subject of lengthening the distance between the two creases, and the supposed increase of the average height of players over time. He provides interesting evidence from a book written by W.G. Grace in 1891 in which Grace quoted the height and weight of players of his era, and lists numerous players over six foot in height, including Grace himself who was 6' at the age of sixteen. Finally, Martin-Jenkins responds on 23rd June 1992 by thanking Bradman for his trouble, but that this 'has not altered my view that it would be desirable to at least experiment with some matches played by first-class cricketers with the stumps set a foot further back at either end and with the old back foot [no-ball] law in operation'. Tree reports on the death of Somerset Chairman, Jack Wild, the election as President of Jeffrey Archer, and England's performances in Australia. Below this there is a larger advertisement with cricketing Monday, vignette 'On next, September 26, will be played a match of cricket at Lord's Ground, Mary-lebon, Kent with Harris and Beldam against 22 of Essex and Hertford. below it lists the two teams. On the Kent team players include Hon. E. Bligh, Pilcher, Fielder, Boxall, Harris, Beldam, Clifford etc. On a further page there is a report in the form of a letter dated 19th September, sent to the Kent Gazette with details of a match held at Lord's 'The grand match of cricket began this morning, between the Mary-le-bone club and the Brighton Club, Harvey Afton with the former and Lord Barrymore on the other. The Mary-le-bone went in first and were out at half past four. Phoenix got ninety-one notches off his own bat: his adversaries clumsily missed a couple of his balls, which were very easily to be caught; he was bowled out at last by the Painter, the ball passing through his legs and afterwards hitting the wicket. Harvey Afton got about three notches. It is five to one against the Brighton Club. The Mary-le-bone club, in the first innings got 196 notches. Phoenix is to play against the Painter, who is reckoned the best of the Brighton players at single wicket, for one hundred guineas. Captain Bligh likewise plays against the painter, one hundred and fifty guineas. Mrs Fitzherbert remained in the Prince's

Tent the whole day, and dined in it, with the Mary-le-Bone Club'. Unusual to get so much cricket coverage in one four page newspaper of the time. The newspaper has some slight age toning and folds otherwise in good to very good condition for its age. Rare item £100/150
