Schultz (Cambridge University, Lancashire & England 1876-1882). Others include F.E. Street (Kent 4 matches), C.E. Green (Middlesex 33 matches) etc
- 8 Australia 1948. '20th Australian XI Tour in Great Britain 1948'. Original players itinerary with title, lion and kangaroo shaking hands and Australian colours of gold and green to top right hand corner. Inner pages contain players names, travelling itinerary, match programme, official functions, names of secretaries, map of London etc. Odd annotations in ink to itinerary pages. AUTOGRAPHED CRICKET EPHEMERA

- 28 Thomas William Garrett. New South Wales & Australia 1876-1898. One page handwritten letter, dated 1st June 1939, the letter reads 'Dear Sir, Enclosed find photograph duly autographed. It is a pity it is such an old one. I have no recent ones available. Yours Sincerely T.W. Garrett'. Light folds otherwise in very good condition. A rare letter from a member of the first Australian touring party to England £500/800
Tom Garrett is listed as player/cap number four in the list of Australian Test players and played in nineteen Test matches for Australia and toured England on three occasions, 1878, 1882 and 1886. His most successful tour being the 1882 series where he took 118 wickets at 14.35 in first class matches. He played in the first Test match played in Melbourne, Australia in March 1877
- 29 Edward Mills Grace. Gloucestershire & England 1870-1895. Single page handwritten letter in ink from Grace to 'Mr Palmer', on Park House, Thornbury note paper, dated 22nd April 1898. Grace is enquiring as to whether Palmer is available to 'play in any of my matches'. Nicely signed by Grace. Foxing & horizontal folds, otherwise good condition £100/150

- 30 Herbert Sutcliffe. Yorkshire & England 1919-1945. Single page handwritten letter in ink dated 24th November 1933 on 'Herbert Sutcliffe Ltd' headed paper. Sutcliffe is writing to a lady (Mrs Storer?) to thank her for an invitation to stay for a visit he is making including a dinner to be given by Sir Home Gordon, and for 'my Lodge meeting on Monday... I have asked Arthur Gilligan to be one of my guests'. Nicely signed 'Herbert Sutcliffe'. Light folds, otherwise in very good condition £50/70
- 31 George Duckworth. Lancashire & England 1923-1938. Single page handwritten letter to 'Dear Fred' dated 18th July 1946. Writing from Moore Old Hall, Warrington, Duckworth lists the names of twenty players for a match to be played on 'July 31'. Names include C. Pepper, Constantine, Martindale, Achong, Hallows etc. No record of this match can be found. Nicely signed by Duckworth. ALLEN HILL. YORKSHIRE & ENGLAND 1871-1882

Allen Hill 1845-1910. Yorkshire & England 1871-1882. Hill played in the first ever cricket Test, taking the first wicket and the first catch in Test History in 1877. Hill began his career with Lascelles Hall and Kirkheaton clubs and in 1863 became professional at Dewsbury and Savile, but it was with Burnley when he first played for the county in 1871. He played 139 matches for Yorkshire between 1871 and 1882. His highest score for Yorkshire was 49 versus Middlesex at Bramall Lane, Sheffield in 1876. His best bowling was 7 for 14 against Surrey at Argyle Street, in Hull in 1879.

He toured with James Lillywhite's team to Australia in 1876-1877.

Allen Hill came out on the Melbourne Cricket Ground on 15th March 1877 as England became the first International Team to field and bowl. Hill bowled the second over of the Innings conceding the first run. In the fourth over he bowled Australian opening batsman, Nat Thomson to take the honour of being the first Test bowler to take a wicket and the first Test bowler to bowl a batsman. When Australia were 40 for 1 Australia's number three batsman Tom Horan mis-hit a delivery from Alfred Shaw and Allen Hill became the first international fielder to take a catch. He was also the first player to open the batting and the bowling in the same Test, opening in the second innings. He scored 35 no in the first innings and 0 in the second. He took 1-42 from twenty three overs in the first innings and 1-18 off fourteen overs in Australia's second innings. Australia won the Test by forty five runs, thanks mainly to Charles Bannerman scoring 165 in Australia's first innings and Midwinter taking six and Kendall taking eight wickets in the match. Hill played in the 2nd Test of the 1876-1877 series. On the second day Allen joined Tom Emmett when England 162 for 6. He partnered Tom Emmett, Tom Armitage and England Captain, James Lillywhite, junior. At 259 for 8, Allen Hill was run out for 49.

Allen Hill was a bowler with an approximate round arm action, which said was 'one of the best of its kind that can be recalled'. His playing career ended in 1883, when he broke his collar-bone, but he went on to become an umpire. Hill officiated in the England v Australia 1st Test match played at Lord's in 1890

Hill did'nt bowl in the first innings but when he bowled in the second innings he took twelve wickets for seventeen runs bowling 25.3 overs. Ten of the wickets were clean bowled

'We travelled through the deep gorge in heavy floods, our two coaches were all but submerged. 'I think we all said our prayers'. Words of Allen Hill

'And there was the travel, which continued to be long and arduous. Particularly memorable was the journey from Greymouth on the west coast of New Zealand's south island to Christchurch in the east, which started in two stagecoaches. They were due to spend the night in Otira, high in the Southern alps, but they were still not there at 11pm when, in heavy rain, they were forced to cross a river that had burst its banks. All safely reached an island in the middle of the stream, which was where their lights blew out. The first coach reached the far side of the river, but the second got stuck.' All had to jump for their lives into the stream, which was now up to their waists, the player wrote. 'By great exertion the coach was got out, but only just in time, as soon huge stones, trees and logs began to be carried down the swollen river'

The soggy players dragged their sodden luggage the remaining half-mile to their hotel, where they discovered there were only three beds for their party of 17. Happily the couple who owned the hotel were able to lend them some clothes while their own dried out, though less happily that did involve some players being forced to put on dresses.

John H. Gibb (1831-1909) was a Scottish, marine painter who settled in New Zealand in 1876. Gibb was a founding member of the Canterbury Society of Arts when it was formed in 1880 and continued to exhibit his many works there until his death. He exhibited wherever possible and showed works in Auckland and Wellington from the early 1880s as well as sending works to many international and inter-colonial exhibitions beyond New Zealand. By the 1880s Gibb was regarded as New Zealand's major professional marine painter. Around 1880 he moved to Australia where he became a member of the Art Society of New South Wales in Sydney. The family returned to New Zealand by 1892. The highest price recorded for the artist for a single work was \$85,000

KERR AND HIS DAUGHTER DIANA
RAIT KERR**

The following ten lots were previously from the collections of Rowan Rait Kerr, Secretary of M.C.C. 1936-1952 and his daughter Diane, M.C.C. Curator 1945-1968. Rowan Scrope Rait Kerr MC who was an Irish-born cricketer and sporting administrator. Rait Kerr, born in Bray, Ireland, led a distinguished army career. As a cricketer, he played in six first-class matches. Five of these were for the Europeans in India between 1913-14 and 1920-21, while the other came after a decade's absence from first-class cricket when he appeared for the Army against Oxford University in 1931. He succeeded William Findlay as Secretary of the Marylebone Cricket Club in 1936 and he retired in 1952. His daughter Diana Rait Kerr became the first Curator of the M.C.C. in 1945 and retired in 1968, she later became one of the first elected lady members of the club in 1999.

Daniel King was known to his contemporaries as 'the great cricketer' but it is likely that his exploits on the cricket field would have been long forgotten but for the chance survival of this portrait painted around 1835 and a pocket handkerchief. The handkerchief depicts an adaptation of Hayman's painting 'Cricket in Marylebone Fields and surrounded by the 1744 Laws of the Game. On the back of the frame is a newspaper cutting dated 1869 refers to having seen an old silk handkerchief given by Daniel King to Mr J. Humphrey of Donnington near Chichester in Sussex on his deathbed. The handkerchief was presented to Sussex County Cricket Club at Hove by Mrs Elizabeth Humphrey of Chichester. Daniel King was born in 1784 and first appeared in the local papers as a cricketer of note in 1814. Local newspapers continued to record his prowess and King first appeared in 'Scores & Biographies' in 1822 when he was top scorer for Goodwood, Boxgrove and Hampnett versus Midhurst at Goodwood Park. After a ten year gap he re-appeared in Scores & Biographies' in 1834 at the age of fifty, opening the batting with the Earl of March for Goodwood versus Duncton again at Goodwood Park. He died in 1836 aged 53 and the gentlemen of Chichester, having a short time since, entered into a subscription for the purpose of having his portrait painted, and presenting it to him as a mark of respect. Mr Lush was employed to paint the picture. It is believed that

the painting was planned to be presented in the week of his death. The melancholy task was doubtless performed and the widow posses the relic of her lamented partner. John Lush's diary reveals that he was a cricket enthusiast and had almost certainly watched Daniel King play. John Lush painted the original portrait of Daniel King some time in 1835 or 1836. The lithograph of the painting was made by Sharp of Gerard Street, Soho, London soon after. This lithograph appears to be a proof copy, 'Proof' printed to the right hand border to the right of the title

357 'A Cricket Match between Sussex and Kent' C1850/60's [?]. Hand coloured lithograph of the famous cricket scene set in Ireland's Royal Brighton Gardens. This composite picture features many of the great players and statesman of the day, although they never competed together in the same match. The lithograph with title to lower border, by S. There are various labels to verso, one headed Towner Art Galley, Eastbourne valuing the lithograph for Miss D. Rait-Kerr at £50, another smaller label for 'The Parker Gallery, Albemarle Street, London' and another large label with typed details of the image 'This picture is an early state of a lithograph by S. Lipschitz of Hamburg of a match in the Brighton Ground. Later states of which at least three exist, bear the names of both the lithographer and of the London publishers. The picture is based on and closely resembles an engraving published in February 1849 by W.H. Mason, engraved by G.H. Phillips from a picture executed by W. Drummond with some assistance from C.J. Basebe. The original painting commenced in 1843 took five years to complete, and it is not surprising to find that in that interval before publication six of the characters had died, and the players changed so that the personae dramatis do not agree with any

recorded contest between Sussex and Kent'. The names and clubs of each player are typed below the above statement

The Australian Services XI was a cricket team comprising solely military service personnel during World War II. They became active in May 1945 after the defeat of Germany. The team played matches against English cricket sides of both military and civilian origins to celebrate the end of the war. These matches were aimed at increasing morale in the war-ravaged English cities and as a means of reviving cricket after the conclusion of fighting. The end of the war marked the start of the 1945 cricket season. Plum Warner organised a series of matches between England and Australian servicemen, known as the Victory Tests, to celebrate the end of hostilities. However, Australian cricket administrators would not accredit the three-day matches as official Test matches, arguing that there were not enough Test-level players in the armed services; Lindsay Hassett was the only Australian who had Test experience

Cyril Price, also known under the pen names of 'Gwynne', 'Kim' and 'Spike', was a Welsh artist, an ex-miner who, when the mines closed, began contributing drawings to the Bristol Evening World. From the 1930s he was a front page and interior artist for the comic weeklies of the Amalgamated Press and worked on titles such as Illustrated Chips (Private Potts 1934), Comic Cuts (Quip and Cranky 1934), Joker (Bert and Daisy 1937), Jolly (1938) and Butterfly (The Jolly Days 1939). Later he worked for the Daily Graphic and his work for this was collected together for The Whisker's Annual. From 1944, the Daily Sketch published Price's political cartoons, who signed them Kim

The match, played on the 22nd-25th August 1925 was drawn, presumably because of rain, as the only completed innings was Surrey's, they made 246-8 declared. Rhodes taking four wickets and Macaulay three. Yorkshire were 82 for no wicket at the end of the match, Sutcliffe 53no. Yorkshire won the County Championship in 1925 and went through the entire season without defeat. Played 32 matches, winning 21 with eleven draws.

George Douglas Machin (1893-1985) served as a balloon observer in the First World War, and was awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross. He also gained fame as a cartoonist for his work on the soldiers newspapers, 'Blighty' magazine. His output was prolific and his signature, 'Mac' appeared on drawings in scores of publications, big newspapers and magazines including Tatler, Daily Mirror etc. He drew war posters for the Government in both world wars. He illustrated several sporting

- cigarette cards sets and the artwork for Chelsea football programme covers during the 1930s. He died in 1985 at the age of 92*

An avid football supporter, he provided illustrations for the Manchester United F.C. programmes from 1933 until 1958.*
