CRICKET EPHEMERA

- 1 Australian tour of England 1893. Earl of Sheffield's XI v Australians 1893. Excellent original folding menu card for the Dinner given by Lord Sheffield on the 9th May 1893 during the match played at Sheffield Park, Uckfield from the 8th-10th May 1893. The highly decorative and colourful menu with front cover, with titles and dates, featuring a kangaroo and Lord Sheffield's cricket emblem with decorative borders, the rear cover with raised Australian emblem to centre in shield with cricket stumps and to sides and lower border, cricket bats and balls. To inside pages, equally decorative, are the menu and wine list to the left and to the right a listing of the players, both the Australian and Earl of Sheffield's elevens, umpires and scorers with cricket themed borders of cricket bats, cricket bags, balls, stumps etc. Gilt to all edges. Players include Blackham, Bannerman, Gregory, Trott, Trumble, Giffen, Lyons, W.G. Grace, Stoddart, Shrewsbury, W. Gunn, Attewell, Lockwood, Briggs, Peel etc. The umpires were R. Carpenter and R.Thoms. The menu printed by John Beal & Son and E. Booth & Sons were the caterers. The two sides of the menu are very cleanly detached at the fold, probably due to the thick card used for the menu, minor wear to the base of the front cover otherwise in very good condition. A rare, decorative and exquisite item of ephemera from this early Australian tour £500/800
- The Earl of Sheffield's XI including W.G. Grace, Captain, Stoddart, Shrewsbury, W. Gunn, Attewell, Lockwood, Briggs, Peel etc won the match by 8 wickets. For the Earl of Sheffield's XI, Grace made 63, Shrewsbury 62 and Gunn 56 and Lockwood took nine wickets in the match. For Australia, who followed on, Graham top scored with 32, Coningham 29 & 26, McLeod 24 & 25 and Giffen took six and Coningham 5 wickets in the match*
- 2 Lord Hawke's Tour of North America, New Zealand and Australia 1902-03. 'Dinner to The Members of Lord Hawke's Cricket Team by The New South Wales Cricket Association. Held at Hotel Australia, Sydney, 21st March 1903. Original and rare menu for this early tour Dinner to Hawke's touring party. The front cover with scene of the Sydney Cricket Ground with a match in progress with titles below and crossed bats, stumps, ball and glove emblem to left hand corner. Gold, dark and light blue ribbon tie to left hand border. The rear cover with a photographic scene of the main stands with massed crowds in attendance with art nouveau border. The two page folding menu inside the covers, the first page with a programme of the music, the centre pages with the Menu and Toasts detailed. Gilt to all edges. Minor wear and staining to the menu covers, old adhesive mark to rear cover, small rust paperclip mark to top of inner pages otherwise in good condition A rare menu from this early tour. Not previously seen by the auctioneer £250/350
- Hawke's tour of North America, New Zealand and Australia in 1902-03 was the first to tour Australasia with New Zealand as the primary destination and as was the norm at the time, was privately run and funded. Hawke's team was a strong one, including Pelham Warner, Bernard Bosanquet and Frederick Fane, and it was victorious in all eighteen matches of the New Zealand tour, though it was defeated in two of the three matches in Australia*
- 3 'First' M.C.C. tour to Australia 1903/04. Early official folding menu for the 'Complimentary Banquet tendered to the English Cricket Team by the Queensland Cricket Association' held on the Queensland Government Yacht 'Lucinda', 30th November 1903. Printed titles to front, menu to inside. Burning and loss to top right hand corner not affecting the text. Age toning and spotting, splitting to fold, otherwise in good condition £50/70
- The 1903/04 tour was the first time an England team went to Australia under the auspices of the M.C.C. The dinner was held on the evening of the close of the tour match against Queensland. M.C.C. won by six wickets*
- 4 Australian tour to England 1905. Early original concert programme card for a 'Grand Concert' held on the R.M.S. 'Miowera', 8th April 1905, on which the Australians were sailing to England for the 1905 tour. Monty Noble and 'Mr. Clem. Hill & Coy.' are listed to perform songs in both parts of the programme. Small stain to one corner, adhesive marks to verso, otherwise in good/ very good condition £50/70
- M.C.C. beat Queensland by six wickets*
- 5 Australian tour of England 1905. Official itinerary card with cameo pictures of the Australian team to face, and fixtures, both in New Zealand on the outward journey and in England, to the reverse. Minor loss and tear to right hand corner with tape repair to verso, minor staining, otherwise in good condition. Rare £100/150
- The fixture card was probably only presented to players and officials*
- 6 'Kent County Cricket Champions 1906'. Rare official menu for the 'Banquet to The Champion Team' celebrating Kent winning their first ever County Championship in 1906. The Banquet held at the Corn Exchange, Maidstone on 10th October 1906 with the Mayor in attendance. Original raised and embossed decorative covers with Borough of Maidstone emblem to centre with purple ribbon tie, gilt to edges. Four printed pages to inside, the first being a title page with cameo portraits of members of the Kent team, menu, toasts and programme of music to other pages. The name 'L.G.E. Fletcher' handwritten to the top border of the fourth page. Printed by the Dickinson of Maidstone. Gilt to edge. Minor staining to covers and the odd inside page otherwise in

- good/very good condition. A scarce item of Kent cricketing history £250/350
- 7 'Kent County Cricket Champions 1906'. Rare official menu for the 'Dinner to the Kent XI' celebrating Kent winning their first ever County Championship in 1906. The Banquet held at Hotel Cecil on 11th October 1906. Original covers with embossed Kent emblem to centre with cream ribbon tie. Twelve printed pages to inside, the first being a photograph of the Kent team, 'A Canterbury Week Ode' by Major Philip Trevor, menu, toasts, programme of music, results and averages for the 1906 season etc to other pages with caricatures of some of the team by 'RIP'. Minor foxing and soiling to covers otherwise in generally very good condition. A scarce item of Kent cricketing history £250/350
- 8 M.C.C. tour to Australia 1920/21. Original commemorative silk theatre handbill for the production of 'Chu Chin Chow' at the Tivoli Theatre, Melbourne, Saturday 1st January 1921, attended by the Australian and English cricketers on the evening following the second day's play of the second Test. 7.5"x13.5". Some red staining, creasing, tears to centre vertical fold, otherwise in good condition £30/50
- 9 Australian tour of England 1926. Official invitation to W.P. Howell to attend a 'Garden Party at Government House, Newlands on the 10th Nov'. With gold embossed crest to top of invitation card. Minor foxing, otherwise in good condition £40/60
- 10 Australia tour to England 1926. Rare official 'Programme of Return Journey London to Sydney'. 44pp booklet, assumed to have been issued to the players. Illustrated throughout with detailed itineraries for various points on the return journey, commencing with the departure on the S.S. Montrose from Birkenhead, Liverpool, on the 1st October, bound for Quebec, Canada, then from Vancouver by sea to Sydney via Honolulu and Auckland. Original paper wrappers with Australian green and gold colours to front. Some creasing to rear wrapper, small old tape repairs to wrapper edges.
- 11 Australian tour to England 1934. Official folding menu for the 'Luncheon to Australian Cricket Team of 1934' held at Forres, 14th September 1934. The menu with town emblem and title to front, menu and toast list to inside, and printed image 'On the River Findhorn' to back. Minor soiling, otherwise in good/ very good condition £70/100
The Australians played North of Scotland at Grant Park, Forres on 14th September 1934. Scheduled for two days, Australia won in a day in a low scoring game by an innings and 20 runs, dismissing North of Scotland for 48 and 98. A fill-up match was played the following day to end the tour
- 12 The Stoics Cricket Club. Official menu for the 75th Anniversary Dinner of this famous wandering club held at Simpsons Restaurant, London on 14th November 1952. 12pp menu with card wrappers and coloured cord, comprising history, photographs, menu, toasts etc. Some famous names feature. Very good condition £25/35
- 13 Kent C.C.C. 1910. Early original Kent membership and fixture card no. 783 for 1910. The small folding card with brown leather covers and gilt titles and emblems to front and back. Pencil annotation to inside 'Kent Champion County'. Adhesive marks to rear cover, otherwise in good condition £50/70
Kent won their third County Championship title in 1910, their second in successive seasons. Of twenty six matches played, nineteen were won, with three draws, three losses, and one match abandoned
- 14 Surrey v Lancashire 1908. Official match ticket for the third day's play of the match scheduled to be played at Kennington Oval, 16th- 18th July 1908. The 1/- unreserved ticket for the East Stand is laid down to page and appears to have been slightly trimmed to one edge. Light folds, otherwise in good condition £25/35
No play was possible on any of the three days and the match was abandoned
- 15 The Ashes 1938. Official ticket for the 1938 England v Australia Ashes series. Circular ticket with cord for admission to the Members' Enclosures, Lord's, 28th June 1938. Good condition. Sold with three official match tickets for England v West Indies, Trent Bridge, 20th-25th July 1950, the tickets issued for play on the Thursday, Saturday and Monday. Some wear and neat tape repair to verso of two, otherwise good condition. Qty 4 £20/30
- 16 Eton v Harrow 1934. Official scorecard with incomplete printed scores, Mound Stand ticket and two members enclosure swing tickets in M.C.C. compliments slip folder for the Eton v Harrow match played at Lord's, 13th- 14th July 1934. VG £15/25
- 17 Varsity cricket. Oxford v Cambridge, Lord's 1953 and 1954. Two unused strips of three joined complimentary tickets for each day of the Varsity matches played at Lord's, 4th- 7th July 1953 and 3rd- 6th July 1954. VG £25/35
In the 1953 match Cambridge University won by two wickets, Colin Cowdrey scoring 116 and 0 for Oxford, Robin Marlar taking twelve wickets in the match for Cambridge. Dennis Silk scored 116 in Cambridge's second innings. The 1954 match was drawn with M.J.K. Smith making 201no in Oxford's first innings and Dennis Silk 118 for Cambridge. Goonesena took six wickets in Oxford's second innings
- 18 Close House C.C. Northumberland. Two original small folding membership cards dated 1933 and 1937 with printed fixtures for the Tyneside and Northumberland cricket leagues respectively. Also includes nineteen original mono candid style photographs of Club members in batting and bowling poses at the wicket and a match in progress, two of the smaller photographs are annotated in ink to the verso, 'Closehouse v Wallsend 15 June [19]29'. The photographs measure 4"x6" and 3.25"x2.25". Staining to the covers and rusting to the staples of the 1937 card, curling to the photographs, otherwise in good condition £25/35

- Close House was built in 1779 for the Bewicke family, and Major Bewicke is listed in the fixture cards as Club President. W.G. Grace is reputed to have once played there*
- 19 Club fixture cards 1914-1997. A good selection of original club fixture cards for Free Foresters C.C. 1914. London Hospital C.C. 1932. North London C.C. 1934. Wardley Welfare C.C. (Gateshead) 1932, 1934, 1937, 1939 & 1940. Gidea Park C.C. 1936 & 1937. Heworth (St. Mary's) C.C. (Gateshead) 1945-1949, 1952-1959, plus rules for 1954. Optimists C.C. (Bristol) 1962-1976, 1978-1981, 1983-1991, 1994-1997. Also three official handbooks for Lancashire Cricket League 1978, Middlesex Colts Cricket Association 1977, and The Sports Bag Evening Cricket League [Leeds] 1984. Qty 59. G £30/40
- 20 Cricket match tickets 1946-2016. A large collection of approx. three hundred official match tickets and passes, nicely presented in a thick album. The majority of tickets are for matches played at Lord's and The Oval, with a good selection of others at home and abroad. Matches covered include Tests, one day internationals, County Championship, John Player League, Gillette Cup, Benson & Hedges Cup Finals, NatWest Trophy, AXA League, also I.C.C. Cricket World Cup in West Indies 2007, also J.T. Murray benefit match prize draw 1975, Courtney Walsh Testimonial 1998 etc. Earlier tickets include Lord's Test, England v India 24th June 1946, v New Zealand 21st June 1958 etc. Odd ticket torn, otherwise in very good condition £40/60
- 21 County, schools and Club fixture and/or membership cards 1894-1972. A selection of fixture/ members' cards for the period. Cards are M.C.C. 1938, 1964, Gloucestershire C.C.C. 1951, 1952, 1960, 1972, Doric C.C. 1894, Royal Grammar School Newcastle-on-Tyne 1894, 1895, Mundania Athletic Club (Cricket Section) 1913, University College School C.C. 1915, The Harrow Association 1938, and Marlborough College C.C. 1941. Sold with two small booklets published by E.F. Hudson, Birmingham, 'Cricket Facts & Figures 1936', and 'Cricket Records 1940'. Also a Gloucestershire C.C.C. car park ticket for 1951. Qty 16. G £30/50
- 22 Home and overseas match tickets 1952-2017. Album containing a good selection of seventy two official match tickets and guest passes. Tickets include England 'home' Test matches v India, Lord's 1952, v West Indies, Headingley 1988, Lord's 2000, v Pakistan, Headingley 1992, v Australia, Old Trafford 1993, v Pakistan, The Oval 1996, v Sri Lanka, The Oval 1998, v New Zealand, The Oval 1999 etc. Overseas Test match tickets include Australia v England, Centenary Test, Melbourne 1977, West Indies v Australia, Trinidad 1995, Sri Lanka v England, Galle 2001, Australia v South Africa, Adelaide Oval 2002 etc. Others include Gillette Cup Final, Lord's 1965, Benson & Hedges Cup Final, Lord's 1993, also County Championship, One Day Internationals, Pura Cup, NatWest Trophy, tour matches etc. Odd duplication. - 23 'A Correct Statement of the Grand Cricket Match, at Nottingham between Eleven of the Sherwood Forest Club [Nottingham], and Eleven of the Leicester newly established County Club, on the 12th, 13th, and 14th of July, 1825'. Original and early handbill with full scores and scorecard of the match printed by J. Plant of Wheat Sheaf Yard, Long Row. The handbill measures 6.75"x9.25", mounted, framed and glazed. Overall 13.25"x16". Minor creasing staining and wear otherwise in good overall condition. A rare surviving handbill from the match played in 1825 £300/500
- Nottingham won the match by 105 runs. In their first innings Nottingham made 172 runs with Colonel Gardiner making 51 and F. Martin 43 with A. Packe taking seven wickets, Leicester replied with 149, Burnsby top scoring with 35, S. Charlton taking four wickets. Noittingham in their second innings made 197 with W. Taylor making 79 and C. Smelt 34, Packe taking four wickets, Leicester were bowled out for 115. The umpires were Gamble and Dennis. The match was apparently played for 200 sovereigns, they played a return match which Leicester won*
- 24 'CRICKET!! The opening day of the Gateshead Borough Cricket Club will take place on Whit-Monday [8th June 1840] on their new ground near the flats on which occasion A Grand Match will be played between the Married and Single members. Wickets to be pitched at One o'clock precisely'. Original and early advertising broadside for the match, printed by M. Benson, No 3, Foot of Dean Street Newcastle with wood engraved vignette of the game at the head of the broadside. Advertising to the lower quarter reads 'W. Mould, Turks Head Inn, Gateshead respectfully informs his friends and public, that hew has erected a large and commodious Tent for the occasion, where Refreshments may be had on reasonable Terms'. The broadside measures 9"x 11.25". '1840' added in ink to the broadside. Some wear to extremities otherwise in good condition for its age. Loosely mounted in modern cream mount. A rare surviving broadside from the match played in 1840. Previously sold by Christie's Auctioneers in November 2011 £300/500
- 25 Lancashire C.C.C. posters 1974. Two original posters, one for the first Test, England v India at Old Trafford, 6th- 11th June 1974, the other an official Benson & Hedges Cup 1974 poster for Lancashire home matches v Nottinghamshire and v Derbyshire, and away matches v Minor Counties and v Yorkshire. Both posters measure 20"x30", with horizontal and vertical folds, otherwise in very good condition £30/50
- 26 Trevor Chappell underarm bowling incident 1981. 'O'Reilly on That Ball. How Low Can We Get?'. World Series Cup, Australia v New Zealand, Melbourne 1st February 1981. Original newspaper poster for The Sydney Morning Herald, dated 2nd February 1981, printed by John Fairfax & Sons, Sydney. 24"x16.5". Horizontal and vertical folds, some age toning, otherwise in good condition £30/50
- With New Zealand requiring six runs off the final ball to tie the World Series Cup match, Australian captain, Greg Chappell, instructed the bowler, his brother Trevor, to roll the ball along the ground to prevent New Zealand batsman, Brian McKechnie, hitting*

- the required six. In commentary, Richie Benaud described it as 'one of the worst things' he had seen on a cricket field*
- 27 'S. Africa Tour. Border: 'No' to \$500,000'. Original newspaper poster for the Daily Mirror (Sydney), dated 16th May 1985, printed by Nationwide News, Surrey Hills, NSW. 15"x24". Horizontal and vertical folds, otherwise in very good condition £30/50
- A representative Australian side took part in a 'rebel' tour to South Africa in 1985/86. Allan Border did not participate and was appointed captain for 1985 the Ashes series in England*
- 28 Don Bradman. 'Bradman Writes For Us'. Original newspaper poster for The News (Adelaide), dated 7th December 1984, printed by Nationwide News, Adelaide. 16"x24". Horizontal fold, some age toning, otherwise in good condition £30/50
- 29 'Kim Hughes Axed'. Original newspaper poster for The Sun (Melbourne), dated 28th December 1984, printed by H.A. Gordon, Melbourne for The Sun-News Pictorial. 20"x26". Horizontal and vertical folds, some creasing, otherwise in very good condition £30/50
- Following increasing pressure from the media and former teammates, Hughes resigned the captaincy of the Australian team having just had a run of poor results against the West Indies*
- 30 'Why Envy? Learn Successful Methods and apply Them. Bill Jones' 1928. Original colour motivational 'life-coaching' poster published by Parker-Holladay & Co., London, who created the character, Bill Jones, to encourage good workplace behaviour and improve productivity. The poster depicts two cricketers in the foreground looking on at an opposition player being carried on the shoulders of team mates surrounded by attractive ladies. An excellent example of graphic design from the 1920s. Printed in England, this is numbered '16' to lower right corner in the series produced. 22"x28". Some wear to edges, small tears to lower edge, minor pinhole rust marks to corners, otherwise in good condition £40/60
- The 'productivity at work' poster campaign was so successful that the posters were subsequently used in America and Canada.*

- 31 Cricket World Cup England and Wales 2019. Three official Lord's posters for group stage matches played in the 2019 World Cup. Pakistan v South Africa, 23rd June (Pakistan won by 49 runs), England v Australia 25th June (Australia won by 64 runs), and New Zealand v Australia 29th June 2019 (Australia won by 86 runs). Each measures approx. 23"x39". VG £30/50
- 32 Cricket posters. Two large posters, one for the Old Surrey v Lord's Taverners' 1965. Original poster for the match played 22nd August 1965 in aid of the National Playing Fields Association and the other for The Lord's Taverners Celebrating their Twenty First Birthday' 1971. Original poster produced for the match v An Old England XI at Lord's, 31st July 1971, 'played in the costume and with the equipment of 1884'. Notable names who took part in the matches include May, Barton, Subba Row, A. Bedser, E. Bedser, Laker, McIntyre, Gover, Barrington, Edrich, Evans, Flavell, Hollies, Ikin, SurrIDGE, Doug Wright, David Frost, Ian Carmichael etc. Both 20"x30". From the collection of Alan Curtis, English actor and Lord's cricket announcer for 28 years. Odd minor faults otherwise in good condition £30/50
- 33 George Oswald Browning 'Gubby' Allen. Middlesex, Cambridge University & England 1921-1950. 'The Badminton' diary for 1937 comprising the 'Annual Register of Sporting and Society Fixtures'. Original decorative card covers contained in red cloth case. This was Allen's copy, presented with handwritten dedication to 'Gubby, with love, Plum [Warner], Xmas 1937'. Contents comprise copious notes in pencil of social engagements, meetings, golf matches etc. throughout. Winter activities include almost daily lunch and dinner engagements with friends including the Chapmans, Airds, "Shrimp" (Leveson Gower), Griffiths, Aubrey Smith etc., also golf days, M.C.C. meetings. In the summer Allen is playing regularly for Middlesex, and attends the four days of the second Test against Australia at Lord's, 24th-28th June. Memorandum pages to rear include a list of his selection of an M.C.C. team to play Eton on 24th May, which includes Sellers, F.R. Brown, Chapman, Stanyforth, Enthoven etc. (the match was not played and Allen records he was 'In bed' that weekend). Some wear and creasing to front cover, breaking to page block, otherwise in good condition £70/100
- 34 David Gower. Original foam rubber puppet of the head of David Gower made for the television series, 'Spitting Image', in the 1980s. Approx. 12" tall. Some wear and loss around the neck, otherwise in good condition £40/60
- Created by Peter Fluck, Roger Law and Martin Lambie-Nairn, Spitting Image first aired on Central Independent Television in 1984 and ran for eighteen series until 1996, and was then revived in 2020. David Gower's character was voiced by Alistair McGowan*
- 35 Cricket cuttings 1926-1929. Album comprising magazine and newspaper cuttings for the period relating to M.C.C. tour to India 1926/27, West Indies in England 1928, M.C.C. to Australia 1928/29, South Africa in England 1929 etc. Images include teams, player profiles, match action, also English grounds at Tonbridge, Canterbury, Dover, The Oval, Headingley, Bramall Lane (Sheffield), Eastbourne, Southampton, Worcester, Fenner's etc., and overseas grounds including Wellington (New Zealand), Queen's Park Oval (Trinidad), The Wanderers' Ground (Johannesburg), The Bombay Ground, Aligarh University Ground (India), Vancouver etc. G/VG£30/50
- 36 Cricket cuttings season 1897. Small album comprising an interesting collection of newspaper cuttings either laid down or loose, the majority reports of matches played by Leicestershire in the 1897 County

- Championship season, and end of season summaries by county. Also includes twelve pages, beautifully handwritten in ink, listing the batsmen who had scored first-class centuries through the season and the match in which it was achieved, including 'Abel, Surrey v Leicestershire, 144, May 5th, Hayward, 130 (ditto), N.F. Druce, Cambridge v C.I. Thornton's XI, 277, May 12th' etc. Some wear, odd pages detached, otherwise in good condition £25/35
- 37 Cricket scrapbook 1930s-1940s. Scrapbook compiled by 'J. Bonnyman Jones. Collector of Cricketana', comprising magazine and newspaper cuttings relating to Brighton College, wartime cricket, and general cricket interest. Contents include images of Brighton College cricket teams of the 1930s, obituary articles on Maurice Turnbull, killed in action in 1944, four pages laid down of handwritten 'Notes on Subsequent Careers of Brighton College XI 1901', dated 1942, with the comment, 'none of 'em did much big cricket after leaving [the school]' etc. G £30/50
- 38 Cricket tour scrapbooks 1930-1955. Three scrapbooks containing a comprehensive selection of press cuttings, mainly from the Daily Telegraph, covering tours and domestic cricket for the period. Armstrong finished with figures of 23 overs, 16 maidens, seven wickets for 33 runs in the match against Derby (see telegram note). He made two half centuries with a top score of 68

45 John Berry 'Jack' Hobbs. Surrey & England 1905-1934. Two original ledgers/ journals relating to Hobbs' sports business, 'Jack Hobbs Limited'. One leather bound leather with brass clasp, comprises accounts for the period 4th October 1919 to 31st December 1926. pp 2-13 'have been taken out and destroyed by us [Hobbs' accountant], as of no value or interest to Jack Hobbs Ltd'. Contents include handwritten indexes to endpapers, and sections relating to share issues, bank account deposits and withdrawals, business expenses, salaries, sales, purchases, bad debts, profit and loss, balance sheets etc. for the period. The other journal comprises the 'Register of Directors or Managers' with their names and occupations, listing Hobbs' various occupations during his lifetime as 'professional cricketer', 'retired cricketer', journalist etc., Andrew Kempston (Company Secretary) and Douglas Brown (Manager). Also 'Summaries of Share Capital and Shares' for the period 1921-1942, and the 'Register of Members and Share Ledger' which includes shares issued in 1953 to H.M. Garland-Wells (Oxford University & Surrey 1927-1939), and to Hobbs's

sons, Leonard and Ivor Hobbs, issued in 1962, the year before Jack Hobbs' death, also a reference to probate being granted to his sons, Jack Douglas Hobbs and Leonard Edward Hobbs, following their father's death on 21st December 1963. Hobbs founded his sports shop in Fleet Street, London in 1919. While Jack was playing cricket the shop was overseen by his younger brother, Sidney, until 1931 who then returned to Cambridge. Jack continued to run the London shop for many years and claimed he earned more from his shop than he did from cricket

46 John Bertram Payne to Alfred J. Gaston, cricket follower, writer and collector. Two handwritten letters in ink to Gaston from Payne. One, a two page letter dated 22nd February 1905, relates to Payne returning Wisden Almanacks for years '[18]64-70' with thanks for the loan. Payne has 'now completed the yearly index to years 1864-87' and hopes to add an appendix 'giving [a]complete alphabetical list of matches played during the period... [which should be useful for reference]'. In the second, four page, letter dated 31st May 1906, Payne congratulates Gaston on a lecture given at Canterbury, and suggests Gaston tries '[his] luck further North, say Manchester, Sheffield, Leeds and, perhaps best of all, Nottingham'. He continues with an interesting comment about C.B. Fry, 'I was very glad to read that Fry may be in harness again in 2 months. A sneaking idea came over me that his cricketing days might be ended after than unaccountable accident', and closes with an enquiry about the value of Wisdens, listing those he currently owns, and notes

that 'Mr. Alcock got £4-10-0 for an 1875 Wisden, and wonders if 'this is a record?'. Both letters signed 'J.B. Payne'. Originally from Gaston's own collection. Adhesive mark to both letters, otherwise in good condition £30/50

John Bertram Payne was an author and cricket statistician who compiled the 'Index to all first-class matches in "Scores and Biographies"' covering volumes I-XIV 1746-1878, first published in 1903.

C.B. Fry suffered a ruptured achilles tendon in 1906 which forced him to miss all but two matches that year

47 E.B. Noel to Alfred J. Gaston, cricket follower, writer and collector. Two handwritten letters from Noel to Gaston. Evan Baillie Noel wrote 'Winchester College Cricket', published in 1926

48 J.T. Henderson to Alfred J. Gaston, cricket follower, writer and collector. Four page handwritten letter in ink from Henderson to Gaston, on Legislative Assembly, Natal note paper, dated 27th July 1899. The letter, with good cricket content, relates to 'the second copy of Lord Hawke's Souvenir' which he had previously sent. He also describes the trouble he had gone to to obtain for Gaston 'copies of my Cricket Annual

- for 1886-87 and 1888-90' from a cricketer in Orange Free State, who 'was not particularly willing to part with them as they are a portion of a set'. He continues by looking forward 'to see the cricket at home this year', describes the Australians as 'the best team that has visited England', and questions 'What is the matter with the England bowling when Young and Bradley have to be requisitioned? [for the fourth Test]'. He describes his admiration for the Natal batsman, Poore, who 'has been piling on runs (especially against Somerset)... [and] made two centuries in successive matches for Natal against Lord Hawke's First Team'. Signed 'J.T. Henderson'. To the inside pages, a small original sepia photograph of a team is partly laid down. Team and location unknown. Good condition £40/60
- Under the pseudonym, 'Cover Point', Henderson edited the South African Cricketers' Annual' and the 'Natal Cricketers' Annual' from 1884/85 to 1906/07*
- 49 Richard Parr Daft (Nottinghamshire, 1 match 1886) to Alfred J. Gaston, cricket follower, writer and collector. Two handwritten letters, originally from Gaston's personal collection, written by Daft, son of Richard Daft (Nottinghamshire 1858-1891). In one, a three page letter dated 31st May 1900[?], Parr offers some letters 'to fill your album. As my father has never gone in for collecting he thinks they will be better in your hands'. Slipped in is a fragment of an advertisement for 'A Grand Match' at Lord's, 24th May 1847, The Earl of Strathmore's [Lord Burghley] Side v The Earl of Winterton's Side. Daft is writing from Ware in Hertfordshire, and is enclosing 'a few letters' for Gaston's scrapbook. - Richard Daft Senior died in 1900*
- 50 Bernard Dale to Alfred J. Gaston, cricket follower, writer and collector. Two letters handwritten in ink from Dale to Gaston. One, a four page letter dated 1891, relates to Dale's recent publication of his pamphlet, 'Some statistics of cricket; or, The influence of the weather on the wicket with a method for its elimination in the comparison of averages'. Dale is grateful to 'have received the praise of one who is known as a great authority on cricket literature'. Dale states he 'should have liked to have added one or two more diagrams- in particular one showing the average rainfall for each of the 25 years... but I fear the pamphlet will only be carefully read by savants like yourself'. The other is a three page letter dated 26th November[?] 1893. Dale writes to congratulate Gaston stating 'I cannot suggest the name of any book or brochure not already included in your "Bibliography of Cricket" which I read with the greatest interest when it appeared in "Wisden"' and eagerly anticipates an addenda. Dale closes with statistics for 'a wonderful year the past season has been for cricket (first class)', comparing runs scored and wickets taken in 1893 with the Jubilee year of 1857. - 51 Philip Christian William Trevor to Alfred J. Gaston, cricket follower, writer and collector. Dale thanks Gaston for his 'kind letter of encouragement... and express approval of my cricket brochure'. He describes spending 'a very enjoyable morning... the other day reading through "Wisden" for 1892 and had no idea until I read your "Bibliography" that so much had been written on cricket'. Nicely signed 'Bernard Dale'. Originally from Gaston's personal collection. Minor adhesive marks and wear to the fold, otherwise in good condition £20/30

Dale's reference to his 'brochure' may relate to 'Some Statistics of Cricket, or the Influence of the weather on the wicket, with a method for its elimination in the comparison of averages' which Dale published in 1891

The following thirteen lots comprise a collection of letters written to G. Neville Weston who is renowned as being probably the greatest historian and biographer of W.G. Grace, in particular his attention to the detail of minor matches in which Grace played throughout his career. In the forward to Weston's book 'W.G. Grace The Great Cricketer' published in 1973, Irving Rosenwater quotes A.A. Thompson saying Weston 'knows more about W.G. than any man alive', to which Rosenwater adds, 'or dead'

- 56 Henry Ling. Cricket writer. Interesting four page handwritten letter to Neville Weston from Ling at his home in Croydon, dated 22nd July June [19]34. In a lengthy letter, Ling writes in great detail about his collection of Lillywhite guides, all complete with original wrappers 'excepting the 10th Edition which has been rebound without the covers

& wants four pages at the end', and that he is lacking the '1st, 2nd, 5th, 6th, 9th, & 14th Autumn' editions. Ling is very interested in Weston's description of his own set and states, 'You do not mention the covers of the various editions in your article' and assumes that Weston's copies 'have been rebound without original wrappers'. He continues, 'The covers are interesting, because they give information which does not appear on the title pages, and the design of the covers is not the same in all editions'. The remaining content comprises Ling's detailed descriptions of the variations in designs of the covers, anomalies in issue dates, original publication prices, pagination and advertising pages, previous sales figures, and includes corrections to descriptions given by Weston with references to other sources including E.R. Wilson, Britton and Holmes. Ling closes by thanking Weston for 'sending a copy of Mr. F.A. Brooke's letter and enclosure- his notes and your descriptions have been a great help to me to understand the various issues- I am afraid I shall never possess a complete set'. In a postscript Ling also thanks Weston for 'the catalogue of Cricket Pictures and also for the "Cricket Card News"'. Nicely signed 'Henry Ling'. A useful and comprehensive record of the variations in the Lillywhite Guide. VG £30/50

Lillywhite's Guides were issued annually from 1849 to 1866. These are now rare, especially the early issues. They were succeeded by John Lillywhite's Cricketer's Companion from 1865-1885 ('Green Lilly'), and James Lillywhite's Cricketer's Annual ('Red Lilly') first published in 1872, which incorporated the Companion after 1885 and continued until 1900.

Ling was a contributor to 'The Cricketer's Manual by "Bat" (Charles Box). A Short Bibliography' originally published by Weston in 1936. The 'Dr. Hunter' to whom Ling refers is Dr. T.R. Hunter who compiled the 'Catalogue of Cricket Literature [A to C.B. Fry]' published by The Cricketana Society c.1934 (Padwick 15)

- 57 Arthur Langford. Assistant Editor, 'The Cricketer' Magazine. Four original wartime letters on official

letterhead from Langford to Neville Weston. In the first, a handwritten letter dated 27th May 1941, Langford confirms that 'The Cricketer' will be 'coming out, but [we] have had to restrict our print order' and states he is unable to provide three May issues requested by Weston, but can send a copy of the Spring Annual and the issue of 3rd May. In a handwritten letter dated 24th November 1941 and a further typed letter of 17th February 1942, Langford again discusses the difficulties of providing 'back numbers' and that 'several people are considering advertising in the coming Annual for the missing numbers'. In the final handwritten letter of 30th April [1942?], Langford states, 'I know you are very anxious to be relieved of your duties', and refers to a 'Mr Stamp' who 'should be given a "run"... I think Mr Warner has met him and unless I am mistaken he has had a few verses printed in "The Cricketer" in the past'. All four letters signed in ink by Langford. G £40/60

Arthur Langford was a journalist who started writing for 'The Cricketer' in 1924. Appointed as assistant to the Editor, Sir Pelham Warner, he effectively ran the magazine from his home in Surrey while juggling work with the BBC. He was given the official title of Editor in 1964 and remained in the role until 1966

- 58 Dr. T.R. Hunter. Founder member of the Cricketana Society. Lengthy seven page typed letter, with excellent cricket content, from Hunter to George Neville Weston, dated 7th December 1933. Writing from his home in Wharfedale, Hunter covers subjects including the development of the Society and its membership, and intriguing opinions about the 'Bodyline' series of 1932/33. He opens by expressing his sympathy for an accident Weston had suffered to his hand, and apologises for being 'a bad correspondent' having been occupied with 'the work of the Society', explaining that 'membership is steadily increasing and I now have to duplicate 100 copies of each sheet I stencil'. Numerous notable names of previous and current members are mentioned including B.S. Lewis of Reading 'who is willing to rejoin if he can be promised he won't be let down as he was when he joined

at first when Mr Britton started the society'. He refers to receiving letters with messages of satisfaction from Lord Hawke and Julien Cahn, and further references to names such as 'Mr Shelton', 'Mr Youngren', 'Mr [Charles] Pratt Green', 'F.S.A-C [Ashley-Cooper]', and 'E.B.V. Christian', and hopes that the Journal 'will take its place amongst the literature of the game'. There then follows a discussion on second-hand book prices and attempts to secure discounts for members, and publicity for the journal in 'The Cricketer', 'Indian Cricketer' and 'Australian Cricketer', commenting that 'Mr Langford and Mr Warner [of 'The Cricketer'] are not too much taken up with our society except insofar that our contributions help to fill their publication', bemoaning Warner's silence. Reference is then made to a book about E.M. Grace, Britton's article on a visit to Hambledon, and others on Scottish cricket, and Test match performances of Rhodes, Spofforth and Dave Nourse, with Taylor inviting contributions from Weston. Continuing on 8th December, Taylor refers to a letter received from the cricket writer, 'Mr [Henry] Ling', whom he describes as 'a kindly soul, but terribly critical'. There then follows a very interesting description of Taylor's opinion of Douglas Jardine having read Jardine's book on the Bodyline series 'Three Times', which Taylor describes as 'childish and petty', and suggests that M.C.C. players should be 'censored, before publication, so that any matter which is likely to disturb the friendly relationship between two countries could be deleted'. He questions Warner's role in the affair, and asserts that 'if Jardine was telling the truth, then Hobbs, Noble, Wilmot, Kippax and others were misleading us'. Ling had asserted that Jardine did the right thing, but Taylor believes that 'if Jardine is to be accepted as giving a true report, then the Australians are the most rotten people associated with cricket or any sport'. Finally, Taylor describes Ling's criticism of Weston's book, which Taylor believes are 'minor details', and wishes that more encouragement was forthcoming '[while] we are all doing our best'. VG

George Neville Weston and T.R. Hunter were both members of the Cricketana Society when it was founded in 1929 by C.J. Britton, Weston holding the post of Secretary and Treasurer. Hunter compiled the 'Catalogue of Cricket Literature [A to C.B. Fry]' published by The Cricketana Society c.1934

J.W. Goldman, cricket author and collector. Single page typed letter written to George Neville Weston dated 19th June 1936 on Isadore Goldman & Son, Solicitors, headed paper with Goldman's typed private address. Goldman thanks Weston for his letter and is 'glad to know that we have two bonds between us: Law and Cricket. I am certain the former is more remunerative'. He states he has 'joined the Cricketana Society: paid 10/-: after a long time got a lot of loose leaves sent to me; no receipt and have heard nothing more'. He describes an offer from 'Maggs' of the Allahakbarrie book for £35 having been quoted between £12 and £15 by dealers as 'the proper price for it'. Goldman encloses payment of 10/6 for a copy of the Nyren Bibliography, and states he has never seen an original Boxall, has a full set of Lillywhite's Guides, three editions of 'Felix on the Bat', and is 'short of Boxall's Guide, Epps Scores and Britcher's Scores'. He closes with a comment about an interview he has given with the Evening News and encloses a copy of the article. A handwritten postscript in ink states, 'I cannot get further copies of the Evening News now for love nor money. It has become a valuable cricket item!!'. Nicely signed in ink by Goldman. Staple holes to one corner, otherwise in good condition £40/60

J.W. Goldman, cricket author and collector. Single page typed letter written to George Neville Weston dated 12th April 1938 on Isadore Goldman & Son, Solicitors, headed paper. It is indeed strange that both you and the writer of the article should have a copy signed by Gaston and both numbered 4', and refers Weston to the writer of the article, 'A.C. enquires about how Weston's Boxing collection is progressing, 'I have about 70 Boxing pictures now and about 30 books, but I expect I am a long way behind you', and refers to a 'quite large' lithograph he has in his possession of Bendigo, and offers it to Weston for £3.10.0. Frederick A. Brooke, cricket writer and collector. Three page handwritten letter from Brooke to George Neville Weston dated 28th June 1933. Brooke is writing from his home in Yorkshire to thank Weston for the 'Catalogue of the Colman Cricket Pictures', finding it a 'very interesting collection and I would like to see it'. Brooke states he had intended attending the Test match (England v Australia, Lord's) and should have paid a visit to the Tate Gallery but unfortunately I was not well enough'. He acknowledges England's 'glorious result' (England won by an innings and 38 runs) but believes 'we were rather lucky and some alterations might be made in the team for the Manchester match', which he is hoping to attend. Brooke is saddened by the 'Larwood trouble', and asks of Weston 'when the 6 ball [per over] rule was introduced in one day matches', believing 'the rule was not made until 1884'. He closes by thanking Weston for his letter on the Lillywhite's Guides. Nicely signed 'Fred A. Brooke'. G/VG £30/40

Brooke wrote 'Yorkshire cricket matches 1733-1891', which, according to Padwick 3022, comprised three volumes, in the form of an 'unpublished typescript in M.C.C. Library'.

The exhibition of Sir Jeremiah Colman's collection of paintings was held at the Tate Gallery in London, 16th June- 30th September 1934. Colman was Chairman of the family mustard business, J & J Colman of Norwich, and served as President of Surrey County Cricket Club from 1916 to 1923. Colman died in 1942

C.J. Britton, cricket writer and collector. Four page handwritten letter from Britton to George Neville Weston dated 2nd September 1933. Writing in his somewhat spidery hand, Britton opens with

- effusive thanks to Weston whom he believes has been the anonymous donor of at least one of three 'tins of cream... in beautiful condition and... delectable'. He is keeping Weston's copy of 'Young Cricketers from Australia until you return as I have Wilmot's and Lucas's books aswell', the latter he describes being of 'real "Nyronical" importance', with the comment, 'The statement that Nyren did not keep the Bat & Ball Inn [Hambeldon] is intriguing & the point ought to be cleared up'. Britton then refers to Weston's 'haul from the Rev. Holmes's collection' and is 'bewildered by the sudden rise in the excellence of your stock... Undoubtedly the Felix portrait is the gem'. He recounts a recent visit from 'Cohen', probably the collector, H.A. Cohen, 'who has picked up two remarkable items. One is nothing less than an original old top hat for cricketers use... shaped "a la Box"', and affectionately describes Cohen as 'an old scrounger!'. He closes by offering Weston 'a very complete Index to Ashley-Cooper's Cricket 1730-45', which he had compiled a couple of years previously 'and had forgotten all about it', for possible inclusion in Weston's Bibliography of Ashley-Cooper. Signed 'C.J.B.'. G/ VG £30/50
- Charles Britton was a collector, writer and founder of the Cricketana Society. He produced 'Cricket Books: the 100 best (old and new)' in 1929, and in 1935 published a study of Gilbert Jessop*
- 63 C.J. Britton, cricket writer and collector. Two page handwritten letter from Britton to George Neville Weston dated 29th June 1935. Britton opens by thanking Weston for 'details of Cpt.[?] Webb's match with Berkshire'. The remaining content primarily relates to the death of F.S. Ashley-Cooper (in 1932), which has 'left a tremendous gap', and speculates as to who might fill his shoes, 'Rockley Wilson could I fancy, if he would, but I doubt if he would have the energy to put so much work into it... This new man, G.B. Buckley, seems to be the right sort, but I imagine he is like most folk, [and] has to earn his living'. On cricketing matters, Britton continues with his view that 'Worcestershire are unlucky' claiming that beyond the team's 'stars... the reserve is usually much below par'. He also believes 'Warwick[shire] have not played their best team, with Ord and Hill, 'future England men... cannot get their places [in the team]'. Britton does not agree with Weston that the 'S. Africans will win the rubber... their bowling is not just strong enough'. Signed 'C.J. Britton'. G/VG £30/50
- 64 Gerald Harvey Humphries. Worcestershire 1932-1934 (two matches). Two page handwritten letter on ruled paper from Humphries to George Neville Weston dated 4th February 1942. Writing from R.A.F. Andreas on the Isle of Man where he was stationed, Humphries is writing to thank Weston for sending a copy of 'Cricket' by Neville Cardus, '[I] enjoyed every chapter'. He goes on to describe his 'tortuous' four day journey to 'this new station' which has 'no lights and a mile walk for water and food, also no sign of a cricket pitch!'. He recounts seeing a large print hanging in Blackpool depicting a 'Test Match, England v Australia, with W.G. batting and apparently being miraculously caught one handed on the extra cover boundary', and thinks Weston might be interested in acquiring it. Nicely signed 'Gerald Humphries'. G/ VG £30/50
- 65 Charles Pratt Green, cricket collector and wine merchant. Two page handwritten letter from Pratt Green to George Neville Weston dated 27th October 1941. Writing from his Malvern home, Pratt Green makes reference to an accompanying letter (not included) from E.H.D. Sewell (London County & Essex 1902-1904) who 'played a lot of good cricket in his day and that Sewell's autograph would be a good addition to Weston's collection of autographs. Pratt Green has passed on Sewell's enquiry 'to a friend who will take as great [a] pleasure in solving it as I should'. VG £40/60
- Charles Pratt-Green was a famous collector of cricket memorabilia including an impressive run of over 150 cricket bats used by famous players from the golden age, which were later sold to Sir Julian Cahn*
- 66 Charles Pratt Green, cricket collector and wine merchant. Two page handwritten letter from Pratt Green to George Neville Weston dated 15th December [c.1942]. Writing from his Malvern home, Green acknowledges receipt of a book and reports, 'I have just read the thrilling chapter on "The Champion" & it shone'. He also sends his thanks for 'the kind mention of the copy of [the] original edition of "The Victorians" you gave in Great Queen Street'. He describes how his book collection continues to accumulate, and describes 'When leaving Beresford House I packed with 2,000 volumes, and gifts of books come almost weekly and lie in stacks'. He continues to describe receiving a military cane 'Fifty years ago [from] a brother-in-law... [who] was a friend of C.J. Kortwright... a thing of little value- its only value consisting in its having once belonged to the most famous fast bowler of his day', and offers it to Weston as a gift. Green closes stating that Christmas is approaching, as is his ninetieth birthday. G/VG £40/60
- Charles Jesse Kortwright (Essex 1894-1907) was regarded as the fastest bowler of his day*
- 67 A.C. McKay, cricket writer, to George Neville Weston. A series of four typed letters from McKay, all written in 1938 on airmail paper with letterhead for the National Bank of India Ltd., Madras. In the first letter dated 6th May, McKay is pleased that Weston is going to subscribe to 'Indian Cricket' for whom McKay was the contributor of the 'Cricketer's Library' Series. He is pleased to accept the offer to purchase a copy of Weston's 'History of a Portrait' of Felix, and regrets not obtaining Weston's 'Bibliography of Ashley-Cooper' Work's'. He closes with the enclosure of a 'very "local" boxing brochure'. On 1st June McKay reports he is forwarding a copy of 'Mr. Obeysekere's book on boxing, is delighted to have received Weston's biography of Ashley-Cooper, wishes to order 'the Nyren biography', and asks Weston, 'being a Nyren expert', if he can shed any light on 'Old John Small'. In a two page letter of 7th June, McKay responds to Weston who is trying to acquire 'The Trent Bridge Souvenir',

- saying 'If Mr. Goldman is unable to obtain [it] I'll tackle Sir Julien [Cahn] direct'. He closes with a discussion on various titles not in his collection of which he would be interested, and a short mention of the impending Ashes series in England. In the final two page letter of 15th June, McKay acknowledges receipt of Weston's 'Nyren Biography', by saying 'It will soon be a case of someone issuing a "Bibliography of the Works of G. Neville Weston"! ', and thanks him for the 'trouble you have taken over Nyren's reference to Small'. McKay closes with a reference to "'David Harris, of Crookham", by Buckingham (1910)?' and that he has been writing about 'Silver Billy' Beldham and Harris, 'two grand old characters'. Each letter nicely signed in ink by McKay. Lights creasing and folds, otherwise in very good condition £50/80
- 68 Rowan Rait Kerr. Secretary of M.C.C. 1936-1952. Single page typed letter on M.C.C. letterhead to Neville Weston. Dated 21st August 1937, Rait Kerr thanks Weston for his letter, 'which has helped me considerably in dating without doubt the first edition of Lambert [William Lambert's 'Instructions and rules for playing the noble game of cricket' first published 1816]. I think Ashley Cooper's letter to you of the 30th of October probably satisfactorily explains how some of the unnumbered editions are undated'. He also expresses his thanks for Weston sending 'the excellent photograph of the Nyren relics'. Nicely signed 'R.S. Rait Kerr'. VG £25/35
- Rowan Scrope Rait Kerr MC was an Irish-born cricketer and sporting administrator. Rait Kerr was born in Bray, Ireland and led a distinguished army career. As a cricketer, he played in six first-class matches, five of these were for the Europeans in India between 1913-14 and 1920-21, while the other came after a decade's absence from first-class cricket when he appeared for the Army against Oxford University in 1931. He succeeded William Findlay as Secretary of the Marylebone Cricket Club in 1936 and he retired in 1952. His daughter Diana Rait Kerr became the first Curator of the M.C.C. in 1945*
- 69 George Neville Weston, cricket collector. A selection of three letters, written in 1938, from Weston's own archive comprising correspondence with The Worthington & Co. Brewery in Burton-on Trent. The first, dated 18th February 1938, is Weston's original copy of a typed letter to the brewery enquiring about acquiring a 'china ash-tray with a pictured design of Mr. Dumkins of Muggleston C.C. (Pickwick Papers) issued by you'. The reply from the brewery dated 21st February states that by sending Weston an example they are making an exception as they were usually only issued 'for use in licensed houses', but are happy to do so. Having received the ash tray, Weston writes expressing his gratitude on 23rd February. VG £30/40
- 70 Paul Antony Gibb. Cambridge University, Yorkshire, Essex & England 1935-1956. Single page handwritten letter dated 27th July 1958 from Gibb to a Robin McConnell in New Zealand, with original envelope. The others, both in response to request for autographs are from John Inverarity, dated 4th April 1983, and Allan Border, dated 17th February 1988. All three letters nicely signed. G £30/50

- 75 West Indies and South African Test cricketers signed letters. Three handwritten letters from Test cricketers including John Cameron (two Tests for West Indies 1939) offering one of his caps, and South Africans, Percy Mansell (13 Tests 1951-1955) replying to a request for his signature, and Neil Adcock (26 Tests 1953-1962) who is unable to send a cap but offers to send a Springbok tie. - 76 George Oswald Browning 'Gubby' Allen. Cambridge University, Middlesex & England 1922-1950. Three page typed letter, with good cricket content, on airmail paper dated 3rd February 1964, from Allen to Jim Swanton. At the time Allen was President of the M.C.C. and reports on a comfortable flight out to Bombay and how he 'tried to settle some of our cricket problems on a very poor telephone line with the Secretary of the Pakistan Board of Control in Karachi', resulting in him flying out to Karachi and on to Rawalpindi to meet face to face at dinner with six cabinet ministers. He makes observations about how 'charming and friendly' the people of India and Pakistan are, 'but I completely fail to understand their real hostility for one another'. Regarding the cricket he states, 'The

- less said the better... our team have suffered a lot of injuries and illness' describing their batting in the most recent match as 'unimaginative and third rate... I have a meeting with the Captain and the Manager this evening to discuss the future'. Signed 'Gubby' with a handwritten postscript in which he states, 'The real truth is that this side plays poor cricket because they are... a very poor side'. G/VG £50/80
- 77 Jeffrey Baxter Stollmeyer. Trinidad & West Indies 1938-1957. Interesting two page letter from Stollmeyer, written in Trinidad and dated 17th September 1968, to Jim Swanton who, at the time, was editor of 'The Cricketer', regarding the recent decision taken by the International Cricket Council to recommend 'to M.C.C. that a new Law of Cricket should be introduced, limiting the number of on-side fieldsmen allowed to be placed behind the popping crease to two'. He states that the 'suggestion won the support of the majority of Cricketing Countries present at the Conference, despite the protestations of the West Indies and New Zealand'. He claims that if this were to be adopted, 'a proviso similar to the law governing "the persistent bowling of fast short-pitched balls etc." could be introduced, which would effectively deal with the matter', and states that 'We in the West Indies are unequivocally opposed to any Law being introduced which violates the principle that a fielding captain may be prevented from placing his fielders where he wishes'. He comments on 'several niggling changes in the Laws', which with the exception of the 'front-foot rule... have been mainly of nuisance value', but disagrees vehemently with this 'fundamental change... [which] should have required complete unanimity of all members of the Conference', and closes hoping that it is not too late for the M.C.C. 'to use their powers of veto'. Attached is a further single page typed covering letter from Stollmeyer requesting that the full letter is published in the magazine. Both letters nicely signed 'J.B. Stollmeyer'. VG £40/60
- Jeffrey Stollmeyer captained the West Indies in thirteen Tests and*
- later became a member of the Board of Control and a Test selector*
- 78 Robert Elliot Storey 'Bob' Wyatt. Warwickshire, Worcestershire & England 1923-1951. Three letters between Wyatt and Jim Swanton regarding the LBW law. In the first, a typed copy letter to Wyatt dated 31st October 1968, Swanton enquires about a 'contraption' Wyatt had built 'showing by strings and pegs where the ball must pitch in order to satisfy the present law of LBW' and wonders whether the device could be photographed for inclusion in an article examining 'the case for an extension of the law to the offside, as long advocated by Don Bradman and... by Ronny Aird' for the Spring Annual of 'The Cricketer', of which Swanton was editor at the time. He also asks for a '500 word article on why you would go back to the old law'. Wyatt's states in a three page handwritten reply dated 9th November that he doesn't believe the device is suitable for photography 'but that it might give you an idea for a scale drawing. He has little to add to his views on the law beyond what he wrote for The Cricketer in 1967, but summarises his reasons, believing 'The law is entirely illogical... [causing] batsmen to push forward to short length bowling... puts a premium on certain types of bowling... assists negative bowling... [removes] the incentive to keep the ball up... encourages the selection of medium fast bowlers' etc. Wyatt signs the letter as 'Bob' and closes with a postscript saying he is enclosing a fuller article on the subject as requested. On 13th November, Swanton thanks Wyatt for his contribution and looks forward to visiting Lord's and hopes to view Wyatt's model. VG £40/60
- 79 M.C.C. letters 1951-1978. Five letters on official Lord's Cricket Ground letterhead. Includes one handwritten letter dated 2nd November 1951 from W. Findlay, President of M.C.C. in 1951, to 'Dear Eric' thanking him 'for all you did yesterday'. Signed 'Billy Findlay'. One, an undated letter to Jack Sokell of the Wombwell Cricket Lovers' Society, from Intikhab Alam, on his business letterhead, stating he is unable to attend a function as he is returning 'to Pakistan for good'. The other, a single page handwritten letter dated 5th February 1976 on 'Mushtaq Mohammed Benefit Year 1976' letterhead in which Mushtaq thanks 'My dear Gillian' for her contribution to his benefit. - 84 Gilbert Laird Jessop. Gloucestershire, Cambridge University, London County & England 1894-1914. Nice two page handwritten letter dated 16th April 1948 written to 'Dear Arkell'. Jessop comments on an article on the 'Old County' which he found to be 'most interesting, but then anything that R.C.R.S. [Robertson-Glasgow] writes never fails to be so'. He reminisces about Gloucestershire players of his era such as Charlie Townsend, 'the best player in my time... for a couple of seasons the best leg break bowler I ever saw'. George Dennett he describes as 'too slow for Tests', and Charles Parker 'was handicapped somewhat thro' lack of opportunities especially on sticky wickets. Looking forward to the 1948 Ashes series, he hopes that 'the selectors will not be such asses as to choose any player... who is under suspicion of unsoundness'. Nicely signed 'Gilbert L. Jessop'. - 85 John Thomas Hearne. Middlesex & England 1888-1923. Single page handwritten letter in ink dated 24th September 1921 from Hearne who is returning 'your list of names with mine added'. Seymour-Conway was styled Viscount Beauchamp between 1793 and 1794 and Earl of Yarmouth between 1794 and 1822. He was
- also a member of M.C.C.
- 139 Charles Warren, Middlesex, Sussex, Hampshire & England 1795-1826. Signed free-front envelope to Mrs Palmer of Rickmansworth, sent from 'London, February twenty eight 1821. Nicely signed 'C. Warren' in black ink. Rare early signature of tWarren who played twenty three first class matches. G/VG £30/50
Warren was mainly associated with Middlesex. He played in the augural Gentlemen v Players match, at Lord's in 1806
- 140 William Ward. Surrey, Hampshire & M.C.C. 1810-1845. Signed free-front envelope to 'Mrs Parker' of Farnham, sent from 'London, Feb. twelve 1830'. Nicely signed 'W. Ward' in black ink to the lower left corner. A very rare early signature of Ward, a right handed batsman and occasional lob-bowler who played 130 first class matches and was considered for many years one of the leading batsman in England. Light folds, laid to slightly smaller page, otherwise in good/ very good condition £100/150
William Ward was born in 1787 and educated at Winchester where he first played cricket. His first recorded match was in 1810 when he played for England against Surrey at Lord's. His greatest achievement was when playing for M.C.C. v Norfolk at Lord's in 1820 he scored 279, a record that remained unbroken until W.G. Grace made 344 in 1876. He made eighteen appearances for the Gentlemen v Players between 1819-1838. In 1825 he bought from Thomas Lord, the lease of Lord's cricket ground for five thousand pounds, when Lord was considering selling the ground for building. In 1836 J.H. Dark purchased the remainder of the lease from Ward. Ward was M.P. for the City of London between 1826-1831. He died in 1849
- 141 'Cricket. The Golden Ages'. A.A. Thomson. A folder comprising a collection of correspondence, originally from the archives of the London publisher, Stanley Paul & Co., relating to the publication of Thomson's work in 1961, and subsequent re-issue by The Sportsman's Club in 1962 (Padwick 80). The correspondence commences

- in 1957 with contractual negotiations between the publisher and Thomson, and is followed by letters relating to requests for the reproduction of images with replies from Diana Rait-Kerr, Curator, M.C.C., Christina Beldam etc., and an interesting series of letters from October and November 1961 relating to the use of quotations of the views of Don Bradman for the book's publicity. On 18th November Bradman wrote a two page unsigned typed letter to Thomson, thanking him for sending a copy of his latest book, describing it as 'refreshing and delightful', and continues with comments about the state of the current game referring to Test match run rates, Australia's 'bright attacking play', 'throwers' etc. There then follows a series of letters between the publisher, Thomson and Bradman, relating to whether Bradman's views can be reproduced. In a handwritten letter to the publisher, Thomson express his concern about quoting Bradman's opinions, which are enclosed in a copy of a letter from Bradman to Thomson and further summarised on a separate typed page, and asks that Bradman's permission be sought. In a subsequent typed signed letter, dated 13th November 1961, Bradman gives his permission to use his quotation for the book, but not to use other comments about the state of English cricket, as 'These were personal observations made to a friend [Thomson] and were for his ears alone', which might be construed as criticism of the M.C.C. and compromise his position as Chairman of the Australian Board of Control. Other correspondence includes handwritten letters dated 1962 from Thomson to the publisher requesting copies of the book for sale at venues at which he is giving speeches, various copy letters of congratulation from notable names including P.G. Wodehouse, H.S. 'Harry' Altham, Colin Cowdrey, R.G. Menzies (Prime Minister of Australia) and Lord Birkett. Also included are two pages of Thomson's handwritten 'blurb' and other notes, the publisher's original draft announcement/ press release dated April 1959 etc. An excellent and interesting collection of original correspondence following the course
- of the production of Thomson's work. G £70/100
- Arthur Alexander 'Tommy' Thomson (1894-1968) wrote nearly sixty books including plays, novels, verse, humour, travel, and many on cricket*
- 142 E.W. 'Jim' Swanton. 'E.W.S. at Chelmsford'. Three page typed article for 'The Cricketer' with copious handwritten additions and alterations in red ink in Swanton's hand. In the undated article, Swanton is reporting on the Gillette Cup Quarter-Final match, Essex v Lancashire, at Chelmsford, 30th June 1971, a closely fought match which Lancashire won by twelve runs. Having been set 204 to win by Lancashire, with man of the match, Clive Lloyd, 'a batsman of a class transcending that of anyone in the match', scoring 109, Swanton describes 'A game of the tensest excitement' and with Essex requiring 22 off the last four overs Turner and Hobbs 'swung their bats for the last time [and] the task was just too much'. VG £50/80
- 143 E.W. 'Jim' Swanton. 'Editorial. India and Pakistan'. Three page handwritten editorial by Swanton for 'The Cricketer', undated but written for the January 1971 issue. Swanton opens with an introduction stating this issue is to be the first of three devoted 'in part to different cricket- playing countries of the Commonwealth'. He reports that preparations for this issue, focussing on India and Pakistan, were well underway before war broke out between the two nations and prays for a speedy end to hostilities and that the cricketers would be able to 'resume their... rivalry on the cricket field'. The remainder of the content relates to decisions taken by the T.C.C.B. at a recent meeting relating to the registration of overseas players in County cricket, Test Trial matches, rules for the playing of a series of three one-day matches against Australia in 1972, reversion to the pre-1970 l.b.w. law, structure of the new Benson & Hedges Cup, changes to the Gillette Cup etc. File holes to the pages, some age toning, otherwise in good condition £50/80
- Swanton was Editorial Director of The Cricketer 1966-1983*
- 144 Ian Peebles. Middlesex, Oxford University & England 1928-1948. Haig National Village Championship. Twelve page handwritten article by Peebles for 'The Cricketer', undated but written in 1972, the inaugural year of the competition organised by The Cricketer. Peebles reports on the first Final, played at Lord's, 9th September 1972, between Troon (Ayrshire) and Astwood Bank (Worcestershire), which Troon won by seven wickets. Peebles bemoans 'unwelcoming' weather, and the problems encountered caused by a train derailment preventing some 600 Troon supporters getting to the match. He describes the origins of the competition, the success of 'a lot of enthusiastic play', and comments on how the traditional view of village cricket had changed due to television having 'standardised the life in all hitherto differing communities'. Mention is given to the performances of players, but considers 'Mr Carter [Captain of Troon]... is a minor county batsman of major county calibre'. G/VG £50/80
- 145 Bryan Douglas 'Bomber' Wells. Gloucestershire & Nottinghamshire 1951-1965. 'Things ain't what they used to be'. Two page typed article by Wells with alterations in ink. Signed to the second page by Wells. Undated, but written for 'Nov or Oct Cricketer' 1972. Wells contemplates the current state of the game, believing it lacks 'class players worth seeing', and the necessary 'forcible injection' of one day cricket 'to make the game and players come to life', but that 'Instant cricket, like instant mashed potato is all right, but not the real thing'. He refers to the Ashes series of 1972, Lillee, Marsh and Stackpole being the highlights, but that the first one-day international series 'must have made Brian Close weep with 'two of the fastest bowlers bowling at times with no slips'. - 146 Ray Robinson, cricket writer. 'The Last Man Knew His Place'. Two page typed tribute of Australian spin bowler, Bert Ironmonger, by Robinson for The Cricketer, with a third page being an obituary of Alan Kippax. The article, with handwritten alterations, is undated but almost certainly 1972, the year of Kippax's

- death. Robinson remembers Ironmonger, who died in 1971, with affection and humour, describing his batting role as last man in for Australia as 'beyond attainment by even Bill Bowes for England... If he happened to last an over or two it never gave rise to a delusion that he was improving... the site of Bert taking guard, with ham-like hands doing well to hold the bat right way around', and a delightful story of his wife attempting to telephone him as he walked out to bat at Melbourne and her telling the attendant, 'That's all right- I'll hang on'. The tribute to Kippax describes his 'graceful strokeplay... balance in footwork and timing... his cuts made with a willowy bow'. G/VG £50/80
- 147 John Woodcock, cricket writer and journalist. 'Third Test Match at Edgbaston'. Seven page handwritten article by Woodcock for the September 1970 issue of *The Cricketer*, reporting on the third 'Test', England v Rest of the World', 16th- 21st July 1970. Rest of the World had secured victory by five wickets after England had conceded a first innings lead of 269, and suffered 'two bad accidents' in their second, the running out of Fletcher, and Cowdrey mistiming a long hop on a slow wicket. He commends D'Oliveira's fine innings of 110 in the first, and looked likely to repeat the feat in the second innings when he edged Sobers to slip for 81. He admires the first innings partnership between Sobers and Lloyd which 'decided the match and led to the Rest compiling the largest total ever made against England at Edgbaston'. Needing only 141 to win, the Rest 'made heavy weather of it with Underwood producing 'his best bowling of the series'. Woodcock comments on other players' contributions including that of Peter Pollock who 'found the switch from the press box to the middle rather too demanding. The wicket was about as much good to him as a broken down typewriter'. G/VG £50/80
- John Woodcock was cricket correspondent for The Times from 1954 to 1986, and edited the Wisden Almanack from 1981 to 1986*
- 148 Alan Ross, cricket writer, poet and publisher. 'Old Crock of Gold'. Three page (plus additional slip) handwritten article by Ross for *The Cricketer* 'Bookshelf' book review column on Tom Graveney's autobiography 'Cricket Over Forty'. The article is undated, but would have been written in 1970, the year of the book's publication. Ross describes it as 'one of the more interesting of its type', but considers the title and opening two chapters to be 'a geriatric moan'. Thereafter he admires Graveney's 'lack of bitterness' over matters such as 'Hutton's and May's inflexibly modest estimate of him', 'his dismissal from the Gloucestershire captaincy' and his rejection by England 'when I was playing at my best'. Overall Ross considers it a 'shrewd book... its account of batting against the world's best bowlers uniquely valuable', but closes with the desire to know more about Graveney's 'final, sad suspension from Test cricket for playing in a Sunday benefit match in the middle of a Test'. - Alan Ross became a sports writer for The Observer in 1950 and their cricket correspondent in 1953*
- 149 Alan Ross, cricket writer, poet and publisher. 'A Basis for Discussion'. Three page handwritten article by Ross for *The Cricketer* 'Bookshelf' book review column on 'Don't Play With Apartheid' by Peter Hain. The article is undated, but would have been written in 1971, the year of the book's publication, in which Hain presents his account of the 'Stop the Seventy Tour' campaign which led to the boycotting of sporting and other international contacts with South Africa. Ross admires the 'passionate and energetic nature of [Hain's] commitment... The main dispute was never about ideology, only about tactics' and that Hain 'marshals an impressive array of facts that bear no contradiction' closing with the opinion that the book 'should be required reading for anyone seriously interested in cricket and human justice' and recommends it 'unreservedly'. - 150 Jeffrey Baxter Stollmeyer. Trinidad & West Indies 1938-1957. Four page typed article by Stollmeyer, 'The LBW Law of the Future', dated 28th March 1970 and written for 'Tony Cozier's new magazine', and accompanied by a two page typed letter dated 20th May 1970 to Jim Swanton, asking him to read and comment on the article. Stollmeyer writes at a time of escalating 'turmoil' in Trinidad and Tobago with a State of Emergency having been declared. In the article Stollmeyer presents his arguments for a review of the LBW law to allow umpires to give a batsman out irrespective of where the ball had pitched as, in his view, this would 'encourage the leg-spinner and outswerve bowler to take his rightful place in the game', and require the batsman to attempt to play the ball with the bat, not the pad. The letter is signed 'Jeff'. G/VG £50/70
- Stollmeyer captained West Indies in 13 Test matches and later became a member of the West Indies Board of Control and Test selector*
- 151 'Kapil Dev. Test Programme by David Hookes'. Five page original handwritten manuscript of an article written in 1985 by David Hookes on Kapil Dev for a Test match programme for the 1985/86 India tour to Australia. Hookes opens with the statement, 'Kapil Dev, still only 26, ranks alongside contemporary superstars Ian Botham, Imran Khan, Richard Hadlee and Malcolm Marshall as one of the world's leading allrounders'. Signed 'David Hookes'. Ex Irving Rosenwater collection. G/VG £40/60
- 152 Ian Redpath. Victoria & Australia 1961-1976. Seven page handwritten article titled 'I. Redpath', written by Redpath, reminiscing on his cricketing life from his first visit to the Melbourne Cricket Ground as a ten year old in 1951, attending the Olympic Games in 1956 and later playing there. He recalls his first match at the ground, playing for a combined school XI against opposition that included the former England Test bowler, Frank Tyson. He expresses admiration for Wes Hall 'swinging lustily at Alan Davidson and being left holding the bat handle with the rest in 10 pieces on the middle of the pitch', and recalls that many of the game's great characters were fast bowlers, 'Fred Trueman [being] the only bowler who has never bowled a straight ball in his life', and describes Bill Lawry as 'a

- very tough player'. He closes with an appreciation of the M.C.G. crowd, describing them as 'undoubtedly the largest, noisiest, most unruly, hardest drinking, most sun burnt and, more importantly, most knowledgeable cricket crowd in the world'. Ex Irving Rosenwater collection. VG £60/90
- 153 Allan Robert Border. New South Wales, Queensland, Essex and Australia 1976-1996. Nine page handwritten article by Border with handwritten covering letter to 'Dear Ock' (agent/ publisher?), dated 23rd April 1986, written in Chelmsford. Border is enclosing 'some writings that may be good for the book'. The first page of the article lists famous people Border has met including Princess Diana, Elton John, Mick Jagger, Queen Elizabeth, Des O'Connor, Peter O'Toole etc., which he has crossed out and then started the article with the title 'Royalty & Me', in which he recounts various occasions when his path crossed that of members of the Royal Family. Ex Irving Rosenwater collection. G/VG £60/90
- 154 David Gower. 'D. Gower- Australian Tour 1985'. Five page handwritten manuscript written by Gower for an article looking forward to the impending visit of the Australians for the 1985 Ashes series, with accompanying undated handwritten covering letter to 'Austin', signed 'David', and additional note in Irving Rosenwater's hand 'recd. 13.3.1985'. Gower discusses media attention over 'disappointing performances' of both Australia and England against the formidable West Indies, but that 'both sides now appear to be on the up again' with Australia being led by Allan Border and new faces including Craig McDermott, Dean Jones, Rod McCurdy and Simon O'Donnell. He records that England's recent success in India, 'captained by Gower', was 'not the easiest of tasks... [and] enhanced a number of reputations. Most outstanding was the enigma that is Mike Gatting... for whom India proved a huge turning point', and the 'fighting performances' of Graeme Fowler, resulting in 'some fierce competition' for the opener's slot from Tim Robinson, Martyn Moxon and the returning Graham Gooch from three year's exile. Of the bowlers he lists potential candidates as Phil Edmonds, John Emburey, Pat Pocock, Neil Foster, wicketkeeper Paul Downton, and 'one other name we should ignore at our peril, Ian Terence Botham'. He awaits the series eagerly and its importance for both sides with the Ashes remaining 'one of cricket's great contests'. Ex Rosenwater collection. VG £70/100
- England won the six match Ashes Test series 3-1 with two matches drawn. The selection of the Australian touring party had been affected by a number of notable players had signed up to join the rebel tour to South Africa and were not selected for the series in England*
- 155 Dennis Lillee. 'Test Series, World [Series] Cup, World Champ[ionship]' 1984/85. Four page draft handwritten manuscript of an article by Lillee for The Sun newspaper in Sydney. Lillee reports on the closure of a busy season with the Test series against West Indies, Australia receiving 'a drubbing' in the first two Tests, 'fighting back' in Melbourne and winning in Sydney 'to gain some lost prestige', followed by a 'struggle' in the one day series 'with the World Championship just around the corner'. Contrary to some views, Lillee does not agree that Australia cannot 'compete by world standards', but are 'reshaping' the end of the Greg Chappell era in a similar way after the Bill Lawry era. He lists numerous young players with potential including names such as Ritchie, O'Donnell, Jones, Phillips, Hughes, Alderman, Hookey, Rackemann etc. and considers the situation 'healthy'. The manuscript contained within a paper folder, annotated by Irving Rosenwater and dated 'Recd. 8/3/1985'. G £60/90
- 156 Richard Hadlee. 'The Stage is Set'. Six page handwritten manuscript by Hadlee, dated 21st October 1984. Hadlee is looking forward to the Benson & Hedges World Championship of Cricket, held to celebrate the 150th anniversary of European settlement in Victoria, and feels 'the time is right to win our first ever competition on Australian soil'. He is optimistic for New Zealand's chances having 'a very good draw in our group' against Sri Lanka and West Indies and describes the challenges set by both teams, and an assessment of the other nations taking part. He then provides a summary of individual members of the New Zealand team (including himself). Signed to the last page by Hadlee. G/VG £60/90
- New Zealand's first group match against West Indies was abandoned without a ball bowled. They then beat Sri Lanka to qualify for the semi-final where they lost by seven wickets to the eventual tournament winners, India*
- 157 Cricketana Society List of Members 1930. Two copies of lists of members of the Society, one being Weston's copy of a typed list with alterations and additions in Weston's own hand, the other a six page official printed version comprising introductory letter from Weston, 'List of Suggestions for Working of [the] Society', a small 'Portfolio Specimen Sheet', 'List of Members', 'Minutes' of the first meeting held 21st October 1929, and a 'Bibliography of Cricket'. Notable names of listed members include P.F. Warner, A.W.T. Langford, C.J. Britten, H.A. Cohen, G. Neville Weston, F.S. Ashley-Cooper, C.I.S. Wallace, Henry Ling, Norman Gale etc. Also included is a small selection of accounts and a receipt, apparently written in Weston's own hand. G £40/60
- 158 The Cricketana Society 1929-1935. Buff folder comprising items relating to the formation of the Society and original issues of the Society Journal. Contents include two pages, each with 'Cricketana Society' title in ornate gothic script and the handwritten inscription in ink, 'The following were present at the first meeting held on the 21st October 1929 at the St. Bride's Institute, Bride Lane, Fleet Street, E.C.'. Both pages with the stamped signature of P.F. Warner (Chairman), and signatures in ink below of sixteen attendees including C.J. Britton, G. Neville Weston, C.I.S. Wallace, Henry Ling, R.M. Bell (Richard Moor Bell, London County 1902-1904) etc. Attached to one of the pages is a printed introduction to the Society by G. Other contents include a typed three page 'Circular' announcing the responses received following the announcement in the 'Cricketer' regarding the formation of the Society, outlining plans for annual meetings, election of officers, membership, establishing rules, and the purpose and structure of the club. Signed in ink by C.J. Britten. Also a single page typed Agenda for the inaugural meeting, dated 11th October 1929. Two two-page typed letters from T.R. Hunter, one signed by Hunter, both dated 1933. One, to a Mr. Burr, relates to the revival of the Society and extending its membership world-wide, the prohibitive cost of printing the Journal, and his 'big attempt' to compile a list of 'all books beginning with letters "A", "B" and "C" for the first issue, and asks for a list of books held by the correspondent. George Neville Weston and T.R. Hunter were both founding members of the Cricketana Society when it was formed in 1929, Weston holding the post of Secretary and Treasurer, Hunter compiling the 'Catalogue of Cricket Literature [A to C.B. Fry]', published in the The Cricketana Society Journal. Weston was renowned as being probably the greatest historian on the history of W.G. Grace. Other original members included the collector and writer, Charles Britton, who in 1929 produced 'Cricket Books: the 100 best (old and new)', and in 1935 published a study of Gilbert Jessop, Henry Ling who was a contributor to 'The Cricketer's Manual by "Bat"

(Charles Box). A Short Bibliography' originally published by Weston in 1936, C.I.S. Wallace, a well-known collector who lived in Kent and played cricket for Lessness Park near Bexleyheath, and R.M. Bell, a notable cricketer who was a member of Brackley's tour to Egypt in 1909, and appeared for Sutton C.C. for forty years

159 The Cricket Society early 1960s. Folder of over eighty typed and handwritten correspondence to Peter Barling, Secretary of the Cricket Society, comprising replies to invitations to attend Society dinners. 160 England v Australia. Third Test, The Oval 1884. Facsimile copy of the scorebook for the historic third Test, played 11th- 13th August 1884, accompanied by a single page typed letter and small page of notes handwritten by Irving Rosenwater. In the letter to 'Dear Bertram [Wakley], dated 6th August 1990, Rosenwater sends his thanks for sending the copy of the scorebook, 'which I am very happy to include in my library'. He also comments that he has copies of the original scorebook of the Centenary Test at Melbourne in 1977, given to him by the scorer, G.G.A. Saulez. The letter is nicely signed 'Irving Rosenwater'. In his handwritten note, Rosenwater describes the original 1884 scorebook as being 'housed at Surrey County Hall, and that 'not all the scores add up, eg Murdoch's 211, copied incorrectly from elsewhere. Bowling also in places inaccurate. Overs not always consecutive. On occasions when an over has been omitted, it has been added at end (ie out of sequence). In red ink he closes, 'Copy from B.J. Wakley at Lord's, July 26, 1990'. VG £40/60

1884 was the first English season to feature more than a single Test match, and the third (final) match

of the series ended in a draw. Australia scored 551 in their only innings (McDonnell 103, Murdoch 211, Scott 102), with all eleven of England's players called on to bowl. In reply England scored 346 (Read, batting at number ten, scoring 117), and, following on, ended 85-2, so winning the series 1-0 with two matches drawn

161 Percy Fender. Century in 35 minutes. Facsimile copy of the scorebook for the match Northamptonshire v Surrey played at Northampton, 25th-27th August 1920 in which Fender scored a century in only thirty five minutes, from the collection of Irving Rosenwater, who had apparently acquired the copies in an attempt to resolve a debate over Fender's score in the match. Accompanying the copies are two interesting typed letters written in 1974 between Rosenwater and 'Dick' of The Times newspaper comprising a discussion regarding an anomaly in the scorebook over the insertion of a single in Fender's score by Gerald Brodrigg, plus other research notes in Rosenwater's own hand. Dick states, 'With great daring I rang Gerald Brodrigg... led in on the subject of his letter in the Telegraph... He was very frank about our query... he looked up his notes and found the piece of paper on which he copied Fender from the scorebook... yes the single is inserted by him duly ringed round with a question mark... he cannot recall how or why there should be a single inserted there with a question mark...'. Dick closes by offering to assist Rosenwater 'if you are game to try and trace Fender back ball by ball from the start [of the innings]'. Rosenwater's copy letter reply acknowledges Dick's 'daring... in ringing Gerlad Brodrigg, and though his reply does not advance matters very far, it does resolve the speculation about his grounds for inserting the single'. He continues with references to where scores of '6, 4, 1' occur and that 'I agree that a single must be inserted somewhere (i.e. I don't think Fender's score was 112*), I think I can satisfy you beyond doubt that it cannot be where Brodrigg has inserted it'. VG £40/60

Surrey beat Northamptonshire by eight wickets, scoring 619-5 declared

- in their first innings, Peach ending on 200no, Ducat scoring 149, and Fender recorded on cricketarchive.com as finishing on 113no, not 112!*
- 162 Centenary Test. England v Australia 1977. Facsimile copy of the original scorebook from the Centenary Test played at Melbourne, 12th-17th March 1997, given to Irving Rosenwater by Geoffrey Saulez who was one of the official scorers for the match. Includes a small handwritten note and is contained in an envelope annotated by Rosenwater. The scorebook records the batting and bowling figures for all four innings, and also the attendance and taking for the five days of play. VG £40/60
- Australia won the one-off Test match by 45 runs. They were bowled out for 138 in their first innings but, in reply, England could make only 95. In the second innings Australia scored 419 (Marsh 110no), before dismissing England for 417 (Randall 174). Dennis Lillee took eleven wickets in the match*

THE SIR PELHAM FRANCIS WARNER (1873-1963) ARCHIVE

The personal archive of Sir Pelham Francis Warner (1873-1963). Warner played first-class cricket for Oxford University, Middlesex and England, playing 15 Test matches, captaining in 10 of them, with a record of won 4, lost 6 and succeeded in regaining The Ashes in 1903-04. However he was less successful when he captained England on the tour of South Africa in 1905-06, suffering a resounding 1-4 defeat, the first time England had lost to South Africa in a Test match. He was also to have captained England on the 1911-12

- tour of Australia, but fell ill early in the tour and was unable to play in any of the Tests with Johnny Douglas taking over the captaincy. He was named Wisden Cricketer of the Year in 1904 and also in 1921, making him one of only two to have received the honour twice (the other is Jack Hobbs). The second award marked his retirement as a county player after the 1920 season, in which he captained Middlesex to the County Championship title. In the mid 1920s he was Chairman of Selectors, tour manager on the infamous Bodyline tour of Australia in 1932-33. He was the chairman of the England Test selectors for several years in the 1930s. He later became President of the Marylebone Cricket Club and was knighted for his services to cricket in 1937. Warner wrote extensively on cricket, recounting his Ashes Tests, and a history of Lord's Cricket Ground. He founded The Cricketer magazine, was cricket correspondent of the Morning Post from 1921 to 1933, and subsequently of the Daily Telegraph. He died in 1963 at the age of 89 years

A letter of thanks from Argentina where Warner had led an M.C.C. tour in 1926/27 to South America. Various handwritten letters of congratulation following the Ashes victories in England in 1926, and in Australia on the 1932/33 'Bodyline' series, and a request from the Mount Pleasant Staff Club, London, for Warner to give a talk on his return from the tour. A letter from an admirer dated 1st October 1929 on the eve of Warner's birthday, who points out 'what a month Oct is for good cricketers being born', others in addition to Warner including Rhodes, Bosanquet, Braund and Gunn. A typed letter from the Secretary of the 'Peter Pan Free Kindergarten' in Sydney, addressed to Warner on board the 'Aorangi' en route to New Zealand on the

- 1932/33 tour, reminding Warner of his promise to 'procure the signatures of the members of the team', having apparently made numerous requests earlier in the tour, including to Arthur Mailey, to which Warner stated he was willing to fulfill. A handwritten message wishing Warner a speedy recovery from an 'ulcer in your duodenum'. Four page handwritten letter dated 21st September 1939 from a brother who is at Army college at Camberley etc. G £50/70

A later letter dated 24th June 1957 coincides with another tour by the West Indies, and Warner reports that their fielding 'went to pieces' in the second Test at Lord's, which England won by an innings and 36 runs, 'they [West Indies] will have to do some hard thinking about their side for Nottingham'. He make interesting observations about the Lord's pitch,

- describing it as 'dangerous & I have long been fearful of a dreadful accident'. Despite the pitch 'Weekes played a superb innings. He is a very great batsman'. In contrast Warner states that 'the wicket at Nottingham next Test is too good & we may have to struggle hard there'. He closes with the opinion that 'Dexter is a superb cricketer- another Keith Miller'. All letters are signed 'P.F.W.' Sold with a card with two original mono photograph portraits laid down of Warner, the photograph to the front signed by Warner to the darker part of the photograph, and also to the card below, and dated July 1950. Gilt borders to covers, with raised bands and gilt to spine. All contained in a green cloth slip case.

The album was sold as lot 109 in the Christies sale of 23rd November 1990 to the collector, John Hawkins, who had the case made for the album. He also produced a booklet, 'Victor Trumper's Photograph Album of the Australian Cricket Team's Tour of the British Isles in 1909' published by Christopher Saunders in 2005, in which he provides a commentary on the background to the album and a listing of the enclosed images, assisted in part by a two page listing handwritten in pencil in Trumper's own hand on his sporting business letterhead, which is enclosed loose in a matching portfolio in the box. The album, now in its new case, was sold again by Christies as lot 283 in their sale of 30th October 2012. The album comprises a total of ninety nine original mono photographs. The Christies catalogue for the 1990 sale describes the album thus but, strangely, the 2012 catalogue describes it as 'containing 86 photographs'. We can confirm that the album contains ninety nine images.

The first seventy photographs, each measuring 4.5"x6.5" and laid down two to a page, form the original contents of the album as compiled by Laver, depicting scenes from the 1909 tour. Subjects include members of the touring party swimming in Sydney, departing Melbourne on the 'Orantes', and visiting sites en route in Ceylon, Suez Canal, Naples and Pompeii, and the team on board the White Star Liner, 'Adriatic', at Southampton.

Cricket content include scenes of large crowds in the stands and promenading in the Test matches at Edgbaston, which England won by ten wickets, Lord's, where the Australians levelled the series with a nine wicket win, Leeds, Australia winning by 126 runs, Trumper scoring 27no batting at number seven in the first innings, and the drawn match at The Oval in which Trumper scored 73 and 20 with Warren Bardsley becoming the first player to score a century in both innings of a Test match. Australia won the series 2-1 with two matches drawn. Other cricket matches featured include the tour match v Gloucestershire at Cheltenham College where, captained by Trumper, they narrowly avoided defeat, and a high scoring draw at Canterbury against Kent.

Other images include attending the Henley Regatta, visiting stately homes, Eton College and attractions such as the 'flying cars' at Blackpool, and a photograph of Annette Kellerman, standing full length on a diving board. Kellerman swam for Australia at the 1908 Olympics in London. This section of the album closes with seventeen excellent photographs of the majority of the members of the touring party, each depicted individually in cricket attire at the wicket. Players depicted are Noble, Trumper (twice), Macartney, Whitty, Carter, Carkeek, Hopkins, McAlister, Armstrong, O'Connor, Macartney, Gregory, Bardsley, Ransford, Cotter and Hartigan.

The remainder of the album appears to have been personalised by Trumper, there being a further twenty nine photographs, all slightly smaller, each measuring approx. 4.5"x3.75", from other tours including ten depicting Trumper and W.G. Grace batting in the nets and Trumble bowling, probably from the 1902 tour to England. These do not appear to have been listed by Hawkins and these so called 'missing' images may explain the discrepancy between the two Christies catalogue listings. There next follow eight photographs from the 1903/04 series in Australia, and a further eleven, also probably from the 1902 tour. The 1903/04 images were taken during practice at the Sydney Cricket Ground, and

feature R.A. Duff, C.B. Jennings, R.E. Foster, G.H. Hirst, H. Strudwick, B.J.T. Bosanquet, L.C. Braund and Trumper. Those from 1902 include action from the tour match v M.C.C. and Ground at Lord's with Grace fielding, also George Hirst bowling, and another of Grace, described by John Hawkins as 'the only known action photograph of W.G. Grace bowling his teasing round arm deliveries'. Others appear to be taken at Lord's and Crystal Palace. Some fading to the images makes player identification difficult. The final image in the album is the Australian touring party photographed with unidentified hosts at a social event.

Victor Trumper, who toured with the Australian team on the 1899, 1902, 1905 and 1909 tours of England, was regarded by many of his contemporaries as the greatest of all Australian batsman. His highest first class score was 300no v Sussex in 1899, and he scored almost 17,000 runs at an average of 44.57. The 1909 tour was to be his last to the Mother Country. By 1914 his health had deteriorated and in 1915 he died of Bright's disease aged only 37 years.

Albums such as this that Laver produced share common photographs but were personalised with images relevant to the specific recipient. This copy has been further personalised by Trumper to create a unique personal souvenir of tours on which Trumper played. Each album was numbered sequentially by the player's alphabetical listing on the tour party. Interestingly this means that Trumper's copy should have been number '14'. John Hawkins suggests 'someone was not presented with one... the player in question was McAlister who had been foisted on to the team by the Board of Control, and was therefore unpopular with both the manager, Laver, and the captain, Noble'

DAVID DENTON. YORKSHIRE & ENGLAND 1894-1920

David Denton. Yorkshire & England 1894-1920. Four large impressive, neatly compiled, uniformly bound personal albums covering Denton's playing and umpiring career containing some early, rare and much sought after items. David Denton (1874-1950) was a very effective, attacking right hand batsman whose attacking play, although risky, bought over 36,000 runs in first class cricket. His nickname of 'Lucky' came from his habit of surviving the numerous chances that his attacking batting style created for the opposition. He was a great hero of Yorkshire cricket between 1894 and 1920 and played eleven Tests for England. He scored 1000 runs in a season twenty one times in that period. His fine wristy stroke play ensured that all runs were scored quickly. He was also one of the finest deep fielders in England of his period. In 1905, Denton had a fantastic year, scoring 2,405 runs earning himself Wisden Cricketer of the Year recognition in Wisden 1906. In July 1905, he was chosen to play against Australia at Headingley at Leeds, but he failed to make the most of his opportunity and was dismissed for 0 and 12, being dropped from the team immediately thereafter. He was recalled for the tour to South Africa that winter, and played in all five Tests. He made just one fifty in ten innings, and was again dropped from the side, but nevertheless played five more Test matches for England on a second and final tour of South Africa, in 1909/10. In the third Test at Johannesburg he made 104 at about a run a minute, but in no other innings did he even pass 30, and his England career came to a permanent end. Yorkshire won the County Championship on nine occasions during his player career and were in the top four for twenty one years of the twenty three years in which he played

He scored centuries in four consecutive innings in 1913 and four times scored centuries in both innings of a match, he made 2037 runs at an average of 41.57 with seven centuries and nine half centuries and a highest score of 168. His one appearance in Test cricket came against Armstrong's touring Australian side in 1921 at Headingley in a match where Jack Hobbs had to withdraw on the opening day because of appendicitis. Hardinge scored 25 and 5 and was not picked again. As a footballer, Hardinge played as an inside forward during

the cricket off-season and played for Newcastle United, Sheffield United and Woolwich Arsenal, as well as playing one International match for England making him a 'Double International'

Tom Webster (1886-1962) was a British cartoonist and caricaturist who specialised in sporting cartoons. He started out at the Sports Argus in Birmingham, then later the Evening News, before joining the Daily Mail in 1919. He specialised in cartoons of horseracing, cricket and golf, and stayed at the Mail for over twenty years. He left the Daily Mail in 1940, but continued to draw for other newspapers and his own range of annuals, until 1960. He died in 1962, aged 76

In the second Ashes Test, England's first innings closed at 425, Duleep-sinhji scoring 173. In reply Australia amassed 729 for 6 dec. (Bradman 254, Woodfull 155). England were dismissed for 375 in the second innings (Chapman 121, Grimmett six wickets), Australia going on to win by seven wickets

He left the Daily Mail in 1940, and later during the war he performed in concert parties in France and Belgium, as a cartoonist and comedian, as well as doing some work as a war correspondent. He continued to draw for other newspapers, and his own range of annuals, until 1960.

Originally published in 1812 in instalments by subscription, Sherwood Neely and Jones (later Sherwood, Jones & Co.) published three volumes by Pierce Egan

between 1818 and 1821, and a further single volume, designated the 'fourth' volume, by John Bee (John Badcock), in 1824. According to the 'History & Bibliography of Boxing' by R.A. Hartley (2009), Egan produced his own 'fourth' and fifth volumes which were originally published by George Virtue in 1828 and 1829. For legal reasons Egan was only permitted to continue to use the title 'Boxiana' provided he used the wording 'New Series'. However, the title page of each of the five volumes offered in this lot each carry the publication details 'London: Printed for Sherwood, Neely and Jones, Paternoster Row, 1829'.

Thomas Cribb and Ned Painter were champion English bare-knuckle boxers. Born in England, William Fuller made his name in boxing in America.

The bookplate of Tooley appears to be that of Ernest Terah Hooley, of Risley Hall, Derbyshire, a financial fraudster who was declared bankrupt four times and served two terms in prison

J.H. Taylor won the Open Golf Championship on five occasions in 1894, 1895, 1900, 1909 and

Edwin Trim & Co. Wimbledon.

The following twenty seven lots contain original real photograph postcards of tennis by renowned publisher Edwin Trim (1863-1952). Trim was a local printer and stationer in Wimbledon, his shop was in Hill Road, Wimbledon. He produced posters and programmes for the Wimbledon championships from 1893 onwards, from around 1903 he started the first known Wimbledon photo-cards with his first known card being a ladies singles match during the Championships. The iconic Trim Photo-card era lasted for more than three decades. With only odd exceptions nearly all his postcards featured photographs taken at Wimbledon. There is no evidence that Trim was a photographer and may well have sourced his images from local photographers. In 1938 with the death of his son, the company's long association with The All England Club came to an end however the name continued with cards supplied by City Press Agency. Reggie Doherty won four consecutive Wimbledon gentlemen's singles titles 1897-1900, with younger brother Laurie achieving the feat five times 1902-1906. The brothers also won the Wimbledon doubles title together eight times between 1897 and 1905, and Laurie become the

Of the many cricket tours I have taken part in, I always look back on this one as the most delightful- quite apart from any personal success I was fortunate enough to achieve. No happier band of cricketers, I believe, ever toured, and the charm of the trip was very largely due to our Captain [Lord Brackley]- I was exceedingly happy moreover in the companionship of my very dear friend, Hesketh Prichard'.

Twenty matches were played on the tour in Jamaica, Barbados, St. Lucia, British Guiana, St. Vincent, and Trinidad, and the summary of the results is recorded as 'Matches played, 20. Won 11; Lost 3; Drawn 6'. Each match is presented with a title page followed by two facing pages comprising a match report providing a firsthand account of the match and comprehensive scorecard. The final two pages list the batting and bowling averages of the tourists and their opponents. For the tourists, Wynyard (Hampshire 71 matches, 3 Tests) topped the batting averages scoring 908 runs in 24 innings, including four centuries (highest 157) at an average of 41.27,

followed by Ernie Hayes (Surrey 500 matches, 5 Tests), 26 innings, 925 runs, three centuries (highest 173), average 38.54. George Thompson (Northamptonshire 222 matches, 6 Tests) led the bowling averages, bowling 490.2 overs (more than twice the number bowled by anyone else), of which 130 were maidens, taking 126 wickets for 1347 runs at an average of 10.61. A photograph of Lord Brackley, who became Earl of Ellesmere in 1915 after the death of his father, is laid down to the inside front cover. Loosely inserted at the rear are two newspaper cuttings and an original printed scorecard of the return match played in June 1906 between Brackley's team and the touring West-Indies side at Lord's.

Given that this was produced as a wedding gift to Brackley, it is likely that only a few copies were printed, there is no copy at Lord's, and only three other copies of the book have been noted of which two are known to have belonged to members of the tour party, G.H. Drummond (Northamptonshire 4 matches) and the vice-captain, A.W.F. Somerset (Sussex 5 matches), supporting the view that copies of the book were supplied only to the tourists. An important record from the 'Golden Age' of cricket. Previously sold by Christies as lot 2 in the sale of July 1994. The tour party set off on 31st December 1904, arriving in Jamaica on 11th January 1905. Twenty matches were played of which ten were ranked as first-class. Unlike the two earlier tours to the West Indies, Brackley's side had two fine professionals, Ernie Hayes who top-scored on the tour, and George Thompson who took most wickets on the tour. The thirteen playing members of the touring party were accompanied by J. Moss a first-class umpire, M. Bellamy, employed as groundsman at Brackley's estate who acted as scorer, and W.H. Beton, a Lord's dressing room attendant. All these support staff played some matches on tour. (One of Bellamy's matches was first-class but this is not recorded in the Who's Who of Cricketers.)

Both Hayes and Wynyard acted as

'special correspondents' to major UK sporting newspapers, generally sending in reports weekly. Hesketh-Prichard (Hampshire 60 matches), a professional writer and distinguished soldier, also reported on the tour. When at full strength, with Olliviere, Cumberbatch and Lebrun Constantine (father of Learie), the West Indies were formidable opposition. Whilst the tour was a happy and successful one, it wasn't without 'irritating occurrences' including two involving Brackley who, in a match in St. Vincent, was bounced out, and subsequently reportedly abused by the same bowler in a later match causing him to leave the field in a tantrum.

Two matches were played against 'All West Indies', the first in Bridgetown, Barbados was won by Lord Brackley's XI by an innings and 17 runs (Wynyard 101, Thompson 11 wickets). The other at Port of Spain, Trinidad was an exciting and close fought contest with Brackley's XI prevailing by only four runs. Neither match was awarded Test status, but the quality of the play arguably merited it.

The Scottish playwright, novelist and creator of Peter Pan, James Matthew Barrie (1860-1937), founded the cricket team, Allahakbarries, which was active from 1890 to 1913. Barrie was knighted in 1913.

Alan Alexander Milne (1882-1956) was an English playwright and author, best known for his books about the teddy bear Winnie-the-Pooh and for various poems, and wrote several books on cricket. Considered a talented cricket fielder, Milne played for two amateur teams that were largely composed of British writers: the Allahakbarries and the Authors XI. His team mates included fellow writers, J. M. Barrie, Arthur Conan Doyle and P. G. Wodehouse
