### CRICKET EPHEMERA

- 1 Harvard Cricket Club (Massachusetts, U.S.A.). Official membership certificate issued to R.P. Bass, and signed by A.J. Peters Jr., Secretary of the Club. The undated certificate with emblem of crossed bats and stumps to centre, and wax seal to lower left corner incorporating the date 1862, assumed to be the year the Club was formed. Mounted, framed and glazed in contemporary wooden frame, overall 9.25"x11". G £40/60
- 2 South Africa v Australia. 'Triangular Tournament' 1912. Original ticket for the Test match played at Old Trafford on the 28th and 29th May 1912. The ticket has crease and repair to corner, seat number overwritten. Sold with further match tickets for the Mound Stand for the Eton v Harrow match at Lord's 1912, ticket for the Grandstand for the New South Wales v South Australia match played on the 13th January 1940 plus membership cards for Cambridge University Cricket Club 1921 Trinity College C.C. 1939 and Lancing College C.C. 1944. Odd faults, good £50/70  
*Australia won the Test in 1912 by an innings and 88 runs in two days*
- 3 Harold Thomas William 'Wally' Hardinge. Kent & England 1902-1933. Official menu and invitation card for the 'Dinner in Honour of Cricket' held at The Mansion House, London on the 12th October 1927. The invitation reads 'The Lord Mayor requests the honour of the company of Mr W. Hardinge at Dinner on Wednesday October 12th at seven for half past seven o'clock'. Evening or morning dress. The three page folding menu, with one third neatly detached has the name 'Hardinge' circled in ink. Folds and nicks to the menu. Good condition £30/50
- 4 'The Olympian Cricket Club. Seventh Season, 1884'. Official folding programme for the Annual Sports event held at Horning's Field, Clapton, 27th September 1884. The

four page programme with printed titles, list of officers and regulations to front, and list of sporting events to centre pages. Printed by Chardin of Clapton. Horizontal and vertical folds, otherwise in good/ very good condition £25/35

- 5 South Africa 1935. 'British Sportman's Club' luncheon menu held for the South African team at the Savoy Hotel, 17th April 1935. 8pp and card wrappers with decorative front cover featuring a cartoon by Tom Webster of a lion dressed as an umpire with the caption 'Greetings! South Africa the English umpire welcomes you. May your stumps be tiny - your bat large and the ball ever joyful for you'. Light vertical creasing to internal pages, otherwise in good/ very good condition £30/50
- 6 Kensington Oval, Barbados. Two original large printed seating plans, one for the Kensington Stand measuring 40.5"x14", the other for the George Challenor Memorial Stand, 24"x14". Dates unknown, possibly 1950s/1960s. Some staining to the Challenor plan, otherwise in good condition £30/50
- 7 Oxford University C.C. 1960. Two original handbills/ posters, one listing 'Home Matches 1960' at The Parks, 9"x13", the other with information regarding membership, subscriptions privileges etc., 8.75"x11". Also an official folding fixture card for the 1960 season. All three printed by the Holywell Press, Oxford. Light creasing to the posters, otherwise in good/ very good condition. Qty 3 £30/40
- 8 'CRICKET!! The opening day of the Gateshead Borough Cricket Club will take place on Whit-Monday [8th June 1840] on their new ground near the flats on which occasion A Grand Match will be played between the Married and Single members. Wickets to be pitched at One o'clock precisely'. Original and early advertising broadside for the match, printed by M. Benson, No 3, Foot of Dean Street Newcastle with wood engraved vignette of the game at the

head of the broadside. Advertising to the lower quarter reads 'W. Mould, Turks Head Inn, Gateshead respectfully informs his friends and public, that he has erected a large and commodious Tent for the occasion, where Refreshments may be had on reasonable Terms'. The broadside measures 9"x 11.25". '1840' added in ink to the broadside. Some wear to extremities otherwise in good condition for its age. Loosely mounted in modern cream mount. A rare surviving broadside from the match played in 1840. Previously sold by Christie's Auctioneers in November 2011 £250/350

- 9 Cricket patents 1935. An interesting selection of original official documentation for Patent No. 426150 issued to Francis Anderson and dated 10th January 1934 for 'Improvements in Cricket Wickets'. Documents include official seal, Patent Specification, diagrams, description and diagram of 'Additional improvements' etc. Some ageing and wear, otherwise in good condition £40/60
- 10 M.C.C. tour to West Indies 1974. Official players' itinerary booklet issued to Derek Underwood for the tour, with his hand written annotations to pages. Previously sold by T. Vennett-Smith as lot 61 in the sale of 26th November 2013. VG £40/60
- 11 Bodyline. M.C.C. tour to Australia 1932/33. Scarce original tour booklet issued on board the S.S. Orontes. Believed to be Freddie Brown's copy with his handwritten match scores in ink to the Notes page. Previously sold as part of the Freddie Brown collection in November 2013 by T. Vennett-Smith. Rusting to staples, splitting to spine, and some age toning to wrappers, otherwise in good condition £140/180
- 12 'Champion County [Nottinghamshire] v. Rest of England' 1907. Official ticket for the second day of the match played at the Kennington Oval, 12th- 14th September 1907, for the East Stand, price 1s. 0d. The ticket is clipped to the left edge and lower corner, and laid down to a

- ruled page. Sold with a press cutting image of Warner and Hayward walking out to bat for The Rest in the same match, similarly laid down. G £25/35
- The match was drawn. Plum Warner scored 116 and 113no for The Rest. Other centurions were J.T. Tyldesley (114no) for The Rest and J.R. Gunn (105no) for Nottinghamshire, both in the second innings*
- 13 John Berry 'Jack' Hobbs. Surrey & England 1905-1934. Large original ledger/ journal relating to Hobbs' sports business, 'Jack Hobbs Limited'. Accounts are for the period 1964-1980 and cover profit and loss accounts, sales, expenses, directors' and staff salaries, audits, bad debts, carriage and postage, bank deposits, dividends, expenses, advertising in various sporting publications include Surrey C.C.C. fixture cards etc. Includes references to directors, J.D., L.E. and I.H. Hobbs, all relations of Jack Hobbs. The ledger with heavy duty metal hinges and thick boards. Minor wear to boards, otherwise in good/ very good condition £40/60
- Hobbs founded his sports shop in Fleet Street, London in 1919. While Jack was playing cricket the shop was overseen by his younger brother, Sidney, until 1931 who then returned to Cambridge. Jack continued to run the London shop for many years and claimed he earned more from his shop than he did from cricket. He died in 1963. The Cambridge outlet remained a Hobbs family-run business until it was bought out in 2015.*
- 14 Australia tour to West Indies 1955. A large selection of over forty original newspapers with coverage of the 1955 Australian tour to West Indies. Newspapers include Guiana Graphic, The Daily Chronicle (Georgetown, British Guiana), Trinidad Guardian, The Star (Kingston, Jamaica), The Daily (and Sunday) Gleaner (Kingston, Jamaica) etc. The newspapers with significant age toning and very brittle to page edges, overall in very fragile condition £50/70
- 15 'The Standard'. 9th September 1880. Original complete copy of the broadsheet newspaper with a lengthy report, covering two and a half columns, on the first Test match between England and Australia to be played in England, at The Oval, 6th- 8th September 1880. England, with the three Grace brothers, W.G., E.M. and G.F., won by five wickets, W.G. Grace scoring 152 in England's first innings, Murdoch 152no in Australia's second innings following on. The newspaper is preserved flat in removable clear perspex and in very good condition £100/150
- George Frederick Grace made his only Test appearance in this match, being dismissed for nought, second ball, in both innings. Less than two weeks later he developed pneumonia and died on his way to play in a match in Winchester*
- 16 Shane Warne and Dennis Lillee. Two original colour newspaper posters celebrating Shane Warne's significant achievements. One copy with headline '500 Wickets', Herald Sun, 13th March 2004 and the other with headline 'Warne's Magic Milestone', Sydney Morning Herald, 27th December 2006. Sold with an original poster for the Daily Mirror (New South Wales) dated 9th August 1982 with the headline 'Lillee. Row grows over bet'. Each measures approx. 16"x23". Light folds, otherwise in very good condition. Sold with a large colour copy portrait photograph of Warne, signed by Warne. 8"x12". VG. Qty 4 £60/80
- Warne took his 500th Test wicket against Sri Lanka in Galle, 2004. His 700th dismissal was that of Andrew Strauss in the Melbourne Ashes Test of December 2007. The Dennis Lillee poster refers to the bet that Lillee and Rod Marsh had in 1981 against England winning the Leeds Test with odds of 500-1*
- 17 'Henry Baker's "Loafers" v Cotswold Magpies' 1867-1879. Large original scorebook published by James Lillywhite, in which is recorded a series of annual matches played between the two teams, the majority written in ink in neat copperplate handwriting. The book appears to be lacking the first page from the 1867 match. Some pages include comments on the match such as 'These birds visited Worcester on July 22 [1867], tho' hardly fledged managed to pull off the match owing to the clipping innings of little "K". Thence to Gl'ster where some long legged loafers from Hardwick Court stopped their flight...', and references to 'Dancing at Hardwicke Court'. The scorebook concludes with matches played by the Loafers against Minchinhampton 1883, and Guy Stanton's XI 1886. Breaking to page block, staining to covers, otherwise in generally good condition £40/60
- Little information can be found, although records exist of matches played by the Cotswold Magpies against Worcestershire in the period 1867-1876. Harwicke Court in Gloucestershire, home of the Lloyd-Baker family*
- 18 Haresfield C.C., Gloucestershire 1882 & 1883. Two large original cloth bound scorebooks published by James Lillywhite comprising scores of matches played by Haresfield C.C. in seasons 1882 and 1883. Includes matches played against Gloucestershire 2nd XI in 1882, also Minchinhampton C.C., Frocester C.C., Frampton C.C., Churchdown C.C., etc. Wear to the covers of both scorebooks, breaking to page blocks, staining to some pages of the 1882 book, otherwise in generally good condition £60/90
- 19 Cricket scrapbooks 1948 & 1949. Two scrapbooks, one comprising press cuttings covering the M.C.C. tour and Test series to South Africa 1948/49, the other for the New Zealand tour to England 1949. Both albums with cuttings laid down with accompanying handwritten details. G/VG £30/50
- 20 Lord's and World Cup 1999. An original Lord's bar towel with rainbow colours sold with a section of 'ICC Cricket World Cup England '99' bunting comprising twenty two hanging cards with four repeating designs. G £20/30

A selection of original orders of services of thanksgiving for Godfrey Evans held at Canterbury Cathedral, 21st September 1999, Bob Woolmer held at St. John's Wood Church, 7th September 2007, Sir Alec Bedser, Southwark Cathedral, 12th July 2010, Christopher Martin-Jenkins, St. Paul's Cathedral, 16th April 2013, also for the Service Commemorating the Centenary of the Death of Dr. W.G. - 23 Don Bradman. 'Bradman Writes For Us'. Original newspaper poster for The News (Adelaide), dated 7th December 1984, printed by Nationwide News, Adelaide. 16"x24". Horizontal fold, some age toning, otherwise in good condition £30/40
- 24 West Indies. Two original 78rpm records by Egbert Moore (Lord Beginner). 'Victory Test Match-Calypso. England v West Indies, Lords 1950' with the Calypso Rhythm Kings, Melodisc. 'M.C.C. v West Indies Calypso' 1949, accompanied by Gerald Clark and his Caribbean Serenaders, Brunswick Ltd. G £50/70
- 25 Irving Rosenwater archives 1959-2003. - 27 Cricket Club histories c. 1930s. A large collection collected by Irving Rosenwater comprising typed and handwritten articles on club histories. Contained in four folio buff folders, the articles cover clubs nationally with particular emphasis on London, southern and south western clubs. Included are a good number of typescripts for a series of articles by 'Greenmantle' written for and published in the News Chronicle in the 1930s, with some cuttings of the published articles included. Clubs covered include Gore Court (Sittingbourne), Merton (Surrey), Hemel Hempstead, The Butterflies, Whitstable & Tankerton, Tring Park, Wolverhampton, Basingstoke & North Hants, East Grinstead, Notts Amateur, Leicester Ivanhoe, Downend, Bradford, Bury, and the wandering clubs of Free Foresters and Band of Brothers. - 30 Harold W. Dalton. England masseur. M.C.C. tour to Australia and New Zealand 1954/55. 'Ideal' exercise book with daily diary entries handwritten in ink by Dalton recording travel, activities for each day, and his observations on conditions and his records of players' injuries and treatments during tour and Test matches. Examples include 'Feb 18-22 Tyson coming off with a strain... Loader with bruised h/ string (he could have played)', 'Feb 26 Tyson clear. Loader clear. Bailey doubtful for Test... Cowdrey in bed Doctor attended'. Includes items mounted or loosely inserted including an S.S. Orsova 'Information for Passengers' leaflet, tourist information leaflets produced by the Orient Line for Perth & Fremantle, Cocos Islands, Colombo, Aden, Suez Canal- Port Said, Naples, Pompeii, Marseilles, and Gibraltar, a Western Australia official 'Introduction card', invitations, Central Bank of Ceylon and Egyptian bank notes, and closes with an official M.C.C. invitation issued to Dalton to attend the dinner at The Dorchester, 6th June 1955, to welcome the return of the touring party. - 31 Cricket prints, posters and programmes. Box comprising a selection including including a limited edition print of 'The Oval' signed by the artist, Alan Fearnley. A large selection of approx. 230 large original colour page book plates of players from 'The Lord's Taverners Fifty Greatest'. Four unsigned 'Art of Sport Miniature Collection' miniature bats. Signatures of Godfrey Evans, Carl Hooper and Phil DeFreitas each mounted with a photograph of the player. A large selection of modern Test match programmes, a modern cricket trophy etc. Mixed condition, generally good £30/50
- 32 Phillips auction catalogues 1978 to 1986. Collection of fifteen Phillips auction catalogues, some with results on printed sheets and others with results written to the pages. Formerly the property of Irving Rosenwater. Newsletters include issue nos. 26, 28-32, 34, 35, 43, 44, 48, 49, 51, 53, 54, 57, 60, 61, 63-65, 67, 69, 71 and 80 for the period 1966-1988. Annual reports cover seasons 1974/75-1976/77, 1982/83-1985/86 and 1990/91. Some duplication of issues. Also includes a typed letter to the publishers of the newsletter, PBL, from Irving Rosenwater, dated 19th August 1986, in which he bemoans the content of the Annual Report/ newsletter, complaining 'what a very pale shadow of a real annual report it is' suggesting 'it behoves the club to pause, think afresh, and direct itself to a dignified and comprehensive report on its annual activities'. - 34 'Why Envy? Learn Successful Methods and apply Them. Bill Jones' 1928. Original colour motivational 'life-coaching' poster published by Parker-Holladay & Co., London, who created the character, Bill Jones, to encourage good workplace behaviour and improve productivity. The poster depicts two cricketers in the foreground looking on at an opposition player being carried on the shoulders of team mates surrounded by attractive ladies. An excellent example of graphic design from the 1920s. Printed in England, this is numbered '16' to lower right corner in the series produced. 22"x28". Some wear to edges, 4" tear to lower edge and other nicks/ wear to edges, pinhole rust marks to corners, otherwise in good condition £40/60  
*The 'productivity at work' poster campaign was so successful that the posters were subsequently used in America and Canada*
- 35 South African cricket statistical surveys 1960s/1970s. A collection of eight facsimile copies of handwritten statistical surveys compiled by Denys Heesom covering cricket in South Africa for seasons 1969/70-1975/76 and 1977/78. Also a similar survey, 'South African First-Class Matches', dated October 1971. The majority stored in plain buff folders and in original envelopes sent to Irving Rosenwater with correspondence between Heesom and Rosenwater. G £30/50
- 36 Cricket ephemera and memorabilia. - 37 'Eleven of England in Australia with Mr. Mallam' 1861/62. Very rare and early large silk handkerchief commemorating England's first cricket tour to Australia. The centre printed in sepia with an image of the eleven members of the touring party, all named, standing with the tour manager, Mallam, and title below, all within a wide yellow border. Players are H.H. Stephenson (Captain), Bennett, Iddison, Lawrence, Hearne, Mudie, Sewell, Mortlock, Caffyn, Griffith and E. Stephenson, with Mr. W.B. Mallam to the centre. Not depicted is the twelfth member of the party, 'Tiny' Wells. Below the image the embroidered initials 'R.S.' (Richard Sanderson of Swaley, Clitheroe). 35"x33" in modern

*In 1861, 'Spiers and Pond' brought over to Australia the first All-England cricket team, who sailed on Isambard Kingdom Brunel's steamship, SS Great Britain, from Liverpool. This was the first commercial sponsorship of cricket.*

*The idea for the tour came from the English proprietors of a Melbourne company called Spiers and Pond, which ran the Café de Paris in the city. Spiers was Felix William Spiers and Pond was Christopher Pond. Their representative in England, a Mr Mallam, had tried to interest Charles Dickens in a lecture tour of Australia and New Zealand, offering him £7,000, later increased to £10,000, to travel to Australia, but Dickens turned the offer down. Instead, having noted the success of the first England overseas cricket tour of 1859 to North America and the growing popularity of cricket in Australia, Spiers and Pond decided to attract a team of leading English cricketers. Mr Mallam therefore journeyed to Birmingham in September 1861 to watch the North v. South game at Aston Park. During the game, Mallam met the cricketers at the nearby Hen and Chicken Hotel to make a business proposal. As a result, twelve players agreed to tour Australia the following winter on terms of £150 per man plus expenses.*

*Richard Withington Bromiley Sanderson played one first-class match, for Lancashire, in 1870*

38 'To the Admirers of the Noble Game of Cricket.'. A large, colourful and striking printed cotton commemorative handkerchief, with the England XI of 1847 after the watercolour by Felix to centre. Wide red border with vignettes of the laws of cricket, a village game and of batsmen illustrating a variety of strokes including Forward, Leg half volley, Home block, The Draw etc. Surmounted by a cricketer riding a flying bat (mammal). Framed and glazed, overall 36"x29". Various

39 Cotton table cloth with over one hundred embroidered signatures of county players including the 'Champion County 1904' (Lancashire) with embroidered red rose emblem and title to the top, and a further nine county emblems and colours, the majority probably cap or blazer badges, for twelve counties, M.C.C., members of the 1904 South African touring party etc. 'Signatures' include A.C. He talks of being taken to watch Pudsey play Saltaire, whilst still a 'babe in arms' and seeing Sidney Barnes playing for Saltaire, 'fifteen years later I played against the great S.F. Barnes and made 69 no. Barnes was 60 years of age', talks of playing football and golf 'Cricket however was the game that attracted me most, at a very young age I realised the value of a straight bat', mentions learning a great deal through playing with a tennis ball in the church yard, talks at length about joining the Boys Brigade, summer week-ends, cross country runs, football match, parading around Pudsey, Brigade rally in Leeds etc. Some excellent content. - 124 Keith Stackpole. World Championship of Cricket 1985. Three page handwritten manuscript for an article by Stackpole with accompanying handwritten note by Irving Rosenwater. Stackpole anticipates the Championship as the 'biggest cricket extravaganza ever staged', notes that the Australian players had undertaken a 'rigorous training programme... to help us match and hopefully overcome the mighty West Indies'. He describes the group structure of the tournament and believes 'it seems obvious that the W.I. will qualify top [of their group] so I think it is imperative that [Australia] also finish top of our group in order to set up a final shootout between us and the W.I.'. - The Benson and Hedges World Championship of Cricket was a one day international tournament held to celebrate the 150th anniversary of European settlement in Victoria. Comprising the seven Test-playing teams of the period, matches were played in Melbourne and Sydney, with the former hosting the first international match to be played under floodlights. Australia won only one of their three group matches and failed to qualify for the semi-finals. West Indies topped their group but were beaten by Pakistan in the semi-final. India, who were undefeated throughout the tournament, beat Pakistan in the final by eight wickets*
- 125 Allan Border. 'Pakistan 1980-1982'. A fifteen page handwritten manuscript and a further three pages of typescript by Border for a chapter for a book, possibly his autobiography. - Swanton was Editorial Director of The Cricketer 1966-1983*
- 131 Ian Peebles. Middlesex, Oxford University & England 1928-1948. Haig National Village Championship. Twelve page handwritten article by Peebles for 'The Cricketer', undated but written in 1972, the inaugural year of the competition organised by The Cricketer. Peebles reports on the first Final, played at Lord's, 9th September 1972, between Troon (Ayrshire) and Astwood Bank (Worcestershire), which Troon won by seven wickets. Peebles bemoans 'unwelcoming' weather, and the problems encountered caused by a train derailment preventing some 600 Troon supporters getting to the match. He describes the origins of the competition, the success of 'a lot of enthusiastic play', and comments on how the traditional view of village cricket had changed due to television having 'standardised the life in all hitherto differing communities'. Mention is given to the performances of players, but considers 'Mr Carter [Captain of Troon]... is a minor county batsman of major county calibre'. G/VG £40/60
- 132 Bryan Douglas 'Bomber' Wells. Gloucestershire & Nottinghamshire 1951-1965. 'Things ain't what they used to be'. Two page typed article by Wells with alterations in ink. Signed to the second page by Wells. Undated, but written for 'Nov or Oct Cricketer' 1972. Wells contemplates the current state of the game, believing it lacks 'class players worth seeing', and the necessary 'forcible injection' of one day cricket 'to make the game and players come to life', but that 'Instant cricket, like instant mashed potato is all right, but not the real thing'. He refers to the Ashes series of 1972, Lillee, Marsh and Stackpole being the highlights, but that the first one-day international series 'must have made Brian Close weep with 'two of the fastest bowlers bowling at times with no slips'. - 133 John Woodcock, cricket writer and journalist. 'Third Test Match at Edgbaston'. Seven page handwritten article by Woodcock for the September 1970 issue of *The Cricketer*, reporting on the third 'Test', England v Rest of the World', 16th- 21st July 1970. Rest of the World had secured victory by five wickets after England had conceded a first innings lead of 269, and suffered 'two bad accidents' in their second, the running out of Fletcher, and Cowdrey mistiming a long hop on a slow wicket. He commends D'Oliveira's fine innings of 110 in the first, and looked likely to repeat the feat in the second innings when he edged Sobers to slip for 81. He admires the first innings partnership between Sobers and Lloyd which 'decided the match and led to the Rest compiling the largest total ever made against England at Edgbaston'. Needing only 141 to win, the Rest 'made heavy weather of it with Underwood producing 'his best bowling of the series'. Woodcock comments on other players' contributions including that of Peter Pollock who 'found the switch from the press box to the middle rather too demanding. The wicket was about as much good to him as a broken down typewriter'. G/VG £40/60
- John Woodcock was cricket correspondent for The Times from 1954 to 1986, and edited the Wisden Almanack from 1981 to 1986*
- 134 Jeffrey Baxter Stollmeyer. Trinidad & West Indies 1938-1957. Four page typed article by Stollmeyer, 'The LBW Law of the Future', dated 28th March 1970 and written for 'Tony Cozier's new magazine', and

accompanied by a two page typed letter dated 20th May 1970 to Jim Swanton, asking him to read and comment on the article. Stollmeyer writes at a time of escalating 'turmoil' in Trinidad and Tobago with a State of Emergency having been declared. In the article Stollmeyer presents his arguments for a review of the LBW law to allow umpires to give a batsman out irrespective of where the ball had pitched as, in his view, this would 'encourage the leg-spinner and outswerve bowler to take his rightful place in the game', and require the batsman to attempt to play the ball with the bat, not the pad. Following their victory, Swanton states 'the Australians must have left Lord's mighty happy on the extent to which their all-round stock has recently risen', but notes that 'the selectors did not have the side they wanted' and 'Boycott's contribution to the game was negligible... M.C.C.'s batting was laboured apart from Denness'. He closes by looking forward to the first Test at Old Trafford. File holes, otherwise in good/ very good condition £50/70

- 138 E.W. 'Jim' Swanton. 'E.W.S. at Hove'. Three page handwritten article for 'The Cricketer'. In the undated article Swanton is reporting on the close of the drawn County Championship match at Hove, Sussex v Yorkshire, 15th- 18th May 1971. He describes John Hampshire's innings for Yorkshire of 183no as being 'full of honour', and the 'persevering' medium-pace bowling of Tony Greig. He then carries out an analysis of why the match did not produce a result with Yorkshire unable to bowl out Sussex cheaply in the first innings 'on a fast, fresh pitch', the loss of an hour to weather, having to adapt to a rain affected wicket on the second day, and Sussex's 'inadequate bowling and catching mistakes'. Despite the lack of a result, Swanton enjoyed 'watching from the deck-chairs with the sun on our faces'. Some minor creasing, otherwise in good condition £50/70

- 139 J.L. Manning. Sports correspondent for the Daily Mail. Mexico World Cup 1970. Five page typescript with annotations and alterations in Manning's own hand, written for 'The Cricketer' magazine. Manning is writing having just seen Brazil beat Italy to win the Jules Rimet trophy for the third time. He opens by justifying writing on the subject of football in a cricket magazine with

a reference to C.B. Fry, 'Two days after replaying the F.A. Cup Final of 1902 for Southampton against Sheffield United he was unlucky to miss a century at the Oval. "Where is Don Bradman?" he wrote impishly of this double deed in his autobiography 37 years later'. He describes England's footballers in Mexico suffering 'more hostility and criticism than any British sports team since D.R. Jardine's in Australia in 1932-3' and 'Cruel and defamatory pictures and reports' following an incident around the disappearance of an emerald bracelet, and compares the 'F.A.'s lack of attention to public relations [which] became as familiar as M.C.C.'s'. Manning wonders whether England will again win the World Cup 'before the Ashes are regained from Australia' and continues with an assessment of England's performance in the tournament, sportsmanship in sport, racial ill-feeling, and the need for cricket to introduce a world governing body along the lines of F.I.F.A. in football. Ross refers to Marshall's 'only experience of Test cricket' on the West Indies tour to Australia 1951/52 and his difficult relationship with the captain, Stollmeyer' which 'seems to have been the main reason for his pulling out of West Indian cricket and throwing in his lot... with Hampshire'. - Alan Ross became a sports writer for The Observer in 1950 and their cricket correspondent in 1953. Roy Marshall's autobiography was one of a series published as 'Cricket Stars of Today', edited by Reg Hayter*

Four page handwritten article by Ross for The Cricketer 'Bookshelf' book review column on two titles, 'Holmes and Sutcliffe' by Leslie Duckworth, and 'A History of Yorkshire Cricket' by J.M. Kilburn, both published in 1970. Grace The Great Cricketer' published in 1973, Irving Rosenwater quotes A.A. Thompson saying Weston 'knows more about W.G. than any man alive', to which Rosenwater adds, 'or dead'*
- 147 Dr. T.R. Hunter. Founder member of the Cricketana Society. Two typed letters to George Neville Weston. One, a three page letter dated 14th May 1933, deals primarily with matters relating to the Cricketana Society including the cost of printing and duplicating, membership numbers approaching forty, hopes for the future of the newly reformed society, the need for committee members to step up to their obligations, approves of the suggestion of Sir Julien Cahn and A.W. Shelton as vice-presidents, considers potential candidates for overseas representatives, gives an update on his preparation of the catalogue of book etc. The other two page letter dated 10th June 1933 includes his agreement with the proposal of Mr Britton being made an Honorary Member and the securing of Lord Hawke as an Honorary Vice President. He continues with interesting views on the 1932/33 'Bodyline' Ashes series having read the book 'Defending the Ashes' by the Australian reporter, R.E. Wilmot, 'which throw a new light on the M.C.C. tour in Australia'. Hunter continues with interesting comments on the bowling of Bill Bowes, 'We don't like to believe that England was guilty of questionable tactics, but unfortunately we cannot close our eyes to the fact that some players don't care what they do so long as they don't infringe the laws... I thought some of [Bowes'] deliveries absolutely dangerous... [he] realises the danger attached to his "bouncers"' pointing out that in a recent Yorkshire match against Kent at Leeds 'he never sent a single ball down to Chapman which exception could be taken to, but the other batsmen got them'. Both letters signed in green ink by Hunter. VG £40/60
- George Neville Weston and T.R. Hunter were both members of the Cricketana Society when it was founded in 1929 by C.J. Britton, Weston holding the post of Secretary and Treasurer. Hunter compiled the 'Catalogue of Cricket Literature [A to C.B. Fry]' published by The Cricketana Society c.1934*
- 148 Dr. T.R. Hunter. Founder member of the Cricketana Society. Two page typed letter dated 23rd December 1933 from Hunter to George Neville Weston, co-founder of the



Cricketana Society. Hunter opens by acknowledging receipt of a welcome letter and a catalogue of books. The remainder of the content relates to apparently unfavourable comments made by 'Mr Ling' relating to Weston's recent biography of the cricket historian, F.S. Ashley-Cooper. Hunter agreed with Ling that 'a lot more might have been included... Mr Shelton had seen the proofs and as he- one of the greatest friends and admirers of Ashley-Cooper- was satisfied... I never can just understand anyone not being grateful for the attempt of a man who tries to do something... encouragement leads one to continue, condemnation and severe criticism leads to the abandonment of further attempts'. Regarding Hunter's own efforts to produce his book catalogue, he states, 'If anyone would care to do a section of the catalogue I don't mind one bit, but so far no one has offered'. He closes with a reference to W.G. Grace never visiting South Africa, 'it would have made a memory to many who would have gone miles to see him'. Nicely signed in ink by Hunter. VG £30/50

*Ling was a contributor to 'The Cricketer's Manual by "Bat" (Charles Box). A Short Bibliography' originally published by Weston in 1936. Dr. T.R. Hunter compiled the 'Catalogue of Cricket Literature [A to C.B. Fry]' published by The Cricketana Society c.1934 (Padwick 15)*

- 149 Frederick A. Brooke, cricket writer and collector. Two page handwritten letter from Brooke to George Neville Weston dated 14th October 1934. Writing from his home in Yorkshire, Brooke refers to Weston's 'Bibliography of Ashley-Cooper's writings and note that you state an issue of "Feats, Facts and Figures" was issued in 1900, is this correct? I always understood that there was no issue in 1900... no copy was sent me by Ashley-Cooper though he sent all the others'. He closes with a comment regarding the M.C.C. who 'are shilly shallying with the leg theory question'. Signed 'Fred A Brooke'. Minor smudging, otherwise in good/ very good condition £30/40

*Brooke wrote 'Yorkshire county*

*cricket matches 1733-1891', which, according to Padwick 3022, comprised three volumes, in the form of an 'unpublished typescript in M.C.C. Library'*

- 150 C.J. Britton, cricket writer and collector. Three page handwritten letter from Britton to George Neville Weston dated 22nd September 1936. The majority of the content relates to Dr. [T.R.] Hunter, a co-founder of the Cricketana Society, who 'did not mention so far as I remember anything about owing you letters'. Britton recalls 'how you very finely took over the Societyship when no one would, but for the most part our conversation was about old players [and] the colour question of South Africa'. He continues by listing 'some very nice little items' held by Hunter including 'Bobby Peel's ribbon, an Australian pocket badge from a blazer... a cigarette holder (bat & ball) with old Caffyn's autograph on it- the last he ever signed and many fine auto-photos... He seems to have "scrounged" very well!'. He closes with the hope that Weston will visit soon. Nicely signed 'C.J. Britton'. G/ VG £30/40

*Charles Britton was a collector, writer and founder of the Cricketana Society. He produced 'Cricket Books: the 100 best (old and new)' in 1929, and in 1935 published a study of Gilbert Jessop*

- 151 J.W. Goldman, cricket author and collector. Single page handwritten letter written to George Neville Weston dated 29th June 1938 on Isadore Goldman & Son, Solicitors, headed paper. Goldman thanks Weston for his recent letter and is 'Glad you liked the Illinois Brochure'. He continues, 'I have collected a good many cricket items but mostly old plays 1750-1800 dealing with cricket' and refers to boxiana, 'I have obtained a rare Boxing Poem call the "Gymnasiad" by Paul Whitehead 1744 dedicated to Broughton. I should like to see your Boxing bibliography in draft, I may be able to help you as I have quite a few'. Very nicely signed in ink by Goldman. G/ VG £30/40

- 152 Charles Pratt Green. Cricket collector and wine merchant. Two two-page handwritten wartime letters with

very good cricket content from Pratt Green to George Neville Weston. In the first, dated 18th December 1941, he thanks Weston for 'the Cardus book' describing it 'as the most fascinating I have read for years', admiring his 'choice of language'. He thanks Weston for the offer of 'the loan of "Famous Victorians"' and refers to A.G. Gardiner's essay on W.G. Grace in 'Pebbles on the Shore' of which he had not previously heard. In the second letter, dated 30th July[?] 1942, Green states 'I cannot envisage Downend as a museum. What of interest would it contain? Such articles of W.G.'s equipment as may be available, portraits... records of his doings and sundry books. A room, it seems to me, would suffice'. Green is interested to hear that Weston has visited Odd's cricket bat factory, 'In my collecting days... their bats were far the most shapely', refers to A.C. Macalaren having used one, and remembers a visit to 'Gunn's Factory where Mordecai Sherwin, the old [Nottinghamshire] stumper, was in charge.' He also recalls having been sent a bat for his collection made from a 'weeping willow (not the correct wood) grown from a slip[?] brought from the tree over Napoleon's grave at St. Helena. If you have the Trent Bridge Centenary Book you will see that Sir Julien Cahn associates this with the Farrand collection'. Both letters signed by Pratt Green, slight smudging to the signatures. *Charles Pratt-Green was a famous collector of cricket books and memorabilia including an impressive run of over 150 cricket bats used by famous players from the golden age, which were later sold to Sir Julian Cahn*

- 153 C. Stamper. Member of the Cricketana Society. Two two-page handwritten letters from Stamper to George Neville Weston. The first, dated 3rd July 1930, relates to his secretarial work for the Society during C.J. Britton's ill health, and his own enjoyment of the first Test, being 'four days of delight'. The second letter of 14th May 1931, comprises Stamper's explanation for his 'arrears of work' due to an illness earlier in the year, and then

- damaging his arm 'so that until this week I could use neither pen nor pencil'. He describes being let down by a local printer who lost a draft of a Society circular, and is of the opinion 'that it would be well to wind up the society but that would seem like hitting Mr Weston when he is down'. He talks of attempting to recruit new members, 'but no one seems to have anything to offer... I cannot see that many people will be willing to pay their subscription, however small, unless they have some results'. Both letters nicely signed by Stamper. G/VG £30/50
- 154 Cricketana Society correspondence 1929 & 1930. Two letters to George Neville Weston. One, a handwritten two page letter from R.J. Parker dated 17th October 1929, relates to his attempts to find hotel accommodation in London for C.J. Britton, and looks forward to meeting Britton the following week. The other single page handwritten letter is from a George Newey, dated 10th March 1930, who is pleased to become a member of the Cricketana Society and encloses his subscription of 5/- with a typed list of his own cricket book collection, and closes by asking Weston for suggestions of titles he thinks he should get, and hopes that 'Mr Britton will soon be restored to health again'. Both letters nicely signed. File holes to the Parker letter. G/VG £30/50
- 155 Charles Pratt Green, cricket collector and wine merchant. Two two page handwritten letters from Pratt Green to George Neville Weston, the first dated 27th October 1941. Writing from his Malvern home, Pratt Green makes reference to an accompanying letter (not included) from E.H.D. Sewell (London County & Essex 1902-1904) who 'played a lot of good cricket in his day and that Sewell's autograph would be a good addition to Weston's collection of autographs. Pratt Green has passed on Sewell's enquiry 'to a friend who will take as great [a] pleasure in solving it as I should'. The second dated 15th December [c.1942]. Writing from his Malvern home, Green acknowledges receipt of a book and reports, 'I have just read the thrilling chapter on "The Champion" & it shone'. He also sends his thanks for 'the kind mention of the copy of [the] original edition of "The Victorians" you gave in Great Queen Street'. He describes how his book collection continues to accumulate, and describes 'When leaving Beresford House I packed with 2,000 volumes, and gifts of books come almost weekly and lie in stacks'. He continues to describe receiving a military cane 'Fifty years ago [from] a brother-in-law... [who] was a friend of C.J. Kortwright... a thing of little value- its only value consisting in its having once belonged to the most famous fast bowler of his day', and offers it to Weston as a gift. Green closes stating that Christmas is approaching, as is his ninetieth birthday. G/VG £50/70
- Charles Pratt Green (1852-1950) lived for many years in Beresford House in Great Malvern where he traded as a wine merchant. During his life he amassed a large collection of cricket books, and over 150 bats, which he sold to Sir Julien Cahn we he moved from Beresford House.*
- Charles Jesse Kortwright (Essex 1894-1907) was regarded as the fastest bowler of his day*
- 156 George Neville Weston, cricket collector. A selection of three letters, written in 1938, from Weston's own archive comprising correspondence with The Worthington & Co. Brewery in Burton-on Trent. The first, dated 18th February 1938, is Weston's original copy of a typed letter to the brewery enquiring about acquiring a 'china ash-tray with a pictured design of Mr. Dumkins of Muggleston C.C. (Pickwick Papers) issued by you'. The reply from the brewery dated 21st February states that by sending Weston an example they are making an exception as they were usually only issued 'for use in licensed houses', but are happy to do so. Having received the ash tray, Weston writes expressing his gratitude on 23rd February. VG £25/35
- 157 Dennis Lillee on Zaheer Abbas 1986. Single page typed letter dated 5th August 1986 to Lillee from Pakistan cricket journalist and writer, Qamar Ahmed, requesting a 'little piece on Zaheer Abbas' for a booklet he is preparing for a function to mark Zaheer's retirement from Test cricket. Accompanying the letter is a single page handwritten draft by Lillee and a two page article typewritten by Irving Rosenwater (with handwritten note by Rosenwater) in which Lillee describes Zaheer as 'a great batsman' with 'class and determination', commenting that 'As a bowler it was suicide competing against "Zed" on an easy-paced or flat wicket... his concentration was second to none' and recalls Zaheer's 'wonderful 274' in his first innings against England in 1971. - 158 Graham Yallop and John Maguire. Australia. Two official two page contracts issued by Austin Robertson & Associates of Sydney as confirmation of the appointment of Austin Robertson as the cricketers' agent/manager in Australia for public appearances, advertising, marketing, interviews etc. The Yallop contract dated 4th July 1984, the Maguire contract undated but appears to be the same period. Both contracts signed by the respective player with the Maguire contract additionally signed by Carl Rackemann as Witness. G/VG £40/60
- 159 Richard Parr Daft (Nottinghamshire, 1 match 1886) to Alfred J. Gaston, cricket follower, writer and collector. Two handwritten letters, originally from Gaston's personal collection, written by Daft, son of Richard Daft (Nottinghamshire 1858-1891). In one, a three page letter dated 31st May 1900[?], Parr offers some letters 'to fill your album. As my father has never gone in for collecting he thinks they will be better in your hands'. Slipped in is a fragment of an advertisement for 'A Grand Match' at Lord's, 24th May 1847, The Earl of Strathmore's [Lord Burghley] Side v The Earl of Winterton's Side. The teams feature notable players of the period including Clark, Hillyer, Haygarth, Dakin, Dean, Lillywhite etc. The other, a two page letter handwritten in ink, is dated 4th March 1905. Daft is writing from Ware in Hertfordshire, and is enclosing 'a few letters' for Gaston's scrapbook. He also has 'some old [Lillywhite] annuals which I should like to sell as I have duplicates of them' and asks if Gaston has an idea of their value. Tear and some loss to

fold. Both letters signed 'R.P. Daft'. Some staining. Sold with a further fragment of a letter laid to trimmed card. 'I hope you get to the Oval on the 2nd day of our match when I hope to see you'. Signed 'R. Daft', possibly Richard Daft senior. Odd faults as described, otherwise in generally good condition £80/120

*Richard Daft Senior died in 1900*

- 160 George Oswald Browning 'Gubby' Allen. Cambridge University, Middlesex & England 1922-1950. Three page typed letter, with good cricket content, on airmail paper dated 3rd February 1964, from Allen to Jim Swanton. At the time Allen was President of the M.C.C. and reports on a comfortable flight out to Bombay and how he 'tried to settle some of our cricket problems on a very poor telephone line with the Secretary of the Pakistan Board of Control in Karachi', resulting in him flying out to Karachi and on to Rawalpindi to meet face to face at dinner with six cabinet ministers. He makes observations about how 'charming and friendly' the people of India and Pakistan are, 'but I completely fail to understand their real hostility for one another'. Regarding the cricket he states, 'The less said the better... our team have suffered a lot of injuries and illness' describing their batting in the most recent match as 'unimaginative and third rate... I have a meeting with the Captain and the Manager this evening to discuss the future'. Signed 'Gubby' with a handwritten postscript in which he states, 'The real truth is that this side plays poor cricket because they are... a very poor side'. G/VG £40/60

- 161 Jeffrey Baxter Stollmeyer. Trinidad & West Indies 1938-1957. Interesting two page letter from Stollmeyer, written in Trinidad and dated 17th September 1968, to Jim Swanton who, at the time, was editor of 'The Cricketer', regarding the recent decision taken by the International Cricket Council to recommend 'to M.C.C. that a new Law of Cricket should be introduced, limiting the number of on-side fieldsmen allowed to be placed behind the popping crease to two'. He states that the 'suggestion won the support of the majority of Cricketers

Countries present at the Conference, despite the protestations of the West Indies and New Zealand'. He claims that if this were to be adopted, 'a proviso similar to the law governing "the persistent bowling of fast short-pitched balls etc."' could be introduced, which would effectively deal with the matter', and states that 'We in the West Indies are unequivocally opposed to any Law being introduced which violates the principle that a fielding captain may be prevented from placing his fielders where he wishes'. He comments on 'several niggling changes in the Laws', which with the exception of the 'front-foot rule... have been mainly of nuisance value', but disagrees vehemently with this 'fundamental change... [which] should have required complete unanimity of all members of the Conference', and closes hoping that it is not too late for the M.C.C. 'to use their powers of veto'. Attached is a further single page typed covering letter from Stollmeyer requesting that the full letter is published in the magazine. Both letters nicely signed 'J.B. Stollmeyer'. VG £30/50

*Jeffrey Stollmeyer captained the West Indies in thirteen Tests and later became a member of the Board of Control and a Test selector*

- 162 Robert Elliot Storey 'Bob' Wyatt. Warwickshire, Worcestershire & England 1923-1951. Three letters between Wyatt and Jim Swanton regarding the LBW law. In the first, a typed copy letter to Wyatt dated 31st October 1968, Swanton enquires about a 'contraption' Wyatt had built 'showing by strings and pegs where the ball must pitch in order to satisfy the present law of LBW' and wonders whether the device could be photographed for inclusion in an article examining 'the case for an extension of the law to the offside, as long advocated by Don Bradman and... by Ronny Aird' for the Spring Annual of 'The Cricketer', of which Swanton was editor at the time. He also asks for a '500 word article on why you would go back to the old law'. Wyatt's states in a three page handwritten reply dated 9th November that he doesn't believe the device is suitable for photography 'but that it might give

you an idea for a scale drawing. He has little to add to his views on the law beyond what he wrote for The Cricketer in 1967, but summarises his reasons, believing 'The law is entirely illogical... [causing] batsmen to push forward to short length bowling... puts a premium on certain types of bowling... assists negative bowling... [removes] the incentive to keep the ball up... encourages the selection of medium fast bowlers' etc. Wyatt signs the letter as 'Bob' and closes with a postscript saying he is enclosing a fuller article on the subject as requested. On 13th November, Swanton thanks Wyatt for his contribution and looks forward to visiting Lord's and hopes to view Wyatt's model. VG £30/50

- 163 Australian Test player questionnaires 1980s. Five questionnaires completed by hand by Australian Test cricketers, Dean Jones, Greg Matthews (3 different), and Mike Veletta for tour guides, magazines etc. Each questionnaire includes subjects such as nickname, education, interests, injuries, favourites, sporting fears, most embarrassing moment etc. Ex Irving Rosenwater collection. #### **THE SIR PELHAM FRANCIS WARNER 1873-1963) ARCHIVE**

*The personal archive of Sir Pelham Francis Warner (1873-1963). Warner played first-class cricket for Oxford University, Middlesex and England, playing 15 Test matches, captaining in 10 of them, with a record of won 4, lost 6 and succeeded in regaining The Ashes in 1903, & 1904. However he was less successful when he captained England on the tour of South Africa in 1905, & 1906, suffering a resounding 1, & 4 defeat, the first time England had lost to South Africa in a Test match. He was also to have captained England on the 1911, & 1912 tour of Australia, but fell ill early in the tour and was unable to play in any of the Tests with Johnny Douglas taking over the captaincy. He was named Wisden Cricketer of the Year in 1904 and also in 1921, making him one of only two to have received the honour twice (the other is Jack Hobbs). The second award marked his retirement as a county player after the 1920 season, in which he captained Middlesex to*



- the County Championship title. In the mid 1920s he was Chairman of Selectors, tour manager on the infamous Bodyline tour of Australia in 1932, 33. He was the chairman of the England Test selectors for several years in the 1930s. He later became President of the Marylebone Cricket Club and was knighted for his services to cricket in 1937. Warner wrote extensively on cricket, recounting his Ashes Tests, and a history of Lord's Cricket Ground. He founded *The Cricketer* magazine, was cricket correspondent of the *Morning Post* from 1921 to 1933, and subsequently of the *Daily Telegraph*. He died in 1963 at the age of 89 years
- 164 Pelham Francis 'Plum' Warner. Oxford University, Middlesex & England 1894-1920. Two items of cricket ephemera from the collection of Warner's estate relating to Uxbridge Cricket club, an official ticket for the Uxbridge Cricket Club Annual Dinner held at the Chequers Hotel, Uxbridge, 21st May 1879, and an official Uxbridge Cricket Club folding fixture card for season 1883. Some foxing, otherwise in good condition. Qty 2 £30/40
- 165 Pelham Francis 'Plum' Warner. Oxford University, Middlesex & England 1894-1920. Hampstead Cricket Club 1905. Official menu for the Annual Dinner held at The Cafe Royal on the 20th March 1905. The menu with photographic image from an original by George Beldam of F.S. Spofforth in bowling action, with the caption "'Spoff" "Spoffing'". To the centre pages is listed the entertainments and the toasts and speakers, including Warner and Bernard Bosanquet (Oxford University, Middlesex & England 1898-1919). The menu is laid down to an album page with a newspaper cutting reporting on the dinner in which Spofforth is referred to as having 'got well towards his 1000 wickets for Hampstead by taking 65 wickets for 5 runs apiece when he had the misfortune to sprain himself in giving Mr. George Beldham that wonderful snapshot which they saw on the dinner card'. To the verso an original mono photograph is laid down of a match in progress with the initials 'H.C.C.' in pencil to the left side. Below is laid down an official fixture card of the Brasenose College, Oxford rowing eights for 1905. Sold with a mono bookplate image of 'Hampstead Cricket Club Ground 1930' with history of the Club to verso, with a reference to Spofforth being 'a member of the Club for many years... and Mr. A.E. Stoddart, a Captain of England, made his greatest score there of 485 runs on August 4th, 1886'. Wear, tears and age toning to the page, creasing to the menu, otherwise in good condition £40/60
- Frederick Robert Spofforth (New South Wales, Victoria & Australia 1874-1888), known as 'The Demon Bowler', had emigrated to England in 1888. His last first-class match was for the M.C.C. in 1897. He also played for Hampstead, and records exist for matches he played in seasons 1894-1903. According to this dinner report it is clear he also played in 1904*
- 166 Pelham Francis 'Plum' Warner. Oxford University, Middlesex & England 1894-1920. Three original telegrams received by Warner following England's victory over Australia in the 1926 Ashes series. The telegrams, from friends and acquaintances, are dated 18th, 19th and 20th August 1926, two sent to Warner at the Carlton Club, London. England had secured victory in the fifth and final Test at the Oval by 289 runs having drawn the first four matches, so winning the Ashes series 1-0. Warner was Chairman of Selectors for the series. Sold with five original telegrams of messages of congratulation received by Warner following England's victory over Australia in the infamous 1932/33 'Bodyline' Ashes series. The telegrams, from friends and acquaintances, are dated 16th-18th February 1933, one in original envelope. Warner was joint manager with R.C.N. Palairet for the tour. Some creasing, otherwise in good condition £80/120
- In the deciding 'Timeless' fifth Test of the 1926 Ashes series, Australia had a narrow lead of 22 runs after the first innings. Following heavy overnight rain, Hobbs and Sutcliffe overcame the 'sticky wicket' to make a stand of 172 before Hobbs was out for 100, Sutcliffe going on to make 161, and England went on to win comfortably*
- 167 Pelham Francis 'Plum' Warner. Oxford University, Middlesex & England 1894-1920. M.C.C. tour to Australia 1911/12. Two pages on official Victoria Government letterheads, one for Government House, Melbourne, the other Government Cottage, Macedon Upper. The pages very nicely signed in ink by various government officers, their families and guests. Sixteen signatures in total including Lord Denman, his wife, Gertrude, and their six year old son, Thomas, also Norman McLeod, John Fuller, Roland Vernon, Lord Richard Nevill, Grace Vinery etc. Warner was Captain of the 1911/12 M.C.C. tour to Australia and presumably collected these signatures while attending an event on the tour. It is known that Warner attended a tennis party at Government House in Melbourne. G/VG £40/60
- Thomas Denman, 3rd Baronet Denman, served as the fifth Governor-General of Australia from 1911 to 1914.*
- Warner fell ill early in the 1911/12 tour and was unable to play in the Test series and his place as captain was taken by J.W.H.T. Douglas. England lost the first match but went on to win the series 4-1 to regain The Ashes*
- 168 Pelham Francis 'Plum' Warner. Oxford University, Middlesex & England 1894-1920. A selection of wartime correspondence with some cricket interest from Warner's personal collection. Contents include a handwritten postcard from J.B. Cattley[?] of Eton College, dated 24th February 1943. He writes, 'The great work is now in the Library, & the Captain of the XI is coming to take it out. His name is Keighley, & his Australian parents thoughtfully & hopefully gave him the initials W.G.', referring to William Geoffrey Keighley (Oxford University & Yorkshire 1947-1951). A single page handwritten letter from 'Lucan' (6th Earl of Lucan, father of the 7th Earl who went missing in 1974) dated 30th December 1942 congratulating Warner on a family wedding.

- Two page handwritten letter dated 14th August 1942 from R.B. Vincent, cricket correspondent for The Times sending his best wishes to Warner who has been unwell, and other telegrams and messages of good will. A number of letters of congratulation for Warner's book 'Cricket Between Two Wars' (published in 1942) including one correspondent writing from his hospital bed. Sold with and official wartime souvenir programme for a charity match between an Australian Army XI and An Australian XI played at Pratten Park, Ashfield (Sydney), 27th December 1943. The teams listed to the centre pages include notable Australian players including Bill O'Reilly, Sydney Barnes, Ron Saggars, Bill Alley, Vic Jackson etc. Lacking the rear page. Rusting to staples, wear and folds. The letters in good condition £50/70
- 169 Pelham Francis 'Plum' Warner. Oxford University, Middlesex & England 1894-1920. Four handwritten airmail letters from Warner to his son 'Es' (Esmond Warner) who is posted in Cairo, written in 1950 and 1951. Warner writes at some length about family and cricket, and reports that the Duke of Edinburgh has invited him to be the next President of the M.C.C., quoting the Duke as saying 'I feel sure that all cricket minded people in the country will agree with my choice'. He looks forward to the visit of the West Indies touring party and later describes entertaining the Prime Minister and Mrs. Attlee and several other dignitaries and foreign royalty 'in the box at Lord's', and presenting the teams to the King, describing it as 'a great event'. A later letter dated 24th June 1957 coincides with another tour by the West Indies, and Warner reports that their fielding 'went to pieces' in the second Test at Lord's, which England won by an innings and 36 runs, 'they [West Indies] will have to do some hard thinking about their side for Nottingham'. He make interesting observations about the Lord's pitch, describing it as 'dangerous & I have long been fearful of a dreadful accident'. Despite the pitch 'Weekes played a superb innings. He is a very great batsman'. In contrast Warner states that 'the wicket at Nottingham next Test is too good & we may have to struggle hard there'. He closes with the opinion that 'Dexter is a superb cricketer- another Keith Miller'. All letters are signed 'P.F.W.' Sold with a card with two original mono photograph portraits laid down of Warner, the photograph to the front signed by Warner to the darker part of the photograph, and also to the card below, and dated July 1950. G/VG £70/100

- 175 Roy Booth. Yorkshire & Worcestershire 1951-1970. Worcestershire World Tour 1965. Black file comprising an excellent collection of twelve letters/ aerogrammes and eleven postcards sent from Booth to his wife, Joyce, while travelling on the Worcestershire 'World Tour', February- April 1965. The collection covers Booth's descriptions primarily of travelling, social events and excursions, with some mention of the cricket. On the team's arrival in Africa, they played matches in Kenya and Rhodesia, and he describes the challenges of playing cricket at high altitude and the need for the application of 'Nivea' as protection whilst fielding in the hot sun. Interest is high on the Rhodesia leg with large crowds attending matches, good press coverage and matches being broadcast. He has, however, been suffering from 'Gyppo Tummy Trouble'. On the Calcutta leg of the tour Booth describes extremes ranging from the 'filth and poverty' as 'the worst we have come across' to being entertained at the races by the 'Maharaja of Kooch Byar [sic]' at the Royal Calcutta Turf Club where British jockeys Walter Swinburn and Mick Greening were racing. Having left the 'God Forsaken Hole called Calcutta... (It stinks)', the party travelled on to Malaysia to play matches in Singapore, Kuala Lumpur, with sumptuous receptions and parties in palatial surroundings and being treated like royalty. He describes the start of a match in Hong Kong being delayed by a tropical storm, before travelling on to Thailand, and finally Honolulu and Los Angeles. A fascinating and personal account of the tour. G/VG £150/250
- 176 Derek Shackleton. Hampshire & England 1948-1969. *Frederick Liddell Steel was one of the seven sons of Joseph Steel, a Liverpool merchant who owned a Scottish estate. P-T's' suggestion that they had been adapted from earlier versions, and finally proposing that the poem was an amalgam of several compositions; a leaf from an early journal, pp 43/44, giving the full text of the 56 line poem with a handwritten note suggesting the song was written in 1771 or 1772 (from the Winder collection); the complete original

four page issue of the Hampshire Chronicle of 4th August 1777 with an announcement on the first page of the 'Rev. Mr Cotton's School at Winchester. The Anniversary Meeting of the Gentlemen educated at the above School will be held at the George Inn, at Winchester, on Monday, August 11...'. There is also on the same page an announcement of a match to be held on Kimston Down between the Duke of Dorset, with ten Hampshire men against any eleven of England for 1000 guineas. Much of the content of the lot has come from Harry Altham's collection. David Rayvern Allen in his 'A Song for Cricket' has several pages devoted to the poem although it would appear that he had not had the advantage of access to Altham's material. ## The David Frith Collection

David Frith was born in Gloucester Terrace, London in March 1937. In 1949 he emigrated with his family to Australia, arriving in Sydney aboard the RMS Orion. He started his working life as a copy boy for The Daily Mirror in 1954 for a short period, before moving on to banking with the Commonwealth Bank; he played cricket for the famous St George Club before moving onto Paddington C.C. He first met Bertie Oldfield in his sports shop in Sydney in 1951, buying his first bat from him and getting to know him fairly well, Oldfield gave him his Australian blazer worn on the 1930 tour of England during this time which started off David's passion for collecting.

He returned to England in 1964, but after the death of his mother, family commitments led Frith back to Sydney where he sought a full-time cricket related post and thanks to a recommendation by Jack Fingleton, he did secure some work with the Australian News and Information Bureau. The return to Australia would prove to be short-lived and he moved back to the United Kingdom departing aboard the TSS Fairstar in 1972.



He succeeded Tony Pawson as deputy editor of The Cricketer Magazine in November 1972 before becoming editor from the March 1973 issue onwards. He founded Wisden Cricket Monthly and edited it from 1979 to 1996. In 1988 Frith won the Sports Council's British Sports Journalism award as Magazine Sports Writer of the Year.

Frith has written dozens of books on both cricket in modern times and cricket of the past, mainly focussing on Ashes Test Match history. His major works include biographies of A.E. Stoddart, Archie Jackson and Ross Gregory; also 'Pageant of Cricket', 'The Trailblazers' and 'Bodyline Autopsy'. He has also written 'The David Frith Archive' listing his vast collection of cricket memorabilia, books and ephemera which runs to 1100 pages. He has also successfully produced cricket videos and films; he presented an annual archive cricket film evening held at the National Film Theatre in London for thirty years. Frith became the first (and so far only) author to win The Cricket Society's Book of the Year award three times in 2003 among other prestigious awards from home and abroad. He recently published his life story 'A Paddington Boy'.

I first met David just after I had started my business in 1993 at a Cricket Memorabilia Society meeting. I was introduced to David and I think he mentioned me being the 'new kid on the block'. He wished me well and finished our short conversation with 'Garry Sobers has two 'R's in his name, don't forget it'. He must have noticed the error in one of my initial auction catalogues. I have never forgotten those words! Attention to detail!

His cricket collection is vast, impressive and eclectic and I hope we have done justice to it in this first offering through our March auction.

- 270 Australia tour to England 1880. Extremely rare original match ticket for the tour match, Werneth v Australians, played at The Coppice, Oldham, 16th & 17th July 1880. To the print, 'Werneth Cricket Club versus Australian Eleven Friday July 16th, 1880. Pavilion Side 2/-'. To verso a handwritten inscription, 'This ticket was found by the joiner when the bar was being moved back and he gave it to me on Wed. 11th[?] January 1950. (1880-1950). W.A. Fisher'. The ticket measures 3"x1.5", with small loss/ clipped to two corners, nicks and creasing. Some soiling, otherwise in good condition. An amazing and historic artefact from the second Australian tour £150/250
- The Australians beat the eighteen of Werneth by an innings and 21 runs. Batting first, and in their only innings, the Australians scored 119, McDonnell top scoring with 53. Werneth were then dismissed twice for 38 and 60, Spofforth ending with match figures of 19-38 and Palmer with 13-54*
- 271 'Surrey County Cricket Club 1880'. Small and early original navy blue leather folding membership card/ ticket with title in gilt to front and 'Member's Ticket to 30th April 1881' in gilt to verso. Printed to inside are the names of the Club officers, Lord Monson (President), Lord Bessborough (Vice-President), Mark Cattley (Treasurer) and C.W. Alcock (Secretary), also fixtures and member's signature of A.G. Rough. Stamped no. 518. Slight fading to the front cover, otherwise in good/ very good condition £80/120
- In the 1880 County Championship Surrey played eight matches, winning only two, losing four and drawing two*
- 272 Henry Holroyd, 3rd Earl of Sheffield (Lord Sheffield). England tour to Australia 1891/92. Original early folding fixture card with brown leather covers, and 'Lord Sheffield' in gilt to front with gilt borders. The inside with printed fixtures titled 'Programme of International & Intercolonial Matches for N.S.W. cricketers during season 1891-92'. Issued by the New South Wales Cricket Association, presumably Lord Sheffield's personal copy. Very good condition £100/150
- A significant patron of cricket, Lord Sheffield established a private ground at his seat at Sheffield Park in Sussex, and there hosted numerous first-class matches and touring sides. Concerned with the declining popularity of cricket in Australia, Lord Sheffield organised at his own expense the 1891/92 tour under the captaincy of W.G. Grace, comprising Stoddart, Shrewsbury, W. Gunn, Attewell, Lockwood, Briggs, Peel etc. While in Australia he donated £150 to the New South Wales Cricket Association, which led to the inauguration of the Sheffield Shield Australian domestic state cricket competition*
- 273 'Notts County Cricket Club' 1896. Small and early original red leather folding membership card/ ticket with title in gilt to front and '1896 Member's Ticket. Not Transferable' in gilt to verso. Printed to inside are the names of the Club officers, The Lord Bishop of Southwell (President), W. Wright (Hon. Sec. and Treasurer), and H. Turner (Secretary), also fixtures for the 1896 season, and member's signature of J.J. Pratt. Stamped no. 5973. Minor soiling to the covers, otherwise in very good condition £50/80
- The 1896 County Championship was the seventh officially organised running of the competition. Nottinghamshire played sixteen matches, winning five, losing five and drawing six, and finished in sixth position*
- 274 England v Australia 1921. Official 'Return Pass' card/ ticket for the second Test played at Lord's 11th- 14th June 1921. The ticket with M.C.C. emblem and details printed on M.C.C. coloured striped background. To verso printed '1'. Fading to colours, otherwise in good/ very good condition £40/60
- Australia won by eight wickets. Top batsmen in both innings were Woolley for England (95 and 93) and Bardsley for Australia (88 and 63 no). The top wicket taker in the match was McDonald for Australia ending with eight wickets for 147 runs. Australia won the first three matches of the series with the final two games drawn, so retaining the Ashes*
- 275 'The Australian Cricket Team 1909'. Folding fixture/itinerary card for the Australian tour of England 1909. Decorative covers, with title, with cameo pen pictures of the players and facsimile signatures of the tourists to inside pages and tour fixtures to back cover. R.F. Steel. 'The Block'. Melbourne. - The fixture card was probably only presented/issued to players and officials*
- 276 Aquila Clapshaw & Sons Wholesale Warehouse List. c.1860s. Early original folding price list issued by 'Aquila & Sons, 66 Hackney Road, London [address crossed through in ink] Late 3 & 4 New Street, City Road'. 'Sole Inventors of Malacca Cane, Spring and Dove-tail bats; Patronized by the late Prince Consort, and the Principal Clubs throughout the world. Established 1800'. The folding price list with titles to front, prices for bats, stumps and 'miscellaneous' items including balls, leg guards, gauntlets, scoring sheets etc. to the centre, and advertisement to rear for Aquila Clapshaw & Sons, Cricket Bat, Ball and Stump Manufacturers. Wear and some loss to edges, horizontal fold with splitting. Fragile condition £40/60
- Aquila (also known as Aguila) Clapshaw and his younger brother, Charles, moved their office to New Street in 1840. Soon after the brothers parted company and Aquila was joined in the bat making business by his son, Samuel, who took over on his father's death in 1860. An Aquila Clapshaw bat dated 1860 is held by the Lord's Museum*
- 277 'Kentish Gazette'. Original early four-page newspaper for 30th August 1791 printed in Canterbury. Page four column 3 features a six line report, 'On Tuesday, and the two following days, was played a grand Match of Cricket, at the Holt, near Farnham, in Surrey- The County of Surrey against the County

- of Hants, for one thousand guineas, which ended thus: Surrey 1st innings 89- 2nd innings 112. Hants 1st inn. 106- 2nd inn. 78'. Duty stamp to lower right corner of third page. The newspaper has been trimmed to the lower edge, with tear to centre fold and some loss to top corner, otherwise in good condition for its age. A rare item £100/150
- 278 'St. James's Chronicle and General Evening Post'. Original early four-page newspaper for 29th August 1822, printed at Blackfriars, London. Page four column 5 features an interesting thirteen line report on 'The Great Cricket Match between 15 Sheffield and 11 Nottingham players, for which great preparations have latterly been making on the new ground at Darnal, near Sheffield, commenced on Monday the 26th. The contest having excited a peculiar interest, the concourse of spectators was great. The playing commenced, and all went on well till about four o'clock, when a large extent of scaffolding, which had been fitted up on the ground near the road side, suddenly gave way, and precipitated its unfortunate tenants one over the other on the ground. A scene of confusion ensued, which was truly affecting. Two persons were killed upon the spot, and between 40 and 50 more or less maimed. Late last night 23 cases had been admitted to the Infirmary, four or five of which were pronounced very dangerous'. Duty stamp to top right corner of first page. Slight splitting to the fold, otherwise in very good condition. A rare item £140/180
- Despite the tragic accident the match proceeded. Having been scheduled for three days it was completed in one with the eleven of Nottingham beating the fifteen of Sheffield by ten wickets*
- 279 'Land and Water. Hunting, Shooting, Fishing, Practical Natural History'. Original early tabloid magazine with attractive decorative masthead. Vol. XI no. 272, London 8th April 1871. 17pp, vii. The section on p.244, 'Sporting Notes from Australia', includes a good 39-line article on the state of cricket in Melbourne. The writer reports on Melbourne's recent close victory over Sydney by two wickets, 'a very pleasant match'.
- Reference is made to 'Mr. F.P. Miller, the Surrey don', and Colonel Ward who stood as umpires, and the arrival of B.B. Cooper (Middlesex, Kent, Victoria & Australia 1863-1878), 'the Sydney men are disgusted at the idea of his playing for us [Melbourne] against them'. The article continues with an interesting commentary on dwindling public support for cricket, 'the Victorian public has become very fastidious in its patronage of the game, and nothing less than a Grace would now draw a crowd at our colonial'. Included is a description of the Melbourne ground, 'Richmond Paddock... looking fresh and green... the elm trees planted by the first All England Eleven are well and flourishing', and it continues with the hope that the English will return soon with W.G. Grace, 'Unless we can have Mr.[sic] W.G. Grace we don't care for the minor constellations in the cricket firmament'. The article is signed 'H', and David Frith has annotated in pencil, 'Hammersley?'. - 280 Dennis Lillee newspaper cricket posters. Three original newspaper posters. All three undated but probably late 1970s. Posters are for the Daily News (New South Wales?) The Australians' at Lord's, 27th May 1878, the second match of the Australians inaugural tour to England, and opens with the description of 'one of the most extraordinary spectacles that has occurred at this place for a long time past... Marylebone were provided with a well-selected team, but with the exception of Mr. Hornby no one exhibited anything worthy the name of a defence'. The report describes W.G. Grace being dismissed cheaply by Allan for four, Booth losing his off stump 'before he scored a run'. The introduction of Spofforth in to the bowling attack saw M.C.C. lose seven wickets for six runs, Spofforth ending with figures of 5.3 overs, 3 maidens, 6 wickets for only 4 runs including a hat trick, and M.C.C. were dismissed for 33 with six ducks and only Hornby reaching double figures. In reply the Australians mustered only 41 with Midwinter top scoring with 10, Shaw and Morley taking five wickets apiece. In the second innings M.C.C. fared even worse being dismissed for a paltry 19 runs, Spofforth taking a further four wickets and Boyle six, and the Australians scored the required twelve runs for the loss of one wicket, 'so that the Colonials beat the greatest and the most powerful club in the world by nine wickets'. - The 1970/71 Ashes series was scheduled for six matches but after the third Test at Melbourne was abandoned without a ball being bowled an additional match was played. Of the six matches in which play was possible, England won two and drew four to regain The Ashes*
- 284 Australian newspaper cricket posters. Three original posters including Daily Mirror [Surry Hills, New South Wales] 'Test Star [Simon O'Donnell] Cancer. - The 1948 Australians remain the only Test touring side to be unbeaten on an entire tour, in all winning twenty five and drawing nine of the matches played. They beat Oxford University convincingly by an innings and 90 runs, Bill Brown top scoring with 108 in Australia's only innings of 431. In reply Oxford were bowled out for 185 and 156*
- 287 'The Vickers Sporting Calendar', 1937. Large colour printed hanging calendar for Vickers Gin, with dominant and attractive colour artist's impression of C. Bannerman retiring hurt after scoring 165 for Australia against England in 'The First Test Match', played at Melbourne Cricket Ground, March 1877. - The first Test of the 1928/29 Ashes series was a one-sided affair with England beating Australia by 675 runs. England scored 521 in their first innings (Hendren 169), Australia replying with 122 (Larwood taking 6-32). England then made 342-8 declared in the second, with Australia then being dismissed for only 66, so securing victory for England. Don Bradman made his Test debut in this match, scoring 18 and 1. England went on to win the five-match Ashes series 4-1.*
- The Brisbane Exhibition Ground (now known as the Brisbane Showground) was the first to host a Test match in Queensland. Only one more Test match was played there, in 1931, before 'The Gabba' became the home of Test cricket in Queensland later that year*
- 289 Henry Holroyd, 3rd Earl of Sheffield (Lord Sheffield). Lord Sheffield's colours. - Lord Sheffield played one first-class match but is better known as a cricket patron, being responsible for organising the tour to Australia in 1891/92, which was considered to be of great importance following a fall in popularity of the game in Australia after disastrous conflicting dual tours of English sides in 1887/88, and the Australians unsuccessful tour to England in*



1890. Lord Sheffield employed Alfred Shaw as the team manager for the tour, which was captained by W.G. Grace, and it was during this tour that Lord Sheffield donated funds to the New South Wales Cricket Association for the purchase of a plate and hence establish the domestic competition, still known today as the Sheffield Shield.

Shaw's association with Lord Sheffield had started in 1883 when he was encouraged to establish a cricket base at Sheffield Park, and to scout around the county with the intention of unearthing fresh talent for the Sussex County Cricket Club. Having parted company with Nottinghamshire in 1887, he played no county cricket until 1894 when he was co-opted to play for Sussex at the age of 52, under Lord Sheffield's presidency

- 291 Arthur Priestley's tour to West Indies 1896/97. 'The Cricketers' Scoring Book (Greatly Improved)' published by John Wisden & Co., London. Original scorebook for the tour, comprising batting and bowling analyses for two innings to each double page. The large format cloth bound scorebook, with gilt title to front and measuring 13.5"x15.75", includes complete

scores neatly annotated in ink for all sixteen matches played on the tour, which comprised four matches in Barbados, one each in Antigua and St. Kitts, another in Barbados, four in Trinidad, ending with five in Jamaica. Nine of the matches were deemed first-class, one of which, played at Port of Spain, was the first time a representative West Indies eleven had played against a touring English team. Captained by Acher Warner, brother of P.F. Warner, West Indies won a thrilling contest by three wickets in which Lebrun Constantine, father of Learie Constantine, played as wicket keeper, and is recorded as having taken two catches and one stumping and scoring 38 and 45 with the bat. Overall the tourists won ten of the matches played, with one draw and five defeats. This touring team was much stronger than that of the previous (inaugural) 1894/95 tour to the West Indies.

In addition to Priestley, the touring party of thirteen amateurs included A.E. Stoddart, C.A. Beldam and W. Williams of Middlesex, S.M.J. Woods, R.C.N. Palaret and H.T. Stanley of Somerset, R.P. Lewis of Oxford University, C.C. Stone (Leicestershire), F.W. Bush, L. Barratt, J. Leigh and G. Elliott. The performances on the tour of A.E. Stoddart stood out, he being the only tourist to score a century, which he achieved on five occasions including 153no v St. Vincent XI, 107 v Antigua, 133 v St. Christopher C.C. (St. Kitts), 100 v Jamaica, and 143 v Jamaica. Stoddart also headed the bowling averages taking 53 wickets for 520 runs at an average of only 9.81 in the first-class matches, taking five wickets in an innings on five occasions and ten in a match twice. The journal of tour member, Legh Barratt, was sold by Knights in the auction of November 2021 in which Barratt recorded his memories of a happy and successful tour. No record of the identity of the scorer can be found. Bookplates of J.W. Goldman, A.E. Winder and David Frith laid down to inside front cover. *There was some controversy over this tour as Lord Hawke had been asked to take the 1896-97 touring team out to the West*

*Indies following an invitation from the Governor of British Guiana and from Trinidad, Barbados and Jamaica. Unfortunately his telegram accepting the islands' invitations was never received and another English party (this one) led by Arthur Priestley was being arranged, having accepted an invitation from Jamaica. Lord Hawke met Priestley, but the two could not come to an amicable settlement and both decided to go independently to the West Indies. In the issue of 'Cricket' for 8th April 1897 was published the correspondence between Mr Priestley and Lord Hawke, and it would appear from the details set out that Hawke treated Priestley in a rather high-handed manner. Lord Hawke's touring party played its first match sixteen days after Priestley's first match. A rare book from Priestley's tour of 1896/97 is being sold in this auction as lot 1211*

The original wax seal has been clipped, otherwise in good condition. A rare document for the tour £800/1200
- George Hirst holds the distinction of being the only player ever to score 2000 runs and take 200 wickets in one season, that of 1906. Despite his achievements for Yorkshire, he was not able to replicate his performances for England. Hirst played in eleven matches on the 1897/98 tour, scoring a total of 338 runs in eighteen innings at an average of 21.12 with a top score of 85, achieved in the third Test. He also took nine wickets for 682 runs, average 75.77, and took ten catches. England won the first Test by nine wickets, but Australia then won the following four to take the series 4-1. Hirst did not play in the fourth Test having picked up an injury in the third Test at Adelaide.*
- Early tours in the 1860s were primarily organised by professionals, but by the 1870s, amateurs were becoming more involved, and by the 1890s tours were being*



*arranged and funded by individuals such as Lord Sheffield and the Melbourne Cricket Club, with players' contracts negotiated on an individual basis. This process was difficult and inefficient and, thanks in part to the driving force of Major Benjamin Wardill, Secretary of Melbourne C.C., it was realised it would be easier to negotiate with one single body, hence the 1903/04 tour to Australia was the first to be arranged under the auspices of the Marylebone Cricket Club*

The first photograph shows the Eighteen of Victoria in the field with the outer reserve to background, the second image shows Griffith taking strike for England with the Melbourne Cricket Club pavilion to the left of the image and the third photograph shows England in the field, with the wicket-keeper, captain Stephenson with the temporary stand to background with 'Spiers and Pond' advertising. The original photographs vary slightly in size and due to some trimming to original mounts also vary in overall size. *The crowd was estimated at 15,000, with others looking in. Stephenson's team won the match by an innings and 96 runs, Stephenson's team making 305 with Caffyn making 79, Griffith 61. Victoria totalled 118 and 91 in their innings, Griffin taking nine wickets, Bennett seven and Sewell seven wickets in the match. Conway was Victoria's best bowler taking 4 wickets for 60 runs off 51 overs*

*Charles Nettleton was an English born photographer who worked in Victoria, Australia. Nettleton used*

*the wet plate process throughout his career. He photographed the first steam train journey in Australia, between Melbourne and Sandridge, later Port Melbourne. He was later employed by the City of Melbourne. In those roles, he recorded the spectacular growth of Melbourne over 35 years, photographing many of the major public works of the time. Nettleton photographed soldiers being sent to the New Zealand Wars in 1860. In 1861, he was allowed to board the SS Great Britain to photograph the first English cricket team to arrive in Australia. He photographed the volunteer artillery camp at Sunbury in 1866 and in 1867, he was appointed the official photographer during the Victorian visit of the Duke of Edinburgh.*

*In 1861, 'Spiers and Pond' brought over to Australia the first All-England cricket team, who sailed on I.K Brunel's steamship, SS Great Britain, from Liverpool. This was the first commercial sponsorship of cricket.*

*The idea for the tour came from the English proprietors of a Melbourne company called Spiers and Pond, which ran the Caf   de Paris in the city. Spiers was Felix William Spiers and Pond was Christopher Pond. Their representative in England, a Mr Mallam, had tried to interest Charles Dickens in a lecture tour of Australia and New Zealand but without success. Instead, having noted the success of the 1859 venture and the growing popularity of cricket in Australia, Spiers and Pond decided to attract a team of leading English cricketers. Mr Mallam therefore journeyed to Birmingham in September 1861 to watch the North v. South game at Aston Park. During the game, Mallam met the cricketers at the nearby Hen and Chicken Hotel to make a business proposal. As a result, twelve players agreed to tour Australia next winter on terms of £150 per man plus expenses.*

- 334 'Eleven of H.M.S. Britannia'. A montage of four very early photographs, laid down to large card photograph album page, of members of the ship's cricket team, the photographs dated 1865 and 1873. The two on the left hand side are from 1865 showing the team in front of the wicket and the one

below of a match in progress. The two photographs on the right hand side are similar with a team grouping at the top and below an image of a match in progress in 1873. *H.M.S. Britannia (training ship) was the name given to the British Royal Navy's ship used for the preliminary education of naval officers from 1859 to 1905. It was anchored first at Portsmouth, then Portland, and finally off the town of Dartmouth in Devon.*

- 336 G.F. Vernon's tour of Ceylon and India 1889-1890. Good, original and early joint team photograph taken on the tour and featuring members

of Vernon's team and probably of the Punjab team (the photographer's location) who they played in the final tour match in Lahore on the 27th February to the 2nd March 1890. The photograph, by George Craddock of Lahore, Simla and Kasauli, features the two teams, standing and sitting in rows with spectators and trees to the background, wearing an assortment of blazers, caps and pith helmets. Players identified include Lord Hawke, G.F. Vernon and H. Philipson. The general weakness of the Indian and Ceylonese opposition is evident in the number of wide winning margins achieved by Vernon's XI, six of the ten wins by an innings. Twelve of their thirteen hosts had teams which comprised the typical combination of British expatriates who were mostly civil servants or soldiers. The expatriate XIs were no better than English local club teams and so, for the most part, they were easily beaten by Vernon's XI. G.F. Vernon's XI beat the Punjab by an innings and 40 runs*

- 338 Lord Hawke's tour of the United States and Canada 1891. Good, large, original and attractive photograph of the touring team, seated and standing in front of a pavilion on the tour. The photograph, with illegible name of photographer to corner, shows Hawke holding a cricket bat to centre, the grass strewn in front of them with folded blazers, panama hat, bats and pads. There were four first-class matches, all of them in India, including the first match ever to involve an All India XI. In all, they played 23 matches, of which 15 were won, 2 lost and 6 drawn. Three of the matches were in Ceylon*

- 340 'England v Australia. First Test Match, Sydney. Dec 17th to 22nd 1920'. England seemed certain to be bowled out cheaply and to lose the match. In spite of the very difficult batting conditions, however, Hobbs and Sutcliffe took their partnership to 172 before Hobbs was out for exactly 100. Sutcliffe went on to make 161 and in the end England won the game comfortably*

- As evident from the scoreline, the Australian team greatly outclassed the Indians, who had some good individual performances to their credit. However, they did not put up much resistance as a team, with their batting failing to make any impression on the Australians*
- 348 England v Australia 'Ashes Series' 1953. Three very large mono photographs taken at the third Test match at Old Trafford, Manchester. *Albert Chevallier Tayler born in 1862 at Leytonstone, Essex and died in 1925 in Paddington, London. An*

*artist who specialised in portrait and genre painting, but was also involved in the plein air methods (open air) of the Newlyn School. He was a member of the British Royal Academy of Painters, and he studied at Heatherley's School of Art, Royal Academy Schools and with painters in Paris. Tayler was a keen cricketer, and in 1905 produced a set of watercolours with chalk featuring well known cricket players. They were published in The 'Empire's Cricketers: from Original Drawings By A.Chevallier Tayler with Biographical Sketches By G.W.Beldam, Season 1905', with accompanying text by G.W.Beldam. - 389 Steve Waugh. New South Wales & Australia 1984-2004. Australian white sleeveless sweater worn by Waugh on the Australian tour of England in 1993. The sweater, by Silver Fleece, with embroidered Australian emblem to the centre of the chest and 'XXXX' sponsors emblem and with green and gold trim to neck, sleeve and waist was presented to David Frith by Waugh following the series. Name tag 'Steve Waugh' over label. Very good condition £250/350
- In a series dominated by Australia, Steve Waugh again had a very good tour of England in 1993. He made 157no in the 4th Test at Leeds and half centuries at Old Trafford and at Birmingham. His series average of 83.20 (total 416 runs) left him top of the Australian batting averages*
- 390 Steve Waugh. Australia. A pair of Gunn & Moore 'Maestro' batting gloves used by Steve Waugh in the 1989 Ashes series in England. One glove signed by Waugh who presented the gloves to David Frith. Some match wear. Slight fading to the signature, otherwise in good condition £250/350
- Australia won the 1989 series 4-0 to regain the Ashes, their first series win in England since 1975. Steve Waugh topped the batting averages for the series, scoring 506 runs in eight innings with a highest score of 177no, averaging 126.5*
- 391 Dennis Keith Lillee. Western Australia & Australia 1969 to 1983. Original yellow headband, with central 'green flash' emblem to front, worn by Lillee whilst bowling for Australia in the 1981 Ashes series. The headband 'was snatched 'still dripping' from the brow of Dennis Lillee' by Frith. Good condition. One of cricketana's most esoteric items £140/180
- 392 Narendra Deepchand Hirwani. Madhya Pradesh & India 1984-2006. Original yellow headband, with central 'blue arrow' emblem to front, worn by Hirwani whilst bowling for India. The headband was given to Frith for his collection. Good condition £40/60
- Hirwani is mainly remembered for his success on his Test debut. He took sixteen wickets, eight in each innings, for India against West Indies in the final Test in 1988*
- 393 Robert Graeme Pollock, Eastern Province, Transvaal & South Africa 1961-1983. White 'Benson & Hedges Series' cricket shirt worn by Pollock in the mid 1980s matches for Transvaal. The shirt with multi colours band to shoulders and 'Benson & Hedges Series' sponsors emblem to chest. Some staining around the neck otherwise in good condition £70/100
- 394 Ross Gerald Gregory, Victoria & Australia, 1933-1939. Victorian Cricket Association state long sleeved sweater worn by Gregory during his brief first-class playing career. The sweater, with cable stitch to wool, by 'The Mutual Store Limited', with his name handwritten to label, with navy blue trim to neck, waist and sleeves. The sweater has several moth holes and has shrunk a little over time otherwise in good condition for its age. Rare to see a pre-war Victorian sweater £400/600
- Ross Gregory a diminutive gifted right-hand batsman, was a precocious batting talent, making his debut for Victoria while still at school and his Test cricket debut before the age of 21 in the*

- 1936, 1937 season, after scoring 128 for his state against the M.C.C. tourists, although this was his only first-class century. He only played twenty-four first-class matches; he scored 17 fifties in his 33 games and took 50 wickets with his leg breaks and googlies. He compiled 23, 50 and 80 in his three Test innings, making a major contribution as Australia came back from 2-0 down to win the Ashes 3, 1, 2. During the Second World War, Gregory enlisted in the Royal Australian Air Force and attained the rank of Pilot Officer. He was killed in action near the town of Gaffargaon, East Bengal (now Bangladesh) in 1942, aged just 26 years, when his bomber crashed on operations to bomb the Japanese in Burma.
- David Frith wrote a biography of Australian Test cricketer Ross Gregory which was published in 2003.
- 395 Ross Gerald Gregory, Victoria & Australia, 1933-1939. Australian Test long-sleeved sweater worn by Gregory during his brief Test playing career. The sweater by 'Farmer's Sydney', with his name handwritten to label, with green and gold trim to neck, waist and sleeves. The sweater a little soiled otherwise in good condition for its age. Very rare to see a pre-war Australian Test sweater £500/800
- 396 Willie Watson. Yorkshire, Leicestershire & England 1939-1964. England home Test sleeveless sweater worn by Watson during the 1953 Ashes series against Australia. The sweater, by Simpson of Piccadilly, with the three lions and crown of England to the centre of the chest, has his name 'W. Watson' handwritten to neck label. The sweater has a little shrinkage and wear otherwise in good condition. Sold with a handwritten signed card from Watson to this effect £200/300
- Willie Watson played twenty three Test matches for England, his most famous innings was one of 109, in almost six hours, which with Trevor Bailey contributing to a partnership of 163, enabled England to save the second Test at Lord's in 1953 against the Australians, when the game appeared to be lost*
- 397 Leonard 'Jock' Livingston. New South Wales & Northamptonshire 1941-1957. Northamptonshire sleeveless 1st XI sweater worn by Livingston during his career with Northamptonshire. The sweater, by Swanns of Gold Street, Northampton, with maroon and yellow trimming to neck and waist. 'J. Livingston' handwritten to label at neck. Good condition £60/90
- Australian born Livingston played the majority of his first-class cricket in England. Having missed out on selection for the 1948 Ashes tour to England, Livingston joined Lancashire League side Royton for the 1949 season. In 1950 he joined Northamptonshire. Following the cancellation by M.C.C. of the 1949/50 tour to India, George Duckworth assembled a Commonwealth team made up of mainly Lancashire League players, captained by Livingston, to tour the sub-continent.*
- 398 George Edward Tribe. Victoria, Northamptonshire & Australia 1945-1959. A pair of cream cricket flannels (trousers) worn by Tribe during his playing career. The flannels by Austin Reeds, have a buttoned fly with turn-up to leg. Odd small moth hole otherwise in very good condition £50/80
- 399 Cricket clothing. A selection of modern cricket clothing including England v Australia 300th Ashes Test, Headingley 2001 commemorative white cricket shirt produced by npower, a Marston's Beer sponsors white cricket shirt, 'Bunbury Cricket Club' white cricket shirt, a replica Sri Lankan one-day shirt (new in bag), a Queensland Bull red and white scarf and three casual cricket shirts, two produced by the E.C.B. Very good condition. Sold with a Brit Oval seat cushion (some minor wear). Qty 9 £40/60
- 400 The Ashes. Geoff Lawson. Australia. Two individual cricket boots match worn by Lawson in the Ashes series of 1985 and 1989, both signed and presented to David Frith by Lawson. Puma 'Ace', signed 'Geoff Lawson. The Ashes 1985', the other by Reebok signed by Lawson with inscription 'The Ashes 1989- what a win!!'. The 1985 boot with heavy glue repairs to the toe, the 1989 boot with large hole worn through at the big toe. Otherwise in good condition £40/60
- England regained the Ashes in 1985 by winning the six match series 3-1 with two matches drawn. Lawson played in all six matches taking 22 wickets for 830 runs at an average of 37.72. His best match figures were 6/177. Australia then won the 1989 series 4-0 with two matches drawn and weren't to lose the Ashes again until 2005. Lawson's bowling figures were 29 wickets for 791 runs, average 27.27, best 6/72*
- 401 Rodney Hogg. Australia. A pair of 'Puma 100' cricket boots match worn by Hogg, both signed and presented to David Frith by Hogg, date unknown. Good condition £50/80
- Rodney Hogg played thirty eight Tests for Australia 1978-1985 taking 123 wickets at an average of 28.47. His best match return was 6/74, taking ten wickets in a match twice, and five wickets in an innings on six occasions*
- 402 Max Walker. Australia. A pair of Puma cricket boots with leather uppers and soles, match worn by Walker. Both boots signed and presented to David Frith by Walker, one appears to be dated '75'. Good condition £50/80
- Max Walker played thirty-four Tests for Australia 1972-1977 taking 138 wickets at an average of 27.47. His best match return was 8/143, taking five wickets in an innings on six occasions. Walker died in 2016*
- 403 The Ashes. Terry Alderman. Australia. A pair of Puma 'Lillee' cricket boots with leather uppers and soles, match worn by Alderman. The boots unsigned, with handwritten note, 'Terry Alderman's end of 1981 tour'. Presented to David Frith by Alderman. Good condition £50/80
- Alderman played in 41 Tests for Australia, 1981-1991, taking 170 wickets at an average of 27.15. The famous 1981 Ashes series saw Ian Botham relinquishing the England captaincy after the second Test, the reinstatement of Mike Brearley, and England going on to win the series*

- 3-1 with the memorable performances of Botham and Willis. Alderman was the top wicket taker of the series with 42, and ended top of the bowling averages for Australia with 21.26
- 404 John Edrich. Surrey & England. A pair of cricket boots with leather uppers and soles, match worn by Edrich. Maker unknown. Both boots signed, 'Best wishes, John Edrich'. Presented to David Frith by Edrich. Some cracking and wear, otherwise in good condition £40/60
- Edrich played a total of 77 Tests for England 1963-1976. He scored a total of 5138 runs at an average of 43.54. His highest score in all formats was 310no, achieved in the third Test against New Zealand at Headingley in 1965*
- 405 Evelyn Maitland 'Lyn' Wellings. Oxford University & Surrey 1928-1931. M.C.C. tour to Australia 1958/59. Original holdall issued to Wellings. The black zip-up holdall with M.C.C. colours, 'E.M. Wellings' and 'M.C.C. Australian Tour 1958-59' to one side, and 'Ansett-Ana Australia's Major Airline M.C.C. Australian Tour 1958-59' to the other. Maker's name, 'James Watt, Melbourne' to inside. Presented to David Frith by Wellings. Some splitting, otherwise in good condition £30/40
- Lyn Wellings was a cricket journalist who wrote primarily for the London Evening News 1938-1973. With a reputation for vitriol, attacking the one-day game, overseas players in County cricket, and South African isolation. In 2010 David Frith wrote of Wellings 'his attacks on the game's adverse trends and ill-conceived pieces of administration were the compulsion of a man whose regard for cricket was unusually deep' and considered him 'an outstanding analyst'*
- 406 Cricket ties. A good selection of thirty ties including Cornhill Insurance Test match ties for 1980, 1980 (Centenary Test Tie), 1981, 1982, 1984, 1985, 1986, 1987, 1988, 1989, 1990, 1991, 1992, 1993, 1994, 1995 (2), 1996, 1998, 1999, 2000 etc, Texaco Trophy ties for the 1991, 1993, 1994, 1995 etc. Some earlier Cornhill ties VG £30/50
- 407 Clarence Victor 'Clarrie' Grimmett. Wellington, Victoria, South Australia & Australia 1911-1941. Australian green wool Test cap with Australian emblem to front with kangaroo and emu embroidered in metal thread and coloured thread with the legend 'Advance Australia' in scroll worn by Grimmett in the 1924/25 Test series played in Australia. The cap, by Harding's Mercury, Hunter Street, Sydney, with label inside with name handwritten 'C.V. Grimmett' in black ink. Some slight wear to brim and slight soiling and fading to the cap itself otherwise in good condition for its age. Previously sold by Christie's Auctioneers as lot 7 of the sale of 'The Property of the late Clarrie Grimmett of Wellington, Victoria, South Australia and Australia' in their June 2nd auction held in 1988 £12000/15000
- Clarrie Grimmett, a leg spin bowler, was a New Zealand born Australian cricketer. He is thought by many to be one of the finest early spin bowlers, and usually credited as the developer of the flipper, prematurely bald, he often bowled in a cap. He played first-class cricket for Victoria and moved on to South Australia in 1923, but it is for his performances in Test cricket for the Australian cricket team that he is best remembered. Grimmett played in thirty seven Test matches between 1924 and 1936, taking 216 wickets at an average of just 24.21 runs apiece. He took two five wicket hauls on debut against England in Sydney in 1925. He became the first bowler to reach the milestone of taking 200 Test wickets, and is one of only five Test bowlers that played in their first Test after the age of thirty to take more than 100 wickets. He took a five wicket haul on twenty one occasions, seven times finishing with ten wickets or more in a match. His Test career only began when he was aged 33, and ended when he was 44, playing his last Test against South Africa in Durban in February 1936. In first-class cricket he took a total of 1,424 wickets in 248 matches between 1911 and 1941, at a rate close to six wickets per match. Grimmett was named Wisden Cricketer of the Year in 1931, he died in Adelaide in 1980 at the age of 88 years.*
- Grimmett made his Test debut, at the age of 33 years, in the fifth and final Test of the 1924/25 series against England played at Sydney on the 27th February to the 4th March 1925. He excelled in the Test taking two five wicket hauls, 5-45 off 11.7 overs in England's first innings and 6-37 of 19.4 overs to win the Test for the Australians by 307 runs. His match figures were 11 wickets for 82 runs off 31.1 overs.
- 'Only eighteen [Australian] caps dating from before 1940 have been sold publicly in the past twenty years.... Only five caps from before 1930 have been sold. They are rare indeed'. 'The Baggy Green. Michael Fahey & Mike Coward. March 2008
- 408 Gilbert Roache Andrews Langley. South Australia & Australia 1945-1957. Australian green wool Test cap worn by Gil Langley during the Australian Test tour of England in 1953. The cap, by Farmers of Sydney, embroidered with the Australia emblem and below '1953' in gold thread. His name 'G. Langley' handwritten in ink to the inside of the cap on the 'Farmers, Sydney' label. The cap has slight colour discolouration to the peak and back of the cap (probably due to sweat) otherwise in good condition. A rare cap from this Australian Coronation tour of England £4000/6000
- Gil Langley played in four of the five 1953 Test matches, with Don Tallon playing in the first at Nottingham. He took eight catches and a stumping in the four Test matches and following Tallon's retirement in 1953 became the first choice wicket-keeper for Australia until his retirement in 1956. Langley's skills behind the wicket were recognised by Wisden Cricketers' Almanack, who proclaimed him "the safest wicketkeeper in the game" and named him one of its five cricketers of the year in 1957. He had toured England in 1956 and was one of the few highlights in an outclassed Australian side. In the Lord's Test of that year he completed nine dismissals in Australia's only win of the series. This would stand as the Test record for dismissals by a wicket keeper in a match until it was broken by Bob Taylor in 1980. Langley played in twenty six Test*



- Matches for Australia taking 83 catches and fifteen stumping; in first class cricket he took 291 catches and seventy seven stumpings. His career batting average was 25.68 with a top score of 160no. Langley died in 2001, aged 81 years*
- 409 Jeffrey Robert Thomson. New South Wales, Queensland, Middlesex & Australia. 1972-1986. Australian green cloth Test cap, worn by Thomson during his Test career, with embroidered Australian emblem to front. The cap with 'Australian Manufacture' stamp to inside and handwritten presentation inscription 'To David, love, Jeff Thomson, 1977'. David Frith wrote and published his biography 'Thommo, The World's Fastest Bowler' in 1980. Very good condition £2500/3500
- Jeff Thomson was one of the fastest bowlers in the history of cricket; he bowled a delivery with a speed of 160.6→1km/h against West Indies in Perth in 1975, which was the fastest recorded delivery at the time. He was the opening partner of fellow fast bowler Dennis Lillee, their combination was one of the most fearsome in Test cricket history. Thomson had an unusual but highly effective slinging delivery action that he learned from his father. He played in fifty one Test matches for Australia taking 200 wickets at an average of 28 and overall in first class cricket 675 wickets at 26.46*
- 410 William Albert Stanley Oldfield, New South Wales & Australia 1919-1938. New South Wales blue wool state cricket cap with embroidered N.S.W. shield emblem to front of cap. Name handwritten to label 'W.A. Oldfield'. Some wear to cap and wear and some loss of detail to the emblem, lacking the button to the crown of the cap, heavy wear to the cap lining with some tears otherwise in good condition. The cap was given to Frith by Oldfield many years ago when Frith lived in Australia, along with his 1930 Australian tour blazer, also being sold in this auction. Frith regularly visited Oldfield's sports shop in Sydney in the 1950's and got to know him quite well. Sold with a modern postcard of Oldfield keeping wicket probably wearing this very cap £700/1000
- Bertie Oldfield played for New South Wales from 1919/20 season to the 1937/38 season as a wicket-keeper. In all first-class cricket, Oldfield took 399 catches and 263 stumping. He played 54 Tests for Australia and his 52 stumpings during his Test career remains a record several decades after his final Test match*
- 411 Thomas Richardson. Surrey, London County, Somerset & England 1892-1904. Original England cloth Test cap presented to Richardson for his Test match appearances playing for England in between 1893 and 1898. The dark blue cap, with much smaller peak than later caps, with raised wired emblem of the three lions and crown of England to front, made by H. Ludlam & Co of Albemarle Street, London. Some minor wear to inside lining, odd tiny moth hole otherwise in good/very good condition. David Frith obtained the cap from Tom Richardson's son in April 1968. Sold with card to that effect given to Frith when he obtained the card. A rare and early England cap. £1000/1500
- This England cap was presented to Richardson retrospectively sometime around 1908 and before his death in 1912. Notes from the M.C.C. Committee (1907) record 'they had recommended that MCC should design and register, if possible, a device for a cap for England elevens playing in England. Past Test players approved by MCC to be entitled to wear,'...'A cap for cricketers who represented England, in 1907, was selected, the design being three lions under a crown, in silver, on a blue cap, subject to the consent of HM the King. The cap to be obtained from H. Ludlam, Albemarle Street.,' (1908)*
- Tom Richardson, a fast bowler, relied to a great extent on the break-back (a fast ball moving from off to leg), a relatively long run-up and high arm whose cricket matches including 14 Tests, taking a total of 2,104 wickets at an average of 18.43 with a best of 10-45 against Essex in 1893. In the four consecutive seasons from 1894 to 1897 he took 1,005 wickets, a figure unsurpassed over such a period and in 1895 took 290 wickets, two records only exceeded by 'Tich' Freeman of Kent. He made*
- his Test debut in August 1893 against Australia and played his last Test against Australia at Sydney in March 1898, taking 8-94 (his best Test figures) in a losing cause. He took 88 wickets in Test matches at an average of 25.22. Richardson died young at the age of just 41 from a heart attack in Chambery, France in 1912*
- 412 Kumar Shri Duleepsinhji. Sussex & England 1924-1932. M.C.C./England navy blue cloth Test touring cap, by E.C. Devereux of Eton, with excellent embroidered touring emblem of St. George & Dragon. His name 'K.S. Duleepsinhji' inscribed in black ink to the inner label of the cap. The cap has a broken inner peak but does not detract from the overall look of the cap. Some wear to inside lining, some wear and odd moth hole to cap otherwise in good condition. A rare touring cap from this most graceful of batsmen £500/800
- Duleepsinhji was a cricketer who played for England in the era before the Indian cricket team, he is considered one of India's first great batsmen, alongside his uncle Ranjitsinhji, who also represented England. Born in present-day Gujarat, he was educated at the Rajkumar College, Rajkot, before moving to England as a boy, where he attended Cheltenham College, and Cambridge University. Duleepsinhji went on to achieve great success as a batsman for Cheltenham College, Cambridge University, Sussex and eventually England in a career cut short by recurrent illness. In 1930, playing for Sussex, he scored 333 runs in one day against Northamptonshire. He played twelve Test matches for England making a top score of 173. His Test average of 58.5 ranks him among the best batsmen to have played Test cricket. He died in December 1959, following a heart attack, in Bombay*
- 413 Majid Jahangir Khan. Lahore, Punjab, PIA, Glamorgan & Pakistan 1961-1985. Pakistan green wool Test cap worn by Majid Khan on the Pakistan tour of England in 1982. The cap, by Shaheen Cap House of Karachi, with wired silver emblem of Pakistan and '1982' to front of cap.

Name 'Majid Khan' handwritten to inside of cap. Good/very good condition £300/500

*Majid Khan in his heyday, was considered to be one of the best and most majestic batsmen in the world. Khan was one of the best ever opening batsman against express pace, averaging over 50 each in Test matches and World Cups when opening against the fearsome pace attacks of the 1970's West Indies and Australia. In his first-class cricket career spanning 18 years, from 1961 to 1985, Majid Khan played in 63 Test matches for Pakistan, scoring 3,931 runs with 8 centuries, scored over 27,000 first-class runs and made 73 first-class centuries, with 128 fifties*

- 414 Bishansingh Giansingh Bedi. Northern Punjab, Delhi, Northamptonshire & India 1961-1981. India black cloth Test cap, by Ad-Art of Bombay, with embroidered and wired emblem of India with wording 'Indian Cricket Team' in light blue and gold, 'England 1979' in wired thread beneath the front of cap. The cap has the inscription to label 'For David, with best wishes for your cricketing pursuits' Signed 'B. Bedi'. Sold with one of Bedi's cream coloured patkas often worn by Bedi during matches. The patka inscribed by Bedi 'For the Friths with Love, B. Bedi'. Qty 2. Both in good condition £300/500

*Bishan Bedi was primarily a slow left-arm orthodox bowler. His bowling has been described as graceful, even beautiful, and full of guile and artistry. He was an expert in flighting the ball, and was capable of making it hold it back or hurry forward and added subtle variations of spin. He played Test cricket for India from 1966 to 1979 and formed part of the famous Indian spin quartet. He played a total of 67 Tests and took 266 wickets at an average of 28.71. He also captained the national side in 22 Test matches, often wearing his colourful patka. In first-class cricket he took 1560 wickets (more than any other Indian) at an average of 21.69. The Indian tour of 1979 was Bedi's last tour with the Indian team, he had a poor tour taking only seven wickets but remains an Indian cricket legend*

- 415 Edward James Sheffield. Surrey & Kent 1930-1933. Surrey 2nd XI cap worn by Sheffield during his brief first-class cricket career curtailed due to a back injury. The chocolate brown cap, by E.C. Devereux of Eton, with the crown to top but appears to be lacking the shield, which the auctioneer believes was originally beneath it. Some wear and small repairs to the cap otherwise in good condition £50/80

*Sheffield played 23 matches for Surrey during the 1930-1932 seasons and actually topped the county's bowling averages in 1931 with 64 wickets at 19.64 runs per wicket, the wickets included a return of seven for 123 against Somerset in his first match of the season which were the best innings figures of his career. He played 5 matches for Kent in 1933*

- 416 Michael Andrew Atherton. Lancashire & England 1987-2001. Lancashire light blue Schools Cricket Association cap worn by Atherton during his early days as a cricketer. The cap, with embroidered Lancashire emblem of a rose to front in green, red and yellow and the initials 'L.S.C.A.' in red to front. The label signed by Atherton. Good condition £50/80

*Michael Atherton played one hundred and fifteen Tests for England and captained England on a record fifty-four occasions. He scored over 7,700 runs at Test level with an average of 37.69 with a highest score of 185no v South Africa. In first-class cricket he scored almost 22,000 runs at an average of 40.83 and a highest score of 268no for Lancashire v Glamorgan in 1999*

- 417 William Albert Stanley Oldfield, New South Wales & Australia 1919-1938. Australian Test blazer worn by Oldfield on the Australian 1930 tour of England. The green blazer, by Harding's Mercury of Sydney, with gold trimming to blazer edging, pocket and sleeves, embroidered gold and silver wire and coloured thread emblem of Australia to breast pocket with the wording 'Advance Australia' and '1930' beneath. Name handwritten to label 'W.A. Oldfield'. Odd small moth hole to the back of the blazer and slight soiling through

age to the yellow trimming otherwise in good condition. The blazer was given to Frith by Oldfield many years ago when Frith lived in Australia, along with his New South Wales cap, also being sold in this auction. Frith regularly visited Oldfield's sports shop in Sydney in the 1950s and got to know him quite well. A very rare Australian blazer from the 1930 Ashes tour of England £5000/8000

*Bertie Oldfield toured England on four occasions, in 1921, 1926, 1930 and 1934 as well as being a member of the AIF in England in 1919. On the 1921 tour he was the reserve wicket-keeper and appeared in only one Test, but on his next three visits he appeared in all fifteen Tests and built up a reputation as one of the greatest of all wicket-keepers and the best of his generation. In the first Test of 1930 he made two stumpings of Woolley and Hobbs, in the second Test he took six catches. Australia won the series 2-1 with two Tests drawn, it was the first time in England for Don Bradman and he certainly excelled on the tour. Oldfield took 399 catches and 263 stumpings in his first-class career. He played 54 Tests for Australia and his 52 stumpings during his Test career remains a record several decades after his final Test match*

- 418 Thomas Godfrey Evans. Kent & England 1939-1967. M.C.C. navy blue touring blazer worn by Evans on the M.C.C. tour of Australia in 1954/55. The blazer, by Simpson, Daks, embroidered with the M.C.C. emblem in white of St George & Dragon of England and below in scroll '1954 Australia 1955' to breast pocket. Trimming to the blazer edges, pockets and sleeves in M.C.C. colours of yellow and red. Name 'T.G. Evans' to Simpson label in inner pocket. - 419 Robert George Dylan Willis. Surrey, Warwickshire & England 1969-1984. Official M.C.C. navy blue touring blazer worn by Willis on the tour of Australia in 1978-1979. The blazer, by Dak, Simpson of Piccadilly, with embroidered M.C.C. emblem in white of St George & Dragon of England and below in scroll '1978 Australia 1979' to breast pocket. Trimming to pockets, sleeves and blazer edging in M.C.C. colours of yellow and red. Handwritten note in pocket reads 'Bob Willis blazer, given to DF (David Frith) at Edgbaston July 3rd 1986'. - The M.C.C. tour of Australia in the 1978-79 season was a six-match Test series for The Ashes. England won the series 5-1, thereby retaining The Ashes. This series was often over shadowed by Kerry Packer's World Series Cricket which meant many players from both sides were absent, including Greg Chappell. Australia were more handicapped which opened the way for England and their captain Mike Brearley. Willis took twenty wickets in the series including 5-44 in the second Test*
- 420 Sunil Manohar Gavaskar. Bombay, Somerset and & India 1966-1987. Official Indian navy blue touring blazer worn by Gavaskar on the tour of England in 1986. The blazer, by Em Aay of Madras, with beautifully embroidered gold wire and coloured thread Indian emblem and above and below in scroll 'India. England 1986' to breast pocket. Name printed to tailor's label 'Mr Sunil Gavaskar'. Very good condition

- Sunny Gavaskar is acknowledged as one of the greatest opening batsmen of all time; he was widely admired for his technique against fast bowling. He scored over 10,000 Test runs, the first Test player to achieve this landmark, at an average of 51.12 including thirty-four*
- centuries. His highest score was 236no against West Indies in 1983. He held the record for the highest number of Test centuries (34) before Tendulkar went past him in 2005. Gavaskar Gavaskar was also a fine slip fielder and his safe catching in the slips helped him become the first Indian, excluding wicket-keepers, to take over a hundred catches in Test matches. He played his first Test match in 1971 against West Indies and his last was against Pakistan in 1987. He was named one of the Wisden cricketers of the year in 1980.*
- The three Test tour of England in 1986 saw him score only 185 runs at 30.83, which India won 2, 2&10 despite his lack of production*
- 421 Donald George Bradman. New South Wales, South Australia & Australia 1927-1949. A pair of batting gloves presented to David Frith by Don Bradman at the Lord's Taverners reception and Dinner held at the London Hilton on the 13th May 1974. The white leather gloves, both with brown 'sausage shaped' finger and thumb protection are an odd pair of gloves in that the left hand glove has the label of Slazenger 'Len Hutton,' and the right hand glove has the label of 'Grasshopper Sports Goods. By Frank Bryan Ltd of Worcester.'. Both appear well used and are presumed to have been worn by Bradman at some point in the latter years of his playing career. The gloves are sold in the same brown 'Robert Jackson & Co Ltd paper bag that Bradman gave the gloves to Frith and there is the original note that Frith inserted in the bag at the time stating 'Don Bradman's gloves. Given to me at the London Hilton (Lord's Taverners Reception & Dinner, May 13th 1974); the wording had faded a little over the years and has been gone over again in pen. The year '1948' has been added to the note but there is no firm evidence of this. Frith was a good friend of Bradman and met with his wife at the Dinner, they corresponded over a good number of years. A very rare pair of cricket gloves once the property of the greatest batsman of all time

- This was Don Bradman's first visit*
- 422 Craig John McDermott. Queensland & Australia 1983/84-1995/96. County full size cricket bat used by McDermott on the Australian tour of England in 1985. The bat has McDermott initials to top of the shoulder of the bat 'CMcD' and is inscribed 'To David [Frith], Best Wishes Craig McDermott 1985 Test Series' Some wear and repair to the bat's rubber handle, good condition

- McDermott had a wonderful 1985 tour with the ball, taking thirty wickets in the six match Test series but only made 103 runs with the bat*
- 423 John Hugh Edrich. Surrey & England 1956-1978. County Sports 'John Edrich' Autograph cricket bat used by John Edrich whilst playing for England in Tests against both India and Pakistan in 1971. The bat inscribed to the shoulder of the bat by Edrich 'I used this bat in Test matches against India and Pakistan in 1971, signed John Edrich', The bat has a further inscription below presenting the bat 'To Dave, Debbie and the family, good luck and best wishes from Judy and John, Cathryn and Jonathan Edrich'. This being David and Debbie Frith. The bat has cloth tape to the blade in two strips, good condition

- India and Pakistan both toured England in 1971, playing three Test matches each. This was the year when Zaheer Abbas burst on to the International scene making 274 in the first Test at Birmingham. England won the series against Pakistan but lost to India both by one Test to nil, with four matches drawn across the two series*
- 424 William Arras Johnston, Victoria & Australia 1945-1955. Slazenger Australia 'Sykes Don Bradman' Autograph cricket bat used by Johnston on the Australian tour of England in 1953. The bat is inscribed and signed to one side of the bat shoulder by Johnston 'Bill Johnston 1953' and to the other in thicker marker pen (in later years) Bill Johnston 1953 (Average) 102 !!'. The bat has a cloth tape to inside edge of the blade (Johnston being a

*Johnston scored 102 first-class runs on the tour of 1953 batting at number 11. He was only out once and therefore had a Test batting average for the tour of 102*

*Archie Jackson scored 164 on his Test debut in 1929 to become the then youngest player to score a Test century. He died in 1933, aged 23, from tuberculosis. The bat was acquired by David Frith from the previous owner in Hampshire who had been given the bat by Jackson, sold with a photographic image of Jackson walking out to the field with the bat*

- 426 Elias Henry 'Patsy' Hendren. Middlesex & England 1907-1937. Australia v England 1928/29. Warsop 'Extra Special' cricket bat used by Patsy Hendren in scoring 169 runs in the first Test match of the series played in Brisbane on the 30th November, 1st, 3rd, 4th and 5th December 1928. The bat inscribed to the shoulder of the bat by Hendren 'Used in Test match in Australia 1928-9 by me E. Patsy Hendren, First Test 159 runs', Hendren has also printed his name

to the other shoulder of the bat 'Pat Hendren'. The bat is signed in ink by the England and Australian teams. fifteen signatures of the England and thirteen signatures of the Australian players who played in the series. Signatures include Chapman (Cpt), White, Freeman, Hendren, Mead, Tate, Leyland, Sutcliffe, Hobbs, Larwood, Jardine, Hammond, Ryder (Cpt), Blackie, Oldfield, Bradman, Woodfull, Kippaz, Mailey, Archie Jackson, Ironmonger, Andrews, Oxenham, Richardson etc. The signatures all in good order and legible, very slight fading to some signatures. - 427 England v Australia 1921. Gunn & Moore 'William Gunn' Autograph cricket bat signed in ink to the back of the bat by the England and Australian teams who played in the Test series held in England in 1921. Sixteen signatures of the England players and fourteen signatures of the Australia team. Signatures include Douglas (Cpt), Tennyson, Hobbs, Fry, Woods, Fender, Mead, Woolley, Sandham, Brown, Hallows, Armstrong (Cpt), Gregory, Collins, Mailey, Hendry, Bardsley, Ryder, Taylor, Andrews, Macartney etc. Also signed by P.F. Warner. The shoulder of the bat signatures by R.E. Foster and H.K. Foster. This bat was previously sold by Christies' Auctioneers and in its description it refers that the bat was probably used by R.E. Foster in making his record score of 287 v Australia at Sydney in 1903-04. The signatures all in good order and legible, some a little fainter than others. - 428 Charles Burgess Fry, Sussex & England 1892-1921. Gunn & Moore 'William Gunn' Autograph cricket bat. The bat is initialled with 'CBF 4' to the rear shoulder at the ownership position by Fry and to the other shoulder is inscribed 'R. Kennerley, Rumford from C.B. Fry'. The bat has cloth tape to the blade in four different strips, loss to the bat handle rubber. Whether Fry used this bat in matches in which he played is unknown £100/150

- 429 John Thomas Brown. Yorkshire & England 1889-1904. Crawford's

'The Exceller' cricket bat used by Jack Brown in scoring his only Test match century and scoring the fastest ever fifty in Test cricket in 28 minutes in the fifth Test match v Australia played at Melbourne on the 1st, 2nd, 4th to 6th March 1895. The bat is inscribed to the face of the bat 'J.T. Brown made his 140 ... in the great England v Australia match at Melbourne 1895 with this Crawford bat'. There are two words missing from the inscription directly after the number 140. The bat aged, browned and stained, the bat handle rubber present but perishing. The bat has a circular mark to the spine with two tiny holes impressed where a circular number may have been attached suggesting the bat may well have been in a museum or collection. In addition there are two small vertical holes below again suggesting that there may well have been a small plaque attached, possibly from the Wisden Cricket Bat Museum, many of these bats are now on loan at Lord's £20000/30000

*John Thomas Brown, born in Driffield, East Yorkshire in 1869, was a member of the Stoddart's tour touring party to Australia 1894/95. He played in all games on the tour and in the 2nd innings of the fifth Test at Melbourne scored 140, his only Test century, including the fastest ever fifty scored in Test cricket, 28 minutes, and still remains the record to this day. Brown and Ward put on 210 for the third wicket before Brown was out, effectively winning the game. England won the match by six wickets and the series 3-2.*

*In a letter written by Brown, dated March 1895, to his parents, previously sold by Knights in 2006, Brown states that he scored the half century in 27 minutes.. 'If I ever felt determined to do well I did when I heard the people say 'Its all over now,'. I got 51 in 27 minutes and then the people began to think that 'It was not all over yet,' and it was not for Albert Ward and myself took the score to 238 before I was out..... It was a glorious win, one that we shall never forget.....*

- 430 The Triangular Tournament 1912. England, Australia and South Africa. F.H. Ayres 'Victor Trumper'

- Autograph cricket bat signed by all three Test nations who played in the tournament. The Australians with fifteen signatures, the South Africans with fourteen signatures and England with a legible eight signatures. Sadly the wood of the bat has darkened and signatures have faded over the years and many signature are now illegible. Signatures that can be read are Gregory, Whitty, Webster, Minnett, Bardsley, Emery, Macartney, Smith, Snooke, Taylor, Faulkner, Wade, Carter, Nourse, Cox, Fry, Spooner, Douglas, Foster and Hobbs. Printed presentation label for 1961 to the back of the bat £200/300
- The Triangular Tournament of 1912 comprised nine Test matches held in England. Australia were weakened due to player disputes, the English summer was one of the wettest on record, the matches between Australia and South Africa generated little public interest and the venture was never repeated. England won the tournament with four wins, two draws and no losses*
- The Australians beat South Africa in two Tests and lost to England in one Test with the other Tests drawn*
- 431 Test match teams 1930's. Gunn & Moore 'William Gunn' Autograph cricket bat signed to the face of the bat by the All Indian team of 1932, eighteen signatures including Nayudu, Colah, Ghulam Mahomed, Nissar, Singh, Wazir Ali, Jahangir Khan, Palia, Wazir Ali etc. The majority of the signatures legible, four a little faint, signed above these signatures by the West Indies touring team of 1939, seventeen signatures including Grant, Bayley, Williams, Stollmeyer, Headley, Clarke etc, some signatures legible but many not. The face also signed by F.S. Jackson (Yorkshire & England). The back of the bat signed by five other Test teams plus a few other players. The New Zealand tourists of 1937, the West Indies team of 1933, an England Test team of the 1930's, the Australians 1934 and the South African team of 1935 etc. The majority of the signatures legible but some fading and faded. - 432 Australian tour of England 1938. Stuart Surridge 'Perfect' cricket bat nicely signed to the back of the bat by all sixteen members of the touring party in ink. Signatures are Bradman (Cpt), McCabe, Waite, Fingleton, Barnes, Badcock, Ward, Walker, Barnett, Fleetwood-Smith, O'Reilly, Hassett, McCormick, Chipperfield, Brown and White. Jack Fingleton has also signed over the bat 'treatment' label on the shoulder of the bat. The signatures are all in good bright condition. The rubber handle has perished and the majority lost £250/350
- The 1938 Ashes series was tied 1-1 with two matches drawn and the Old Trafford Test abandoned without a ball bowled. In the fifth and final Test at The Oval, Len Hutton famously made his record score of 364, England winning by an innings and 579 runs.*
- 433 England v Australia Services XI, Sheffield 1945. Gunn & Moore 'William Gunn' Autograph cricket bat signed to back by the England and Australian teams who played at Sheffield on 23rd-26th June 1945. Lacking one signature on each team, signed with ten signatures each, possibly due to fading. Signatures include Hammond (Cpt), Robertson, Edrich, Washbrook, Pope, Hutton, Pollard, Hassett (Cpt), Sismey, Carmody, Workman, Pepper, Miller, Price, Ellis etc. Some fading to the signatures but all legible £70/100
- England won the match by 41 runs, Hammond made 100, Washbrook 63, Pope took five wickets in the first innings and Polard five wickets in the Australian second innings*
- 434 Australia and Surrey 1948. 'County Sports. The Caerlulex' cricket bat signed to face by fourteen members of the 1948 Australian touring team and twelve of the Surrey team of 1948. Signatures include Bradman (Cpt), Hassett, Morris, Harvey, Ring, Barnes, McCool, Miller, Holmes (Cpt), Squires, Fishlock, E&A. Bedser, Todd, Gover etc. To verso are faded signatures of an M.C.C. team, one legible of Valentine. The signatures of the Australian and Surrey teams are browned and have some spidering but nearly all legible £150/250
- 435 M.C.C. tour of Australia 1950/51. R.M. Crocker & Son National Choice 'Lindsay Hassett' cricket bat signed to the back by the Australian and M.C.C. teams. Sadly only seventeen signatures remain legible due to fading and include Hassett, Fingleton, Loxton, Johnson, Burke, Compton, Simpson, Statham, Hutton, Parkhouse etc. Below are the faded and fading signatures of the South African team and Sussex teams of 1951. The back also signed by Frank Woolley £100/150
- 436 Middlesex, Surrey and Vic Lewis XI c1959. Lillywhite Frowd 'Jack Robertson' Autograph cricket bat signed to face by the Middlesex and Surrey teams. Twenty-three signatures including Warr (Cpt), Robertson, Compton, Edrich, Titmus, Gale, Russell, May (Cpt), A&E. Bedser, Stewart, Constable, Laker, Lock etc and to reverse what appears to be a Vlc Lewis XI, eleven signatures including Lewis, Edrich, Sharpe, Richardson, Russell, Cox etc. The signatures to the face of the bat a little faded, the signatures to reverse in good condition £50/70
- 437 England 1972/73 and Bert Oldfield (New South Wales & Australia 1919-1938). Slazenger Australia 'Bert Oldfield' autograph cricket bat signed to the back by Oldfield and dated 1972 and by twelve members of the England 1972/73 Test team, signatures include Illingworth, Boycott, Roope, Knott, Arnold, Amiss, Hayes, Snow, Fletcher, Greig etc. Lacking rubber to handle, odd faults otherwise in good condition £50/80
- 438 'Double sided cricket bat'. An unusual double sided (flat on both sides) cricket bat produced in the 1990s by 'The Classic Bat Company'. Good for reverse sweeps. Sold with a 'Darbrook Limited Farokh Engineer autograph bat signed to the face by the M.C.C. and West Indies teams of 1976, some signatures faded, only twelve signatures now legible including Lloyd, Julian, Richards,

- Gomes, Greenidge, Amiss, Roope, Pocock etc. Further signatures to verso, again some faded including Edrich, Close, Brearley, Woolmer, Underwood, Snow, Wood, Old etc. The bat lacking its rubber sleeve. Qty 2 £50/80
- 439 England v South Africa 1947 and West Indies v England 1947-48. Split and hinged cricket stump nicely signed in ink to the top part of the stump by the England and South African teams who played in the 5th Test at The Oval in 1947. Twelve signatures of the England team and fifteen signatures of the South African touring party. Signatures include Yardley, Washbrook, Robertson, Wright, Evans, Compton, Copson, Gladwin, Melville, Nourse, Mann, Fullerton, Viljoen, Rowan, Dyer etc. Below these signatures are the ink signatures of the M.C.C. and West Indies teams from the 1947/48 series in the West Indies. Fifteen signatures of the M.C.C. touring party and seventeen signatures of the West Indies team. Signatures include Allen, Cranston, Wardle, Laker, Hardstaff, Ikin, Headley, Gomez, Stollmeyer, Walcott, Weekes, Goddard etc. Signatures in good condition £100/150
- England beat South Africa in the 1947 home series by three Tests to nil with two matches drawn. West Indies won the 1947/48 series by two Test to nil with two Tests drawn*
- 440 Bruce Nicholas French. Nottinghamshire & England 1976-1995. Original cricket stump used in the England v Australia Bicentennial Test match played at the Sydney Cricket Ground on 29th January to 2nd February 1988, the match was drawn. Bought by David Frith as lot 161 in the Bruce French Benefit auction of September 1991. Label from the auction attached, signed by French. Good condition £50/80
- 441 Australia v England 'The Birth of the Ashes' 1882/1883. A George III Penny, dated 1773, said to have been used by the Hon. Ivo Bligh with William Murdoch when the Ashes were regained by England in the Test Series in Australia. Apparently Bligh gave the coin to Fred Spofforth, the Australia fast bowler, known as 'The Demon Bowler', after losing a bet that Spofforth could not uproot a single stump with the coin atop it two out of three balls. Spofforth promptly proceeded to uproot a stump three times... When later Spofforth played for Derbyshire, the coin was passed to Levi Wright, the county's open batsman. Wright did much to encourage cricket ambitions and one such person was a Henry Henson of Reading. For years, apparently, the coin was kept in a small box made by a Sydney Jeweller, bearing the wording 'From I.B. to F.R.S.', May your descendants never win the toss with it against England' and it was from Henson that Ron Yeomans, a renowned collector, obtained the coin, virtually as a gift. The coin was obtained by David Frith direct from Ron Yeomans. The coin, worn but still showing the date of 1773, is sold with a photocopy of a newspaper cutting with images of the coin reporting the find of the coin, dated July 1966 and was reported on in Playfair Cricket Monthly in January 1967. A rare early Ashes item £3000/5000
- The England Captain Ivo Bligh pledged to bring back 'The Ashes of English Cricket', following the obituary which had been published when Australia defeated England at The Oval during the 1882 English season. In the third and deciding 3rd Test played at Sydney, England batted first making 347 all out in reply, Australia made 218. In England's second innings they made 123 with Spofforth taking 7-44. Barlow (7 wickets) and England then proceeded to bowl the Australians out for 83 winning the Test by 69 runs and the Ashes. After the tourists had won this game and thus the series of three matches by two to one, some ladies burnt the bails used in the match and placed the 'Ashes' in a small urn and presented it to the victorious captain of the English team Ivo Bligh, he had won back the ashes of English cricket'. The urn, together with its embroidered velvet bag, is housed in the Memorial Gallery at Lord's*
- 442 'Ranjitsinhji 3d Cigar'. Large heavy cast iron cigar cutter, the metal top with portrait of Ranjitsinhji, head and shoulders, wearing cap, blazer and tie with the wording "Ranjit-sinhji 3d Cigar" to side. Wind-up mechanical mechanism beneath. 'Patent number. Feb 19 1889' to base, with grooved match striker to side. Made by the Erie Specialty Co, Erie, Pennsylvania USA. Workings rusted and broken. Wear and loss of colour to the wording and image of Ranjitsinhji otherwise in good original condition. The cigar cutter measures 6"x4.5" on the top and 6.5"x5" at the base and stands approximately 3.75" tall. A very rare cigar cutter endorsed by one of the famous cricketing names of the period £1200/1600
- It has been noted that other Cigar Cutter's made by Erie Specialty Co in 1889 (not with Ranjitsinhji's endorsement) are described as Countertop Store Display cutters. David Frith suggests the cutter was produced around 1897-98 when Ranji was at the height of his powers and was a very popular member of Stoddart's 1897/98 team in Australia*
- 443 Frederick Robert Spofforth. New South Wales, Victoria & Australia 1874-1888. Rare silver hallmarked figure of Fred Spofforth, full length in cricket attire holding a cricket ball to waist. The figure, on circular base, measures approximately 4.75" tall and is hallmarked to base for Birmingham 1907. The makers marks are indistinct but are possibly 'H.S.' for H. Samuel Ltd of Birmingham. Six small holes to underside of base suggest that the figure may well have been mounted previously. A rare silver figure of the 'Demon Bowler'... Good condition £250/350
- 444 Thomas Richardson. Surrey, London County, Somerset & England 1892-1904. Original cricket ball with which Tom Richardson took all ten wickets for Surrey against Essex at The Oval in June 1894. The ball mounted on a silver metal stand with wooden base has a silver metal shield with the inscription 'The ball with which Tom Richardson took all 10 wickets for Surrey against Essex at [the] Kennington Oval June 18th 1894'. Minor wear to the stand, the ball becoming loose from its mount otherwise in good original condition. A unique memento of this notable early cricketing feat £700/1000



- Richardson took all ten wickets for 45 runs off 15.3 overs, bowling all but three of the wickets. This was his career best figures and the first time a Surrey player had taken ten wickets in an innings. His figures in the 2nd innings were 5-50 with four bowled. Richardson took 196 wickets in the 1894 season at an average of 10.32*
- 445 Thomas Richardson. Surrey, London County, Somerset & England 1892-1904. Original cricket ball with which Tom Richardson took a career best eight wickets for ninety four runs for England against Australia at the Melbourne Cricket Ground in 1894. The ball mounted on a silver metal stand with wooden base has a silver metal shield with the inscription 'The ball Tom Richardson obtained 8 wickets for 94 runs in the first innings of the 5th Test match against Australia. March 1898'. Some slight wear to the inscription otherwise in good original condition. A unique memento of his Test career-best bowling achievement £2000/3000
- Richardson took eight wickets in the Australian first innings and two in the second but could not prevent Australia winning the Test match and the series by four Tests to one. His figures in the first innings were 36.1 overs, 7 maidens, 8 wickets for 94 runs. Richardson took 54 wickets on the tour at an average of 25.56. This was Richardson's last appearance in Test matches and are the best bowling figures by a player in his final Test match*
- 446 Australian tour of England 1926. 'England's Cricket Mascot'. Original lapel badge depicting a lion batsman, in red enamel, holding a cricket bat and standing in front of the wicket with '1926' in a scroll below. The field in green enamel. The badge is complete as it would have been sold and is affixed to its original card sales label with the printed wording 'England's Cricket Mascot' with the facsimile signature of England Captain Arthur Carr above. The badge measures approximately 1.75cm wide x 2.75cm high and the card measures 6cm x 6.5cm. Some soiling to the card otherwise in wonderfully original condition. During the game, Mallam met the cricketers at the nearby Hen and Chicken Hotel to make a business proposal. As a result, twelve players agreed to tour Australia next winter on terms of £150 per man plus expenses. David Frith wrote 'The Trailblazers'. The only book written on this historic tour*

He took 100 wickets in nineteen Tests for England with a best of 8-59 v South Africa in 1907. Although Blythe suffered from epilepsy he freely volunteered for the Kings Own Yorkshire Light Infantry in 1914 and served with distinction on the Western Front. Blythe was killed in action by 'random shellfire' during the battle of Passchendaele, Belgium in November 1917

- Robert Allan "Fitz" Fitzgerald was an English cricketer and administrator who served as Secretary to the Marylebone Cricket Club between 1863-1876. He represented Cambridge University, M.C.C. and Middlesex, in 46 first-class matches between 1854 and 1874. He also played for I Zingari, the Gentlemen of M.C.C., Buckinghamshire and Hertfordshire. Between 1854 and 1874 he played 50 matches per year and in 1866 scored over 1,000 runs. As Secretary of M.C.C., Fitzgerald sought greater influence for M.C.C. 'off the field' and did much to help improve Lord's Cricket Ground and its facilities. He became M.C.C.'s first paid secretary in 1865.

*Edwin Trim & Co. Wimbledon. The following 20 lots contain original real photograph postcards of tennis by renowned publisher Edwin Trim (1863-1952). Trim was a local printer and stationer in Wimbledon, his shop was in Hill Road, Wimbledon. He produced posters and programmes for the Wimbledon championships from 1893 onwards, from around 1903 he started the first known Wimbledon photo-cards with his first known card being a ladies singles match during the Championships. The iconic Trim Photo-card era lasted for more than three decades. With only odd exceptions nearly all his postcards featured photographs taken at Wimbledon. There is no evidence that Trim was a photographer and may well have sourced his images from local photographers. In 1938 with the death of his son, the company's long association with The All England Club came to an end however the name continued with cards supplied by City Press Agency.
