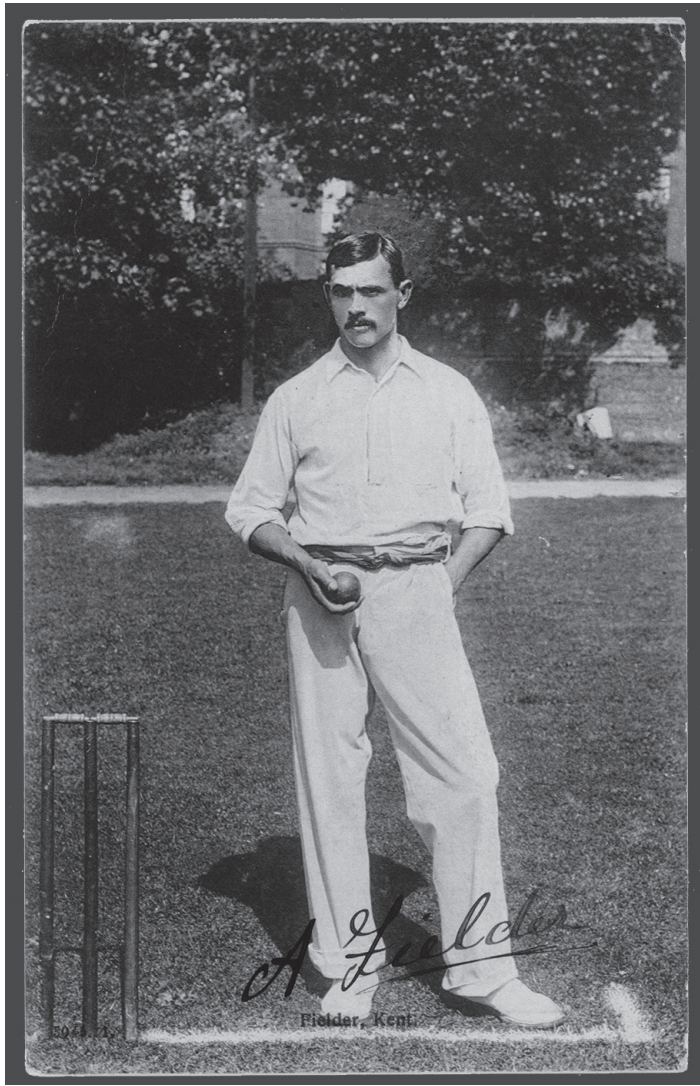

CONDITIONS OF SALE

1. A buyer's premium of 20% (plus VAT @ 20%) of the hammer price is payable by the buyers of all lots.
2. Cheques to be made payable to 'Knights Sporting Limited'.
3. Knights Sporting Ltd, Registered Office, The Thatched Gallery, The Green, Aldborough, Norwich, Norfolk. NR11 7AA
4. Postage and packing will be charged at current rates for all postal deliveries.
- 4a Postage and packing is subject to VAT at 20%.
5. The seller warrants to the Auctioneer and to the buyer that he is the true owner or is properly authorised to sell the property by the true owner and is able to transfer good and marketable title to the property free from any third party claim.
6. The highest bidder to be the buyer. If during the auction the Auctioneer considers that a dispute has arisen he has absolute authority to settle it or re-offer the lot. The Auctioneer may at his sole discretion determine the advance of bidding or refuse a bid, divide any lot, combine any two or more lots or withdraw any lot without prior notice.
7. The buyer shall pay the price at which a lot is knocked down by the Auctioneer to the buyer (the hammer price) together with a premium of 20% (plus VAT @ 20%) of the hammer price, all of which are hereafter collectively referred to as 'the total sum due'. 'A deliberate forgery' means a lot made with intent to deceive.

- 11 Derek Shackleton. Hampshire & England 1948-1969. Large black file comprising a very good and comprehensive collection of correspondence and personal items spanning Shackleton's life from wartime army service, his playing career and later as an umpire through to 1982 and his retirement. Contents include letters and telegrams from acquaintances congratulating Shackleton on achieving 2000 wickets in first-class cricket in 1962, dinner menus and invitations with the odd signatures of attendees, a postcard from Shackleton to his parents while on board ship, and official printed players' itineraries for the Commonwealth tour to India and Ceylon 1950/51 and M.C.C. to India 1951/52. Also a good selection of official typed M.C.C. correspondence relating to the tour including letter of invitation to join the tour, dated 20th July 1951, travel and vaccination arrangements, playing conditions etc., and letters from friends in India looking forward to his visit. An invitation to play for Colne C.C. as their professional in the Lancashire League in the 1961 season, and invitations to play in matches organised by Lavinia, Duchess of Norfolk, Tom Clarke of the Daily Mail, and John Bromley of ITV in 1977. A four page typescript for an article by Shackleton on his playing career, dated 1964. An original player's contract for Hampshire C.C.C., season 1968. T.C.C.B. correspondence to first-class umpires 1979-1981. Other non-cricketing items include Shackleton's wartime service ration book, Soldier's Release Book, a wartime letter of reference from Burnley Football Club for whom Shackleton played as goalkeeper in the reserves team in season 1942/43, Christmas cards received, his driving test failure certificate dated 27th February 1959 and again on 21st April 1959 etc. G/VG. £200/300
- Derek Shackleton played in 583 matches for Hampshire and in his first-class career took 2857 wickets at an average of 18.65. He also appeared in seven Test matches for England 1950-1963, taking eighteen wickets at 42.66.*

Writing from Beverly Hills, California, Smith is replying to a request for a photograph 'for the theatre lobby'. Nicely signed 'C. Aubrey Smith'. Horizontal fold, light creasing and age toning, otherwise in good/ very good condition. £50/70
- Aubrey Smith played for England and Sussex and captained them in 1887 and 1888. He also captained the Shaw & Shrewsbury team to Australia in 1887/88. He gained fame in the 1930/40's as an actor based in Hollywood and appeared in numerous films. He died in 1948.*
- 17 Norman Walter Dransfield Yardley. Cambridge University, Yorkshire & England, 1935-1955. Handwritten two page letter to a London estate agent dated 19th November 1947. Following a recommendation from Ronnie Aird, Assistant Secretary of the M.C.C., Yardley is looking for suitable accommodation in the St. John's Wood area. Nicely signed 'N.W.D. Yardley'. Very good condition. £25/35
- 18 Harold Larwood. Nottinghamshire & England 1924-1938. Handwritten single page letter dated 4th October 1953 with original envelope. Written on airmail paper and sent from Sydney, Larwood is replying belatedly to a request for his autograph, the original letter having been forwarded via Trent Bridge and the New South Wales Cricket Association. Signed 'H. Larwood'. Light folds, otherwise in good/ very good condition. £40/60
- 19 Sunil Manohar Gavaskar. Bombay, Somerset and & India 1966-1987. Single page handwritten letter from

- Gavaskar dated 9th March 2010 on his personal letterhead, replying to a request for autographs. Signed by Gavaskar. Light folds, otherwise in good/ very good condition. £30/50
- 20 Surrey C.C.C. players' letters 1950s onwards. Five letters from Surrey players responding to requests for autographs, invitations to events etc. Each letter signed by the featured player. Signatures are Peter [May], Tony Lock, Jim Laker, Ken [Barrington] and Alec Bedser. Odd faults, overall in good condition. £50/80
- 21 Irving Rosenwater. Cricket writer and collector. Single page typed letter from Rosenwater dated 17th April 1984. Writing from Sydney to a correspondent in Bromsgrove, Worcestershire, Rosenwater apologises for 'this terrible delay' having received the original request for his autograph some two years after it being originally sent. Nicely signed in black ink by Rosenwater. VG. £30/50
- 22 James Lowther, 1st Viscount Ullswater, President of M.C.C. 1923. A collection of nine handwritten notes and a letter from Ullswater to the M.C.C. secretary, Francis Lacey, and his assistant, William Findlay, all written in 1923 from 19th July to 27th November, on headed notepaper for Ullswater's residences in Great Cumberland Place and Campsea Ashe in Suffolk. Subjects covered include the availability of the President's motor car and parking arrangements, the provision of official stationery, giving permission for the photography of prints and drawings in the Lord's pavilion, dates of availability (or not!) to attend meetings, discussions about designs by Sir Herbert Baker for the development of a new grandstand etc. All letters signed 'Ullswater'. He makes observations about how 'charming and friendly' the people of India and Pakistan are, 'but I completely fail to understand their real hostility for one another'. Regarding the cricket he states, 'The less said the better.. our team have suffered a lot of injuries and illness' describing their batting in the most recent match as 'unimaginative and third rate.. I have a meeting with the Captain and the Manager this evening to discuss the future'. Signed 'Gubby' with a handwritten postscript in which he states, 'The real truth is that this side plays poor cricket because they are.. a very poor side'. G/VG. £30/50
- 24 Pelham Francis 'Plum' Warner. Oxford University, Middlesex & England 1894-1920. M.C.C. tour to Australia 1911/12. Four handwritten airmail letters from Warner to his son 'Es' (Esmond Warner) who is posted in Cairo, written in 1950 and 1951. Warner writes at some length about family and cricket, and reports that the Duke of Edinburgh has invited him to be the next President of the M.C.C., quoting the Duke as saying 'I feel sure that all cricket minded people in the country will agree with my choice'. He looks forward to the visit of the West Indies touring party and later describes entertaining the Prime Minister and Mrs. Attlee and several other dignitaries and foreign royalty 'in the box at Lord's', and presenting the teams to the King, describing it as 'a great event'. A later letter dated 24th June 1957 coincides with another tour by the West Indies, and Warner reports that their fielding 'went to pieces' in the second Test at Lord's, which England won by an innings and 36 runs, 'they [West Indies] will have to do some hard thinking about their side for Nottingham'. He make interesting observations about the Lord's pitch, describing it as 'dangerous & I have long been fearful of a dreadful accident'. Despite the pitch 'Weekes played a superb innings. He is a very great batsman'. In contrast Warner states that 'the wicket at Nottingham next Test is too good & we may have to struggle hard there'. During the Second World War, Gregory enlisted in the Royal Australian Air Force and attained the rank of Pilot Officer. He was killed in action near the town of Gaffargaon, East Bengal (now Bangladesh) in 1942, aged just 26 years, when his bomber crashed on operations to bomb the Japanese in Burma.*

Ted McDonald was a cricketer as well as being an Australian rules footballer before totally concentrating on cricket. Despite a short international career, he was considered by many cricketers as well as commentators to be one of the best fast bowler of his generation. McDonald was the unexpected bowling sensation of the 1921 Australian tour to England. He and Jack Gregory caused something approaching panic among the England batsmen. Where Gregory was able to swing the ball both ways, McDonald imparted vicious movement off the wicket. Like later fast bowling pairs, they were devastating in combination, taking 46 wickets in the series. McDonald played a few matches for Victoria before the First World War, but came to prominence immediately after it with eight wickets in an innings in a state match. He was picked for three Test matches in the 1920-21 series against England, which Australia won 5-0, but had little success, his six wickets costing 65 runs each. In England the following summer, though, he was an instant success, taking eight wickets in the first Test at Trent Bridge and contributing significantly to the victories at Lord's and Headingley that won the series McDonald was named as a Wisden Cricketer of the Year in 1922 for his exploits of the previous summer. After the England tour, McDonald

played in three Tests against South Africa in the 1921-22 series in South Africa. Those, however, were his last Tests, all of his Test cricket was contained within the calendar year of 1921 as he then took up an engagement as a professional with the Lancashire League club Nelson. By 1924, McDonald had qualified to play for Lancashire, initially, because of his League commitments, in midweek games only. Again, he was a sensation. In his first full season, in 1925, he took 205 wickets, and in the five seasons from 1926 to 1930, Lancashire won the County Championship four times, the most successful period in the county's history. In all, he took 1053 wickets for Lancashire. His value to the county was recognised in the award of a benefit in 1929, an unusually fast reward, for he had been playing county cricket for only five seasons. McDonald's first-class career ended fairly suddenly. His form dipped in 1930, though he still took more than 100 wickets, but in 1931, he lost form almost entirely, taking just 26 wickets all season and being left out of the county team for half the matches. At the end of the season, he went back to the Lancashire League with Bacup. McDonald died at the age of 46, when his car collided with another near Bolton, England, on the morning of 22 July 1937.

The Australian tour of England in 1921 was the only time that 'Rowan, Glasgow' produced the players caps and blazers.

'Only eighteen [Australian] caps dating from before 1940 have been sold publicly in the past twenty years.. Only five caps from before 1930 have been sold. They are rare indeed'. 'The Baggy Green. Michael Fahey & Mike Coward. March 2008

Bertie Oldfield toured England on four occasions, in 1921, 1926, 1930 and 1934 as well as being a member of the AIF in England in 1919. On the 1921 tour he was the reserve wicket-keeper and appeared in only one Test, but on his next three visits he appeared in all fifteen Tests and built up a reputation as one of the greatest of all wicket-keepers and the best of his generation. In the first Test of 1930 he made two stumpings of Woolley and Hobbs, in the second Test he took six catches. Australia won the series 2-1 with two Tests drawn, it was the first time in England for Don Bradman and he certainly excelled on the tour. Oldfield took 399 catches and 263 stumpings in his first-class career. He played 54 Tests for Australia and his 52 stumpings during his Test career remains a record several decades after his final Test match.

The 1989 six Test Ashes series was won by Australia by four Tests to nil, with two matches drawn. Border made 422 runs in the Test with a highest score of 80 and an average of 73.66, he scored six half centuries in the six Test matches played. Border played in one hundred and fifty six Tests for Australia and scored 11,174 runs at an average of 50.56 with 27 centuries. He captained Australia in

- 93 Test matches from 1984/85 to 1994.

Cooper (Middlesex, Kent, Victoria & Australia 1863-1878), 'the Sydney men are disgusted at the idea of his playing for us [Melbourne] against them'. The article continues with an interesting commentary on dwindling public support for cricket, 'the Victorian public has become very fastidious in its patronage of the game, and nothing less than a Grace would now draw a crowd at our colonial'. Included is a description of the Melbourne ground, 'Richmond Paddock.. looking fresh and green.. the elm trees planted by the first All England Eleven are well and flourishing', and it continues with the hope that the English will return soon with W.G. Grace, 'Unless we can have Mr.[sic] W.G. Grace we don't care for the minor constellations in the cricket firmament'. The article is signed 'H', and David Frith has annotated in pencil, 'Hammersley?'. The introduction of Spofforth in to the bowling attack saw M.C.C. lose seven wickets for six runs, Spofforth ending with figures of 5.3 overs, 3 maidens, 6 wickets for only 4 runs including a hat trick, and M.C.C. were dismissed for 33 with six ducks and only Hornby reaching double figures. In reply the Australians mustered only 41 with Midwinter top scoring with 10, Shaw and Morley taking five wickets apiece. In the second innings M.C.C. fared even worse being dismissed for a paltry 19 runs, Spofforth taking a further four wickets and Boyle six, and the Australians scored the required twelve runs for the loss of one wicket, 'so that the Colonials beat the greatest and the most powerful club in the world by nine wickets'. - 336 Arthur Priestley's tour to West Indies 1896/97. 'The Cricketers' Scoring Book (Greatly Improved)' published by John Wisden & Co., London. Original scorebook for the tour, comprising batting and bowling analyses for two innings to each double page. The large format cloth bound scorebook, with gilt title to front and measuring 13.5"x15.75", includes complete scores neatly annotated in ink for all sixteen matches played on the tour, which comprised four matches in Barbados, one each in Antigua and St. Kitts, another in Barbados, four in Trinidad, ending with five in Jamaica. Nine of the matches were deemed first-class, one of which, played at Port of Spain, was the first time a representative West Indies eleven had played against a touring English team. Captained by Aucher Warner, brother of P.F. Warner, West Indies won a thrilling contest by three wickets in which Lebrun Constantine, father of Learie Constantine, played as wicket keeper, and is recorded as having taken two catches and one stumping and scoring 38 and 45 with the bat. Overall the tourists won ten of the matches played, with one draw and five defeats. This touring team was much stronger than that of the previous (inaugural) 1894/95 tour to the West Indies. In addition to Priestley, the touring party of thirteen amateurs included A.E. Stoddart, C.A. Beldam and W. Williams of Middlesex, S.M.J. Woods, R.C.N. Palairret and H.T. Stanley of Somerset, R.P. Lewis of Oxford University, C.C. Stone (Leicestershire), F.W. Bush, L. Barratt, J. Leigh and G. Elliott. The performances on the tour of A.E. Stoddart stood out, he being the only tourist to score a century, which he achieved on five occasions including 153no v St. Vincent XI, 107 v Antigua, 133 v St. Christopher C.C. (St. Kitts), 100 v Jamaica, and 143 v Jamaica. Stoddart also headed the bowling averages taking 53 wickets for 520 runs at an average of only 9.81 in the first-class matches, taking five wickets in an innings on five occasions and ten in a match twice. The journal of tour member, Legh Barratt, was sold by Knights in the auction of November 2021 in which Barratt recorded his memories of a happy and successful tour. No record of the identity of the scorer can be found. Bookplates of J.W. Goldman, A.E. Winder and David Frith laid down to inside front

In the issue of 'Cricket' for 8th April 1897 was published the correspondence between Mr Priestley and Lord Hawke, and it would appear from the details set out that Hawke treated Priestley in a rather high-handed manner. Lord Hawke's touring party played its first match sixteen days after Priestley's first match.*

The expatriate XIs were no better than English local club teams and so, for the most part, they were easily beaten by Vernon's XI. G.F. Vernon's XI beat the Punjab by an innings and 40 runs.*

Ron Archer was a highly gifted all rounder who played nineteen Test matches for Australia, his career was cruelly cut short by a serious knee injury in the one-off Test against Pakistan in Karachi in 1956 when he was just 23. A permanent fixture in the team from his debut against South Africa at Melbourne in 1952/53 until stricken by injury in 1956 Archer was a stylish middle order batsman and robust opening bowler. In 1953 he played in the last three of the five Test matches played. When England toured Australia in 1954/55 he topped the Australian bowling averages with 13 wickets (16.53), made 64 not out in the first Test and 49 in the second Test. He played in the first four Tests but not the fifth. Showcasing his all round talent he took 18 wickets at 25.05 in England in 1956 but fell injured in Pakistan on the way home. He played in 1958/59 as a specialist batsmen but though he averaged over 40 for Queensland his knee would not allow him to continue in the game. After retiring from the playing field he worked as a TV executive, became Cricket Australia's Code of Behaviour Commissioner and officiated as an International Cricket Council match referee. He was made a life member of the Queensland Cricket Association for his services to cricket. In his nineteen Test matches he took forty eight wickets at an average of 27.45, took twenty catches and scored over 713 runs at an average of 24.58 with a top score of 128.

The blazer beautifully embroidered with the Australia emblem to breast pocket and below 'N.Z. Tour 1967' in gold thread, with gold trimming to blazer pocket and sleeves. The blazer is in wonderfully good condition with the emblem bright. A rarely seen blazer for this tour. £400/600

While the Australia national cricket team was touring South Africa in February and March 1967, another Australian team captained by Les Favell, toured New Zealand to play each of the six provinces and four matches against New Zealand, but these matches did not have Test status. The Australians won against Auckland and Otago but lost to Canterbury and in the first international match against New Zealand, the other six matches were drawn.

The loss to Canterbury was the first time Australia had ever lost a first-class match in New Zealand. This was a strong team, seven of the team had played Test cricket and three others later played in Tests. Some observers considered it a stronger team than the Australian Test team that was touring South Africa at the same time.

- 424 Raymond James Bright. Victoria & Australia 1972-1986. Australian dark myrtle green test blazer worn by Bright during his Australian career. The blazer, embroidered with the Australia emblem to breast pocket is in very good condition with the emblem bright. The vendor bought the blazer direct from Bright, who worked for him following his retirement from cricket. £300/500

Ray Bright, a spin bowler, played in twenty five Tests for Australia. He was selected for a large number of Australian touring parties, including to New Zealand in 1973-74, 1976-77, 1978, 1981-82 and 1985-86, England in 1977, 1980 and 1981, the West Indies in 1978-79, Pakistan 1979-80 and 1982-83, Sri Lanka 1980-81, Sharjah 1986 and

India 1986-87 but it is not known which tour this blazer was worn in.

- 425 Thomas William 'Tom' Graveney. Gloucestershire, Queensland, Worcestershire & England, 1948-1972. England 'home' Test blazer worn by Graveney during his Test match playing career. The navy blue blazer, by Simpson of Piccadilly, with raised embroidered emblem of the three lions and crown of England to chest. The blazer with minor wear otherwise is in good/very good condition and the emblem bright and fully intact. The blazer was bought, along with the Australian blazer of Ron Archer (lot 422) by the vendor from another collector around 30 years ago. £300/500

- 426 Brian William Luckhurst. Kent & England 1958-1976. 'M.C.C. tour of Australia 1974-75'. M.C.C. navy blue blazer, by Burton, worn by Luckhurst on the tour of Australia with wired emblem of St. George and the dragon and below 'Australia & N.Z. 1974/75'. The vendor bought the blazer from Luckhurst direct in the 1990's. Good condition. £250/350

Luckhurst replaced Geoff Boycott from the original tour party due to Boycott having to withdraw on the grounds that he was yet fit enough mentally to return to Test cricket. Luckhurst scored 415 runs on the tour at an average of 25.93.

- 427 Chetan Pratap Singh Chauhan. Maharashtra, Delhi & India 1967-1985. Official Indian navy blue touring blazer worn by Chauhan on the tour of England in 1979. The blazer, by Em Aay of Madras, with beautifully embroidered gold wire and coloured thread Indian emblem and below 'England 1979' to breast pocket, silver metal buttons to blazer featuring the Indian emblem. Name printed to tailor's label 'Mr C. Chauhan'. Chauhan's business card to pocket. Very good condition. £400/600

Chetan Pratap Singh Chauhan was a cricketer who played 40 Test matches for India. He played Ranji Trophy for Maharashtra and Delhi. He played most of his international cricket in the late 1970s and was the regular opening partner of Sunil Gavaskar during that period. He

scored over 2000 Test runs at an average of 31.57.

CRICKET BATS, BALLS & EQUIPMENT

- 428 William Lloyd 'Billy' Murdoch. New South Wales, Sussex, London County Australia & England 1875-1904. A pair of brown leather wicket-keeping gloves, inscribed on the left glove 'Presented to Harry Musgrove.. Lords XI by Billy Murdoch 18[.] worn on the tour of England 1878'. The wording indistinct, fading and worn in certain parts particularly on the year 18.?. Both gloves mounted and box framed, with modern plaque which reads 'The wicket-keeping gloves used by W.L. Murdoch during the Australian tour of England in 1878'. The beautifully carved framed with decoration of cricket bats, stumps, bails and balls. Overall the frame measures 20"x16" . Sold with a copied image of the 1998 lot description, the cover of the catalogue and an image of the gloves in the catalogue [see below]. A very rare and early item from Australia's inaugural tour of England. £10000/15000

Murdoch began his career as a wicket-keeper, but at Test level kept wicket only once, with Jack Blackham being preferred, Murdoch acting as stand-in when needed. He played in the second Test match ever played, the 1877 clash against England at the Melbourne Cricket Ground. Murdoch captained Australia in sixteen Test matches, on the tours of 1880, 1882, 1884 and 1890 tours of England, one of which, in 1882, gave rise to The Ashes. As a batsman, Murdoch scored both the first double century in Test cricket, 211 against England in 1884 and the first triple century in Australian domestic cricket, 321 against Victoria in 1882. In later years, he settled in England, playing county cricket for Sussex, 1893 to 1899, as captain and London County, 1900 to 1904. In 1892, he toured South Africa with England and played in one Test match, making him one of the few cricketers to represent more than one international team. Murdoch's final first-class match came at the age of 49 in 1904. He died in Melbourne in 1911, aged 56.

Murdoch kept wicket in one Test match for Australia against England, in the 2nd Test at Sydney in 1882 and for England in Cape Town in 1892, tour match. In total, Murdoch kept wicket in forty seven first class matches including twenty seven tour matches in England on the 1878, 1880, 1882 1884 and 1890 tours of England. In 1878 he kept wicket for Australia in seven tour matches.

The gloves were originally sold in the Phillips Auctioneers auction held at the Kooyong Lawn Tennis Club, Melbourne on the 23rd August 1998 as lot 369. The gloves then were described as being signed, there is not sign of this through the frame but his signature may be on the hidden undersides of the gloves.

Henry 'Harry' Alfred Musgrove was an Australian theatrical manager and cricketer who played for Victoria and in one Test match in the second Test of the 1884/1885 series against England at Melbourne. He was the successful manager of the Australian team in England in 1896, 'where his tact and courtesy contributed significantly to a harmonious tour'.

'He was good enough as a keeper for demon Spofforth to refuse to play in the first of all Tests at Melbourne, March 1877, because Murdoch was not the keeper. In the face of Blackham's success behind the stumps, Billy concentrated on his batting but often on tour he would keep while Blackham fielded'. Jack Pollard. Australian Cricket, the Game and the Players' 1989

'Behind the stumps Blackham was the equal of the best English wicket-keepers and Murdoch acted efficiently as his stand-in'. Peter Wynne-Thomas. 'The Complete History of Test Tours. 1989.

'The Evolution of the Cricket Bat'.

429 A mid eighteenth century circa 1740-1750 cricket bat of light wood, possibly willow, with right-handed curve and distinctive hook-shape to base, no shoulders, made by William Pett of Sevenoaks with two impressed marks 'W. Pett 4' on top of handle and 'Will. Pett Sevenoaks Kent' on the base of the bat. The overall length of the bat is 38.25", the width at the centre of blade is

just over 4" and the maximum width of the base of the bat is 2.5" and weighs almost 2lb. The curved shape of this bat and the type of maker's mark are consistent with it being made in the mid-18th century. There are some heavy indentations to the bat face, the result of its being used for a hammering action of some sort, quite possibly the putting in of stumps otherwise it is in remarkably fine condition with the twine grip still preserved on the long handle. It makes an interesting comparison with the 18th century oak bat made by Thomas Edmonds, formerly in the MCC collection, and included as lot 665 in Christie's MCC Bicentenary Auction of 1987. This was more than double the weight at 5lb. However, it had the maker's name stamped on the base in similar fashion and was essentially the same shape, exactly the same length and with the same form of surviving twine grip. Immense weight is not a necessary characteristic of surviving 18th century bats. The oldest known bat, inscribed "J. C. 1729" and kept at the Oval, weighs only 2.4lb (see Wisden Book of Cricket Memorabilia p. 229). Hugh Barty-King in Quilt Winders and Pod Shavers 1979 (p46) refers to another surviving bat made by Pett himself weighing 2.2lb. A very rare and early cricket bat previously sold by Christie's Auctioneers as lot 133 in their sale of 1998. Sold with the late vendors research notes giving further information on the bat. £4000/6000

William Pett (1710-86) is the earliest recorded cricket bat maker in Kent. His bats, very different from modern ones, were designed to look more like hockey sticks. John Frederick Sackville, 3rd Duke of Dorset, purchased eleven of his bats in 1766 at two shillings and sixpence each. One of Pett's bats, made in 1745, is now in the local Sevenoaks Museum. William Pett is one of the few recorded makers of bats prior to the 19th century. G.D. Martineau in 'Bat, Ball, Wicket and All' (1950) records the names of two London bat makers, Christopher Thorn and George Wheeler. Then adds: 'The names of the other bat-makers of the 18th century which we know are Wm. Pett and his son Thomas, both of Sevenoaks, John Small,

senior, of Petersfield, William Staples of Sevenoaks, and Charles Budd of Brighton...'. There is much more detailed discussion of Pett, who died in 1786, in Barty-King's Quilt Winders and Pod Shavers, pp. 44-47. It is noted therein that 'By the 1770's William Pett must have been making cricket bats on a reasonably large scale, for they seem to have been readily available for purchase in retail shops in London and probably elsewhere'. Evidence for their popularity comes from Fanny Burney's (an English satirical novelist, diarist and playwright) diary where she quotes a letter from a friend in the west country, Mrs Rishton, asking her "'to buy Mr. Rishton two cricket bats made by Pett of 7 Oaks. You will get them at any of the great toy shope, the maker's name always stamp'd upon them'.

Provenance (given by Christie's in 1998): This bat and the preceding lot (another bat) were sold by Christie's in 1998 were removed from Hollin Hall, Near Ripon, North Yorkshire, following the death of the last direct descendant of the Boynton Wood family. The bats, together with other artefacts dating from the 18th century, were found earlier this year behind a very large George III mahogany breakfront bookcase; as opposed to being deliberately put there, they must have fallen down from the top of the bookcase which was installed during refurbishments to the house in the later part of the century; the side panels to the bookcase meant there was no way of recovering the bats unless the enormously heavy bookcase was itself moved. The bats may have belonged either to John Wood of Copmanthorpe and Hollin Hall (died 15 November 1778) who assumed the name of Boynton, and is the person who commissioned the bookcase while aggrandising the family mansion; or to his younger brother Richard Wood (1712-97) who succeeded him as heir to the Hall. Richard Wood married Elisabeth, daughter of Hutton Perkins of Mill Hill, Middlesex, in 1745, and the couple had 3 sons (and 2 daughters) who would also have been old enough to play cricket before the century ended. However,

the existence of the bats, lying in the darkness between the back of the bookcase and the wall behind, must have been forgotten for well over a hundred, perhaps even closer to two hundred years.

- 430 'Tom Walker's Skyscraper'. A late 18th Century cricket bat purportedly used by Tom Walker to make 95 not out for the White Conduit Club v Kent at Canterbury in 1786. The bat, with fading ink inscription to the top of the blade 'Walker/Innings 95/86', was made by William Yalden (1740-1824), a friend of Walker's, who played for Hampshire and Surrey. Impressed marks 'Wm. Yalden' on the top of the bat handle, some loss to the edges of the impressed marks, unspliced, narrow shoulders with angled edges flaring to a thick, slightly convex toe. The back of the bat is humped, not bevelled. The bat is 36.25" long. There is, what appears to be, an old museum label to the blade which reads 'Period 1780-1835. Unspliced' in ink. Small loss to the bottom of the face of the bat and smaller amount to the back of the bat otherwise in good condition. The bat was previously in the M.C.C. Collection and was sold as lot 677 in the M.C.C. Bicentenary auction of April 1987 which was conducted by Christie's Auctioneers. A very early and rare bat used by a paid professional batsman of the day. Sold with the late vendors research notes giving further information on the bat. £4000/6000

Thomas Walker (1762-1831) was one of leading batsmen of 18th century cricket. He played as a professional for Surrey (1787-93) and Surrey (1788-1910) whilst appearing occasionally for Hambledon and various 'All England' teams. The bat was purportedly used by Walker to score 95no and 102 for the White White Conduit Club (+ six given men) v Kent at Canterbury in August 1786. Walker was paid by the London club to appear as one of the 'given men' in a match for which much money was wagered. Such high scoring was extremely rare at this time, and it is likely that, after the match, the White Conduit Club bought the bat from Walker as a memento of his

performance for them. During the following year, 1787, members of the White Conduit Club formed the Martylebone Cricket Club, so would have taken this bat to display in the pavilion at the first Lord's Ground. It must have been displayed at each of the three Lord's Grounds as the club moved its headquarters. Having eventually reached the St. John's Wood Ground, it survived the fire of 1825 which destroyed most of the artefacts contained there. Although there are older bats in existence, this bat is the oldest known bat to be used in one of the 'grand' matches by a leading batsman of the day.

The late vendor of the bat attended the sale held by Christie's on behalf of the M.C.C. and viewed the bat prior to the sale. What he noticed was that the Tom Walker Skyscraper bat had been misnumbered by Christie's auctioneers and instead of being the catalogued lot 677 it had been numbered Lot 667 and vice versa with the bat being sold as lot 667 'An elegant later 19th century straight faced bat with square shoulders'. He bought the lot for. £160 and the other incorrectly numbered bat appertaining to be Walker's bat sold for. £1000. Some days later, the vendor received a call from Christie's, admitting their mistake and asking if he would sell the bat back for. £1000, the vendor refused.

- 431 A 'Pod' cricket bat. An early 19th Century 'pod' cricket bat from around circa 1820. The bat is unspliced with narrow straight shoulders and flaring towards the toe. The face is unusually slight convex and the back of the blade is ridged and bowed. Part of one edge has been repaired. The bat measures 35.25" long and weighs almost 3;lb, maker unknown. There is what appears to be an old museum label to the blade which reads 'Straight and shouldered. Unspliced Pod 1800-1835' in ink. The bat was previously in the M.C.C. Collection and was sold as, I assume, lot 685 in the M.C.C. Bicentenary auction of April 1987 which was conducted by Christie's Auctioneers. A very early and rare bat. Sold with the late vendors research notes giving further information on the bat. £300/500

'Pod cricket bats were produced for a short period around the 1820's and reflected the growing anxiety amongst batsman to find an alternative to the 'clubs' used by earlier generations. Bowling was becoming more and more round arm and the weight did not need to be so concentrated at the base of the bat. The 'Pod' was more effective against this type of bowling and its unusual shape appealed to a new generation anxious to be fashionable.

- 432 An early whalebone sprung spliced cricket bat. An early mid 19th Century cricket bat from 1851, made by Edward and William Page of Surrey, London with impressed stamp to the base of the bat and to the shoulder. The blade is spliced and straight shouldered and the back very slightly humped. The bat measures 34.75" long and weighs just over 2lb. There is a metal presentation plaque to the top of the bat which reads 'From the members of Torquay Cricket Club to W.H. Kitson, Hon Secty. September 1851'. An early and unusual bat. Sold with the late vendors research notes giving further information on the bat. £300/400

This bat was amongst the first bats made by E. & W. Page with a whalebone strip down the splice. The strips of whalebone were the early frontrunners of the modern 'springs'. The 1850's saw the fashion of very light bats, during this period a lot of shots were made behind the wicket and the ball was rarely driven. This bat is exceptionally slim which helped to reduce the overall weight.

- 433 George Baker 'Six wickets v United All England Eleven 1859'. An early cane handled cricket bat with a cane splice. An early mid 19th Century cricket bat from 1859, probably, made by Thomas Nixon of Oxford. The blade is cane spliced and straight shouldered flaring slightly to the toe and the back very slightly humped. The bat measures 34.25" long and weighs almost 2.5lb. There is a metal presentation plaque to the back of the bat which reads 'Presented to G. Baker by the U.M. Butchers C.C. for good bowling against the United All England Eleven, at Kennington Oval, 23-5-59'. The bat also has

Baker's name impressed twice to the front of the bat to either side of the splice 'G. Baker'. An early bat presented for bowling against the All England Eleven. Sold with the late vendors research notes giving further information on the bat.

£400/600

George Baker played for the twenty two of the United Master Butcher's Club against the travelling United England Eleven at Kennington Oval on the 23rd-25th May 1859. During the match, he took six wickets in the first innings and one in the second and amongst his victims were John Wisden, John Lillywhite, William Mortlock and Robert Carpenter, all amongst the finest players in England. The match was played for the benefit of the Master Butchers Charitable Institution. Baker bowled unchanged in the first innigs and finished with figures of 44 overs, six wickets for 53 runs. The England Eleven only mustering a 100 runs in the first innings. The United England Eleven won the game by 152 runs.

- 434 Frank Dark & Sons, Lord's Cricket Ground. An early cricket bat made by Frank Dark & Sons at Lords in 1876. The bat is slightly gently rounded rather than ridged and its convex shape flattens at the toe. It measures 34.25" long and weighs just over 2lb. The top of the handle has impressed 'F.Dark' and on the front of the shoulders the words 'F. Dark & Sons' and 'Lord's Ground' and down the splice again the words 'F.Dark & Sons'. There is a metal presentation plaque to the back of the bat which reads 'Presented to A. Boorman by the members of the G.W.R. (P.D.) C.C. for the highest average runs 1876'. Sold with the late vendors research notes giving further information on the bat.

Frank Dark was the son of James Henry Dark, who was the proprietor of Lord's between 1835 and 1864. The extensive Dark family had been connected to Lord's since the very early 1800's and the bat making business handed down several times. The bats were made in a small factory under the Mound Stand and sold at matches held at Lord's

- 435 Aquila Clapshaw cricket bat 1877. An early cricket bat made by

Clapshaw and exported to Australia. The bat is typical of this period, the blade is slim and the back almost flat at the top, becoming slightly humped as it reaches the toe. The handle made from four strips of can glued together. It measures 34.75" long and weighs just over 2lb. The top of the handle has impressed Aquila Clapshaw & Sons, City Road, London' and under the toe is impressed 'City Road'. The bat is a 'Superior' and the front of the blade is impressed 'W. Isard' There is an inscription inscribed into the wood and highlighted in gilt 'Vice President's Prize. Sandridge Cricket Club. Presented to Mr W. Treadaway for Best Cup Batting Average. 1st Elven. Season 1876-7'. Direct descent from the Treadaway family. Sold with the late vendors research notes giving further information on the bat.

£200/300

Members of the Clapshoe (changed to Clapshaw in 1803) family had been making cricket bats in Surrey since 1700. This bat was made at the branch in City Road where a dozen craftsman turned out 10 to 12 bats a day. The firm continued to make bats into the 1970's.

- 436 Richard Gorton 'Dick' Barlow, Lancashire & England, 1871-1891. 'My Favourite Bat'. A very historic bat used by Barlow during the 1881 and 1882 cricket seasons and abroad on tour with England teams in Australia, New Zealand and the United States of America. The bat is covered in paper and has been since the turn of the century when it was pictured in Barlow's book 'Forty Seasons of First Class Cricket' written by him in 1908. The bat has comprehensive handwritten details of the matches the bat was used in by Barlow. The neat printed writing begins 'A cricket bat which has travelled around the world. This is the most successful bat R.G. Barlow ever played with. It then lists the scores made with the bat beginning with the county matches of 1881, Gentlemen v Players, Shaw's Tour to America, New Zealand and Australia in 1881/82 finishing with Barlow's tour total runs and average for the tour. Then is listed the scores for the 1882 county season plus the Gentlemen v Players matches and

finally scores made on Ivo Bligh's tour of Australia in 1882/83, finishing off with his 1882 total runs and average made. He used the bat in the sixth Test match v Australia at Sydney 1881-82 making 31 & 62, the eighth Test match v Australia at Melbourne 1881-82 making 16 & 56 and the twelfth Test match v Australia at Sydney 1882/83 making 28 & 24. The closing wording reads 'Barlow carried this favourite bat right through the innings seven times in 1882, four times in first class matches. In first class and local cricket he made over 4000 runs with it'. The bat is slim and the back slightly humped. The handle is triple sprung and a hanging hook has been inserted into the top of the handle for display purposes. Direct descent from the Barlow family. The bat, as has been stated, has been covered in paper for more than a century however part of the face of the bat is uncovered and it appears that there is writing to the top of the blade of the bat including Barlow's signature. The bat appears to be in worn condition, the handle lacking its binding thread, being wrapped it is difficult to judge the blade of the bats condition. Sold with the late vendors research notes giving further information on the bat and a photocopy of the page 157 featuring the bat from his book.

£15000/25000

Richard Barlow played in 351 first class matches scoring over 11,000 runs at an average of 20.61 with a highest score of 117 v M.C.C. in July 1885. He took 950 wickets at 14.52 with a best of 9-39 v Sussex in June 1886. He played seven times for England against Australia in England: in the match which gave rise to the Ashes at the Oval in 1882; and at Lord's, the Oval, and Old Trafford in 1884 and 1886. Barlow paid three visits to Australia, going out with Alfred Shaw and Arthur Shrewsbury in 1881/1882, with the Hon. Ivo Bligh in 1882/3, and again with Shaw and Shrewsbury in 1886/1887. He played in every match of all three tours. His batting epitomised the term 'stonewalling'. It was said that for every 100 runs scored by his opening batting partner, Hornby, Barlow would score ten. He also played football

as a goalkeeper for Lancashire and ultimately became a Test match umpire.

In the sixth Test match against Australia at Sydney in the Shaw tour 1881/82 he used this bat to forge the very first opening hundred partnership in Test cricket. In 1882 playing for Lancashire against Nottinghamshire he batted unbeaten through the Lancashire innings scoring only five runs. The innings lasted for eighty seven overs and did not score a single run when on 0 for 70 minutes which is still the lowest score ever made in these circumstances.

The bat is pictured on page 157 of his book 'Forty Seasons of First Class Cricket' 1908 amongst eleven other bats used by Barlow. The bat stands sixth from the left on the image and is mentioned by Barlow in the commentary below the image.

- 437 Kingsmill James Key. Surrey & Oxford University 1892-1904. 'Record Partnership Bat 1887'. A Gradidge 'Imperial Driver' cricket bat used by Key when scoring 281 runs in a record stand with Hylton Philipson of 340 runs for the seventh wicket for Oxford University in their first innings against Middlesex at Chiswick on 23rd-25th June 1887. This was the highest first class score recorded. The bat signed to the shoulder of the bat K.J. Key. The bat came from the family by descent and the bat and a ball from the match were sold in one lot at auction and described as being used in the match. The ball was banded and engraved as having been used in this match. Sold with the late vendors research notes giving further information on the bat. £400/600

Middlesex entertained Oxford at Chiswick Park in June 1887 and at lunch on the first day, Oxford were 86-5. At 104 for 6 Hylton joined Key and they added 340 runs together and the University finished their innings on 555 all out. Middlesex were bowled in cheaply and followed on with the eventual result being Oxford won by an innings and 229 runs.

Kingsmill Key was identified as a fine all-round cricketer whilst at Clifton College, moving onto

Oxford in 1883 where he obtained his blue. He played his first match for Surrey at the age of 17. Key was a middle order batsman and slow off break bowler who played for Surrey from 1882-1904, he captained the side from 1894 to 1899 with considerable success, winning the County Championship in that six year period on three occasions (1894, 1895 & 1899, finishing 2nd once and 4th in the other two seasons. He is quoted as a 'A man of most original views, an always philosophic cricketer and an imperturbable captain'. His highest score was 281 for Oxford University v Middlesex in 1887. He went on Sanders tour of North America in 1886, Hawke's tour of North America in 1891 and Oxford University Authentics tour of India 1902/03. A noted rugby player, he gained his blue at Oxford. He died in August 1932, at the age of 67, from poisoning after an insect bite.

- 438 "A Cobbett Triangular Bat c1889". A triangular practice cricket bat made by James Cobbett of St. John's Wood, London. The triangular shaped bat's blade is only 2.25" in width and has 'Cobbett, Marylebone' stamped below the splice and Cobbett's trade mark stamp to the top of the splice. The back of the blade rises sharply from the splice into an acutely angled ridge before sharply falling away at the last moment towards the toe. The thickness of the blade is almost constant from shoulder to toe. The bat measures 34.25" long, original binding to handle. Some marks to the blade otherwise in good original condition. Sold with the late vendors research notes giving further information on the bat. £150/250
- 439 Kumar Shri Ranjitsinhji. Cambridge University, Sussex & England. 1890-1920. 'Ranji's University bat 1892 and 1893'. A Benjamin Warsop & Sons 'Superior' cricket bat used by Ranjitsinhji in the years 1892 and 1893. The bat has his initials 'K.S.R.' to the back of the bat and a list of matches and scores achieved by him in Ranji's handwriting in ink. Some of the scores towards the bottom of the list are illegible but many above are legible although some indistinct. The scores made in 1892 are to the right hand side of the back of the bat and

scores made in 1893 to the left hand side of the bat. The 1892 scores, being the first season he played senior cricket but the season before he played first class cricket, listed are for matches played for his college Trinity. The scores are listed vertically and headed '92' [1892] and include 79no v St. Johns, 58 v Varsity, 101 v Selwyn, 146 v St. Johns, 40 v Oxford City, 141 v Bedford, 142 v St. Johns, 111 v Jesus, 142 v Bridlington etc, to the right is the heading '93' [1893] with scores noted below including 18 [v C.I. Thornton's XI], 40 v Gents of England, 11 not out, 55 [v M.C.C.], 17 run out [v Yorkshire], 5 v Yorkshire, [38] v Surrey, 17 not out [v Australians], [40] v Sussex, 54 v M.C.C. etc. Sold with the late vendors research notes giving further information on the bat.

Kumar Shri Ranjitsinhji was the ruler of the Indian princely state of Nawanagar from 1907 to 1933, as Maharaja Jam Saheb and a noted Test cricketer who played County cricket for Sussex and Test cricket for England. He is widely known as the 'Father of Indian Cricket', as he was one of the earliest top-class Indian cricketers to play the sport. Ranji has widely been regarded as one of the greatest batsmen of his era. Unorthodox in technique and with fast reactions, he brought a new style to batting and revolutionised the game. Previously, batsmen had generally pushed forward; Ranji took advantage of the improving quality of pitches in his era and played more on the back foot, both in defence and attack. He is particularly associated with one shot, the leg glance, which he invented or popularised. The first-class cricket tournament in India, the Ranji Trophy, was named in his honour.

This bat was used by Ranji throughout the two seasons, when he was at Trinity College, Cambridge. It accompanied him through his rise to prominence until he gained his blue in 1893.

- 440 William Henry Patterson. Oxford University & Kent 1880-1900. A James Cobbett 'Gutta Percha Driver' cricket bat used by William Patterson in 1892 when he topped the Kent

Averages scoring 511 runs in nine matches and it is likely that he used it to score 114 for Kent v Lancashire. The bat formed part of the Charles Pratt Green famous cricket bat collection and on the right hand shoulder of the bay is written 'C.P. Green Esq 99'. The number 99 indicates that the bat was number 99 in Green's collection and in the book 'Historic Bats' by J.N. Pentelow lists it as belonging to William Patterson and used in 1892. In 1931, Green's bat collection was bought by Sir Julian Cahn in 1931 and this bat was part of the purchase. There is another number impressed to the splice being 'D5933' and this may well relate to its place in Cahn's collection. The bat is impressed with the Cobbett's trademark to the top of the spine with the name 'Cobbett' impressed either side. Below this are various wordings within circles including 'maker', 'Marylebone' and 'Cobbett's Jubilee' and 'Gutta Percha Driver' and to the top of the handle the name 'Cobbett' is stamped twice. Sold with the late vendors research notes giving further information on the bat. Good original condition.

William Patterson attended Harrow School and played in the drawn match v Eton at Lord's in 1877 having had his cricket kit stolen while travelling to Lord's by carriage. He subsequently played first class cricket for Oxford University and Kent 1880-1900, and was joint captain of Kent 1890-1893. He was later President of Kent C.C.C. and served on the M.C.C. committee.

A Gutta Percha is a tropical tree and its use in providing the rubber for this bat provided the novelty name which would appeal to those who bought it.

- 441 William Gunn. Nottinghamshire & England 1880-1904. A Gunn & Moore 'The Autograph' cricket bat used by William Gunn in making 273, his highest first class score, for Nottinghamshire against Derbyshire at Derby in July 1901. The bat formed part of the Charles Pratt Green of Malvern famous cricket bat collection. The face of the bat has the standard Gunn & Moore wording impressed to it and back of the bat has been painted gold and inscribed

in black painted wording to the width of the top of the blade 'Notts v Derbyshire, 273, Played at Derby, July 15-16-17 1901. Sold with the late vendors research notes giving further information on the bat. Very good original condition. £400/600

William Gunn was a very tall, graceful and patient batsman. A classical cover driver, he played in eleven matches for England and featured in twenty six century partnerships with Arthur Shrewsbury. One of the finest batsmen of the early Golden Age, Gunn also played two football internationals for England and in 1885 founded the famous bat making firm of Gunn & Moore. Gunn's innings dominated the match against Derbyshire, the weakest first class county at the time and he batted for five and a half hours. His innings was chanceless and included thirty eight fours. This was his highest first class score.

- 442 John Berry 'Jack' Hobbs, Surrey & England 1905-1934. A Frank Bryan 'The President Special' cricket bat used by Jack Hobbs in making 130 for Surrey v Essex at Leyton in 1906. The face of the bat has the standard Frank Bryan wording impressed to it and below this is affixed to the bat a 'Surrey County Cricket Club' letterhead on which Hobbs has dated '14th September 1906' and written the following wording 'I have used this bat on several occasions, making among other scores, 130 v Essex at Leyton'. Signed 'Jack Hobbs S.C.C.C.' The letterhead yellowed and worn to the edges. There are two bat rubbers on the bat, some loss to the bat rubber. Sold with the late vendors research notes giving further information on the bat. Good original condition. £700/1000

Jack Hobbs was probably the finest batsman of all time, he played for Surrey between 1905-1934 and played 834 first class matches. He scored over 61,700 at an average of 50.70 with 199 centuries, incredibly ninety eight of them were scored after his fortieth birthday, and a highest score of 316 v Middlesex in 1926. For England he made 61 Test appearances for England scoring over 5,400 runs at an average of 56.74 with a best of 211 v South Africa in 1924.

With this bat, the young Jack Hobbs scored his fourth century. Opening the batting at Leyton with Tom Hayward, Hobbs put on 164 for the first wicket in two hours. Hobbs had qualified to play for Surrey in 1905, and this was his second century against Essex in two seasons.

- 443 Donald George Bradman. New South Wales, South Australia & Australia 1927-1949. A William Sykes Ltd. Don Bradman. N.S.W. and Australian XI Autograph' bat. The bat is said to have been used by Bradman on the Australian unofficial 'goodwill tour' of Canada and America, the team led by Arthur Mailey, Captain of the team in 1932. The bat was presented to the Hollywood Cricket Club by Arthur Mailey as Caoptain and on behalf of the Australian team, following the end of the last match played on the 24th-28th August 1932. The notes, written by the late vendor, describe that Sir Charles Aubrey Smith had loaned his Buick car to Bradman and his new wife Jessie for the length of their stay and, in response, Bradman presented Smith with the bat which he used throughout the tour. The bat is inscribed in ink to the back on the left, in what in my opinion, is Bradman's hand, 'The Australian Cricket Team', to the right is written 'c/o A.A. Mailey, Manager', again I feel in Bradman's hand. Sold with the late vendors research notes giving further information on the bat. Good original condition.

The rising star Don Bradman had only agreed to tour if he could bring his newly married wife Jessie with him. So Jessie had a squad of cricketers with her on their honeymoon!. The Australian tour party consisted of twelve cricketers and they played twenty matches in Canada and America between June 17th and leaving to return to Australia on the 31st August 1932. Bradman stated in his foreword for 'The Don meets the Babe' by Ric Sissons 1995 'I recall him [Aubrey Smith] with great nostalgia as a wonderful kind hearted gentlemen. Amongst other things he put his car and Chauffeur (plus dog) at the disposal of my wife and me during our few unforgettable days in

Hollywood'. The Hollywood Cricket Club was formed in 1931 by British actor and cricketer C. Aubrey Smith. The publicity from the Australians' North American cricket tour was put to good effect with the founding of the club and the securing of a permanent cricket ground at Griffith Park in Burbank, near the film studios. Celebrities who played for the club over the years include P. G. Wodehouse, Boris Karloff, England), Boris Karloff, Aubrey Smith, Ronald Colman, Leslie Howard, David Niven, Errol Flynn, Douglas Fairbanks, Laurence Olivier etc and Olivia de Havilland, Joan Fontaine, Elsa Lanchester and Merle Oberon attending matches it was a star studded affair.

C. Aubrey Smith played for England and Sussex and captained them in 1887 and 1888. He also captained the Shaw & Shrewsbury team to Australia in 1887/88. He gained fame in the 1930/40's as a film actor based in Hollywood and founded the Hollywood Cricket Club in 1931. He died in 1948 aged 85.

444 'Australian Cricketers. Goodwill Tour 1932'. Australian tour of Canada & America 1932. Scarce official brochure for the tour with pen pictures, biographies and itinerary. The tour started in Victoria, Canada on 17th June and finished in Hollywood on 28th August 1932 and was organised and run by Arthur Mailey. A very rare brochure from the tour. Includes with the brochure is a rare two page folding paper scorecard for the Australian team who played St. Catherines at Ridley College on the 5th-6th July 1932. Plus a disbound scrapbook with press cuttings laid down covering June and part of July 1932, some pages detached. The items were given to the vendor by a friend, who was a Candian prior to his death. 446 William Walter Keeton. Nottinghamshire & England 1926-1952. A Gunn & Moore 'Autograph' bat used by Keeton in scoring 1162 runs in August 1933. Keeton scored more than 1000 runs in August 1933, with six centuries in the month, including four in five innings. The centuries were 129 v Surrey, 110 v Hampshire, 168 v Middlesex, 110 v Yorkshire, 138no v Lancashire and 100 v Kent.

Walter Keeton played in two Tests for England in 1934 and 1939. He was a Wisden Cricketer of the Year in 1940 and played first-class cricket as a right-handed opening batsman between 1926 and 1952 for Nottinghamshire. Keeton scored a century against every other first-class county and his 312 not out made in just under eight hours against Middlesex at the Oval in 1939 is still a record for the Nottinghamshire team. He also played professional association football for Nottingham Forest and Sunderland.

447 'Charles John Barnett. Gloucestershire & England 1927-1948. A Gunn & Moore 'Autograph' bat

used by Barnett in scoring three centuries for Gloucestershire in 1934. The face of the bat is inscribed 'Season 1934. 170 v Worcestershire at Dudley, 100no v Worcestershire at Cheltenham and 189 v Sussex at Cheltenham' below the inscription Barnett has signed his name. Barnet scored three of the six centuries scored in 1934 with this bat, all were scored between the 28th July and the 17th August. Against Sussex he hit two sixes and twenty four fours. Charlie Barnet was one of the most entertaining and aggressive opening batsman ever to play for England. He was a strong driver and cutter who could destroy an opening attack in minutes. He played in twenty Test matches for England, scoring two centuries.

448 Charles Stewart Dempster. Wellington, Scotland, Leicestershire, Warwickshire & New Zealand 1921-1948. A Gunn & Moore 'Autograph' bat used by Dempster in scoring three consecutive centuries for Leicestershire in 1938. The face of the bat is inscribed 'A delightful bat. Three centuries in a row. C.S. Dempster. New Zealand XI'. Also initialled to the shoulder of the bat by Dempster. The bat rubber has perished and little remains of it. Good original condition. Sold with the late vendors research notes giving further information on the bat. £300/500

Dempster scored three consecutive centuries with this bat against Australia 105, v Hampshire 110 and Oxford University 187. 'Stewie' Dempster was one of the finest batsmen ever to play for New Zealand. He toured England with the first New Zealand team in 1927 and headed the averages, scoring six centuries. In 1929 he scored the first ever Test century for New Zealand. He qualified for Leicestershire and

captained the county between 1936 and 1938. He played first class cricket for twenty seven years and averaged 44.98 in all matches and in Test cricket he ended with a Test average of 65.72.

- 449 Denis Charles Scott Compton. Middlesex & England 1936-1958. A Slazenger 'Denis Compton Autograph' bat used by Compton in making his highest Test score of 278 for England against Pakistan in the second Test at Trent Bridge in July 1954. The bat inscribed to front by Compton 'With this bat I scored 278 against the Pakistan touring team in the Nottingham Test 1954' and signed below 'Denis Compton'. On the back of the bat on the shoulder are the handwritten initials 'D.C.S.C.' The bat in good original condition. Sold with the late vendors research notes giving further information on the bat. £1500/2500

Following his duck in the first Test of 1954, Compton soon made amends at Nottingham. Pakistan made 157 all out in their first innings and England replied with 5586 declared and Compton made 278 of the runs, Reg Simpson making 101. Compton hit a six and thirty three fours in the innings. England won the Test by an Innings and 129 runs and Compton's score still remains the highest Test score at the ground. He batted for 290 minutes.

Denis Compton scored almost 40,000 first class runs, with a highest score of 300 and an average of 51.85. He played 78 matches for England and scored almost 6,000 runs at an average of 50.06 and a best of 278. His best season was 1947 where he scored 3816 runs at an average of an incredible 90.85 with 18 centuries. Compton was the original Brylcreem boy. He was a breathtakingly talented batsman who had all the cavalier abandon and audacity of youth. He played football for Arsenal and won the F.A. Cup with them in 1950.

- 450 John Hugh Edrich. Surrey & England 1958-1978. County Sports 'John Edrich autograph' cricket bat used by Edrich to score his hundredth century in first class cricket. He scored 101 not out with this bat for Surrey v Derbyshire on the 12th July

1977 at The Oval. The bat inscribed to front by Edrich 'With this bat I scored my hundreth century in first class cricket', signed below 'John Edrich'. The bat in good original condition. £1500/2500

- 451 Sydney George Shepherd. Worcestershire 1936. 'Stourbridge Cricket Week 1937'. Gradidge 'Imperial Driver' cricket bat with heading in black to front 'Stourbridge Cricket Week 1937' and below the results of the two matches played by Worcestershire in the County Championship against Yorkshire and Glamorgan. Signed to the back of the bat by all three teams, Worcestershire, Yorkshire and Glamorgan and the odd additional player who didn't feature in the matches. Worcestershire lost to Yorkshire by an Innings and 81 runs and beat Glamorgan by nine wickets, Hedley Verity taking ten wickets in the match for Yorkshire, five in each innings, Hutton and Leyland making

centuries. Sydney Shepherd made just the one first class appearance for the Worcestershire club playing at Stourbridge v Yorkshire in May 1936. Worcestershire won the match by 11 runs in a very low scoring game, Verity taking thirteen wickets in the match. Shepherd made 9 and 0 with the bat and bowled two overs without success. He went onto play for Cheshire.

- 452 John Richard 'Jack' Mason. Kent & England 1893-1914. A large leather cricket bag containing a set of cricket pads, a cricket bat, a pair of batting gloves, a pair of cricket boots and a Kent C.C.C. County cap, all belonging to and worn by Jack Mason who played over 330 matches for Kent and played five Tests for England as a member of A.E. Stoddart's England touring party to Australia 1897/98. The cricket pads are a little worn through use and age but complete in good condition, the Gunn & Moore 'Autograph' cricket bat has a little old woodworm and some loss to the rubber handle otherwise in good condition, the white leather wraparound batting gloves with dark brown chamois finger protection button closure, the leather cricket boots, wonderfully soft to the touch, in nice condition with mud and grass still attached to the hobnailed soles and the Kent county cricket cap worn by Mason. The navy blue cap, by E.C. Devereux of Eton, with Kent emblem of the 'white horse rampant' to front. 'Mason J.R.' handwritten in ink to inner cap label. The cap is faded and has minor wear to it and it has the smaller peak, typical of a pre first world war cricket cap. The cricket bag, with brass fittings, containing the items is very worn, a little damaged but almost complete. It has the remains of travel stickers to its sides, part of one appears to read 'Beckenham Junction' and what appears to be faint red, white and blue flag shaped decoration, two to each side. One end of the bag has been roughly repaired and the other end requires restoration. One of the handles at the end of the bag has broken. This was Mason's kit bag as it was more or less left at the

end of his playing career in 1919, something not often seen.

John Richard Mason, known as Jack Mason played for Kent County Cricket Club between 1893 and 1914, captaining the team between 1898 and 1902. He played for England in all five Test matches on A. E. Stoddart's 1897/98 tour of Australia. Over six feet tall, Mason was a right-handed batsman and right-arm fast-medium pace bowler, classified as a genuine all-rounder. His highest score of 183 came against Somerset at Blackheath while, in 1899, he posted an unbeaten 181 against Nottinghamshire in an unbroken partnership of 321 with Alec Hearn. He was offered the captaincy of the English team to tour South Africa in 1905-06. He declined, and Pelham Warner captained the team. Mason was chosen as one of the five Wisden Cricketers of the Year in 1898. He died in 1958 at the age of 84 years.

Mason's cricket bag and letters written during the 1897/98 tour later formed the basis of 'Test of Time. Travels in search of a cricket legend', a book about the tour which was written by Mason's grandson John Lazenby and published in 2005. In the book, Lazenby vividly describes the moment as a youngster when he climbed into the roof his father's garage and opened the cricket bag for the first time revealing the contents of the bag. His family sold the cricket bag to a local dealer in the mid 1960's and they eventually were bought from the dealer and became part of the collection of the late vendor of these items. Lazenby visited the vendor in the course of research for the book and reacquainted with the bag and its contents.

Lyn Wellings was a cricket journalist who wrote primarily for the London Evening News 1938-1973. With a reputation for vitriol, attacking the one-day game, overseas players in

innings in which they made 356, the Gentlemen were then bowled out for 185, the Players in their second innings made 293-4 declared with Brearley taking a further two wickets. The Gentlemen were bowled out for 315 and the Players won the match by 149 runs. In 1905, his best season, Lancashire fast bowler, Walter Brearley took 181 wickets at an average of 19.25.

470 Oxford v Middlesex 1887. The cricket ball used during the Oxford innings of 555 and the record breaking third wicket stand of 340 runs for the 6th wicket stand between Kingsmill Key and Hylton Philipson for Oxford University v Middlesex in the match played at Chiswick Park, Chiswick on the 23rd to 25th June 1887. The ball with silver metal band with inscription 'Oxford v Middlesex. June 23rd, 24th, 25th. Oxford scored 555 with this ball. K.J. Key 281. H. Philipson 150. 340 runs for the 6th wicket. Record '. Good condition. A rare and early ball from a record breaking cricket match. £300/500

In this match between Oxford University and Middlesex, Oxford batted first and scored 555 all out. Middlesex were then bowled out for 119 and following on for 207 leaving Oxford the winners by an innings and 299 runs. Whitby six wickets and Forster seven took the wickets for the University. The record stand of 340 remained a record until 2005 and Key's score of 281 remained a record score for the University until 2013. Kingsmill Key went onto play first class cricket for Surrey, whom he captained for several years in the 1890s. Hylton Philipson went onto play for Middlesex and England as a wicket keeper batsman and is well known for his Vanity Fair portrait by Spy published in 1889.

- Australia won the final Test at The Oval by 592 runs, Bill Ponsford made 266 and Bradman 244 in Australia's first innings, England in reply made 321 all out with Leyland making 110. Australia in their second innings made 327 all out, with Clark and Bowes both taking five wickets for England. Australia won the match and the Ashes by bowling out England for 145 with Grimmett taking 5-64.*
- 491 England v Australia 1932/33. 'Bodyline'. Circular ceramic ashtray with impressed inscription to centre '19.11.33. Never mind the leg Theory. We have the Ashes'. The date of the 19th November 1933 was the date when the M.C.C. touring team left Australian shores to continue their tour in New Zealand. The ashtray with light brown/cream inner and black outer rim. 'Bovey' impressed to base, 4.25" diameter. Good/very good condition. £150/250
- The Devon Tors Pottery was one of the smaller potteries operating*

from Bovey Tracey the Ashes series by four Tests to one. The tour was highly controversial because of the bodyline bowling tactics used by the England team under the captaincy of Douglas Jardine.

Bodyline, also known as fast leg theory bowling, was a cricketing tactic devised by the English cricket team for their 1932-33 Ashes tour of Australia, specifically to combat the extraordinary batting skill of Australia's Don Bradman. A bodyline delivery was one where the cricket ball was bowled at the body of the batsman, in the hope that when he defended himself with his bat, a resulting deflection could be caught by one of several fielders standing close by.

The tactic was considered by critics to be intimidatory and physically threatening, to the point of being unfair in a game that was supposed to uphold gentlemanly traditions. England's use of a tactic perceived by some as overly aggressive or even unfair ultimately threatened diplomatic relations between the two countries before the situation was calmed. Although no serious injuries arose from any short-pitched deliveries while a leg theory field was actually set, the tactic still led to considerable ill feeling between the two teams, particularly when Australian batsmen suffered actual injuries in separate incidents, which inflamed the watching crowds. The controversy eventually spilled into the diplomatic arena.

Calthorpe (Warwickshire & England 1919-1930) who played in the match and was instrumental in starting the Folkestone Cricket Festival in the 1920's. Previously sold as part of The A.P. - Tich Freeman took ten wickets in the Kent v M.C.C. match played at Folkestone on the 5th-7th September where Freeman broke the record. Freeman took 6-147 in the M.C.C. first innings and 4-117 in the second. M.C.C. won by four wickets. Remarkably, Freeman took 250 wickets or more in England in the seasons of 1928, 1929, 1930, 1931, 1932 and 1933. In total Freeman took 3776 first class wickets in 592 matches at an average of 18.42 in his twenty two year playing career (1914-1936). Only Wilfred Rhodes bettered this record and he played for thirty two years (1898-1930).*
- 536 Australian tour of England 1884. Antique block Meerscham Pipe in original 'pipe shaped' brown leather case lined with red velvet with clasp, hinged lid and brass hinges presented to an Australian reporter on the 1884 tour. The bronze metal medal with 'M.C.C. 1814-1914, with cricket bat and stump decoration' and below in scroll 'J. Humphries' and to verso 'Lord's Ground Centenary 1914' to outer ring and to centre 'To commemorate the 100th Year as a Cricket Ground'. 1.25" diameter. Ring suspension. - 544 David Denton. Yorkshire & England 1894-1920. Gentlemen v Players. Centenary match 1906. CRICKET SCORECARDS, PROGRAMMES, MAGAZINES etc

We are delighted to be offering what must be one of the most unrivalled collection of scorecards in the world. This is part one. In 'The Wisden Book of Cricket Memorabilia' by Marcus Williams & Gordon Phillips (Oxford 1990) they describe scorecards as being 'close behind love letters and those written by cricketing immortals as the most revealing evocation of nostalgia'.

The earliest known scoresheets were printed on paper and date from 1744. More robust examples printed on card rather than paper weren't seen until the 1820s. Early scoresheets provided details of individual batsmen's scores and the method of dismissal and by whom. By the 1770s scoresheets were providing more details such as the names of the bowlers and wicket-keepers, and the designation of the captain and wicket-keeper by an asterisk and dagger respectively, but unless the stumps had been broken, bowlers were not credited with wickets taken off their bowling until 1836, and full bowling analyses were not published until well into the 1890s.

1294 'The Return Match of Cricket between the counties of Kent & Sussex'. Exceptionally early single sided scoresheet for the 'First Day's Play' of the match played at Brighton Royal Cricket Grounds, 12th & 13th September 1836. In Hereford's second innings, James Grundy bowled nineteen four-ball overs (76 balls) taking five wickets for only three runs.

The United England Eleven was formed in 1852 as a breakaway from William Clarke's All England Eleven. Both teams comprised top professional players of the period and played matches all over the country that provided quality cricket prior to the rise of county cricket. On Clarke's death in 1856, the two teams agreed to play regular fixtures pitting some of the best players of the day against each other.

The last ever first-class match played at the Royal Brunswick Ground in Hove resulted in some notable achievements. W.G. Grace scored 217 in the Gentlemen's second innings, his highest to date, having been dismissed for a duck in the first. He shared a then record partnership of 241 for the second wicket with his brother, G.F. 'Fred' Grace who made 98. Grace's double century was the first occasion when a player scored 200 runs in a day, and was

the highest individual score made on the Royal Brunswick Ground. Thornton hit 34 off only eight balls in the Gentlemen's second innings, and for the Players, Shaw took seven first innings wickets, all bowled.

John Lillywhite (Sussex & Middlesex 1850-1869) was part of the famous Lillywhite family who founded the London sports outfitters, Lillywhites. He was a member of Parr's tour to North America in 1859, the first by an English side overseas. Some 13,000 people attended his benefit match from which Lillywhite earned around £700.

Prince's Cricket Ground in Chelsea, London was a cricket ground, created by the brothers George and James Prince as part of the Prince's Club, on which 37 first-class matches were played between 1872 and 1878. The ground was built on in 1883. The boundaries of the site are marked by Cadogan Square West, Milner Street, Lennox Gardens Mews, Walton Street and Pont Street. The first match played on the ground was Household Brigade v. Lords and Commons on 3 June 1871. Middlesex County Cricket Club used the ground between 1872 and 1876 and played their first match on 23-25 May 1872 against Yorkshire. Middlesex played only three County matches in 1872 and lost them all.

- The umpires, E. Stephenson and Bob Thoms declared the match over and Middlesex the winners when in fact the scores were level. Yorkshire agreed to take the field again for Middlesex to score the extra run required. Yorkshire's Harry Dewse made his only first-class appearance in this match.*
- 1332 'Eton v. Harrow' 1873. Early original single sided scorecard for the match played at Lord's, 11th- 12th July 1873. The scorecard with complete printed scores. Eton batted first and made 145 and 166. Replying, Harrow scored 146 in their first innings. Set 165 to win, they reached 167/5 to win by five wickets, Hadow ending 54no, and Crutchley making 49. With the Players set 307 to win, Jupp and Lockwood put on 78 for the first wicket but despite contributions from Emmett (36) and Charlwood (32no), wickets fell steadily and they were bowled out for 258, Gentlemen winning by 48 runs. Southerton took a further seven wickets giving him match figures of 16/52. The South then knocked off the required runs without loss, ending 41/0 to win by ten wickets. With the exception of just three overs, Alex Watson and William MacIntyre of Leicestershire bowled throughout the match taking eleven wickets between them.*

This match was not without incident both on and off the field, as W.G.'s second son, Edgar Henry, was born on the second morning of the match. Lines printed below the scorecard title state 'Played at the Grimsby Cricket Ground.. in which the champion "bat" scored the extraordinary number of 400 runs which included 4 sixes, 21 fours, six threes, 58 twos, and 158 singles, and never gave a chance until he had scored 350'. Grimsby used a total of fifteen different bowlers, and in 340.1 overs, and over 13 hours, none of them could prise him out! After the United South's innings ended, it was found that Grace had scored 399. Both teams agreed to add one run to the total giving him 400.

- 1343 'Yorkshire versus Gloucestershire' 1876. Official and early single sided scorecard for the match played at Bramall Lane, Sheffield, 24th- 26th July 1876 with complete printed scores. All three Grace brothers,

E.M., W.G., and G.F., played for Gloucestershire, as did their cousin, W.R. Gilbert. The Yorkshire team was comprised entirely of professionals, and Gloucestershire all amateurs. In a remarkable match attended by some 20,000 on the first two days, which Gloucestershire won by 17 runs, the Grace brothers had a hand in all twenty Yorkshire wickets with Fred Grace taking thirteen wickets, and W.G. taking six. Additionally, E.M. Grace took five catches, and W.G. two. Gloucestershire batting first scored 156 and 133 with Yorkshire making 118 and 154. W.G. The match was scheduled for three days, but completed in one, in just 4.5 hours of play. In reply against a powerful bowling attack the Australians made 150 and, following on 138, the Players winning by an innings and 34 runs. The Players eleven also featured A. Shrewsbury, G. Ulyett, W. Bates, E. Lockwood, W. Flowers, T. Emmett, E. Peate, M. Sherwin and F. Morley. The Australian team, lacking Spofforth, was A.C. Bannerman, H.H. Massie, W.L. Murdoch, P.S. McDonnell, T.P. Horan, G. Giffen, J.M. Blackham, G.J. Bonnor, H.F. Boyle, T.W. Garrett and G.E. Palmer. The scorecard printed at an irregular angle. To the verso, advertisements include for 'Cricket. - 1373 'Middlesex v. Gloucestershire' Cheltenham Cricket Week 1882. Early original double sided scorecard for the match played at the College Ground, Cheltenham, 14th- 16th August 1882. Woof 6/32) and, following on, for 96 (T. Emmett 35). Gloucestershire won by an innings and 45 runs for their first victory of the season. Other players featured include W.G. Grace, E.M. Grace, F. Early and unusual original large single sided scorecard for the match between eleven members of the Daft family against Skegness, played at Skegness, 26th August 1882. Skegness batted first and made 72, Richard Daft taking seven wickets. The introductory text above the scorecard describes the Daft XI's only innings, 'Mr. R. Daft, the celebrated player, made the extraordinary score of 103, including two fives, sixteen fours, and five threes' in a total of 144, with C.F. Daft Junior (25) being the only other member of the team to reach double figures. In the Skegness second innings, they reached 50/4, with the Daft XI declared winners on the first innings. - 1376 The Ashes. 'England v. Australia' 1882. Early and original double sided official scorecard for the second Test match to be played in England, Kennington Oval, 28th- 30th August 1882. The scorecard with complete printed scores. Australia batted first and were bowled out for only 63, top scorer was Blackham (17), R.G. Barlow taking 5/19 off 31 overs of which 22 were maidens. Replying, England were dismissed for 101, George Ulyett scoring 26 and Fred Spofforth taking 7/46. Australia then made 122 in their second innings, Hugh Massie making the top score of the match with 55. Set only 85 to win, England were going well at 51/2, until Spofforth struck, once again taking seven wickets to give him match figures of 14/90. Spofforth and Boyle took the last five wickets for only eleven runs, and England were all out for 77 (W.G. Grace 32), handing victory to Australia by the slender margin

of seven runs. Other players include A.P. Lucas, A. Lyttelton, C.T. Studd, J.M. Read, W. Barnes, A.G. Steel, A.N. Hornby, E. Peate (England), A.C. Bannerman, G.J. Bonnor, W.L. Murdoch, T.P. Horan, G. A weakened Surrey side batted first and scraped to 87 with only Bobby Abel (45) and W.W. Read (21) reaching double figures. Nottinghamshire replied with 188 (A. Shaw 33, A. Shrewsbury 31, W.E. Roller taking 5/27), and then Surrey were bowled out cheaply a second time, this time for only 43 with Read (17) the only batsman in double figures, Shaw taking 7/22. Nottinghamshire won by an innings and 58 runs. Other players featured include W.H. Scotton, F. Butler, W. Barnes, W. Gunn, W. Flowers, A.P. Smith, E. Mills, W. Wright, M. Sherwin (Nottinghamshire), J. Shuter, S.W. Cattley, J.M. Read, H.W. Bainbridge, E.W. Pooley, R. Voss, E.D. Barratt and W. Wood (Surrey). - 1378 'Sussex v. Yorkshire' 1883. Early original single sided scorecard for the match played at Bramall Lane,

Sheffield, 11th- 13th June 1883. The scorecard with complete printed scores in a match with a tense finish. Sussex batted first and made 182, W. Humphreys top scorer with 33. In reply Yorkshire were bowled out for 128, a deficit of 56, E. Peate ending 29no, A.B. Hide taking 6/45. Sussex were then dismissed for 128 in their second innings with only J.B. Hide (58) and E.J. McCormick (42) reaching double figures. Set 185 to win, Yorkshire were bowled out for 181 with Lewis Hall (42no) running out of partners. Sussex won by just three runs. Advertising to lower margin for Whittam's 'Great book on the game', R.G. Barlow's outfitters, and R.G. Barlow's 'The Young Cricketer's Guide'. Printer unknown. 4.5"x6". Previously the property of F.M. Lucas (Sussex 1880-1887) who played in the match. Adhesive marks to verso, otherwise in very good condition. £100/150

This match was James Lillywhite's last first-class match for Sussex, scoring 29 and 4. He had played for the County for 21 years, and captained England in the first two Test matches ever played, both on the 1876/77 tour to Australia.

- 1379 'Sussex v Kent 1883. Early original single sided scorecard for the match played at The County Ground, Hove, 18th- 20th June 1883. The scorecard with complete printed scores. Sussex batted first and made 273, W. Humphreys top scorer with 63. In reply Kent reached 259, E.F.S. Tylecote making the top match score of 78. In the second innings Sussex scored 259 (H. Phillips 53, G.N. Wyatt 51), setting Kent 306 to win. The loss of early wickets made the task more difficult and they were bowled out for 175 (L. Wilson 33no), Sussex winning by 130 runs. J.B. Hide of Sussex took five wickets in each innings, returning match figures of 10/109. Advertisement to lower margin for H. Crowhurst, General Printer, Brighton. 4.75"x7.25". Very good condition. £100/150

- 1380 'Gloucestershire v. Lancashire' 1883. Early original single sided scorecard for the match played at Old Trafford, 26th & 27th July 1883. The scorecard with complete printed scores in the match in which Gloucestershire batted first and

were dismissed for what was then their lowest total, reaching only 34. Only Frank Townsend (16) and W.G. Grace (11) reached double figures. A.G. Steel and Dick Barlow took five wickets apiece, Barlow conceding only ten runs in the twenty overs he bowled. In reply Lancashire made 153 (J. Payne 26no), Woof taking 6/55, Gloucestershire were then dismissed for 136 in their second innings (E.M. Grace 44), Lancashire knocking off the required runs to win by ten wickets. The match was scheduled to be played at Liverpool but heavy rain saw the match moved to Old Trafford.

- 1381 'The United Eleven v. Twenty-Two Amateurs' 1883. Rare early original single sided scorecard for a match played at Moreton-in-Marsh, 6th-8th August 1883. The scorecard appears to record the first (possibly only) innings totals, the Twenty-Two Amateurs batting first and reaching 156, The United Eleven then being dismissed for 68. The United XI features five professionals listed as Robinson, Baines, Hind, Pinder and Beaumont (possibly John Beaumont, Yorkshire & Surrey 1877-1890) who took ten wickets for the United Eleven whose team also features the Gloucestershire player, A.E. Leatham. Two other Gloucestershire players appear to have played for the Twenty-Two Amateurs, G. Francis and H.V. Page. H.P. Smith of the Twenty-Two took eight wickets. Intriguingly, no record of this match can be found, so it cannot be ascertained whether this scorecard is complete, or if the match extended to a second innings. No bowling analyses are given. - 1382 'Nottinghamshire v. Lancashire' 1883. Early original single sided scorecard for the match played at Old Trafford, 9th- 11th August 1883. The scorecard with complete printed scores for the match in which Nottinghamshire reached 110, top scorer was W. Flowers (18), A. Watson taking 7/41. In reply Lancashire scored 218 in their only innings, brothers D.Q. Steel making 75, and A.G. Steel 60. Nottinghamshire then reached 90/2 and the match was drawn with no play possible on the second day. Printer unknown. 4.75"x7". Heavy horizontal fold and creasing, wear and soiling to edges, otherwise in generally fair condition. £60/90

No play was possible on the second day. Nottinghamshire were declared 'Champion County' in 1883, the first of four successive titles won by the county.

- 1383 'Nottinghamshire v. Lancashire' 1883. Early original single sided scorecard for the match played at Clifton College, Bristol, 27th- 29th August 1883. The scorecard with complete printed scores for the match in which Gloucestershire batted first and scored 324 with W.G. Grace making 112 and J. Cranston 127. In reply, Lancashire made 190 (R. Pilling 46no) and following on, 213 (W.H. Robinson 90). Gloucestershire then reached their target of 80, ending 81/4 to win by six wickets. Advertising to top and bottom borders and to verso for local attractions and businesses. Printed by J.W. Arrowsmith of Bristol. 5"x7.25". Horizontal fold, rounding to corners, with some soiling, Overall in fair/ good condition. £70/100

W.G. Grace's first innings score of 112 was his first century in first-class matches for over two years. It was the first time two batsmen had scored centuries in an innings against Lancashire. In a poor year for Gloucestershire, they had only won two matches prior to this, their last of the 1883 season.

- 1384 'Oxford v. Cambridge' 1884-1890. Three original single sided scorecards for Varsity matches played at Lord's 30th June & 1st July 1884, 28th June- 1st July 1885, and 30th June- 2nd July 1890. The 1884

and 1885 scorecards with complete printed and handwritten scores, the 1890 with complete printed scores. Oxford University won the 1884 match, the 50th encounter between the two sides, by seven wickets, H.O. Whitby taking ten wickets in the match. In the 1885 match Cambridge University won by seven wickets, C. Toppin taking 7/51 in Oxford's first innings, and H.W. Bainbridge scoring 101 for Cambridge's first innings. The 1890 match was a low scoring affair, rain having washed out the first day's play. In the first innings Oxford were dismissed for only 42, Cambridge replying with 97, Oxford then reached 102, Cambridge winning by seven wickets. Notable players who went on to play at Test level include, for Cambridge University, C.W. Wright (England 3 matches), C.A. Smith (1), M.B. [Lord] Hawke (5), F.G.J. Ford (5), F.S. Jackson (20), G. MacGregor (8), S.M.J. Woods (3 matches for England, 3 for Australia), A.J.L. Hill (3), and for Oxford University T.C. O'Brien (5 matches) and L.C.H. Palaret (2). Each card measures 4.5"x6". - 1385 'Surrey v. Oxford University' 1884. Early original double sided scorecard for the match played at Kennington Oval, 23rd- 25th June 1884. The scorecard with complete printed scores. Both teams had unusual first innings. Oxford University batted first and had reached 205/4, before losing their last six wickets for only one run to be dismissed for 206. H.V. Page top scored with 61. Surrey then suffered a similar fate, reaching 162/4 then losing the next five wickets for one run, with the last pairing holding on to reach a total of 202, M.P. Bowden ending 55no. In their second innings, Oxford made 261 (Hine-Haycock 68, Key 55), and then bowled out Surrey for 165 (Shuter 76) to win by 90 runs. Oxford University's T.C. O'Brien went on to play in five Test matches for England, and K.J. Key captained Surrey 1894-1899. Advertising to verso includes the sports outlets of John Piggott and F.H. Ayres. The match was scheduled for three days but completed in two.

- 1386 'Gentlemen v. Players' 1884-1886. Three original double sided scorecards for matches played at Lord's 7th-9th July 1884, 6th & 7th July 1885, and 12th- 14th July 1886. The 1884 with incomplete printed and handwritten scores, the 1885 and 1886 scorecards with complete printed scores. Gentlemen won the 1884 match by six wickets with W.G. Grace (89) and A.G. Steel (63) completing a match winning stand of 137 in the second innings. For the Players G. Ulyett (94 & 64) and W. Bates (45 & 72) scored over half their runs. In the 1885 match, needing only 77 runs to win, the Players struggled to 80/6 to win by four wickets, W. Barnes taking 11/106 in the match for the Players. The target for the Players in the 1886 match was only sixty, but only W. Barnes (30no) reached double figures in the run chase, winning by five wickets. All three cards with printed fixtures for matches at Lord's to verso. Each measures 4.5"x6". Shaw's remarkable match bowling figures of 14/65 included taking a hat-trick in both innings, the first time this feat had been achieved. Nottinghamshire fixtures and local advertising including the

The Non-Smokers easily chased down the required runs ending 15/1 to win by nine wickets. Sussex then ended 133/3 to win by seven wickets thanks to a fine innings on a difficult pitch of 76no by F.M. Lucas. Advertising to front and verso for local businesses. Printed by H. Smith of Cambridge. 4"x6.5". Originally from the collection of F.M. Lucas who played for Sussex in this match. Very good condition. £70/100

John William Juniper (Sussex 1880-1885, 57 matches) was a left-arm fast bowler who had sight in only one eye. Tragically, this was his last first-class match. Having taken career best bowling figures in the first innings, he caught a chill,

left the field, and died ten days later of typhoid fever aged only 23.

- 1391 'Middlesex v. Notts.' 1885. Early original double sided scorecard for the match played at Lord's, 16th-18th July 1885. The scorecard with complete printed scores. In reply Nottinghamshire scored an impressive 415, including an unbeaten 224no by Arthur Shrewsbury who carried his bat for some eight hours for what was then the highest individual score made in a first-class match 'proper' at Lord's, supported by W. Attewell (89) and A. Shaw (52). Middlesex's G. Burton toiled for 112 four-ball overs, returning figures of 7/96. Middlesex were then bowled out in their second innings for 133 (Webbe 46), with W. Wright taking 8/74 and ten wickets in the match. Nottinghamshire won by an innings and 154 runs. Fixtures for matches at Lord's printed to verso. - 1392 'Hampshire v Kent' 1885. Early original single sided scorecard for the match played at the County Ground, Southampton, 20th- 22nd July 1885. The scorecard with complete printed scores. Kent batted first and scored 133 (R.S. Jones 26) and 297 (F. Marchant 62, A.J. Thornton 59), and

- Hampshire 193 (H. Calder 44) and 105 (H. Armstrong 41). Kent's James Wootton took 8/39 in Hampshire's second innings, ten wickets in the match. Kent won by 132 runs. Originally from the collection of K. McAlpine who played for Kent in this match. Printer unknown. 4.5"x6". Light vertical creasing, otherwise in very good condition. £80/120
- This was only the third first-class match to be played at the County Ground in Southampton, which continued to host matches until 2000. Hampshire C.C.C. had been founded in 1863 with first-class status but following poor performances that status was removed after the 1885 season, and it was to be nine years before Hampshire were invited to play in the County Championship in 1895.*
- 1393 'Gentlemen v. Players of Kent' 1885. Rare early original double sided scorecard for the match played at the Angel Ground, Tonbridge, 20th-22nd August 1885. The scorecard with complete printed scores. The Players batted first and scored 315 (J. Pentecost 65, H. Hearne 53, E. Hickmott 41), the Gentlemen replying with 147 and, following on, 165 (Stanley Christopherson 62 & 35). Players won by an innings and three runs. Printed on the ground by R. Ware of Tonbridge. 4.75"x7.25". Local advertising to verso, including the sports outlet of W. Gale. Originally from the collection of Kenneth McAlpine (Kent 1885-1886, 4 matches). Adhesive marks to verso where previously laid down, otherwise in very good condition. £80/120
- This match does not appear to be recorded on the cricketarchive.com database, but was apparently arranged to replace the fixture against Lancashire which had been cancelled over a dispute over the bowling actions of Lancashire's Crossland and Nash. Middlesex and Nottinghamshire had taken similar action earlier in the season. The Players team featured three Hearne brothers, George, Frank and Alexander. Herbert Hearne also played but was not related. The Gentlemen team included two Christopherson brothers, Stanley and Sidney. Stanley played one Test match for England in 1884.*
- 1394 Kent v Nottinghamshire 1886. Early original double sided scorecard for the match played at Mote Park, Maidstone, 24th- 26th June 1886. The scorecard with complete printed scores. The scorecard with complete printed scores for the match in which Surrey batted first and scored 349, J.M. Read top scoring with 131, F. Wright taking 6/32 for Leicestershire. In reply Leicestershire were bowled out for 116, Tom Richardson returning figures of 8/54 and, following on were dismissed for 173, J.W. Sharpe taking 5/32. - 1420 'Lord Sheffield's XI v. Australians' 1896. Rare and early single sided scorecard for the opening match of the Australian's 1886 tour to England, played at Sheffield Park, 11th- 13th May 1896. The scorecard with incomplete printed scores shows the state of play on the second day of the match, the Australians having batted first and being dismissed for 257, Joe Darling top scoring with 67. Lord Sheffield's XI had reached 67 for the loss of three wickets and they went on to make 195 (Ranjit-sinhji 79, W.G. Grace 49, Ernie Jones taking 7/84). The Australians were then bowled out for 195 in their second innings (G.H.S. Trott 59no), and the match ended in a draw with Lord Sheffield's XI on 180/4 (F.S. Jackson 95no). Jackson later wrote,*

1421 'Gloucestershire v. Warwickshire' 1896. Matches are 13th- 15th July 1896, Players won by an innings and 26 runs, 10th- 12th July 1893, match drawn, and 9th & 10th July 1894, Gentlemen won by an innings and 39 runs. Kelly ending 50no and Frank Iredale scoring 47. Surrey were then skittled out for 64, Ernie Hayes' scoring 43, the only batsman to reach double figures. Victor Trumble and Howell shared the wickets taking five apiece, Howell ending the match with figures of 15/57. Annotation in ink to verso, 'Howell's first match for an Australian team in England. In their second innings, Gloucestershire reached 113 with Grace top scoring again with 33, Middlesex's Roche taking 6/26. Foley who played for Middlesex in the match, the initials 'C.P.F.' annotated in ink to verso. Very good condition. £60/90

This was W.G. Grace's final first-class match for Gloucestershire and his last in the County Championship. At the age of fifty, he resigned two days after the completion of this match.

1436 Abel's record score at The Oval. 'Surrey v. Somersetshire' 1899. Rare and early original single sided scorecard for the match played at the Kennington Oval, 29th- 31st May 1899. In a remarkable match, Surrey batted first and made a colossal 811, then the highest score made at The Oval, with Bobby Abel carrying his bat for 357no, at the time the second best individual score. Daniell 50) and, following on, were dismissed for 198 (Sammy Woods 53, Brockwell 5/76), Surrey winning by the substantial margin of an innings and 379 runs. To the verso is a handwritten description in ink of Abel's innings, 'the largest score made by a professional in first-class cricket', and lists his scoring shots which comprised

Abel's 357no, his best first-class score, remains a Surrey record, and was the highest score made at The Oval until Len Hutton scored 364 in 1938. Surrey won the 'County Championship' in 1899.

1437 W.G. Grace's last Test match. 'England vs. Australia. First Test Match' 1899. Early original double sided scorecard for the first Test match to be played at Trent Bridge, 1st- 3rd June 1899. - 1439 Australian tour to England 1899. 'The [Cambridge] University v. Australians'. The scorecard with incomplete printed scores showing England's first innings standing at 47/3. They went on to make 372 with Tom Hayward scoring 130 and Dick Lilley 58. In reply Australia found themselves in trouble at 57/7 but rallied with Monty Noble (60no), supported by Trumble (44) and Iredale (31) to close their first innings at 196, Bradley taking 5/67 for England. Brooks joined First Division club Tottenham Hotspur in February 1953.
By the 1954-55 season, Brooks had broken through into the first team and made 31 appearances, scoring seven goals. After the departure of manager Arthur Rowe in 1955, the best years of Brooks' Spurs career came under new manager Jimmy Anderson and he scored in double figures to help Tottenham to second and third-place finishes in the 1956-57 and 1957-58 seasons respectively. His performances also won him England recognition. Brooks scored 51 goals in 179 appearances during his six and a half years with Tottenham.
