CRICKET EPHEMERA

- 1 'Cricket. Slow v. Fast'. Early and rare original advertising handbill for 'A Grand Match' at Lord's, 5th July 1841 'and following day'. The handbill describes the teams as comprising 'Eight Gentlemen and Players, with Three Slow Bowlers, against Eight Gentlemen and Players, with Three Fast Bowlers'. The 'Slow' team included Bayley, Cobbett, Lillywhite, Liddell, Hastings, Anson, Bentinck, Kynaston, Taylor, Guy and Wenman. The 'Fast' team was Mynn, Fenner, Redgate, Savile, Keate, Napier, Nethercote, Thackeray, Ward, Box and Pilch. Advertising to lower portion for 'Matches to Come', J.H. Dark's cricket equipment, score papers etc. Printed by Morgan, 39 New Church Street, Portman Market. 5.5"x8.75". Minor wear and nicks to edges, some foxing, light creasing, otherwise in good condition. £200/300

The Fast Bowlers (79 & 102) beat the Slow Bowlers (85 & 58) by 38 runs.

- 2 'Cricket. The Marylebone Club & Ground, with Pilch, against the Northern Counties of England'. Early and rare original advertising handbill for 'A Grand Match' at Lord's, 23rd June [1845] 'and following day'. Listed are the two teams, including Bathurst, Bennett, Kynaston, Taylor, Barker, Dean, Dorrinton, Hillyer,

Lillywhite, Pilch and Sewell for M.C.C., Hartopp, Noyes, Seddons, Williams, Butler, Clark, Dakin, Guy, Hunt, Parr and Redgate for Northern Counties. Advertising to lower portion for 'Matches to Come', '[J.H.] Dark's Newly Invented Leg Guards' and other cricket supplies etc. Printed by Morgan, 39 New Church Street. 5.5"x8.5". Heavy loss and creasing, with pencil marks to centre, overall in fair condition.

M.C.C. (41 & 99) lost to The North (141) by an innings and one run. William Clarke took ten wickets in the match for The North.

- 3 'Cricket! Surrey Cricket Ground, Kennington Oval' 1853. Early original advertising handbill for 'Grand Matches' to be played at The Oval. Matches are 'The Surrey Club with Two Players against the [Sevenoaks] Vine Club with Two Players', 30th June, 'The North against The South', 7th July, 'Twenty-two I Zingari against the Eleven of England for the Benefit of Beagley', 14th July, and 'Fourteen of the County of Surrey against the Eleven of England', 1st August. 5"x7.25". Printer unknown. Small hole to centre, staining and some creasing, otherwise in good condition. £150/250

- 4 'Cricket! Yorkshire versus Surrey. The First Great Match of the Season' 1873. Early original advertising handbill for

the match played at Brammall[sic] Lane, Sheffield, 16th- 18th June 1873. Yorkshire players listed are Clayton, Greenwood, Emmett, Hall, Hill, Iddison, Lockwood, Pinder, Smith, Rowbotham and West, and for Surrey, Boulton, Berris, Strachan, Chester, T. Humphrey, R. Humphrey, Jupp, Pooley, Southerton, Street and Freeman. Details of admission to the ground below. Printed by J. Robertshaw, Angel-St., Sheffield'. 7.25"x9.75". The handbill laid to card, overall 7.5"x10.25". Some wear and tear, overall in good condition. £150/250

In a low scoring match, scheduled for three days but completed in two, Surrey batted first scoring 79, Tom Emmett (6/38) and Allen Hill (4/32) sharing the wickets. In reply Yorkshire could muster only 54 (James Southerton 6/24 and James Street 4/30). Surrey's second innings saw them creep up to 84, Emmett and Hill again doing the damage and Emmett ending with match figures of 12 wickets for 84 runs. Yorkshire then reached their target with some ease, ending on 113 for the loss of only two batsmen to win by eight wickets.

Edward 'Ted' Pooley was suspended by Surrey for allegedly taking a bet during this match. His career was clouded by his drinking and gambling exploits leading to his arrest on the 1876/77 tour to New

Zealand and Australia, so missing the inaugural Test match against Australia. He died in poverty in 1907.

- 5 David Denton. Yorkshire & England 1894-1920. 'David Denton's Benefit. Yorkshire v Lancashire, Headingley Ground, Leeds. August 5th, 6th and 7th [1907]. Original hanging cardboard poster, printed navy blue and white background advertising the Benefit match 'All Lovers of Cricket are cordially invited to co-operate in order to make the Benefit a great success'. It advertises seat prices, collecting books, hanging cards and cheap tickets with names and address of County Committee members to the lower third of the poster. Some loss to top right hand corner and wear, damage and slight loss to the lower border otherwise in good condition for its age. Blue and white threaded hanging cord to the top of the poster. 14.5"x22". Sold with a further smaller hanging poster for the game with similar title to top with a central image of Denton wearing Yorkshire cap and blazer. This has a subscription list below for supporters of Denton to fill in. Very minor loss to lower left hand corner otherwise in very good condition. 12.5"x20". Qty 2 £100/150

In a low scoring match, Yorkshire won the match by nine wickets, Rhodes was the star of the show taking 11 wickets in the match. Denton made 3 in the first innings but was 25 not out when Yorkshire scored the winning runs, the contest yielded nearly £2,000 for Denton's Benefit.

- 6 Australian tour of England 1938. Large original 'News Chronicle' advertising and promotional poster and image of the Australian team to centre and the wording 'Australian Team above and below 'Exclusive art plate'. Banner to top and bottom reads 'News Chronicle'. The poster printed in red and black on a pink background and measures 19"x30". The lot includes the Test Team art plate printed picture of the team with title 'The Australian Test Team 1938' to top and players names to lower border. Sold with the original envelope in which the art plate was sent. Printed details to envelope read 'Australian Test Team Art Plate'.

One copy to be given free to each purchaser of the News Chronicle on application'. All three items in good condition, the poster neatly folded as issued. Rarely seen £70/100

- 7 Hornibrook 6 for 5 Essex Rout'. Large original newspaper poster for the 'Home' edition of the [London] Evening News, dated 8th May 1930. The poster measures approx. 20"x30", framed and glazed overall 24"x34". Horizontal and vertical folds, with small loss to right edge and top corner, otherwise in good/ very good condition. £100/150

The poster refers to the Australians' tour match against Essex played at Leyton, 7th- 9th May 1930. Percy Hornibrook ended the first innings with figures of six wickets for eleven runs off nine overs with Essex being dismissed for 67. He took a further four wickets in the second innings, returning match figures of 10/40, the Australians winning by 207 runs.

- 8 'W.G.'s Son Drops Dead at Cricket'. Large original newspaper poster for the Daily Herald, dated 7th June 1938. The poster measures approx. 20"x30", framed and glazed overall 22.5"x33". Horizontal and vertical folds, with apparent old tape repairs to verso, otherwise in good, very good condition. £120/160

Charles Butler Grace, who played four first-class matches 1900-1906 for London County and W.G. Grace's XI, died in Sussex in 1938 He collapsed and died whilst batting during a match at Bexhill on Whit-Monday on 6th June 1938.

- 9 'The Sportsman Almanac 1902. 'The Sportsman' is the Oldest, Largest and Leading Sporting Daily Paper'. Large original rare poster for 1902 season. Printed by Merritt & Hatcher, London. The colourful poster features to the top half of the poster a large printed panel with cameo images of various sizes of members of 'Australian Tour 1901-02. Mr A.C. Maclaren's English Eleven. Players featured include Maclaren, Ranjitsinghi, McGregor, Jephson, Lord Hawke, Barnes, J. Gunn, Quaife, Blythe, Hayward, Jones, Jessop, Braund etc with calender months printed to either side. To the lower half of the poster are 'The Sportsman's list of

principal [horse] races in 1902' with two cameo, one of the late George Lohmann (he died in December 1901) and leading jockey D. Maher. The poster printed in red, blue and black on a white background. The poster is framed and glazed and measures overall 19.5"x24.5". Very light folds to poster and slight loss to the top right hand corner otherwise in very good condition for its age. An excellent piece of early ephemera with Ashes interest £100/150

- 10 'Grand Cricket Match at Sheffield, E. Stephenson's Benefit' 1870. Early original Great Northern Railway handbill advertising train travel to Sheffield for the match, assumed to be United North of England XI v United South of England XI, played at Bramall Lane 1st & 2nd August 1870, for the benefit of Edwin Stephenson (Sheffield, M.C.C., Yorkshire & England 1854-1873). The handbill printed on pink paper, measures 5.5"x9", and was issued at King's Cross Station, London, July 1870. Binding holes to left edge, light fading and staining to top edge, otherwise in good/ very good condition. £100/150

Edwin 'Ned' Stephenson (sometimes erroneously known as 'Edward') was a wicket-keeper who played for Sheffield and Yorkshire. He was also a member of the first tour by an English team to Australia in 1861/62, led by H.H. Stephenson (no relation).

United North of England beat the United South by an innings and 5 runs. Edwin Stephenson did not play in the match that was scheduled for three days but completed in two.

- 11 Robert 'Bobby' Abel. Surrey & England 1881-1904. Original typed letter on 'Tit-Bits' magazine letterhead, hand dated 8th September 1890. The letter addressed to 'Mr R. Abel' reads, 'On making up the batting average for the month of August, we find that you have the honour of being the best Batsman in the country, with an average for 10 innings of 49.1. We have therefore great pleasure, in accordance with the conditions laid down in the Tit'Bits cricketing competition, in sending you a cheque for £25, receipt for which

- we shall be glad to have by return of post. We also take this opportunity of congratulating you upon your success, and trust you may long continue to handle the Willow in a manner so creditable to English Sports'. The letter mounted in ornate card mount, overall 12"x15". Some uneven age toning, the mount with some wear and loss of surface otherwise in good condition £40/60
- 'Tit-Bits' was a weekly magazine founded by George Newnes in 1881. Its style of popular journalism is considered to be a forerunner to the Daily Mail and Daily Express newspapers*
- 12 Fred Trueman. 'Vitalis- Keeps even my hair neat all day'. Original 1960's free standing card advertising sign/show card showing Trueman, half length, in England sweater holding and pointing at the bottle of Vitalis. Approx 19"x28". Some wear, scratching, some loss to small parts of image otherwise in generally good condition £30/50
- 13 'Groves Cricket & General Sporting News Agency, Sheffield'. Two four page 'Final Revised List of Cricket Fixtures for 1887', one printed on white paper, the other blue. The front pages detail the terms and prices of the services provided to customers of the agency, with slightly differing versions. Sold with two similar lists published by Ashley & Smith's Sporting News Agency, London, for 'The Cricket Season' 1887 and 1892. Some wear and tears to folds, otherwise in good condition. - 14 'The Times. M.C.C. Number. London May 25th 1937'. Original 25 page supplement to the Times newspaper with front cover depicting Thomas Lord with various cricket scenes in borders around image commemorating the 150th anniversary of Lord's. The contents with articles on the Lord's Ground, tributes, Hambledon, M.C.C. etc. Good condition £20/30
- 15 'Frank Worrell of Barbados 1924-1967'. Order of Thanksgiving for Worrell held at Westminster Abbey on 7th April 1967 with official ticket for admission to the Choir for the service. Also an Order of Service for the memorial service held for
- Worrell, 'Sometime professional Radcliffe Cricket Club', at Radcliffe Parish Church, 9th April 1967. Very good condition. Sold with a mono studio photograph of Worrell, head and shoulders, wearing graduation robes. 6.25"x8.25", photographer unknown. Light creasing, otherwise in good condition. Qty 4. £70/100
- Worrell was the first cricketer to be honoured with a memorial service in Westminster Abbey. He graduated from Manchester University with a B.A. degree in 1959.*
- 16 Roy Kilner. Yorkshire, Europeans & England 1911-1927. Official single sided order of service sheet for the memorial service held for Kilner at Wombwell Church, 10th April 1928. 8"x10.5". Horizontal and vertical folds, otherwise in good condition. £50/80
- Kilner died in 1928 aged only 37 after contracting enteric fever while coaching in India.*
- 17 'In Memoriam. Charles Burgess Fry 1872-1956'. Eight page original memorial service booklet for Fry, the funeral was held at St. Martin-in-the-Fields Church on the 18th September 1956. The address was made by Harry Altham. Rare £50/80
- 18 W.G. Grace. 'Souvenir of the National Testimonial to Dr. W.G. Grace, July 22nd 1879, with Photograph and Record of Performances. Sixpence.' Printed by the Cricket and Football Times, Ludgate Circus, London. [1879], Attractive printed card with title within chromolithographed border of flowers, holly etc. To inside pages is a mounted portrait photograph of Grace, with a record of his averages in first class matches, averages in county matches and scores over 100 in first class matches from 1864 to 1878 printed opposite. Previously sold by Knights in 2016. The card measures 3.5"x4.75" and has some minor foxing, minor wear to covers, slight splitting to fold. A rare and early example of Grace memorabilia. £200/300
- Grace was the recipient of two national testimonials. The first was presented to him by Lord Fitzhardinge at Lord's on 22 July 1879 in the form of a marble clock,*
- two bronze ornaments and a cheque for £1,458. The second, collected by MCC, the county of Gloucestershire, the Daily Telegraph and The Sportsman, amounted to £9,703 and was presented to him in 1896 in appreciation of his 'Indian Summer' season of 1895 when he scored his 100th first class hundred.*
- 19 W.G. Grace. 'Banquet held on Monday, June 24th 1895 at the Victoria Rooms, Clifton to Mr W.G. Grace in celebration of his One Hundredth Century, completed on Gloucestershire County Ground in match Somersetshire v Gloucestershire, on Friday May 17th 1895'. Original three page folding card menu for the Banquet, the cover with excellent pictorial colour decoration showing crossed bats, ball and stumps, titles to centre and to lower border an image of a cricket match in progress with Grace batting with '100' on the scoreboard. To inside pages menu, toast list, wine list, poem by E.B.V. Christian to Grace, portrait of Grace and list of hundreds. Speeches included The Duke of Beaufort, E.M. Grace, E.G. Clarke etc. Previously sold by Knights in 2016. The menu has split at folds which have unfortunately been taped, some staining and soiling to menu otherwise in good condition. A rare item of Grace memorabilia. £150/250
- Grace completed his one hundredth century by making his highest first class score of 288 v Somerset in the game.*
- 20 Farewell Dinner to Dr W.G. Grace 1898'. Original menu card for the Dinner, given by the Clifton Foot Beagles, held at the Clifton Down Hotel on December 6th 1898. Decorative and colourful front cover, with green ribbon tie, with images of hunting horn, whistle, riding cap and whip and titles, menu and toast list to inside pages with further decorative hunting images to rear cover. Printed by 'W. Bennett, 43 Broad Street'. The toast list includes, His Grace the Duke of Beaufort, W.G. Grace etc. Originally from the collection of C.L. Townsend (Gloucestershire & England 1893-1922), this being Townsend's copy. Previously sold by Knights in March 2012 and again in 2019. Some minor foxing and age

- toning otherwise in good/very good condition. Rare. £150/250
- W.G. Grace, who was Vice Chairman of the Clifton Foot Beagles until early 1899, regularly ran with the beagles up until leaving Gloucestershire and moving the Grace family to London, following the death of his only daughter Bessie, in 1899.*
- 21 Yorkshire. 'Dinner in honour of Hirst and Rhodes and on the occasion of the publication of A.A. Thomson's fiftieth book'. Official menu for the dinner given by 'The Cricketer' held at Lord's Tavern, 25th June 1959. The menu with Yorkshire white rose emblem and printed title to front, menu and speakers to inside. Minor soiling to front, adhesive marks to verso, otherwise in good condition. £30/50
- 22 Lancashire C.C.C. 1873-1968. Five items relating to Lancashire including a Manchester C.C. 1873 folding member's ticket with printed fixtures to centre, officers listed to rear. 'Lancashire County, 1883, and Manchester Cricket Club', three part folding membership card with black leather covers and gilt title, issued to and signed in ink to inside by Richard H. Gorton [Committee Member] of Eccles. Four page printed information sheet headed 'Lancashire County and Manchester Cricket Club' issued to announce the start of the 1926 season. Folds with some splitting. Official fixture booklets for seasons 1951 and 1968. Odd faults as described, otherwise in good/ very good condition. £100/150
- 23 Albert Craig 'The Surrey Poet'. Five items relating to Albert Craig, the cricket rhymester. Five page typescript for a B.B.C. Radio broadcast of 'Cricket Lovely Cricket. A.C. 'Kent in their proper place', 62 line printed verse sheet with introduction by Craig, relating to Kent's successes of 1906. Loss to left edge partially affecting the text. - 24 M.C.C. tour to South Africa 1922/23. Official menu for the dinner given to the M.C.C. team at The Grand Hotel, Port Elizabeth, 20th November 1922. The folding menu with printed title to front with M.C.C. colours to borders, toast list and menu to inside, attendees listed to rear page. Detached at fold. Age toning and some wear, two small holes to left edge of front cover, otherwise in good condition. £40/60
- M.C.C. were playing Eastern Province at Port Elizabeth 18th- 21st November 1922. M.C.C. won by an innings and 9 runs.*
- 25 M.C.C. tour to South Africa 1922/23. Official menu for the 'Farewell Banquet to the M.C.C. Team by the Natal Cricket Association' held at the Durban Club, Durban, 20th February 1923. The menu with paper wrappers, red and yellow ribbon tie. Printed title and Natal emblem to front, toasts and menu to centre pages. Wear and staining, overall in fair condition. £60/90
- The date of this dinner corresponds with the deciding 5th Test played at Durban, 16th- 22nd February 1923 ('Timeless' Test), which England won by 109 runs to take the series 2-1 with two matches drawn.*
- 26 Australia tour to England 1926. 'Australian Party embracing the Australian Cricket XI 1926. Tour of Europe'. Official Itinerary booklet 'Organised by Pickfords' for the Australian's Tour of Europe en route from Australia. The itinerary describes the party's arrival from Perth on the S.S. 'Otranto' at Naples on 7th April with a visit to Pompeii. April 8th in Rome to visit the Unknown Warrior's Grave, St. Peters and the Vatican. April 9th train journey to Florence, April 10th Milan, April 11th to Montreux in Switzerland, April 12th Interlaken, April 13th/14th Lucerne, April 15th- 17th Paris for Versailles and Malmaison, April 18th boat train via Dover to London. An unusual and interesting insight into the touring party's travel arrangements, presumably issued to players and officials. Vertical fold and some wear to wrappers, otherwise in good condition. £80/120
- 27 M.C.C. tour of Australia 1928/29. Official 'Orient Line, R.M.S. Otranto' souvenir brochure for the 'M.C.C. Australian Tour 1928-9'. Decorative covers with M.C.C. colours. To inside pages, pen pictures and biographies of the M.C.C. team, itinerary, fixtures etc. Scarce. Minor soiling to wrappers, otherwise in very good condition. £50/80
- 28 'M.C.C. Australian Tour 1928-29'. Rare official 8pp tour itinerary with decorative card wrappers for the M.C.C. tour of Australia 1928-29. The front cover with bold decoration in M.C.C. colours. - 29 M.C.C. tour of South Africa 1938/39. 'Timeless Test Series'. 'South African Tour 1938-1939'. Official players itinerary for the tour with titles and M.C.C. colours to front cover. - 30 M.C.C. tour to South Africa 1948/49. Official folding menu for the 'Civic Dinner in honour of the M.C.C. Touring Team' held at the Commercial Hotel, Robertson, 3rd November 1948. The menu with decorative front cover and printed title, toasts and menu to inside. 'Ex R.T. Simpson' annotated in pencil to back cover. Very good condition. £40/60

- M.C.C. played a tour match against Western Province at the Callie de Wet Sportsground, Robertson, 3rd & 4th November 1948. M.C.C. won by an innings and 100 runs. Reg Simpson played, scoring 47 in M.C.C.'s only innings.
- 31 M.C.C. tour of South Africa 1948/49. Rare official menu for the dinner given for the M.C.C. held at the Polleys- Hotel, Pretoria, 8th December 1948. The folding menu printed in both English and Afrikaans with titles to front, toast list and menu to inside. 'Ex R.T. Simpson' annotated in pencil to back cover. Very good condition. £40/60
- The tour match against the Combined Transvaal XI was played at Berea Park, Pretoria, 7th & 8th December 1948. Reg Simpson scored 145 in an opening partnership of 257 with Cyril Washbrook (144). The match was drawn.*
- 32 Yorkshire County Cricket Club archive circa 1860's to 1960. A large and comprehensive coverage of Yorkshire County cricket covering the century comprising a large quantity of eighteen large ledgers and scrapbooks containing news cuttings and images recording matches and regarding the club in the period. Black album comprising nicely presented photographs, articles, copy scorecard, cards, letters and telegrams of congratulations all relating to Gimblett scoring a century on his debut in first-class cricket for Somerset v Essex at Frome, 18th-21st May 1935. Gimblett scored 123 in Somerset's only innings of 337, beating Essex by an innings and 49 runs. Contents include a copy head and shoulders photograph nicely signed in black ink by Gimblett, copy scorecard with handwritten scores for the match, also two original handwritten letters from former Somerset players, a two page letter dated 31st May 1935 from John Daniell (Somerset & Cambridge University 1898-1927) Secretary of Somerset C.C.C. enclosing a cheque for 30/- and hoping Gimblett will be fit to play 'in the May Bank Holiday match at Taunton', and a single page letter dated 20th May 1935 from J.B. - 39 William Lloyd 'Billy' Murdoch. New South Wales, Sussex, London County, Australia & England 1875-1904. Original and interesting two page 'begging letter' handwritten in black ink from Murdoch to 'Dear Old Dick', dated 11th January 1904. Murdoch appears to be in some financial difficulty, asking for 'a very good favour. I want you old man if you possibly can to lend me £35'. Murdoch expects to be able to repay the loan 'next month, but failing that, you would be sure to have it in June, when our money comes home from Australia. I have run a bit short and there are a couple of things I particularly want to settle up'. He continues in a lighter vein, asking after his friends health, and refers to not having seen 'old W.G. [Grace] for some time. I have been round to the ground several times, but he is always away beagling or golfing'. He closes with a reference to the Australians, 'I am afraid they will be very weak in the bowling' (M.C.C. were touring in Australia at the time of his writing). He signs off 'Bye Bye, Ever yours', nicely signed by Murdoch. Interestingly, Knights sold Murdoch's follow-up letter dated 15th January 1904 (as lot 75 in the auction of November 2017), in which he expressed his regrets at his request for the loan being turned down saying 'I would be very sorry to think old man that my asking and you refusing would in any way interfere with our friendship...'. Some splitting to fold, otherwise in good/ very good condition. £180/250
- Billy Murdoch is listed as player/cap number thirteen in the list of Australian Test players and he played his first Test match for Australia, in the second Test ever played, against England at Melbourne in March/April 1877. He captained Australia in sixteen Tests from 1880 to 1890, this included four tours to England one of which, in 1882, gave rise to The Ashes. A right hand batsman and occasional wicket keeper, he played in eighteen Test matches overall for Australia. Murdoch scored both the first double century in Test cricket (211 against England in 1884) and the first triple century in Australian domestic cricket (321 against Victoria in 1882). In later years, he settled in England, playing county cricket for Sussex (1893 to 1899, as captain) and W.G. Grace's London County team (1900 to 1904). In 1892 he toured South Africa with England and played in one Test match, making him one of the few cricketers to represent more than one international team. Murdoch's final first-class match came at the age of 49, in August 1904. He died in Melbourne in 1911, aged only 56.*
- Warwickshire C.C.C. The following fourteen lots comprise a collection of correspondence, the majority written to or by Leslie Deakins who**

- served as Secretary from 1945 to 1976.
- 40 John Alfred 'Jack' Flavell. Worcestershire & England 1949-1967. Original two page handwritten letter, undated but late 1940s, from Flavell to Warwickshire C.C.C. Writing from army barracks in Oswestry, Flavell states that he has had an offer from Worcestershire to join their ground staff, 'there[sic] terms are very good and... there is a good chance of getting straight into [their] County eleven... At the moment my chances of getting into your first eleven [as a fast bowler] are very remote'. He closes by stating he has not finally made a decision and will let them know in due course. Nicely signed 'J. Flavell'. Staple holes to one corner, otherwise in good condition. £30/50
- Flavell joined Worcestershire in 1949 and went on to make four Test appearances for England 1961-1964.*
- 41 William George 'Willie' Quaife. Warwickshire & England 1894-1928. Two original single page typed letters from Quaife to Leslie Deakins, Secretary of Warwickshire C.C.C., both on 'Quaife and Lilley' official business letterhead. In the first, dated 17th February 1949, Quaife is replying to a letter regarding rights to the sale of 'Cricket material' on the ground at Edgbaston. He is uncertain what the value of the arrangement would be, but offers the club £50 for the rights for a year, 'to include the hire of the showcase now in the Pavilion'. In the follow-up letter dated 18th March 1949 Quaife agrees to the terms and conditions, and that 'B.W. Quaife [his son] will come down shortly to make final arrangements. Both letters nicely signed in ink 'W.G. Quaife'. Small file holes to top left corners, otherwise in very good condition. £50/70
- The Birmingham 'athletic outfitters' business was original set up by the Quaife brothers, William and Walter, in the early 1900s. It became 'Quaife and Lilley' when another Warwickshire player, Richard Lilley joined the firm.*
- 42 George Oswald Browning 'Gubby' Allen. Middlesex, Cambridge University & England 1921-1950. Single page letter from Allen, handwritten in ink and dated 12th July 1950. Writing to Leslie Deakins, Secretary of Warwickshire C.C.C., Allen states 'I have passed on Gladwill's name to Ronnie Aird [M.C.C. assistant secretary]. He says they often get inquiries & he will not forget him'. Nicely signed 'Gubby Allen'. Staple holes to top left corner, otherwise in very good condition. £25/35
- 43 Douglas Robert Jardine. Oxford University, Surrey & England 1920-1934. Two page handwritten letter on 'The Scottish Australian Company Limited', London letterhead, in ink from Jardine to Leslie Deakins, Secretary of Warwickshire C.C.C., the letter dated 3rd May 1955. Jardine is replying to a letter from Deakins regarding the 'Association of Cricket Umpires appeal', a cause which Jardine clearly supports having been 'genuinely impressed (& vastly gratified) by the tremendous amount of hard voluntary work done by members'. He closes by saying he looks forward to visiting Edgbaston again. Nicely signed 'Douglas R. Jardine'. Staple holes to top corner, otherwise in very good condition. £70/100
- Jardine was a board member of the Scottish Australian Company, which dealt in real estate and finance. He died in 1958.*
- 44 Brian Maurice Brain. Worcestershire & Gloucestershire 1959-1981. An interesting selection of eight handwritten and typed letters dated 1963 and 1966 from and about Brian Brain. The first is a handwritten letter dated 27th February 1963 from Brain to M.J.K. Smith, then captain at Warwickshire, asking whether he would be considered to join the playing staff. Smith replied on 7th March 1963 rejecting Brain's request. On 17th June 1966, Brain wrote to Leslie Deakins, Secretary at Warwickshire C.C.C. stating he had applied to be released from his contract with Worcestershire and whether they would be interested in his services. There follows correspondence between Deakins and Joe Lister at Worcestershire, on 21st June 1966 Deakins asking for permission to negotiate with Brain. In his reply dated 23rd June, Lister says Brain's 'chances of gaining a regular place in the side, within the next year or so, were very rosy'. Deakins acknowledges these comments on 24th June. A further letter from a Warwickshire member dated 13th July 1966 to Deakins recommends 'obtaining the services of B. Brain of Worcestershire', and Deakins' reply of 15th July explains the Club's 'acute' position regarding bowlers. Good condition. £40/60
- Brain made his first-class debut for Worcestershire in 1959 aged 18. He played only one County Championship match that season and did not make another first team appearance until 1964 when he started to establish himself more regularly in the first team. He eventually moved to play for Gloucestershire in 1976.*
- 45 Herbert Sutcliffe. Yorkshire & England 1919-1945. Four letter comprising correspondence from 1965 between Sutcliffe and Leslie Deakins, Secretary of Warwickshire C.C.C. In a two page handwritten letter in ink dated 26th April 1965 Sutcliffe states that he will be attending Edgbaston to adjudicate on a Gillette Cup match and, tongue in cheek, suggests this 'will enable you to prepare the Red Carpet and engage the local band and also arrange with the Chief Constable for an escort on the borders of the City', nicely signed 'Herbert'. Deakins welcomes Sutcliffe's letter in a typed reply of 27th April with amusement. Sutcliffe writes again on 3rd May unable to attend the 1st Test due to a prior golfing engagement, with Deakins writing on 5th May enclosing a parking permit as requested. Good condition. £40/60
- 46 Edgar John 'Eddie' Barlow. Transvaal, Eastern Province, Western Province, Derbyshire, Boland & South Africa 1960-1983. Three letters relating to Eddie Barlow in 1968. The first is dated 5th March from Leslie Deakins, General Secretary of Warwickshire C.C.C. to 'The Members of the Cricket Sub-Committee'. Following the change in regulations enabling county sides to recruit one overseas player, Warwickshire had contacted Barlow by cablegram who had 'just joined Stellenbosch Farmers Winery in Capetown'. The reply stated he had 'already been approached

several times' and he would not be interested in joining. Three days later on 8th March, Warwickshire captain, Alan Smith, wrote to Barlow with an attractive offer to play for the Club, and on the 15th March Barlow replied confirming he was 'not interested in taking up a professional appointment at present'. The letter nicely signed by Barlow. Good condition. £40/60

Barlow eventually played county cricket when he joined Derbyshire in 1976.

- 47 Warwickshire players selected for England 1968-1970. Five typed letters received by Leslie Deakins, Secretary of Warwickshire C.C.C. from the M.C.C./ T.C.C.B. at Lord's, each advising that Warwickshire players had been selected to play for England in Test matches. Letters are dated 31st May 1968, David Brown, Dennis Amiss and Tom Cartwright selected for the Old Trafford Test v Australia. 16th June 1968, Tom Cartwright and Dennis Amiss for the Lord's Test, both signed by Doug Insole, Chairman of the Selection Committee. 19th July 1969, David Brown to play at Lord's v New Zealand. 6th August 1970, Dennis Amiss for England v. Rest of the World at Lord's, both signed by Alec Bedser, T.C.C.B. Selection Sub-Committee. 22nd July 1970, Lance Gibbs to play for Rest of the World v England at Headingley, signed by Freddie Brown, T.C.C.B. Selection Sub-Committee. Sold with a typed letter dated 12th January 1967 to Deakins from Sir Alec Douglas Home in his capacity as President of the National Playing Fields Association, requesting that Lance Gibbs be made available to play in a match in Glasgow. Deakins' reply of 23rd January states there is no objection subject to confirmation that Gibbs would be permitted by the West Indies Board to join Warwickshire. Qty 7. Good condition. £50/80
- 48 Colin Everton Hunte Croft. Guyana, Demerara, Lancashire & West Indies 1971-1982. Single page handwritten letter from a young Colin Croft to Leslie Deakins, Secretary of Warwickshire C.C.C. Dated 7th August 1973, Croft thanks the Club for the award of a plaque following his attendance on a course with

English Colts. Croft talks of his desire to play cricket in England, his frustration at not being selected to play for Guyana, and his job as an Assistant Air Traffic Control Officer. Signed 'Colin Croft' with an enclosed press cutting of Croft with his plaque. There then follows a short typed note dated 25th October 1973 from Deakins to 'Derief' Taylor (Jamaica & Warwickshire) with handwritten notes by Taylor describing Croft as 'very promising... could become a first-class cricketer', and a further letter dated 29th July 1974 from Deakins to Croft, apologising for the delay in replying, and asking to be kept updated on his progress in cricket. Croft made his Test debut for West Indies in 1976/77 and joined Lancashire in 1977 for whom he played until his retirement from first-class cricket in 1982.

- 49 John Major, Prime Minister, visit to Edgbaston 1994. Four typed letters relating to John Major visiting Edgbaston. The first, dated 8th March 1994 is a copy letter from M.J.K. Smith, Chairman of Warwickshire C.C.C., inviting the Prime Minister to attend two one day international matches at Edgbaston, v New Zealand on 19th May and v South Africa on 25th August. An official reply dated 29th March from Major's Private Secretary at Downing Street states he will be able to attend the August fixture. Two further letters on Downing Street letterhead are from John Major, dated 29th August 1994, one to 'Dear Mike [Smith]', the other to Dennis Amiss, thanking them both for their hospitality. Both signed in ink, 'Yours ever, John'. Very good condition. £50/70
- 50 Warwickshire trialists 1950s-1980s. Eight letters, the majority from and/or to Leslie Deakins, Secretary of Warwickshire C.C.C., relating to requests and invitations to attend trials etc. Correspondents include an invitation to Ken Higgs (Lancashire, Leicestershire & England 1958-1982) to attend a trial in 1953, with Higgs' handwritten reply requesting a change of date as it clashes with his holidays. Typed letter from Alf Gover to Leslie Deakins, dated 10th August 1963 on 'Sandham and Gover' letterhead, asking permission

to invite Khalid Ibadullah to join a Commonwealth team to tour Pakistan. Two handwritten letters, one dated 27th March 1958, the other undated, from Brian Crump (Northamptonshire 1960-1972) turning down invitations to play in friendly matches for Warwickshire, stating that he has already accepted a similar request to play for Northamptonshire. Typed letter from Graham Dowling of the New Zealand Cricket Council, dated 14th June 1988, regarding a request to find cricketing opportunities for Simon Green (Warwickshire 1988-1991) in New Zealand etc. Also a handwritten letter from Leslie Ames inviting Bert Wolton (Warwickshire 1947-1960) to play in a match 31st August-2nd September at Hastings (year and match unknown), sold with a Bert Wolton benefit leaflet and Warwickshire C.C.C. fixture card for 1959. Insole mentions

- tickets received, accommodation, arrangements for batting and fielding practice for 'the mob', meeting the press etc. Nicely signed by Insole. Also a press release letter dated 'May, 1949' from the 'Sporting Record' announcing the launch of a new instructional feature, 'Learn with our Stars'. Odd minor faults, otherwise in good condition.

Accompanying this is a further single page document on blue paper, which states 'James Lillywhite as I write[?] proposes to make himself liable to the 12[?] players. England won the Ashes series by four Tests to one. The tour was highly controversial because of the bodyline bowling tactics used by the England team under the captaincy of Douglas Jardine.

Bodyline, also known as fast leg theory bowling, was a cricketing tactic devised by the English cricket team for their 1932-33 Ashes tour of Australia, specifically to combat the extraordinary batting skill of Australia's Don Bradman. A bodyline delivery was one where the cricket ball was bowled at the body of the batsman, in the hope that when he defended himself with

his bat, a resulting deflection could be caught by one of several fielders standing close by.

Maurice Leyland played in 41 Test matches scoring 2764 runs at an average of 46.06. On the tour he ended with the fourth highest batting average amongst the team of 44.00, scoring two centuries. He scored 83 and 42 in the 3rd Test and 86 in the 4th Test. Leyland toured Australia with M.C.C. on three occasions 1928/29, 1932/33 and 1936/37 but this is the only tour they 'reclaimed the Ashes' with Leyland in the touring party

446 Charles Phillip Mead. Hampshire & England 1905-1936. The ball was presented to Cobden a few days after the match by I.D. Walker, the former Harrow Captain. Sold with full printed details of the match and confirmation that the ball was presented to Cobden. Some loss of the gilt inscription to ball otherwise in good condition £300/500
- Cobden was a right arm fast bowler who gained a blue in all three years of his time at Cambridge. In 22 matches he took 65 wickets at an average of 17.20, with best innings figures of 6/35. He took five or more wickets in an innings four times and ten or more wickets in a match once. For many years he ran Radnor C.C. He played for Shropshire and Herefordshire. This match is one of the longest-running annual sporting fixtures in the world and is the last annual school cricket match still to be played at Lord's....*
- 465 Major Robert Montagu Poore. Europeans, Hampshire & South Africa 1892-1906. Large heavy leather cricket bag used by Poore during his cricketing career playing for the 7th Hussars and presumably for Hampshire and other teams. The bag has central handles, is sealed using buckles and metal clips at each end and measures 36" long. The bag decorated with crossed painted colour stripes of navy blue and yellow, the colours of the Queen's Own 7th Hussars (and also Hampshire C.C.C.). - Robert Montagu Poore was a cricketer and British army officer who, whilst serving in South Africa in 1896, played in three Test matches for the South African cricket team. In 1899, Poore became the most fertile run-scorer in all of England, hitting 1,399 runs, including seven hundreds between 12 June and 12 August at an average of 116.58. In 21 innings over the course of the entire season, Poore managed 1,551 runs at 91.23, a record average for an English season not broken until Don Bradman averaged 98.66 in 1930. Poore was rewarded with selection as a Wisden Cricketer of the Year.*
- 466 William Howard Vincent 'Hopper' Levett. Kent & England 1930-1947. Large leather cricket bag used by Levett during his cricketing career playing for Kent and England. The bag has central handles and a central lock, it is sealed by two straps and buckles and by metal clips at each end and measures 36" long. The bag has various remnants of travel labels at each end and the bag is inscribed 'W.H.V.L.' being Levett's initials. The bag is generally worn, very minor breaking to stitching and small loss of leather to base otherwise in good overall condition for its age £150/250
- William Howard Vernon 'Hopper' Levett. Kent & England 1930-1947. Levett played 142 matches for Kent as wicket keeper in the period, taking 283 catches and 195 stumpings. His highest score with the bat was 76. He toured India and Ceylon with the M.C.C. in 1933/34 playing in one Test match on the tour.*
- 467 Arthur Edward Wilson. Middlesex & Gloucestershire 1932-1955. Large leather cricket bag used by Wilson during his cricketing career playing for Middlesex and Gloucestershire. The bag has central handles and a central lock strap and buckle, sealed by straps and buckles and metal clips at each end and measures 36" long. The bag is inscribed 'A.E.W.' being Wilson's initials. The bag is generally worn but otherwise in good overall condition £150/250
- Andy Wilson, a wicketkeeper, Played briefly for Middlesex before playing for Gloucestershire between 1936 and 1955. He became their first choice keeper a couple of years later after he had qualified for residence. He scored 1138 runs in his debut season and after the war he began opening the batting for the county. He took 30 stumpings in 1947 and made his highest score of 188 against Sussex in 1949. For every season until 1950 he passed 1000 runs, last achieving the feat in 1953.*
- 468 Hon. Mortimer Granville Tollemache. Cambridge University 1891-1893. 'Skeleton Leg Guards'. These are similar to the previous gloves in their range except that these gloves have been faced by an India rubber compound with a rough surface to make it easier to retain the ball when catching. The rubber adds slightly to the protection provided. Some wear with loss to the backs of both gloves, some staining and general wear. The initials 'J.F.K.' to both gloves on the wrist. Rarely seen. Sold with the vendors notes on the gloves showing an advertisement for the gloves in the Busseys 1898 catalogue £120/160
- 474 Wicket keeping gauntlets 1910's. An early example of a pair of brown leather wicket-keeping gloves used in the period, makers unknown. These gloves were marketed before and just after World War One. Made, mainly of leather, they have padded finger and thumb tips and padded palms, back straps have been added and ventilation holes are now punched in the back of the glove. Some wear, slight damage, some staining otherwise in good condition £80/120
- 475 Wicket keeping gauntlets 1920's. An example of a pair of leather wicket-keeping gloves used in the period, makers unknown. These gloves were top of the range glove in the 1920's. - Prince Christian Victor (1867-1900) was a member of the British royal family and a grandson of Queen Victoria. He is the only member of the royal family to have played first-class cricket, appearing in one match for I Zingari against Gentlemen of England at Scarborough, 29th- 31st August 1887, scoring 35 and 0. While serving with the British Army in the Second Boer War, he contracted malaria and died of enteric fever in Pretoria in 1900, aged only 33.*
- 524 Eton v Harrow, Lord's, July 1873. Four original photographs of Eton players, Francis Buckland, Eustratius Pandeli Constantine Ralli, Alfred Lyttleton and Frederick John Bruce who all played in this early Public School match. The Eton v Harrow cricket match at Lords in July 1873 ended in a vulgar brawl and police had to be called to restore order. The game, watched by 20,000 people, had comprised two days of the finest all round school cricket that had been seen for some time at Lord's and was closely contested. On the last day however, Harrow overcame the favoured Etonians by five wickets and happy Harrovians rushed on to the pitch to hoist their heroes upon their shoulders. The celebrations soon turned into noisy and riotous proceedings. The MCC said that any repetition must inevitable end in the discontinuance of the match and luckily the 1874 match went off without incident.

In 1938 Buckley moved to Weston-super-Mare in Somerset where he lived in a Victorian house close to his local cricket ground.

While studying at Oxford, Richard Colley played first-class cricket for Oxford University. He made his debut against Cambridge University

- in The University Match of 1853, with Colley playing first-class cricket for Oxford until 1855, making a total of seven appearances. He scored a total of 166 runs in these matches, at an average of 13.83 and a high score of 68. He also played at county level for Oxfordshire and, between 1854 and 1866, for Shropshire. While playing for the latter he achieved a century in one match, when he made 118 runs*
- 1177 'The United All-England Eleven v. Sixteen of Reigate and District' 1856. Early small original double sided scorecard with incomplete printed scores for the match played at Park Lane, Reigate, 14th- 16th August 1856. The scorecard lists the complete first innings of the Reigate team who reached 102, James Dean taking 8/34 for United England. Top scorer for Reigate was Fred Chadband with 24. - 1179 'Grand Cricket Match. United 11 of All England v. 22 [of] Hull & District' 1859. Early original single sided scorecard with complete printed scores for the match played at Argyle Street, Hull, 28th- 30th July 1859. - They boarded the ship, Paramatta, at Sydney on the 8th February 1868 and sailed for England arriving at Gravesend on the 13th May 1868. Whilst in England they played forty seven matches in twenty two weeks winning fourteen, drawing eighteen and losing fifteen of the matches played. Apart from playing the cricket matches they gave exhibitions of spear and boomerang throwing and other sports. Their matches proved very popular, with 5,000 spectators attending the more important games. According to Haygarth it was a very lucrative speculation.*
- 1197 'The County of Lancaster [Lancashire] v. The County of Surrey' 1869. Early original single sided scorecard with near complete printed scores for the match played at Old Trafford, Manchester, 27th- 29th May 1869. Electing to bat first, Surrey posted 209 with George Griffith top scorer on 78. Replying, Lancashire reached 255 (Edmund Rowley 52, Cornelius Coward 49, Roger Iddison 48, James Southerton taking 5/66 for Surrey). In the second innings, Surrey were dismissed for 132 (Ted Pooley 37). Arthur Appleby took 8/68 for Lancashire and ended with match bowling figures of eleven wickets for 144 runs. Lancashire then chased down their target, ending 87/3 to win by seven wickets. Printed by William Whittam, 'Printer for the All England Eleven'. 4.5"x6". In the second innings, the Players made 228 (Tom Emmett 93), setting the Gentlemen 174 to win, who were skittled out for only 62, Charles Green being the only batsman to reach double figures with 17. Prince's Cricket Ground in Chelsea, London was a cricket ground, created by the brothers George and James Prince as part of the Prince's Club, on which 37 first-class matches were played between 1872 and 1878. The ground was built on in 1883. The boundaries of the site are marked by Cadogan Square West, Milner Street, Lennox Gardens Mews, Walton Street and Pont Street. The first match played on the ground was Household Brigade v. Lords and Commons on 3 June 1871.

- 1202 American Baseball Players tour to England 1874. 'Princes' Club & Ground v. Eighteen of America'. Early and rare original single sided scorecard with complete printed and handwritten scores in ink for the match played at the Prince's Ground, Chelsea, 6th & 7th August 1874. Prince's Club batted first and were bowled out for only 21 with seven players scoring ducks. Only F.D. Leyland reached double figures, ending 10no. Set 132 to win, Nottinghamshire ended 42 runs short with two wickets remaining at the close of play and the match was drawn. In the second innings, England reached 234/8 before making the first declaration in Test cricket. Shrewsbury scored 81 and William Gunn 77, George Giffen taking 5/43, but rain prevented any further play and the match was drawn. Fixtures at Lord's for season 1893 to verso. - 1245 'Gravesend Cricket Week, 1893. Kent v. Middlesex'. - 1325 The Ashes. Australia v England 1924/25. 'Sutcliffe's Series'. A rare complete set of official scorecards for the five Test matches in the 1924/25 Ashes series played in Australia, all with complete printed scores, and originally from the personal collection of Jack Hobbs. The first, played at Sydney on the 19th- 27th December 1924 with Australia winning by 193 runs, Hobbs scoring 115 & 57, Sutcliffe 59 & 115, the second, at Melbourne on the 1st-8th January 1925 with Australia winning by 81 runs (Hobbs 154 & 22, Sutcliffe 176 & 127), the third, at Adelaide on the 16th- 23rd January 1925 with Australia winning by 11 runs (Hobbs 119 & 27, Sutcliffe 33 & 59), the fourth, at Melbourne on the 13th- 18th February 1925 with England winning by an innings and 29 runs (Hobbs 66, Sutcliffe 143), and the fifth, at Sydney on the 27th February- 3rd March 1925 with Australia winning by 307 runs (Hobbs 0 & 13, Sutcliffe 22 & 0). The years of 1924 and 1925 were probably Sutcliffe's most productive years, both for Yorkshire and for England. Sutcliffe had an exceptional tour of Australia with M.C.C. in 1924/25. In the five Tests, he scored 734 runs at an average of 81.55 with four centuries and a highest score of 176. In the 1925 County Championship Sutcliffe was second in the batting averages behind Hobbs, scoring 2,528 runs at 66.52 with 8 centuries and a highest score of exactly 200 against Leicestershire.
