#### CRICKET EPHEMERA

- 1 Hampshire C.C.C. 'The Kentish Gazette'. Original early newspaper for 27th July 1792 printed in Canterbury. Page one column 1 features a small advertisement for 'Cricket. A Grand Match of Cricket will be played in Cobham Hall Park August 13th and the following days, Kent with two given men out of Surry against Hampshire... A good ordinary provided on the Cricket Ground, each day of playing, by Heath of the Bull Inn, Rochester'. On the back page column 4 is a small report on another Hampshire match 'Last week a Grand Match of Cricket was played on Windmill Down, Hants- the county of Hants against the County of Surry for One Thousand Guineas' Hampshire totalled 298 from their two innings and Surry 171. The newspaper appears to have been bound at some point otherwise in good condition for its age. £80/120
- 2 Hampshire C.C.C. 'The Farmer's Journal and Manufacturer's and Trader's Register 1807'. Early, original and interesting eight page newspaper for Saturday May 30th 1807. With five line paragraph on page 46. 'Cricket. The Grand Match in Lord's Ground, on Monday last, between nine of Hampshire, with Lambert and Hampton against eleven of All England, for one thousand Guineas a side, was decided on Wednesday, in favour of England, by 47 runs'. The paper previously bound, some folds, wear to edges, slight damage otherwise in good condition for its age £60/90
- 3 'The Great Match of Cricket. Yorkshire & Norfolk' 1834. Original four page broadsheet copy of the 'The Norfolk Chronicle and Norwich Gazette' newspaper dated 7th June 1834. Page three features an advertisement for the match to be played 'at Norwich, Wednesday 18th June and following days for 100 Sovereigns a-side. The match will include the celebrated Marsden & Dearman, the Three Pilches and the best players of the two counties'. Duty stamp to top right corner of front page. Some wear and loss to fold and one edge, some age toning to centre pages, otherwise in good condition. £50/80  
*The match took place at the New Ground, Norwich as advertised. The three Pilch brothers, Fuller, Nathaniel and William, helped Norfolk to a significant victory by 272 runs. Fuller Pilch scored 87 and 73 in Norfolk's two innings of 215 and 191. Yorkshire were bowled out for 37 and 97. Yorkshire's William Woolhouse was their top scorer in both innings with 21 in the first innings and in the second innings he is recorded as having batted for three hours for 26!*
- 4 Original newspapers 1860s-2000s. A comprehensive collection of over eighty home and overseas newspapers, the majority complete copies, with good cricket coverage. Issues include 'The Daily Gleaner', Kingston, Jamaica, June 1955 'Cricket Souvenir' for 'West Indies vs. Australia 1955'. 'The Birmingham Post Supplement in Commemoration of Edgbaston Test Match' 30th May 1957. Two complete issues of 'The Referee Edited by Pendragon', 21st June and 28th June 1885. 'The Daily News' 14th August 1926 with photographs to back page of the 'Final Cricket Test at The Oval', England v. Australia. 'The Evening News' 17th August 1925, Hobbs' 100th hundred. 'Evening Post Test Match Special' and the 'Yorkshire Post' 12th August 1977, Boycott's 100th hundred. 'The Sun-Herald' Sydney, 31st January 1965, New South Wales and Victorian teams pay their respect before play following the death of Winston Churchill. 'The Star Trueman Special Edition' 29th August 1961. 'The Daily Mirror' 19th October 1915 with report on the illness of W.G. Grace. 'Daily Sketch' 17th June 1932, front page only (torn), Holmes and Sutcliffe 555 record score. 'Scientific American', New York 10th August 1861, with article on a patent issued for 'Hanlon's Improved Wicket'. Reports on Ashes Tests, England v. Australia, 'Daily Mirror' 18th August 1926, Hobbs and Sutcliffe centuries, 'Daily Sketch' 19th August 1926, England win The Ashes, 'Daily Mirror' 23rd June 1934 at Lord's, 'Daily Sketch' 10th June 1938 at Trent Bridge, 23rd July 1938 at Headingley etc. Plus some single newspaper pages covering cricket. Some faults to earlier issues, otherwise in good condition. £100/150
- 5 Cricket! Surrey Cricket Ground, Kennington Oval' 1853. Early original advertising handbill for 'Grand Matches' to be played at The Oval. Matches are 'The Surrey Club with Two Players against the [Sevenoaks] Vine Club with Two Players', 30th June, 'The North against The South', 7th July, 'Twenty-two I Zingari against the Eleven of England for the Benefit of Beagley', 14th July, and 'Fourteen of the County of Surrey against the Eleven of England', 1st August. 5" x7.25". Printer unknown. Small hole to centre, staining and some creasing, otherwise in good condition. £120/160
- 6 Australian tour of England 1938. Large original 'News Chronicle' advertising and promotional poster and image of the Australian team to centre and the wording 'Australian Team above and below 'Exclusive art plate'. Banner to top and bottom reads 'News Chronicle'. The poster printed in red and black on a pink background and measures 19" x30". The lot includes the Test Team art plate printed picture of the team with title 'The Australian Test Team 1938' to top and players names to lower border. Sold with the original envelope in which the art plate was sent. Printed details to envelope read 'Australian Test Team Art Plate'. One copy to be given free to each purchaser of the News Chronicle on application'. All three items in good condition, the poster neatly folded as issued. Rarely seen £50/70
- 7 Hornibrook 6 for 5 Essex Rout'. Large original newspaper poster for

- the 'Home' edition of the [London] Evening News, dated 8th May 1930. The poster measures approx. 20"x30", framed and glazed overall 24"x34". Horizontal and vertical folds, with small loss to right edge and top corner, otherwise in good/ very good condition. £80/120
- The poster refers to the Australians' tour match against Essex played at Leyton, 7th- 9th May 1930. Percy Hornibrook ended the first innings with figures of six wickets for eleven runs off nine overs with Essex being dismissed for 67. He took a further four wickets in the second innings, returning match figures of 10/40, the Australians winning by 207 runs.*
- 8 The Ashes 1930. Original 'L.N.E. M. & G.N. Rlys' railway handbill titled 'Divisional Labour Party Corridor Express Excursion to Blackpool, Sheffield & Manchester' and 'See Third Test Match. England v. Australia, Old Trafford Ground, Manchester. Saturday, 26th July [1930]'. The handbill measures 7.5"x9.75". Small white label laid to top right corner. Light folds, otherwise in good/ very good condition. £40/60
- 9 'Cricket. Follow the Game with the King-Pins of Cricket, West Indians v Spartans, Sunday May 27th & Decoration Day May 30th [19]23'. Unusual and intriguing handbill for cricket matches played at Commercial Field, Brooklyn, New York. The handbill features lists of two teams, with short biographies of each player. Players for the 'West Indians' include Dr. W.O.B. Gibbs (Captain), F. Hinds, O. Layne, E. Holder, R. Alder, A. Dash etc. Players listed for 'The Dreadnoughts' include A. Walcott (Captain), A. Simpson, V. Sween, John Robinson, R. Cook etc. Printed by 'The Energetic Press', Brooklyn. Despite research, the auctioneer has been unable to find any record of the match. 7.5"x12". - 10 Victorian Ladies' cricket. Early small original handbill for 'A Grand Female Cricket Match, between 11 of Surrey and 11 of Hampshire for 500 Guineas' at Robert Thornton Esq.'s Park, Clapham, 30th September 1811, printed by Grant of Borough, and a sepia plain back real photograph postcard of a reproduction of an engraving of a humorous depiction of the match in progress. The handbill with heavy staining measures 4"x5.75", laid to page. Sold with an original advertising handbill for 'A Lawn-Tennis Rival. "Victorian" or Ladies' Cricket' items by William Peacock of Islington at the International Inventions Exhibition, London 1885. Printed by Wright & Co. of London. 5.75"x9". Horizontal fold, otherwise in good condition. Also a modern copy photograph of the Wycombe Abbey Girls' School cricket team of the 1890s. Very good condition. Qty 4. £70/100
- 11 'The Hampshire Giants'. John Arlott 1945. An original seven page typescript written and narrated by John Arlott for a radio programme broadcast 6th May 1945 on the B.B.C. Home Service. Arlott writes about the 'Bat and Ball' inn on Broadhalfpenny Down, home of the Hambledon Cricket Club, 'the greatest single club in the history of cricket'. He describes the speeds that the underarm bowlers of the time, such as David Harris, achieved, and the significant roles played by Richard and John Nyren in the success of Hambledon. Arlott describes William 'Silver Billy' Beldham as a 'magnificent forcing bat' and how, aged 86, Beldham walked seven miles each way to watch a cricket match. Other players mentioned are the batsman, Tom Walker, and the 'star fieldsman and big hitter, Noah Mann', and closes with a vivid description of post-match celebrations and entertainment at the Bat and Ball. A typically descriptive and poignant account of the dawn of Hampshire cricket. Ex John Arlott collection. G/ VG £100/150
- 12 Michael Parkinson on Greg Chappell. Original four page typescript with handwritten corrections and annotations of an article written by Parkinson for a book on Chappell. Ex Irving Rosenwater collection with handwritten note in Rosenwater's hand, 'Michael Parkinson [while in Sydney] copy for Greg Chappell picture book. 1982'. VG. £30/50
- 13 Sunil Manohar Gavaskar. Bombay, Somerset & India. 1967-1987. Seven page handwritten manuscript written on 'Vacation Hotels New Zealand' note paper of an article by Gavaskar reviewing India's 1980/81 tour to Australia. Ex Irving Rosenwater collection with handwritten annotation to first page, 'Sunil Gavaskar original copy'. VG. £50/70
- 14 Imran Khan. Lahore, Worcestershire, Oxford University & Pakistan 1969-1992. Seven page handwritten manuscript for an article written by Imran Khan, accompanied by a three page typescript version with handwritten annotations and corrections by Imran and Irving Rosenwater. Imran reviews the 1983/84 Pakistan Test and one day international series in Australia and looks forward to the impending 1984/85 tour to New Zealand followed by the World Championship of Cricket series in Australia 1985, stating 'the performance on home wickets can no longer be counted as a useful yardstick to pass any judgement on our strength. It has become quite a usual phenomenon of Pakistan teams going abroad with the batting considered invincible and the bowling as the weak link, yet the batting ends up collapsing under pressure whereas the bowling does much better than expected'. He continues with his opinions on selection, citing Zaheer Abbas, 'Mohsin [Khan] and Mudassar [Nazar] should be our openers', Javed Miandad, Qasim Omar, Saleem Malik, Sarfraz Nawaz etc. and hopes to play his own part 'in this great, great spectacle'. Ex Irving Rosenwater collection with handwritten note in Rosenwater's hand, 'Imran's piece. 2.11.1984'. Good cricket content. G/VG.£50/70
- 15 Maxwell Henry Norman 'Max' Walker. Victoria & Australia 1968-1982. 'Javed Miandad by Max Walker'. Five page handwritten article by Walker in which he describes Miandad as 'cheeky' and 'full of fun', and who was 'indirectly responsible for my taking what was a "career best" catch' at the Manuka Oval, Canberra 'in the second year of World Series Cricket'. He describes taking an 'absolute screamer [of a catch]' to dismiss Miandad, only regretting 'that it

- wasn't in front of 50,000 at the M.C.G. instead of 500 and a few dogs at Manuka Oval'. He continues by looking forward to Miandad duelling with Lillee and Pascoe in the impending 1981/82 Test series in Australia, and highlights Miandad's career to date, having been made Pakistan's youngest captain when aged 22, his reputation 'as a brilliant cover fielder', and his 'cavalier batting' and 'application', and looks forward to welcoming the Pakistan touring party. - 16 Australia. The Chappell brothers. Seven page handwritten article in pencil titled 'My three sons from a parent's point of view' written by Martin Chappell, father of the brothers Ian, Greg and Trevor, with an accompanying note in ink to 'Dear Austin [Robertson?]' dated 22nd August 1982. Chappell describes his delight of seeing his three sons playing together for South Australia, and at Lord's for Australia in '1972 (Ian & Greg), 1977 (Greg), 1981 (Trevor)'. He describes his own passion for cricket and baseball, the boys growing up, the contribution of his wife, Jeanne (daughter of Vic Richardson), who was 'resolved to doing all the hard work necessary to keep a family of sportsmen in the field', setting up a practice pitch in the garden, his pride in their many achievements including Test debuts, Ian and Greg's appointments as Test captains etc. The covering note refers to photographs he is providing, but 'a great shortage of V.J.R. [Richardson] with the boys'. Ex Irving Rosenwater collection. An excellent personal, family account of the Chappell brothers. G/VG. £40/60
- Austin Robertson wrote a number of biographies of Australian cricketers.*
- 17 'S.F. Barnes- Master Bowler'. Leslie Duckworth. A comprehensive collection of typed and handwritten correspondence from 1965 to 1967 between Duckworth and Irving Rosenwater contained in a large envelope with title handwritten to front in Rosenwater's hand with the annotation, 'How the book came to be published'. Contents include Duckworth's description of being let down in 1965 by the publisher, Epworth Press, then by Eyre & Spottiswoode, and Rosenwater's encouragement and efforts to find an alternative and subsequent assistance with its eventual publication by The Cricketer/ Hutchinson in 1967. Also contains Duckworth's synopsis, discussions regarding content, and ongoing updates on progress of the book's production, serialisation in the Birmingham Post, reviews, cuttings, the odd photograph of Barnes, etc. Ex Irving Rosenwater collection. - Leslie Duckworth worked for the Birmingham Post and published a number of cricket biographies and histories in the 1960s and 1970s.*
- 18 Irving Rosenwater archives 1959-2003. A collection of fourteen large envelopes containing copies of reports and articles and original press cuttings collected by Rosenwater, with his handwritten titles to the envelopes. Subjects covered include 'Cricket Cartoons (cuttings)' 1959. 'G.A. Lohmann's Grave at Matjiesfontein'. Fritz Joubert, with four original mono press photographs, 1965. 'Regina v N. Gifford' copy typescript of a 'humorous' article titled on the Benson & Hedges Cup Semi-final, Lancashire v Worcestershire, 1973, with accompanying scathing comments by Rosenwater. 'A.W. Greig "Melbourne Herald" Interview August 30, 1974' relating to accusations of improper conduct. Cuttings of 'Australia v England 1978-79. Reports on the Tests'. 'The Relationship Between the Australian Cricket Board and the Players', John Lysikatos 1983. 'New South Wales Cricket Association and Tooheys Limited. Agreement: 1983'. 'Sponsorship of Victorian Cricket' April 1984. 'Sydney Cricket and Sports Ground Trust Report and Accounts' May 1985. 'Letter to Australian Cricket Board re 1986-87 Season'. 'D.K. Lillee Newspaper and Magazine Features etc'. Newspaper cuttings relating to the World Cup in South Africa 2002/03. - 19 J.W. Goldman. 'Cricket on the Hearth' c.1890 to early 1900. Three scrapbook albums compiled by Goldman in matching volumes bound in red cloth (Vol. I smaller), each with leather title label to spine. The contents comprise a nice and comprehensive collection of magazine extracts of cartoons, printed photographs of players and matches, teams etc. mainly relating to English first-class and some Test cricket of the period including the Australian tour of 1902, many annotated with captions in ink by Goldman. Both sides of the second end paper of Vol. I features the poem, 'Cricket on the Hearth' by Norman Gale, apparently handwritten in ink by Goldman. Vol. III also contains eight original printed poems by Albert Craig, the 'Cricket Rhymster', trimmed and laid down to pages. Many notable players are featured including A.C. Maclaren, W.G. Grace, Trumble, Kelly, A.E. Trott, C.B. Fry, Jessop, Lilley, Warner, Abel, Mead, Lockwood, Douglas, Jackson, Tyldesley, Hirst, Trumper, Hill etc. Minor wear to boards, some age toning to page edges, otherwise in good/ very good condition. £70/100
- 20 'The Life of W.G. Grace'. Large format scrapbook comprising a good selection of newspaper cuttings relating to Grace's childhood and playing career, with reports of his achievements and anecdotes, and also his brothers Edward Mills Grace and George Frederick Grace. The book with brown paper wrappers and handwritten title to front with 'Book compiled of news cuttings acquired in March 1905'. Good condition. £30/50
- 21 England Test series 1962-1979. Ten scrapbook albums comprising an extensive collection of newspaper cuttings covering England home and away Test series and tours. Each album is dedicated to a specific series/ tour and bound uniformly in green cloth with gilt title to spine. Series are England v Australia 1962/63, v West Indies 1963, v Australia 1972, v West Indies 1973, v Australia & New Zealand 1974/75, v Australia 1975, v West Indies 1975/76, v West Indies 1976, v Australia 1977, and v Australia 1978/79. - 22 Pre-war cricket scrapbooks. Two scrapbooks of newspaper and magazine cuttings, one pre-World War I featuring England Test and County cricketers C.B. Fry, W.G. Grace, W. Rhodes, Ranjitsinhji, Plum Warner, Gilbert Jessop, Lord Hawke, also the Australian tours to England 1909 and 1911 including Victor Trumper etc. The other, with newspaper and some magazine cuttings, relates to the seasons 1928-1930 including the M.C.C. tour to Australia 1928/29 and Australia to England 1930. Tape repair to spine of the later album, otherwise in generally good condition. £30/40
- 23 'Rev. R.S. Holmes. Cricket Literature and some Cricket Notches. Illustrated'. Compiled by George Neville Weston 1933. Large format scrapbook handsomely rebound in brown quarter leather and tan cloth, raised bands and gilt title to spine, with gilt on black leather title label to front, and what appears to be the original title label laid down to inside front cover. Comprises 92 numbered leaves (186 pages in total), the majority being original extracts from 'Cricket a Weekly Record', some hand copied by Weston, backed by magazine illustrations of famous players, teams, grounds etc. including Hornby, Palaret, Felix, Richardson, Parr, Jessop, Shuter, Anglo-American team 1859 etc. Other contents include Weston's handwritten copy of Ashley-Cooper's 'Chat' with Holmes in 'Cricket' 2nd May 1907, a list of books bought by Weston from Holmes' estate in 1933 with prices, and transcriptions of letters by Weston concerning the purchase of Holmes' collection in 1929, handwritten indexes etc. Laid down to the inside back cover is an envelope of correspondence between Weston and the book dealer, Charles Leslie, on cricket including W.G. Grace, boxing, books purchased from Charles Pratt-Green, and an original rare bookplate of R.S. Holmes. A.E. Winder bought this volume from E.K. Brown in 1981, Winder's bookplate to first page. - Holmes was a major contributor to 'Cricket A Weekly Record from 1884 to 1895.*
- 24 Melbourne Cricket Club annual reports and newsletters 1966-1990/91. Folder comprising a collection of approx. fifty newsletters and annual reports issued by the Club for the period. Formerly the property of Irving Rosenwater. Newsletters include issue nos. 26, 28-32, 34, 35, 43, 44, 48, 49, 51, 53, 54, 57, 60, 61, 63-65, 67, 69, 71 and 80 for the period 1966-1988. Annual reports cover seasons 1974/75-1976/77, 1982/83-1985/86 and 1990/91. Some duplication of issues. Also includes a typed letter to the publishers of the newsletter, PBL, from Irving Rosenwater, dated 19th August 1986, in which he bemoans the content of the Annual Report/newsletter, complaining 'what a very pale shadow of a real annual report it is' suggesting 'it behoves the club to pause, think afresh, and direct itself to a dignified and comprehensive report on its annual activities'. - 25 South African cricket statistical surveys 1960s/1970s. A collection of eight facsimile copies of handwritten statistical surveys compiled by Denys Heesom covering cricket in South Africa for seasons 1969/70-1975/76 and 1977/78. Also a similar survey, 'South African First-Class Matches', dated October 1971. The majority stored in plain buff folders and in original envelopes sent to Irving Rosenwater with correspondence between Heesom and Rosenwater. G. £40/60

Official menu and toast list for 'The Twenty First Annual Dinner and Meeting of the members and friends of the Ilkley Tradesmen's Cricket Teams held at The Lister's Arms Hotel, Ilkley on Wednesday 18th September 1901'. Cover with details to front, menu, toast list and presentation details to inner pages with 'Captains of the teams from 1880 to 1901 cameo images to verso. Some wear, folds and soiling to covers, two adhesive marks to top of the rear cover. A rare early survivor £40/60

- 102 Alfred Mynn. Kent, Sussex & Suffolk 1834-1959. A collection of eight original letters addressed to Mynn and his wife at their home in Bearsted, Kent. Each letter is beautifully handwritten in copperplate style by their daughters, all aged from 10 to 14. The letters date from 1840 to 1843 and are written from their school at Bearsted Seminary regarding school vacations and their education. Sold with a copy of 'The Cricket Quarterly', Vol. 2 No. 3, July 1964, which features an article by Patrick Morrah on the subject of these letters. Also a selection of correspondence and ephemera relating to the Mynn family history. Good/ very good condition. £300/400
- Alfred Mynn, known as the 'Lion of Kent', was considered to be the greatest all-rounder of his day. At well over six feet tall and twenty stone in weight, he was a formidable round-arm bowler and hard hitting*

- batsman. He scored only one first-class century (125no), for the South v North in 1836. Playing with an injured ankle, he batted with a runner and, during his innings, his leg was so badly bruised he was sent back to London where doctors considered amputation. However he recovered and on his return to the game took to batting with a leg guard, thought to be the origin of batting pads. Mynn struggled financially as an amateur cricketer and was declared bankrupt in 1845 but his situation was eased when he was awarded a testimonial in 1847. He died aged 54 in 1861.
- His daughters' school was situated no more than twenty minutes away from the family home, so the letters were probably set as an exercise in handwriting by their teacher.*
- 103 Charles Lucas Townsend. Gloucestershire & England 1893-1922. Interesting two page handwritten letter from C.L. Townsend, writing from his home in Stockton-on-Tees to Jim Coldham and dated 7th March 1946. Replying to Coldham's 'very charming letter', Townsend is grateful for people's continued enthusiasm for the game 'in these terrible days'. He reports that his son, David, (Oxford University & England 1933-1935) 'is running the Durham County Cricket... with unabated success', has been invited to play in the Scarborough Festival, and has '2 fine sons. I am afraid I shall not see them play at Lord's & so keep up the family tradition as my father [Frank Townsend]... played with "W.G"'. Nicely signed 'C.L. Townsend'. - 104 Vyell Edward Walker. Middlesex 1859-1877. Single page handwritten letter in ink from Walker to an unknown correspondent. - Edward Walker was one of seven brothers, the 'Walkers of Southgate', who played for Middlesex. He captained Middlesex from 1864 to 1872.*

- The following seven lots comprise a collection of letters written to G. Neville Weston who is renowned as being probably the greatest historian and biographer of W.G. Grace, in particular his attention to the detail of minor matches in which Grace played throughout his career. In the forward to Weston's book 'W.G. Grace The Great Cricketer' published in 1973, Irving Rosenwater quotes A.A. Thompson saying Weston 'knows more about W.G. than any man alive', to which Rosenwater adds, 'or dead'.*
- 106 Henry Ling. Cricket writer. Two handwritten letters to Neville Weston from Ling at his home in Croydon. In one, a two page letter dated 19th July 1936, Ling is enquiring whether Weston has heard from 'Dr. [T.R.] Hunter. What a disappointment he has been'. Hunter was a founder member of the Cricketana Society and Ling refers to correspondence with Hunter in which 'I told him that I thought the members got tired of waiting for the [Society] Journal and instalments of the Bibliography, and that it would have been better if the Bibliography had been undertaken by two or three members who could give the time to it and the editorship of the Journal taken on by someone other than the Secretary'. Ling also states he had offered to pay off debts incurred by the Society, and that 'I sent him the D. E. & F. lists of books corrected and added to' but was perturbed not to have received them back. He closes with comments on recent books he has purchased, and articles in 'The Cricketer' by 'Richard Binns' and 'Mr. Goldman'. In the other, earlier, single page letter from Ling, dated 11th September 1934, Ling thanks Weston for obtaining 'a copy of the letter relating to the frontispiece of Nyren'. Both letters nicely signed 'Henry Ling'. Very good condition. £30/50
- George Neville Weston and Dr. T.R. Hunter were both members of the Cricketana Society when it was founded in 1929 by C.J. Britton, Weston originally holding the post of Secretary and Treasurer. Hunter compiled the 'Catalogue of Cricket Literature [A to C.B. Fry]' published by the Society c.1934. Ling was a contributor to 'The Cricketer's Manual by "Bat" (Charles Box). A Short Bibliography' originally published by Weston in 1936.*
- 107 Arthur Langford. Assistant Editor, 'The Cricketer' Magazine. Four original wartime letters/ notes on official letterhead from Langford to Neville Weston. All four letters appear to date from May 1943 (two dated), and all relate to enquiries made by Weston regarding the availability of back issues of 'The Cricketer', binding cases and title pages, as Weston appears to be arranging to have his collection bound. In one letter Langford also invites Weston for his opinion on the content of a recent issue of the magazine. All four letters signed in ink by Langford. VG. £30/50
- Arthur Langford was a journalist who started writing for 'The Cricketer' in 1924. Appointed as assistant to the Editor, Sir Pelham Warner, he effectively ran the magazine from his home in Surrey while juggling work with the BBC. He was given the official title of Editor in 1964 and remained in the role until 1966.*
- 108 Gerald Harvey Humphries. Worcestershire 1932-34 (two matches). Four handwritten letters from Humphries to Neville Weston. The first is a miniature facsimile copy of a letter dated 17th April 1944, written while on active duty in Burma, in which Humphries recalls borrowing

a book from Weston's library. An original two page follow-up letter dated 28th October 1944, complete with original envelope annotated 'On Active Service' and with official 'R.A.F. Censor' stamp, contains good cricket content. Humphries recollects scoring '0 not out; certainly my first innings in Div 1 B'ham League was G.H. Humphries b. Sedgwick 0. It took just two balls'. He continues by claiming 'I always think [E.H.D.?] Sewell writes a lot of ridiculous stuff about cricket. His Worcestershire team is good but not in my opinion fair to such stalwarts [as] Fred Root (who must be in), M.K. Foster who is a certainty. Dick Pearson who did the "double" several times and both J.F. MacLean and Buller are superior choices to Abell as wicket-keeper... I don't think one could leave Nawab of Pataudi out though I don't care for his qualifications, while Gilbert Ashton must be one of our best'. Both letters signed 'Gerald'. Two later letters dated 12th March and 2nd April 1955 relate to a recent dinner both attended, and Humphries asks for the loan of books on R.E.S. Wyatt for a speech he is due to give at Moseley C.C. Both signed 'Gerald Humphries'. Very good condition.

- 109 Charles Pratt Green, cricket collector and wine merchant. Three wartime letters handwritten in ink to George Neville Weston from Pratt Green writing in his typical sloping style from his Malvern home. In a four page letter dated 2nd January 1942 Pratt Green refers to posting 'the Kortwright Cane and the return of the delightful Cardus book', reports on the receipt of an 'avalanche' of books at Christmas and recounts at length an anecdote about a west country match, 'Who is the best bowler you ever had? "Arnold" was the reply... his first few overs were the most difficult bowling of his day'. In a two page note dated 12th January 1942, Pratt Green thanks Weston for the loan of books, and how he has enjoyed essays on 'Famous Victorians'. The final two page letter, dated 18th December[?] 1942, relates in part to an article on 'Lord Fred'k Beauclerk'

which Pratt Green wishes to share with Weston. He continues with the news that 'Hutton has to undergo a bone-grafting operation. Maurice Leyland... [said] that it was very doubtful if Hutton would play cricket again. That would be a tragedy'. He closes with a report on his own failing eyesight. G/VG. £30/50

*Charles Pratt Green (1852-1950) lived for many years in Beresford House in Great Malvern where he traded as a wine merchant. During his life he amassed a large collection of cricket books, and over 150 bats, which he sold to Sir Julien Cahn when he moved from Beresford House.*

- 110 Dr. T.R. Hunter. Founder member of the Cricketana Society. Two two page typed letters from Hunter to George Neville Weston. One dated 20th July 1933 relates to Hunter having written to Plum Warner to ask if Warner would be willing to continue to act as President of the Cricketana Society, but had received no reply. A further letter to 'Mr [Arthur] Langford' resulted in a reply that confirmed the date and location for a meeting regarding the work of the society. He also refers to 'a nice letter... from Mr Charles Pratt Green of Malvern. He seems to be a dear old fellow and been an enthusiastic collector.' He updates Weston on the progress of the bibliography he is compiling, sending 'the second instalment of the catalogue of books under letter B. I am getting on well with letter C'. Signed in ink 'T.R. Hunter'. In the second letter, dated 7th April 1934, Hunter encloses a booklet by E.L. Roberts, thanks Weston for 'the copies of the Bristol papers containing the life of W.G. Grace', and provides an update on the bibliography, stating it has 'been a bit of a toil' and bemoans members who 'don't refrain from criticising, yet take care they don't contribute anything'. He closes with a comment about Douglas Jardine having 'no intention or desire to play against the Australians in 1934... I personally think it would have been a sad mistake in the interests of friendly sport if he had captained England'. The letter is unsigned. VG. £30/50

- 111 Dr. T.R. Hunter. Founder member of the Cricketana Society. Interesting three page typed letter from Hunter

to George Neville Weston dated 19th June 1934. Hunter opens with an apology for his late reply, and acknowledges receipt of a catalogue of pictures exhibited at the Tate Gallery, and a magazine on cigarette cards. He then reports that the second issue of the Society Journal is being posted out and how interesting he found Weston's article on Lillywhite's guides. Commenting on Society members, 'The only one I rather fear is old friend Britton [Charles Britton, founder of the Cricketana Society]' describing him as 'cranky' due to ill health, and that he had recently received 'a rather nasty letter from him... over "nothing"' and goes to some length to defend his own position. He closes with a comment on the 'disgust for the attitude of Larwood towards Test cricket... I think Larwood is cute in creating "sensations"... To me, Jardine and Larwood- good as they may be as players, apparently forget the good manners which is looked for in gentlemen'. Nicely signed in ink 'T.R. Hunter'. VG. £30/50

- 112 C.J. Britton, cricket writer and collector. Two two page handwritten letters from Britton to George Neville Weston, one dated 20th September, the other 2nd October 1933. The subject matter of both letters mainly concerns the loan of books to and from each other, however in the second letter Britton also discusses the issue of short length bowling in the context of 'Bodyline', 'I still think that a short bumper of any direction & of any pace is a long hop & batsmen must cope with it as they had to cope with overarm bowling & later, the googlie. The M.C.C. appear to have mishandled the whole affair now, for how could they support Jardine and Bodyline if all the County Captains were not supporting them???... It must be remembered, however, that all the County Captains are batsmen'. He closes with memories of Frank Foster (Warwickshire & England) who had fallen foul of the law and into bankruptcy. A rare early signature of Ward, a right handed batsman and occasional lob-bowler who played 130 first class matches and was considered for many years one of the leading batsman in England. *William Ward was born in 1787 and educated at Winchester where he first played cricket. His first recorded match was in 1810 when he played for England against Surrey at Lord's. His greatest achievement was when playing for M.C.C. v Norfolk at Lord's in 1820 he scored 279, a record that remained unbroken until W.G. Grace made 344 in 1876. He made eighteen appearances for the Gentlemen v Players between 1819-1838. In 1825 he bought from Thomas Lord, the lease of Lord's cricket ground for five thousand pounds, when Lord was considering selling the ground for building. In 1836 J.H. Dark purchased the remainder of the lease from Ward. Ward was M.P. for the City of London between 1826-1831. He died in 1849*
- 119 Francis 'Frank' Marchant. Eton, Cambridge University & Kent C.C.C. 1883-1905. Very large album containing various photographs, scorecards and ephemera covering the cricketing career of former Kent Captain, Frank Marchant with comprehensive coverage. The album begins with his school cricket at Eton with original photographs of the Eton XI of 1882/1883 and individual photographs of ten of the teams players including Studd, Lucas, Pemberton etc. There are printed match reports and scorecards mainly dated 1882 and 1883 with an original scorecard for Eton v Winchester 1883. ## CRICKET BATS, BALLS & EQUIPMENT

*'The Evolution of the Cricket Bat'.*

- 404 A mid eighteenth century circa 1740-1750 cricket bat of light wood, possibly willow, with right-handed curve and distinctive hook-shape to base, no shoulders, made by William Pett of Sevenoaks with two impressed marks 'W. Pett 4' on top of handle and 'Will. Pett Sevenoaks Kent' on the base of the bat. The overall length of the bat is 38.25", the width at the centre of blade is just over 4" and the maximum width of the base of the bat is 2.5" and weighs almost 2lb. The curved shape of this bat and the type of maker's mark are consistent with it being made in the mid-18th century. There are some heavy indentations to the bat face, the result of its being used for a hammering action of some sort, quite possibly the putting in of stumps otherwise it is in remarkably fine condition with the twine grip still preserved on the long handle. It makes an interesting comparison with the 18th century oak bat made by Thomas Edmonds, formerly in the MCC collection, and included as lot 665 in Christie's MCC Bicentenary Auction of 1987. This was more than double the weight at 5lb. However, it had the maker's name stamped on the base in similar fashion and was essentially the same shape, exactly the same length and with the same form of surviving twine grip. Immense weight is not a necessary characteristic of surviving 18th century bats. The oldest known bat, inscribed "J. C. 1729" and kept at the Oval, weighs only 2.4lb (see Wisden Book of Cricket Memorabilia p. 229). Hugh Barty-King in *Quilt Winders and Pod Shavers* 1979 (p46) refers to another surviving bat made by Pett himself weighing 2.2lb. A very rare and early cricket bat previously sold by Christie's Auctioneers as lot 133 in their sale of 1998. Sold with the late vendors research notes giving further information on the bat

*William Pett (1710-86) is the earliest recorded cricket bat maker in Kent. His bats, very different from modern ones, were designed to look more like hockey sticks. John*

Frederick Sackville, 3rd Duke of Dorset, purchased eleven of his bats in 1766 at two shillings and sixpence each. One of Pett's bats, made in 1745, is now in the local Sevenoaks Museum. William Pett is one of the few recorded makers of bats prior to the 19th century. G.D. Martineau in 'Bat, Ball, Wicket and All' (1950) records the names of two London bat makers, Christopher Thorn and George Wheeler. Then adds: 'The names of the other bat-makers of the 18th century which we know are Wm. Pett and his son Thomas, both of Sevenoaks, John Small, senior, of Petersfield, William Staples of Sevenoaks, and Charles Budd of Brighton....'. There is much more detailed discussion of Pett, who died in 1786, in Barty-King's Quilt Winders and Pod Shavers, pp. 44-47. It is noted therein that 'By the 1770's William Pett must have been making cricket bats on a reasonably large scale, for they seem to have been readily available for purchase in retail shops in London and probably elsewhere'. Evidence for their popularity comes from Fanny Burney's (an English satirical novelist, diarist and playwright) diary where she quotes a letter from a friend in the west country, Mrs Rishton, asking her "'to buy Mr. Rishton two cricket bats made by Pett of 7 Oaks. You will get them at any of the great toy shops, the maker's name always stamp'd upon them'.

*Provenance (given by Christie's in 1998): This bat and the preceding lot (another bat) were sold by Christie's in 1998 were removed from Hollin Hall, Near Ripon, North Yorkshire, following the death of the last direct descendant of the Boynton Wood family. The bats, together with other artefacts dating from the 18th century, were found earlier this year behind a very large George III mahogany breakfront bookcase; as opposed to being deliberately put there, they must have fallen down from the top of the bookcase which was installed during refurbishments to the house in the later part of the century; the side panels to the bookcase meant there was no way of recovering the bats unless the enormously heavy bookcase was itself moved. The bats may have belonged either to John*

*Wood of Copmanthorpe and Hollin Hall (died 15 November 1778) who assumed the name of Boynton, and is the person who commissioned the bookcase while aggrandising the family mansion; or to his younger brother Richard Wood (1712-97) who succeeded him as heir to the Hall. Richard Wood married Elisabeth, daughter of Hutton Perkins of Mill Hill, Middlesex, in 1745, and the couple had 3 sons (and 2 daughters) who would also have been old enough to play cricket before the century ended. However, the existence of the bats, lying in the darkness between the back of the bookcase and the wall behind, must have been forgotten for well over a hundred, perhaps even closer to two hundred years.*

405 'Tom Walker's Skyscraper'. A late 18th Century cricket bat purportedly used by Tom Walker to make 95 not out for the White Conduit Club v Kent at Canterbury in 1786. The bat, with fading ink inscription to the top of the blade 'Walker/Innings 95/86', was made by William Yalden (1740-1824), a friend of Walker's, who played for Hampshire and Surrey. Impressed marks 'Wm. Yalden' on the top of the bat handle, some loss to the edges of the impressed marks, unspliced, narrow shoulders with angled edges flaring to a thick, slightly convex toe. The back of the bat is humped, not bevelled. The bat is 36.25" long. There is, what appears to be, an old museum label to the blade which reads 'Period 1780-1835. Unspliced' in ink. Small loss to the bottom of the face of the bat and smaller amount to the back of the bat otherwise in good condition. The bat was previously The bat was previously in the M.C.C. Collection and was sold as lot 677 in the M.C.C. Bicentenary auction of April 1987 which was conducted by Christie's Auctioneers. A very early and rare bat used by a paid professional batsman of the day. Sold with the late vendors research notes giving further information on the bat £10000/15000

*Thomas Walker (1762-1831) was one of leading batsmen of 18th century cricket. He played as a professional for Surrey (1787-93) and Surrey (1788-1910)*

*whilst appearing occasionally for Hambledon and various 'All England' teams. The bat was purportedly used by Walker to score 95no and 102 for the White White Conduit Club (+ six given men) v Kent at Canterbury in August 1786. Walker was paid by the London club to appear as one of the 'given men' in a match for which much money was wagered. Such high scoring was extremely rare at this time, and it is likely that, after the match, the White Conduit Club bought the bat from Walker as a memento of his performance for them. During the following year, 1787, members of the White Conduit Club formed the Marylebone Cricket Club, so would have taken this bat to display in the pavilion at the first Lord's Ground. It must have been displayed at each of the three Lord's Grounds as the club moved its headquarters. Having eventually reached the St. John's Wood Ground, it survived the fire of 1825 which destroyed most of the artefacts contained there. Although there are older bats in existence, this bat is the oldest known bat to be used in one of the 'grand' matches by a leading batsman of the day.*

*The late vendor of the bat attended the sale held by Christie's on behalf of the M.C.C. and viewed the bat prior to the sale. What he noticed was that the Tom Walker Skyscraper bat had been misnumbered by Christie's auctioneers and instead of being the catalogued lot 677 it had been numbered Lot 667 and vice versa with the bat being sold as lot 667 'An elegant later 19th century straight faced bat with square shoulders'. He bought the lot for £160 and the other incorrectly numbered bat appertaining to be Walker's bat sold for £1000. Some days later, the vendor received a call from Christie's, admitting their mistake and asking if he would sell the bat back for £1000, the vendor refused*

406 'A home made cricket bat of the 1780's. An early carved home made bat from the period. The bat carved from one piece of wood with the blade widening from 2.75" where it meets the handle to 3.5" at its toe. The ridge has been shaved off at the top and the bottom of the blade

to make it conform, loosely, with bats of more up to date designs. The blade is not spliced and only slightly shouldered. The handle is longer than professionally made bats of the period. The bat is topped by a button cap and is not sprung. Straight bat were made around this time rather than the curved bats and the scraping style of play which was consigned to the past. Bat were therefore made straight in the 'pod' or blade. By this time shops in London were selling cricket bats on a reasonably large scale but they were too expensive for everyone to buy. Local cricketer still readily fashioned their own bats. Good condition. Sold with the late vendors research notes giving further information on the bat £200/300

- 407 An early presentation cricket bat. An mid to late 19th Century cricket bat from 1874 made by William Page of Dulwich. The bat is slim and slightly humped. The bat is topped by a button cap and is not sprung. There is a silver metal shield to the back of the bat which reads 'Lausanne Cricket Club. Presented to Jno. S. Walker Esq, for highest average-26. Season 1874. An early and rare bat. Good condition. Sold with the late vendors research notes giving further information on the bat £70/100

*By 1874, William Page had left the partnership with his brother Edward and become the proprietor of Tufnell Park Cricket Grounds in Upper Holloway. He was patronised by the Prince of Wales and by Middlesex Cricket Club. He died two years later in 1876. It seems possible that Jno. Walker may have been connected with the famous Walker family who were so deeply involved in Middlesex cricket in the early days*

- 408 Kingsmill James Key. Surrey & Oxford University 1892-1904. 'Record Partnership Bat 1887'. A Gradidge 'Imperial Driver' cricket bat used by Key when scoring 281 runs in a record stand with Hylton Philipson of 340 runs for the seventh wicket for Oxford University in their first innings against Middlesex at Chiswick on 23rd-25th June 1887. This was the highest first class score recorded. The bat signed to the

shoulder of the bat K.J. Key. The bat came from the family by descent and the bat and a ball from the match were sold in one lot at auction and described as being used in the match. The ball was banded and engraved as having been used in this match. Sold with the late vendors research notes giving further information on the bat £300/400

*Middlesex entertained Oxford at Chiswick Park in June 1887 and at lunch on the first day, Oxford were 86-5. At 104 for 6 Hylton joined Key and they added 340 runs together and the University finished their innings on 555 all out. Middlesex were bowled in cheaply and followed on with the eventual result being Oxford won by an innings and 229 runs.*

*Kingsmill Key was identified as a fine all-round cricketer whilst at Clifton College, moving onto Oxford in 1883 where he obtained his blue. He played his first match for Surrey at the age of 17. Key was a middle order batsman and slow off break bowler who played for Surrey from 1882-1904, he captained the side from 1894 to 1899 with considerable success, winning the County Championship in that six year period on three occasions (1894, 1895 & 1899, finishing 2nd once and 4th in the other two seasons. He is quoted as a 'A man of most original views, an always philosophic cricketer and an imperturbable captain'. His highest score was 281 for Oxford University v Middlesex in 1887. He went on Sanders tour of North America in 1886, Hawke's tour of North America in 1891 and Oxford University Authentics tour of India 1902/03. A noted rugby player, he gained his blue at Oxford. He died in August 1932, at the age of 67, from poisoning after an insect bite*

- 409 John Thomas Brown. Yorkshire & England 1889-1904. 'A.E. Stoddart's tour of Australia 1894/1895'. 'Pilling & Briggs of Manchester 'Lancashire Spring Handle' cricket bat presented to Jack Brown for making the highest score in the tour match between eighteen of Ballarat and Stoddart's team, the match played at Ballarat 5th-7th January 1895. Brown made 64 in the first innings and the match was drawn. The bat with silver metal

shield to splice on the back of the bat is inscribed 'Cricket. England v Ballarat. Presented to J.T. Brown. The highest scorer in the match by J.A. Chalk. 7-1-95'. The bat, which presumably was subsequently used by Brown, is aged, browned and darkened, lacking the rubber bat handle but still retains the majority of the threading to handle. Sold with a further 'Royden. Flexible Handle' branded cricket bat used by Brown during his career. The bat has a metal aluminium strip to the back with his name 'J.T. Brown' impressed to the metal. The bat has a vertical split to the blade, is darkened and aged, it retains mode of the rubber bat handle which is worn and faded. A historic pair of bats used by Brown, Yorkshire's first great opening batsman. The two bats were purchased from the Brown family some years ago. Good condition £500/800

*John Thomas Brown, born in Drifffield, East Yorkshire in 1869, was a member of the Stoddart's tour touring party to Australia 1894/95. He played in all games on the tour and in the 2nd innings of the fifth Test at Melbourne scored 140, his only Test century, including the fastest ever fifty scored in Test cricket, 28 minutes, and still remains the record to this day. Brown scored almost 18,000 first class runs at an average of 30.52 with a top score of 311 v Sussex in 1897. He died in 1904 at the age of 35*

- 410 A 'Lancashire Witch'. An innovative shoulderless cricket bat. The bat was made by Frank Sugg of Liverpool around 1896 and impressed to the front of the blade under the splice. Because the blade has no shoulders, the width of its face flares gradually from on 5.2" at its top to 9.4" at its toe. The back of the blade rises steadily to a high ridge and slopes quickly down to the toe is topped by a button cap and is not sprung. The handle is made from 12 canes and was patented by Sugg in 1896. The bat was bought by the late vendor at auction in Australia. The 'Lancashire Witch' was designed to follow a market trend for lighter bats. The bat retailed at 17/6p each. An early and innovative bat. Good condition. Sold with the late vendors research

- notes giving further information on the bat £150/250
- 411 Bernard James Tindal Bosanquet. Oxford University, Middlesex & England 1898-1919. Stuart Surridge 'Rapid Driver. Extra Special' cricket bat believed to have been used by Bosanquet on the M.C.C. tour of Australia in 1903/04. The bat originally belonged to and was used by George Drummond who was an emergency call up on the tour and played in two tour matches in 1904 and was then given to Bosanquet to use. The bat is signed to the shoulder of the bat by Drummond and Bosanquet has scratched his name below the signature of Drummond. Some wear to the bat with protective tape twice applied to the blade of the bat, loosening to the stringing on bat handle otherwise in good condition. The bat was sold by the Bosanquet family through Bonhams auctioneers in February 2010 as lot 27 and had been in the family for the best part of 100 years. Sold with a photocopy of a newspaper cutting detailing the bats sale in 2010 £500/800
- Bosanquet is best known for perfecting the 'googly' delivery (sometimes called the Bosie), an off break delivered with a leg break action. He played seven Test matches for England 1903-1905 and his 6-51 in the second innings of the Ashes in 1903/4 put England 3-1 up to win. He was named as Wisden Cricketer of the Year in 1904, and was a successful batsman, leading the first-class averages in 1908 including his best score of 214.*
- 412 Arthur Frederick Augustus 'Dick' Lilley. Warwickshire & England 1888-1911. 'Dick Lilley's Record Bat'. A Gradidge of Woolwich 'Imperial Driver' cricket bat used by Lilley in the 1907 season playing county and Test cricket. The bat is inscribed to the shoulder of the bat 'To my dearest friend,, F. Taylor, A.A. Lilley Sept 8/07 and indistinctly signed to the other shoulder by Lilley. This bat was, almost certainly used by Lilley during the 1907 Test series against South Africa and for his highest first class score of 171 v Worcestershire at Worcestershire in that season. It could be expected that Lilley gave this bat to his friend, following the 1907 season as he knew his season was over having refused the terms offered to tour Australia during the coming winter. Good condition £500/800
- Dick Lilley was the outstanding English wicket-keeper for the first ten years of the decade and played for England in 35 Test matches for England from 1896 to 1909*
- 413 Frederick Charles Holland. Surrey 1894-1908. Stuart Surridge 'Extra Special' cricket bat. The bat marked to the front by the maker 'For the express use of Fred Holland, Oundle'. After Holland retired from Surrey in 1909 he became the cricket coach at Oundle School. Binding to blade, good condition £60/90
- 414 'A fine example of a Gradidge Imperial Driver' 1912'. The back of the blade of the bat slowly rises until suddenly arching to its highest point creating an effect of humping before it then fall sharply to the toe. The handle formed from one cane is split four weighs and in each section is inserted cork and rubber. This bat was presented in 1912 and there is a silver metal shield to the back of the bat which reads 'Tendering Hundred Cricket League. Presented to R. Scott for best bowling analysis in League. Season 1912' Good condition. Sold with the late vendors research notes giving further information on the bat. A handsome Gradidge bat £60/90
- This bat was sold from the retail showroom of John Wisden & Co, stamp twice impressed to front of blade. Gradidge applied for the patent on the handle in 1896 and it was indicated that the handle's composition was a secret worth protecting*
- 415 John Berry 'Jack' Hobbs. Surrey & England 1905-1934. William Gunn 'Autograph' match used cricket bat circa 1920's signed by Jack Hobbs to the ownership position on the shoulder of the back of the back possibly indicating it may have been used by Hobbs. Binding to blade and wear to the rubber handle otherwise in good condition £70/100
- 416 George Geary. Leicestershire & England 1912-1938. 'What a Bat'. A Gunn & Moore 'Autograph' cricket bat used by Geary during his playing career, the vendor suggests around 1925 in his notes. The bat was presented to William Sherwin, bat maker of Nottingham, son of the former England wicket keeper Mordecai Sherwin. It is inscribed boldly to the length of the blade 'Dear Mr Sherwin. What a bat. No-one could wish for better one. In fact, one could not find a more perfect one. Can you do anything with it. Yours faithfully G. Geary'. Geary has also signed the shoulder of the bat. Sold with the late vendors research notes giving further information on the bat. Good original condition £300/500
- George Geary was one of Leicestershire's most dependable and long serving players. He was a big, strong, fast bowler who thrived on long spells. He was a sound, resolute lower order batsman who scored eight centuries in a long first class career. He played in fourteen Test matches for England*
- 417 William Walter Keeton. Nottinghamshire & England 1926-1952. A Gunn & Moore 'Autograph' bat used by Keeton in scoring 1162 runs in August 1933. The face of the bat is inscribed '1162 in August 1933' and below is a label which details the innings played with the bat in August 1933. The original writing has faded a little and has been overwritten at a later date. The bat rubber has begun to perish and the blade is cracked to the back otherwise in good original condition. Sold with the late vendors research notes giving further information on the bat. £200/300
- Keeton scored more than 1000 runs in August 1933, with six centuries in the month, including four in five innings. The centuries were 129 v Surrey, 110 v Hampshire, 168 v Middlesex, 110 v Yorkshire, 138no v Lancashire and 100 v Kent*
- Walter Keeton played in two Tests for England in 1934 and 1939. He was a Wisden Cricketer of the Year in 1940 and played first-class cricket as a right-handed opening batsman between 1926 and 1952 for Nottinghamshire. Keeton scored a century against every other first-class county and his 312 not out made in just under eight hours against Middlesex*

- at the Oval in 1939 is still a record for the Nottinghamshire team. He also played professional association football for Nottingham Forest and Sunderland.
- 418 "A Western Samoan Kirikiti bat". A Kirikiti bat used in the 1930's. The bat is one piece and blade is three sided with the two flat striking faces being 2" wide flaring to 3" at the toe. Kirikiti is the Samoan version of cricket and is popular with the islanders. The rules of Kirikiti or Kilikiti are flexible. Indeed, the majority of reports written on the game simply say that the rules can only be known by those playing. The game is the national sport of Samoa and is played in many other Pacific countries. Good condition. Sold with the late vendors research notes giving further information on the bat £200/300
- 419 'Tom Barling Six Centuries bat'. Gunn & Moore 'Autograph' bat used by Barling in the 1946 and 1947 seasons playing for Surrey. Inscribed to the bat face in ink 'During the seasons 1946 and 1947 I scored over 2000 runs with this bat including 233 not out v Notts, 172 v Oxford University, 164 v Northamptonshire, 129 v Middlesex, 129 v Warwickshire and 148 not out v Combined Services. Signed below the inscription Tom H. Barling (Surrey XI). Old tape to centre of bat, some darkening to wood otherwise in good condition. The bat was bought by the late vendor from Knights Auctioneers in 2018. Good condition. Sold with the late vendors research notes giving further information on the bat £250/350
- Geoffrey Boycott (Yorkshire & England 1962-1986) was one of England's most successful opening batsmen, appearing in over six hundred first-class matches in his playing career, including 108 Test matches for England, scoring 48,426 runs including 151 centuries at an average of 56.83. Of his twenty two Test centuries his highest score was 246 no made against India at Headingley in 1967. He captained England in four Test matches on the 1977/78 tour to Pakistan and New Zealand.*
- 420 Geoff Boycott. Yorkshire & England 1962-1986. A Slazenger cricket bat, pads and batting gloves all made to his specification and used by Boycott in his illustrious cricket career playing for Yorkshire and England. The equipment is sold with a letter of provenance from Boycott detailing the specifications for him on each item. The Slazenger V12 bat, weighing 2lb 8oz, eight grains to blade with special protective sheet to the blade and the handle shaped for his bottom hand as specified by Boycott, signed by Boycott to the shoulder, the Slazenger buckskin pads with special protective padding and short cut of design above the knee roll, signed to the back of each pad by Boycott and the batting gloves with padding covering finger ends, extra protection for the second finger and extra padding on the palm of the right glove, each again signed by Boycott. The letter of provenance reads 'This is to confirm that the following personal items of cricket equipment, presented to Jonathan Pinfield on the 1st November 1988 were made to my specification and used during my career. The letter signed by Boycott and dated 8th November 1988. Some minor wear to the bat handle rubber, some darkening to the surface of the pads otherwise in good condition £1500/2500
- 421 Arthur Mitchell. Yorkshire & England 1922-1945. Mounted cricket stump used in the fifth and final Test match, England v South Africa, played at The Oval in August 1935. The stump was obtained by Mitchell after the match. The stump is mounted into a wooden block and has a silver metal shield to the stump with 'England v South Africa 1935. Presented to D.O. Smith by A. Mitchell'. There is a silver metal plaque to the base of the stump with details of the match and the players names/line ups from both sides. The stump was given to D.O. (Dennis) Smith by Alf Mitchell, son of Arthur Mitchell, in the 1980s/1990s. The mount and inscriptions were then added by Smith, who subsequently sold it to the present vendor. Good/very good condition. £150/250
- Arthur Mitchell played for Yorkshire from 1922 to 1945, he scored over 19,000 first class runs with an average of 37.47 including 44 centuries. He played six Test matches for England between 1933 and 1936. In the final Test at The Oval against South Africa in 1935, he made 40 opening the batting in England's only innings. The match was drawn. South Africa won the series 1, 0 with four matches drawn. Their victory at Lord's was their first in a Test match in England, and with the remaining matches drawn, it also ensured that they would, for the first time, win a series in England*
- 422 England v Rest of the World 1970. Gray Nicolls 'Colin Milburn Autograph' cricket bat signed to the face by the England and Rest of the World teams of 1970 and to the back by four counties Northamptonshire, Derbyshire, Warwickshire and the Yorkshire teams of 1970. Fading to some the Rest of the World team signatures to the front and to some of the Northamptonshire signatures to the back otherwise in good condition £40/60
- 423 South African tour of England 1935. John Wisden 'Union Driver' cricket bat signed to face by eleven of the South African tourists. Signatures include Wade (Cpt), Cameron, Mitchell, Nourse, Bell, Williams, Balaskas, Tomlinson etc. Some slight spidering to the ink signatures otherwise in good condition £70/100
- 424 England v Australia, Headingley 1953. Stuart Surrige 'Herbert Sutcliffe Autograph' size 6 cricket bat signed to the back of the bat by both teams plus Don Bradman and other England players. Thirty one signatures in total including Hassett, Miller, Harvey, Ring, Benaud, Hutton, Bedser, Compton, Wyatt, Leyland, Watson, Lock etc. Some fading to signatures otherwise in good condition £60/90
- 425 England v Australia, Lord's 1997. Gunn & Moore cricket bat signed to the face by the England team who played Australia at Lord's in June 1997. Twelve signatures including Atherton (Cpt), Hussain, Gough, Thorpe, Crawley, Caddick, Malcolm etc. Very good condition £50/80

- 426 'Lord Taverners 1985'. Full size cricket bat, presented in framed wooden display case, signed by the England (12 signatures) and Australian (16) teams who played in the Lord's Test match of 1985. In addition to these signatures there are also thirty three signatures of former cricketers, guests, celebrities and English Prime Ministers. Signatures include Edward Heath, James Callaghan, Harold Wilson, John Mills, Cliff Morgan, Peter Alliss, Leslie Crowther, Henry Cooper, Compton, Edrich, Hutton, Cowdrey, May, Close, Laker, Snow etc. Some fading to certain signatures, in particular to seven of the Australian signatures otherwise in good condition £50/80
- 427 Australia 2001. Gray Nicholls full size cricket bat signed to face by sixteen members of the Australian touring team to England 2001. Signatures include S.Waugh, Warne, Gilchrist, McGrath, M.Waugh, Ponting, Langer etc. Warne's signature incomplete. Mounted in bat case. G £60/90
- 428 England Test cricketers. Duncan Fearnley 'Supreme' cricket bat signed to the face of the bat by over sixty, mainly post war, Test players in two vertical rows. Signatures include F.R. Brown, May, Bowes, Paynter, Akin, Washbrook, Wardle, Hardstaff, Laker, Cowdrey, Voce, W.Edrich, Compton, Close, Fishlock, C.J. Barnett, Shuttleworth, Dewes, Bedser, Dexter, Tyson etc. Further signatures to the back of the bat but these are mainly faded but include clear signatures of Australians Cosier, Walters, G. Chappell etc. The signatures to face are in good condition, spidering to the ink of the odd signature £60/90
- 429 'England Test Captains' 1947-1991. Full size unbranded bat with printed title to top with players' names to the face of twenty seven England Test captains for the period. Signature to the face of each captain beside the name. Two are signed to label laid down, of Sheppard and Greig, and one of Brown (possibly facsimile) to clear tape. Others all signed to the face include Cranston, Mann, May, Cowdrey, Dexter, Smith, Close, Graveney, Illingworth, Lewis, Denness, Brearley, Botham etc. Slight fading to the odd signature, otherwise in good/ very good condition. £40/60
- 430 Don Bradman. Australia tour to England 1938. Gunn & Moore 'The Autograph' Size 5 cricket bat with additional stamp to face for Lillywhites Ltd. The bat with dedication in ink written in Bradman's hand, 'To Alec Duthie[?] with best wishes from...', dated 22nd May 1938 and fully signed below by Bradman and all the other fifteen members of the Australian touring party, sixteen signatures in total of Bradman, McCabe, Hassett, Chipperfield, O'Reilly, Barnett, Ward, Brown, Badcock, Fingleton, White, Waite, McCormick, Walker, Barnett and Fleetwood-Smith. The date corresponds with the rest day of the drawn tour match, Surrey v Australians at the Kennington Oval, 21st- 24th May 1938, Bradman scoring 143 in the Australians' first innings. - 431 Kent C.C.C. Gillette Cup Winners 1967. Full size Slazenger 'Colin Cowdrey' autograph bat with handwritten title in ink to face 'Kent 1967. Gillette Cup Winners. Championship Runners-up' and signed by fifteen members of the Kent team. 441 W.G. Grace. An unusual and rarely seen life size bronze hand of Grace holding a cricket ball. The stump of the arm impressed with Grace's signature. The hand and arm measure approximately 11' long. The hand and ball, which was apparently produced to commemorate W.G. Grace's 41st Birthday, July 18th 1889, is beautifully and very skilfully sculptured showing the finger and thumb nails, the wrinkles around the finger joints and palm, the knuckles and veins in the back of the hand with a lovely patina to the bronze. Knights have previously sold a pair of early similar photographs, one showing the large bust of Grace made in 1888 by artist William Henry Tyler with annotation and the other showing the life size hand of Grace holding a cricket ball. ENGLAND 1888-1923**

- 536 John Thomas 'Jack' Hearne. Middlesex & England 1888-1923. 'A.E. Stoddart's Tour of Australia 1897/98'. The Tour Diaries of J.T. Hearne'. The diaries, written in pencil in a firm and reasonably clear hand, in two limp board exercise books, cover the majority of the tour but concludes on Wednesday 12th January, it is not known if Hearne wrote no more or whether there may have been a third album which is not known to the vendor, and are entertaining and cover the tour both on and off the field throwing additional light on a tour which was very much less successful for Stoddart and his team than the victorious visit in 1894/95. The diaries reveal Hearne to be a determined cricketer, an honest man with a great sense of humour and an observant eye who was not averse to the occasional modest 'indulgence' off the field. The diaries begin with the tour party, with the exception of Ranjitsinhji, who joined the ship in Naples, departing St Pancras station on the 17th September 1897 'Left St

Pancras. Special train, large crowd who gave us a capital send-off. Joined S.S. Ormuz at Tilbury'.... left Plymouth at 6pm Sunday'. the diary then covers the voyage, describing the weather, conditions, meals, sights 'Saw any quantity of whales, just off Cape St Vincent', playing cards and deck games, concerts, calling in at Gibraltar, Naples, Port Said, Colombo 'people fearfully disappointed at our not playing a match', crossing the equator, cricket practice 'All of us seem fit except Ranji who is still a little seedy. Jack Broad got rare crack on the nose with a ball, knocked him out for a moment... heated discussions to how many runs should be given for a hit overboard, arrival at Albany , first sight of Australia 'All boys delighted to set foot on shore again', on to Largs Bay, Adelaide on the 24th October 'Enormous crowds waiting for a glimpse of Ranji. All Ranji- nobody else thought of (absurb, I think with such men as Stoddy, Tom Richardson, Tom Hayward)'... Reception at Town Hall, Mayor toasted English team. Fine reception by 2,000 people... Went to the Oval to practice, lots of people there 'to see Ranji'. Very pretty ground and good stand accommodation' ... 'Bruised finger, George Hirst hit it'... commenced match v South Australia... 'Clem Hill played a fine innings of 200no'... 'Stoddart ordered to keep to his bed, MacLaren Captain'... 'lots of comment on [Ernie]Jones's delivery. Consider it the most outrageous thing'... 'Ranji 137 not out, Mason played well for 79' ... 'Ranji very weak after play, attack of asthma'... 'Jim Phillips no-balled Jones for chucking'. The team left for Melbourne on Monday, November 1st and the next day attended the Melbourne Cup at Flemington Racecourse and commenced tour match v Victoria on the 6th November 'Capital attendance 17,000. Stand and ground revealed a grand sight indeed from the field and beats anything I have ever seen at a cricket match'... 'I finished with five wickets for 61. The team arrived in Sydney on the 11th November for match against N.S.W. the next day 'Trumper made a great catch in the long field dismissing Hayward'... After winning again they played tour

matches in Newcastle, Glenn Innes and a joint team New South Wales & Queensland, drawing the first and third and winning the second leaving on the train to travel to Brisbane. England scored a record 636 in the match with MacLaren making 181, Druce 126 and Hirst 75, match drawn. The team then moved on to Toomwoomba and Armidale for three one day tour matches before the first Test to be held on the 13th December. Events leading up to the first Test did not augur well for the England team. Ranji had been ill, the captain Stoddart had news of his mothers death and it kept raining...!. 'Began first Test match, on most perfect wicket, MacLaren made 109 and Ranji 175 totalling 551, Australia all out 237, Hearne 5-42 'Feel very strong and well like bowling for a week'...Australia following on made 408, Hearne 4-99 leaving England to make 95 to win which they duly did by nine wickets. Train to Melbourne 20th December where the team took a well deserved rest, duck shooting and fishing at Metong and other places on a three day trip by launch... 'walked for two solid hours in scorching hot sun, loaded with cartridges and eaten alive by flies without getting a shot or even seeing anything in the way of game'... played tour match at Bendigo before the second Test began on the 1st January 'Started second Test match in cooler weather, Stoddart standing down... they put on 520, a winning score at any time... The crowd were every severe on us with their 'barracking' and one section showed itself very unsportsmanlike' .... this 'barracking' is awfully disconcerting to players'. England batted in reply and on a baked and cracked wicket following glorious hot weather on the Sunday (rest day) were dismissed for 283, following on and with the wicket almost unplayable they were all out for 144. The Australians winning by an innings and 55 runs. 'Am confident in saying that had we won the toss that the result would have been just the reverse'.. The team then travelled to Ballarat and Stawell for up-county tour matches, drawing both, the heat getting to the p[layers] "113 in the shade and we were playing on a ground with not a blade of grass upon it... Not

a breath of air could reach you and as ill luck would have it we were in the field'. Wednesday 12th January was the last entry in the two books kept by Hearne. The second book in not quite fully completed which suggests he wrote no more. If a mood of disillusionment is apparent in the final entries, it is not inappropriate. England were soundly beaten in the remaining three Tests and lost the series 4-1. Hearne did not tour again but played three more Tests against Australia in 1899, performing a hat-trick at Headingley, the last by an Englishmen in a Test against Australia in England. He last played for Middlesex in 1923, a highly respected 'senior pro'. Some wear and old tape to the spine of the books, front covers detaching, some browning to outer pages, some breaking to page blocks and pages becoming loose otherwise in good condition. An excellent insight into the life of a professional cricketer on tour, substandard accommodation and food, sharing double beds, trouble with mosquitoes for the professionals compared to the lodgings and food of the amateurs. A unique pair of diaries£2000/3000

*The thirteen man touring party consisted of Stoddart, MacLaren, Druce, Ranjitsinhji, Mason, Hayward, Richardson, Hearne, Wainwright, Hirst, Briggs, Storer and Board*

*Jack Hearne played for Middlesex from 1888 to 1923 and played twelve Test matches for England taking 49 wickets at an average of 22. He took 3061 first-class wickets and is the greatest for any bowler of medium pace or above, and his best seasons were in 1896 taking 257 wickets and in 1898 taking 222 wickets. He is the only bowler to take a hat-trick in an Ashes Test match played in England. Hearne achieved this honour by taking the wickets of a seriously illustrious Australian trio of Clem Hill, Syd Gregory and Monty Noble in the second innings of the first Test match played at Headingley v Australia in 1899, his last appearance in a Test match for England. He toured South Africa with W.W. Read's team in 1892 and was chosen to tour Australia in 1897/98. Wisden named him as*

a Cricketer of the Year in 1892. He died in April 1944 at the age of 76 years.

Hearne took 3061 wickets in his first class cricket career at an average of 17.75, the amount of wickets only bettered by Rhodes, Freeman and Parker in first class cricket

*Jack Hearne is the only bowler to take a hat-trick in an Ashes Test match played in England. Hearne achieved this honour by taking the wickets of a seriously illustrious Australian trio of Clem Hill, Syd Gregory and Monty Noble in the second innings of the first Test match played at Headingley v Australia in 1899, amazingly his last appearance in a Test match for England. In a low scoring match the Test match was drawn. Hearne finished his 2nd innings bowling spell with four wickets for 50 runs from 31.3 overs*

- 1216 Yorkshire 1875. Two early original scorecards with complete printed scores for matches played in 1875, both with complete printed scores. One is for Nottinghamshire v. - 1217 Yorkshire Colts 1876 & 1877. Two early original scorecards. Matches are 'Colts of Nottinghamshire versus Colts of Yorkshire', Trent Bridge, 5th & 6th June 1876. Incomplete printed scores. Yorkshire Colts (220) beat Nottinghamshire Colts (94 & 98) by an innings and 28 runs. Notable players included Henry Lockwood (brother of Ephraim) who played 16 matches for Yorkshire, and Nottinghamshire's William Shrewsbury, older brother of Arthur. Printed on the ground by George Richards of Nottingham. The other, titled '24 Colts of Yorkshire' is for the match G. Pinder's Yorkshire Colts v. E. Hornby, R.G. Barlow, A.P. Lucas, I.D. Walker, W.E. Midwinter etc. Richard Daft's XI were all members of the tour to America in 1879, comprising Oscroft, Lockwood, Ulyett, Selby, Daft, Barnes, Bates, Emmett, Shaw, Pinder and Morley. - 1236 'Oxford v. Cambridge' 1880-1882. Three early original scorecards for Varsity matches played at Lord's, 28th & 29th June 1880, 27th-29th June 1881, and 26th- 28th June 1882. The scorecard with the players listed for the start of play and incomplete scores for England's first innings in pencil. England batted first with W.G. and E.M. Grace opening the batting and putting on 91 for the first wicket before E.M. Grace was dismissed for 36. W.G. went on to score England's first Test century, making 152. Other contributions came from A.P. Lucas (55) and Lord Harris (52). In reply Australia were bowled out for 149 with Morley taking 5/56. Following on Australia then rallied with 327 including a century by their captain, W.L. Murdoch (153no). England then reached the target of 57 for the loss of five wickets despite both G.F. and E.M. Grace being dismissed for second ball ducks. Other players were W. Barnes, F. Penn, A.G. Steel, A. Lyttelton, A. Shaw for England, A.C. Bannerman, T.U. Groube, P.S. McDonnell, J. Slight, J.M. *The second tour of an Australian team to England was only confirmed after all the English domestic fixtures had already been arranged, with the tourists playing matches mainly in the north. The fixtures were rearranged to accommodate the first Test match to be played in England, which featured the three Grace brothers, W.G., E.M., and G.F. ('Fred'), and remains the only time three brothers have represented England in the same Test match. Fred Grace, who took what has been described as 'the most famous deep field catch in history', developed a cold during the match which escalated to pneumonia and he died just two weeks later aged only 29. The Australians were without their 'Demon Bowler', Fred Spofforth, who had injured his hand.*

- 1240 Yorkshire C.C.C. 1880 & 1881. Two early original scorecards for matches played at Bramall Lane, Sheffield, both with incomplete printed scores. Matches are Yorkshire v. Lascelles Hall 6th- 8th September 1880, and Yorkshire Colts v. Nottinghamshire Colts 6th & 7th June 1881. In the 1880 match Lascelles Hall (181 & 214) beat Yorkshire (117 & 202) by 76 runs. Ten of the Lascelles Hall team played first-class cricket for Yorkshire and three, Billy Bates, Andrew Greenwood and Allen Hill, went on to play Test cricket for England.
