'The Eleven of England' 1847. Original early silk commemorative handkerchief depicting the England eleven of 1847, after the watercolour by Felix. The handkerchief with blue border portrays Sewell, Lillywhite, Pilch, Dorrington, O.C. Pell, N. Felix, Clarke, Dean, W. Dennison, A. Mynn, Parr & Guy with names and title printed to the lower border of the cloth. 37"x30". Previously sold as lot 131 in the Christie's sale of 19th June 1998. 'The Australian Cricket Team' 1878. 2 Very rare and early large cotton handkerchief commemorating Australia's inaugural first-class tour to England. Lithographed in grey, the centre panel set in elaborate frame depicts the twelve members of the Australian touring party seated and standing, with names printed below. Players are W.L. Murdoch (Captain), T. Horan, F. Allan, G.H. Bailey, J. Conway, A. Bannerman, C. Bannerman, J. Blackham, F.R. Spofforth, D.W. Gregory, Midwinter, T.W. Garrett and H.F. Boyle. To each of the four corners is an oval cartouche panel of four of the players in batting or bowling pose featuring Spofforth, Blackham, Murdoch and C. Bannerman. The ornate title scroll below the centre panel comprises an Australian coat of arms, crossed bats and 'Registered Sept. 1878'. Measuring 23"x24", the handkerchief is fully laid down to mount card and in very good condition. A very rare and early item of cricketing history. £300/500

Following the Australian Aboriginals' tour of 1868, this was the first tour to England undertaken by an Australian team with first-class status. The team departed from Sydney on 29th March 1878 and voyaged via New Zealand and Honolulu, crossed America by train to New York and arrived at

Liverpool on 13th May. Although no Test matches were played, following a heavy innings defeat by an innings against Nottinghamshire, in their second tour match they defeated M.C.C. at Lord's, W.G. Grace being dismissed second ball in each innings for scores of 4 and 0.

'At Play, Cricket'. Rare and attractive American cricket handkerchief, c.1870/80s, with delightful scenes of boys playing cricket. Cotton handkerchief with large printed image to centre of two boys playing the game holding bats at the wicket. Further images of the game to right and left quarters of the handkerchief with captions, 'Well Caught', 'Fielding', 'The New Bat' and 'After Play'. The handkerchief predominately coloured in red and black with decorative border surround. To top border of surround is the makers name 'S.H. Greene & Sons. Washington'. 12.5"x12.5". The firm of S.H. Greene & Sons of Washington, U.S.A. was founded in Warwick, Rhode Island in 1865 and finally went into receivership in 1925.

The handkerchief with large central printed portrait in black of the team and Manager, with printed title to top and players' names below, surrounded by decorative borders in gold. Players featured are P.S. McDonnell (Captain), A.C. Bannerman, H. Trott, C.T.B. Turner, G.J. Bonnor, C.W. Beal (Manager), H.F. Boyle, J. McC. Blackham, J. Worrall, A.H. Jarvis, J.J. Lyons, J. Edwards, F.J. Ferris and S.P. Jones. 16.5" square. The handkerchief has some rust staining and foxing, with some small holes, otherwise appears in good condition. 'The Laws of the Game of Cricket c.1744'. Large silk handkerchief with printed image of Hayman's 'Cricket in Marylebone Fields' to centre. 'Jos. Ware. Cranford Kent to lower border. This handkerchief reproduced in the 1960's by Liberty, originally printed by Joseph Ware of Cranford, Kent, the handkerchief measures 28" x 27". Around the perimeter of this famous illustration are the oldest existing printed Laws of Cricket and date from 1744. The laws are written in cursive script and they describe a game quite different to modern cricket, overs consisted of four balls, there was no 'leg before wicket' rule and there was no restriction on the size of the bat. For Cambridge Henry Snow, Charles Taylor, Frederick Ponsonby and Arthur Farmer went on to play county cricket. 5.5"x8.75". Printed by Morgan of Portman Market. 'The Daisy Tour. Yorkshire Wanderers Dutch Tour' 1893. An unusual and intriguing first-hand account of the tour that took place over two weeks in August 1893, neatly handwritten in ink by tour member, Samuel R. Jackson. Bound in red cloth, title and 'With S.R.J.'s Compliments' in gilt to front cover. The first page lists the members of the tour, and the facing page features a typed summary of the tour and averages. The following pages comprise neatly written and humorous biographies of each player, titled 'Capabilities and Peculiarities of the Team', each of whom had been given a tour nickname such as 'Good Old Hatt', 'The Groom', 'The Ghost', 'The Commodore', 'Daisy' (Jackson) etc. The touring party included three who played first-class cricket for Yorkshire and one for England, Edmund 'Uncle Isaac' Peate (England nine Tests 1881-1886), 'Old Harry' Leadbeater (10 matches 1884-1890), and Robert 'Belshing Bob' Baker (3 matches 1874-1875). Edmund Peate is described as a 'Slow left hand bowler, good bat (left), generally walks out to shake hands with the bowler'. Of Hatt the Captain, he is described as a 'Good bat, fine fielder at point, and a good bowler (at home)'. The section closes with the comment, 'These jottings are written to amuse the members of the team, and not to offend and if any word or expression should touch a "tender spot" or tread on a sore corn, forget and forgive your fellow Cricketer "Daisy" simply remembering that "It's a nice place Holland". The closing pages comprise lyrics to 'a few songs of the tour [to] complete the book'. A delightful account of the tour with affectionate descriptions of the personnel. Bookplate of A.E. Winder to inside front cover and, slipped in, are six typed letters from Winder to the vendor, dated 1978-1987, relating to collecting including the John Arlott collection, each signed by Winder. Also three original scorecards for matches played by Everley Cottagers C.C. at Hackness, two for a match v Hackness, 22nd September 1906, the other v Mr. F. Allison's Team, 21st September 1907. The latter includes the signature in ink of Learie Constantine whose father played on the West Indians' tour to England in 1900. Very wide panoramic style oil painting on canvas by renowned artist Albert Chevallier Tayler, the painting finally completed in 1906 as a companion piece to the larger and famous painting of 'Kent v Lancashire at Canterbury 1906'. The portrait panel painting with central image and title, in banner, depicting portraits of Lord Harris and George Marsham, head and shoulders, within decorative cameo panels with title below. To the right and the left of this central image are portraits of the players who did not play in the Kent v Lancashire match, Kenneth Hutchings, 'Wally' Hardinge, Edward Dillon, Frank Woolley, Arthur Day, Alec Hearne, William Fairservice, John Hubble and Sammy Day plus former Kent Captains W.H. Patterson and Frank Marchant both portrayed in similar decorative cameo panels. The four portraits in cameo panels have their heraldic arms of their Universities and above and below the central panels are the arms of Canterbury and Kent County Cricket Club. The artwork was originally commissioned by Lord Harris, a very prominent figure in Kent cricket. The painting is not signed by Chevallier Tayler. The painting is framed in gilt wood and has brass name plaques running along the lower edge identifying each portrait. The painting measures 2.3 metres (seven feet five inches) wide and 43cm (17 inches) tall. This

historic artwork was originally hung directly below the main panoramic painting of the Kent v Lancashire cricket match in 1907 and has been hung in the pavilion until recently, marking 118 years since it was first revealed to the cricket club and the public. A unique opportunity to acquire a piece of Kent and cricket history

The famous Kent v Lancashire 1906 painting which hung above this panel portrait, was sold in 2006 for £600,000, a record price for a cricket painting. It now hangs outside the Long Room at Lord's for all to enjoy. Due to a historic misunderstanding about the origin of the panel, it was not included in the original sale of the painting. However it has now been established that the two pieces are in fact connected and the portrait panel is being offered for the first time. The history behind the artwork is detailed in Jonathan Rice's book 'Stories of Cricket's Finest Painting: Kent v Lancashire 1906, which provides insight into the significance of the painting and its place in cricketing history. Rice records In a minute of Kent's Management Committee in 1907 when Tayler was

hard at work on the main painting it was recorded "The Artist had agreed to add a panel to the picture, on which he would paint portraits of Lord Harris, George Marsham, W.H. Patterson and Frank Marchant...'. Two of of the players, Hutchings and Dillon, who also feature on the main painting, also appear on the panel due to them fielding so far from the bat on the larger painting. They are a very handsome set of portraits with the coat of arms of Kent, Canterbury, Oxford and Cambridge among the heads. Proceeds from the sale of the painting will be used to help fund a new visitor centre and museum at Canterbury to open up the club's broad collection of unique Kent cricket items to a new generation.

Lord Harris commissioned both paintings to celebrate Kent's inaugural County Championship winning season of 1906. He chose artist Albert Chevallier Tayler for the paintings. Chevallier Tayler (1862 to 1925) was an English artist who specialised in portrait and genre painting. He is most known for his twelve-year involvement with the Newlyn School of painting.

Tayler was an avid cricketer, and in 1905 produced a set of twelve watercolours of famous and mostly royal cricket players. Lord Leverhulme used the series to produce lithographs and advertise his Lever Brothers soap products. The promotion proved popular and besides the painting Tayler is most famous, cricket wise, for his paintings entitled 'The Empire's Cricketers'. The prints of which were originally published in twelve parts, each containing four plates in 1905. He also painted a small oil on canvas work entitled 'Eton v Harrow at Lord's 1886 which is part of the M.C.C. Collection.

'W.G. Grace at the Wicket'. Original sepia photogravure, after Archibald Stuart Wortley 1890, of the famous painting of Grace in batting pose at Lord's, which hangs in the Long Room at Lord's. A pupil of Sir John Everett Millais, Archibald J. Stuart Wortley (1849-1905) was a portrait and sporting painter of considerable renown. Grace, is based on an oil painting which was commissioned by the M.C.C. by means of subscriptions in 1888-90, and now hangs in the Long Room. The artist was paid £300. The scene is Lord's Ground with the old tennis court in the background, now the site of the Mound Stand. 'When standing for this picture, W.G. took up his characteristic and delightful pose. The artist hesitated: 'But Dr Grace, would you stand as easily if the game were in a tight place?' he asked. 'Certainly' was the reply, 'because, after all, I should only be facing the next ball'.

'The evolution of cricket bats and equipment'

Wicket keeping gauntlet's through time. Four different gloves showing the progression of protection given from the 1890's to the 1920's. The first is an early example of a single white kid leather wicket-keeping glove used in the period, made by Geo. G. Bussey & Co of Peckham offering more protection to the wrists and improved ventilation. Some staining and wear otherwise in good condition. The second is a pair of white kid leather wicket-keeping gloves used in the same period, made by Geo. G. Bussey & Co of Peckham. These are similar to the previous gloves in their range except that these gloves have been faced by an India rubber compound with a rough surface to make it easier to retain the ball when catching. The third being a pair of leather wicket-keeping gloves used in the 1920's period, makers unknown. These gloves were top of the range glove in the 1920's. They are leather faced and ventilated from the front. The fingers and the back of the wrists are all very heavily padded, the thumb has double protection. Ultimately this type of glove proved too heavy and cumbersome and the trend began to reverse back to what we know today and the fourth a pair of leather wicket-keeping gloves used in the period, makers unknown but endorsed by Leslie Ames, Kent and England to the back of the glove. These gloves with tan leather backs are ventilated from the back and a strip of elastic has replaced the previous strap. The face of the gloves are faced with pimpled rubber, the wrist guards are more heavily padded than previous and the most important innovation is the addition of internal thumb and finger cups which aid protection without adding weight and bulk. 335 Cricket stumps circa 1790's to 1820. Three oval, rather than circular, cricket stumps used during this early period. The stumps each have a narrow binding about an inch from the top, although one is now missing. The stumps measures 24" (above the ground) and flare noticeably towards the toe measuring 1.25" wide at the base and finish 0.87" at the top, The three stumps had wooden tongues to allow them to be set into the ground, one stump has lost this feature. During this period, the wicket was set to measure 7" so the bails would measure 3.5" each. After 1816 'throwing' (raising the bowling arm above 90 degrees) became rife in English cricket as the bowlers sought to combat ever improving batting techniques and improved pitches. Rather than allow this, the M.C.C. sought other ways to assist the hard pressed bowlers. In 1820 the rules were changed to heighten the stumps by two inches from 24" to 26" and to allow a new ball at the start of each innings. It should also be noted that, during the late 18th and early 19th centuries, the ball could still pass through the wicket without disturbing the bails. A rule change in 1823 prevented this from continuing. These historic stumps were probably made and used before the current Lord's ground was opened in 1814. One of the stumps as mentioned previously is missing its narrow binding at the top and one is missing its wooden tongue to the foot otherwise in good original condition. This proved to be a temporary measure because in 1823 the rules were again changed and the height of stumps was raised to 27". The wicket was widened again to measure 8" and crucially, the rules now stated that the stumps must be thick enough to prevent the ball from passing between them. 338 Nineteenth century cricket shirt and trousers circa 1880's. The 'Sports' shirt was made by Storanco in the 1880's. It is made from taffeta and labelled as 'all wool'. It buttons down the front and has a long back which passes between the wearers legs and buttons at the front. This long back was designed to save the wearer from using underpants and having to wash two garments instead of one. It also provided a convenient pouch for his abdominal protector. > Rev. William Churchill was a noted athlete in the 1870s, played cricket at Marlborough and making one first-class appearance, for an England XI with W.G. Grace, in 1877.

'A Warsop Triangular Bat circa 1890'. A triangular practice cricket bat made by Benjamin Warsop of St. John's Wood, London. The triangular shaped bat's blade is only 2.5" in width and has 'B. Warsop, Marylebone' stamped across the splice and below a faded trade mark and 'B. Warsop' impressed to the cap of the bat. The back of the blade rises sharply from the splice into an acutely angled ridge before sharply falling away at the last moment towards the toe. The thickness of the blade is almost constant from shoulder to toe. The bat measures 34" long, weighing 1lb 5.5oz, with original binding to handle. Triangular bat enjoyed a very brief period of popularity between 1888 and 1892. Their avant garde design appealed to an age when the bizarre became very trendy. The name still exists today as Warsop Stebbing, cricket bat makers of Chelmsford, Essex.

James Cobbett 'Gutta Percha Driver' cricket bat c1890. Stamps for 'Richardson of Liverpool' to the bat in several places. 'Cobbett' impressed twice to the cap of the handle and the initials 'W.D.R.' and number D23045 run down the splice. The back of the bat is gently rounded rather than ridged. Little is known of James Cobbett because he died of consumption in 1842, aged 38. He kept a workshop near to Lord's cricket ground and his business thrived after his death. John Barlett 'compressed' cricket bat 1892. Stamps for 'Bartlett, Waterloo Road (the makers address)' to the bat. The back of the bat is almost flat as the front. but rises slowly to a low rounded ridge. The handle is formed from nine slips of cane. Little is known of John Bartlett's bat making business except that he began working in Lambeth in about 1850 and he relied upon the neighbouring Kennington Oval for some of his business. John Thomas Brown. Yorkshire & England 1889-1904. 'A.E. Stoddart's tour of Australia 1894/1895'. 'Pilling & Briggs of Manchester 'Lancashire Spring Handle' cricket bat presented to Jack Brown for making the highest score in the tour match between eighteen of Ballarat and Stoddart's team, the match played at Ballarat 5th-7th January 1895. Brown made 64 in the first innings and the match

was drawn. The bat with silver metal shield to splice on the back of the bat is inscribed 'Cricket. England v Ballarat. Presented to J.T. Brown. The highest scorer in the match by J.A. Chalk. 7-1-95'. The bat, which presumably was subsequently used by Brown, is aged, browned and darkened, lacking the rubber bat handle but still retains the majority of the threading to handle. Sold with a further 'Royden. Flexible Handle' branded cricket bat used by Brown during his career. The bat has a metal aluminium strip to the back with his name 'J.T. Brown' impressed to the metal. The bat has a vertical split to the blade, is darkened and aged, it retains mode of the rubber bat handle which is worn and faded. A historic pair of bats used by Brown, Yorkshire's first great opening batsman. The two bats were purchased from the Brown family some years ago. Good condition

John Thomas Brown, born in Driffield, East Yorkshire in 1869, was a member of the Stoddart's tour touring party to Australia 1894/95. He played in all games on the tour and in the 2nd innings of the fifth Test at Melbourne scored 140, his only Test century, including the fastest ever fifty scored in Test cricket, 28 minutes, and still remains the record to this day. Brown scored almost 18,000 first class runs at an average of 30.52 with a top score of 311 v Sussex in 1897. He died in 1904 at the age of 35

Jack Brown's century bat (117 v. New South Wales) 1894. A 'Crawford The Exceller Patent' bat by H.C. Crawford of Plumstead, Kent. Impressed 'Crawford The Exceller Patent' to face over splice, 'J. Wisden and Co London' to both shoulders, and 'Crawford' to handle cap. Below the splice to the face is an inscription in ink in Brown's own hand, 'J.T. Brown 117 Sydney Nov 24- 1894' from Stoddart's tour to Australia 1894/95. The back of the blade is gently humped, flattening towards the toe. The bound handle is made from one cane split into four segments, unusually with vulcanised rubber strips inserted crossways between the segments, with a good proportion of the

original leather grip retained. The bat measures 34.5", and weighs 2lbs 4oz. Originally from the estate of J.T. Brown. Cracking and loss to face, woodworm affecting the blade, otherwise in good condition. Sold with the late vendors research notes giving further information on the bat. £400/600

John Thomas 'Jack' Brown (Yorkshire & England 1889-1904) played in eight Test matches for England. His innings of 117 against New South Wales on the 1874/75 tour to Australia laid the foundation for an eight wicket victory.

John Wisden and Co., were the sole agents for the Crawford 'Exceller' bat.

David Denton. Yorkshire & England 1894-1920. Stuart Surridge 'Rapid Driver' cricket bat used by Denton in the 1905 cricket season scoring over 2405 runs, becoming one of Wisden's 'Five Cricketers of the Year' [Wisden 1906], and making 52 and 153 not out against the Australians at Bradford in June 1905. The bat is inscribed clearly in black ink in Denton's hand 'Scored over 2000 runs with this bat including 52 and 153 not out versus Australians at Bradford June 5,6 & 7th 1905'. Additionally inscribed 'Highest score against the Australians 1905 tour' and signed by him. The bat in good original condition has an old split to the edge which has been bound with £1500/2500

The 1905 tour match against the Australians was drawn, Yorkshire batted first and made 324 all out, Rhodes top scoring with 70 and Cotter taking three wickets. The Australians in reply making only 208 with Ringrose taking nine wickets for 76 runs. In the Yorkshire second innings they made 266-4 declared, Denton 153 not out and the match finished in a draw with Australia finishing on 187-4

David Denton (1874-1950) was a very effective, attacking right hand batsman whose attacking play, although risky, bought over 36,000 runs in first class cricket. His nickname of 'Lucky' came from his habit of surviving the numerous chances that his attacking batting style created for the opposition.

He was a great hero of Yorkshire cricket between 1894 and 1920 and played eleven Tests for England. He scored 1000 runs in a season twenty one times in that period. His fine wristy stroke play ensured that all runs were scored quickly. He was also one of the finest deep fielders in England of his period. In 1905, Denton had a fantastic year, scoring 2,405 runs earning himself Wisden Cricketer of the Year recognition in Wisden 1906. In July 1905, he was chosen to play against Australia at Headingley at Leeds, but he failed to make the most of his opportunity and was dismissed for 0 and 12, being dropped from the team immediately thereafter. He was recalled for the tour to South Africa that winter, and played in all five Tests. He made just one fifty in ten innings, and was again dropped from the side, but nevertheless played five more Test matches for England on a second and final tour of South Africa, in 1909/10. In the third Test at Johannesburg he made 104 at about a run a minute, but in no other innings did he even pass 30, and his England career came to a permanent end. Yorkshire won the County Championship on nine occasions during his player career and were in the top four for twenty one years of the twenty three years in which he played.

Samuel Meston's 'Special Selected' 347 Breeden Bat 1906. The bat by W.J. Breedon of Leyton, Essex. Impressed to the front shoulders 'W.J. Breedon', across the splice 'Special Selected' and 'Leyton Essex', below 'Roberts Bristol' and 'Extra Spring'. The back shoulder inscribed in ink 'S.P. Meston 1906', the inscription barely legible, affected by what appears to be a large scorch mark. The back is steeply rounded rather than ridged, falling away to the toe, the shoulders sloping. > The 1908 Festival match against the M.C.C. was drawn, Yorkshire batted first and made 325 all out, Denton top scoring with 133 and Napier taking six wickets. For M.C.C,, who included such players as Fane, Spooner, Douglas, Hutchings, Marsham in their ranks, made 271 all out with George Branston (Nottinghamshire) making 68no and Rhodes taking five wickets. Yorkshire in reply made 208-5 declared with Denton making 121. The M.C.C. in reply making 72-0 before time ran out

349 Gunn & Moore 'Nonjar' cricket bat c1910. Stamps for 'Gunn & Moore Nonjar' to front and impressed 'Reblade' stamp to back. The blade is 'reblade' provided by the manufacturer, a service often used in those days. The handle is made of a mixture of many canes and rubber strips, hence the brand name 'Nonjar'. In his early days with Gunn & Morre, the great cricketer and bat maker, William Sherwin was in charge of the Company's reblading division. Sold with the late vendors research notes giving further information on the bat. Some old woodworm to blade otherwise in good condition £60/90

350 John Berry 'Jack' Hobbs, Surrey & England 1905-1934. A Summers Brown 'Force' cricket bat used by Jack Hobbs in making 154no for

the Players versus the Gentlemen at Lord's in 1911. The face of the bat has the standard Summers Brown wording impressed to it and below this is the signature of Hobbs. Beneath this are the following words inscribed in ink 'Record Force Bat. Gents v Players, Lord's 1911. J.B. Hobbs went in first with this bat and played right through the innings scoring 154 not out constituting a record. This bat has scored over 1000 runs'. To the back of the bat on the right shoulder is the faded signature of 'J.B. Hobbs', still legible. The bat was presented to G.E. Jack Hobbs was probably the finest batsman of all time, he played for Surrey between 1905-1934 and played 834 first class matches. He scored over 61,700 at an average of 50.70 with 199 centuries, incredibly ninety eight of them were scored after his fortieth birthday, and a highest score of 316 v Middlesex in 1926. For England he made 61 Test appearances for England scoring over 5,400 runs at an average of 56.74 with a best of 211 v South Africa in 1924.

In the match the players were left to score 423 runs in 290 minutes to win the match in the fourth innings. On a very difficult pitch and facing the bowling of Foster, Douglas and Le Couteur, Hobbs reached 154not out before his team were all out for 292. His innings included 24 fours. The match was drawn, Sussex batted first and made 146 with Lillywhite top scoring with 42no, Sherman taking 5-45 from 39 overs, in reply Surrey made 196 with Ceasar with 77, Dean four and Wisden three of the wickets off 63 overs to fall. In Sussex's second innings they made 199, Brown making 55, Martingell taking four wickets and the match finished in a draw with Surrey on 59-5, Ceasar making 43 of the runs scored, Wisden took four of the wickets

'The Gentlemen of Kent against the Gentlemen of Hampshire on The Kent Cricket Ground, Canterbury' 1857. Early single sided scorecard printed by 'Jennings, Printers of Canterbury for the match played on the 29th and 30th June. The scorecard, with excellent vignette of a cricket match in progress, with fully completed printed scores. The scorecard measure 4.5"x6" and in remarkably good condition for its age. Rare.

The match was drawn with Kent saving the day with one wicket remaining at the conclusion. 'Hambledon v. England played on Broadhalfpenny Down' 1908. Rare early original scorecard for the first match to be played on Broadhalfpenny Down in over 100 years, 10th- 12th September 1908, with complete printed scores. The England XII elected to bat first and were bowled out for 124, Francis Ford top scorer with 33, George Dennett 28. Jack Newman took 8/54 for Hambledon who then scored 277 thanks to a career best 114no by William Jephson and 59 from Teddy Wynyard. The cricket ground was the home venue for first-class matches organised by the Hambledon Club from 1753 to 1781. Immediately next to the ground is the Bat & Ball Inn. known as the 'cradle of cricket', whose landlord for ten years from 1762 to 1772 was Hambledon captain Richard Nyren. Broadhalfpenny Down continued in regular use by Hambledon/ Hampshire teams until 1781. At the end of that season, the Hambledon Club moved to Windmill Down closer to the village. The original ground fell into disuse through most of the nineteenth century and was converted to agriculture. Attempts were made to restore the ground with the result that this 1908 'Hambledon v England XI' fixture was played as a commemorative match and featured numerous famous players including cricketer Hampshire Edward Whalley-Tooker, a descendant of a member of the original Hambledon Club. An unveiling of a granite memorial, erected to mark the site of the original cricket ground, was performed by E.M. Sprot, captain of Hampshire C.C.C. Following the match in 1908 the ground was reclaimed for farming. Whalley-Tooker set about the task of securing its permanent use for cricket and in 1925 it was restored to host cricket matches.

George Robert Canning Harris, 4th Baron Harris, 1851 to 1932, generally known as Lord Harris, was a British colonial administrator and Governor of Bombay, best known for developing cricket administration via Marylebone Cricket Club. An English amateur cricketer, from 1870 to 1889, Lord Harris played for Kent and England, captaining both teams. He was President of the Kent County Football Association between 1881 and 1908, as well as serving as a government minister from 1885 to 1900. Harris made his first-class debut for Kent in 1870 after he left Eton. Owing to his position in society, he was immediately elected to the club committee and was associated with Kent cricket for the rest of his life. He became county captain in 1871, although his appointment was not made official until after he left Oxford. Harris held the Kent captaincy until 1889. He led the English cricket team in Australia and New Zealand in 1878-79, The team had previously played a match against an All-Australia XI at the Melbourne Cricket Ground and this was later designated Test status as the third-ever Test match. Harris was therefore the second England Test captain after James Lillywhite. Harris captained England against Australia on three further occasions. In 1880 at The Oval, in what was later recognised as the inaugural Test match in England, England won

by 5 wickets. The full span of Harris' first-class cricket career was from 1870 to 1911, at 42 seasons one of the longest on record, though he made only seven appearances after 1889 when he relinquished the Kent captaincy so his essential playing career was from 1870 to 1889. He scored 9,990 runs in first-class cricket with a highest score of 176 among eleven centuries and held 190 catches. He took 75 wickets with a best analysis of five for 57. He died in 1932 at the age of 81 years

New Zealand historian Rob Franks includes this as number three in his list of the thirty earliest New cricket publications, preceded only by two editions of the rules of the Dunedin Cricket Club. This is therefore the first publication in New Zealand to describe cricket. Franks, in the preparation of his bibliography of New Zealand cricket, had discovered only two copies of this work, both in New Zealand libraries. One was complete, and collated as this copy, with eight pages of advertisements at the rear. The other was lacking covers and advertising pages. This is therefore extremely rare, and an important survival, the only copy outside New Zealand, and the only copy likely to appear for sale. The author is anonymous, but it is fairly clear that the author of the two following reports of Auckland cricketers in the south, published in 1883 and 1885 (sold in the previous Knights auction), was W.F.Buckland, who also arranged this tour, and played in the matches. On the title-page of this book is a bold pencil signature,

which appears to be Buckland. I do not think it is too much of a stretch to assign the authorship of this to Buckland, and to assert that this is a signed copy. Tom Reese, whose signature is also on the title-page, was born in 1867 and played for Canterbury from 1887. It is perfectly possible that he, as a keen 17 year-old cricketer, met Buckland on the last of his trips south in 1884.

The tour was a great success, with Auckland winning all four matches, against Canterbury, Otago, Wellington, and Nelson. Scores of all the matches are in this book, and are also in Reese's 'New Zealand Cricket 1841-1914'.

Franks did not find a copy of this in any New Zealand library or private collection, the only copy he traced being in the M.C.C. Library at Lord's. This book describes and gives the scores of the sixteen matches between Canterbury and Otago between 1864 and 1879.

Rare account of the first tour of England. Belief in the natural superiority of English cricket was shattered by Australia's nine wicket win at Lord's over an M.C.C. club team which included W.G. Grace. 'The tour was ... a tremendous success, and it established in England a healthy respect for Australian cricket, especially in bowling, fielding and wicket-keeping, where Blackham made a big reputation. The only discord arose from the 'removal' of Midwinter and the claim that Grace and others were paid for their services ... The real pity is that there was no Test match' (Moyes, p. 175). The Newall family was instrumental in establishing cricket in Philadelphia in the latter half of the nineteenth century. of 1611. The text continues with a basic description of the game, based on an 18th century version with the wicket being called a 'but' or goal comprising two stones approximately one foot apart. The player, armed with a 'crosse ou baton recourbe [curved bat]' attempts to hit the ball, then runs to another goal which he hits with the bat before returning to his own goal. The accompanying facing plate depicts three boys playing the game in a country setting with a windmill in the background, two boys are holding curved bats similar to hockey sticks, one in batting stance, the third is about to deliver the ball.
