1. A buyer's premium of 20% (plus VAT @ 20%) of the hammer price is payable by the buyers of all lots.
2. Cheques to be made payable to 'Knights Sporting Limited'.
3. Knights Sporting Ltd, Registered Office, The Thatched Gallery, The Green, Aldborough, Norwich, Norfolk. NR11 7AA
4. Postage and packing will be charged at current rates for all postal deliveries.
- 4a Postage and packing is subject to VAT at 20%.
5. The seller warrants to the Auctioneer and to the buyer that he is the true owner or is properly authorised to sell the property by the true owner and is able to transfer good and marketable title to the property free from any third party claim.
6. The highest bidder to be the buyer. If during the auction the Auctioneer considers that a dispute has arisen he has absolute authority to settle it or re-offer the lot. The Auctioneer may at his sole discretion determine the advance of bidding or refuse a bid, divide any lot, combine any two or more lots or withdraw any lot without prior notice.
7. ### CRICKET EPHEMERA

- 1 Marylebone Cricket Club. Official M.C.C. membership card for season 1913. The leather bound folding card with beautiful gilt decoration to covers, printed fixtures at Lord's to inside. Membership no. 4382 issued to Major E.G. Waymouth. Good/very good condition. £30/50
- 2 Australia tour to England 1886. Lord March's XI v The Australians. Charlie Howard's Benefit. Rare large photographic admission ticket for the match played at The Priory Park, Chichester 28th- 30th June 1886. The match was played for Charlie Howard's (Sussex) Benefit and the admission ticket has images of Howard, Priory Park, Chichester Cathedral and Cross. Printed detail to centre reads 'Lord March's Eleven v The Australians. Charlie Howard begs respectfully to announce that the above match will be played for his Benefit in the Priory Park, Chichester on June 28, 29 & 30, 1886' with some of Howard's career highlights to lower half of ticket. Details to lower border 'W.N. Malby. Photo, Chichester' and 'E.H. Martin, Writer'. The ticket complete with original strip of three entry stubs, now detached, is signed in ink 'Charlie Howard' and was probably presented to a member of the Australian touring party. Horizontal crease to lower portion of the ticket, wear to one corner, old tape repair to verso, otherwise in good condition. £100/150  
*The Australians beat Lord March's XI by eight wickets. Giffen took 7-21 and Spofforth 6-72 for the Australians and J.C. Wootton took 6-78 for Lord March's XI. Charlie Howard played 22 matches for Sussex from 1874-1882.*
- 3 Warwickshire C.C.C. 1933. Original folding membership/ fixture card for the 1933 season issued to a 'J.R. Hetherington', no. 566. The card with blue cloth covers and printed titles. Very good condition. £20/30
- 4 Earl of Sheffield's Eleven 1884. 'Cricket Match between the Australian Eleven and the Earl of Sheffield's Eleven in Sheffield Park on May 12th & 13th [1884]'. Rare original shield-shaped folding admission ticket 'to the Private Marquee'. The front with ornate colour design with 'Advance Australia' emblem to centre, crossed bats, stumps and ball motifs to top corners, and Lord Sheffield crown emblem below, floral decoration in gold. The ticket appears to be un-issued and is unsigned. The card with neat tape reinforcement to the fold. Very good condition. A scarce original ticket/ invitation. £120/160  
*The Australians, including Bannerman, Murdoch, Giffen, Bonnor, Blackham, Midwinter, Spofforth etc. won the match by an innings and six runs. Lord Sheffield's XI included W.G. Grace, Ulyett, Shrewsbury, Greenfield, Hide, Shaw etc. Giffen and Palmer took ten wickets each in the match for the Australians.*
- 5 Yorkshire C.C.C. fixture cards 1954-2025. Thirty official club printed fixture cards for 1954-1956, 1958, 1959, 1983-1988, 2001, 2004, 2005, 2007, 2010, 2011, 2013-2025. Good condition in small red folder. Sold with a larger folder containing fixture lists/location maps of county teams mainly in 1999 all produced by Sun Life of Canada £25/35
- 6 South American Cricket team in England 1932. Official folding fixture card with shield to front incorporating the emblems of the three nations of Argentina, Brazil and Chile, fixtures and tour details to centre, list of playing members to rear. 'Ex libris' label for Alan James Richards laid down to rear. Sold with an official mono photograph of the team seated and standing in rows wearing tour blazers for the match v Sussex at The Saffrons, Eastbourne 2nd- 5th July 1932, 8.25" x 6.25". Also an official double sided scorecard for the match with complete handwritten scores. Some age toning to the fixture and scorecards, folds to the scorecard, the photograph in very good condition. £60/90  
*The 1932 tour by the South Americans included seven first-class matches. The match against Sussex was drawn and featured centuries from James Langridge (128 for Sussex) and John Knox (110no for the South Americans). Langridge also took 7/87 for Sussex in the first innings.*
- 7 South Africa tour to England 1904. An original, unusual and possibly unique 'List of Matches' card produced in the style of a membership/ fixture booklet and issued to the 'Hon. J.D. Logan' as a pass to allow Logan entrance to cricket grounds for all matches on the 1904 tour, which Logan had financed. The folding card with cloth covers and printed title to front 'South African Cricket Team 1904', printed tour fixtures to centre and fold out page, which reads 'This card admits to Pavilion at all matches excepting those played at Lords, where a special stand is reserved'. Very good condition. £70/100  
*Scottish-born James Douglas Logan was a South African politician and cricket patron, one of the 'founding fathers' and a major benefactor of South African cricket, who used his wealth and influence to promote the game. He financed the tours to England in 1901 and 1904 and presented the Logan Cup in Rhodesia (Zimbabwe) which continues today as the premier domestic first-class competition. See also the following lot.*
- 8 South African cricket membership tickets 1897-1901. Two original Western Province Cricket Club membership card/ fixture list booklet for seasons 1897/98 and 1900/01, leather covers with gilt title. Sold with a similar membership booklet

- for the Western Province Amateur Athletics Association 1898. All three issued to 'The Hon. J.D. Logan', South African cricket patron (see previous lot). Very good condition. Qty 3. £30/50
- 9 Somerset, Dorset and Yeovil County and regional cricket 1950s/1960s. Box comprising a comprehensive collection of correspondence relating to Yeovil Area committee meeting minutes and correspondence addressed to committee secretaries 'Mr. Masters' and 'Mr. Brewer' including arrangements for Somerset C.C.C. County Championship matches at Yeovil, County Club membership fundraising campaigns, area and youth knockout competitions etc. Also contains material relating to Dorset cricket, Compton House C.C. (Sherborne, Dorset), including a selection of nine Club scorebooks for the period 1960s- 1990s, Club minutes, fixture cards etc. Also a team photograph of Dorchester Casuals C.C. 1950 featuring G.L.O. Jessop (Hampshire 1929-1933, four matches), son of Gilbert Jessop. Mixed condition, generally good. £40/60
- 10 'Langbourne Cricket Club. Programme of the Second Grand Annual Bohemian Concert' 1895. Official four page programme for the concert held at The Surrey Masonic Hall, Camberwell (then part of Surrey), 25th April 1895. The floral decorated front cover with printed titles, 'Sir J. Blundell Maple, M.P., L.C.C.' was the Club Patron. Programme of musical entertainments to centre pages, list of 'Stewards' to rear page. Printed by A. Constance of Walworth Road. Horizontal folds, some splitting to folds and nicks to edges, otherwise in good condition. £25/35
- Sir John Blundell Maple was the owner of the furniture makers, Maple & Co., No record of the Langbourne Cricket Club can be found.*
- 11 Leicestershire v South Africa 1924 'Opening match of the tour'. Small official menu for the Dinner given by Leicestershire to the tourist held at the Royal Hotel, Leicester on Saturday May 3rd 1924. The two page folding card menu with titles, dates and menu to front, Names of the two teams, South Africa and Leicestershire to inside the front cover and the 'Toast List' to the facing page. The Chairman of the club and the two Captains, H.W. Taylor and Major G.H.S. Fowke spoke at the Dinner. The running fox emblem of the club to the front cover and the printed detail in the club's colours of green and red. Minor wear to extremities and minor age toning otherwise in good condition. A rare survivor from the Dinner £60/90
- The opening match of the tour was drawn. Ewart Astill took nine wickets in the game*
- 12 'A Supper Dance to welcome home the N.S.W. Members of the 1930 Australian Cricket Team at David Jones', Saturday 22nd November 1930. Tickets 7/6. Proceeds in aid of Sydney Industrial Blind Association. Three similar tickets for the supper numbered 651 to 653. The New South Wales members of the team were Don Bradman, Alan Fairfax, Archie Jackson, Alan Kippax, Stan McCabe and Bertie Oldfield whom attended the Supper. Odd very minor faults otherwise in very good original condition £40/60
- In November 1930, over 800 people attended a dance at David Jones in Sydney to welcome home the New South Wales members of the Australian cricket team. The event honoured players like Don Bradman, Allan Kippax, McCabe, and Oldfield. The West Indies team members were also guests of honour. A memento in the form of a silver clock was presented to each cricketer by Mr. R. A. Oxlade, acting chairman of the Australian Board of Cricket Control.*
- 13 M.C.C. tour of Australia 1911/12. 'The M.C.C. Dinner'. Small and beautifully ornate folding menu for the Dinner given for the M.C.C. touring party to Australia held on the 27th February 1912 at the Hotel Wentworth, Sydney. The menu, on cream card with pink blush colour, has raised stylish art nouveau floral decoration with title to centre. The inside has a poem from Shakespeare and Menu 'On a good wicket' to left and right hand sides. All the courses are named after English players, 'Hearne Bay Oyster Cocktails', 'Rhodes Schnapper a la Century', 'Saddle Woolley Lamb and Vine Sauce', 'Hobb-led Asparagus and Pawley Dressing', 'Peche Warner' etc. Very good condition. A rare and early menu. £70/100
- 14 Lord Harris, George Robert Canning, Kent & England 1870-1911. 'Complimentary Dinner to Lord Harris. By a few of his cricketing friends, on his leaving England for India as Governor of Bombay 1890'. Scarce exquisite one page card menu held in honour of Lord Harris held at The Limmer's Hotel, Conduit Street on the 4th February 1890. The menu card with gold and red floral decoration to borders with detail printed to centre. Light horizontal crease and adhesive marks to verso otherwise in good/very good condition. A rare item. Sold with a trimmed sepia real photograph postcard of Harris. G £150/250
- 15 'Kent County Cricket Champions 1906'. Rare official menu for the 'Dinner to the Kent XI' celebrating Kent winning their first ever County Championship in 1906. The Banquet held at Hotel Cecil on 11th October 1906. Original covers with embossed gilt Kent emblem to centre with cream ribbon tie. Twelve printed pages to inside, the first being a photograph of the Kent team, 'A Canterbury Week Ode' by Major Philip Trevor, menu, toasts, programme of music, results and averages for the 1906 season etc to other pages. Minor foxing and soiling to covers otherwise in very good condition. A scarce item of Kent cricketing history £200/300
- 16 Kent C.C.C. County Champions 1906. Official menu for 'The Blackheath Village Commemoration Cricket Banquet In Honor of our Local Champions', held at the Three Tuns Hotel, Blackheath, 1st November 1906. The menu with pale blue borders and scalloped edges, printed titles and Kent 'Invicta' emblem to front cover. Programme of toasts and musical entertainments to centre pages, including the Response by the Club Chairman, Malcolm Christopherson. Printed menu to rear cover. From the collection of J.R. Mason. Minor

- damage to rear cover, very slight splitting to fold otherwise in good condition. A rare item from this Championship winning season

- 17 'Bodyline'. Official Orient Line 'S.S. Orontes' brochure for the 'M.C.C. Australasian Tour 1932-33'. Pictorial front cover with team detail and photographs, itinerary, player profiles etc. to inside pages. Light soiling to covers, some splitting to spine, rusting to staples, otherwise in good/ very good condition. £50/70
- 18 Scarborough Cricket Club Annual Reports. Two official four page printed reports for Annual General Meetings held in 1915 and 1918. Odd folds, creasing and nicks to edges, otherwise in good condition. £20/30
- 19 Australia v England 'Bodyline' 1932/33. A collection of nine original copies of The Sydney Mail magazine, four complete, others lacking wrappers or with pages detached. Each issue has at least one article of coverage from the tour and Ashes Test series, the majority written by Dr. Eric P. Barbour with interesting and extensive reports and comment on the Bodyline controversy. 28th September 1932 pp 8-9 two page article on Bradman. 19th October p8 'Greatest Batsmen of all Time', pp 26-27 centre spread of the tourists, p30 article on upcoming cricketers (incomplete). 2nd November, four detached pages including the front page with photographs of the England and Western Australia teams, pp 32-33 illustrated report on the tour match at Perth. 7th December, pp 26-30 five page report with photographs of the 1st Test at Sydney. 18th January 1933, front cover cricket image, pp 8-9 two page article 'Test-Match Interludes' by S. Elliott Napier, pp26-30 including centre spread photographs of the 3rd Test at Adelaide titled 'A Hard Battle that may mark a Crisis in Cricket', and reports by Barbour, p46 full page photograph of the England team. 25th January, pp 28-31, conclusion of the 3rd Test. 15th February, front page cricket illustration, pp 24-28 report on the 4th Test at Brisbane. 8th March, pp 28-29, report on England's Ashes series victory, Barbour claiming that the majority of Harold Larwood's deliveries (and that of the Australian, Harry Alexander) were no-balls based on slow-motion film evidence suggesting his back foot dragged over the bowling crease before the release of the ball under the old back foot law. 15th March, pp 28-29 with a page comprising a series of still photographs from slow-motion film providing evidence to back up Barbour's opinion regarding Larwood's action. Wear and tear to some wrappers, otherwise in good clean condition. An excellent record of the 'timeless' series with immediate reaction to the controversies from an Australian point of view. £70/100
- The Sydney Mail was a large format magazine published weekly from 1860 until it ceased in 1938. Eric Barbour co-wrote with Alan Kippax the book 'Anti-Bodyline' published in 1933 in which portions of the Sydney Mail articles were reproduced.*
- 20 South African tour booklets. Two booklets both printed in both English and Afrikaans. One issued for the M.C.C. tour of South Africa 1948/49 by the United Tobacco Co. Cape Town 1948. 32pp. Very small pre tour booklet comprising pen pictures, map, fixtures etc with original decorative colour paper wrappers and the other for the Australian tour of South Africa in 1949/50 'A Shell Guide to the Australian Cricket Tour 1949-50' folding tour guide card. The 1948/49 booklet has one facsimile page being page 3/4 otherwise in good condition £30/50
- 21 M.C.C. tour of South Africa 1948/49. Official M.C.C. Christmas card from the tour. With cover image of the emblem of M.C.C. and M.C.C. colours to corner, cord tie. To inside a picture of the team and the wording, 'Wishing you a Happy Christmas and a prosperous New Year'. Unsigned but from the Doug Wright, Kent and England, collection. Very good condition

- 22 Centenary of the Marylebone Cricket Club 1787-1887. Original 'Plan of Tables' for the Centenary Anniversary Dinner held at Marylebone Cricket Club, Lord's Cricket Ground on the 15th June 1887. Hon. E. Chandos Leigh, President. Folding table plan with attractive and decorative front cover. This was Isaac Donnithorne Walker's copy (Middlesex 1862-1884) and has his name, 'Mr I.D. Walker' handwritten to lower border of the front cover. Printed by Jas. Truscott & Son of Suffolk Lane. Sold with an accompanying 'Centenary Dinner Toast List' card and blank menu card. Minor splitting to folds, otherwise in good/ very good condition. Rare.

- Isaac Walker was the youngest of the seven Walker brothers of Southgate who all played for Middlesex and were instrumental in the founding of Middlesex C.C.C. in 1864 and establishing Lord's as their home ground. He took over the Middlesex captaincy from his brother Edward in 1873, and held the position until 1884.*
- 23 'The "Interlock" Plywood Zig-Zag Puzzle. Volume 4 The Test Match at Lords'. Original 200 piece wooden jigsaw by Raco (Richards Art Company) c.1920s/ 1930s. No. 4 in a series of twelve listed. In original box in the form of a book with cloth covers, colour illustration of a match in progress at Lord's to lid. Not previously seen by the auctioneer. Some splitting and wear to box, otherwise in very good condition. Appears complete. £30/50
- 24 Worcestershire C.C.C. Small box comprising a selection of Worcestershire related items including a Wisden Cricketers' Almanack for 1989, limp cloth covers, signed to photo plate by Phil Neale, one of the 'Five Cricketers of the Year'. - 25 George Bean. Nottinghamshire, Sussex & England 1885-1898. Albert Craig. 'Cricket Rhymester' 1891. Original double sided card of a poem in four stanzas by Craig titled 'Good Old Bean. Secured 145 runs not out against Notts, in his usual slashing style at Brighton, 9th July, 1891. In the second innings Bean got 92 runs'. In the final line Craig states 'Men like Bean will make Sussex rise higher and higher'. Advertisement to verso for F.H. Ayres cricket equipment. The card measures 5"x8". Minor foxing, otherwise in good/ very good condition. £70/100
- Bean was a member of Lord Sheffield's tour to Australia in 1891/92 and played in all three Tests. In the 1891 County match against Nottinghamshire at Hove Bean carried his bat for 145no in Sussex's first innings and came close to becoming the second player (after W.G. Grace) to scoring centuries in both innings, being dismissed for 92 in the second. Sussex fell short in the run chase to lose by 144 runs.*
- 26 Walter Quaife. Sussex & Warwickshire 1884-1901. Albert Craig. 'Cricket Rhymester' 1887. Original single sided card of a poem in four stanzas by Craig titled 'Surrey v. Sussex at Brighton. Quaife secured his century in fine style, Aug. 1887'. Quaife scored 111, his maiden first-class century, in the first innings for Sussex in the match played at Hove 8th- 10th August 1887. Craig describes Quaife batting 'in brilliant style... A prettier bat or a neater, I don't think was ever yet known'. The card measures 6"x4.5". Very good condition. £70/100
- In a closely fought match, Surrey were set 149 for victory and managed to scrape home to win by one wicket.*
- 27 'Sussex v. Gloucester at Brighton, Whit-Monday, June 1st, 1903'. Albert Craig. 'Cricket Rhymester' 1891. Original double sided broadsheet poem in four stanzas by Craig, 'Respectfully dedicated to the popular Gloucestershire Captain, G.L. Jessop, Esq.'. The poem is headed, unusually, with portrait images of 'Prince Ranji', Ranjitsinjhi, and 'The Gov'nor', Bobby Abel. Craig looks forward to the match describing 'Around the ever welcome Sussex chief [Ranji]/ Are gathered sturdy braves to "do or die", with descriptions of players including 'A Prince amongst athletes, illustrious Fry', 'accomplish'd feats of Harry Butt', 'good old Marlow, safe and sound', also Relf, Killick, Tate, Bland, Vine etc. Advertisement to verso for F.H. Ayres cricket equipment. The page measures 11.25"x8". Horizontal and vertical folds, the page cleanly spilt along one fold, otherwise in good condition. £50/70
- In the match played at Hove 1st- 3rd June 1903, Gilbert Jessop achieved his highest first-class score of 286 in Gloucestershire's first innings of 482. Sussex replied with 266 (Fry 83) and, following on, 325/4, Ranji ending 162no. The match was drawn. It is not known why Bobby Abel of Surrey is illustrated.*
- 28 'Kent against All England played in the Artillery Ground, London 1746'. Albert Craig. 'Cricket Rhymester' c.1891. Double sided broadsheet with six lines of verse and the scorecards of two historic matches, Kent v All England '1746' (actually 1744) and 'Cricket Oddity. Single wicket match at Newenden, in Kent, October 5th 1825'. The poem reads, 'Here's to our rare old Summer sport/ Long may our Pastime last/ Long may we prize the tie that binds/ The present, with the past/ Lambert and Ward have passed away/ Kings Grace and Lohmann reign to-day'. Advertisement to verso for F.H. Ayres cricket equipment. The page measures 7"x8". Horizontal fold, minor staining, otherwise in good condition. £70/100
- According to Tony Laughton in his 2008 book on Craig 'Captain of the Crowd', this broadsheet was probably produced for the match Kent v Sussex at Gravesend, 27th-28th June 1891. The All England match of 1744 is the first for which a full scorecard exists, and the other 'Cricket Oddity' features scores for a single wicket match in which both teams of five failed to score a single run in the match!*
- 29 Robert 'Bobby' Abel. Surrey & England 1881-1904. Albert Craig. 'Cricket Rhymester' 1891. 'Robert Abel. Surrey's Pride. Brighton, July 13th, 1891'. Double sided broadsheet poem comprising two stanzas and chorus. Craig is referring to Abel's performance in the match Sussex v Surrey at Hove 13th & 14th July 1891 in which Abel scored 197 in Surrey's only innings of 387 before bowling out Sussex twice for 116 & 92. Surrey won by an innings and 179 runs with John Sharpe taking ten wickets in the match. Craig describes Abel's innings as 'a display that cannot fail to please', a 'Sturdy little "brick"/ Active, staunch, and prim'. Advertisement to verso for F.H. Ayres cricket equipment. The page measures 5"x8". Some age toning to lower portion, otherwise in good/ very good condition. £70/100

- 30 Henry Perkins. Cambridge University, Cambridgeshire & M.C.C. 1854-1868. Single page handwritten letter on M.C.C. letterhead, dated 29th June 1885. Writing in his capacity as Secretary of M.C.C., Perkins is inviting 'My dear [F.M.] Lucas' to play for Gentlemen v Players at Lord's on 6th July. Very nicely signed 'Henry Perkins'. Very good condition £40/60
- Perkins was Secretary of M.C.C. 1876-1897. Frederick Lucas (Sussex & Cambridge University 1880-1887) did play in the match and was top scorer for the Gentlemen (captained by W.G. Grace) in both innings, scoring 89 & 31. The Players won by four wickets.*
- 31 Vyell Edward Walker. Middlesex 1859-1877. Three page folding letter handwritten in ink from Walker to the cricket author, W.A. Bettesworth, dated 29th May 1900 with good cricket content. The date of the letter corresponds with the publication in 1900 of Bettesworth's book, 'The Walkers of Southgate'. Walker appears to be writing about information he has provided, stating 'For my own part I don't think I should have produced the Statistics in print- they can be of no interest, but Mr [Ashley?] Cooper must have taken a great amount of trouble over them'. He also mentions E.M. Grace, and refers to 'A.L. Smith... it was his name appearing and the portion

- about himself which he did not like to appear in print & that he had settled the matter with you'. Archibald Levin Smith had also contributed a chapter to the book entitled 'Reminiscences by an old friend'. Nicely signed V. Edward Walker. Small adhesive marks to verso, otherwise in very good condition. £70/100
- Edward Walker was one of seven brothers, the 'Walkers of Southgate', who played for Middlesex. He captained Middlesex from 1864 to 1872.*
- 32 William Gilbert Grace. Gloucestershire, London County & England 1865-1908. Two page handwritten folding letter from Grace, written on London County C.C., Crystal Palace, headed paper, and dated 19th November 1899. Grace is replying to a request from 'Mr Rammell' regarding fixtures, presumably for the 1900 season, saying 'I am sorry we cannot play on June 16th or July 7th. I think we can easily fix up a date after meeting of secretaries on the 5th of next month. Will you let me have a few dates to choose from'. Very nicely signed 'W.G. Grace'. Light horizontal folds, otherwise in very good condition. £180/250
- Grace was invited in 1898 to help form the short-lived London County Cricket Club and was appointed as the club's secretary, manager and captain, severing his connection with Gloucestershire C.C.C. during the 1899 season. The team played first-class matches from 1900 to 1904 and finally folded in 1908. 'Mr [A.W.] Rammell is thought to have been the Secretary of The Stoics C.C.*
- 33 Thomas 'Tom' Emmett. Yorkshire & England 1866-1888. Rare four page folding letter with excellent cricket content from Emmett to the collector, Charles Pratt Green, dated 21st November 1891 with original envelope. Emmett is replying to a request for one of his bats to add to Green's collection. Emmett is sorry that he had recently given away 'the only old bat I had... And when I tell you that I gave it to some school boys in the East End of London I know you will excuse me'. He goes on to describe the interest of a master at Rugby School who 'fixes
- them a new bat every year which he buys from me'. He describes the bat he donated as 'one that I had a right to be proud of' listing matches and scores he had made that summer including '65 against the bowling of W. Collins & W. Robertson' at Newbold Revel, '65 & 66 not out' for W. Taylor's XI at Watford. 'In September for Tom Plumb's benefit at Northampton against Sherwin's Notts XI I got 43 not out against the bowling of W. Attewell & Sharpe the Surrey bowlers'. He refers to his contemporary Billy Bates (Yorkshire & England 1877-1887) being 'engaged at Haslingdon in Lancashire & was doing nicely but I don't think he will play for his County again', and closes by saying he is busy at Rugby School 'putting down some new turf & levelling in which I am taking an active part'. Nicely signed 'T. Emmett'. Light horizontal fold, otherwise in very good condition. An excellent signed letter from the great Yorkshire and England player. £500/800
- Tom Emmett was a left-arm fast bowler who played 426 first-class matches, captaining Yorkshire from 1878 to 1882. He made seven Test match appearances for England including the very first to be played, on the 1876/77 tour to Australia. His best Test bowling figures of 7/68 were achieved in the only Test of the 1879 Australia tour. In 1889 he was appointed cricket coach at Rugby School where he also served as groundsman. Charles Pratt Green (1852-1950) lived for many years in Beresford House in Great Malvern where he traded as a wine merchant. During his life he amassed a large collection of cricket books, and over 150 bats, which he sold to Sir Julien Cahn when he moved from Beresford House.*
- 34 Lord Harris, George Robert Canning Harris, Kent & England 1870-1911. Single page handwritten letter to a 'Mr Bell', written on Belmont, Faversham, headed note paper and dated '26th' (year unknown). Lord Harris writes 'You are very welcome to the remains of my old bat if Philip[?] has not thrown it away... If you so instruct him before taking it away I will sign it'. Nicely signed 'Harris'. Light vertical fold and creasing, otherwise in good condition. £100/150
- Lord Harris was a British colonial administrator and Governor of Bombay, best known for developing cricket administration via Marylebone Cricket Club. An English amateur cricketer, from 1870 to 1889, Lord Harris played for Kent and England, captaining both teams, including in the first Test match to be played in England, against Australia in 1880 at The Oval. He died in 1932.*
- 35 Charles William Wright. Nottinghamshire, Cambridge University & England 1882-1899. Single page letter handwritten in ink by Wright on Saxelby Park, Melton Mowbray headed paper to a T.B. Milne. Dated 23rd February 1935, Wright states 'I am very sorry but I gave up cricket 20 years ago owing to the loss of an eye and every atom of my cricket tackle was given away long ago to the village club'. Very nicely signed 'C.W. Wright'. Light horizontal and vertical folds, otherwise in very good condition. £60/90
- Wright played his three Test matches for England on the 1895/96 tour to South Africa. He lost an eye in a shooting accident forcing his retirement from cricket.*
- 36 George Alfred Lohmann, Surrey, Western Province & England, 1884-1897. Single page undated handwritten note in black ink on trimmed plain paper. Lohmann writes to say he will be 'most happy to look you up when I am near Tiverton'. Very nicely signed 'Geo. A Lohmann'. The page with light horizontal fold and small tear to left edge is laid down to another page, adhesive marks to verso, otherwise in very good condition. A very nice signature. £150/250
- Lohmann played 18 Tests for England 1886-1896, achieving best bowling figures of 9/28. He was regarded by W.G. Grace and C.B. Fry as the finest medium pace bowler they had faced.*
- 37 Andrew Ernest Stoddart. Middlesex & England 1885-1900. Two page folding letter handwritten in ink by Stoddart, undated. Writing to 'Dear [A.W.] Rammell, Stoddart is handing

- in his resignation as President of The Stoics Cricket Club. He states, 'What you want I am sure is a man who has time and ability to give to the club. I am afraid I have neither'. Very nicely signed 'A.E. Stoddart'. Light horizontal fold, otherwise in very good condition. An excellent signature. £180/250
- It is believed that the Stoics Cricket Club was founded in 1877 by Andrew Stoddart, originally for the old boys of Westminster School. Notable players who appeared include A.E. Stoddart, C.J. Kortwright and R.W.V. Robins, but it was while playing for Hampstead against Stoics in a one day match in 1886 that Stoddart scored 485 in a total of 813 for 9, the Stoics not getting a bat. It is assumed that A.W. Rammell was Secretary of The Stoics C.C.*
- 38 Arthur Frederick Augustus 'Dick' Lilley. Warwickshire & England 1894-1911. Single page handwritten undated letter in ink from Lilley to an unknown correspondent. Lilley is writing in reply to a request for one of his bats, stating 'I am sorry that I have not got an old bat left but if it would not be to [sic] late you shall have the first one I may have next season'. Very nicely signed 'A.A. Lilley'. Light horizontal fold, otherwise in very good condition. £80/120
- 39 Edward George 'Teddy' Wynyard. Hampshire & England 1878-1908. Three page handwritten folding letter in ink from Wynyard on M.C.C./ Lord's Cricket Ground official letterhead with very good cricket content relating to the impending 1906/07 tour to New Zealand, which Wynyard was to lead. Dated 18th June 1906, Wynyard is writing to 'Dear Magnay' saying 'The team for New Zealand is in no sense mine but one selected by M.C.C. They have asked me to go & I am only officially concerned in getting it up. We wrote to Eyre who replied that only P.R. May would be able to go from Cambridge; we then got on with the invitations on that basis. The side is not complete and if you like I will certainly ask Lacey [Secretary, M.C.C.] to submit your name as able to go'. Very nicely signed 'E.G. Wynyard'. Light horizontal fold, otherwise in very good condition. £100/150
- The planning for the 1906/07 tour to New Zealand was overshadowed by the aborted tour to Australia. The relatively weak team set sail comprising only five regular County players and four university players, of which Magnay was not one of them. Christopher B.W. Magnay, 3rd Baronet Magnay (Cambridge University & Middlesex 1904-1911) played twelve first-class matches.*
- 40 John Richmond Gunn. Nottinghamshire, London County & England 1896-1925. Single page handwritten letter in ink dated 25th June 1903 on Nottinghamshire C.C.C. headed paper. Gunn is writing, presumably to Lord's, confirming he 'shall be pleased to play Gentlemen v Players'. Very nicely signed 'J. Gunn'. Some uneven trimming, adhesive mark to verso, small hole to top left corner, otherwise in good condition. £60/90
- John Gunn appeared for the Players in the drawn match against the Gentlemen at Lord's 6th- 8th July 1903.*
- 41 Hon. Lionel Hallam Tennyson. Hampshire & England 1913-1935. Two page folding 'In Memoriam' letter handwritten in ink by Tennyson to 'Dear Hugh [Pakenham]'. Dated 12th December 1916, Tennyson is writing to thank Pakenham for his 'kind letter of sympathy' following the death of his mother. Very nicely signed, Lionel H. Tennyson'. Light horizontal fold. Very good condition. £80/120
- 42 Arthur Lindsay Hassett. Victoria & Australia 1932-1953. Single page handwritten letter in ink from Hassett on The Worcestershire Brine Baths Hotel, Droitwich letterhead. Dated 3rd May 1956 while attending the tour match at Worcester, Hassett is writing to 'The Hon. Secretary [Ron Yeomans], The Northern Cricket Society' declining an invitation to attend a Society Dinner. Nicely signed 'Lindsay Hassett'. Light fold. Very good condition. £60/90
- 43 Warren Bardsley. New South Wales & Australia 1903-1926. Single page handwritten letter on ruled paper from Bardsley to a 'Mr Bailey'. Dated 16th October 1948, writing from Sydney, Bardsley is responding to a request for his autograph. He continues, 'Very much regret the present great weakness in English cricket. Measured by past standards of visiting Australian teams to England our recent one was far from strong, although most successful'. Very nicely signed 'Warren Bardsley'. Light folds. Very good condition. £80/120
- In 1909 Bardsley became the first batsman to score a century in each innings of a Test. He captained Australia twice on the 1926 tour to England.*
- 44 Donald George 'Don' Bradman. New South Wales, South Australia & Australia 1927-1949. Single page handwritten letter from Bradman on his 'Don Bradman & Co. Stock, Share and Investment Brokers' official business letterhead. Dated 15th July 1949 and addressed to 'Mr Ross', Bradman expresses his 'grateful thanks' for congratulations on receiving his knighthood. Very nicely signed 'Don Bradman'. Light folds otherwise in very good condition. £60/90
- 45 William Henry Cooper. Victoria & Australia 1878-1885. Very rare single page handwritten letter from Cooper, written on ruled paper, dated 'Sept 15th [1936]'. Cooper is writing to 'Mr. Hill', being Les R. Hill, the cricket writer and collector base in Mount Gambier, South Australia. Cooper writes, 'At 87 I am granted wonderfully good health' and while he 'cannot do anything in the way of cricket except looking at cricket' he looks forward 'to see something good in a short time', presumably referring to the impending 1936/37 Ashes series, but thinks 'I don't think we are going to have it all our way'. Cooper closes by saying he is sending this letter 'to Mr. Gautier[?] as you do not give your Adelaide address'. Nicely signed, 'W.H. Cooper'. Horizontal and vertical folds with splitting to folds, small losses to corners, otherwise in good condition. A very rare signature of an early Australian Test cricketer. £400/600
- William Cooper was born in Maidstone, Kent in 1849. His family emigrated to Australia when he was*

- aged eight. He didn't start playing cricket until he was 27 following advice from a doctor to get more exercise. A leg-spinner, he made his first-class debut for Victoria in 1879 against Lord Harris' England touring side and took 5/79 in the first innings, and played two Test matches for Australia in the 1881/82 and 1884/85 Ashes series. He was selected for the Australian tour to England in 1884 but injured his spinning finger on the voyage out and was only able to play in five of the first-class matches and no Tests. He died in 1939 in Malvern, Melbourne. Les R. Hill was a bookseller and collector in Mount Gambier, South Australia, who in 1974 published 'Australian Cricketers On Tour 1868-1974', a record of all Australian tours abroad, and also privately published biographies of Australian Test players including Bill Whitty and Arthur Richardson.
- 46 William Gilbert Grace. Gloucestershire & England, 1870-1899. Two page folding hand written letter, on London County Cricket Club letterhead, from Grace to 'My dear Dick' (presumably being Richard Moore 'Dick' Bell. London County 1902-1904) regarding his non appearance at a golf match possible arrangements for future game, the letter dated March 11th 1906 by Grace. 'I expected to see you yesterday at Hurlingham. I hope nothing serious prevented you from turning up. We had a great days golf and the match ended in a tie. It is a sporting course and wants a lot of doing. I am afraid I cannot manage to play tomorrow. In have nothing on Tuesday in fact all the week. When are you coming back, you do not say where you are off to. I think I can manage to give you a good game now. With kind regards from my wife I am yours very truly...'. Nicely signed 'W.G. Grace'. Sold with a colour 'Tuck's' postcard of Grace in cricketing pose 'Playing Back'. Good condition £200/300
- Grace and Bell were good friends and played cricket together with London County C.C. and using a quote from a previously sold letter from Bell, Bell remembers meeting 'the Doctor practically all the year*
- round after he came up to London, cricket in the summer & we used to run with the beagles and play golf together in the winter'.*
- 47 Edward Wentworth 'Ted' Dillon. Kent & Oxford University 1900-1923. One page type written letter from Dillon to William Findlay, Secretary of M.C.C. The letter, dated 8th November 1923, on 'H.W. Dillon & Sons, Steamship and Insurance Brokers' headed paper. A brief message to Findlay 'My Dear Billie, Ever so many thanks for your letter of yesterday and I much appreciate tour promise to do what you can to help'. Signed 'Yours sincerely' Ted Dillon. Light folds, good condition £50/80
- Ted Dillon captained Kent 1909-1913*
- 48 Benjamin James 'Ben' Sealy. Trinidad & West Indies 1923-1941 (1 Test 1933). Also known as Ben Sealey. Single page handwritten letter in blue ink from Sealy, dated 12th November 1956, writing to a 'Mr Ogden' to say he will be travelling to England 'next year... and should I be fortunate to be around the West Indies team, I hope to meet you personally when the team comes to Old Trafford'. Small adhesive marks to verso, light folds, otherwise in good/ very good condition. £70/100
- Sealy's one Test match for West Indies was in the 3rd Test against England at Kennington Oval in 1933. He scored 29 & 12 and took one wicket. England won by an innings and 17 runs.*
- 49 Alexander John 'Sandy' Bell. Western Province, Rhodesia & South Africa 1925-1939. Two page handwritten letter in blue biro on ruled paper from Bell with very good cricket content relating to 'Bodyline'. Dated 22nd January 1971 and writing from East London in South Africa, Bell opens by correcting statistical details such as 'I was O'Reilly's first LBW victim, and not Cyril Vincent', 'My last wicket, in the mud, bowling off breaks off a two yard run, on a matting wicket!'. He then describes Don Bradman's innings of 299no in the 4th Test of the 1931/32 Test series at Adelaide, 'For sheer greed I have never seen a better effort. He ran Alan Kippax out for 0 [without facing a ball] in
- an endeavour to reach his century. He then ran Pud Thurlow out for 0, trying to get his 300. During this innings Jock Cameron caught him twice, and Cyril Vincent, left hand over the wicket, hit the welt of [Bradman's] boot in the blockhole. After a long pause, the umpire said "Not out", and gave as his reason that the blockhole was deep, and the ball might have missed the wicket. That evening Bradman asked "How did you like my innings Jock?" Quick as a flash came Jock's immortal reply, "Which innings?". Bell points out that Bradman's innings 'led to the "bodyline" series' and in the final section of the letter Bell describes his own attempts to stem Bradman's scoring by betting Jock Cameron £1 that he could bowl a maiden over, and did so by bowling beamers with a leg-side field set. His final comment is that his South African team-mate, Herbie Taylor, went to England at the close of the tour, 'There he talked to Douglas Jardine & you know the rest'. Nicely signed 'Alex Bell'. A fascinating insight into the precursor of leg theory or 'bodyline' tactics. Horizontal and vertical folds, otherwise in good/ very good condition. £70/100
- 50 Harold Larwood. Nottinghamshire, Europeans & England 1924-1938. Single page handwritten letter in ink from Larwood on plain ruled paper, dated 29th July 1977. Writing from the Victoria Hotel in Nottingham where Larwood was attending the 3rd Ashes Test at Trent Bridge, Larwood is replying to a request for his signature and arrangements for the collection from the hotel of a signed miniature bat. Light folds, Very good condition. £70/100
- 51 William 'Bill' Voce. Nottinghamshire & England 1927-1952. Single page handwritten letter from Voce writing from his home in Hucknall. The letter is undated but is a late reply to a letter of 'Feb 76' in which he was asked 'which of the 27 Tests gave me the greatest pleasure'. His reply is 'being asked to play in them... I enjoyed every match I played in weather [sic] I was getting good hiding or I giving hiding'. Nicely signed 'Bill Voce'. Light fold. Very good condition. £60/90

- 52 Walter Alexander Humphreys. Sussex & Hampshire 1871-1900. Single page handwritten letter/note in ink from Humphreys to 'Mr Padwick' dated 24th October 1889. Humphreys appears to be replying to an offer to buy a picture from him, stating 'I have been so very busy during the opening of the Exhibition here that I have not known hardly what to do first... Your offer for Picture not being sufficient must decline with thanks'. Nicely signed 'Walter Humphreys'. Small old tape repair to verso with show-through partially affecting the signature, otherwise in good condition.

- 53 Alfred Shaw. Nottinghamshire, Sussex & England 1864-1897. Rare and early single page handwritten letter with good cricket content from Shaw to an unknown correspondent in Nottingham, dated 27th April 1889. Writing from the Star & Garter Hotel, Brighton, on 'in memoriam' style paper with black borders, Shaw is replying to a request for information about players. 'As I was not out in Australia with the last team I cannot give you any notes but Mr Shrewsbury was... I am engaged here [Sheffield Park, Sussex] with Earl of Sheffield so will not see Sherwin[?] or Flowers for a long time'. Very nicely signed 'Alfred Shaw'. Very good condition.  
£250/350
- Alfred Shaw holds the distinction of bowling the first ball in Test cricket. He was later employed by the Earl of Sheffield to coach young Sussex cricketers on his Sheffield Park estate.*
- 54 John Shuter. Kent, Surrey and England 1874-1909. Two page handwritten letter in ink, dated 26th March 1889, from Shuter to a Miss Macdonald who is organising a fundraising bazaar. Shuter writes 'I fear it is quite impossible to obtain notes from or even signatures of the Surrey Eleven at the present time' but offers to try to obtain them later 'if May is not too late', and asks her to send him a reminder nearer the time 'addressed to Kennington Oval, London'. He also refers her to 'E. Hawkins & Co, Kings Road, Brighton- Photographers [who] will supply you with photographs of any County team and... particular players'. Very nicely signed 'John Shuter'. Very good condition.

- Shuter captained Surrey between 1880-1893 and was appointed Secretary to the county club in 1919, unfortunately dying before he had completed a year in office. He first led Surrey to the County Championship in 1887. They then came first in 1888, tied with Lancashire and Nottinghamshire in 1889, and won again in 1890, 1891 and 1892. Shuter was a batsman and chiefly an off-side player. He played one Test at The Oval in August 1888 against the Australians making 28 in England's only innings.*
- 55 Richard Daft (senior). Nottinghamshire 1858-1891. Two page folding letter handwritten in ink with good cricket content from Daft, dated 30th June 1870, to the cricket administrator, R.A. Fitzgerald (Cambridge University, M.C.C. & Middlesex 1854-1874). Fitzgerald is arranging a team for North v South at Canterbury and Daft writes 'I am sorry to say that through the continued illness of my wife I shall be unable to play in the forthcoming North & South match at Canterbury... I have had to give up all matches where I cannot get home at night'. He recommends alternative Nottinghamshire players to take his place including 'Oscroft [who] is playing so well... a real good man. Young Butler who has been playing with such success... I will see & engage either of these for you if you think well & will let me know'. Beautifully signed 'Rich Daft'. Sold with a small mono printed engraving of Daft. Very good condition.

- Richard Daft was one of the finest batsmen of his day, playing 254 matches for Nottinghamshire scoring 9788 runs at an average of 25.42. He wrote 'Kings of Cricket- Anecdotes and Reminiscences from 1858 to 1892' the year after he retired, which was published in 1893. By 1900 his health had deteriorated and he died bankrupt. Robert Fitzgerald was Secretary of M.C.C. 1863-1876.*
- 56 Walter William Read. Surrey & England 1873-1897. Two page handwritten folding letter in ink from Read to a 'W. Moreton Esq', dated 22nd July 1904. Read is sending his thanks 'for your extreme kindness... As you know full well when any body is in temporary trouble so few in this world will lend a helping hand'. Nicely signed 'W.W. Read'. - Walter William Read played eighteen matches for England, captaining twice, and was considered one of the best batsmen of the 1880s. Read still holds the record of the highest Test score batting at number ten when he made 117 for England against Australia at The Oval in 1884. He died in 1907 aged 51.*
- 57 William Gunn, Nottinghamshire and England 1880-1904. Handwritten note on 'Gunn & Moore' headed memorandum sheet, undated, responding to a request from a lady collector for his signature. 'I have much pleasure in responding to your wish to possess my autograph'. Beautifully signed 'William Gunn'. Light folds, small adhesive mark to verso, otherwise in very good condition.

- William 'Billy' Gunn was a very tall, graceful and patient batsman. A classical cover driver, he played in eleven matches for England and featured in twenty six century partnerships with Arthur Shrewsbury. One of the finest batsmen of the early Golden Age, Gunn also played two football internationals for England and in 1885 founded the famous bat making firm of Gunn & Moore.*
- 58 William Brockwell. Surrey, Kimberley, London County & England 1886-1903. Two page handwritten folding letter from Brockwell to E.B.V. Christian. The undated letter, with good cricket content, appears to refer to a book being compiled by Christian. Brockwell states 'Only mention my century v Gloucester being the first and the 106 not out v Notts... the others v Essex, Yorks & the North I would leave out & I wonder also if you think proper not refer to my bowling W.G. Grace although I should not mind if you

- Bill Brockwell played in seven Tests for England, all against Australia 1893-1899. He fell on hard times after retiring from first-class cricket and died in 1935 in abject poverty. Edmund Brown Viney Christian was a writer and poet on subjects including cricket and law.*
- 59 Albert Neilson 'Monkey' Hornby. Lancashire & England 1867-1899. Two page handwritten note in ink on 'Parkfield, Nantwich, Cheshire' headed paper from Hornby to 'Dear Alice', undated. Hornby writes 'I am very sorry but I have given my tickets away, or else you could have had them. You had better write to Henry Perkins [Secretary of M.C.C. 1876-1898]... who I think will be able to let you have some. Use my name'. Nicely signed 'A.N. Hornby'. Light fold. - Monkey Hornby was an opening batsman, a bowler who bowled both right and left handed, and an excellent cover fielder. He played for England in three Test matches 1878/9 to 1884, captained Lancashire 1880-1893, and was President 1894-1916. Hornby, also a noted rugby union player, was capped nine times for England.*
- 60 Samuel Moses James 'Sammy' Woods, Somerset, Cambridge University, England & Australia 1886-1910. Small two page handwritten note in ink dated '4th Sept'. Presumably writing to a publisher, Woods thanks them 'for 6 copies of the Book. It reads quite well. I hope others will think the same'. A date is annotated in pencil '7/9/25' to the first page, which corresponds with the publication of Woods' autobiography 'My Reminiscences' in 1925. The note is nicely signed 'Smy Woods'. - Sammy Woods played in three Tests for Australia in 1888, and three for England on the 1895/96 tour to Australia.*

Dated '21 VI [19]04', Lacey writes 'The Committee of the M.C.C. have selected you to play for the Players v the Gentlemen at Lord's on July 4th, 5th, 6th' and awaits confirmation of his availability. Nicely signed 'F.E. Lacey, Sec. M.C.C.' The page appears slightly trimmed and is laid down to a tightly trimmed album page with an original sepia candid-style photograph of Denton at Lord's laid down to verso. Some soiling to the letter, otherwise in good condition. £100/150
- Francis Lacey was Secretary of the M.C.C. from 1898 to 1926. He was the first person to be knighted for services to any sport. Denton played in the Lord's match, scoring 4 and 0. Gentlemen won by two wickets.*
- 62 Edward Ferdinando Sutton Tylecote. Oxford University, Kent & England 1869-1886. Single page handwritten letter in ink from Tylecote, dated 2nd July 1934. Writing from his home in Hunstanton, Norfolk, to an unknown correspondent, Tylecote states '[Your letter] gives me far more pleasure than a score of notices from correspondents to the Star or any other paper coming from people who never saw me play 40 to 50 years ago'. Nicely signed 'E.F.S. Tylecote'. Folds and small staple holes, otherwise in good condition. £120/160
- Tylecote was a member of Bligh's tour to Australia 1882/83, and played in six Test matches 1882-1886. Tylecote recorded the first known quadruple century scoring 404no while at Clifton College in 1868, a record later eclipsed by A.E.J. Collins who scored 628no at the same venue. Tylecote died in Norfolk in 1938.*
- 63 Edward Mills Grace. Gloucestershire, Gentlemen & England 1862-1896. Handwritten single page folding letter on Park House, Thornbury letterhead from Grace, dated 1st May 1901, to 'Mr Hill'. Grace writes 'I have put you down for certain to play. We commence at one o'clock and have no lunch'. Very nicely signed 'Edward Mills Grace'. Some foxing, otherwise in good/ very good condition. £120/160
- Grace was a member of Parr's tour to Australia and New Zealand 1863/4, the second time an English XI had visited the antipodes. His only official Test for England was in 1880. Grace made his first class debut for MCC against Kent at Canterbury in 1862, scoring 192no and taking ten wickets in an innings.*
- 64 Lord Martin Bladen Hawke, Yorkshire & England 1881-1911. A two page handwritten folding letter in ink from Lord Hawke, who was Captain of Yorkshire for many years, to 'My dear Talbot', dated 14th March 1900. Writing from his home at Wighill Park, Tadcaster, the letter appears to relate to some gossip about 'the Club [Yorkshire?]' asking 'Do tell me... the whys and the wherefores re [the] enclosed'. - 65 Gilbert Laird Jessop. Gloucestershire, Cambridge University, London County & England 1894-1914. Nice single page handwritten letter dated 'Sept 4' (year unknown, possibly 1930s), to 'Dear Dr. Hunter' with interesting cricket content. Jessop is arranging to meet for tea and 'we can then settle the World's Cricket affairs between us'. He continues by stating 'Anything about Don Bradman bores me- a wonderful run getter but I don't like him as a cricketer'. Nicely signed 'Gilbert L. Jessop'. Very good condition. £70/100
- Dr. Hunter may refer to T.R. Hunter who was a founder member of the Cricketana Society, publishing journals from around 1933.*
- 66 Frederick Gale. Four page handwritten folding letter from Gale to 'My dear Pardon'. In the undated letter the handwriting is difficult to decipher, but the overall theme of the content appears to relate to mistakes appearing in published articles and books, and he closes in a postscript complaining that someone has been 'abusing me in all the papers'. Nicely signed 'Fred Gale'. Very good condition. £60/90

- Fred Gale played in the Winchester Eleven in 1841 against Eton and Harrow at Lord's, but did not go on to play first class cricket. He made his name as a prolific writer of books, newspaper and magazine articles writing under the name 'The Old Buffer'. He emigrated to Canada to be with his family after the death of one of his sons, but was homesick and missed his cricket, so returned home the following year. The 'Pardon' to whom the letter is addressed could relate to the journalist and writer, G.F. Pardon, or either of his sons C.F. and S.H. Pardon who both edited the Wisden Cricketers' Almanack.*
- 67 Vyell Edward Walker. Middlesex 1859-1877. Single page handwritten note in ink from Walker to 'Miss Burrows', dated 10th May 1894. Written on Arnos Grove, Southgate headed paper, Walker writes 'I have the pleasure to enclose my card to admit yourself & friends to Enclosure at Lords'. Very nicely signed 'V. Edward Walker'. Very good condition. An excellent signature. £40/60
- Edward Walker was one of seven brothers, the 'Walkers of Southgate', who played for Middlesex. He captained Middlesex from 1864 to 1872.*
- 68 John Broadbridge. Marylebone Cricket Club 1840. Sussex v England. Rare and very early single page handwritten letter in ink from John Broadbridge at Lord's Ground, dated 30th July 1840, to 'Friend Wenman' (Edward Gower 'Ned' Wenman, Kent 1825-1854). Broadbridge writes 'I have engaged Cobbett, Bayley, & Hawkins, & I wish you consider that you are also engaged. They will be at Dover on Sunday next, & of course you will also. The arrangements I have made with Cobbett will no doubt meet your approbation. I believe Hillyer is engaged as Umpire. I shall not say any think [sic] about the match, you will see all the particulars in Bells Life. Trusting you will not disappoint me', nicely signed 'John Broadbridge'. It would appear that Broadbridge was arranging a team for the match Sussex v England, which was played at Brighton, 10th & 11th August 1840. James Cobbett, Ned Wenman and William Hillyer played in the England team, Charles Hawkins appeared for Sussex, and John Bayley was one of the umpires. The letter with folds and the addressee, pre-paid postage and 'Cranbrook Penny Post' hand-stamps to the verso. Some wear with old tape repairs to edges, otherwise in good condition. - 69 John Edward Kynaston Studd. Middlesex & Cambridge University 1878-1884. Single page typed letter on 'The Polytechnic, London' official letterhead, of which Studd was a founder and President. - Studd served as President of the London Polytechnic until his death in 1944. He was also Lord Mayor of London 1928/29.*
- 70 Elias Henry 'Patsy' Hendren. Middlesex & England 1907-1937. Single page handwritten letter on West London Indoor Cricket & Sports Club official letterhead, of which Hendren held the post of Manager. Dated 16th February 1926 to a 'Mr Webber', Hendren writes to confirm a visit 'to you from April 19th for one week: My terms for the [visit] would be £25'. Nicely signed 'E. Patsy Hendren'. - This and the following lot suggests that 'Mr Webber' was organising an annual exhibition, to which Hendren and Frank Woolley were invited to attend.*

Writing from his home in Southborough, Kent, Woolley states 'I am sorry I cannot accept your offer to be present during your cricket exhibition as I am full up with coaching & other engagements in London'. Writing soon after celebrating his 80th birthday, Warner is replying to a request from a 'Mr Gillman' for his autograph and photograph and sends his best wishes 'noting you too will reach "80 not out", it only needs a 4, a 3, a 2 and a single & you will be there!'. - 74 John Berry 'Jack' Hobbs. Surrey & England 1905-1934. Single page handwritten letter in ink dated 19th December 1953. Writing from Hove, Sussex, to 'Dear Johnny', Hobbs sends his thanks for 'giving me another birthday luncheon party... a right royal time- good food, wine and excellent company. You were a wonderful host'. Nicely signed 'Jack Hobbs'. Light fold. Very good condition. £50/80
- 75 Richard Gorton 'Dick' Barlow'. Lancashire, Derbyshire & England 1871-1891. Two page handwritten folding letter in ink from Barlow to F.S. Ashley-Cooper. Dated 4th November 1912, on his personal letterhead in Blackpool, Barlow is replying to an enquiry about 'a feat which you name', of which he says he has 'no recollection... and must say it is news to me'. He continues to say he always looks forward to cricket and is keeping well. Very nicely signed 'R.G. Barlow'. Very good condition. A rare and early letter from this noted cricketer. £150/250
- Known as the 'Stonewaller', Barlow once scored no runs in a partnership of 45 with A.N. Hornby who was*

- dismissed for 44, and holds the record in first-class cricket for the lowest score by an opening batsman carrying his bat through an innings, scoring five not out in Lancashire's total of 69 against Nottinghamshire in 1882.
- 76 Charles Burgess Fry. Sussex, Hampshire, Oxford University, Europeans & England 1892-1922. Double sided two page handwritten letter in ink from Fry at 'Hamble, Hants', to a Mr Stalworthy, dated 16th May 1922. Fry is replying to a request for advice on how best to grip a cricket bat. Fry goes into some detail, opening with 'If you ground a bat near your right toe and keep it nearly upright between the first two fingers of your right hand and then, without thinking how, let your left hand take its grip quite naturally you will have what I consider the best initial left-hand grip. You will find I expect that thus the back of the left-hand is full towards cover or extra cover. Ranji & I think Trumper held their bats thus'. He also refers the correspondent to a book 'called Batsmanship by [Fry] published by Evelyn Nash. The book contains all the relevant details... (I have no interest in the sale! as I sold the copyright outright)'. Signed to the extreme lower right corner, 'C.B. Fry'. Gale' regarding presumably Bowls 'I am depending on you at [??] on Saturday at 3 O'clock, also at West Ealing on the 13th at same time and here on the 18th. Signed 'W.G. Grace'. One page comprises five original candid photographs of the Trent Bridge ground and pavilion taken at that match, also newspaper cuttings reporting Sussex losing by ten wickets, Fender scoring 1 & 2, and taking one wicket for 14 runs off three overs in the first innings, with an incomplete official scorecard. Other scorecards featured include for the subsequent match v Lancashire at Old Trafford, Fender was twelfth man, also matches in which Fender played for Sussex v Warwickshire at Priory Park, Chichester 1911, Kent 2nd XI v Sussex 2nd XI, Sittingbourne 1911, Lancashire v Sussex, Old Trafford 1911, and five scorecards of matches in which Fender appeared for the Manchester Club in 1911 etc. Throughout the album is a large selection of letters and telegrams relating to Fender playing in 1908-1911 for Sussex Club & Ground and Brighton Brunswick. Accompanying an official scorecard for M.C.C. v Public Schools, Lord's 1909, in which Fender played as a pupil of St. Paul's School, are signed letters from Teddy Wynyard inviting Fender to play again in 1910. Fender was unable to fulfil the fixture as he was no longer qualified to represent Public Schools having recently left St. Paul's School, with a response card acknowledging the fact also signed by Wynyard. There are numerous signed letters from Billy Newham, former captain of Sussex C.C.C., and A. Millward (umpire?), inviting Fender to play for Sussex Club & Ground and Sussex 2nd XI in 1909 and 1910, Also letters relating to playing football for Scot-Lane F.C. in the Bolton League 1910/11, the timing of which corresponds with Fender moving up to Lancashire in 1910 to work in a paper mill where he damaged his hand in an accident. Also included is correspondence with invitations from various cricket clubs in the area with a view to Fender playing. Other items include six official folding club membership and fixture cards, some issued

to Fender 1909-1911, a luggage label annotated 'Fender, Sussex XI' being a 'Present from W. Gunn' etc. Slipped in is an official receipt for the purchase of this album at the Phillips auction of 22nd October 1986, Lot 60, hammer price £240. The album has subsequently been attractively rebound in full black leather, marbled endpapers, gilt title to spine, with original receipt from the bookbinder dated 2010. *Percy Fender played his County cricket for Sussex from 1910 to 1913 before moving to play for Surrey in 1914, making a total of 557 first-class appearances. He captained Surrey 1921-1931 and still holds the record for the fastest century, scored in 35 minutes for Surrey v Northamptonshire in 1920. He was selected to play for England on thirteen occasions and was described as 'the best captain England never had'. Fender died in 1982 aged 92.*

M.C.C. won the match by an innings and 71 runs. The next page is headed New South Wales the next opponents on the tour, but not signatures were collected by Fielder, the next page has a smaller laid down lined page, headed 'for A. Fielder', signed by thirteen members of the Queensland team and umpires who M.C.C. played next on the tour. Signatures are Evans (Cpt), Fitzgerald, Byrne, Henry, Carew, Griffith, Atkins, MacDonald, Foster, Crouch and Patrick plus the two umpires Muir and Orr, this is

followed by a blank page with only the title Maitland XVIII, however he did collect eighteen members of the Newcastle who played against them on the 4th/5th December. Signatures include Thomas Dent who took five wickets in the M.C.C. first innings, Bourke who top scored in the first innings with 43. The match was drawn. The following two pages facing each other are headed 'First Test Match. England Eleven [and Australia Eleven] played at Sydney'. This first Test was played from the 11th-17th December. Fielder, who was not included in the team, has entered the names of the England team but no signatures were signed, however the Australian page is signed all twelve players who played in the Test match. Signatures in ink are Monty Noble (Capt), Reggie Duff, Victor Trumper, Clem Hill, Warwick Armstrong, Albert Hopkins, William Howell, Syd Gregory, Frank Laver, James Kelly and John Saunders. Also signed by presumably the twelfth man Claude Jennings and the two umpires, Robert Crockett and Alfred Jones. England won the Test by five wickets, Noble made 133 out of a total of 285 in Australia's first innings, England responded with 577 all out, with R.E. Foster making 287 and Len Braund making 102, Australia in their second innings made 485 with Victor Trumper making 185no, England scored the required runs with five wickets down, Tom Hayward making 91. The following two pages are similarly laid out with handwritten titles for the second Test at Melbourne in which Fielder made his Test debut for England, again the names of the English team have been entered in Fielder's hand and the Australian page has been signed by four of the players plus the Umpire Crockett. Signatures are Warwick Armstrong, William Howell, James Kelly and Donald Gehrs. England won the Test by 165 runs, Rhodes taking 15 wickets in the match. The remainder of the autograph book has blank pages with the exception of the final page where Fielder has noted 'Winter Money received from K.K.C.C. of £5-00 on the 20th October'. The book breaking at the spine a little and some pages are detached otherwise in good original condition. An early and unique

autograph book compiled by an initially enthusiastic collector of the teams autographs on his first tour, perhaps the pressures of the actual tour, travel and playing of matches on the tour dulled his enthusiasm to collect autographs as the series went on. £1500/2500

*Arthur Fielder was selected for his first overseas tour and he played in thirteen matches on the tour including the second and third Tests at Melbourne and Adelaide. In the second Test he didn't bowl a ball thanks to Rhodes taking fifteen wickets in the match but did take a catch, at Adelaide he opened the bowling in the first innings and took 0-33 off seven overs, in the second innings he took 1-51 from twenty five overs. In all on the tour he took fourteen wickets at an average of 23.07. Lady Darnley was travelling on the R.M.S. Orontes voyage to Australia at the same time as the M.C.C. team and she helped to arrange and play in a cricket match between the M.C.C. team and the ladies on board. The ladies successfully won the match and she hosted a tea party for both teams in her saloon to celebrate the conclusion of the game and the ladies victory. The M.C.C. 1903/04 tour, led by Plum Warner, was the first official M.C.C. sponsored tour where they won the five match Test series by three Tests to two.*

It has been suggested to me that he was presented with a silver tea service upon his return to England from Australia in early 1925 by the people of Brighton to commemorate the record breaking feat. However, if that is the case why is the tea pot engraved with the wording "Johnnie Walker Trophy" and have 'Adelaide' inscribed on it. He took eleven wickets in the first Test at Sydney, nine wickets in the 2nd Test at Melbourne, only two wickets in Adelaide in the third Test, seven wickets in the 4th Test back at Melbourne and nine wickets in the final Test at Sydney making up the 38 wickets. The reference to the Johnnie Walker Trophy suggests that it might have been a presentation from the company in recognition of the achievement, Johnnie Walker whisky sponsored huge scoreboards in many towns around England in the 1920/30's to inform cricket lovers of the Test match scores as it happened but did this only happen in the summer, I presume so.... A real conundrum !

Charlwood, made up with T. Hearne, Griffith, Mortlock, T. Humphrey, Southerton, Pooley, Caesar or H.H. Stephenson, John & James Lillywhite'. He closes by stating he hasn't a copy of the photo, 'but if you care to send yours along I should be sure to know each one'. Nicely signed 'Jas Lillywhite'. The letter, with light horizontal fold, is laid to trimmed page with adhesive marks to verso. Good condition. £180/250

*James Lillywhite captained England in the very first two Test matches played, in Australia in 1876/77. He played 157 matches for Sussex and went on many overseas tours. His final match was for Lord Sheffield's XI in 1885. He went on to be a first-class umpire, standing in six Test matches. Lillywhite died in Westerton in 1929.*

- 560 Frederick William 'Fred' Tate. Sussex & England 1887-1905. Two page handwritten folding letter in ink from Tate to the collector and brother-in-law of Sir Julien Cahn, E. George Wolfe. Dated 8th December 1937 and writing from Derby, Tate is please to be able to provide his autograph and promises to try to obtain a photograph for Wolfe's collection. The Australians won against Auckland and Otago but lost to Canterbury and in the first international match against New Zealand, the other six matches were drawn. The loss to Canterbury was the first time Australia had ever lost a first-class match in New Zealand. This was a strong team, seven of the team had played Test cricket and three others later played in Tests. Some observers considered it a stronger team than the Australian Test team that was touring South Africa at the same time. Peter Burge played in 42 Test matches between 1955 and 1966 and was a Wisden Cricketer of the Year in 1965. After retiring as a player he became a*

highly respected match referee, overseeing 25 Tests and 63 One Day Internationals.

- 873 'Liverpool Cricket Club 1822 Score Book'. Original scorebook bound in apparently original marbled boards, blue leather spine with raised bands, gilt title to front. The scorebook comprises over 160 pages of scores for seasons 1822 and 1823, with records of individuals' scores ('Notches'), also a list of members and averages. The inside cover and front endpaper have the handwritten rules of the Club, which have been crudely scrubbed out in ink. Slipped in is a modern typed transcript of those rules. Additionally a transcript listing the matches played in 1822 is also included, with a three page handwritten letter from Don Ambrose who was

a noted expert on Liverpool cricket, and who claims that some of the matches are the earliest recorded in the area. Ownership label laid down to inside front cover of G. Harold Culshaw of Oxford University. Ex A.E. Winder collection. Some age toning to pages, one page detached with breaking to page block. - 874 Oxford v Cambridge 'The University Match at Lord's' 1841, Seventh Varsity match held. Original scorers sheets from the match played on the 14th, 15th & 16th July 1841, these sheets were compiled by the Oxford scorer. The sheets are handwritten in a neat hand and are laid down to card, sheets to both sides. Handwritten titles of the match, dates to the top of the sheets. The first sheet shows the innings of Cambridge who made 103 in the first innings, J.B.R. Bulwer top scoring with 31, Lowth taking four of the wickets to fall, the second sheet shows the Oxford first innings where they also made 103 with A.E. Dryden top scoring with 28, Sayers, five and St. Croix, four, taking the wickets for Cambridge. By the close of play Cambridge has set Oxford a total 120 to win the match by themselves scoring 120, Bulwer again top scoring with 30 runs, the next day Oxford were out for 112-9 and lost the match, with R. Garth top scoring with 40 not out. However Lord Ward was absent and is marked on the sheet has 'absent' and could not be found and probably lost the match for Oxford needing on eight runs to win. In addition to these sheets there are the original sheets for the Marylebone Cricket Club v Oxford University match played two days later. In this match M.C.C. won by six wickets, Oxford making 157 and 105, M.C.C. making 123 and 140-4. The majority of the sheets are back to back on the card with two exceptions. Good condition £200/300

*There are several printed notes with the sheets, one which sounds like a first hand description of the match which notes 'An early morning shower made the grass wet, as the last day began. A passing horse*

*had flicked mud on to the scorer's notes as he settled in to record an exciting last day's play.... Just before Dinner, Oxford were well set at 95-5 until suddenly Mr Sayres clean bowled Lord Loftus and Mr Mills with consecutive balls. Lord Ward was due to face the hat trick ball but could not be found anywhere! Almost ten minutes passed before the Oxford men finally gave up hope of finding him leaving Cambridge to celebrate an unlikely victory. Lord Ward, whose absence was almost entirely to blame for the defeat was soon forgiven and went on to become the First Earl of Dudley and the M.C.C. President in 1864. Our scorer went back to his lodgings that night and carefully filled in these pages.... from his mud spattered notes. 'The scores sheets were purchased from the M.C.C. in 1987 and have been part of the Roger Mann collection until fairly recently.*

- 875 H.H. Stephenson's tour of Australia 1861/62. 'International Cricket Match. New South Wales v All England, played at the Domain, Sydney on Wednesday, Thursday, Friday and Saturday, January 29th, 30th and 31st, and February 1st 1862. The All England Eleven introduced into the Colonies by Messrs Spiers & Pond'. Very early original silk scorecard for the match played in 1862 between New South Wales (22 players) and the All England XI. Printed by the Caxton Printing Office of George Street, Sydney. The scorecard on silk with colour printing in blue and red, has the title to top border with the scores and details below and is bordered with advertisements including 'M. McMahon's Cricketing Depot of George Street', 'C. Bovis, Bootmakers, Zingari and other boots for Cricket...' etc. Delicate silk borders to extremities, with some wear and loss. The scorecard is loosely held to backing board and has some staining and age toning, plus heavy wear with some loss to right hand side and to lower border of the silk. Lesser amounts of wear and small holes to other parts of the silk. Overall in reasonably good condition for its scarcity and age. The scorecard itself measures approximately 11"x9.5". An extremely rare

- scorecard from this seminal cricket match on the first tour of Australia. £700/1000
- Stephenson's XI made 175 all out in their first innings with Mortlock top scoring with 76, Caffyn 38 and Gilbert (a cousin of the Grace family) took three wickets, in reply, the twenty two of New South made 127 all out with Kettle the top scorer with 39, Sewell taking nine, Iddison five and Griffith four wickets between them. In their second innings the All England XI made 66 all out with Gilbert and Moore taking four wickets apiece, New South Wales were then bowled out for 65 with Griffith taking eleven, Sewell five and Iddison three wickets and the All England XI won the match by 49 runs.*
- 876 'Authorized Cricket Score. The United Eleven of England versus The Eastbourne Club' 1866. Early original double sided scorecard for the match played at Eastbourne 20th- 22nd August 1866 with printed scores at the close of the first day's play. The twenty two of Eastbourne (102 & 128) lost to the United England Eleven (81 & 150/5) by five wickets. For England, Iddison took seventeen wickets in the match and Freeman fifteen, with Thomas Signall top scorer with 58no in the second innings. The England team also featured John Thewlis, Roger Iddison, James Grundy, Samuel Biddulph, Daniel Hayward etc. For Eastbourne Charles Carpenter, Albert Reed, George 'Farmer' Bennett, Thomas Case, James Lillywhite (England 2 Tests), Harry Killick, Charles Ellis etc. Issued by J. - 877 'England v Australia, The Oval 1880'. The First Test Match to be played in England. Original commemorative silk scorecard for the inaugural Test match, England v Australia, played at the Kennington Oval on the 6th-8th September 1880. England won the first Test match by five wickets. England made 420 and Australia were bowled out for 149 in their first innings. Australia following on in their second innings made 327 all out, and England won the test reaching their target of 57 for the loss of five wickets. For England, W.G. Grace made 152, Lucas 55, Lord Harris 52 and Fred Morley of Nottinghamshire took eight wickets in the match. For Australia, Murdoch made 153no in their second innings. The scorecard with fully printed detail. Printed by John Sharp & Co, Pilgrim Street, London. In the second innings Gilbert Jessop scored a remarkable 191, reaching his century in only 42 minutes, the second fastest century recorded in first-class cricket. Frank Woolley took 5/81. The Players were then bowled out for 172 with Alfred Morcom taking 7/76 (his career best) and May a further three wickets to return match bowling figures of eleven wickets for 118 runs. *In 1861, 'Spiers and Pond' brought over to Australia the first All-England cricket team,*

- who sailed on *Isambard Kingdom Brunel's steamship, SS Great Britain, from Liverpool. This was the first commercial sponsorship of cricket. The idea for the tour came from the English proprietors of a Melbourne company called Spiers and Pond, which ran the Café de Paris in the city. Spiers was Felix William Spiers and Pond was Christopher Pond. Their representative in England, a Mr Mallam, had tried to interest Charles Dickens in a lecture tour of Australia and New Zealand, offering him £7,000, later increased to £10,000, to travel to Australia, but Dickens turned the offer down. Instead, having noted the success of the first England overseas cricket tour of 1859 to North America and the growing popularity of cricket in Australia, Spiers and Pond decided to attract a team of leading English cricketers. Mr Mallam therefore journeyed to Birmingham in September 1861 to watch the North v. South game at Aston Park. During the game, Mallam met the cricketers at the nearby Hen and Chicken Hotel to make a business proposal. As a result, twelve players agreed to tour Australia the following winter on terms of £150 per man plus expenses.*
- 975 England tour to Australia 1881/82. Lillywhite, Shaw and Shrewsbury's tour. Early large original sepia photograph of members of the touring party visiting a gold mine near Melbourne in 1881. In the third and deciding 3rd Test played at Sydney, England batted first making 347 all out in reply, Australia made 218. In England's second innings they made 123 with Spofforth taking 7-44. Barlow (7 wickets) and England then proceeded to bowl the Australians out for 83 winning the Test by 69 runs and the Ashes. After the tourists had won this game and thus the series of three matches by two to one, some ladies burnt the bails used in the match and placed the 'Ashes' in a small urn and presented it to the victorious captain of the English team Ivo Bligh, to represent winning back the 'ashes of English cricket'. The urn, together with its embroidered velvet bag, is housed in the Memorial Gallery at Lord's.*

*August Bank Holiday 1904 was 'happily favoured with fine weather' and George Hirst was having his benefit after twelve years of service to the club. A total of 78,681 people came into the ground and receipts of £3,702, 2s & 3d were unprecedented and only exceeded 21 years later when Roy Kilner collected £4,016 19s & 3d. Lancashire Captain, Archie MacLaren unwisely invited Yorkshire to bat first and they batted for seven hours in total despite having to recover from 143 for five. Ernest Smith, missed before he had scored, was bowled by James Hallows for 98. Hirst made 65, John Tunnicliffe 55 and Lord Hawke 54. Hirst removed MacLaren, Reggie Spooner and Johnny Tyldesley in his first three overs and finished with six for 42 as Lancashire were all out for 173 in response to Yorkshire's 403. So Lancashire had to save the game on the Wednesday which they did as Tyldesley made an undefeated 108. The match was drawn, Lancashire finished on 163-3. Lancashire won the County Championship in the 1904 season, not losing a match. Yorkshire finished in 2nd place having lost only two matches all season. In the 1904 season, George Hirst averaged scored 2,501 first class runs at an average of 54.36 with nine centuries and took 132 wickets at an average of 21.09.*
